



Ephesians 2:11-18







TODAY'S MESSAGE | NOVEMBER 14, 2021

How Christ's Redemption Unites Us

EPHESIANS 2:11-18

Ephesians gives more attention to the church than any other epistle. Our passage, often called "the key and high point of the whole epistle," is one of the most significant passages about the church in the Bible. In his desire to make his mostly Gentile friends realize the value of the church to God and for them, Paul makes them remember their past to realize their empowered present and glorious future. All this was made possible through Christ's work on the Cross:

1. REMEMBER WHEN YOU HAD NO HOPE AND WERE WITHOUT GOD (Ephesians 2:11-12)

- This is one of the few places in Scripture where we are asked to remember the past. Paul mentions three things applicable to Gentiles only (that's us), but the last two apply to all, both Jews and Gentiles.
- Remembering is the key to loving and worshiping God. Remember the life-changing work of Christ in us from being dead in sins to being alive in Christ, from being excluded to being included. This calls attention to our being works in progress who cannot become lax or proud. But remember the past only to focus on Christ and the change He has brought.
- Ephesians 2:11-12 serves as a solid warning for Christians, for we are as vulnerable to the failures of the Jews. We cannot draw people to Christ while belittling them. Salvation should lead to thanksgiving, not arrogance, and a sense of grace is the key.

2. REALIZE WHO YOU ARE NOW BECAUSE OF WHAT JESUS DID (Ephesians 2:13-18)

- a. This is what Jesus did to bring us where we are today (Ephesians 2:14-17)
 - He "made us both one" (v. 14)
 - He created "one new man in place of the two" (v. 15)
 - He reconciled us "both to God in one body through the cross" (v. 16)



b. This is who you are now and why you are here (Ephesians 2:13, 18)

- We who were far off were brought near through Christ's sacrificial death (v. 13). This is true for every believer regardless of race and other dividing differences.
- Because of Christ, all believers have access through the Holy Spirit to the Father (v. 18). This is how the church, as a new family, unites all people regardless of race and other dividing differences.

FINAL THOUGHTS

To focus on unity has nothing to do with compromise about doctrine. Have you noticed the so-called guardians of right doctrine are often the most grace-less? Is it impossible to be both doctrinally sound and loving at the same time? Right doctrine should make people more gracious and less self-righteous.

Christ's redemption resolves all forms of discrimination at its very root, including racial and spiritual discrimination. All Christians are not merely *equal;* instead, all Christians have been *united* in Christ and placed in God's church, His family. Praise God for the church and the One who gave His life for it!

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. How does it affect you when you recall your past before becoming a Christian? (cf. Ephesians 2:11-12). How are you encouraged by your real and present status? (cf. Ephesians 2:13).
- 2. Are there aspects of your being (e.g., nationality, economic status, social class, education, etc.) that are a subconscious barrier to your fellowship with other Christians? How will you go about resolving this?
- 3. If another believer in the local church hurt you deeply, how does looking at Jesus' sacrifice on the cross enable you to forgive? What will you do to initiate reconciliation with them?
- 4. Pray with thanksgiving for Christ's gift of redemption, which placed us all in God's family, the church. Pray for believers who have become lukewarm to fellowship with others in the local church.

Scripture reminds us in Romans 12:5-6a 5-6a, "So we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. We individually have different spiritual gifts.

You don't really get into ministry. You are in ministry, if you are a believer. You are to do the work of ministry. Your pastor is there to teach you and equip you to do the work of service; to build up the church, the body of Christ toward maturity. (Ephesians 4:11-12)

When you put your faith in Jesus, when you believed in His Person, as God the Son; His provision, that He died for your sins and rose from the dead; and believed in His promise to give you eternal life – you were saved. You were born again, indwelt by the Holy Spirit. You were given your spiritual gift.

What is your gift? You aren't sure? Well, what do you gravitate toward? What do you enjoy doing? What are you effective at?

As we move forward with on-site worship, you might want to consider being part of the Worship Ministry Team. You might consider being a projectionist, an on-site singer, an on-site instrumentalist. Or your interest might be in sound mixing, camera work, video technical direction or stage management. Join us!
