



The Calling and Content of Our Ministry

Ephesians 3:1-13

The Calling and Content of Our Ministry

EPHESIANS 3:1-13

Is the call to serve God only for spiritual giants like the apostle Paul? Or is there room in the ministry for people like us? Is there pressure for us to come up with the content of our ministry? Or has God made things quite plain for us in that aspect?

The answers to these questions are in Ephesians 3:1-13. And because in this passage, Paul's discourse about his call to ministry and the content of his ministry are considerably intertwined, we will divide the passage by themes rather than by verse:

1. The Servant of the Gospel: The Call of Paul to Ministry


Paul was about to pray in verse 1 but interrupted himself as he reflected on the call of God upon his life. Notice these things about his calling to serve God which remain so true for you and me today:

- The opportunity to serve God is entrusted to us by God: "the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me" (v. 2)
- The ability to serve God is gifted to us by God: "I was made a minister according to the gift of God's grace, which was given me by the working of His power" (v. 7)
- The worthiness to serve God comes from the call of God, not from ourselves: "To me, though I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given" (v. 8)

2. The Significance of the Gospel: The Content of Paul's Ministry

- The term "mystery" here means a previously unrevealed truth that is now brought to light. And it's not that the Gentiles could become part of God's kingdom (the Old Testament contains that promise and every Jew knew that Gentiles could become proselytes), but it is how this would happen that is new "in Christ Jesus through the Gospel" (v. 6).
- Why would God do this? So that through the church, the eternal purpose of God would be witnessed by angels, holy and unholy (vv. 10-11).
- The church is not an afterthought of God. Treasure your being part of God's church! And our access to God through prayer was always the plan of God (v. 12). Treasure your access to God through prayer!







FINAL THOUGHTS

The calling to serve God isn't just for Paul. It's for all of us who have been saved by grace through faith. And that itself is the content of our ministry – it is about the One who saved us by grace through faith, how He did it (the message of the Cross), and what we have become by His grace.

May God bless your call to ministry as you fulfill it, and may God bless your faithfulness to the content of your ministry, the Gospel.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. If someone tells you "I want to serve God but there are no opportunities for me inside this church", how would you correct this person's way of thinking? How does Paul's own call to ministry give us insight into God's call to ministry for every believer?
- 2. Some Christians have made mistakes so grievous and public that they think God will never let them serve Him again even after full repentance. How can you encourage a Christian who looks at himself/herself this way?
- 3. There is a growing trend today to dismiss the local church as unnecessary, irrelevant, or hypocritical. Many people think, "I will just worship God on my own, hopping around the unlimited choices of online churches." What negative consequences do you think may result from this attitude? As long as it is not risky and it is physically possible for a believer, why is it ideal to attend worship on-site? (Hebrews 11:25)
- 4. Read Ephesians 5:25-30 together, then pray and worship Christ together for the high regard He has for the church, His Bride. If need be, confess any negative attitudes you may have developed about the church for any reason, remembering that human shortcomings can never thwart the ultimate purpose and favor of Christ toward His Bride, the church.


