Post-Pandemic Social Anxiety: Adjusting to the New Normal Matthew 6:24-34

Two months from now, we face an unwanted anniversary. By mid-March, we'll have endured two years of this pandemic and the lockdown it caused. Here are what experts project as Post-Pandemic Possibilities:

- Concerns about relating normally with others again
- Concerns related to financial uncertainty
- Fear of the unknown future
- Fear of the unseen virus

But there's hope! The Son of God knew that while situations change in human history, the human heart doesn't. And what He said to His disciples then is even more relevant to our times now.

Jesus brought up two kinds of necessities in life and how we should respond to them:

- a) ABSOLUTE NECESSITIES: A matter of life and death (i.e., food and water) Listen to Jesus about the absolute necessities of life:
 - <u>Remember who you are: your infinite value to the Father who saved you</u> and gave you eternal life through Christ.

"Look at the birds of the air... Are you not of more value than they?" (v. 26)


• Realize the futility and harm of worry.

"And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his life?" (v. 27)

- b) CONVENIENT NECESSITIES: Important but not indispensable (e.g., clothing it symbolizes everything else that we need in life besides food and water)
 Listen to Jesus about the convenient necessities of life:
 - The excellence of God's care and standards of beauty may be beyond our comprehension, but shouldn't be beyond our appreciation.

Even modern science helps us realize this.

"the lilies of the field... neither toil nor spin... yet even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these." (v. 28-29)





 Jesus reiterated this truth because it was so important: you are of infinite value to God.

He then reveals the root of our anxiety: *"if God so clothes the grass of the field… will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith?" (v. 30)*

Jesus then addressed two intersecting timelines we are all concerned about:

- a) THE HARSH REALITIES OF THE PRESENT
 - Jesus assures us: "your heavenly Father knows that you need them." (v. 32) What an inspiration to pray!
 - Jesus assures us: "your heavenly Father knows that you need them." (v. 33) God will take it from there.
- b) THE UNCERTAINTY OF OUR FUTURE


How do we get ready for a future we can't even predict or foresee?

 Jesus assures us: "tomorrow will take care of itself." (v. 34) But this is not Que Sera, Sera. Remember, He addressed believers that He'd been teaching about the character of God. Jesus told us to <u>entrust an unseen future to a God</u> <u>more real and constant than the future we fear</u>. There is no need to add to the troubles each day brings.

FINAL THOUGHTS

As inconstant and unpredictable as our hearts are, God is constant, unchanging, and faithful. And we can worry by our lonesome selves locked up in our homes today, or we can reach out to one another, virtually or onsite (at the opportune time), and remind each other of these words that Jesus said. Here's the best response to God's Word today:

"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." (Hebrews 10:24-25)




