LESSON AIM

- GG members will gain a deeper understanding of what the true Gospel entails and why it matters.
- GG members will discern the characteristics of false teachings and the importance of doctrinal integrity.
- 3. GG members will reflect on the nature of Christian servitude: pleasing God versus pleasing people.
- 4. GG members will draw practical applications for their daily walk with Christ in their personal lives and in our church community.

INTRODUCTION

Written by Paul, this epistle is not just a letter but a passionate response to troubling news from Galatia. The Galatian church, initially grounded in the true Gospel, was being swayed by teachings that distorted the essence of their faith. Paul writes not only to correct but also to clarify and reaffirm the core of Christian belief: the grace and peace found in Jesus Christ. In this passage, we'll explore the rich themes of God's grace, the centrality of the Gospel, the dangers of deviating from the truth, and the importance of serving Christ above all.

Paul greeted the Galatian church (vv. 3-5)

Paul greeted the church with grace and peace from God and Jesus Christ, who bought our peace through his priceless sacrifice, according to God's will. Because of this peace and grace from God, he is worthy and deserving of all glory, honor, and praise.

- 1. What are the two key elements of Paul's greeting, and from whom do these come?
- 2. Why do you think Paul chose to emphasize "grace and peace" in his greeting?
- 3. What was the reason for Jesus Christ's giving of himself? Whose will is it that Jesus should sacrifice himself?
- 4. How does Christ's sacrifice reflect the core message of the Gospel?
- 5. Why does God deserve all the glory for all eternity?

Application

Because of Christ's sacrifice on the cross, we have grace and peace with God. As those who are recipients of this gift, it is only right that we glorify God in our everyday activities. How are you experiencing God's grace and peace, and how are you glorifying God in your daily life?

Paul was astonished at the church's desertion of the gospel (vv. 6-9)

Paul told the church how astonished he was that they were quickly abandoning the gospel he had preached. They were being misled by others who distorted the gospel message. Paul declared that these people are accursed.

- 1. How did Paul describe the speed at which the church deserted the gospel?
- 2. How did Paul describe this "different gospel" to which the church was turning?
- 3. What did Paul say should happen to those who preach a different gospel?
- 4. What distortions of the gospel are present in this day and age?

Application

How can you guard yourself against "different gospels" that distort the true gospel of Jesus Christ? How can you ensure that the gospel you share stays true to the gospel originally taught by the apostles?

Paul defended his motives (v. 10)

Paul defended and differentiated himself from the false teachers. He was a servant of Christ and wanted to please Christ by faithfully doing what he was commissioned to do. On the other hand, the false teachers were preaching a distorted gospel that aimed to please those who heard their message.

- 1. Who did Paul say he was trying to please?
- 2. How did Paul describe himself in relation to Jesus Christ?
- 3. Why did Paul make a contrast between pleasing man and pleasing God?

Application

Reflect on your own life and ministry. How can you ensure that your motivation behind them is to please God? What or who may pressure you to please people instead, and how can you overcome this?
