Support of Alberta HOS Ruleset

Geotab[®] is announcing support of the Alberta Drivers' Hours-of-Service (HOS) regulation (317/2002) for intraprovincial Alberta carriers and their drivers.

Electronic logging devices (ELD) can be used in Alberta, provided the device is capable of recording the drivers' hours in accordance with the applicable regulation. For provincial carriers, the device must be compliant with the requirements of an "automatic on-board recording device" specified in section 10 of the Driver's Hours of Service Regulation AR 317/2002.

For Federal Carriers operating in Alberta, they were able to operate without penalty in Alberta until January 1, 2023 as long as they followed conventional hours-of-service requirements, when needed. After this date, federally regulated carriers are required to have a certified electronic logging device (ELD) installed in commercial vehicles that meet the following qualifications:

- 1. Commercial vehicles registered with weight over 4,500 kilograms, or
- 2. Have a manufactured seating capacity of 11 passengers (including the driver), as devices became available.
