	BY THE NUMBERS
1	Notre Dame is currently ranked tied for first nationally with nine interceptions to begin the 2021 season.
3	The Irish have started the season 4-0 for the third time in the last four seasons. Under Kelly, the Irish have gone 4-0 to start the season six times during his 12 years at Notre Dame.
4	Notre Dame collected four interceptions in the win over Wisconsin, marking its most interceptions in a game since the Pinstripe Bowl in 2013 when they had four against Rutgers.
4	Since the start of 2018, Notre Dame is 37-5 (.881). That rate ranks fourth among all teams who have made an appearance in the College Football Playoff since its inception in 2014. Among those teams, Notre Dame is one of just four teams that have totaled five or fewer losses (Clemson, Alabama, Ohio State) since the start of 2018.
14	Notre Dame has totaled 14 sacks over the first four games of the season. It is the most sacks to start a season since 2012, when the Irish also had 14 sacks through the first four games.
24	The Irish have won 24-straight games when they have scored 40 or more points. Notre Dame is 38-2 all-time under Brian Kelly when they score at least 40 points.
43	JD Bertrand has totaled 42 tackles through the first four games of the season. That ranks 11th nationally and is the most by an Irish player through the first four games of a season since Manti Te'o had 54 in the first four games of the 2010 season.
106^	Head coach Brian Kelly surpassed Knute Rockne for most wins all-time at Notre Dame with 106 after the 41-13 win over #18/15 Wisconsin.
375^	Career games coached by Brian Kelly, second among active NCAA coaches to Mack Brown (North Carolina).
1900	The only time Notre Dame and Cincinnati previously met on the gridiron was Oct. 20, 1900 in South Bend. The Irish won the game 58-0 to improve to 4-0 in the season.
2005	The last time Notre Dame had an offensive, defensive and special teams touchdown in the same game was 2005 against Tennessee. Brady Quinn threw for a touchdown and Tom Zbikowski returned a punt for a touchdown and had a pick six.

### MEDIA INFORMATION

#### **GAME CREDENTIALS**

All requests for working press and broadcast credentials for Notre Dame's 2021 home football
games must be made through the online credential form at UND.com/credentials. Because of the
demand for credentials and the limited space available, media agencies covering the visiting school
on a regular basis receive top priority. All other credentials for print media are issued on the basis
of circulation. Only local radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting a daily sports
show receive consideration for credentials. Non-originating, out-of-town radio stations cannot be
accommodated.

#### **CREDENTIAL DISTRIBUTION**

• Media credentials will neither be mailed nor will be available for early pickup. Credentials will ONLY be distributed on game day at the Hammes Auditorium (the Joyce Center's basketball interview room, located betweens Gates 1 and 2). A government-issued ID is required for pickup and each individual must claim only his/her own pass. All media members **MUST** be vaccinated to cover a Notre Dame home game this season. If you have not attended a Notre Dame event before the game, you must show your vaccine card at credential distribution in order to gain entrance to the event.

#### PARKING

• Parking requests will be accommodated on a space-available basis. Parking passes will be electronic for the 2021 season. They will be sent out during the week of the game.

#### **BRIAN KELLY AVAILABILITY**

• The Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly conducts a weekly press conference at noon ET each Monday in person in the Notre Dame Stadium Media Room and also available via zoom. The half hour weekly conference previews the upcoming game. All media members who plan to attend the session in person **MUST** be vaccinated. To obtain the link for Monday's press conference, media members should contact assistant athletics director, football communications Katy Lonergan.

#### STUDENT-ATHLETE INTERVIEWS

• Interviews with Notre Dame student-athletes will occur on Tuesday during each game week in person at the Irish Athletics Center and also via zoom. All media members who plan to attend the session in person **MUST** be vaccinated. Interview requests for student-athletes must be submitted to Katy Lonergan by Noon ET the Sunday before the proposed interview. A player availability schedule will be distributed each Monday during the season. Media are not permitted to directly contact student-athletes or coaches to arrange interviews.

#### **POST-GAME INTERVIEWS**

Post-game interviews for Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly and Notre Dame players
will be held in the Stadium Media Room, along with zoom. Requests for student-athlete interviews
should be submitted by the eight-minute mark of the fourth quarter to Katy Lonergan. For home
games, submit to Katy Lonergan via email or Matt Paras (located in the press box or available by
email at mparas1@nd.edu). Transcripts from Coach Kelly's presser will be available approximately
60 minutes following the conclusion of his post-game comments.

#### STATISTICAL SERVICES

- All media members will be provided with access to game notes via UND.com. Following the
  game, a complete post-game statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a
  scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts
  for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics, substitution chart, post-game quotes from
  both head coaches and players and post-game notes. Live in-game statistics will be available via
  StatBroadcast.

# NOTRE DAME STADIUM

 In its 92nd season as the home of Fighting Irish Football, Notre Dame boasts a 365-114-5 (.759) record in Notre Dame Stadium.



- Notre Dame has won 26-straight games at home dating back to Sept. 30, 2017, starting with a victory over Miami (Ohio) and extending to this season with the win over Purdue (27-13).
- It continues the modern-era record for longest home winning streak for the Irish (28-straight from 1942– 50). With the 52-0 shutout of South Florida, the Irish topped the previous modern streak of 19-straight from 1987-90.
- Clemson is the only Power 5 program that boasts a home streak of more than 26 games:

- With the win over Syracuse in the 2020 home finale, the Irish completed an undefeated home slate for the third-consecutive season, after two-straight perfect home seasons in 2018–19.
- Notre Dame had not achieved three-straight undefeated home seasons since 1987–89.
- Football student-athletes who are true seniors have not lost a home game in their careers and boast a 21-0 record in Notre Dame Stadium.

#### **BEATING NO. 1 AT HOME**

 The last two times the Irish have played at Notre Dame Stadium as a top-five team against a No. 1 program, the Irish are undefeated (1993 vs. Florida State and 2020 vs. Clemson).

### MONSTERS OF THE MIDWAY

- Notre Dame's defense had shades of the 1985 Bears when they flexed their muscle in the 41-13 win over #18/#15 Wisconsin on Sept. 25.
- The Irish allowed just 13 points for the second-consecutive game and the defense scored two touchdowns in the win.
- Linebackers Jack Kiser and Drew White both returned interceptions for touchdowns late in the fourth quarter. It was the first time since 2002 against Stanford that the Irish had two interceptions returned for a touchdown in the same game.
- The Irish also scored on special teams after a 96-yard kickoff return from **Chris Tyree** put Notre Dame up for good in the fourth quarter.
- It was the first Irish kick return for a touchdown since CJ Sanders did it against Army during the 2016 season.
- It was the first kickoff return for a touchdown Wisconsin had given up in its previous 122 games since Duane Bennett did it for Minnesota against the Badgers on Nov. 12, 2011.
- The Irish finished the game with four interceptions and five takeaways total.
- It was the first time since 2013 against Rutgers in the Pinstripe Bowl that the Irish had four interceptions in a game.
- It was the first time since 2019 against Virginia that they had five takeways in a single game.
- Notre Dame tallied an offensive, defensive and special teams touchdown in the same game for the first time since 2005 against Tennessee. Brady Quinn threw for a touchdown and Tom Zbikowski had a punt return and interception return for a touchdown.
- Wide receiver **Kevin Austin** set career highs with six receptions and two touchdowns. It was the first multitouchdown game of his career.
- Quarterback **Drew Pyne** came on after the injury to **Jack Coan** and tossed his first career touchdown pass to **Austin** in the fourth quarter.
- **Pyne** finished with six completions for 81 yards and a touchdown, which were all career-best numbers.
- Punter **Jay Bramblett** boomed a 72-yard punt in the second quarter. It was the longest punt by an Irish player since Hunter Smith had a 79-yard punt against Arizona State in 1998.

### BALLIN' BERTRAND

- Linebacker JD Bertrand continues to be a force for the Irish on defense as he was a key contributor in the win over Wisconsin.
- He led the Irish with seven tackles against the Badgers, the fourth straight game he has led the team in tackles to begin the season.
- Bertrand has totaled 42 tackles through four games is the most to begin a season since Manti Te'o totaled 54 over the

- first four games of the 2010 season.
- The 42 tackles rank 11th nationally and he is seventh in the nation in solo tackles with 27 for the season.
- **Bertrand** tied a career high with 12 tackles in the win over Purdue Boilermakers after he tallied 11 against Toledo and 12 in the season-opener against Florida State.
- The sophomore from Marietta, Ga. was the first Irish player to begin a season with three-straight double-digit tackles games since Courtney Watson back in 2001.
- He is also the first Irish player to have three-consecutive games with double-digit tackles since Alohi Gilman in 2018-19. Gilman had 10 tackles against Southern Cal and then 18 against Clemson in the College Football Playoff Semifinal in 2018 and followed it up with 10 tackles in the 2019 season opener against Louisville.
- In the win over Toledo, **Bertrand** set a career high in sacks (1.0) and recovered his first career fumble to seal the game late in the fourth quarter.
- **Bertrand** got his first career start in the opener against Florida State and his 12 tackles were the most by an Irish linebacker since Te'von Coney had 16 on Dec. 28, 2018 against Clemson.

### **CREATING HAVOC**

- Under new defensive coordinator Marcus Freeman, the Irish defense has been one of the nation's best at creating having plays this season.
- The Irish have totaled nine interceptions this year, which is tied for first in the NCAA.
- The nine interceptions through the first four games of the season is the most by an Irish team to begin the year in the past 25 seasons
- Kyle Hamilton leads the team with three interceptions, a mark that ranks third in the country.
- **Cam Hart** is tied for 13th nationally with two interceptions on the season.
- Hamilton and Hart have both had two interceptions in a game this season, the first time since 2018 that the Irish have had two players with two interceptions in a game in the same season (Jalen Elliott and Alohi Gilman).
- The Irish have had six different players record an interception this season.
- In total, the Irish have 12 takeaways this season and that mark is second in the country behind Oregon with 13.
- Notre Dame is ranked No. 3 in the nation with a turnover margin of +7 through the first four games.
- The 14 sacks are the most in the first four games of a season since the 2012 campaign when the Irish also had 14 sacks in the first four games.
- The depth of the defense has been on full display as 10 different players have recorded a tackle for loss so far this season.
- The defense has also been able to find the endzone this season with two defensive scores. The two touchdowns are tied for fourth nationally for defensive touchdowns this season.

### CINCINNATI - THE LAST TIME

• October 20, 1900 - Notre Dame 58, Cincinnati 0: Before a throng of enthusiastic rooters and admirers decked in a gala array of colors our football heroes overwhelmingly defeated the eleven sent up from the University of Cincinnati to cope with them on last Saturday. The short time the Cincinnati boys had the pigskin in their possession gave them small opportunity to make any headway. Not once during the entire game was our goal threatened. During the second half, when the Cincinnati boys began to look a little dangerous, our fellows forced them to try a drop kick from the thirty-yard line which they missed. Many times Cincinnati strove to advance the ball into our territory, but at each attempt one or more Notre Dame men proved to be an insurmountable obstacle. The men from the Ohio institution were outclassed in nearly all the departments of the game.

### CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

- Dick Corbett Coach Brian Kelly coached at Cincinnati for three seasons (2007-10) prior to taking the Notre Dame job. He guided the Bearcats to a 34-6 record, including a 12-0 mark in the 2009 regular season and berths to the Orange Bowl and Sugar Bowl. He won his first Home Depot National Coach of the Year award after the 2009 season with Cincinnati.
- Defensive Coordinator Marcus Freeman joined the Irish this past offseason after being the defensive coordinator at Cincinnati for the previous four seasons (2017-20). He coached the Bearcats to back-to-back 11-win seasons in 2018 and 2019 and went 9-1 in 2020 en route to a Peach Bowl berth.
- Cornerbacks coach Mike Mickens played cornerback at Cincinnati from 2005-2008. His final two seasons at Cincinnati were under coach Kelly and the Bearcats made the Orange Bowl in 2008. Mickens joined Freeman on the Bearcats coaching staff for two season (2018 and 2019) where they won 11 games in both years. Mickens also spent the 2011 season with the Bearcats as a defensive assistant.
- Current defensive line coach Mike Elston (07-09) and offensive line coach Jeff Quinn (07-09) both were on Coach Kelly's staff during his time at Cincinnati.
- Cincinnati wide receiver Michael Young began his collegiate career at Notre Dame (2017-19). He has spent the last two seasons with the Bearcats.
- Cincinnati offensive coordinator Mike Denbrock has spent two stints at Notre Dame in a variety of roles. He coached tight ends (2010–11), outside receivers and was the passing game coordinator (2012–13), served as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach (2014) and was the associate head coach and wide receivers coach (2015– 16). In his previous stint in South Bend, he coached the offensive tackles and tight ends (2002–04).

## SURPASSING A LEGEND

- With the 41-13 win on Sept. 25 over Wisconsin, head coach **Brian Kelly** surpassed Knute Rockne for the most wins all-time in Notre Dame history with 106<sup>^</sup>.
- With the win over Wisconsin, the Irish improved to 4-0
  this season. It is the third time in the last four seasons that
  the Irish have started the season 4-0. It is also the sixth
  time under Kelly that they have achieved that feat.
- Kelly stands alone as the only Irish coach in history to post six seasons with 10 wins or more (2012<sup>^</sup>, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020).
- Kelly is in his 12th year on the Irish sidelines and is just the second coach in Notre Dame history to coach 12 or more years in South Bend (Rockne - 13).
- It is the third time in the past four seasons and six time in his 12 years that Notre Dame has started the season 4-0.

### AMONG THE NATIONS BEST

- Since the start of 2018, Notre Dame is 37-5 (.881). That
  rate ranks fourth among all teams who have made
  an appearance in the College Football Playoff since its
  inception in 2014.
- Among those teams, Notre Dame is one of just four teams that have totaled five or fewer losses since the beginning of 2018.
- The Irish are one of five teams who have made playoff appearances in multiple seasons.

### SHILLELAGH STAYS HÖME

- The Irish extended their winning streak to nine over Purdue to retain the Shillelagh Trophy with the 27-13 win on Sept. 18
- The Irish defense limited the Boilermakers to their fewest points in a game since Oct. 26 2019 against Illinois.
- With the win, the Irish extended its longest modern-era home winning streak to 26 games.
- Notre Dame also extended its winning streak against unranked opponents to 35 games with the win.
- Running back **Kyren Williams** led the way with 168 allpurpose yards, the most by an Irish player this season and the third most of his career.
- Williams currently ranks 20th in the country with 133.3 all-purpose yards per game this season.
- Quarterback **Jack Coan** finished the day with 223 yards and two touchdowns, his third-straight game with two touchdowns or more.
- It is the first time in his career he has had two or more touchdowns in three-straight games. It is also Coan's second career streak of three-straight games with 200 yards passing or more.
- Wide receiver **Avery Davis** was **Coan's** favorite target as he had a career day with five receptions for 120 yards and a 62-yard touchdown reception.
- The Irish keep the Shillelagh Trophy home and continue to hold all five traveling trophies. They have had all five trophies on campus since 2018.

### HAMILTON THE HUNTER

- Safety Kyle Hamilton tied a career high with 10 tackles and hauled in an interception in the win over Purdue.
- One of his tackles stopped a fourth-down conversion for the Boilermakers in the first quarter. The Irish offense scored a touchdown on the ensuing drive to take a lead they would not relinquish the rest of the game.

- Following his performance against Purdue, he garnered player of the week awards from Walter Camp, Bednarik Award and Athlon.
- Hamilton has tallied three interceptions so far this season, the most interceptions by an Irish player in the first four games of the season since Bennett Jackson and Manti Te'o both had three through the first four games of the 2012 season.
- He has eight interceptions in his Irish career which is just three shy from tying Shane Walton and Todd Lyght for ninth all-time in program history.

### BELIKE MIKE

- Tight end Michael Mayer had a strong day for the Irish in the win over Wisconsin, leading the team with seven receptions on the afternoon.
- It is the third time this season Mayer has led the team in receptions and the third time this year he has hauled in seven or more receptions.
- In the win over Toledo, Mayer finished the game with team high marks in receptions with seven, yards with 81 and touchdowns with two.
- It was the first time in **Mayer's** career that he tallied a multi-touchdown game.
- Dating back to last season, Mayer collected seven or more receptions in three straight games (Alabama, Florida State and Toledo). The last Irish receiver to have threeconsecutive games with seven or more receptions was Michael Floyd in 2011 (Maryland - 8; Boston College - 10 and Stanford - 8).
- Through the first four games this season, **Mayer** totaled 24 receptions for 267 yards and three touchdowns.
- Among tight ends, Mayer ranks second nationally in receptions, fifth in receiving yards and tied for fifth in receving touchdowns.
- His three touchdowns this year already surpassed last year's total of two for the season.

### TALKING TOLEDO

- With the Irish trailing by five with 1:35 left in the home-opener against Toledo, quarterback **Jack Coan** led the Irish on the 75-yard game-winning drive in just three plays that was capped off with an 18-yard touchdown pass to **Michael Mayer**. After the two-point conversion, the Irish took a 32-29 lead that they would not relinquish to improve to 2-0 on the season.
- It was **Coan's** first game-winning drive in the final two minutes of the game in his career and it improved his career record to 14-6 as a starter.
- The last time the Irish had a game-winning drive in the final minutes of the game was in 2019 when lan Book led an 18-play, 87-yard touchdown drive to defeat Virginia Tech 21-20.

- **Coan** finished the game with 239 yards and two touchdowns. It is just the third time in his career that he has had back-to-back multi-touchdown games.
- Fellow quarterback **Tyler Buchner** made his collegiate debut against the Rockets and ripped off a 26-yard run on the first snap of his career.
- Buchner led the Irish on a five-play, 96-yard drive in his first-career series than ended in a 43-yard touchdown run from Kyren Williams.
- In the fourth quarter, **Buchner** recorded his first touchdown pass when he connected with **Chris Tyree** for a 55-yard strike.
- It was **Tyree's** longest-career-reception and his first-receiving touchdown of his career.
- The win extended Notre Dame's longest modern era home winning streak to 25 games, a streak that dates back to the 2017 season.
- The Irish also collected their 34th-consecutive win over an unranked opponent with the victory over Toledo.
- The win gave the Irish their second-consecutive win by three points or less. It is the first time since the 2009 season that Notre Dame has won back-to-back games by three points or less. In 2009, the Irish defeated Michigan State 33-30 and followed it up with a 24-21 win over Purdue.
- Notre Dame won its first game when trailing at halftime since Sep. 28, 2019, when they defeated Virginia, 35-20, after trailing, 17-14, at the half.

### SUNDAY'S BEST

- The Irish opened the 2021 season as the only college football game on Labor Day Sunday and they did not disappoint in their 41-38 overtime thriller over the Seminoles.
- Graduate student Jonathan Doerer hit a 41-yard field goal in the first overtime to clinch the win for the Irish. He was awarded the game ball following the game. He was also named a Lou Groza Award Star of the Week following his performance against the Seminoles.
- It was the first Irish win on the final play of the game since 2014 when the Irish defeated LSU in the Music City Bowl on a 32-yard Kyle Brindza field goal as time expired.
- Notre Dame recorded its first overtime road win in program history against the Seminoles. The Irish were previously 0-3 in road overtime games since it was adopted prior to the 1996 season.
- The Irish continued a number of streaks with their win Sunday night. They won their 33rd-consecutive game against an unranked opponent, which dates back to the 2016 season.
- Notre Dame also extended its regular season winning streak to 20-games against ACC opponents. The Irish are 24-1 against ACC foes in the regular season since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- The Irish also claimed their fifth-consecutive season opening win. Notre Dame improved to 10-2 under head

- Notre Dame tallied 41 points in the win, the most in a season-opener since 2017 when they scored 49 in the win over Temple.
- The Irish improved to 26-5-2 in true road games to open the season with the win. They have won four of their last five true road season-openers.
- Notre Dame has won 23-consecutive games when they have scored 40 or more points. The Irish are 37-2 all-time under Kelly when they score 40 or more points.

### JACK OF ALL TRADES

- Graduate student Jack Coan had one of the best games
  of his collegiate career as he set career highs with 366
  yards and four touchdowns along with tying a career high
  with 26 completions in the win over Florida State.
- The 366 yards set a Notre Dame record for most passing yards in a season-opening game. The previous record was held by current offensive coordinator **Tommy Rees** when he threw for 346 yards against Temple in 2013.
- **Coan** also tied the Notre Dame record for most passing touchdowns in a season-opener with four. He tied with Jimmy Clausen (2009) and Ron Powlus (1994).
- His 366 yards ranked fifth nationally for Week 1 and he was the only quarterback in the Top-5 who had a true road game.
- He became the eighth-straight quarterback to record a win in their first start with the Irish, a streak dating back to the 2007 season.
- On the first drive of the game, Coan connected with Michael Mayer for a 41-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-one to give the Irish an early 7-0 advantage just over two minutes into the game.
- Coan got the Irish back in front when he hit Joe Wilkins Jr., for a 23-yard touchdown pass with 2:25 remaining in the first half.
- After falling behind in the beginning of the third quarter,
   Coan brought the Irish back ahead on the very next drive.
   He went 3-for-3 on the ensuing drive and capped it with a 37-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Austin Jr., on third-and-one.
- His fourth touchdown pass of the night came on the next drive in the third quarter where he went 4-for-4 for 79 yards. Facing third and goal, he hit **Kyren Williams** in the flat for a six-yard touchdown pass.
- All four of his touchdown passes came on third or fourth down.

# THE MAYER OF TALLAHASSEE

- Sophomore tight end Michael Mayer did not waste any time making an impact this season for the Irish, as he was the main target on their very first drive of the season.
- · One the first play from scrimmage, Coan hit Mayer in the

- flat for a 25-yard pass. Four plays later, the pair connected on a 41-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-one to put the Irish ahead 7-0. The 41-yard reception was a career best mark for Mayer.
- At the half, Mayer had five receptions for 89 yards. The 89 yards had already bested his previous career high mark of 73 yards.
- He finished the game with 120 receiving yards for his first 100-yard game of his career.
- He was the first Irish tight end to record a 100-yard game since Cole Kmet had 108 yards against Georgia in 2019.
- He finished the night with career-best marks in receptions (nine) and yards (120).
- The nine receptions ties the Notre Dame record for most receptions by a tight end in a single game.
- The 120 yards receiving was the most by an Irish tight end since Sept. 11, 2010 when Kyle Rudoplh hauled in 164 yards against Michigan.
- It also ranks fifth all-time in Notre Dame history for most receiving yards in a single game by a tight end.
- He tied for the NCAA lead for receiving yards among tight ends in Week 1. He was the only player tied for the lead who played in a true road game.

### ZŤAM KYĽEHAMÍŁTÓN

- Junior safety Kyle Hamilton made his presence known in the season opening win over the Seminoles.
- He recorded two interceptions for the first multiinterception game of his career. He also totaled six tackles on the night.
- Hamilton was tied for the lead nationally for interceptions during Week 1. He was just one of two players to have two interceptions in true road games.
- He was the first Irish player to record two interceptions in a game since Alohi Gillman had two against Syracuse in 2018.
- After both interceptions, the Irish offense scored a touchdown.

### 2021 CAPTAINS

- Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly announced seven team captains for Notre Dame's 2021 football campaign this fall. They include Avery Davis, Kyle Hamilton, Kurt Hinish, Jarrett Patterson, Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa, Drew White and Kyren Williams. All seven players were SWAT captains during the summer workouts.
- The seven captains tie for the most in a single season in Notre Dame history. The Irish named seven captains prior to the 2017 and 2019 seasons.

### NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN

- After spending four years at Wisconsin to begin his collegiate career, graduate student Jack Coan transferred to the Irish in the Spring of 2021.
- He played in 25 games for the Badgers, and made 18 starts to finish with a 12-6 career record.
- Coan finished his career at UW third all-time in completion percentage (68%) and third in pass efficiency rating (144.7).
- Prior to this season, Coan was named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award Watch List.

### CHANGING OF THE GUARD

- After having one of the most experienced offensive lines in the country in 2020, the Irish have a number of new faces on the line this year.
- Jarrett Patterson and Josh Lugg are the two most experienced lineman returning from the 2020 squad.
- Patterson, a team captain for 2021, has made 25 career starts in his career and is coming off a 2020 season where he was named an honorable mention All-American by Phil Steele.
- Heading into this season, Patterson was named to the Rimington Trophy, Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award Watch Lists.
- Lugg has played in 40 games and made 12 starts on the line.
- In 2020, he played in 11 of 12 games and made three starts for the offensive line that was a finalist for the Joe Moore Award.
- Prior to this season, Lugg was one of six Irish named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List.
- An impact transfer who will help the Irish on the offensive line is Cain Madden who joins the Irish from Marshall.
- Madden was a 2020 Walter Camp Second Team All-American and an AP Second Team All-American.
- He started 9-of-10 games for the Thundering Herd in 2020 and the offensive line paved the way for Marshall to outrush their opponents in 7-of-10 games and outpass opponents in six.
- Prior to the 2021 season, Madden has earned preseason All-American honors from Walter Camp (first team) and the Associated Press (second team). He was also named to the Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award Watch Lists.

### DEEP DEFENSIVE LINE

- Even after losing two starters from last year to the NFL Draft, the Irish bring back some of their most experienced players on the defensive line.
- Graduate student Kurt Hinish is the most experienced

- player returning on the team as he has played 53 games in his career and started in 28-of-29 games over the past three seasons.
- In 2020, Hinish had the best season of his career with a career-best 19 tackles, 7.5 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks.
- Hinish was one of the seven captains named prior to the 2021 season.
- Fellow graduate student Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa also brings a wealth of experience back on the line as he has logged 42 games played and 24 starts in his career.
- In 2020, Tagovailoa-Amosa posted career-high numbers with six tackles-for-loss and 2.5 sacks. After the season, he earned second team All-ACC honors.
- Heading into 2021, he joined Hinish in being named one of the seven team captains.
- Tagovailoa-Amosa is also on a number of watch lists heading into the season including the Nagurski Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy, Reese's Senior Bowl and Polynesian Player of the Year. He was also named to the AFCA Good Works Team this preseason.

### SUPER SPECIALISTS

- The Irish head into the 2021 season with the same kicker and punter for the third straight season with the return of Jonathan Doerer and Jay Bramblett.
- Doerer returns for his fifth season with the Irish thanks to the extra year of eligibility and is working his way up the Irish record book, ranking fifth all-time for field goals in his career with 40.
- He ranks fourth all-time in extra points made in his career with 126 and is four away from tying Dave Reeve for third.
- Doerer has made 126-consecutive extra points dating back to the 2018 season. He did not miss an extra point in either the 2019 season (57-57) or the 2020 season (48-48).
- He is first all-time in extra point percentage for his career with a mark of 99.2 percent (126-127).
- So far in the 2021 season, Doerer is 10th nationally in field goals per game with 1.75.
- Bramblett has played in every game (29) for the Irish since he came to campus prior to the 2019 season.
- He sits eighth all-time in Notre Dame history with 129 punts in his career.
- He is tied for fourth all-time in Notre Dame history with a 41.3 career punting average. He is currently tied with Kyle Bridnza.
- Bramblett launched a career-long 72-yard punt in the win over Wisconsin this season. It was the longest punt by an Irish player since Hunter Smith had a 79-yard punt against Arizona State in 1998.

- In 2020, the Irish went 9-0 in ACC play, with wins over Duke, Florida State, Louisville, Pitt, Georgia Tech, Clemson, Boston College, North Carolina and Syracuse.
- In 2019, the Irish went undefeated against the ACC, beating Louisville, Virginia, Virginia Tech, Duke and Boston College as part of the scheduling agreement.
- The Irish improved to 24-1 in regular-season games against Atlantic Coast Conference opponents over the last four seasons (2017-21).
- Notre Dame has won nine-straight ACC road games and 12-consecutive ACC home games.
- There have been, and in the future there will be, seasons when the Irish face just four ACC opponents but will eventually even out the agreement by facing six ACC teams in another year (this occurred in 2014 and 2015 and is set to occur in 2021–22 and 2022–23).

**CHICAGO** – The No. 12/10 Notre Dame football team used a big fourth guarter to take down No. 18/15 Wisconsin 41–13 Saturday afternoon at Soldier Field. The Irish outscored the Badgers 31–3 in the game's final frame and a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown from Chris Tyree gave the Irish the lead they did not relinquish. With the win, Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly surpassed Knute Rockne for most wins all-time in Notre Dame history with 106<sup>^</sup>. Late in the fourth guarter, the Irish returned two interceptions for touchdowns by Jack Kiser and Drew White. It is the first time since 2002 against Stanford that the Irish had two interceptions returned for a touchdown in the same game.

### NFL DRAFT

- With nine players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft, Notre Dame Football has totaled 520 draft picks over the tenure of the program. No other college football program has totaled more than the Irish.
- OL Liam Eichenberg (second round, Miami Dolphins), OL Aaron Banks (second round, San Francisco 49ers), LB Jeremiah Owusu-Koramoah (second round, Cleveland Browns), TE Tommy Tremble (third round, Carolina Panthers), OL Robert Hainsey (third round, Tampa Bay Buccaneers), QB Ian Book (fourth round, New Orleans Saints), DL Daelin Hayes (fifth round, Baltimore Ravens), DL Ade Ogundeji (fifth round, Atlanta Falcons) and WR Ben Skowronek (seventh round, Los Angeles Rams) represented the Irish in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- The nine draft picks were the most during the Brian Kelly era and the most all-time since the 1994 draft when 10 players were selected.

### AN-TIMERS

- Throughout the history of the Notre Dame Football Program, 581 total players have spent time on an active NFL roster. To begin the 2021 NFL season, Notre Dame was tied for fourth with 36 players on active NFL rosters. They were tied with Georgia and trailed only LSU (47), Ohio State (50) and Alabama (54).
- So far in 2021, 10 former Irish players have made their debut appearance on a 53-man roster: Aaron Banks, Ian Book, Liam Eichenberg, Robert Hainsey, Daelin Hayes, Nick McCloud, Ade Ogundeji, Jeremiah Owusu-Koramoah, Ben Skowronek and Tommy Tremble.

### BRIAN KELLY-THE DICK CORBETT HEAD FOOT

- Winningest coach in FBS (276° wins)
- One of only four active FBS coaches with more than 300 games as a head coach.
- With the win over North Carolina, Kelly passed Lou Holtz to claim sole possession of second all-time in program history in career wins at Notre Dame.
- Joins Knute Rockne (13), Frank Leahy (11), Ara Parseghian (11) and Lou Holtz (11) as the only Notre Dame coaches to spend 10 or more seasons on the Irish sidelines.
- Only three-time winner of the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award ('09, '12, '18)
- With 10 or more wins in 2012<sup>^</sup>, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020, Kelly is the only Notre Dame coaches to hit the double-digit mark in wins six times.
- With 10-win seasons in five of the last six years, Kelly is the first Irish coach to have five seasons of double-digit wins in a six-year stretch since Lou Holtz from 1988-93.
- Notched his first win over an AP No. 1 team with the 47-40 win over Clemson (Nov. 8, 2020)
- Ranks second in winning percentage among active FBS coaches (.741<sup>^</sup>) who have coached in 300 or more career games (Nick Saban - .799).
- Second-youngest coach to reach 200 career victories at a major school.
- Has finished .500 or better in 28 of 30 seasons as a head coach.
- Boasts a 17–10 record in postseason as a head coach.
- Kelly is the first coach to post four or more shutouts in an Irish career since Lou Holtz.
- With the 52-20 win over Navy in 2019, Kelly became just the third coach in Notre Dame history with three or more wins of at least 25 points over ranked teams. Lou Holtz and Frank Leahy each secured eight such victories. Ara Parseghian and Dan Devine had two such victories apiece.




