

CHALLENGES AWAIT BEARCATS DURING 2006 SEASON

Since Reed Sunahara took over the reigns of the University of Cincinnati volleyball program in 2000, the goals for the Bearcats have been simple, yet lofty. Each year, Sunahara expects his team to compete for a conference championship and make a push for an NCAA Tournament appearance. In that regard, the 2006 season is no different for the Bearcats.

"We are looking to have another good year," the seventh-year head coach says. "Our goal is to win the BIG EAST Championship, that's our goal every year, and to make it to the NCAA Tournament. If we can stay healthy, we have a good shot at reaching those goals."

Last season, Sunahara guided a Bearcat program that had lost two-time All-American Julie DuPont, to a 20-12 record. The 20-win campaign was the 11th

straight for the UC program. But, for the second straight year, the Bearcats missed making the NCAA Tournament and Sunahara and company are squarely focused on stopping that streak at two.

To do that, UC will rely on a mix of experience and youth. Seniors Myanna Hellsten and Noel Olson headline the contingent of veterans. Both have played in every match of their collegiate careers and the duo will be leaned on to lead an otherwise youthful bunch.

Though only a sophomore, middle blocker Jessie Nevitt exploded onto the scene last year and will be an impact player both offensively and defensively this season. In addition to Nevitt, the always improving Jenny Custer is back, giving the Bearcats plenty of reasons to smile in 2006.

"We are a year older, but still young," Sunahara continues. "Despite that, I think we will be a year better this season. With the kids coming in that will add to the nucleus we already have, if the chemistry is good, we will have a great year."

As always, that won't be easy as the Bearcats will be challenged by a tough non-conference schedule, before embarking on the rigors of their second BIG EAST campaign. A total of seven NCAA Tournament qualifiers from last year dot the schedule, including traditional power UCLA and perennial BIG EAST frontrunners Louisville and Notre Dame. UC should benefit from having all but the Cardinals in the friendly confines of Fifth Third Arena, while the BIG EAST Championship will also be held in the venue.

OUTSIDE HITTERS

The story at outside hitter reads nearly the same as it did last year as key losses will leave the Bearcats with a young group. At least two of the starting jobs will be up for grabs, with junior Jenny Custer returning as the only accomplished player in the group.


Custer would appear to have the edge after starting all of last season on the right side. She provided an offensive spark in her first season as a starter, averaging 3.13 kills per game. Custer can expect a push from Schroeder, though.

The two holes that must be filled were held last season by Maria Pongonis (graduated) and Erin Maldo (injured). Pongonis was the squad's MVP and a second team all-conference pick last season after pacing the team with 3.66 kills per game. Maldo was also a factor in her first year as a starter, averaging 2.35 kills per game. She will be sidelined for the entire season after

sustaining an injury during the spring.

Four players will vie for playing time on the outside with any combination of the group getting a shot. Sophomores Jessica Elley and Lindsey Peterson each saw limited time last year, but have gained valuable experience in the off-season. Peterson travelled to Argentina as part of a USA All-Star team and she will try to translate the experience into a starting job at UC. Elley enjoyed an outstanding spring and will also be right in the fold. Redshirt freshman Jami Torok will also challenge after missing all of last season.

The wildcard in the mix will be freshman Katey Schroeder, who can play in the middle, on the outside and at opposite. An all-state performer in high school, she will battle for a job out of the gate.




SETTERS

The Bearcat offense will flow through senior Noel Olson, who will enter 2006 in her third-year as the Bearcats' primary setter. Also in the mix will be freshman Laurie Weber, who will both challenge Olson and provide depth for the Bearcats.

Olson has improved her play each year and averaged a career-best 12.63 assists per game last season to rank second in the BIG EAST. Her consistency and continued improvement will be keys in the team's success in 2006. The addition of Weber will benefit Olson with a push for playing time and a back-up with setting experience for the first time in two years.

Weber was an accomplished setter on the prep level. A former district player of the year, she provides the squad the depth it lacked at the position last year. Weber is a versatile player and could see time as a defensive specialist as well.

The Bearcats also have the benefit of having former setter Jenny Custer in the fold. Though she is an outside hitter by trade, Custer spent the early stages of the 2004 season as a setter in UC's 6-2 alignment and can fill in should the need arise.



MIDDLE BLOCKERS

The middle should be the strength of the team as both of last year's starters return and will be bolstered by a talented freshman.


The returnees are good ones in former conference freshmen of the year Myanna Hellsten and Jessie Nevitt. At 6-3 and 6-2, respectively, the duo should be a force both offensively and defensively in 2006.

Nevitt burst onto the scene last year, turning in one of the top performances ever by a UC freshman. After redshirting in 2004, Nevitt earned a long list of honors, including BIG EAST Rookie of the Year, first team all-conference and honorable mention All-American. Nevitt has the talent both offensively and defensively to be one of the league's premier players

this year. Another season of experience will also be of benefit for her.

Hellsten will try to regain the form that landed her third team all-conference honors in 2003. Already ranked as one of the top blockers in school history, Hellsten saw her kills per game and hitting percentage drop off last season. A resurgence by her will give UC another offensive weapon.

Providing depth in the middle and pushing the incumbents will be Katey Schroeder, one of the city of Cincinnati's top prep players. Sophomore Jessica Elley can also fill in if needed in the middle.



LIBERO/DEFENSIVE SPECIALIST

In its fifth season in women's college volleyball, the libero has proven to be a crucial position for teams across the country.

The Bearcats are in an interesting position with the libero position as last year's starter is gone, but the regular from two years ago returns.


That returnee is team captain Natalie Dossman. Dossman was solid as the libero in 2004, leading the squad with over three digs per game. She spent her sophomore campaign as a defensive specialist, but will be back in the libero battle again this season.

Dossman's biggest competition for playing time will be talented freshman Jaime Frey. A former all-state performer and club standout, Frey will be in the

mix for playing time early on. Classmate Laurie Weber could also see time here.

The duo will fight to fill the role vacated by Melissa Zenz who transferred, despite breaking the UC single season digs mark last year.

The libero is a defensive specialist who can sub in and out of a game without counting against a team's substitution limit, however the player can only play the back line and cannot attack or set. A new rule for the 2004 season allows the libero to serve during one of the team's rotations.
