FOOTBALL OPENS 122ND SEASON WITH BIG EAST CONFERENCE GAME AT RUTGERS

► The University of Cincinnati football team opens its 122nd college football season Monday, facing BIG EAST foe Rutgers at 4 p.m. on Labor Day in a nationally televised ESPN game at newly renovated Rutgers Stadium. Cincinnati enters 2009 on the heels of its most successful year in program history. The Bearcats won a school-record 11 games, claimed its first BIG EAST championship, and played in the FedEx Orange Bowl for the first time. This year's game marks the first time UC has opened a season against a conference foe, and it's the earliest BIG EAST opener since West Virginia defeated Syracuse Sept. 4, 2005.

A UC THUMBNAIL

► UC returns eight offensive starters, including Tony Pike (QB), Jeff Linkenbach (OL), and all-America wideout/kick returner Mardy Gilyard. The Bearcats return only one starter on defense (Aaron Webster), but the depth chart features veteran players who have seen extensive playing time. UC has a new defensive coordinator in Bob Diaco and a new multiple-front defense.

THE SERIES

► Cincinnati and Rutgers meet for the 15th time Monday with Rutgers holding a 7-6-1 advantage. UC has won the past three meetings, including a 13-10 decision at Nippert Stadium a year ago, and four of the last six. Rutgers holds a 6-1 advantage at Rutgers Stadium. The Bearcats 28-23 win in Piscataway in 2007 was UC's first triumph on the Scarlet Knights' home turf.

THE COACHES

► **BRIAN KELLY**, the two-time reigning BIG EAST Coach of the Year, is in his third full season at the helm of the Cincinnati football program with a 22-6 record and a 19-year career mark of 159-57-2. Kelly led the Bearcats to a school-record 11 wins, a BIG EAST Championship, and a Bowl Championship Series game berth in 2008. He won two NCAA Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State and led Central Michigan to the 2006 Mid-American Conference Championship. He is the leader in victories among active BIG EAST coaches and is the only current BIG EAST coach with 150 or more career wins.

► **GREG SCHIANO** is 46-51 in his ninth season with the Scarlet Knights. He is 1-3 against UC.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS

- UC is receiving votes in both the *Associated Press* poll, and *USA Today* Coaches Polls entering the week. The Bearcats closed out the 2008 season ranked No. 17 in both polls.
- Under third-year coach Brian Kelly, Cincinnati had its second straight 10-win season in 2008. Before Kelly arrived, Cincinnati had exactly one 10-win season (1951).
- UC set a school record with its 11 wins in 2008.
- Cincinnati was picked third in the BIG EAST preseason media poll, despite the Bearcats' receiving as many first-place votes (eight) as favorite Pittsburgh.
- The Bearcats will have 10 new starters on defense. The lone returning starter is safety Aaron Webster.
- Quarterback Tony Pike burst onto the scene in 2008, passing for 2,407 yards and 19 touchdowns, completing 61.4 percent of his passes. He earned second-team all-BIG EAST honors.
- Wide receiver Mardy Gilyard caught 81 passes in 2008 for a school-record 1,276 yards and a team-high 11 touchdowns.
- Cincinnati returns its top four runners (Jacob Ramsey, John Goebel, Isaiah Pead, Scott Johnson) from last season.
- Junior Jacob Rogers and freshman Patrick O'Donnell have been battling for the starting punter job, both aiming to replace Kevin Huber, the first two-time first-team AP all-America selection in school history. Huber was a fifth-round draft selection of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2009.

CINCINNATI (AP) - Chazz Anderson ran eight yards for a touchdown on a quarterback draw, and Cincinnati overcame an afternoon of penalties and punts to beat Rutgers 13-10.

Anderson, making his second straight start after injuries wiped out Cincinnati's top quarterbacks, did just enough to help the Bearcats (5-1, 1-0) win their Big East opener.

The Scarlet Knights (1-5, 0-2) are off to their worst start since 2002, when they went 1-11.

Rutgers' touchdown came on a trick play early in the second half. Mike Teel handed off to running back Kordell Young, who ran toward the right sideline and threw a 17-yard pass to uncovered fullback Jack Corcoran.

Cincinnati had 12 penalties for 115 yards - three of them personal fouls - and went 0-for-11 on third downs, resulting in nine punts. With a chance to run out the clock, the Bearcats failed to move the ball and had to punt, giving Rutgers possession at its 12-yard line with 2:10 to go.

The Scarlet Knights let that final chance slip away when Kenny Britt dropped a pass on 4th-and-2 at the Rutgers 30-yard line.

The Bearcats were forced to use two redshirt freshmen at quarterback after senior Dustin Grutza and junior Tony Pike got hurt.

Anderson edged out Zach Collaros for the job, and has led Cincinnati to a pair of wins. He went 21-of-29 for 239 yards against the Scarlet Knights. Teel finished 19-of-35 for 175 yards. Young, who missed the last four games with a sore knee, ran 22 times for 78 yards.

UC IN CONFERENCE & SEASON OPENERS ...

- The Bearcats will open up the season with a conference game for the first time since 2003.
- UC is 2-2 all-time in season opening league games and 1-0 in Labor Day contests.
- This is the third-straight year the Bearcats and Scarlet Knights will open up BIG EAST play against each other.
- UC and Rutgers have squared off twice in Cincinnati to open the season, a 10-7 UC loss in 1987, and a 17-all tie in 1989.
- UC has won four-straight season openers, and two consecutive conference openers.
- The Bearcats are 2-2 all-time in BIG EAST openers.
- UC holds a 6-6 mark in its last 12 league openers.
- In 122 campaigns, UC is 75-37-10 in season openers.

TWO OLD DOGS SQUARING OFF ...

- Cincinnati and Rutgers are two of the five oldest programs in NCAA Football Subdivision history.
- Rutgers started play in 1869, while UC began play in 1885.
- Michigan (1879), Navy (1880), and Minnesota (1883) make up the rest of the top five.

THE OLD SWITCHEROO ...

- Two of UC's defenders, Demetrius Jones and Marcus Waugh played offense a year ago, at quarterback and fullback, respectively.
- Jones is penciled in as the backup at outside linebacker while Waugh is slated to start in at inside linebacker.

JERSEY BOYS ...

- Seven players on the UC roster, along with two assistant coaches are natives of New Jersey.
- Reuben Johnson (Atco), Demetrius Richardson (Marlton), Randy Martinez (Teaneck), Samuel Griffin (Englewood), Craig Parmenter (Ringwood), Lynell Payne (Marlton), and Orion Woodard (Pompton Lakes) all call the Garden State home.
- Defensive coordinator Bob Diaco grew up in Cedar Grove while passing game coordinator/wide receivers coach Charley Molnar is from Morris Plains.

A SEASON TO REMEMBER ...

- UC, the 2008 BIG EAST Conference Champions, achieved a school-record 11 victories, while posting back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in school history.
- The Bearcats also won the school's first outright conference championship since 1964, and earned the school's first berth in a Bowl Championship Series game, playing against Virginia Tech in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Cincinnati held down a postseason ranking of No. 17 in both polls after the bowl season, tying the top postseason ranking in school history and marking the first time UC has ranked in both end-of-season polls in school history.
- UC finished the regular season on a six-game winning streak and captured all three of its rivalry trophies for the first time

in the same season – the Victory Bell (Miami [OH]), Keg Of Nails (Louisville), and River City Rivalry (Pittsburgh).

- Following the close of the regular season, head coach Brian Kelly was named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the second-straight season. He also earned American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Region 1 Coach of the Year honors, and was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year by *Sporting News*.

A LOOK AHEAD ...

- Eight offensive starters return in 2009, including all-America kick returner and wide receiver Mardy Gilyard, and all-BIG EAST quarterback Tony Pike.
- Pike, one of the best success stories in all of college football a year ago, was named second-team all-BIG EAST after completing 61 percent of his passes for 2,407 yards and 19 touchdowns in 10 starts.
- Safety Aaron Webster is the lone returning starter on the defensive side of the ball. Webster had 60 tackles and an interception a year ago.

GILYARD BACK FOR MORE ...

- All-America kick returner and wide receiver Mardy Gilyard, the 2008 BIG EAST Special Teams Player of the Year, made 81 catches for a school-record 1,276 yards and a team-high 11 touchdowns. He also set a school record with 994 kickoff return yards along with a pair of touchdowns.
- In the 2009 FedEx Orange Bowl, Gilyard had seven catches for a school-bowl record 158 yards and a touchdown.

CLOSING OUT GAMES ...

- Since the arrival of head coach Brian Kelly at UC, and the installation of strength and conditioning coach Paul Longo's lifting and conditioning program, UC has become one of the top closing teams in the country.
- Dating back to the 2007 International Bowl, the Bearcats are 21-0 when entering the fourth quarter with a lead.
- When leading after halftime, UC is 19-2.

A WORD ON THE DEFENSE ...

- The UC defense lost 10 starters from a year ago, seven of whom are competing for roster spots in NFL camps.
- While Aaron Webster is the only true returning starter on defense, the cupboard is not bare.
- If UC's depth chart holds to form, the Bearcats will start seven seniors on the defensive side of the ball Monday in Piscataway.
- That's more defensive seniors than three league teams, Connecticut, Pittsburgh, and West Virginia, will field.
- Entering 2008, six of UC's starting defenders were full-time players the previous season.
- Of UC's potential starting 11, all saw significant time a year ago on defense except for Marcus Waugh who was the starting fullback.

THE JUCOS ...

- Wide receiver Jamar Howard and defensive back MJ James are both junior college transfers who joined UC in the offseason.
- Howard is a Cincinnati native who had signed with the Bearcats out of Withrow HS but did not qualify academically.
- James is a Los Angeles native who played at El Camino CC.

FREY RECEIVES SIXTH YEAR FROM NCAA ...

- Safety Drew Frey was granted an extension of eligibility request by the NCAA for the 2012-13 academic year.
- The 20-year old redshirt freshman missed the entire 2007 season and most of the 2008 season due to injury.
- He had earned his first career start at Akron on Sept. 27, 2008 before being injured in that game.

QUARTERBACK CONTINUITY ...

- ▶ Head coach Brian Kelly experienced something heading into the 2009 season that had not happened in his tenure at UC, he returned his starting quarterback.
- ▶ Tony Pike returns for his second season at the reins of the UC offense, after passing for 2,407 yards and 19 touchdowns in 12 games a year ago.
- ▶ He missed two games, and parts of two others due to injury, but the 6-6 signal caller is healthy and has added 15 pounds to his frame, giving him a coat of armor to withstand the rigors of the long season.
- ▶ Pike is already UC's career leader in completion percentage (.610), and should move into the top-10 on most of UC's career passing lists before the season is too old.

DEPTH AT THE SKILL SLOTS ...

- ▶ One of the offensive strengths of the 2009 team is the squad's depth at the offensive skill slots.
- ▶ The Bearcats return their top-four runners from a year ago in Jacob Ramsey (47.4 ypg), John Goebel (43.4 ypg), Isaiah Pead (27.7 ypg), and Scott Johnson (7.9 ypg).
- ▶ Of the 16 players who caught passes for UC a year ago, 14 return, including nine of the top-10 receivers from 2008.

ON THE LINE ...

- ▶ UC returns three starters on the offensive line, including stalwart left tackle Jeff Linkenbach, left guard Jason Kelce, and center Chris Jurek.
- ▶ The trio has combined for 40 starts.
- ▶ Sophomore Alex Hoffman is penciled in to start at right guard while Samuel Griffin earned the starting right tackles slot during preseason camp.

DROUGHTS IN THE RETURN GAME ...

- ▶ Twelve years and 132 games have passed since the Bearcats have run a punt back for a touchdown, tied for the second-longest streak nationally.
- ▶ The last UC player to run a punt back for a score was Tinker Keck, who ran punts of 44 and 78 yards back for touchdowns against Louisville on Nov. 8, 1997.

WAITING IN THE WINGS ...

- ▶ Wide receiver Vidal Hazelton, a USC transfer, will sit out the 2009 season to satisfy NCAA transfer requirements.
- ▶ He will be a senior and have one season to play in 2010.
- ▶ Hazelton played in 23 games for the Trojans, catching 57 balls for 586 yards and four touchdowns.
- ▶ He had appealed to the NCAA for immediate eligibility, but his request was denied.

THE OLD MEN OF THE DEFENSE ...

- ▶ Linebacker Andre Revels and safety Aaron Webster enter the season with 33 career appearances, tops among UC defenders.
- ▶ Revels, who missed spring football due to injury, checks in with 130 career tackles and five pass break ups.
- ▶ Webster, who was rated by Sporting News as the hardest hitter in the BIG EAST, has 81 career stops and two interceptions.

STAFF NOTES ...

- ▶ Defensive coordinator Bob Diaco joined Cincinnati this winter after three years at the University of Virginia.
- ▶ He brings an energetic style to Clifton and installed UC's multiple-front defense during spring workouts.
- ▶ Diaco (pronounced DEE-ah-ko) joined the Virginia staff in Dec. 2005 as the linebackers and special teams coach. Following the close of the 2008 season, he was named the Cavaliers' defensive coordinator. He spent the 2005 season on Brian Kelly's staff at Central Michigan as the co-DC.
- ▶ Defensive backs coach Kerry Coombs was promoted to associate head coach while Mike Elston was named assistant head coach. Elston will switch over to coaching the defensive line in 2009 while continuing in his role as special teams coordinator.
- ▶ Running backs coach Tim Hinton assumed the recruiting coordinator position.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE ...

- ▶ UC won all of its home games in 2008, the first time since 2000 that the Bearcats went undefeated in Nippert Stadium.
- ▶ Eight of the Top-12 crowds in Nippert history, including a stadium record of 35,098 against Pittsburgh in 2008, have occurred during the Brian Kelly era.
- ▶ With an average of 31,964 fans in six home games in 2008, UC established a single-season attendance record, topping the 2007 average of 30,246.
- ▶ During Brian Kelly's tenure as head coach, UC holds a 10-2 mark at Nippert Stadium.

2011 SCHEDULE SHAPING UP ...

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati and University of Tennessee have agreed to a one-game football matchup to take place in Neyland Stadium on Sept. 10, 2011.
- ▶ UT and Cincinnati have met five times, all in Knoxville, with the most recent outcome a 40-0 Vols win in 1992.
- ▶ The other four meetings occurred between 1904 and 1942, and Tennessee leads the overall series 4-1.
- ▶ The Bearcats lone win in the series was the inaugural matchup in 1904, a 35-0 UC decision.
- ▶ UC will open the 2011 season at Nippert Stadium with Albany before heading to Knoxville to play the Vols. Other 2011 non-conference matchups bring Akron and NC State to Nippert with a road trip to Oxford, Ohio for the 116th Battle for the Victory Bell against Miami (OH).

UC EARNS AFCA RECOGNITION ...

- ▶ UC received 2008 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement honorable mention accolades for its recent graduation success rate of over 90 percent for the entering class of 2001.
- ▶ UC was one of seven programs nationally, including Colorado, Duke, Navy, Notre Dame, Rutgers, and Vanderbilt to achieve over the 90 percent plateau.

RECORD-SETTING NFL DRAFT FOR UC ...

- ▶ UC had its best-ever showing in the recent NFL Draft when six former players, Connor Barwin (second-Texans), Kevin Huber (fifth-Bengals), DeAngelo Smith (fifth-Cowboys), Brandon Underwood (sixth-Packers), Mike Mickens (seventh-Cowboys), and Trevor Canfield (seventh-Cardinals) were selected.
- ▶ UC's six overall draft choices was the most in school history, bettering the previous mark of five, which had occurred three times, in 1998, 1960, and 1947.
- ▶ The six selections were the most of any BIG EAST school, and the Bearcats were one of nine institutions in the nation with six or more players drafted.

HEAD COACH BRIAN KELLY

19th season overall | third at Cincinnati

Named the University of Cincinnati's head football coach on Dec. 4, 2006, Brian Kelly has set the bar high at UC and achieved a great deal of success in a short period of time.

Entering his third year at the helm of the UC program, Kelly boasts a 22-6 record and led the Bearcats to their first BIG EAST Conference Championship in 2008.

Cincinnati achieved a school-record 11 victories in 2008, had back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in school history, won the school's first outright conference championship since 1964, and earned the school's first berth in a Bowl Championship Series game, playing against Virginia Tech in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl.

UC earned its best-ever ranking to close the regular season as it was ranked at No. 12 in the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches polls, and the BCS standings entering the Orange Bowl. The Bearcats held down a postseason ranking of No. 17 in both polls, tying the top postseason ranking in school history.

UC finished the regular season on a six-game winning streak and captured all three of its rivalry trophies, the Victory Bell (Miami [OH]), Keg Of Nails (Louisville), and River City Rivalry (Pittsburgh) in the same season for the first time.

Kelly was named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the second-straight season, and also was named the *American Football Monthly* Schutt Sports Football Bowl Subdivision Coach of the Year. He also earned American Football Coaches

Association (AFCA) Region 1 Coach of the Year honors, and was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year by *Sporting News*.

UC placed 10 student-athletes on all-BIG EAST teams, including first-team selection defensive end Connor Barwin, who was a tight end entering spring practice in 2008.

Kick returner Mardy Gilyard was named the BIG EAST Special Teams Player of the Year, the second-straight season a UC player has earned that award, and punter Kevin Huber earned the first AFCA All-America nod in program history. Huber was also the first two-time Associated Press First-Team All-America selection in UC football history.

Through an 18-year head coaching career, Kelly has established a reputation for building winning teams. He has won at every stop along the way, earning a pair of Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State (2002, 2003), winning a Mid-American Conference Championship at Central Michigan in 2006, before leading UC to its first BIG EAST title in 2008. Entering 2009, Kelly boasts a career record of 159-57-2. He is the winningest active BIG EAST coach and the only league coach with more than 150 wins.

Kelly has become one of the most recognizable faces in the Cincinnati area as he has undertaken a grass roots effort to reach the UC fan base and create strong ties to the local community. A sought after public speaker, Kelly has addressed a number of local organizations, unions, civic groups, and has served as the keynote speaker at many high-profile events, including the 2009 Big 33 Football Classic Awards Dinner.
