Cincinnati (7-1, 0-0 BIG EAST) vs. Louisville (9-0, 0-0 BIG EAST)

SETTING THE SCENE: Cincinnati will open its BIG EAST conference season against No. 16 Louisville on Thursday, Dec. 14, the earliest date UC women's basketball has ever started league play. The Dec. 14 date is also the earliest in the season UC has battled Louisville. The 7 p.m. tipoff at Freedom Hall will feature the Bearcats' longest standing rivalry — UC has faced off with Louisville 55 times, squaring off with the Cards more than any other opponent. The Bearcats are riding a two-game win streak into Freedom Hall, including a 92-53 victory over Alabama State on Sunday. Louisville is undefeated, with their most recent win coming against Western Kentucky, 70-58, on Saturday.

STORY LINES:

- ◆ This is the 56th meeting between UC and Louisville. The Cards own a 29-26 edge over UC in the all-time series. Cincinnati won last year, breaking a four-game losing skid. UC won four consecutive games from 2002-2003, including in the first round of the Conference USA Championships on March 2, 2002 and a double overtime, 73-66, thriller on Feb. 16, 2003.
- ◆ The Bearcats are off to a good start at 7-1 going into the game against U of L. The 2001-02 Bearcats rattled off 11 consecutive victories before Louisville ended the streak with a 71-65 upset on Jan. 4, 2002. Cincinnati went on to a 27-5 record that season and earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament.
- ◆ Louisville is 9-0 this season, its best start in school history.
- ◆ UC and the Cardinals have faced off in six conference (Metro and Conference USA) openers with Louisville owning a 5-1 mark. The Bearcats are 9-14 in conference openers spanning the Metro, Great Midwest, Conference USA and the BIG EAST. This is the first BIG EAST conference opener between the two schools. Last season UC opened league play with a 64-51 loss to Rutgers at Fifth Third Arena, while Louisville won its conference opener, 90-73, at Syracuse.
- ◆ The Bearcats and Louisville share one opponent going into the contest. Both defeated Dayton. UC won 65-60 in its third game of the season, while U of L defeated the Flyers, 81-54, in its season opener.

UC LAST TIME OUT:

The Bearcats used a 62-point second half to blow out Alabama State, 92-53. UC only owned a 30-27 lead at the half. Playing a home game away from home, the Bearcats played for the first time at UC Clermont's Cougar Dome, because Fifth Third was being utilized for Cincinnati's Fall Commencement. The 92 points is a season-high, as is the 39-point margin of victory.

- ◆ Shelly Bellman led three players in double figures with 22 points, her second 20+ performance this season and the sixth of her career. She has scored in double figures in all but one game this season and 22 in her career.
- ◆ Michelle Jones had a season-high 15 points, her fourth game this season scoring in double figures and 21st in her career.

- UC out rebounded Alabama State, 43-22, marking the eighth time in eight games the Bearcats have out rebounded their opponent. The Bearcats have a +13.1 rebounding margin over the year, which is third best in the BIG EAST and seventh in the NCAA.
- UC hit a season-high 20 free throws against the Lady Hornets (20-of-29). The Bearcats also had season-highs with 33 field goals made and a 55 percent field goal percentage.

BEARCATS DATA

- The Bearcats have won the battle of the boards in all eight of their games this season. They own a +13.1 rebounding margin. The UC single-season record is a +6.7 margin.
- Senior Treasure Humphries has had at least three assists in seven of the Bearcats' eight games. She leads the team with 4.75 per game. She needs one assist to reach 200 in her career. The Bearcats are averaging 18.75 assists per game, leading the BIG EAST in that category and 10th in the NCAA.
- Humphries has scored in double figures in four games this season and 35 in her career.
- Sophomore Shelly Bellman averaged 19.5 ppg and 5.5 rpg and was named to the all-tournament team of the Mildred and Roger L. White Invitational. She is the team's leading scorer (15.4) and rebounder (7.3).
- Bellman has scored in double figures in all but one game this season and in 22 of 37 career games. Bellman has had two double-doubles this season with 14 points and 11 rebounds against St. Francis (11/22/06) and 13 points and 13 rebounds against Murray State (11/28/06). She has three in her career and has grabbed at least 5 rebounds in every game this season.
- Sophomore Angel Morgan played the entire 40 minutes and scored a career-high 18 points, vaulting UC to a 74-57 win over Murray State. The win gave head Coach Laurie Pirtle her 300th at Cincinnati.
- Senior Karen Twehues is currently third all-time in career 3-point field goals with 149. She has made 14 this season. She leads the Bearcats in 3-point field goal percentage at 41 percent.
- The Bearcats have had at least three players score in double figures in every game this season, including five in Cincinnati's 83-51 win over St. Francis (Pa.).
- Junior Emy Ogide is averaging 8.6 points a game this season, well above her career average

Treasure Humphries scored 11 points in the final six minutes and Micah Harvey recorded her first double-double as the backcourt led Cincinnati over Louisville, 76-65, in front of a season-high crowd. The lead changed hands four times in the first 10 minutes of the second stanza. UC led by two when Humphries capped a 6-0 run by blocking a shot, grabbing the rebound and beating everyone down the court to lay it in for a 60-52 lead. After the Cards got within four with 3:14 to play, Harvey hit a trey and Humphries followed with a three-point play to push the lead to 10 with 2:18 left.

- The Bearcats extended their home-opener winning streak to 11 with the win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff.
- Cincinnati has held six of its eight opponents to less than 65 points and is averaging 62.5 points allowed this season. The Bearcats held St. Francis (Pa.) to 51 points, a season low.

- Angel Morgan is 3 rebounds shy of the 100-rebound milestone (97).
- Treasure Humphries is 5 steals shy of 150 career thefts (145) and needs 1 assist to reach 200 (199).
- Shelly Bellman needs 2 assists to reach the 100 mark (98).
- Karen Twehues has 149 career 3-point field goals, taking over third place on the all-time career list. Madinah Slaise was third with 146.
- Emy Ogide is 12 points shy of reaching 200 (188) in her career and 5 rebounds shy of 150 (145).
- Michelle Jones is 4 rebounds shy of reaching 200 career rebounds (196).

Monday, Dec. 18. UC has played host to two other Southwestern Athletic Conference teams and are 2-0 against the SWAC this season.

ABOUT THE BEARCATS:

- ◆ Senior Treasure Humphries has led the Bearcats in steals her junior and freshman years. She was a second team All-BIG EAST performer last season.
- ◆ Senior Karen Twehues provides a strong outside threat for the Bearcats. She has 149 career 3-pointers, third in UC history, and coming into this season her .378 career 3-point percentage is second in the record books.
- ◆ Junior Emy Ogide was named the most improved player during practice. She did not start playing basketball until her sophomore year of high school. The athletic post player can govern the paint and open up the perimeter.
- ◆ The five sophomores, Shelly Bellman, Michelle Jones, Angel Morgan, Kahla Roudebush and Jill Stephens, tabbed the 'Fab Five' were a top 10 recruiting class. They learned plenty about Division I basketball last season with 68 starts between them.
- ◆ The freshman class of Carla Jacobs, Natasha Graboski and Stephanie Stevens is also a highly touted group. Jacobs (D-III) and Stevens (D-I) were both honored as Ohio High School Basketball Players of the Year. Graboski earned second team all-state honors.

36th SEASON OF UC WOMEN'S HOOPS: The 2006-07 season marks Cincinnati's 36th year of varsity competition. The 2005-06 squad gave UC its 500th victory on Dec. 3, 2005 during the fifth game of the season, an 82-48 win over Eastern Illinois. UC's all-time record is 518-450, seventh most wins among BIG EAST schools. Under head coach Laurie Pirtle the Bearcats are 300-287 and have made postseason appearances in eight of the last nine years.

UC IN THE BIG EAST: Cincinnati enters its second season as a member of the expanded BIG EAST Conference. In the preseason polls of the league's coaches the Bearcats were picked to finish 12th among the 16 teams. The Bearcats have compiled a record of 71-77 against the current BIG EAST membership. Last year UC finished 11th in the regular season race with a 7-9 ledger and earned a berth to the BIG EAST Championships.

SURVEY OF SCORING AND STARTS: The Bearcats return 78 percent of their scoring from last season, including the three scoring leaders - senior Treasure Humphries (12.8 ppg) and sophomores Shelly Bellman (10.9) and Michelle Jones (9.1). Humphries and Bellman started every game last season, while Jones played in all 29 games and started 17.
