News Headlines

Georgetown investigating hazing

Georgetown University is currently conducting two investigations within its Track and Field teams. The investigations concern forms of hazing, racial bias, and sexual harassment.

The men's Track and field team came under question after a student associated with the group sent out a video in April for the "Hoya Snaxa Awards," which awards team members points for performing degenerate acts. The controversy intensified after another member of the team filed a complaint about the awards and sexual harassment in the locker room.

The school's Office of Institutional Diversity, Equity and Affirmative Action began its own investigation into the track program after a sprinter on the team wrote a post claiming she and other members of the team were treated unfairly, which resulted in several minority athletes leaving the team.

The track and field team's head coach has not been placed on administrative leave by the school while the investigations are ongoing, and Georgetown University said that it hopes to have the racial bias and sexual misconduct reviews completed very soon.

Music artist Drake has been issued a cease & desist letter from Kentucky's Compliance department

Big Blue Madness is a major event on Kentucky's campus that also assists as a recruiting tool for big time high-school players. The NCAA has so many different rules about how schools can go about the recruiting process, and apparently Kentucky specifically warned Drake, who was at the event, not to interact with any of those high-schoolers.

Sadly, Drake did come across some PSA's and "took pics," as head coach John Calipari put it, with "a couple guys." The result? An odd violation and a letter Drake probably never even saw.

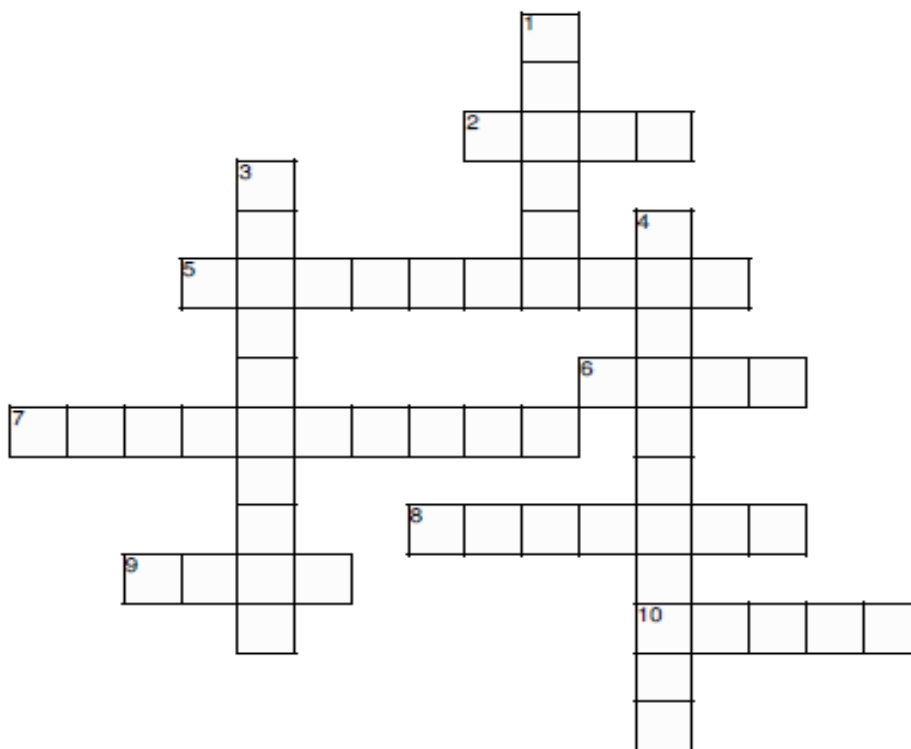

Knott Wright University Question of the Month

According to NCAA Bylaw 13.6.1 An institution must have written departmental policies related to official visits that apply to prospective student-athletes, student hosts, coaches and other athletics administrators that are approved by the institution's president or chancellor and kept on file at the institution and conference office. The institution is responsible for the development and enforcement of appropriate policies and penalties regarding specified areas, as identified by the NCAA Division 1 Board of Directors.

Tip of the Month

JumpForward has customizable columns that you can tailor to include information that is pertinent to your program. There are 31 different fields to choose from that can be made visible anytime you are looking at your prospect database. They are all specific to your login only, so you won't be changing anything for your fellow coaches.

- 1.) Log into JF and along the top go to DATABASES and then PROSPECTS (if it doesn't automatically go there upon login).
- 2.) At the bottom right, click on EDIT COLUMNS which will open the COLUMN CHOOSER.
- 3.) Click the checkbox next to the field you want visible and click SAVE.

You can also order the columns however you like by moving the checked fields up or down in the COLUMN CHOOSER. For example, if you would like to see your prospects beginning with their last name as the first column make sure LAST NAME is the at the very top before saving.
