King figured in six touchdowns (four passing, two rushing) in Houston's 45-18 win against Arizona. He was 17 of 34 for 246 yards and added 31 rushing yards on five carries, helping Houston race to a 38-0 lead on its way to the win.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sean Williams • Navy • Sr. • S • Memphis, Tenn.

Williams had a team-high nine tackles and two forced fumbles to lead Navy to a 22-21 win against Memphis. Williams led a Navy defense that forced four Memphis turnovers and kept the Tigers off the scoreboard in the fourth quarter.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Terrence Horne Jr. • USF • Fr. • WR • Miramar, Fla.

Horne became the first player in American Athletic Conference history to have two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a game as he helped USF to a 49-38 win against Georgia Tech. Horne finished with a conference-record 264 yards on five kickoff returns.

We're Streaking

UCF's 15-game winning streak is the longest active winning streak nationally and ties for the longest in American Athletic Conference history. Memphis also won 15 straight from Oct. 25, 2014, to Nov. 7, 2015.

Perfection

UCF finished the 2017 season as the nation's only unbeaten team. The Knights, who went 13-0, became the first FBS team to finish a season without a loss since Florida State went 14-0 in 2013.

Pow6rful Stuff

The American has 30 nonconference victories against other Power 6 opponents (including Notre Dame) since the start of the 2015 season, the first year of The American's current membership.

The Big Stage

UCF's 34-27 win against Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl improved American Athletic Conference teams to 3-0 all-time in New Year's Six Bowls.

Three For Three

The American Athletic Conference, the Big Ten and the Big 12 are the only conferences that have had at least three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons.

Pac Mentality

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 4-0 against the Pac-12 since the start of last season.

Perfect 10

The American Athletic Conference has had three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons. USF, Temple, Tulsa hit double figures in 2016, while UCF, Memphis and USF won at least 10 games each in 2017.

Scoreboard Watching

The American Athletic Conference featured the nation's top two scoring offenses in 2017. UCF led the nation with 48.2 points per game, while Memphis was second at 45.5 ppg.

Line In The Sand

Tulsa held Central Arkansas to O-for-10 efficiency on third down in Week 1. The Golden Hurricane ranks 11th nationally in opponents' third down conversion percentage (.227).

Road Warriors

Navy will travel 26,496 miles for its eight games away from Annapolis this season, the most mileage for any college football team in the continental United States.

Triskaidekaphobia

Houston has registered two 13-win seasons since 2011, most recently in 2015.

Matters Of Efficiency

Memphis scored touchdowns on its first eight possessions in its 66-14 win against Mercer. UCF scored on eight of its nine possessions that were not ended by the halftime or final gun in its season-opening win at UConn.

The Closers

Houston scored the last 28 points of the game in its 45-27 win against Rice. Tulsa scored the final 14 points of its 38-27 win against Central Arkansas. USF, meanwhile had the last 21 points of its 49-38 win against Georgia Tech.

Separation Of Powers

In the last four regular seasons (2015-18), the American Athletic Conference is a combined 32-10 against teams from Conference USA, the MAC, the Mountain West and the Sun Belt.

Repeat Performances

For the second consecutive season, The American is the only FBS conference to return its players of the year on offense (UCF QB McKenzie Milton), defense (Houston DT Ed Oliver) and special teams (Memphis WR Tony Pollard).

Including Postseason

Including bowl games, The American has had a combined 62 games with more than one million television and streaming viewers since the start of the 2015 season. Cincinnati's win at UCLA in Week 1 was the first such game of the 2018 season.

Welcome Aboard

The American Athletic Conference has two new head coaches for the 2018 season. Josh Heupel, the former offensive coordinator at Missouri and Oklahoma, takes over as head coach at UCF. Sonny Dykes, the former head coach at California and Louisiana Tech, is manning the sidelines at SMU.

Heisman Hopefuls

UCF and Houston have launched formal Heisman Trophy campaigns on behalf of their most prominent players. Here is a look at how each has fared in 2018.

$\mathsf{McKenzie\ Milton \cdot QB \cdot UCF}$

Finished eighth in the Heisman voting in 2017. Of the seven players who finished higher in the voting, only Stanford RB Bryce Love (second) and Wisconsin RB Jonathan Taylor (sixth) return in 2018

Has completed 45 of 71 passes (63.4 percent) for 589 yards and six touchdowns and three interceptions.

Ed Oliver \cdot DT \cdot Houston

Consensus All-America and Outland Trophy winner in 2017.

Tabbed as the No. 1 player in college football by ESPN, CBS Sports and Sports Illustrated

Has 18 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss, six quarterback hurries and one pass defended in two games.

Fifth Anniversary Team

Twenty-two players on NFL rosters are among the 30 current and former American Athletic Conference players who have been named to the American Athletic Conference Fifth Anniversary Football Team.



Voting for the team was conducted in late June and early July. The team was selected based on three components – a fan vote, a vote of local and national media members, and a vote of the conference's 12 football programs.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

The American Bowl Lineup

In addition to the College Football Playoff and New Year's Bowls, The American has either a primary or secondary affiliation with 12 bowl games during its current sixyear bowl cycle, which ends following the 2019 season. The American works annually with its member schools and bowl partners to create the most sensible and attractive postseason matchups.

The Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference each year in the current cycle.

The Birmingham Bowl takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will annually face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl is played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Florida. The American Athletic Conference will supply a team to the bowl during each year of the six-year cycle. Conference USA will play in the game in 2015, 2017 and 2019, while the Atlantic Coast Conference provides the opposing team in 2014, 2016 and 2018.

The Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl began in 2014 and will feature an American Athletic Conference team three times during the six-year cycle at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from Conference USA in 2018.

The Frisco Bowl will be played for the second time in 2018 as the former Miami Beach Bowl was relocated to Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas, An American Athletic Conference plays in the bowl each year.

The AutoNation Cure Bowl made its debut in 2015 at the newly renovated Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl is played at Amon G. Carter Stadium on the campus of Texas Christian University. The American Athletic Conference sends a team to the bowl in 2014, 2016 and 2018. The opponent will be a Big 12 team in 2016 and 2018, with Conference USA as a secondary affiliation.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tennessee, and the Duck Commander Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Louisiana, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.


