The Friars also lost to Rutgers in their only league contest so far and are 5-7 on the year and on a four-game winning streak.

STORYLINES:

- The Bearcats are still looking for their first win in the BIG EAST Conference.
- UC has won two-straight road games. The last three-game road winning streak for the Bearcats was in February of the 2002-03 season.
- UC's five freshmen have scored 48 percent of the points for the team and grabbed 48 percent of the rebounds.
- The Bearcats rank first in the BIG EAST and fourth in the nation with a +12.3 rebounding margin, posting a double-digit margin in eight games.
- Micah Harvey is five points away from 500 for her career and Treasure Humphries is 13 away.
- Anne Stephens is recording 13.3 points and 6.5 rebounds over her last four games. She is 15 points away from 700 for her career and five rebounds short of 400.
- Providence, which managed just one win last season, has won its last four. The Friars are 2-4 at home. Junior guard Shauna Snyder is scoring 13.4 points per game after missing the first seven contests due to injury.
- The Friars and Bearcats both fell to Rutgers in their league-openers. Infact, both led the Scarlet Knights at halftime and lost by 13.
- Providence freshman guard Catherine Bove attended Ursuline Academy in Cincinnati.
- Providence is one of seven BIG EAST schools which UC has never played.

Laurie Pirtle (Ohio State '80)

Seymore is the eighth women's head coach in Providence history, taking over a program which has made four trips to the NCAA Tournament. He served as an assistant coach for the Friar men's team for the last five years.

UC was outscored 36-18 in the second half of a 64-51 loss to No. 8 Rutgers in the first ever BIG EAST game for the Bearcats. They were held to 25 percent shooting in the second half and at one point went seven minutes without a field goal. The Scarlet Knights used that time to turn a 39-34 deficit into a 46-41 lead with 8:35 left. RU scored eight-straight points to take a commanding, 56-45, lead with six minutes left. Fourteen of Michelle Campbell's game-high 21 points came in the second half. The Bearcats scored 17 points off of 10 first-half turnovers by RU to take a 33-28 lead into halftime.

- The loss snapped an eight-game winning streak for UC and a 10-game home winning streak.
- The Bearcats were held to season-lows in points (51), rebounds (31), free throws (15), free throws made (5) and free throw percentage (.333).

ATTACKING THE BOARDS: The Bearcats have dominated the rebounding category this year, averaging a +12.3 margin, best in the BIG EAST and fourth in the country. UC has won the rebounding battle in every game except Indiana and posted a double-digit margin in eight of 12 games. The top four rebounders on the team are freshmen Shelly Bellman (6.3/g), Jill Stephens (4.6/g) and Michelle Jones (4.3/g), and senior Anne Stephens (4.9/g). UC has 179 offensive rebounds and has allowed just 119. This has resulted in the Bearcats averaging 13.9 second chance points per game and allowing just 8.9.

FULL SPEED AHEAD: Junior Treasure Humphries led UC in steals as a freshman and was fourth on the team in scoring. Last year she tore her ACL in the preseason and despite coming back after just four months, was not herself the rest of the year. This year she is off to a flying start, leading the team in scoring (15.3/g), assists (3.3/g) and steals (3.1/g) and ranking fifth in rebounding (3.3/g). Humphries has scored in double-figures in nine of 12 games this year and averaged 20.1 over the five games prior to Rutgers. She is 12-of-24 from behind the arc this year to raise her career percentage to .377, second in UC history.

COMPUTERS LIKE THE CATS: In the latest rankings published by Jerry Palm at CollegeRPI.com, the Bearcats are rated 27th in the nation with the 56th-toughest schedule. UC entered the Rutgers game ranked 23rd on the *Collegiate Basketball News* RPI Report and Jeff Sagarin's ranking have the Bearcats at 59th.

ROAD WEARY: Of UC's last 47 losses, 30 have occurred away from Cincinnati. UC has lost 20 of its last 24 road games, but is 2-1 this year. The Bearcats are averaging 9.2 fewer points in their three road games this year than at home.

BIG OFF THE BENCH: Sophomore Emy Ogide provided a spark to the UC offense at critical points in the games at Dayton and Oregon State. At Dayton on Dec. 22, she scored six-straight points for UC to thwart a second-half comeback attempt by the Flyers. At Oregon State she scored all five of her points in an 11-3 first-half run to erase a seven-point Beaver lead. Ogide has made 6-of-9 shots in the last two games and averaged 6.5 points and 3.0 rebounds.

START OF SOMETHING NEW: Last Tuesday's game marked the beginning of UC's first season in the BIG EAST. The BIG EAST is the fourth conference which the Bearcats have been a member of following the Metro (1981-82 to 1990-91), the Great Midwest (1991-92 to 1994-95) and Conference USA (1995-96 to 2004-05). UC is 128-157 all-time in conference games. The Bearcats are now 8-15 in their history in conference openers and 1-3 in their inaugural games in a new conference.

BEARCATS HONORED BY BIG EAST: On Dec. 19, Michelle Jones and Treasure Humphries became the first Bearcat women honored by the BIG EAST. Jones was named Freshman of the Week for her role in wins over Texas-Arlington and Indiana, while Humphries was named to the Weekly Honor Roll. Jones averaged 14 points and eight rebounds for the week, setting a career-high with 17 points and seven rebounds vs. UTA and adding 11 points and nine rebounds vs. Indiana. Humphries averaged 22.0 points, 5.0 assists, 2.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals in the two games. Against UTA she set a career high with 23 points and handed out six assists with five rebounds and in the win over the Hoosiers she posted 21 points, four assists and three steals. Humphries was also named to the honor roll following her 22-point performance at Oregon State.

CHANGE HAS NOT BEEN GOOD: The Bearcats are hoping to avoid the letdown that has occurred the other three times they began play in a new conference. In 1983-84, UC went 16-12, but won just three of 10 Metro Conference games. 1991-92 saw the Bearcats repeat that 3-7 mark in their initial year in the Great Midwest Conference while going 11-17 overall. In Conference USA's inaugural season, 1995-96, UC went 4-10 in the new league and 8-19 overall.

THE ART OF THE STEAL: As a freshman, Treasure Humphries led the Bearcats with 44 steals. After playing with an injured knee most of last season, she is back to her old tricks in 2005-06. She is currently averaging 3.08 steals per game, best in the BIG EAST and 26th in the nation. Humphries has made at least four thefts in four games, including seven against Fordham, which is tied for the second-most ever by a Bearcat.

HOME SWEET HOME: Since Fifth Third Arena became the home of UC basketball in 1989, the Bearcats have gone 158-83 (.656) on their home court. Over the past nine years they have a home record of 111-29 (.793). Their 10-game home winning streak ended by Rutgers is tied for the fourth-longest in school history. UC went 15-1 at home in 2001-02, the best-ever mark. The Bearcats put together a school-record 21-game home win streak from Jan. 1, 2002 until a loss to Tulane on Feb. 2, 2003.

UNQUESTIONED LEADER: Head Coach Laurie Pirtle, in her 20th year, is UC's all-time leader in coaching wins and on Feb. 21, 2002, she earned her 250th win leading the Bearcats. She is one of six BIG EAST coaches with at least 275 wins at their current school. On Feb. 20, 2004 against East Carolina Pirtle became the 54th active coach to win 350 games in a career.

OFFENSIVE BEARCATS: UC has scored over 70 points in eight of 12 games this year, surpassing the three times that it happened all last season. The 69.6 scoring average is a vast improvement on the 57.1 points per game scored last season. UC is shooting .449 from the field and .703 from the line compared to .382 and .662 last year.

- **Carla Jacobs (5-8, G, Shaker Heights, Ohio)** led Regina High School to its fifth state championship in six years last year after missing the previous season with a knee injury. The first team all-state selection is listed as the fourth-best point guard in the nation by *All-Star Girls Report*. Last year she averaged 18.5 points, 4.2 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 3.4 steals per game

- **Stephanie Stevens (5-7, G, Pickerington, Ohio)** has earned all-district honors three times and last season was named first team all-county and all-conference. She averaged 14.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 4.9 assists per game and led Pickerington Central to a third sectional championship during her career.

- **Natasha Graboski (6-3, C, Upper Sandusky, Ohio)** has twice been named all-district in Division II at Upper Sandusky High School. Last year she carded averages of 14.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 3.5 blocks per game to earn first team all-league honors.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: Despite scoring over 70 points in eight of 12 games, the Bearcats have just one player averaging double-figure scoring. UC has done it with balance as six players are averaging at least 5.9 points per game. In five of 12 games this year, four Bearcats have scored in double-figures, and UC averages 24.7 points per game off the bench.

NEW FACES: Cincinnati moves to the BIG EAST Conference this year. The Bearcats have a 60-72 record (.455) vs. current members of the BIG EAST. They have yet to play Connecticut, Georgetown, Providence, St. John's, Seton Hall or Villanova.

HIGHLY TOUTED: The Bearcat roster features five freshmen — Shelly Bellman, Michelle Jones, Angel Morgan, Kahla Roudebush and Jill Stephens — who make up what was ranked as the 10th best recruiting class in 2005 by the *All-Star Girls Report*. The class has lived up to its billing as the five have accounted for 48 percent of UC's points and rebounds.

- Bellman has started each game and leads the Bearcats in rebounding (6.3/g) and is second in points, assists and steals.
- Jones is third on the team in points (9.0/g) and fourth in rebounds (4.3/g), and is shooting .548 from the floor. She was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Week after averaging 14.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in wins over UTA and Indiana.
- Morgan has started three games and is sixth on the team in rebounding (2.6/g) and third in assists (1.3/g).
- Roudebush has started six games and poured in a season-high 16 points with four rebounds at Xavier.
- Stephens has started each game and is third on the team in rebounding (4.6/g) and fourth in scoring (8.7/g). Against Detroit she posted her first double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

MAKING THEM COUNT: Three-pointers account for just 15 percent of UC's shots and 12 percent of its points, compared to 29 percent and 26 percent last season. When the Bearcats do take threes, they are making them count, however. Since the season-opener, in which UC made just 1-of-12 triples, the Bearcats are shooting .371 (33-89) from behind the arc. Treasure Humphries and Micah Harvey are a combined 17-of-36 on three-pointers.

REACHING A MILESTONE: The Bearcats' win over Eastern Illinois on Dec. 3 was the 500th victory in school history. With an all-time record of 506-439 record, UC has the seventh-most wins among BIG EAST schools.

GETTING TO THE LINE: Last year UC averaged just 14.7 free throw attempts per game and shot just .662 from the line. This year has gotten off to a much improved start as the Bearcats are averaging 21.2 attempts per game and making a .703 of them. Treasure Humphries at .734 ranks ninth in the league as nine Bearcats are shooting .700 or better.

STRONG SCHEDULE: The Bearcats will play 13 games this year against teams that reached the postseason in 2005. Included in the strong home schedule are match-ups with Elite 8 finisher Rutgers, 2001 national champion Notre Dame and regional rivals Louisville, Pittsburgh and West Virginia. Currently, four 2005-06 opponents — No. 7 Connecticut, No. 8 Rutgers, No. 11 DePaul and No. 12 Notre Dame — are ranked in the top 25 and five others are getting votes in at least one of the polls. Cincinnati's 2005-06 opponents compiled a 426-361 record in 2004-05 for a .541 winning percentage.

SISTER ACT: Sisters Anne (Sr.) and Jill (Fr.) Stephens are one of 14 sets of siblings playing together in Division I in 2005-06. At 6-4 and 6-3 in height, they are tied with the Adair twins (George Washington) and Paris twins (Oklahoma) for the tallest sibling duo in the nation. Anne was named Conference USA Sixth Player of the Year last year, while Jill was ranked as one of the top 50 players in her class.

COACHES FAVOR SCARLET KNIGHTS: In the annual preseason poll of the league's coaches, Rutgers was picked to win the BIG EAST in 2005-06, narrowly edging Connecticut. Rutgers guard Cappie Pondexter was named the preseason Player of the Year. The Bearcats were picked to finish 15th, just behind Syracuse and Pittsburgh.

TOP 10 CATS: Seniors Anne Stephens and Micah Harvey and juniors Karen Twehues and Treasure Humphries are seeing the results of their careers in the UC record books. Stephens now has 53 career blocks to rank ninth in school history. Harvey has handed out 353 assists in her career, which is fifth all-time. Twehues has made 95 three-pointers with a .351 percentage to rank fifth in UC annals in both and Humphries is now shooting .377 from three in her career, second-best ever.

TRADITION OF SUCCESS: Last year broke a string of seven-straight postseason appearances for the Bearcats. This era accounted for all but two of the postseason appearances in school history. Four of the seven were to the WNIT, including 2004. Cincinnati has also enjoyed 20-win seasons in five of the last eight years and winning years in seven of the last nine.

EXPERIENCED CATS: The Bearcats entered last season with just 71 games of starting experience, with 49 of those coming from Anne Stephens and Micah Harvey. They entered this year boasting 154 returning starts spread among seven players. Harvey led with 44 and Stephens had 36 starts. The nine returners combined for 350 games of playing experience.

YET STILL YOUNG: Despite those 350 games played, the UC roster still boasts nine players who are freshmen or sophomores. The five true freshmen on the squad were named the 10th best recruiting class of 2005 by the *All-Star Girls Report*.

UP NEXT: The Bearcats continue the gauntlet of BIG EAST basketball when they face No. 7 Connecticut on Thursday, Jan. 12 at the Hartford Civic Center at 7 p.m.
