OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jalen McCleskey • Tulane • Sr. • WR • Covington, La.
McCleskey scored the game-winning touchdown on a 53-yard catch and run with three seconds left in regulation to give Tulane a 38-31 victory against Houston. McCleskey finished the game with four receptions for a game-high 120 yards and two touchdowns.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Cooper Edmiston • Tulsa • Sr. • LB • Gatesville, Texas
Edmiston had a team-high nine tackles, including the pivotal defensive play in the final minute of Tulsa's 24-21 win against previously unbeaten Wyoming. With the Cowboys threatening for the go-ahead touchdown, Edmiston registered a forced fumble at the 3-yard line with 50 seconds left to give Tulsa the ball and clinch the win.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jake Verity • ECU • Jr. • K • Bremen, Ga.
Verity accounted for 13 of the Pirates' 19 points as ECU evened its record at 2-2 with a 19-7 win against William & Mary. Verity scored the last 12 points of the game, breaking a 7-7 tie with four field goals, connecting from 31, 33, 22 and 45 yards.

To Be The Best ...

American Athletic Conference teams have played eight games against top-25 opponents in 2019. Conference teams have faced three top-10 teams this season.

Home Is Where The Wins Are

UCF has won 17 straight home games, trailing only Alabama (28) and Clemson (18) for the nation's longest active streak.

Comforts Of Home

American Athletic Conference teams are a combined 21-3 in home games this season.

It's Been A While

SMU is 4-0 for the first time since 1984. Tulane is 3-1 through four games for the first time since 2003.

The Gauntlet

Tulsa's first four opponents were all unbeaten going into their games against the Golden Hurricane. If SMU wins its next game against USF, then Tulsa will have faced five consecutive teams without a loss. The Golden Hurricane has handed two teams (San Jose State, Wyoming) their first (and only) losses of the season.

Any Way You Want It

Navy, not surprisingly, leads the nation in rushing, averaging 371.5 rushing yards per game. The Midshipmen rank second nationally in pass efficiency at 235.91, trailing Oklahoma (244.66).

The Not-So-Friendly Skies

Memphis leads the nation in pass defense, in terms of yards allowed. The Tigers have allowed 110.0 passing yards per game.

Two Steps Back

USF ranks second nationally in tackles for loss, registering 11.0 TFL per game. The Bulls are tied with Ohio State and trail only Illinois (11.5).

Keeping Up With Jones

SMU RB Xavier Jones has eight rushing touchdowns through four games, trailing only Oklahoma State's Chuba Hubbard (nine) for the national lead.

Signal Callers

Ten of The American's 12 teams returned their primary starting quarterback from last season. Only UConn and SMU entered the 2019 season without their primary starter from last year.

Rank And File

Six American Athletic Conference teams – half of the conference's membership – were either ranked or received votes in the Sept. 15 national polls.

Multifaceted

Houston quarterback D'Eriq King has at least one rushing touchdown and one touchdown pass in an NCAA-record 15 consecutive games.

This Is Our House

Home teams were a combined 30-18 in American Athletic Conference games in 2018. The home team is 2-0 in conference games this season (Navy over ECU and Tulane over Houston).

It's East vs. West

The American's East Division finished the 2018 season with a 10-8 head-to-head record against the league's West Division, marking the first time in the four-year history of the conference's two-division format that the East had the better head-to-head record. West Division teams hold a 38-34 all-time lead against East Division opponents since 2015.

Prognostication

The 2018 season was the first in which both preseason favorites in The American's East (UCF) and West (Memphis) divisions went on to win division titles.

Conference Call

UCF has won 18 consecutive games against American Athletic Conference opponents since the start of the 2017 season. That is the longest active winning streak nationally for any team in its conference. Clemson ranks second with 16 straight wins against ACC teams, while Alabama has defeated 12 straight SEC opponents.

This Goes To 11

Cincinnati is 13-3 since the start of the 2018 season.

New Wave

Tulane won five of its last six games of the 2018 season and is 3-1 to start the 2019 campaign, giving the Green Wave eight wins in its last 10 games.

Giant Killers

SMU has won its last two games against top-25 teams. Temple has won two of its last three against top-25 teams, while Houston is 8-3 in its last 11 games against ranked teams.

The 2019 Championship

The 2019 American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be played Saturday, Dec. 7, at 3:30 p.m. ET and will be televised nationally on ABC for the fifth consecutive season.



The championship will be played between the champions of the East and West divisions, based on the highest winning percentage in conference games.

The site of the championship will be the home venue of the division winner with the highest winning percentage in conference games.

The following tiebreakers are in place for the 2019 season.

Two-Team Tie for Divisional Championship

- Head-to-head result
- Divisional winning percentage
- Head-to-head results within the division against the team with the next best conference winning percentage, in descending order
- Winning percentage against common non-divisional conference opponents
- College Football Playoff Selection Committee rankings, provided that team wins in the final weekend of the regular season. If the higher-ranked team loses in the final weekend, then a composite average of computer rankings will determine the divisional champion.
- Overall winning percentage, excluding exempt games
- Coin toss

Multiple-Team Tie for Divisional Championship

The following is used to eliminate teams until two teams remain, at which point the two-team tiebreaker is used

- If one team defeated all other teams, it will be the divisional champion
- If two teams defeated the other tied team(s), the defeated team(s) is eliminated
- Divisional winning percentage
- Head-to-head results within the division against the team with the next best conference winning percentage, in descending order
- Winning percentage against common non-divisional conference opponents

- Tulane had 325 rushing yards against Houston, extending the Green Wave's streak to 44 consecutive games with at least 100 rushing yards, dating to the end of the 2015 season.
- QB Justin McMillan is 8-2 as Tulane's starter.
- The Green Wave has a bye in Week 5 and resumes play Oct. 5 at Army.

- Tulsa has registered 11 come-from-behind victories in five seasons under coach Philip Montgomery.
- Tulsa has an open date in Week 5. The Golden Hurricane begins American Athletic Conference play Oct. 5 at SMU.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a big success. Fans, including many who are new to the sport, enjoy it. The first College Football Playoff semifinals and national championship were the three most-viewed programs in cable television history.

Every Game Counts

The playoff preserves the excitement and significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Four Teams

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Two Games, One Goal

The kickoff of the new year belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl and Sugar Bowl. The two teams winning the playoff semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. That game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are: Rob Mullens (chair), Frank Beamer, Paola Boivin, Jeff Bower, Joe Castiglione, Herb Deromedi, Ken Hatfield, Chris Howard, Bobby Johnson, Ronnie Lott, Gene Smith, Todd Stansbury, and Scott Stricklin.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

The **Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman** takes place at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Maryland, while the events and activities surrounding the game are based in Washington, D.C. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2019.

The **Birmingham Bowl** takes place at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. The American/Big East has partnered with the bowl since its inception in the 2006 season. The American Athletic Conference will face an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl** is played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Florida. Conference USA will provide the opponent for The American's team in the 2019 season.

The **Cheribundi Boca Raton Bowl** began in 2014 and is played at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Florida. The American representative will play a team from the Mid-American Conference in 2019.

The **Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl** will be played for the third time in 2019. An American Athletic Conference team will face an opponent to be determined at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas.

The **AutoNation Cure Bowl** made its debut in 2015 at Exploria Stadium in Orlando, Florida. An American Athletic Conference team will be paired against an opponent from the Sun Belt Conference. Net proceeds from the game will benefit the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

The **SoFi Hawaii Bowl** is played at Rainbow Stadium on the campus of the University of Hawaii. The American Athletic Conference will face the Mountain West in a Christmas Eve matchup.

In addition to the conference's primary bowl affiliations, The American holds secondary partnerships with the **AutoZone Liberty Bowl** in Memphis, Tennessee, and the **Duck Commander Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, Louisiana, as well as with other ESPN-owned bowls.
