Cincinnati (5-1, 0-0 BIG EAST) vs. Princeton (2-4, 0-0 Ivy)

SETTING THE SCENE: A day after losing their first game of the season, the Bearcats take on Princeton in the consolation round of the Mildred and Roger L. White Invitational, hosted by Northwestern. Cincinnati must regroup quickly from its 81-73 loss to Northern Illinois, when the Bearcats allowed the Huskies a 53 shooting percentage from 3-point range and sent them to the free throw line 34 times. The Tigers lost in the second game of the opening round, 67-53 to the host school Northwestern (6-1). Northwestern and Northern Illinois will face off in the all-Illinois final following the consolation game.

UCLAST TIME OUT: Cincinnati fell to Northern Illinois, 81-73, at the 23rd annual Mildred and Roger L. White Invitational hosted by Northwestern. The Bearcats (5-1) suffered their first loss of the season at Welsh-Ryan Arena by the hot hand of the Huskies who shot 53 percent from behind the arc. It's the same weapon UC has thrived on this season, but the Bearcats sank just 3-of-17 from 3-point range.

- ♦ The Bearcats sent NIU to the free throw line 34 times and gave up a season-high 10 treys.
- ♦ Shelly Bellman scored a season-high 25 points, shooting 9-of-16 from the field.
- ♦ UC shot just 17 percent (3-of-17) from 3-point range, well off its season average of 34 percent.
- ♦ UC has out rebounded all six opponents it has played this season, including a +2 margin against the Huskies. The Bearcats have a +12.2 rebounding margin on the year.

A LOOK AT PRINCETON: Princeton, the reigning Ivy League champions, is 2-4 so far in the 2006-07 campaign. The Tigers lost to a surging Northwestern squad that has already equaled its win total from last season (6), in the first round of the Mildred and Roger L. White Invite.

- ♦ This is the first meeting between Cincinnati and Princeton women's basketball. The Bearcats have played three other schools that represent the Ivy League and are 2-1.
- ♦ Princeton's Meagan Cowher —daughter of Pittsburgh Steelers coach Bill Cowher—has scored in double figures in 12 consecutive games, dating back to last season.

LOOKING AHEAD: Following the Mildred and Roger L. White Invitational this weekend the Bearcats will have the week off for final exams. UC will host Alabama State Sunday, Dec. 10 at 1 p.m. at UC Clermont.

Bearcats Milestone Watch

- Michelle Jones scored 7 points against Murray State, giving her 303 in her career.
- Treasure Humphries is 12 steals shy of 150 career thefts (134).
- Shelly Bellman needs 10 points to reach the 400 milestone.
- Karen Twehues has 148 career 3-point field goals, taking over sole possession of third place on the all-time career list. Madinah Slaise was third with 146.
- Emy Ogide is 24 points shy of reaching 200 (176).

WINNING NO. 300: Sophomore Angel Morgan had a lights-out game, playing the entire 40 minutes and scoring a career-high 18 points, vaulting UC to a 74-57 win over Murray State on Tuesday at Fifth Third Arena. The win improved the Bearcats to 5-0 and gave head Coach Laurie Pirtle her 300th win at Cincinnati.

FIVE IS FINE: Five Bearcats scored in double figures in Cincinnati's 83-51 win over St. Francis (Pa.) on the eve of Thanksgiving at Fifth Third Arena. UC improves to 3-0 all-time against the Red Flash. Sophomore Michelle Jones led the way, topping her season-high with 14 points - all in the first period. SFU stayed with the Bearcats in the opening minutes, answering each UC basket and even taking an 8-6 lead with 16:52 left to play in the half, but then Cincinnati used a 15-2 run and held the Red Flash scoreless for nearly four minutes. The second half saw more of the same as UC outscored the Red Flash, 38-28. SFU had outscored all but one opponent in the second half prior to the contest against the Bearcats.

HEYDAY FOR OGIDE: Emy Ogide had a breakout, career game in UC's 65-60 win over Dayton and was UC's leading scorer for the first time in her career. The 6-2 junior forward came off the bench to score a game- and career-high 18 points, doubling her previous best of 9 points set last year against Georgetown on Feb. 21, 2006. Ogide also pulled in eight rebounds, helping the Bearcats edge UD, 41-40 on the boards. Sophomore Shelly Bellman dished out a career-high 6 assists, topping her previous best of 5. She also scored 12 points, the 17th time she has scored in double digits. In addition to her career-high 9 assists, freshman Carla Jacobs scored 7 points, grabbed 8 rebounds and had 6 steals.

RECORD THREES FOR UC: The Bearcats put up big numbers against Arkansas-Pine Bluff and broke a UC team record for 3-point field goals in a game. UC won soundly, 89-65, in their home opener over the Lions, extending its home-opener winning streak to 11 in a row. UC finished the night with 13 treys - including 10 in the first half - setting the Cincinnati record for 3-pointers in a game.

GETTING A JUMP ON THE SEASON: In UC's earliest season opener in school history, the Bearcats overcame an eight-point halftime deficit to defeat Youngstown State on Friday, Nov. 10. The Bearcats used a 9-0 run to start the second half and held the Penguins scoreless for nearly three minutes. UC regained the lead with 15:44 remaining in the game and did not relinquish it, leading by as many as 19 points. Senior Treasure Humphries was playing in a home-game atmosphere away from Fifth Third Arena. Several family members and friends made the 45 minute drive to Youngstown from Canton, Humphries' hometown. Humphries scored a team-high 17 points, the 26th time in her career she has hit the double-digit mark, and shared the wealth with 8 assists.

FRESHMAN PHENOM: With the start against YSU, Carla Jacobs became one of nine true freshmen Division I point guards in the nation who started in their team's women's basketball season openers. Jacobs is the first UC true freshman starting point guard since Jolinda Lewis was in the 1995-96 season. Jacobs averaged 14.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 6.0 assists per exhibition game. She broke loose for 13 points against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

36th SEASON OF UC WOMEN'S SHOOPS: The 2006-07 season marks Cincinnati's 36th year of varsity competition. The 2005-06 squad gave UC its 500th victory on Dec. 3, 2005 during the fifth game of the season, an 82-48 win over Eastern Illinois. UC's all-time record is 518-450, seventh most wins among BIG EAST schools. Under head coach Laurie Pirtle the Bearcats are 300-287 and have made postseason appearances in eight of the last nine years.

UC IN THE BIG EAST: Cincinnati enters its second season as a member of the expanded BIG EAST Conference. In the preseason polls of the league's coaches the Bearcats were picked to finish 12th among the 16 teams. The Bearcats have compiled a record of 71-77 against the current BIG EAST membership. Last year UC finished 11th in the regular season race with a 7-9 ledger and earned a berth to the BIG EAST Championships.

Bearcats in the Record Book

- Senior Treasure Humphries holds the Bearcats record for most assists in a game, which she set last season with 14 against Georgetown on January 25, 2006. Humphries is also on the single-game record list for steals. She is tied for second with 7, a feat she accomplished twice last season: against Marquette on Feb. 28, 2006 and Fordham on Dec. 11, 2005. Humphries is seventh on the career 3-point field goal percentage list, hitting .327 from downtown. She is 10th in 3-pointers made with 50.
- Senior Karen Twehues has made her mark from 3-point range. She holds the ninth and 10th spots for 3-point field goals made in a season. As a sophomore she canned 59 and last season she was good for 48 trifectas. Going into the 2006-07 season she is second on the career 3-point field goal percentage list, making 37.8 percent from that distance. She is now 3rd on the all-time career list for 3-point field goals made with 147.
- The 2005-06 team ranked second in UC history in rebounding margin at +6.4. Only the 2001-02 Bearcats squad bettered that with a +6.7 margin.

SURVEY OF SCORING AND STARTS: The Bearcats return 78 percent of their scoring from last season, including the three scoring leaders - senior Treasure Humphries (12.8 ppg) and sophomores Shelly Bellman (10.9) and Michelle Jones (9.1). Humphries and Bellman started every game last season, while Jones played in all 29 games and started 17. Sophomores Jill Stephens (13), Kahla Roudebush (6) and Angel Morgan (3) combined for 22 starts last year.

5/3 ARENA ADVANTAGE: Cincinnati enters its 17th season in Fifth Third Arena at Shoemaker Center with a 168-86 record and a .659 winning percentage since its opening in 1989-90, and a 120-32 mark in the past nine years.

HUMPHRIES HONORS: In 2006, Treasure Humphries became the first Bearcat women's basketball player to earn All-BIG EAST honors when she was named to the all-conference second team. A total of 22 Bearcats have earned all-conference recognition during the Laurie Pirtle era.

ABOUT THE BEARCATS:

- ♦ Senior Treasure Humphries has led the Bearcats in steals her junior and freshman years. She was a second team All-BIG EAST performer last season.
- ♦ Senior Karen Twehues provides a strong outside threat for the Bearcats. She has 143 career 3-pointers, fourth in UC history, and coming into this season her .378 career 3-point percentage is second in the record books. The veteran also speaks four different languages.
- ♦ Junior Emy Ogide has been named the most improved player during practice. She did not start playing basketball until her sophomore year of high school. The athletic post player can govern the paint and open up the perimeter.
- ♦ The five sophomores, Shelly Bellman, Michelle Jones, Angel Morgan, Kahla Roudebush and Jill Stephens, tabbed the 'Fab Five' were a top 10 recruiting class. They learned plenty about Division I basketball last season with 68 starts between them.
- ♦ The freshman class of Carla Jacobs, Natasha Graboski and Stephanie Stevens is also a highly touted group. Jacobs (D-III) and Stevens (D-I) were both honored as Ohio High School Basketball Players of the Year. Graboski earned second team all-state honors.
