FOOTBALL PREPS FOR HOME OPENER AGAINST INDIANA STATE

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati football team, coming off a tough 28-14 loss at Fresno State, returns home to venerable Nippert Stadium for the 2010 home opener against Indiana State at noon on Saturday for Hometown Heroes days. Local heroes and champions will be honored throughout the game. The Bearcats will look to put last week's loss behind them and improve on their 12-game winning streak on the home turf.

THE SERIES

- ▶ Saturday marks the fifth meeting between the Bearcats and Sycamores, with UC holding a 3-1 advantage in the series.

THE COACHES

- ▶ **BUTCH JONES**, named the head coach at the University of Cincinnati on Dec. 16, 2009, is in his first season at the helm of the UC program and is 0-1. Jones most recently led Central Michigan University to a pair of Mid-American Conference Championships and three-straight bowl appearances. He holds a 27-14 overall record and a 22-3 mark in league games.
- ▶ **TRENT MILES** is entering his third season at Indiana State with a 2-22 records. He has never faced the Bearcats.

A LOOK AHEAD

- ▶ UC will play its third game in 12 days when it heads to Raleigh, N.C. to take on the NC State Wolfpack on Sept. 16, 2010 at 7:30 p.m. in a game scheduled to be televised by ESPN.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati is in its 123rd football season with an all-time record of 547-543-51 (.502).
- ▶ Cincinnati (1885) is one of the five oldest programs in college football along with Rutgers (1869), Michigan (1879), Navy (1880), and Minnesota (1883).
- ▶ UC opened up the 2010 campaign on Sept. 4 at Fresno State, dropping a 28-14 decision.
- ▶ UC will play its first three games in 12 days and then play only two games in the next 24 days, including having nine days to prepare for Oklahoma on Sept. 25.
- ▶ UC had nine first-time starters at Fresno State and nine players made their first appearance for UC.
- ▶ DB Adrian Witty is the only true freshman on the squad to see playing time in 2010.
- ▶ WR Vidal Hazelton will miss the rest of the season after injuring his knee on a kickoff return at Fresno State.
- ▶ He will be replaced at WR by Marcus Barnett, while DJ Woods will take over as the primary kick returner.
- ▶ Head coach Butch Jones opened up competition on the offensive line this week, choosing to name his starters after practice on Thursday. The OL surrendered eight sacks in the opener at Fresno State.
- ▶ The UC defense held Fresno State to eight yards of total offense in the first quarter of the opener.
- ▶ DB Pat Lambert had his first career interception at Fresno.
- ▶ WR Armon Binns had a team-high seven catches in the opener and has a reception in 14 straight games.
- ▶ Cincinnati won its second-straight BIG EAST Conference title in 2009, earning the league's BCS bowl bid for the second time.

HONORING RAYMOND SHEAKLEY




- ▶ The Bearcats will wear a special helmet decal tonight, honoring the memory of donor Raymond Sheakley.
- ▶ Sheakley, the namesake of Sheakley Lawn in Varsity

Village, died on July 11 at the age of 88.

- ▶ He attended the University of Cincinnati on the GI bill after World War II, earning a business degree.
- ▶ Ray and his son Larry have been long-time supporters of the University of Cincinnati and Bearcats athletics. Both are members of the UCATS George Smith Society.
- ▶ Ray and his wife, Dorothy, sponsor two Honors Plus scholarships in UC's College of Business and have endowed a scholarship for the Carl H. Lindner Honors Plus program.
- ▶ For his birthday in 2006, his family dedicated Sheakley Lawn at UC, a synthetic playing field where the UC band performs before football games and a popular site for pick-up football games and other student activities.
- ▶ Head coach Butch Jones has named Raymond Sheakley as the UC Community Captain for the Indiana State game. Prior to the game, a game ball will be presented to the Sheakley family.

JEFFERSON AVENUE SPORTS COMPLEX



NEW PRACTICE FIELDS TO DEBUT ...

- ▶ The Jefferson Avenue Sports Complex, which includes new practice fields for the Bearcats football team, made its long anticipated debut on Sept. 2, 2010. The Bearcats held a one-hour walk-through practice enjoying the complex for the first time.
- ▶ The ground breaking took place on March 16, 2010 for the project with an estimated construction cost of \$15.5 million.
- ▶ The first phase of construction, completed on Sept. 1, 2010, includes a lighted 100-yard field.
- ▶ The 100-yard field will also become a seasonal indoor practice facility during winter months via an air-supported "bubble" that will be inflated over the field.
- ▶ The bubble, which will be erected from late November to late February, will maintain an interior ambient temperature between 50-60 degrees.
- ▶ The complex will also help the university go green. A chilled water thermal storage tank will be installed under the shorter field to assist with the university's air conditioning systems. The storage tank will help the university realize an ongoing annual energy savings in the range of \$750,000 to \$1 million.
- ▶ The second phase of the construction process will include the addition of a second, lighted 50-yard field, bleacher seating, a press box, a scoreboard, a video/viewing tower, locker/team rooms, a training/taping room, restrooms and a plaza to connect the practice facilities with UC's Varsity Village.

“ From a function standpoint, an indoor facility is absolutely crucial for our winter and foul weather workouts. We currently are unable to hold some of our winter workouts because we don't have a place to go indoors. We can't take steps back in the off-season when other teams are moving forward. We need those things to continue building our championship program.” - HEAD FOOTBALL COACH BUTCH JONES

THE BASICS ...

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati is in its 123rd football season with an all-time record of 547-543-51 (.502).
- ▶ Cincinnati (1885) is one of the five oldest programs in college football along with Rutgers (1869), Michigan (1879), Navy (1880), and Minnesota (1883).
- ▶ Cincinnati won its second straight BIG EAST Conference title in 2009, earning the league's BCS bowl bid for the second time.
- ▶ Head coach Butch Jones enters his first season with the Bearcats after going 27-13 with two Mid-American Conference Championships in three years at Central Michigan University.
- ▶ UC returns 13 starters from the 2009 squad, including all-league selections Armon Binns (WR), Ben Guidugli (TE), Alex Hoffman (OL), and Jason Kelce (OL).
- ▶ The defense returns four of its top six tacklers from 2009, including LB JK Schaffer (100 tackles), DB Drew Frey (64 tackles, 2 INT), DB Dominique Battle (60 tackles, 2 INT), and LB Walter Stewart (59 tackles, 8 TFL, 4.5 sacks).

A NEW CHALLENGE ...

- ▶ UC will play its first three games of the season in 12 days. After battling Fresno State on Sept. 4, the Bearcats open up the home schedule against Indiana State on Sept. 11 before a quick turnaround to play at NC State on Sept. 16.

HELLO EVERYBODY ...

- ▶ Nine Bearcats made their first starts against Fresno State. Maalik Bomar (LB), C.J. Cobb (OL), Evan Davis (OL), Vidal Hazelton (WR), John Hughes (DL), Reuben Johnson (DB), Brandon Mills (DL), Wesley Richardson (DB), and Chris Williams (DB).

FIRST-TIME BEARCATS ...

- ▶ Nine UC players made their first appearance in a UC jersey at Fresno State. Vidal Hazelton (WR), Adrian Witty (DB), Aaron Roberson (DB), Bruce Horner (DB), Mitch Meador (DL), Evan Davis (OL), Blake Annen (TE), Monte Taylor (DL), and Tom DeTemple (LS).

NOTING THE NFL ...

- ▶ NFL final rosters were announced Saturday night, and 11 former Bearcats made the cut. Those playing this year include: Connor Barwin (Houston Texans), Brent Celek (Philadelphia Eagles), Trent Cole (Philadelphia Eagles), Mardy Gilyard (St. Louis Rams), Kevin Huber (Cincinnati Bengals), Jeff Linkenbach (Indianapolis Colts), Ricardo Mathews (Indianapolis Colts), Haruki Nakamura (Baltimore Ravens), Tony Pike (Carolina Panthers), Brandon Underwood (Green Bay Packers), Mike Wright (New England Patriots).
- ▶ Alex Daniels (Oakland Raiders) was placed on injured reserve and DeAngelo Smith (Cleveland Browns) was signed to the practice squad.
- ▶ Linkenbach was an undrafted rookie who finds himself as the backup right tackle in Indianapolis entering the season.

HAZELTON OUT FOR THE SEASON ...

- ▶ Vidal Hazelton will miss the rest of the 2010 season due to a knee injury suffered in the fourth quarter of UC's

season-opening 28-14 loss at Fresno State Saturday.

- ▶ Hazelton, a senior who transferred from USC, was injured on a kickoff return. He will undergo surgery performed by UC's Director of Orthopedic Services Dr. Angelo Colosimo at UC Hospital at a later date.
- ▶ Prior to his injury, he had made six catches for 68 yards and returned three kickoffs for 41 yards.

HOMETOWN HEROES CELEBRATED ...

- ▶ When UC takes the home field for the first time during the 2010 season, it will do so honoring local heroes and remembering the tragic events of Sept. 11, 2001.
- ▶ A pregame flyover from a B-2 Spirit Bomber will take place. The flyover was arranged by Maj. Gen. James M. Kowalski, Vice Commander of the Air Force Global Strike Command and graduate of the UC ROTC program, who will also be on hand for the coin toss.
- ▶ The UC Army and Air Force ROTC units will be honoring its scholarship recipients for the 2010 academic year.
- ▶ During pregame and halftime, the Bearcat Band will play musical tributes to fallen heroes.
- ▶ The skydivers of UC Football, Team Fastrax, will be back to dazzle Bearcats fans with skydiving acrobatics and a show dedicated to veterans.
- ▶ UC will also honor members of the Cincinnati Commandos for their championship, the Cincinnati Cyclones, and the Hamilton Little League World Series team.

FRESNO SUPERLATIVES ...

- ▶ Despite UC's 28-14 loss at Fresno State, several Bearcats set personal career marks during the game.
- ▶ WR Armon Binns tied a career high with seven receptions.
- ▶ LB Maalik Bomar set a career-best with five tackles, including his first career tackle for a loss.
- ▶ QB Zach Collaros had a career-high 41 passing attempts.
- ▶ DL Dan Giordano forced the first fumble of his career.
- ▶ DB Reuben Johnson set a career mark with eight tackles.
- ▶ DB Pat Lambert recorded his first career interception.
- ▶ DL Mitch Meador had his first career tackle on special teams.
- ▶ DL Brandon Mills forced the first fumble of his career.
- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead caught a career-high four balls out of the backfield.
- ▶ DL Derek Wolfe tied a career high with eight tackles.

BONES BACK IN THE SPOTLIGHT ...

- ▶ With the season-ending injury to WR Vidal Hazelton, Marcus Barnett will move outside to take the vacated spot.
- ▶ Bones was a freshman all-America selection after catching 13 TD passes and accumulating 62 receptions for 862 yards.
- ▶ The past two seasons, he has played sparingly, catching 40 balls for 372 yards and two touchdowns in 2008 and 2009.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE ...

- ▶ UC is 12-0 at Nippert Stadium in the past two seasons, the first time in school history the Bearcats have two-straight seasons with an unblemished home record.
- ▶ UC's 2009 average of 33,957 set a single-season mark for attendance, shattering the 2008 record of 31,964.
- ▶ In the past three seasons, UC has set three-straight attendance records and over 500,000 fans (577,006) have come through the Nippert turnstiles.

GOING STREAKING ...

- ▶ UC won all of its home games in 2008 and 2009, a 12-game streak, the first time in school history the team went undefeated at Nippert Stadium in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ The school-record streak of 15-straight wins was set during a span from Nov. 8, 1952-Nov. 13, 1954.
- ▶ Ten of the Top 12 crowds in Nippert history, including a stadium record of 35,106 against Illinois in 2009, have occurred since 2007.
- ▶ With an average of 31,964 fans in six home games in 2008, UC established a single-season attendance record, topping the 2007 average of 30,246.
- ▶ UC's 2009 average of 33,957 set a single-season mark for attendance, shattering the 2008 record of 31,964.
- ▶ Since 2007, UC has set three-straight attendance records and over 500,000 fans (577,006) have come through the Nippert turnstiles.

STREAKING AT HOME IN NON-LEAGUE PLAY ...

- ▶ UC has won 16 straight home non-conference games at Nippert Stadium, dating back to a 30-24 win over Temple in three overtimes on Sept. 20, 2003.
- ▶ UC is 10-0 on the home turf in non-conference play since the 2007 season.

SELLOUTS AT NIPPERT ...

- ▶ Including the 2009 campaign, Nippert Stadium has enjoyed a total of 21 sellouts in its lengthy history.
- ▶ Four of UC's six home games in 2009 were sellouts.

NIPPERT STADIUM ...

- ▶ UC's home field, Nippert Stadium was built in 1902 and completed as a full stadium in 1923, is the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football.
- ▶ Among NCAA FBS and FCS schools, Nippert (1923) is the nation's seventh-oldest stadium still in use, preceded by Penn's Franklin Field (1895), Harvard Stadium (1903), Georgia Tech's Bobby Dodd Stadium (1913), the Yale Bowl (1914), Cornell's Schoelkopf Stadium (1915), and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).
- ▶ Head coach Butch Jones calls Nippert the 'Wrigley Field' of college football.

A NEW ERA BEGINS ...

- ▶ Butch Jones, who was named the head coach at the University of Cincinnati on Dec. 16, 2009, enters his first season at the helm of the Bearcats program.
- ▶ Jones most recently led Central Michigan University to a pair of Mid-American Conference Championships and three-straight bowl appearances.
- ▶ At CMU, Jones continued the program's renaissance, going 27-13 over the past three seasons, including a 22-3 mark in league games, winning a pair of MAC Championships (2007, 2009), playing in three-straight bowl games, and earning a postseason ranking of No. 23 in 2009.
- ▶ Jones spent a total of 11 seasons as an assistant at the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision level. He served as the offensive coordinator at three different schools, spanning eight seasons, and worked directly with 24 all-conference selections in 15 years as a full-time position coach.

YOUTH MOVEMENT ...

- ▶ The youngsters appear to be taking over the University of Cincinnati football team.
- ▶ The Bearcats have only 13 seniors in 2010 and feature 63 players who are at a sophomore level or below.
- ▶ On the depth chart, UC does not start a senior on the defense and have seven senior starters total with six on offense and kicker Jacob Rogers.

ROGERS NEARS TOP OF SCORING CHARTS ...

- ▶ Kicker Jacob Rogers enters the 2010 season in striking distance of UC's all-time scoring record.
- ▶ Rogers sits second with 270 career points, trailing only Jonathan Ruffin (1999-2002) who tops the list with 315 points scored.
- ▶ Rogers already holds the school marks for extra points made (150) and extra points attempted (153), and he sits second in PAT percentage (.980), points scored by kicking (268), and third in field goals made (40).

ACADEMICS STRONG IN 2010 ...

- ▶ Since arriving in Cincinnati, head coach Butch Jones has made an immediate impact, overseeing an academic quarter of great success.
- ▶ The Bearcats achieved a team GPA of 2.7 during the Winter 2010 quarter, up from a 2.4 in the Fall 2009 quarter.

- ▶ Thirty-two student-athletes achieved a GPA of 3.0 or above, including linebacker JK Schaffer who posted a 4.0 GPA.

WOLFE LEADS THE PACK ...

- ▶ Defensive tackle Derek Wolfe enters his junior season as the leader on the defensive line.
- ▶ He made 13 starts a year ago, with 41 tackles, eight tackles for a loss, five sacks, a forced fumble, and fumble recovery.
- ▶ He opened up the season by tying for the team high with eight tackles at Fresno State.

AN OFFENSIVE COMPARISON ...

- ▶ With head coach Butch Jones taking over the UC program entering 2010, many have wondered what that will mean for the high-octane offense Bearcats fans have seen the past several years.
- ▶ Have no fears, as Jones has kept the spread no-huddle attack, but fans will see a bit more offensive balance in 2010 as Jones and offensive coordinator Mike Bajakian will place an emphasis on offensive balance and the running game.

- ▶ It counts among its members current and former college and university Presidents, Mayors of the City of Cincinnati, countless college professors and coaches, flag rank officers of the Armed Forces of the United States, captains in business and industry.

- ▶ The Bearcats are just the sixth school to win two or more outright BCS conference titles since 2000.
- ▶ The six BCS automatic qualifier leagues are the ACC, BIG EAST, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10, and SEC.

COLLAROS NAMED TO A PAIR OF WATCH LISTS ...

- ▶ UC QB Zach Collaros (Steubenville, Ohio/Steubenville) was named to the 2010 watch lists for both the Manning Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- ▶ He appeared in all 13 games as a sophomore, making four starts and helped lead UC to a 12-1 season and its second-straight BIG EAST Conference Championship.
- ▶ He was 93-of-124 for 1,434 yards and 10 touchdowns. Collaros also added a quarterback rating of 195.5, 344 yards rushing, and four touchdowns.
- ▶ Collaros was named BIG EAST Player of the Week on Nov. 9, 2009 after setting a league record with 555 yards of total offense (480 passing, 75 rushing) against Connecticut. He was 29-of-37 for 480 yards and one TD through the air and carried the ball 13 times for 75 yards and two touchdowns. His 480 yards passing was the fourth 400-yard passing game in school history and ranks second all-time in UC history behind Greg Cook who threw for 554 against Ohio in 1968.

OUT FOR REDEMPTION ...

- ▶ Senior John Goebel is back in 2010 after a 2009 campaign marred by injuries.
- ▶ He was limited to nine games, carrying the ball only 12 times and appearing mostly on special teams.
- ▶ Goebel has 648 career rushing yards and seven touchdowns to his credit along with 28 receptions for 295 yards.
- ▶ He opened up the season playing on special teams at Fresno State.

SCHAFFER ON NAGURSKI WATCH LIST ...

- ▶ LB JK Schaffer has earned a spot on the watch list for the Nagurski Award, given to the nation's top defender.
- ▶ He started the final 12 games in 2009 and was second on the team with 100 tackles, ranking eighth in the BIG EAST Conference.
- ▶ Schaffer set a career best with 14 tackles against Illinois and added his second double-digit tackle game with 10 against Florida in the Allstate Sugar Bowl.
- ▶ The junior also added 5.5 TFL, 3 INT, 3 PBU, and 1.5 sacks.

PAIR OF GRAD STUDENTS ON THE 2010 SQUAD ...

- ▶ Seniors C.J. Cobb and John Goebel received their bachelor's degrees on Saturday, June 12, 2010 during the 191st Commencement of the University.
- ▶ Both will enroll in graduate school for the 2010 season.

UC AGAINST THE TOP-25 ...

- ▶ Since 2007, UC tops the NCAA FBS in winning percentage against top-25 teams during the regular season.
- ▶ During that span, UC is 8-2 (.800) in 10 games against ranked foes, leading Texas (.778), USC (.750), and Florida (.727). The complete list is below.

OBADIAH CHEATHAM EARNS SCHOLARSHIP ...

- ▶ Senior walk-on Obadiah Cheatham was honored during training camp as head coach Butch Jones announced he would be placed on scholarship for the 2010 season.
- ▶ Cheatham, a linebacker, is the fifth former walk-on playing in 2010 on scholarship, joining Tom DeTemple, Jason Kelce, Collin McCafferty, and Wesley Richardson.

BINNS NAMED TO BILETNIKOFF WATCH LIST ...

- ▶ Wide receiver Armon Binns earned a spot on the watch list for the Biletnikoff Award, which recognizes the nation's top wide receiver.
- ▶ Binns was UC's second-leading receiver a year ago, grabbing 61 balls for 888 yards and tying for the team high with 11 touchdowns. He averaged 68.3 yards per game and 14.6 yards per catch.
- ▶ He made a team-high seven catches for 55 yards at Fresno State in the season opener.

WOODS A QUADRUPLE THREAT IN 2010 ...

- ▶ Junior DJ Woods helps form the core of a strong group of wide receivers entering the 2010 season.
- ▶ He caught 51 balls for 640 yards and four scores in 2009.
- ▶ Woods opened up 2010 by catching six passes for 72 yards and a touchdown, rushing twice for eight yards, returning a kickoff for 37 yards and also fielding eight punts that were not returned.

RICHARDSON EARNS SCHOLARSHIP ...

- ▶ Junior DB Wesley Richardson, after two years as a walk-on earned a scholarship on Sept. 3, 2009.
- ▶ Richardson, a junior chemistry major, represents the sixth player since 2007 to have earned a scholarship after starting as a walk-on.
- ▶ The others are Alex Daniels, Charley Howard, Jason Kelce, Collin McCafferty, and Mike Windt.
- ▶ Richardson saw action in all 13 games in 2009, making 21 tackles on defense and special teams.
- ▶ He moved into a starting role at free safety in the 2010 opener at Fresno State, notching four tackles.

A HYBRID PLAYER ...

- ▶ Playing the role of outside linebacker/defensive end, sophomore Walter Stewart had 59 tackles, 8.5 tackles for a loss, 4.5 sacks, and an interception a year ago.
- ▶ He opened up 2010 with a pair of solo stops, one of which was a tackle for a loss, at Fresno State.

GUIDUGLI ON MACKAY AWARD WATCH LIST ...

- ▶ University of Cincinnati senior tight end Ben Guidugli was named to the watch list for the 2010 John Mackey Award.
- ▶ The award, presented by the Nassau County Sports Commission, recognizes the nation's top collegiate tight end.
- ▶ Guidugli, a second-team all-BIG EAST Conference selection a year ago, was the fourth-leading receiver on the team, grabbing 27 balls for 264 yards and three touchdowns. He was also a second-team Preseason all-America selection by *Sporting News*.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD ...

- ▶ UC scored a school-record 502 points in 2009, and made several additions to the top-10 scoring totals list.
- ▶ The Bearcats scored 70 points against Southeast Missouri State in the 2009 home opener at Nippert Stadium on Sept. 12.
- ▶ The 70-points was the third-best UC scoring output of all time, the highest point total since 2007, and the first time UC has eclipsed 70 points since 1921.
- ▶ The 70 points against SEMO also marked the top UC scoring total at Nippert Stadium in the modern era.
- ▶ Five of the 10 top UC scoring totals occurred in 2009.

S(PEAD) KILLS ...

- ▶ Running back Isaiah Pead returns after seeing action in all 13 games in 2009, making three starts and leading the BIG EAST with a 6.7 YPC average.
- ▶ He gained 806 yards on 121 carries with nine touchdowns.
- ▶ Pead had a career-best 175 yards on 18 carries against West Virginia and added four games of 75 yards rushing or more.
- ▶ He reached double-digit carries only six times and had 20 receptions for 201 yards and two touchdowns.
- ▶ In the opener at Fresno State, Pead had 10 carries for 36 yards and no negative yardage.

FREY THE OLD MAN OF THE DEFENSE ...

- ▶ Sophomore Drew Frey enters his fourth year with the UC program in 2010.
- ▶ The defensive back played in 12 games in 2009, ranking fourth on the team with 64 tackles. He also added four pass break ups, 3.5 tackles for a loss, two interceptions, and a sack.
- ▶ He missed the entire 2007 season and most of the 2008 season due to injury.
- ▶ Frey was granted an extension of eligibility request by the NCAA for the 2012-13 academic year.
- ▶ He opened 2010 with four tackles at Fresno State.

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND ...

- ▶ For the past 11 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind. its preseason training home.
- ▶ The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- ▶ Among many amenities, Higher Ground features a pair of 100-yard FieldTurf practice fields, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.
- ▶ UC is one of four BCS programs that holds training camp off-campus

CIRCLING CINCINNATI ...

- ▶ The UC football coaching staff have made it no secret that they will use Cincinnati as a recruiting base for future UC student-athletes.
- ▶ Currently, UC has 52 players on its roster from the State of Ohio, far more than any other state represented.
- ▶ Of those 52, 28 are from the greater Cincinnati area.

WOMEN'S FOOTBALL 101 RAISES RECORD AMOUNT ...

- ▶ The Fifth Annual University of Cincinnati Women's Football 101, held in June, raised nearly \$13,000 for breast cancer awareness.
- ▶ Proceeds from the event will benefit breast cancer research at the UC Barrett Cancer Center at University Hospital and its clinical, educational, and research programs. The donation is an event record and surpasses the \$8,000 raised a year ago.

SEASON TICKETS SELLING AT RECORD PACE AGAIN ...

- ▶ The UC Department of Athletics is enjoying another year of record-breaking season ticket sales.
- ▶ Sales surpassed the 20,000 mark for the first time ever, setting the stage for a possible preseason sellout of available season tickets for Bearcats Football this fall.
- ▶ Cincinnati has established program attendance standards over the last four seasons.
- ▶ The Bearcats drew a total of 181,477 fans in 2007 before setting back-to-back regular season average records with program-best 191,788 and 203,741 clips in 2008 and 2009, respectively.

MAY MENTORSHIP PROGRAM A SUCCESS ...

- ▶ As part of the Cats in the Community program, the Bearcats held a May Mentorship event that featured bi-weekly speakers on a wide range of topics.
- ▶ The topics presented to the team included academics, safety, psychology, proper nutrition, and life skills.
- ▶ One of the highlights was NFL Vice President of Player Development Troy Vincent who presented a league-sponsored program called Pathway to the Pros.
- ▶ The program is part of an outreach effort involving the NFL and NCAA.
- ▶ One of Vincent's main points, made throughout the event was the importance of getting a degree.
- ▶ The players were warned about the potholes along the way, things as seemingly harmless as social networking to serious issues such as texting while driving, violence, alcohol, and drugs.
- ▶ Vincent also touched on the issues of conduct, image, and what made him a success at the professional level.

BEARCATS' GRADUATION RATE LEADS BCS TOP-10 ...

- ▶ The Bearcats rank atop the final 2009 Bowl Championship Series Top-10 in academic rankings, according to the latest Graduation Success Rates, released by the NCAA.
- ▶ UC checked in with a 75 percent NCAA graduation rate and a 71 percent federal government rate, the only team in the BCS top-10 to surpass the 70-percent plateau on both lists.
- ▶ The graduation rates are for student-athletes entering college in 2002-03, meaning they earned their diplomas within six years.

THREE FORMER PLAYERS TAKEN IN NFL DRAFT ...

- ▶ Three former UC student-athletes were selected over the three-day 2010 NFL draft.
- ▶ WR Mardy Gilyard was selected by the St. Louis Rams with the first pick of the fourth round and 99th pick overall.
- ▶ QB Tony Pike was chosen by the Carolina Panthers with the 35th pick in the sixth round (No. 204 overall).
- ▶ DL Ricardo Mathews went to Indianapolis with the 31st selection of the seventh round (No. 238 overall).

TWO BEARCATS SELECTED IN UFL DRAFT ...

- ▶ A pair of former University of Cincinnati football players, wide receiver Antonio Chatman and linebacker Curtis Young, were chosen by the Sacramento Mountain Lions in the 2010 United Football League Draft.
- ▶ Chatman was selected with the third pick of the sixth round and 28th selection overall. Young was taken with the fourth choice of the 10th round (49th selection overall).
- ▶ The league begins its second season on Sept. 18, 2010.

NOTING THE ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL ...

- ▶ UC has been ranked in the *Associated Press* poll for 20 weeks over the 2008 and 2009 seasons, reaching as high as the No. 4 spot on two occasions in 2009 – Nov. 1 and Dec. 6.
- ▶ Prior to that, the Bearcats appeared in only 14 AP polls from 1936 to 2007.

FOOTBALL WINS COMMUNITY AWARD ...

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati football team was recently honored with the Erich Kunzel Queen City Advocate Award at the Cincinnati USA Convention & Visitors Bureau's annual meeting at the Duke Energy Center.
- ▶ The award recognized the Bearcats for bringing positive media coverage to Cincinnati and the region during their record-setting 2009 season.
- ▶ UC went 12-0 during regular season, won its second-straight BIG EAST Conference Championship, and played in the 2010 Allstate Sugar Bowl against Florida, its second-straight Bowl Championship Series appearance.
- ▶ This year, the bureau renamed its Queen City Advocate Award in honor of Erich Kunzel, the late conductor of the Cincinnati Pops Orchestra.

UC ATHLETIC TRAINER HONORED ...

- ▶ UC football athletic trainer Bob Mangine recently received the prestigious American Sports Medicine Institute Career Service Award for Contributions to baseball at the 28th Annual Injuries in Baseball Conference in Birmingham, Ala. The award was presented by Dr. James Andrews.
- ▶ Mangine, entering his eighth season with the football program, also serves as the Director of Sports Therapy for Clinical Residency for NovaCare Rehabilitation.

- ▶ He was presented the award in recognition of his contributions over the last 28 years to Sports Medicine.

FORMER BEARCAT A PART OF SUPER BOWL WIN ...

- ▶ Former University of Cincinnati linebacker Troy Evans helped lead the New Orleans Saints to a 31-17 win in Super Bowl XLIV, at Sun Life Stadium in Miami, Fla.
- ▶ Evans (1999-2000), a special teams captain, called the coin toss in the Saints favor prior to kickoff.
- ▶ Evans wrapped up his third season with the Saints and eighth in the NFL. He played in all 19 games in 2009 and is one of the top special teams players on the Saints and provides veteran depth to the linebacker corps. His career totals include 146 career tackles, three fumble recoveries, and an interception.

NO DOUBLING BACK ...

- ▶ UC earned its second-consecutive outright BIG EAST Conference title in 2009.
- ▶ UC last won back-to-back league titles in 1963-1964, sharing the Missouri Valley Conference Championship in 1963, and winning the title outright in 1964.
- ▶ The last school to earn or share the BIG EAST title in two-straight seasons was West Virginia from 2003-05.

FUTURE SCHEDULES ...

- ▶ UC announced it will take on SEC foe Tennessee in 2011 and will face Virginia Tech from the ACC at FedExField in Landover, Md. in 2012.

LOOKING BACK AT 2009 ...

- ▶ The Bearcats finished the regular season with a school-best 12-0 mark and won their second consecutive BIG EAST Conference championship.
- ▶ Cincinnati was one of five unbeaten teams in the nation during the regular season.
- ▶ Unranked in preseason polls, Cincinnati's undefeated regular season catapulted the Bearcats to No. 3 in the BCS standings and earned them an invitation to the Allstate Sugar Bowl, the school's second-consecutive BCS game.
- ▶ UC set numerous school records in 2009, including those for wins (12), road wins (6), consecutive regular-season wins (18), points (502), passing yards (4,014), fewest fumbles (10), fewest fumbles lost (2), and fewest turnovers (10).
- ▶ The Bearcats had an individual top the 100-yard plateau in eight out of 13 games.
- ▶ UC was second in the nation in passing efficiency (161.21) despite using five different quarterbacks through the course of the season.
- ▶ The Bearcats ranked second nationally in kickoff returns (29.2), third in tackles for a loss (8.4), sixth in passing offense (320.3), scoring offense (39.8), and total offense (464.3), while sitting tied for eighth in sacks (2.9), and 10th in sacks allowed (0.9).
- ▶ Eleven UC student-athletes were honored as all-BIG EAST selections, including four out of five starting offensive linemen. Chris Jurek (1st), Alex Hoffman (2nd), Jason Kelce (2nd), and Linkenbach (2nd) earned all-BIG EAST honors in 2009.
- ▶ Cincinnati has won 18-straight regular season games.
- ▶ Cincinnati had its third straight 10-win season in 2009. Before 2007, Cincinnati had exactly one 10-win season

HEAD COACH BUTCH JONES

FOURTH SEASON OVERALL | FIRST AT CINCINNATI

Butch Jones, who was named the head coach at the University of Cincinnati on Dec. 16, 2009, enters his first season at the helm of the Bearcats program.

Jones most recently led Central Michigan University to a pair of Mid-American Conference Championships and three-straight bowl appearances.

Since arriving in Cincinnati, Jones has made an immediate impact, building a staff of championship-level coaches and teachers, as well as an atmosphere of competition and family, while also overseeing an academic quarter of great success. The team achieved a GPA of 2.7 during the Winter 2010 quarter, its best ever. Thirty-two student-athletes achieved a GPA at 3.0 or above.

At Central Michigan, Jones continued that program's renaissance, going 27-13 over the past three seasons, including a 22-3 mark in league games, winning a pair of MAC Championships (2007, 2009), playing in three-straight bowl games, and earning a postseason ranking of No. 23 in 2009. He is the only coach in CMU history to lead the team to consecutive bowl games and is the first in MAC history to do it in his first three seasons as head coach.

"Butch Jones has proven himself to be a championship-caliber football coach," Director of Athletics Mike Thomas said. "I am impressed by the qualities he brings to the table, his knowledge of the BIG EAST Conference, and his desire to succeed. We're proud to welcome him to the UC family."

Jones coached 32 all-MAC performers, including two-time MAC Offensive Player of the Year and 2009 MAC Vern Smith Leadership Award winner Dan LeFevour, and two-time MAC Special Teams Player of the Year Antonio Brown. Under his tutelage, 13 student-athletes earned Academic all-MAC accolades.

LeFevour had an NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision Record 148 career touchdowns (101 passing, 46 rushing and one receiving). His 101 career passing TDs, are the most in MAC history.

CMU was 22-3 against MAC opponents during Jones' tenure, including victories in the 2007 and 2009 MAC Championship Games. The Chippewas were 12-1 in MAC road games under Jones and earned two-straight wins over Big Ten teams.

In 2007, Jones became only the ninth first-year head coach to lead his team to a Mid-American Conference championship. The Chippewas' eight victories marked the second-most of any CMU coach in his debut season, and Jones was one of three first-year head coaches nationwide to coach in a bowl game.

A native of Michigan and a former offensive coordinator at CMU, Jones returned to Mount Pleasant after spending the 2005 and 2006 seasons as an assistant coach under Rich Rodriguez at West Virginia University.

Jones spent a total of 11 seasons as an assistant at the Division I-A level. He served as the offensive coordinator at three different schools, spanning eight seasons, and worked directly

with 24 all-conference selections in 15 years as a full-time position coach.

A 1990 graduate of Ferris State University where he was a two-year letterman on the football team, Jones broke into the coaching ranks while still an undergraduate by serving as intern for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 1987-89.

Jones, 41, and his wife Barb are the parents of three children: Alex, Adam, and Andrew.

FRESNO, Calif. (AP) - The University of Cincinnati football scored the first 14 points of the game but could not hold on, surrendering 28 unanswered points to Fresno State, dropping its season opener by a 28-14 margin.

Fresno State ended Cincinnati's 18-game regular-season winning streak, a 10-game road streak, and a run of five-straight wins in season opening games.

Fresno's Ryan Colburn connected for four touchdowns to help the Bulldogs overcome an early 14-0 deficit and hand Butch Jones a loss in his first game as Cincinnati's coach.

Held to one first down on their first seven drives, the Bulldogs scored touchdowns on their next three, taking a 21-14 lead early in the third quarter on Colburn's 28-yard pass to Devon Wylie. The touchdown came one play after they converted a fourth-and-2 with a short pass to Tapa Taumoepeau.

The turnaround was just as stark on the other side of the ball as the Bearcats were held to minus-6 yards in a span of more than 22 minutes after taking a 14-0 lead on Zach Collaros' touchdown run early in the second quarter.

The Bulldogs sacked Collaros on three successive plays on UC's first drive of the fourth quarter as the Bearcats offense struggled to find a rhythm. Collaros completed 24 of 41 passes for 219 yards, throwing for one touchdown and running for another, but he was sacked eight times.

The Bearcats were held to 15 yards rushing in their first regular-season loss since a 40-16 defeat at Connecticut on Oct. 25, 2008.

The Bearcats got off to the early lead, getting a 23-yard TD pass from Collaros to D.J. Woods following an interception by Pat Lambert. Collaros' 5-yard run early in the second quarter made it 14-0. At that point, Cincinnati had outgained Fresno State 195-8 and had two more touchdowns than the Bulldogs had first downs.
