### **REDHAWKS HOST CINCINNATI IN 128TH MEETING**

The Miami University football team plays host to Cincinnati on Saturday, Sept. 14 at 12 p.m. The contest will be carried live on ESPNU.

#### ABOUT MIAMI

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (724), conference wins (317), MAC Championships (17) and bowl wins (8).
- Historically, Miami's 724 career wins are third all-time among Group-of-Five programs, behind just Navy (739) and Army (728).
- Miami was 4-14 in Coach Martin's first 18 Mid-American Conference games. Since then, the RedHawks are 42-17 in their last 59 games versus schools from the MAC.
- Miami captured its second MAC Championship in the last five years, defeating Toledo 23-14 last season. Chuck Martin won his first MAC Championship back in 2019.
- The RedHawks have been bowl-eligible seven of the last eight seasons. From 2006-15, Miami was bowl-eligible just twice.
- The RedHawks have picked up Power-5 victories in two straight years, downing Cincinnati (31-24) in 2023 and Northwestern (17-14) in 2022. Miami has not defeated a Power-5 team three straight years since 1998-2000.

• The 11 wins last season were tied for the second-most in program history. The last time Miami won 11 games in a season, NFL future Hall of Fame quarterback Ben Roethlisberger was taking snaps for Miami back in 2003 (13-1).

### **ABOUT CHUCK MARTIN**

- Chuck Martin was named Miami head coach on Dec. 3, 2013.
- He was named a 2023 Finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.
- Not only was he 74-7 in six years at Grand Valley State (2004-09), he has coached in seven national championship games in the past 21 seasons. Martin has an all-time head coaching record of 130-70.
- He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year and has been a coordinator on both sides of the ball.
- Martin was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Grand Valley State University on Oct. 23, 2015.
- Martin's 119 games coached at Miami is tops in program history and his 56 career wins ranks behind only Randy Walker (59) and ahead of the Terry Hoeppner (48), Frank Wilton (44) and John Pont (43).

### **ABOUT CINCINNATI**

Cincinnati comes into Saturday's action at 1-1 overall, while averaging 32.5 points and 553.5 yards per contest. Brendan Sorsby has thrown for 681 yards and five touchdowns through two contests and former RedHawk, Mehki Miller, its tops on the team with 12 tackles.

#### SERIES VS. CINCINNATI

- The Battle for the Victory Bell series, which started in 1888 with the first college football game ever played in the state of Ohio, is now 60-60-7 in 127 career meetings. Miami snapped a 16-game losing streak last year with a win over the Bearcats.
- The "Battle for the Victory Bell" between Miami and Cincinnati is the longest-lasting collegiate football rivalry west of the Allegheny Mountains, first being played in 1888. It is also the fifth-most played rivalry in Division I (FBS only) with 127 all-time meetings and is the oldest non-conference rivalry in the nation.
- The first Miami/Cincinnati game was played in Oxford on Dec. 8, 1888 as the teams played to a scoreless tie. The game was the first college football game played in the state of Ohio.
- Due to COVID, the two teams did not play in 2020, ending a streak of consecutive years played, dating back to 1945. Miami/UC did not play in 1943 or 1944, but Miami and UC also played every year from 1909 through 1942. Of the 127 meetings, 55 have been decided by seven points or less, including the seven ties in series history.

### LAST MEETING VERSUS BEARCATS

Joe Wilkins Jr.'s eight-yard touchdown catch in overtime and Yahsyn McKee's game-sealing interception gave Miami a dramatic 31-24 win at Cincinnati in the annual Battle for the Victory Bell. McKee forced overtime by blocking a field goal in the final seconds of the fourth guarter as well.

Miami claimed the Bell for the first time since 2005 and won the first overtime game in program history, while handing the Bearcats just their second home loss in the past five seasons. Brett Gabbert threw for 237 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Red-Hawks' offense.

### **NORTHWESTERN RECAP**

Miami dropped its season opener 13-6 at Northwestern in a defensive battle. Cade Mc-Donald led the Red and White with a career-high eight receptions for 105 yards, while Matt Salopek made a game-high 10 tackles.

- Brett Gabbert finished 22-37 through the air for 227 yards in his first action since Oct. 21, 2023.
- Dom Dzioban made the first field goal of his career.
- Matt Salopek moved into 10th place on Miami's all-time list with 402 career tackles, passing Joe Farais (1976-78).
- Brian Ugwu led Miami with two tackles for loss and added a fumble recovery.

### **DEFENSE CONTINUES TREND**

After allowing just one touchdown in the loss to Northwestern, Miami's defense looks to be following the 2023 blueprint. Last year, Miami ranked eighth nationally, allowing just 15.9 points per contest. The RedHawks were also 26th in total defense (330.4) and 34th in rush defense (132.2).

### MONSTERS OF THE MAC

Miami's defense was even better in conference play last year. Miami ranked first in scoring (10.8), total defense (272.5) and sacks (27). Miami was second in rush defense (114.4) and pass defense (158.1). The RedHawks shut out two MAC opponents (BGSU and Akron) and allowed just three points in a win over Kent State. Miami allowed only nine touchdowns in eight MAC games last season.

### **TACKLING MACHINE**

Linebacker Matt Salopek, the reigning 2023 MAC Defensive Player of the Year, has 402 career tackles and has surpassed 100 stops in 2021, 2022 and 2023. The last time Miami had a player record 100-plus tackles three straight seasons was Matt Pusateri from 2002-04 and no RedHawk has ever secured 100-plus tackles in four-straight seasons. His 402 tackles ranks 10th all-time in program history.

### LIVING ON THE EDGE

Miami had no sacks at Northwestern after finishing first in the MAC and 26th nationally with 35 sacks last season. Brian Ugwu (8.0) and Ty Wise (8.0) each ranked in the top-5 in the MAC and were 41st and 48th nationally.

### 41 AND COUNTING...

Matt Salopek made his 41st career start to open 2024, but he is not the only defender that has played a ton of football on the defensive side of the ball. Kobe Hilton (37), Brian Ugwu (21) and Ty Wise (20) have all started at least 20 games.

### **GABBERT IN THE HISTORY BOOK**

Brett Gabbert, who missed the last six games of the 2023 season with a leg injury, has made 40 starts in his career and is all over the Miami record books. He ranks third in program history with 8,120 passing yards, sixth in completion percentage (.592) and third in passing touchdowns (59). He is also 45 yards shy of 500 career rushing yards and is responsible for 66 touchdowns (59 passing, 7 rushing) in his career.

### **OLE MCDONALD HAD A DAY**

Senior Cade McDonald set career-highs in catches (8) and yards (105) in the loss at Northwestern, smashing his previous high of six grabs for 74 yards last season at Western Michigan. McDonald finished 2023 with 28 grabs for 353 yards.

### **WELCOME BACK JACK**

Lots of preseason talk revolved around Brett Gabbert, but Miami had a second key player returning from injury. Tight end Jack Coldiron, who suffered a knee injury last season at Miami (FL), returned to action versus the Wildcats, finishing the contest with two grabs for 20 yards.

### TRENCH WARFARE

Miami's offensive line is expected to be one of the RedHawks' top units entering 2024. Reid Holskey has started each of the last 41 games for the Red and White and is followed by Will Jados (25), Kolby Borders (24), and John Young (15). Those four have combined to start 106 games and all four started all 14 games a year ago. Charlie Nank made his first career start last week at Northwestern.

### **ALL-MAC SPECIALTY**

Miami has a pair of All-MAC performers on special teams ... both punters. Dom Dzobian was named a second-team All-MAC punter in 2022 and Alec Bevelhimer did the same in 2023. Dzobian, now Miami's placekicker, converted on 2-of-3 field goals last week at Northwestern, while Bevelhimer averaged 39.0 yards per punt against the Wildcats.

### **SEAN MCVAY JOINS CRADLE OF COACHES**

Miami added a 10th bronze statue to its Cradle of Coaches in Sean McVay back in 2023. McVay, the current head coach of the Los Angeles Rams, joined Ara Parseghian, Paul Brown, Weeb Ewbank, John Harbaugh, John Pont, Carm Cozza, Bo Schembechler, Red Blaik, and Paul Dietzel in the south end of Yager Stadium.

### **NEW FACES NEW PLACES**

The transfer portal has changed college football and Miami is no different. The RedHawks have 19 players on the team that transferred from other schools: Connor Briggs (Southeastern Louisiana), Jordan Brunson (Virginia Tech), Jeremiah Caldwell (Louisville), Preston Daniel (Florida State), Dylan Downing (Purdue), Luke Evans (Mississippi State), Savio Frazier (Mercer), William Hardrick (Mississippi State), Andre Johnson (Arizona State), Maddox Kopp (Colorado), Jackson Kuwatch (Ohio State), Cade McDonald (Michigan State), Keyon Mozee (Kansas State), Kam Perry (Indiana), Corey Suttle (Iowa State), Brian Ugwu (Rutgers), Cameron Williams (Indiana), Ty Wise (Indiana) and John Young (Kentucky).

### IF YOU BUILD IT...

Miami's Director of Athletics, David Sayler continues to add facilities for the department. The two newest football installments can be seen just north of Yager Stadium. The new David and Anita Dauch Indoor Sports Center (DISC) opened in February of 2015 and features a full-length 120-yard field and four sprint lanes.

Between Yager Stadium and the DISC is the Athletic Performance Center. The APC provides much-needed upgrades to Miami Football's locker room and offices while also hosting a state-of-the-art medical and athletic training facility that serves all Miami's student-athletes.

### **Retired Miami Numbers**

### #7 Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

#### #40 Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

#### #41 Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#### #42 John Pont

**Total Offense** 

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

Miami University, known world-wide as the "Cradle of Coaches," contributed four alumni to *Sporting News Magazine*'s 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.


PAUL BROWN (`30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON (`35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER (`51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN (`49) was selected as sports' 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN's list. Hayes served as Miami's football coach from 1949-50.

The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami's four alumni topped Alabama (Paul "Bear" Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed "Wizard of Westwood", was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.



An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), **Paul Brown** is a member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. **Brown** then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. **Brown** was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967.



Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable **Walter Alston** managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a "Dodger Way," which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.

Bo Schembechler

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Bo Schembechler** was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, **Schembechler** led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). **Schembechler** then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.




A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Ara Parseghian** was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami's head coach, **Parseghian** compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). **Parseghian** went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in 1964.

Ara Parseghian

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Woody Hayes** served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led Miami to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a three-time winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

**Chuck Martin Head Coach** 11th Season Coaching Record: 130-70 Record at Miami: 56-63 Millikin, 1990

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 30 years in college coaching experience, including 16 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National

Coach of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year in 2023 and has coached in seven national championship games. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

After taking over a team that had just gone 0-12 in 2013, Miami was 4-14 in Martin's first 18 conference games. From there, the rest is history. Martin and the RedHawks are 42-17 in the MAC, best in the conference since 2016. The RedHawks won the 2019 and 2023 MAC Championship and have been bowl eligible seven of the past eight seasons. Martin's 118 games coached are the most in program history and his 56 career wins trails only Randy Walker (59).

This was done year after year with strong recruiting classes. Miami's classes have been some of the best the school has ever seen. Over the last eight years, Miami's recruiting classes have ranked first or second six different times. Those recruiting efforts have shown up at the highest level as well. Dating back to 2019, Miami has had a player selected in the NFL Draft three of the past five

Miami's turnaround began back in 2016 as Martin orchestrated something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

The RedHawks finished this past season with 11 victories, the second-most in program history. Not only did Miami capture its second MAC Championship under Martin, the RedHawks also defeated Cincinnati for the first time since 2005. Martin also led Miami to wins over Ohio and Ball State, meaning all three rivalry trophies can be viewed inside the Athletic Performance Center at one

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/ recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.
