### ON TODAY'S AGENDA

**Govs Captains:** Malik Boynton, JaVaughn Craig  
**Notably:** Two young head coaches square off as they continue to remake programs in their own image. Will Healy's up-tempo offense, which garnered the second 4,000-yard season in program history a year ago, looks to improve upon a late-season surge that saw the offense average 434.2 yards per game over the final five weeks of the 2016 campaign. Luke Fickell, in his first year at the helm of the Bearcats, looks to right the ship in Cincinnati following a disappointing 4-8 mark in 2016 – he comes to Cincinnati from Ohio State, where he was defensive coordinator from 2005-16, serving as head coach in 2011.

### AT THE KICKOFF

#### YEAR 2 OF THE HEALY ERA

- The Governors kick off the 2017 campaign – the 81st in program history – with a Thursday night trip to FBS Cincinnati and ESPN3 broadcast highlighting Week 1.
- A year ago, the Governors offense reached new heights in its first season under Healy and offensive coordinator Wesley Satterfield. Under their guidance, the program amassed 4,042 yards total offense – second-most in program history – and freshman Kentel Williams earned OVC All-Newcomer honors.
- Luke Fickell inherits the Cincinnati program from the ousted Tommy Tuberville after the Bearcats went 4-8 last season, including five straight losses to close the season.
- This is the second season in a row, and sixth time since 2011, the Govs will open the regular season against an FBS opponent; Cincinnati also was the 2011 campaign's first foe.
- With road trips to Cincinnati and Miami University to open the schedule, the Govs will play at least two FBS foes for the third consecutive season; it will be the first time since 2013 that Austin Peay will play FBS opponents in back-to-back weeks to open the season.
- This is Austin Peay's first Thursday contest since hosting Eastern Illinois, Oct. 10, 2013, and the first time the Govs have opened up the regular season on a Thursday night since 2010.
- The nation's top FCS recruiting class will get its first taste of the road against the nation's 123rd ranked scoring offense (19.3 ppg) from a year ago.
- This is APSU's 81st season of college football, including nine non-scholarship seasons (1997-2005).
- Governor quarterbacks will have to be mindful against the Bearcats; Cincinnati intercepted 17 passes last season, 11th-most in FBS.

### ■ SGT. YORK TROPHY

Delta Dental of Tennessee is again the presenting sponsor of the Sgt. York Trophy in 2015. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quad-rangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor.

### ■ GOV WHO DESERVES PUB



With five games left in the 2016 campaign, **JAVAUGHN CRAIG** became a regular fixture in the Austin Peay lineup. All he did after that was average 6.69 yards per carry (second all-time in a single season in APSU history) and tally neither 1,000 yards total offense. His school-record 466 yards total offense earned him Austin Peay's first-ever STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Week honor after his five-touch-down game against Tennessee State; he was the first Governor quarterback to pass for 300 yards and rush for 100 in the same game in school history. This summer, Craig showed his merits off the gridiron, going on a mission trip to Haiti – details will be available in Austin Peay's home-opening game program.

### ■ HEALY'S HIGH POINTS

Fans and media can hear from head coach Will Healy throughout the week, beginning Monday night at Buffalo Wild Wings off Wilma Rudolph Boulevard. Healy is the regular headliner of 'Inside Austin Peay' – he breaks down the previous week with Governors play-by-play man Brian Rives, looks ahead to the next opponent and is occasionally joined by a member of the coaching staff or a player.

Tuesday morning, Healy is on the weekly teleconference with Ohio Valley Conference media members – his slot is 10:35 a.m. and the log-in can be obtained via the OVC and APSU media relations offices.

The Ohio Valley Conference kicks off its 70th season with all nine league teams in action from Aug. 26-Sept. 2... three-time defending league champion Jacksonville State opens up in a marquee matchup against Chattanooga, pitting the sixth-ranked Gamecocks against the 11th-ranked Mocs in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff... four OVC squads will face FBS foes in the season's first week: Austin Peay (Cincinnati), Tennessee State (Georgia State), Southeast Missouri (Kansas) and Eastern Kentucky (Western Kentucky)... aside from the Gamecocks, Tennessee Tech is the only other OVC squad facing a top-25 opponent, hosting 25th-ranked Western Illinois... only three OVC squads are opening up with true home contests: Tennessee Tech, UT Martin (Clarion) and Murray State (Kentucky Wesleyan)... pre-season OVC Offensive Player of the Year, TSU wide receiver Patrick Smith, and the Tigers will help Georgia State christen its new home at Georgia State Stadium, formerly home of the Atlanta Braves when it was known as Turner Field... Jacksonville State has won 24 consecutive OVC games, longest active conference win streak in Division I, ahead of Alabama (17)... the Gamecocks 24-game league winning streak is second all-time in OVC history, behind only Eastern Kentucky (26, 1992-95).

## RECORD-SETTING CORE

- After years spent trying to lock down the quarterback position, Austin Peay is blessed with a multitude of high-upside signal-callers at their disposal in 2017. Back after an impressive five-game stretch to close the 2016 season, Javaughn Craig returns for his sophomore campaign – the dual-threat quarterback roasted Tennessee State for nearly 500 yards total offense last season. Pushing Craig will be high-profile commit Jeremiah Oatsvall (Brentwood Academy), a three-star recruit and the jewel of the top FCS' top 2017 recruiting class.
- A stable of ballcarriers will give the Governors ground game a lift in 2017, with 2016 All-Newcomer selection Kentel Williams seeking to become the first Governor since Ryan White (2008-09) to lead Austin Peay in rushing in back-to-back seasons. A pair of transfers figure to factor into the ground game, with Tre Nation (Illinois) and Darryl Rollins-Davis (Arkansas State) aboard, with returnee and recent scholarship recipient Prince Momodu looking to steal some carries as well as talented freshman Ahmaad Tanner (Dalton HS), who rushed for more than 3,000 yards during his prep career in Georgia.
- For the first time in several years, the Governors should be able to count on a veteran presence at every spot along the offensive line. Two-year starters Ryan Rockensuess and Byron Glass hold down the fort inside, while senior Max Ewoldt provides toughness and veteran leadership at right tackle. Transfers Kyle Anderton (Vanderbilt) and Charles Mosley (Tennessee) are new to APSU but veterans of the collegiate game – Mosley made 12 appearances as a freshman for the Vols, while Anderton moves inside from tight end, where he was a letterwinner for the Commodores.
- The Governors receiving corp will have a new look in 2017, with 42.2 percent of receptions and 45.2 percent of receiving yards returning. However, the wideouts have been bolstered with junior college additions DJ Montgomery (Holmes CC) and Kadeem Goulbourne (Iowa Western CC), with redshirt freshmen Gorel Soumare and Terrius Callahan primed for breakouts in their first collegiate action. True freshman Angelo Wilson (Bowling Green HS) will get first crack at replacing four-year starter Rashaan Coleman in the slot.
- The one spot on offense Austin Peay can lean on its veteran savvy is at tight end, where three-year starter James Coleman returns

after a breakout campaign that featured two games with two touchdown receptions. Michael Hoover, who turned his first career reception a year ago into a touchdown, will push Coleman and be featured in heavy sets, while freshmen Elijah Brown (Morristown West) and Trey Pruitt (Mount Juliet) are among a host of fresh faces seeking playing time.

- The Governors offensive adjustments at half-time put opponents on their heels for much of 2016. Of Austin Peay's 259 points last season, 59.8 percent (155) came in the third and fourth quarters. Among these were a 21-point fourth quarter at UT Martin (Oct. 1), 28 points – including 21 in the final 6:17 of regulation – in the fourth quarter of a near-comeback against Mercer (Oct. 22) and three scores in the final 15:25 of play against Tennessee State (Nov. 5).
- The nine interceptions thrown by Austin Peay quarterbacks were fourth-fewest in the OVC in 2016, with only two coming from Craig—he began his APSU career with 64 consecutive passes without an interception.
- As a team, the Gobs rushed for more than 200 yards in four straight games to close the 2016 season, topping out with 322 yards on the ground against Tennessee State (Nov. 5). Not only was that Austin Peay's first 300-yard rushing game since Nov. 16, 2013 against Southeast Missouri, it's the first streak of four or more contests with 200 or more yards on the ground since Austin Peay began keeping game-by-game records electronically in 2002.
- Austin Peay quarterbacks had as many rushing touchdowns (8) as its running backs in 2016.
- Williams (5) and Kyran Moore (7) each had five or more games with 100 or more all-purpose yards in 2016. Moore's 2016 featured the most 100 AP-yard games since Ryan White had seven (2011), while the duo became the first APSU teammates with 1,000-plus AP yards in the same season since White (1,167) and Terrence Holt (2,373) in 2009. Williams and Moore are the first APSU teammates with five or more games of 100+ all-purpose yards since White (7) and Holt (8) in 2007.
- Williams touched off a piece of OVC history with his league-record 399 all-purpose yards against Eastern Kentucky (Nov. 12). He became the first player in league history to earn OVC Newcomer, Offensive Player and Specialist of the Week in the same week, as well as APSU's first STATS FCS Freshman of the Week honor.

## WILLIAMS' WORKLOAD

Tabbed as one of Athlon Sports' Breakout Players to Watch in the OVC, Kentel Williams should get even more chances to ignite the crowd in 2017. In 112 total offensive touches last season (101 carries, 11 catches), Williams averaged 6.3 yards per touch, with 10 going for 20 or more yards and 20 touches of longer than 10 yards – all coming in the season's final five games, and not including his 97-yard kick return for a score against Eastern Kentucky.

## ■ TOEING THE LINE

- Up front, Jaison Williams returns to anchor one end position after terrorizing opposing backfields as a freshman; his 7.5 TFL were most by an APSU freshman since Daniel Becker posted 8.5 TFL as a freshman in 2006.
- Faces old and new will anchor positions alongside Williams up front. Sheun Whittinghill looks to build off a 4.5 TFL performance in eight games as a redshirt freshman, while Byron Carver returns from missing most of 2016 while also making the transition to a more interior line position. Nico Mays is back to provide depth, while a longtime stalwart at linebacker, Benedict Louis, will try his hand at edge rushing as well.
- But it won't be all returners along the Austin Peay front four. Northwest Mississippi transfer is a big-bodied tackle who led NWMCC to a conference title with 7.0 TFL. Theron Hodges and Matthew Gayle, who both redshirted last season, are slated to take snaps early and often as Marcus West looks to disrupt opposing offenses with fresh bodies along the line.
- The linebacker corp should be in good hands with a pair of veterans locking down starting nods. Gunnar Scholato's All-OVC nod was well-deserved for the former walk-on, while Jeremiah Mitchell is hunting his 100th career tackle after finally breaking into the starting lineup late last season. Sophomore wrecking ball Tyler Reid looks to build on his first campaign, while East Central CC standout Pat Walker will push Mitchell for time on the weak side.
- The secondary will be a good blend of veteran savvy and youthful athleticism. Seniors Malik Boynton and Dekeivis Perry have been through many a battle in the secondary over their APSU careers and will be looked to as elder statesmen for the Govs.
- A pair of junior college transfers will get on the field early to provide a boost for the Govs. Malik Davis, a teammate of Walker's at ECCC, was a first-team MACJC All-State safety a year ago, while ballhawking corner Keawvis Cummings will man one corner position in his first APSU season.
- A quartet of DB's—Chris Hopkins, Juantarius Bryant, Trent Taylor and Rodney Saullsberry Jr.—are back for another season. Both Hopkins and Taylor started for large swaths of the season, with Taylor breaking up a team-high eight passes opposite departed Gov Roderick Owens.

- Freshmen Kordell Jackson and Calvin Sims look to insert themselves into the rotation early. Jackson, who prepped at Ramsey High School in Birmingham, had an excellent camp and could be a longterm fixture as a lockdown cover man.
- When Williams and Lloyd Tubman each registered 2.0 TFL against Murray State last season, they became the first Governor teammates with multiple tackles for loss in the same game since Oct. 24, 2015 (Z. Stuart, C. Teague).
- By himself, Scholato had six double-digit tackle outings in 2016. The entire Austin Peay defense had five such individual performances in 2015. The last Governor with four or more single-game double-digit tackle efforts prior to Scholato was Antwaun Majors in 2011.
- The Governors hope an influx of talent in the secondary will lead to more interceptions in 2016. Of Austin Peay's five interceptions last season, two were by Scholato, a linebacker; two more were by Owens, who graduated in May; and the last was by Kyran Moore, a return specialist/slot receiver who was pulling double-duty during the Tennessee State game, Nov. 5.

## ■ GUNNAR GOES OFF

Gunnar Scholato didn't just become the first Governor since 2008 to post a 100-tackle season a year ago; he blew past the mark with 124 total stops, most by a Governor since 2000 (Drew Wilson) and the seventh-most in FCS last season. He picked off a pass and returned it for a score in the season finale at Kentucky, book-ending a fantastic campaign that began with him earning a scholarship after the 2016 Red-and-White Game.

# WILL HEALY

**Position: Head Coach • Experience: Second Season**

In two short years, Will Healy has brought two top recruiting classes and revitalized Austin Peay football.

Healy was announced as Austin Peay State University's 19th football coach, Dec. 20, 2015, before being introduced at a press conference two days later.

Healy came to Austin Peay after serving seven seasons as an assistant coach at Chattanooga. The personable young mentor worked under head coach Russ Huesman in helping restore the former FCS power Mocs to its previous glory. After arriving in 2009, Healy was part of a staff that had the best turnaround in school history in 2009 (from 1-11 to 6-5) and only improved from that point on. The Mocs won or shared Southern Conference Championships each of the last three seasons, making FCS play-off appearances in 2014 and 2015. In fact, the Mocs finished 9-4 in 2015, including narrow losses to FCS championship finalist Jacksonville State, the FCS quarterfinal contest going into overtime.

The Chattanooga native served as wide receivers coach, passing-game coordinator and recruiting coordinator. Healy's work in the passing game helped mold Jacob Huesman into three-time Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Year. This season, with Healy serving as passing game coordinator, Huesman threw for 2,117 yards and 12 touchdowns while rushing for another 1,244 yards and 13 more scores. As a result, Huesman was chosen STATS FCS Second-Team All-America.

Healy's quarterback development skills appeared early in his Chattanooga tenure. As Mocs' quarterback coach in 2009 he tutored Tennessee transfer BJ Coleman, who passed for more than 2,300 yards, 17 touchdowns and just four interceptions. He became a seventh-round selection of the Green Bay Packers in the 2012 draft.

After moving to receivers coach in 2010, Healy had equal success. Joel Bradford became an All-American in 2010, posting 81 catches for a school-record 1,284 yards. Tommy Hudson and Clarksville native C.J. Board also earned All-SoCon honors in 2014 under Healy's tutelage.

Along the way, Healy's worked with two passing programs ranked in the FCS Top-10 in 2010 (eighth in yards) and 2014 (sixth in passer rating).

Healy's also was responsible for helping transform Chattanooga from a successful team into a well-respected program as recruiting coordinator. With Healy taking the lead in building relationships and the program utilizing Tennesseans for nearly half its roster, Chattanooga had top-rated recruiting classes in 2012-14, including the top-ranked FCS class in 2013 and 2014.

He also served as the program's NFL liaison during his Chattanooga tenure.

Healy was introduced to football at a young age. His father Rob was a star at Georgia Tech and his uncle Chip was an All-America linebacker at Vanderbilt. As a prep quarterback star at Chattanooga's Boyd-Buchanan, Healy earned all-state twice, all-state honorable mention two other years, and was a four-time all-region selection. A Tennessee "Mr. Football" finalist as a senior, Healy holds the Chattanooga area career passing record with more than 7,700 yards.

That helped him land initially at the Air Force Prep Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado before heading to Richmond (Virginia). Healy was a team captain on the Richmond's 2008 FCS National Title team and saw action in 31 games in his collegiate career. He played in the Spiders' win over Montana in the 2008 FCS Championship game, which for many years was played at Chattanooga's Finley Stadium.

Healy received his bachelor's degree from Richmond in Rhetoric and Communication Studies in December 2008. He literally went from the playing field to coaching, joining Huesman at Chattanooga as a young assistant in 2009 at Chattanooga.

Healy married the former Emily Broyles in July, 2012. The couple has one son, Eli, age 2.
