FOOTBALL WELCOMES ECU TO NIPPERT ON SENIOR DAY

The University of Cincinnati football team will be on the hunt for its seventh 10-win season in program history Friday, closing out
the 2018 regular season against ECU at 3:30 p.m. ET on senior day inside Nippert Stadium. The Bearcats [9-2, 5-2 AAC] are going
for the seventh 10-win season in program history. The game will be televised on CBS SN with radio coverage on 700 WLW AM.

THE SERIES

• The Bearcats and Pirates meet for the 21st time Friday. UC has won six of seven in the series but trails 13-8 overall. UC has won three-straight matchups inside Nippert Stadium.

THE COACHES

- LUKE FICKELL was named the 42nd Football Head Coach at the University of Cincinnati in December 2016. He took the reins of
 UC's program after spending 15 years at his alma mater, Ohio State. A veteran of nearly 20 years coaching at the FBS level, Fickell
 was a part of nine Big Ten Conference titles (seven as a coach, two as a player) and two national championship squads with 15
 postseason games and 12 NFL Draft selections under his belt.
- SCOTTIE MONTGOMERY is 9-25 in his third season as ECU's head coach. Montgomery joined the Pirates after a three-year tenure
 at Duke where he served as the Blue Devils' assistant head coach, OC and QB coach. Prior to joining the Duke staff, the NFL veteran wideout spent three seasons on the Pittsburgh Steelers staff under former UC assistant coach Mike Tomlin.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS ...

- The University of Cincinnati football team plays its 131st season in 2018. The program dates to 1885 and is one of the 10 oldest in
 the NCAA FBS. UC has won a league title five times in the last 11 years and will play in its 10th bowl games in the last 13 seasons.
- With eight wins on the year, UC is bowl eligible for the first time since 2015 when the Bearcats played in the Hawai'i Bowl.
- One of the youngest teams in the country, UC is made up of 72-percent underclassmen, including 35 true freshmen. The Bearcats feature players from 16 states and five countries with 64 of 112 student-athletes hailing from Ohio and 24 from the Cincinnati area.
- UC is 9-2 on the season and 4-2 on the road, equaling the most wins away from home since 2014. It's the best start to a season
 for the Bearcats since 2009 when the team went 12-0 during the regular season.
- UC is on the cusp of the seventh 10-win season in program history after hitting the mark in 1951 [10-1], 2007 [10-3], 2008 [11-3], 2009 [12-1], 2011 [10-3] and 2012 [10-3].
- UC will honor its 14-member senior class in a pregame ceremony on Saturday at Nippert Stadium.
- The Bearcats are defeating opponents by an average of 16.0 ppg, which includes home wins over Alabama A&M, Ohio, Tulane, Navy and USF along with road triumphs at UCLA, Miami [OH], UConn and SMU.
- UC leads the NCAA FBS in net punting and ranks among the Top-20 FBS squads in 3rd down conversion pct. defense [4], 4th down conversion pct. defense [5], first downs defense [5], rushing defense [9], total defense [10], time of possions [11], team passing efficiency defense [13], scoring defense [14] and rushing offense [18]
- UC leads the American in scoring defense, rushing defense, total defense, punting, opponent 1st downs, opponent 3rd down conversions and opponent 4th down conversions while ranking No. 2 in pass defense efficiency and No. 3 in pass defense.
- UC has 32 rushing touchdowns on the year, almost tripling last year's total of 11. RB Michael Warren II has 17 of those 32 scores.
- Warren has rushed for 1,163 yards on the season, a school-record overall 18 TDs and a school-record tying 17 rushing scores.
- QB Desmond Ridder has completed 62 percent of his passes in 10 starts, throwing for 2,024 yards, 15 TDs and adding another 567 yards rushing along with five more scores.
- DT Cortez Broughton ranks No. 5 in the American in sacks (0.59 per game) and no. 2 in tackles for loss (1.59 per game). His season numbers (6.5 sacks, 17.5 TFL) surpass his career numbers entering 2018 (3.5 sacks, 10 TFL).
- P James Smith is one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award. He leads the AAC and is No. 4 in the NCAA FBS averaging 46.7 ypp.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the UC Sports Communications Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit the football page at GoBEARCATS.com to request credentials online. Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game. No credentials will be mailed after Tuesday preceding the game. Thereafter, credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located by gate 6.

SCOUTING PASSES

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through UC's Sports Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

SIDELINE PASSES

The University of Cincinnati follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines and behind the restraining line in the end zone.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete stats, scoring summaries, running play-by-play, quickie stats and post-game notes and quotes are provided by the UC Sports Communications Office. Pregame food service is available beginning approximately two hours prior to kickoff, while beverages are available throughout the contest. This service is provided as a courtesy to working media. In addition, concession areas are available within the stadium confines. Wireless internet is available in the press box at Nippert Stadium. Members of the UC Sports Communications staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

UC holds a weekly media luncheon each Tuesday in the second floor Bob Goin Team Room of Richard E. Lindner Center. Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., selected players are available for one-on-one interviews from 11:45-noon, and head coach Luke Fickell takes the podium at noon. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaches.

PRACTICES

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on Tuesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact UC Sports Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regular-season practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and the first 20 minutes (four periods).

INTERNET POLICIES

Live updating of websites, blogs and social network feeds is not allowed during practices.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The UC locker room will remain closed following all football games. Media should request players through UC Sports Communications during the fourth quarter. Media will be allowed to enter the field [for home games] late in the fourth quarter but will not be allowed to conduct interviews with UC football players on the field (home or away). Only the originating television and radio networks will be allowed to conduct interviews on the field.

There will be a 10-15 minute cooling off period between the end of the game and start of the postgame interview sessions. Coach Fickell will address the media in the designated interview area following home games. Players will be brought into the interview area as soon as possible.

Postgame availability on the road will be determined on gameday. Please see football contact Ryan Koslen for details.

AMERICAN ATHLETIC TELECONFERENCE

The American Athletic Conference will coordinate a weekly teleconference of the league's 12 head football coaches. Media members who wish to access the teleconference should contact Chuck Sullivan at the American Athletic Conference for the phone number. CONNECTION

 ECU OL coach Don Mahoney held the same role at UC from 2010-13 and was Bearcats graduate assistant Austen Bujnoch's position coach.

BLUE SKY MINE

- P James Smith is one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award, presented annually to the nation's best punter.
- Smith joined on the finalist list by Braden Mann of Texas A&M and Mitch Wishnowsky from Utah.
- Smith, a sophomore, ranks No. 4 in the NCAA FBS with his 46.7 yards per punt average.
- The Bearcats lead the NCAA FBS and American Athletic Conference in net punting [44.1].
- Smith had a career-long 72-yard punt against Temple and has dropped 22 kicks inside the 20-yard line with 15 going 50 yards or more with only one touchback.
- The sophomore has been honored on Ray's 8, highlighting the best punters in college football each week, on five occasions in 2018 and he was tabbed as the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on November 14, 2018.
- The winner will be announced live on Thursday, December 6, 2018 at The Home Depot College Football Awards on ESPN in Atlanta, Georgia.

LONG & WINDING ROAD

- Among the 33 teams who finished with four or less wins a year ago, Cincinnati (9-2) is the only one to have topped nine wins this season. Syracuse (8-3), Florida (8-3) and Georgia Southern (8-3) are within one game of reaching nine victories.
- UC and Georgia Southern have both increased their win total by five over a year ago.

TEN

- The Bearcats have reached the 9-win plateau for the 13th time in program history and first since 2014.

IRON MAN

 Six weeks and three days after undergoing surgery for a fractured ankle suffered at UConn, C Garrett Campbell started and played the entire game at UCF.

RULE OF THREE

- UC forced three-and-outs on seven of USF's 14 drives, the sixth time in 2018 the Bearcats have forced seven or more opponent three-and-outs.
- UC is one of the national leaders in forcing three-and-outs.

TOO EARLY

 USF scored a touchdown on its opening drive, marking just the second time an opponent has done so in 2018 with UConn being the first. The Bearcats forced its other eight foes to punt on their first possessions of the game.

UNDER PRESSURE

- UC recorded 7.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks vs. USF.
- The 7.0 TFLs marks the seventh time this year the Bearcats have recorded 6.0 or more in a game while the 4.0 sacks marks the fourth time UC has posted 4.0 or more.
- UC has 25 sacks and 66 TFLs on the season, eclipsing its 2017 numbers of 12 and 58. It's the most sacks in a season for UC since 2014 [35] and the most TFLs since 2016 [71].

GREAT WALL OF CINCINNATI

 USF entered the game averaging 219.0 rushing yards per game, but were limited to just 81 on the ground by the Bearcats. That total marked the sixth time in 2018 that UC has held a foe to under 100 yards rushing in a game. With 313 yards of total offense allowed, it marked the seventh time in 2018 UC has held an opponent to 350 yards or less.

TRUCK YEAH

- RB Michael Warren II had one of his best games of the year against USF as the sophomore rushed for 151 yards on the ground and scored three touchdowns while adding two catches for 27 yards and his first career score through the air for his first four-score game.
- Warren had scoring runs of 57, 1 and 1 after hauling a 13yard grab to open his scoring.
- With his 151 yards on the ground, Warren eclipsed 1,000 yards on the ground for the first time in his career and the first time at UC since the 2012 season (George Winn) while bringing his season total to 1,082 yards this year.

STAND

- UC drew first blood at UCF, scoring on a Kimoni Fitz fumble recovery in the end zone, with the force by Malik Clements.
- It was the third defensive score for the Bearcats in 2108 behind a safety (UCLA) and James Wiggins' walk-off pick six in overtime at SMU.
- It was the Bearcats first loss in 2018 when scoring first.
- UC has won 77 percent of its games (69/89) since 2007 when putting the first points of the game on the board.

THOUSAND-YARD STARE

- RB Michael Warren II became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in school history and first since George Winn in 2012 (1,334).
- Reggie Taylor achieved the feat three times [1984-86] and James Bettis [1980-81], Allen Harvin [1978, 1982], David Small [1991-93] and Isaiah Pead [2010-11] all did it twice.
- Warren has tallied 1,163 yards and a school-record tying 17 TDs in 11 games.
- Warren has surpassed Allen Harvin for the 10th-most yards on the ground in a single season after Harvin rushed for 1,161 yards in 1982.

- He tied the record with his first 1-yard plunge in the third quarter and broke the record with his second 1-yard score later in the third.

TIED RECORD

- The 17 rushing touchdowns RB Michael Warren II has tallied in 2018 currently have him tied for the most in a single season in program history, sharing the honor with David Small, who ran for 17 in 1993.
- He is the sixth back in school history to run for double-digit TDs in a single season.

BREAKING POINT

- With his 18 touchdowns in 2018, RB Michael Warren II has accounted for 108 points this year, placing him third in sinqle-season scoring.
- Andrew Gantz is just ahead of him in second with 112 points [2015] with Jim O'Brien holding the all-time mark with 142 points in 1968.
- Warren entered the USF game with 84 points on the year with 98 points (Tony Miliano, 2011) ranking 10th.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Warren, who scored three rushing TDs for the second time
this year (vs. USF, at UCLA), broke off a 57-yard scoring run
against the Bulls, which also pushed him over 1,000 yards.
That carry ranks as the fifth-longest scoring play of the year
for the Bearcats and the second-longest rushing score of
the season behind his own 81-yard carry against Tulane.

TRUCKIN'

 Through games around the nation on Nov. 17, RB Michael Warren II's 17 rushing touchdowns currently rank as a tie for the third most with Clemson's Travis Etienne and Memphis' Darrell Henderson. The trio trails only Devin Singletary of Florida Atlantic, who leads the nation with 22.

- Pitts had a career-high 1.5 tackles for a loss on the evening and 6.0 on the season along with 4.0 sacks, two QB hurries and two passes defended.

TURN UP THE NIGHT

- On UC's second drive of the game against USF, the Bearcats were forced to punt with P James Smith sending the ball down the field 64 yards and WR Alex Pierce downing the ball with an acrobatic move at the USF 1-yard line.
- The UC defense forced a 3-and-out with USF punting the ball 39 yards and UC returning it to the USF 9-yard line. The Bearcats would eventually score on an 8-yard pass to QB Desmond Ridder to WR Kahlil Lewis.

RUN THRU

- QB Desmond Ridder He has completed nearly 62 percent of his passes (61.8) in 10 starts, throwing for 2,024 yards, 15 TDs, including six multiple TD games and another 567 yards rushing with five more scores.
- Ridder battled with Hayden Moore through the spring and training camp with Moore earning the start in the opener at UCLA. Ridder came in on the third drive of the season in a planned rotation and hasn't left the field since, earning the starting nod with a series of strong performances.
- Against USF, he finished the game with 194 yards passing with two scoring strikes through the air and added 60 yards on the ground on 18 carries.
- He put up career passing numbers at SMU, going 33-of-50 for 352 yards and a pair of TDs. It was the first 350-plus yard game for a Bearcats signal-caller since Moore threw for 381 yards at Navy on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Just before halftime against Tulane, Ridder scrambled for 28 yards and a touchdown. That rush marked his seventh rush of 20 yards or more on the season and also stands as his longest rushing touchdown. His previous long was 22 yards and came against Alabama A&M earlier this year.
- Ridder finished the Ohio game 19-of-29 for 274 yards and two TDs through the air and 10 carries for 28 yards and a TD on the ground. He set career marks in all passing categories.
- He completed his final 10 passes against the Bobcats, the first UC QB to accomplish the feat since Gunner Kiel in 2015 against Tulsa.
- He broke off a career-long 39-yard run on the second drive of the first quarter at Miami [OH], a play that eventually led to RB Michael Warren II rushing two yards for a TD.
- Ridder had 100 yards rushing on 18 attempts against the RedHawks, both career highs. His rushing total also makes him the first Bearcats quarterback since Munchie Legaux to hit the century mark on the ground after Legaux recorded 117 yards against Pittsburgh on September 6, 2012, six years and two days prior to Ridder's feat.
- He sparked the Bearcats in the opener at UCLA, finishing with 100 yards on 13-of-24 passing and rushing 14 times for 63 yards, including an 18-yard scamper in the second quarter which helped lead to Cole Smith's 24-yard field goal which game UC a 17-10 halftime lead.

IN THE AIR TONIGHT

- WR Kahlil Lewis had a career day against SMU, finishing with 12 catches for 174 yards and a pair of 32-yard TDs.
- He eclipsed his previous career highs of 10 receptions, set last year against SMU and 150 yards vs. ECU in 2016.
- It was his second multiple TD game of the season (Tulane) and fourth of his career. Lewis had only six catches in UC's previous three games and had seven first-half receptions.
- For his career, Lewis has 158 receptions for 1,899 yards and 17 TDs, ranking him No. 6 all time in receptions.

- UC returned home to Nippert Stadium for the first time in nearly a month, knocked off Navy 42-0, and will play three November home games for the first time in nine seasons.
- UC has not played three of its final four games of the regular season at home since 2009 when it faced UConn, West Virginia and Illinois in November on the home turf.

PANIC! AT THE DISCO

- The 35-23 win over USF on Nov. 10 marked the first primetime game inside Nippert Stadium since Nov. 14, 2015 when the Bearcats knocked off Tulsa 49-38.
- Playing under the lights at Nippert has been a rare thing in

the last decade, happening only five times.

 UC is 5-0 in November games at home which start at 7 p.m. or later since 2008.

ANOTHER BRICK IN THE WALL

- UC leads the NCAA FBS in net punting and ranks among the Top-20 FBS squads in 3rd down conversion pct defense [4], 4th down conversion pct defense [5], first downs defense [5], rushing defense [9], total defense [10], time of possions [11], team passing efficiency defense [13], scoring defense [14] and rushing offense [18].
- UC leads the American in scoring defense, rushing defense, total defense, punting, opponent 1st downs, opponent 3rd down conversions and opponent 4th down conversions while ranking No. 2 in pass defense efficiency and No. 3 in pass defense.

THE FORCE

- DT Coretz Broughton made his 47th career start against UCF while also starting for the 38th game in-a-row.
- Against Navy, he recorded a career-high 10 tackles that included 0.5 sacks and 1.5 tackles for loss. His 10 tackles are a career-high, surpassing his previous best of six.
- For the season, Broughton has 44 tackles, 17.5 for a loss, along with 6.5 sacks, five PBUs and three QB hurries.
- He ranks No. 2 in the AAC in TFLs and No. 5 in sacks.

THE TURNING POINT

- Cincinnati scored on its first four (and only) possessions of the first half against Navy to build a 28-0 lead at the break.
- It marked the second time this year that the Bearcats scored touchdowns on all their possessions in the first half of a game after going 6-for-6 against Alabama A&M.
- The Navy game also marked the third time the Bearcats scored touchdowns on four or more possessions in a row with the second instance coming at UConn when UC score on its final drive of the second quarter, all three in the third and its first in the fourth quarter.
- UC added to that by scoring on its opening drive of the second half to move to 5-of-5 on the day before punting on its second drive of the half.

FOURTH TIME IS THE CHARM

- Navy entered its game against UC ranked 24th nationally in fourth down conversions having converted on 14-of-22 attempts. Cincinnati, who entered the game ranked ninth nationally in fourth down conversion defense, held the Midshipmen to 0-for-3 on fourth downs today.
- Navy did not reach the red zone during the game with UC going 4-for-4 on the day. The closest Navy got was the UC 25 yard line before turning the ball over on downs. In fact, the Midshipmen advanced the ball into UC territory on just three of their 10 drives. Along with reaching the 25, Navy also reached the UC 49 in the first quarter (punt) and the UC 34 in the third quarter (downs).

START ME UP

 The Bearcats scored touchdowns on their opening drives of both halves of play against Navy, the fourth time that has happened this year. The previous occasions came against Alabama A&M, UConn and SMU.

CAN'T STOP ROCK 'N' ROLL

- Cincinnati allowed 171 yards of total offense to Navy and held the Midshipmen to 124 yards on the ground, their lowest output of the season. In fact, the rushing total for Navy is 183 yards under its season average of 307.3 per contest and surpassed its previous low of 129 yards rushing earlier this year at Air Force. The 171 total yards ranks as the fewest UC has allowed in 2018 (was 198 to Miami) with the 124 rushing yards the second-fewest (59 to Miami).
- The 124 rushing yards allowed was not only the lowest of the year for Navy, it also was 452 yards fewer than what the Midshipmen put on UC last year in Annapolis when they ran for 576 yards, the most allowed by a UC team in program history. Navy entered the game with the No. 3 rushing offense in the NCAA FBS. One of the differences was the play up front as UC recorded a season-high-tying 5.0 sacks (had the same at UCLA to open the season) after not recording a sack last year at Navy.

BACK TO ZERO

- UC shutout Navy 42-0, their second shutout in 2018 after earlier defeating Miami [Ohio], 21-0 [9/8/18].
- It's the first time since the 1981 season that the Bearcats have shutout multiple foes after UC won 10-0 at home over Rutgers (9/26) and 24-0 at home over Louisville (11/14).

HOLD ON LOOSELY

The Bearcats did not have a turnover vs. Navy (six touchdowns, three punts, one end of game), marking the second time they have done so this year [0 at Miami]. After recovering one fumble and finishing +1 in the turnover battle, UC has either finished tied with its opponent (four times) or leading (three) seven times in eight games.

LONG PROMISED ROAD

- WR Rashad Medaris hauled in a 55-yard strike from QB Desmond Ridder on the opening drive of the second half against Navy, his second score of 50 yards or more this year, trailing only his 77-yard scoring catch from Ridder against Ohio.
- That scoring play stands as the sixth-longest play of the year and the sixth-longest scoring play of the season.

FEELING A MOMENT

- S James Wiggins has come up with two interceptions at critical moments in games this season.
- His first came with Ohio at the 2-yard line facing a thirdand-goal. Wiggins came up with the pick with 51 seconds remaining in the game and UC ahead 34-30.

- His second was a game-winning, 86-yard interception return for a TD in overtime against SMU, his third interception of the season and first career TD.
- It was UC's first pick-6 since Malik Clements' game winner at Miami [OH] in 2017.
- The 86-yard run back was the fourth longest in school history and longest since current UC CB coach Mike Mickens had a 79 yard INT return for a TD against USF in 2007.
- Wiggins was named American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, Oct. 29.

BRAND NEW KICKS

- K Cole Smith scored eight points, including a pair of second-half field goals, to help Cincinnati to a 26-20 win at SMU. Smith hit from 24 yards in the third quarter to give the Bearcats a 17-7 lead and he made a 41-yard attempt as time expired in the fourth quarter to force overtime.
- He was named American Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 29.
- He hit a career-long 44-yard field goal with 9:31 left in the first half at Temple, his third make of the season.
- The 44-yard make was the longest for a UC kicker since Andrew Gantz hit a 50-yarder at ECU on Nov. 28, 2015.

THAT'S GOOD

- PR Aulden Knight had a career-long 31-yard return in the to start UC's second half at SMU.
- Knight joined the Bearcats as a walk-on in August after transferring from Hampton.
- He has returned 22 punts for 130 yards on the season, a 5.3 yards per return average which ranks second in the AAC.

CASTLE WALLS

 UC held SMU to 23 net rushing yards, a season-low. UC last held an opponent to 20 or fewer yards on Sept. 21, 2013 when Miami (0H) was limited to seven yards rushing.

NOWHERE TO RUN

- UC's 125 rushing yards at SMU was a season low and the Bearcats didn't score a rushing TD for the first time in 2018.
- UC ranks No. 4 in the AAC in rushing offense, getting an average of 238.2 ypg on the ground with 34 rushing scores.

CROWD CHANT

- Bearcats Insider, a new show on FOX Sports Ohio covering UC Athletics debuted in August.
- The 30-minute show airs weekly on FSO as hosts Dan Hoard and former Bearcats quarterback Tony Pike discuss the most recent game and upcoming matchup as well as feature interviews with coaches and players.
- New episodes will air Wednesdays; check local listing for times and replays. The show on Wednesday, October 17th, UC's football bye week, will feature a preview of Bearcats basketball.

PHILADELPHIA FREEDOM

- UC had an up and down game at Temple.
- The Bearcats were in an early 10-0 hole after a pair of fumbles on the game's opening two drives.
- UC fought back to knot things up at 10-10 and took a 17-10 lead in the third quarter, overcoming some strange officiating calls and three missed field goals.
- UC's defense was stifling, forcing Temple into seven 3-andouts and coming up with three interceptions.
- The Owls scored with 49 seconds left in regulation to knot things up at 17 and found the end zone in the extra period to take a 24-17 lead.
- UC's ensuing possession in OT started with an 11-yard run by Michael Warren II, but was followed with a fumbled snap on a miscue, an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty forcing a thirdand-36 and an interception to close things out.

CARRY THAT WEIGHT

 UC rushed for 200 yards at Temple and 252 yards at UCF, its only two losses of the season when rushing for 200 or more yards and only the third and fourth losses since 2007 when surpassing the 200-yard mark on the ground [41-4].

TAKE IT TO THE LIMIT

- UC forced three interceptions at Temple, the most since a five-interception day at Purdue in 2016.
- The Bearcats have 12 takeaways in 2018 (eight interceptions, four fumble recoveries) after having only 11 in 2017.
- UC has forced a turnover in all eight games this season.

DON'T STOP ME NOW

- LB Perry Young continued his strong play at Temple, finishing with nine tackles. He has 33 tackles in the last five games and is UC's leading tackler on the season with 46 stops.
- · Young will miss the remainder of the season due to injury.

(OVER) TIME TO MOVE ON

- The Bearcats knocked off SMU 26-20 in overtime, earning their first OT win since 2008 (at West Virginia), snapping a five-game slide in extra time and moving to 7-9 in OT games.
- UC played an overtime game for the second-straight week for the second time in program history and the first time since 1997, a span of 21 years. UC played back-to-back road games at Houston (L, 2 OT) and at Miami (OH) (W, 2 OT) on Oct. 18 and Oct. 25, 1997, respectively.

UP SHE RISES

- Entering the Temple game, UC had allowed 10 points to be scored in the fourth quarter but the Owls hit the Bearcats for 14.
- UC holds a 67-23 edge over its foes in the final 15 minutes.

WHATEVER IT TAKES

- UC had a season-high 9.0 TFLs at SMU and against Navy, have twice recorded 8.0 tackles for a loss this season and has tallied 5.0 or more on nine occasions.
- The Bearcats had a season-high 5.0 sacks at UCLA, at SMU and vs. Navy, along with 4.0 against Tulane and USF.

FOLSOM PRISON BLUES

- TE Josiah Deguara set a career mark with 112 yards receiving at UConn. He had a 22-yard reception in the first quarter, tying a then season-long catch.
- Deguara's 38-yard reception for a TD on the first drive of the third quarter was a season- and career-long catch.
- He has 31 catches for 396 yards and four TDs. He has a reception in all 10 games, entering 2018 with 15 career receptions for 145 yards and no scores.

VOICE YOUR CHOICE

- Entering the UCF game, UC was No. 24 College Football Playoff, No. 19 (Associated Press) and No. 20 (Amway/USA Today Coaches).
- It's the Bearcats first-ever CFP poll appearance, highest AP ranking since 2009 (No. 9) and highest coaches poll rank since Oct. 14, 2012 [18].
- Prior to its overtime loss at Temple, UC was No. 20 in the AP and No. 21 in the coaches.
- At the time, it was UC's first AP ranking since Oct. 14, 2012 [No. 21] and the first coaches poll since Dec. 1, 2013 [No. 23].
- UC has been ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 for 45 weeks, climbing to a high of No. 4 during the 2009 season.

WALK IT BACK

 CB Tyrell Gilbert snagged his first interception of the season and fifth of his career late in the fourth quarter at Temple.

SAY WHAT?

 Cincinnati won the opening coin toss against Navy, the eighth win in 11 games this season and, when including the coin toss ahead of overtime, has won 10 of 13 possible coin tosses [8-3 pregame, 2-0 in overtime].

MIAMI 2017 ... ERR 2018

- WR Thomas Geddis had three receptions for 25 yards in the first half at UConn, and finished with five catches for 45 yards, setting a season high for receptions in a game.
- He followed it up with a season-high tying five receptions at SMU, going for 38 yards.

IT'S YOUR DAY

- Jarell White hauled in his first career interception on a tipped ball in the fourth quarter at UConn.
- White moved into a starting role at WLB after Perry Young was lost for the season due to injury. White responded with a 10 tackles against USF and 11 at UCF.
- White has 50 tackles on the year, including 5.0 for a loss.

VIRGINIA IN THE RAIN

- DE Kimoni Fitz rung up a career-best 2.5 tackles for a loss at UConn to go with his five tackles on the day.
- The senior has 50 stops, 4.5 sacks, 9.0 TFLs and four QB hurries on the season.

CLOSING TIME

 UC led Temple 17-10 entering the fourth quarter and lost in overtime, marking only the sixth time since 2007 the Bearcats have lost a game where they have led after three quarters (83-6).

WHERE THE PLAYERS PLAY

- RB Charles McClelland gave UC a 17-10 lead with 6:09 left in the third quarter at Temple on a career-long 42-yard TD run.
- It was UC's second 2018 rushing score of 40 or more yards.
- McClelland finished with 70 yards on four carries.
- He has averaged 6.8 yards per carry in 2018, which ranks No.
 6 in the American Athletic Conference.

IT TAKES TWO

- CB Coby Bryant hauled in his first career interception with 6:17 in the first quarter and his second with 4:12 to qo.
- It marked the first multiple-interception game since Mike Tyson had three interceptions at Tulsa in 2016.
- Bryant finished with four tackles, three PBUs and the two interceptions.

RUNNIN' DOWN A DREAM

- RB Michael Warren II rushed for 100 or more yards in fourstraight games, tallying 124 against Ohio, 147 at UConn 123 vs. Tulane and 132 at Temple.
- Ten UC backs accomplished the feat since 1948, but Warren was the first since DeMarco McCleskey in 1998.

THE LONG RUN

- Michael Warren II rattled off an 81-yard touchdown at the start of the second quarter, against Tulane.
- It was the longest play of the year for the Bearcats, surpassing the 77-yard touchdown pass from QB Desmond Ridder to WR Rashad Medaris against Ohio.
- Historically, Warren's run, the longest for UC since 2015 when Hosey Williams ran for 84 yards against UConn, ranks among the longest in program history.
- The 81-yard rush for Warren is the third longest rush from scrimmage in UC history and the second-longest scoring run in program history behind Joe Miller, who ran 91 yards for a score against Xavier in 1953.

OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS

- OL Chris Ferguson scooped up a fumble against Tulane and ran for six yards the first yards and first fumble recovery of his career.
- A senior from Nassau, Bahamas, he had never played a down
 of football for the Bearcats prior to the 2018 opener at UCLA
 and has started every game this season at right tackle.
- Ferguson has played both OL and DL during his UC career. He
 was born in the Bahamas, moved to Orlando, Florida at the
 age of 18, was originally a basketball player and played only
 one year of HS football before coming to Cincinnati.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK ...

UC has put together six come-from-behind wins, most recently winning 35-23 against USF after trailing 16-14 at halftime. Previously, UC came back from deficits at UCLA [10], vs. Ohio (21), vs. Tulane (4) and at SMU (2).

SHOW ME WHAT YOU GOT

- Trailing 21-0 with 5:45 left in the first half against Ohio, UC scored 34 points to mount its largest comeback since trailing Pittsburgh 31-10 (also 21 points) with 1:26 left in the second quarter and winning 45-44.
- UC has posted eight fourth-quarter comeback wins since 2008, with one against Ohio in 2018, two in 2017 (Miami & UConn), one in 2016 (Miami), two in 2011 (USF and Louisville), one in 2009 (Pittsburgh) and one in 2008 (Hawai'i).
- UC's game-clinching 92-yard drive was its longest of the season in terms of yardage.

TAKIN' CARE OF BUSINESS

 DE Ethan Tucky blocked a Tulane punt in the third quarter, setting up a UC touchdown pass one play later (QB Desmond Ridder to WR Khalil Lewis). The punt block was the first for the Bearcats since October 25, 2008, when Connor Barwin blocked a UConn attempt.

YOU GIVETH. WE TAKETH

 CB Coby Bryant forced his first career fumble against Tulane with CB Cam Jefferies collecting the loose ball. The recovery for Jefferies is the first of his UC career and his second collegiate recovery after he collected one for Bowling Green against Michigan state last year, returning the ball 46 yards for a score.

ELECTRIC WORRY

- UC's 49 points at UConn was its most in an AAC game since scoring 49 against Tulsa on Nov. 14, 2015.
- It was also UC's most points in a conference road game since scoring 46 at Memphis on Sept 24, 2015.

THE END

- UC snapped a five-game losing skid in conference openers with its 49-7 win at UConn.
- Entering the game, UC had dropped five straight first league games and won a September conference game for the first time since 2012 [Sept. 6 vs. Pittsburgh]
- Prior to Sept. 29, the Bearcats last road win in a conference opener was in 2011 at USF.

I PLAY THE ROAD

 WR Malick Mbodj had his first career reception on a 51-yard toss from QB Hayden Moore in the fourth quarter.

FINISHING & STARTING STRONG

- UC bookended halftime at UConn with 14 points scored in a span of 71 seconds. First up was a 6-play, 79-yard drive in 38 seconds before halftime which saw Rashad Medaris haul in a Desmond Ridder pass while going out of bounds for a score.
- After halftime, UC received the kickoff and needed two plays and 75 yards before Ridder found TE Joisah Deguara in stride for a 38-yard pitch-and-catch which made the score 28-7 in favor of the Bearcats. Deguara's TD was set up by a 37-yard run by RB Michael Warren II.

GIVEN A CHANCE

- WR Rashad Medaris hauled in a 15-yard pass from QB Desmond Ridder with 23 seconds left in the first half at UConn for a TD, his second in as many games.
- He finished with three catches for 40 yards and has 24 catches for 429 yards and three scores along with a teamhigh 17.9 yards per catch average.
- Medaris's 77-yard touchdown reception against Ohio was the first touchdown of his career. It was a career-long pass by QB Desmond Ridder. Medaris finished with a career-best 104 yards on the day.

READY TO RUN

- RB Taylor Boose saw his first action of the season at running back against UConn and finished with 66 yards rushing on seven carries, including a career-long 49-yard carry.
- Boose is out indefinitely with an injury.

RUN-AROUND

- QB Hayden Moore had his first TD of the season at UConn, an 11-yard scamper in the fourth quarter set up by WR Malick Mbodj's third-down catch, Moore's ninth career rushing TD.
- He finished 3-of-3 passing for 69 yards and rushed seven times for 32 yards and the TD.

YOUTH OF THE NATION

 UC is one of the five youngest teams in college football, featuring 81 underclassmen [29 sophomores, 17 redshirt freshmen, 35 true freshmen] on its 112-person roster.

POLLING DATA

Entering week 11 at No. 11 UCF, UC earned its first-ever ranking in a College Football Playoff poll (No. 24), its highest ranking in the Associated Press poll since 2009 (No. 19) and highest rank in the Amway/USA Today Coaches Poll since Oct. 2012 (No. 20).

to the founding of the Medical College of Ohio and Cincinnati College in 1819.

SABOTAGE

- UC was whistled for 14 flags and 150 penalty yards against Ohio. The 14 penalties is the most for UC since a game at Hawaiii n 2002 where the Bearcats also had 14.
- It is tied for the third-most penalties in UC history [18 vs. Kansas State in 1961, 15 vs. Xavier in 1958]. The 150 penalty yards is fourth-highest in the record book and the most since being flagged for 176 yards against Louisville in 1968.

BLUE SKIES

 The 77-yard TD from QB Desmond Ridder to WR Rashad Medaris against Ohio was UCs longest passing play and passing TD from scrimmage since QB Hayden Moore hit WR Devin Gray on an 82-yard score on Nov. 25, 2016 at Tulsa.

WE ARE THE WORLD

- The 2018 roster is composed of student-athletes from 16 states and five countries.
- Sixty-four Bearcats hail from Ohio, with 24 from Cincinnati, followed in order by Florida (10), Georgia (9), Indiana (6), Illinois (4), Kentucky (4), Virginia (4), Alabama (3), Michigan (2) with single players from California, Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Texas and Washington.

OHIO PLAYERS

- RB Tavion Thomas scored his third career TD on a 1-yard plunge in the third quarter at UConn.
- He carried 10 times for 56 yards and the score.
- Thomas has averaged 6.4 yards a carry with five TDs.

ONE STEP UP

 LB Jarell White started in place of an injured Perry Young against Ohio and responded by tying for the team lead with nine tackles and a huge TFL. White's TFL came the play before Wiggins' interception, a three-yard loss on 2nd & goal for his stuff of OU RB AJ Ouellette.

THE CORNER

 WR Jayshon Jackson scored his first career touchdown with 12:37 left in the fourth quarter against Ohio. Jackson caught a 26-yard teardrop from QB Desmond Ridder, brought the ball in, tucked and rolled for the score.

SMALLER STORY, BUT SURE YOU'RE FOLLOWING

- LB Ty Sponseller is one of UC's leaders with six special teams tackles, totaling four stops on kickoff and two on punts.
- The sophomore from Mason is a movie buff who reviews films on Twitter @Ty_TrueReview.

LIGHT EM UP

 UC's 741 yards of total offense against Alabama A&M was the fourth game in school history with more than 700 total yard and the second-best output in the UC annals, second only to the 752 yards recorded at Memphis in 2015.

READY TO GO

- The Bearcats, who scored 28 or more points only twice in 2017, scored 28 in the first quarter against Alabama A&M.
- With 42 points total in the opening half, it marked the most points UC has put up in the first two quarters of a game since scoring 49 on Akron on September 17, 2011.
- UC scored 63 points, which stands as the most scored in a game since September 14, 2013, when the Bearcats defeated visiting Northwestern State, 63-9.

PLAY IT AGAIN SAM

- Four Bearcats recorded their first career TDs against Alabama A&M, including QB Desmond Ridder, RB Tavion Thomas, RB Charles McClelland and TE Wilson Huber.
- Ridder, who had one passing touchdown to his credit entering the game and connected with Thomas Geddis in the first quarter for a 29 yard strike, rushed for a 22-yard scored in the first quarter to make it 14-0 for the hosts.
- Thomas scored a pair of touchdowns for UC, grabbing his first with an 11-yards scamper in the second quarter (42-0) before adding a 1-yard plunge in the third (49-0).
- McClelland got in on the act at the end of the third quarter as he rushed from 1 yard out (56-7) before Huber recovered a Thomas fumble in the end zone for the final score of the game.

YOUTH GONE WILD

- RBs Tavion Thomas [141] and Charles McClelland [121] both recorded over 100 yards of rushing against Alabama A6M, marking the first time the Bearcats have two 100-yard rushers in a game since 2015.
- Hosey Williams (140) and Mike Boone (117) both broke the century mark as UC beat UConn, 37-13, at home on 10/24.

WHO'LL STOP THE RAIN?

- UC's 21-0 win over Miami (OH) was played in dreadful weather conditions, with heavy rain throughout.
- The Bearcats ran 62 plays with 51 coming on the ground as the passing attack was largely ineffective.
- UC's 11 pass attempts were its fewest in a game since attempting 11, also against Miami [OH] on Sept. 30, 2006.

STAFF DAY

- UC saw four quarterbacks play in the home opener with Ridder playing the first quarter, Hayden Moore the second, Ben Bryant in the third and Jake Sopko in the fourth.
- The four signal callers combined to go 21-of-26 passing for 332 yards with 3 touchdowns and one interception.
- All four quarterbacks also saw their first drives with the offense culminate in touchdowns.

A HOME TO COME TO

- UC is the only team in The American that did not play a home game in the first two weeks of the season.
- UC last started a season with two-straight road games in 1991 with three-straight away from home against Penn State, North Carolina and Bowling Green.
- The Sept. 15 home opener was the latest since 1991.

THE FIRST CUT IS THE DEEPEST

- Never let the toughness of LS Zach Wood be guestioned.
- Wood underwent surgery for appendicitis prior to the Alabama A&M game, only missed a week and was medically cleared prior to the Ohio game and snapped with no problem.
- Wood was put on scholarship prior to the Tulane game.

PINBALL WIZARD

- S Darrick Forrest recorded his first interception and returned it 23 yards to the Miami 1 early in the fourth quarter, setting up RB Michael Warren II's second rushing touchdown of the game.
- On the defensive play, CB Coby Bryant got his hand on the ball to deflect it from the receiver with LB Bryan Wright getting his hand on it to keep the ball in the air where Forrest snagged it and nearly found the end zone, being tackled just short.

FOR WHOM THE BELL TOLLS

- UC knocked off longtime rival Miami in the 123rd meeting in the Battle for the Victory Bell 21-0.
- UC's win cuts into Miami's all-time series lead as the RedHawks now lead, 59-57-7.
- The Bearcats have now won 13 in a row in the series with the RedHawks with the last loss in the series coming in 2005, a 44-16 win for host Miami in Oxford
- The last time the Bearcats posted a shutout the series came in 2013 when they won, 14-0, in Oxford.
- The 2018 game marked the second time Paul Brown Stadium has hosted the series with UC winning the previous game in 2014, 31-24, with Nippert Stadium under construction.

DOWN ON THE CORNER

- Entering the Miami (OH) game, CB Tyrell Gilbert had four career pass breakups and nearly doubled that total in the first half as he had three on RedHawks wide receivers. Gilbert added a pair of solo tackles in the game as well.
- Gilbert has played several positions during his time at UC but has settled in nicely at corner, with three starts in 2018.

LOVE IT WHEN A PLAN COMES TOGETHER

- LB Bryan Wright was the AAC Co-Defensive POTW on Sept. 3.
- Wright, playing his first game at middle linebacker after switching from defensive end in the offseason, had four tackles, including two sacks and three tackles for loss, and had a pivotal forced fumble in the fourth quarter that resulted in the go-ahead safety in UC's 26-17 win at UCLA.
- He shared the weekly accolade with Houston DT Ed Oliver.

GOING TO CALIFORNIA

- With a 26-17 win at UCLA on Sept. 1, UC has been victorious in its past three West-Coast trips, winning 28-18 at Oregon State in 2009 and 52-23 at San Diego State in 2007.
- UC is 3-3 all time in games in the state of California, going 1-0 each against UCLA and San Diego State and 1-3 against Pacific in Stockton, California.

HANGINAROUND

- RB Michael Warren II earned a spot on the league's weekly honor roll following the win at UCLA. Warren tallied a careerhigh 142 yards on 35 carries with a career-best three TDs.
- It was UC's top rushing performance since Gerrid Doaks ran for 149 yards at Tulane in 2017. UC's last three TD rushing performance came from former Bearcats standout Mike Boone against Tulsa on Nov. 14, 2105.
- Entering 2018, UC had rushed for three or more TDs only once in the last 24 games, against Miami [OH] on Sept. 24, 2016.

NEW KID IN TOWN

- K Cole Smith saw his first action for UC at UCLA.
- The freshman from Middletown knocked in all three of his extra points and a 24-yard field goal at the Rose Bowl.
- UC attempted just 17 field goals a year ago, but none in the final two games of the campaign.

LONG TIME GONE

- The Bearcats have opened a season with back-to-back road games 12 times previously with the 2-0 start to the 2018 campaign marking just the second time UC has won both.
- The last time it happened came in 1898 when UC posted a 12-0 win at Ohio before blanking host Miami, 22-0. The last time UC opened a season with back-to-back road games was in 1991 when it lost at #5 Penn State and at North Carolina.

PLAYING FROM BEHIND

- UC turned in an impressive showing in Week 1 as the Bearcats erased an early 10-0 deficit on its way to a 26-17 win at UCLA in Pasadena.
- The Bearcats scored 17 second-quarter points to take the lead into halftime and didn't trail the rest of the way, snapping UCLA's 10-game, non-conference winning streak at the Rose Bowl.
- Tied at 17, UC recorded a safety in the fourth quarter with Bryan Wright forcing a UCLA fumble with the Bruins deep in their own territory.
- QB Desmond Ridder engineered a 9-play, 36-yard drive which featured a pair of 4th-down conversions and ended with a 1-yard TD run by RB Michael Warren II which made the final 26-17.

ROOMBOX

- K Ryan Jones has settled in as UC's kickoff specialist, averaging 64.6 yards per boot with four touchbacks on five attempts in the opener at UCLA.
- A year ago, the junior provided some desperately needed stability to the kicking game, kicking extra points and making six field goals over the second half of 2017.
- The former walk-on was placed on scholarship during the week leading up to the UCLA trip.

THE LAND DOWN UNDER

 P James Smith has been a rock of consistency since joining UC a year ago. The first-team, all-league selection a year ago had eight punts at UCLA, averaging 43.4 ypk with a long boot of 52 yards and five kicks dropped inside the 20-yard line.

NIGHT SWIMMING

 If you're a fan of seeing the Bearcats play under the lights, you're in luck. Since 2007, UC has kicked off at 6 p.m. ET or later in 79 games or 55-percent of the time. Noon kickoffs rank second with 47 while 3:30 p.m. kicks have occurred 25 times.

T.E.A.M.

 Simply put, HC Luke Fickell's mantra Together Everyone Achieves More is one of the guiding forces for the UC program.
 The phrase adorns the team's workouts shirts, Coach Fickell's gameday attire and a band worn by members of the team.

SMASHMOUTH

 DT Cortez Broughton registered 2.5 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss in the season opener at UCLA. With that effort, he eclipsed his 2017 total for both sacks [1.0] and TFLs [3.5].

AN UNLIKELY GROUPING

- The original starting five for the Bearcats OL is made up of a sixth-year former walk-on [Garrett Campbell], two grad transfers (Dino Boyd & Kyle Trout), a former hockey player [Morgan James] and senior who had never played a game of college football before the opener at UCLA [Chris Ferguson].
- They average 6-5 and 310 lbs.

SUPERFREAK

- S James Wiggins earned a spot on Bruce Feldman's Biggest Freaks in College Football list, checking in at No. 33.
- Feldman wrote of the Bearcats sophomore: "One of the higher-ranked recruits Cincinnati has signed in recent years, the 5-11, 205-pound one-time Miami commit from South Florida is super strong for his size. He benches 405, squats 675 and has tremendous burst, broad jumping 11-0, vertical leaping 37 inches and timing 4.40 in the 40."
- Wiggins hauled in his first career interception with 9:57 left in the second quarter at UCLA.
- He totaled a career-best 10 tackles at Temple on Oct. 20.

STUCK IN THE MIDDLE WITH YOU

- Bryan Wright made the move to middle linebacker in the offseason after previously playing at DE.
- He started UC's first six games in 2017, recording 15 tackles and 2.5 TFLs, before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury.
- Wright was a prep QB at Howard HS in Wilmington, Delaware where he also played on a state championship basketball team.

FORMER BEARCATS ON STAFF

 Guidugli and Mickens are not the only former Bearcats on the coaching staff. Steve Stripling (DL), Joker Phillips (WR) and Ron Crook (OL) had previous stints on the coaching staff while Austin Bujnoch (offensive GA) and Pat Lambert (defensive GA) played for the Red & Black.

THUNDERSTRUCK

- P James Smith earned a spot on the Ray Guy Award Watch List after his standout freshmen campaign.
- Smith, a First-Team All-AAC selection as a true freshman, kicked 64 times for a 42.0 per kick average with a long boot of 65 yards in 2017.
- He had 33 punts fair caught, dropped 21 inside the 20-yard line and booted nine kicks for 50 or more yards.
- Smith hails from Wangaratta, Australia, which is a mere 9,683 miles from Cincinnati. He grew up playing Australian Rules FB, is a product of Prokick Australia.

THE STAFF HAS SEEN THIS BEFORE

- HC Luke Fickell, a 19-year veteran of the coaching ranks, has a veteran, experienced staff with 239 years of on-field experience at all levels of football.
- DL coach Steve Stripling (40), S coach Jon Tenuta (37), OC/TE coach Mike Denbrock (32) and WR coach Joker Phillips (30) have 30+ years of experience while OL coach Ron Crook (29) and STC/TE coach Doug Phillips (22) have 20+ years in.
- DC/LB Marcus Freeman (9), QB coach Gino Guidugli (8) and CB coach Mike Mickens (7) joined the coaching ranks after professional playing careers.
- ST coach Brian Mason, who moved to the coaching staff in January 2018, spent six years as a coach before serving as UC's director of recruiting a year ago.

CHA- CHA- CHANGES

 The coaching staff underwent several changes during the offseason with some familiar faces returning to UC.

- Special Teams Coordinator Brian Mason served as the Bearcats Director of Recruiting in 2017, cornerbacks coach Mike Mickens was an All-America selection at cornerback who helped lead UC to the 2008 BIG EAST title and Orange Bowl and defensive line coach Steve Stripling was previously on staff from 2010-13 and was UC's interim HC in the 2013 Belk Bowl win over North Carolina
- On the offensive side of the ball, coordinator Mike Denbrock shifted over to tight ends, Gino Guidugli moved over to quarterbacks and Doug Phillips shifted to running backs.

SEEING DOUBLE

 Freshmen wide receivers Jack and Jake Peterson are identical twin brothers from Granville, Ohio.

CLEVELAND ROCKS

- DT Marquise Copeland earned spots on the watch lists for the Outland and Nagurski Trophies entering 2018.
- The Cleveland, native earned Honorable Mention All-AAC
 accolades a year ago. He was a 12-game starter at defensive
 tackle, setting career highs with 63 tackles, 8.0 tackles for a
 loss and a team-high 3.5 sacks. He set a career high with 10
 tackles and a QB hurry against UConn in the season finale.
- He was an Athlon preseason First-Team All-AAC selection.

GEORGIA ON MY MIND

- Cortez Broughton, a Second-Team All-AAC honoree in 2016, returns for his senior campaign at UC.
- Broughton ranked among UC's Top-10 tacklers with 23 total stops. He also added 3.5 tackles for a loss, five QB hurries, a fumble recovery and a sack.
- He played in the 2009 Little League World Series for the Warner Robins (Georgia) All-Stars.

BIG LEAGUE

OL Morgan James does not have the traditional background
of a college football player. He did not play in high school and
spent time after graduation playing hockey in the Southern
Professional Hockey League. The big man was an enforcer on
ice. His first exposure playing football came when he joined
the Bearcats during training camp in the fall of 2015.

MEN WITHOUT HATS

- TE Bruno Labelle, a native of Quebec, Canada, had a dream of playing NCAA FBS football since he was young.
- Discovered by the Bearcats during a summer prospect camp on campus, Labelle earned a scholarship offer and enrolled at UC in January 2016, going through spring ball.

EVERY ROSE HAS A...

- UC's season-opening trip to the Rose Bowl marks another iconic stadium the Bearcats have competed in.
- In recent years, UC has played games in the top five venues by capacity in college football, including Michigan Stadium [107,601 - 2017], Penn State's Beaver Stadium [106,572 -2005], Ohio State's Ohio Stadium [104,944, 2014], Texas A&M's Kyle Field [102,733, 1971] and Tennessee's Neyland Stadium [102,455 - 2011].

EIGHT DAYS A WEEK

 UC added three graduate transfers to its roster, LB Tinashe Bere (Duke), OL Dino Boyd (Rhode Island) and CB Cameron Jefferies (Bowling Green). Bere will miss the season after suffering a leg injury early in training camp.

RUNNING ON EMPTY

 UC 9-2 over its last 21 games when possessing the ball for 30 or more minutes in a game.

CINCINNATI SMART

- The football team recorded a 3.011 GPA in the spring of 2018 marking the first time the team GPA had been above a 3.0.
- UC took home the American's Team Academic Excellence Award for the third-straight year, marking the first time one school had won the award in three consecutive seasons.
- UC was one of seven winners of the American Football Coaches Association's 2017 Academic Achievement Award for recording a 100-percent graduation rate for members of its freshman football student-athlete class of 2010.
- UC had 48 football student-athletes and a league-high 286 Bearcats on the 2017 American All-Academic Team.
- Garrett Campbell, Morgan James, Hayden Moore and James Smith were all TopCats scholars, earning 4.0 GPAs in the spring academic session.

THE RISING

- QB Hayden Moore became the fifth UC signal caller all-time to surpass 6,000 career passing yards.
- Moore [6,191] sits fifth on the all-time chart, trailing current UC QB coach Gino Guidugli [11,453], Gunner Kiel [6,835], Danny McCoin [6,801] and Deontey Kenner [6,278].
- Moore's 75-yard TD pass to Kahlil Lewis at ECU was the longest of his career and UC's longest play from scrimmage in 2017.
- Moore holds both the UC and AAC single-game passing mark with his 557-yard performance at Memphis in 2015. Moore came off the bench in the second quarter in relief of injured UC starter Gunner Kiel.

DOUBLE DUTY

- UC radio voice Dan Hoard also serves as the play-by-play man for the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals, joining Bill Hillgrove [Pittsburgh Panthers & Steelers] and Gene Deckerhoff [Florida State/Tampa Bay Buccaneers] as the only broadcasters in the country to handle radio play-by-play duties for both an NCAA FBS and NFL team.
- ESPN CFB commentators Dave Pasch (Arizona Cardinals) and Bob Wischusen (NY Jets) are NFL play-by-play radio voices.

A LEGEND RETURNS HOME

- RB coach Gino Guidugli, a member of UC's James P. Kelly Sr. Athletics Hall of Fame returned to his alma mater in 2017 after spending six seasons at Central Michigan.
- Guidugli was named CMU's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach following the 2016 campaign after previously serving as the RB coach/recruiting coordinator.
- He spent 2017 at UC's running backs coach and shifted to quarterbacks prior to the spring of 2018.
- Guidugli still holds seven UC school records and is the only signal-caller in school history to throw for 3,500 or more yards in a season and had 14 career 300-yard passing games.

LOCKDOWN DEFENDER BACK IN CLIFTON

- Former UC All-American Mike Mickens returned to UC in January 2018 as cornerbacks coach.
- Mickens, UC's career interceptions leader with 14, joined the coaching staff after four years coaching corners at Bowling Green. He also spent time at Idaho and Indiana State.
- The 2011 UC graduate was a FWAA All-America selection in 2007 and a 2008 Playboy All-American.

MEDARIS BACK IN THE FOLD

- WR Rashad Medaris returns after missing most of 2017 due to injury. He had six catches in five games before missing the rest of the campaign.
- Medaris is the brother of former UC standout WR Anthony McClung and was a Class 6A All-State Selection out of Pike HS in 2014. Medaris had 88 receptions for 1,218 yards and 12 TDs during his two year HS career.

HIGH-TECH EQUIPMENT

 Cincinnati is one of a handful of teams to wear the Russell Athletic CarbonTek shoulder pad system. The pads are a collaboration between Russell Athletic and Boeing that uses excess carbon fiber from 787s.

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

- UC announced a long-term partnership with Under Armour, naming the global performance brand as the its official outfitter starting July 1, 2015.
- As part of the multi-year agreement, Under Armour will exclusively design and supply the footwear, apparel and equipment for training and gameday uniforms for each of UC's 19 men's and women's varsity athletic teams beginning in the 2015-16 season.

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- For the past 20 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Among many amenities, Higher Ground features a pair of 100-yard artificial turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

TWIST & SHOUT

- Sixth-year OL Garrett Campbell was tabbed for the watch lists for the both the Wuerffel Trophy and Allstate/AFCA Good Works Team®.
- Campbell is a regular representative in the community, organizing groups of UC football players to make monthly visits to Cincinnati Children's Hospital, volunteering at other local hospitals, participating in after-school programs, big brother programs and reading to local school children.
- He started his UC career as a walk-on in 2013, working his way towards earning a scholarship prior to the 2017 season. He started 12 games a year ago for the Bearcats, a key part of an offensive line unit which surrendered nine less sacks than it did in 2016, ranking among the top half of the American.

THE CINCINNATI STRIPE

- A prominent feature on UC's uniforms is a stripe with elements unique to the University and its campus.
- The height of the stripe is equal to that of the Cincinnati script
 on the home and road uniforms. The angles represented
 were inspired by the angles on numerous campus buildings
 and structures, including the new Nippert Stadium press
 box and the long red stairway inside the Richard E. Lindner
 Center. The triangles are representative of the windows of
 the Lindner Center, which are visible from Nippert Stadium
 on gameday and all throughout campus.



Carson Field at Nippert Stadium has been the venerable home of the University of Cincinnati football team since 1901 and provides the Bearcats with one of the best home-field environments in college football.

Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football.

The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon, privately funded renovation and expansion project. The reopening of Nippert Stadium coincided with the 100th anniversary of the 1915 original construction of the facility.

UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field [1895].

Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).

The stadium served as home for the Cincinnati Bengals, in 1968 and 1969, while their original permanent home at Riverfront Stadium was being constructed. It is currently the home field for FC Cincinnati, a professional soccer team in the USL who earned an expansion slot in MLS for 2019.

Nippert has served as a venue for concerts by Aerosmith, Blue Oyster Cult, Britney Spears, Michael Jackson, NSYNC, Janet Jackson, KT Tunstall, The North Mississippi All-Stars, The Roots, the Cincinnati Opera Company, Styx and many more.

Two US Presidents have spoken at the stadium. On Oct 16, 1936, President Franklin Roosevelt, running for a second term, appeared at Nippert Stadium and spoke from an open car in the rain to a crowd estimated at 15,000 and on Nov. 2, 2008, President Barack Obama held a campaign rally at Nippert two days before the 2008 Presidential Election to an estimated 27,000 attendees.

USA Today named Nippert as the best home-field venue in the former BIG EAST Conference and ESPN's Scott Van Pelt cited Nippert as a "one of the gems of college football'.

RECENT ENHANCEMENTS

The playing surface was widened and a new perimeter wall was constructed following the 2016 season, creating a safe area around the end zone corners and giving Nippert the ability to play host to international friendly matches on a FIFA regulation field.

A two-phase fan experience project was completed from 2017-18 with the installation of a new LED video display, which was four times larger than the previous videoboard, electronic ribbon boards, an upgraded audio system along with a distributed antenna system to improve cell phone coverage.

THE 2015 RENOVATION

During the most-recent renovation, the Bearcats played their 2014 home schedule at Paul Brown Stadium downtown before returning to a packed house against Alabama A&M on Sept. 5, 2015

Both east and west concourses were completely renovated and widened and fans will find 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations and new restrooms throughout the stadium, including ADA accessible seating and facilities.

East-side patrons with seats in Herschede-Shank Pavilion will notice the skywalks connecting O'Varsity Way to the upper deck, allowing them to bypass the main concourse and have a quick and easy route to and from their seats.

All the seating benches are covered by red and silver Perma-Cap vinyl bleacher covers by Hussey Seating. The covering gives the bleachers a different look and includes a CPAW painted in the south end zone student section.

The most striking changes, however, sits five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long, the five-story West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.

The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels; a press and operations level, suite level, scholarship club level, and patio suites mezzanine level.

UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area

customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

In addition, three new lighting poles were installed along with new lights on existing poles and on the roof facing of the press box. The stadium lighting averages 165 footcandles, a vast improvement over the previous number.

PREVIOUS IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The 2015 project was the latest in a series of enhancements that began in 1916 when construction began on a permanent brick-and-concrete stadium structure, which was completed, section-by-section, as funds were raised.

Over the years, the playing surface has been lowered several times, the Reed Shank Pavilion, now Herschede-Shank Pavilion, on the east side of the stadium was added in 1954 and a permanent grandstand and gameday locker rooms were added in the north endzone in 2005.

Capacity was raised to 28,000 in 1954,35,000 in 1991 and 40,000 following the 2015 renovation.

Artificial turf was first installed in 1970 and in 2000, the stadium became one of the first in the U.S. to utilize FieldTurf, a grass-like synthetic surface.

Prior to the 2013 season, UBU Sports' Speed Series S5-M synthetic turf system was installed as the playing surface at Nippert. The stadium's field orientation was shifted slightly north and west to even out the sideline areas and add a run-off area around the south end zone.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (Ohio) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning. His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924.

The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

HEAD COACH LUKE FICKELL

SECOND YEAR • OHIO STATE '97

Veteran defensive coordinator and Ohio native Luke Fickell was named the University of Cincinnati's 42nd football head coach in December 2016.

The 18-year veteran of the FBS coaching ranks took the reins of the UC program after spending 15 years at his alma mater, Ohio State.

Fickell was hired on Dec. 10, 2016 and in the span of less than eight weeks, he hired a staff and put one of the top recruiting classes in the American Athletic Conference together. Since he hire, Fickell has been a tireless advocate for the Cincinnati program, speaking at numerous events and schools to continue to build the Bearcats brand inside the State of Cincinnati, the 50-mile radius surrounding the Clifton Hts. campus.

His impressive resume includes being on the staff of two national championship winning teams, seeing 12 of his players selected in the NFL Draft, and coordinating outstanding defenses over the last 12 seasons as a co-coordinator or defensive coordinator.

He is also an excellent recruiter with strong Midwest and Florida relationships, a national presence when needed and a discerning eye for talent. He was named the American Football Coaches Association assistant coach of the year in 2010 and he was named a "top recruiter" in 2012 by both Rivals and ESPN.

No stranger to championship-level football, Fickell was a part of nine Big Ten Conference titles (seven as a coach, two as a player) and two national championship squads at Ohio State. During his coaching tenure with the Buckeyes, OSU qualified for the College Football Playoff twice and played in 15 postseason games.

The former standout football player, college graduate, NFL player, husband and father is most-noticed as a developer of talent.

His NFL Draft selections include first-round picks A.J. Hawk, Bobby Carpenter, Ryan Shazier and Darron Lee, NFL standout James Laurinaitis and Joshua Perry, Anthony Schlegel, Larry Grant, Marcus Freeman, Austin Spitler, Ross Homan and Brian Rolle.

The 2016 Buckeyes earned a spot in the College Football Playoff semifinal against Clemson after finishing the regular season 11-1 and ranked No. 3 in CFP poll. OSU won five consecutive games to close the season and boast the nation's No. 4 total defense (282.3 yards per game allowed), including the No. 1 pass efficiency defense and the No. 3 scoring defense [14.2].

Since 2005, Fickel-coached defenses at Ohio State have ranked among the NCAA FBS Top-40 in yards-per-play allowed, averaging a ranking of No. 17 and earning its highest rank of No. 3 in 2016. Cincinnati based ProFootballFocus ranks OSU's defense as its No. 3 overall unit in 2016.



Fickell's coaching career began at Ohio State. After spending a year on the injured reserve list with the New Orleans Saints, he was hired in 1999 as a graduate assistant at OSU by his college coach, John Cooper.

Fickell's first full-time coaching position came in 2000 under Lee Owens at Akron, spending two years as defensive line coach. Jim Tressel brought him to Ohio State as special teams coordinator in 2002 and he also worked with the defensive front on the BCA National Championship squad. He was named linebackers coach in 2004, and added co-defensive coordinator duties to his resume in 2005.

In May of 2011 he was asked to take over an Ohio State program staggered by the loss of its head coach, the unexpected departure of a star quarterback and on the cusp of NCAA penalties, and against stacked odds, he led the Buckeyes to a bowl game. Prior to his appointment to serve as head coach, he had been promoted to assistant head coach in March 2011.

He returned to his role as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2012. Over the past five seasons, coaching under UC alumnus Urban Meyer, Fickell's defensive units have been a big reason the Buckeyes went 61-5 and won the 2014 College Football Playoff National Championship.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Fickell is a graduate of DeSales High School, where he was a three-time, undefeated state wrestling champion, and he is a 1997 graduate of Ohio State. He played for the Buckeyes from 1992-96, redshirting the first year and then starting the next four seasons at nose guard. He started a school-record 50 consecutive games between 1993 and 1996.

Fickell graduated from Ohio State in 1997 with a degree in exercise science. Luke and his wife Amy have six children: Landon, Luca, twin sons Aydon and Ashton, and twin sons Laykon and Lucian.


