FOCUS OF THE MONTH

SOCIAL MEDIA REMINDERS

- Coaches cannot like, retweet, or post on social media voluntary workouts
 of current student athletes during the summer
 - Even if the student athlete posts the workout on their private social media, it is not permissible

CPR/AED CERTIFICATION

 17.1.6 Sports-Safety Certified Staff Member Presence During Countable, Physical Activities. An institutional staff member with current certification in first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automatic external defibrillator (AED) use must be present any time a student-athlete participates in a physical, countable athletically related activity. (Adopted: 4/24/14 effective 8/1/14)

Coaches, make sure your CPR and AED certifications are up to date before the new school year begins!

IS THIS PERMISSIBLE

Coach Wright's 15-year-old son wants to play baseball so he signs him up to play on the local club team. Coach Wright decides to help coach his son's team. This team has kids on it that live up to a 60-mile radius from the institution. They could play for a closer team, but Coach Wright is such a good coach, they don't mind the drive. Coach Wright is aware that he has club players that travel these far distances to play for him.

Answer: This would not be permissible.

In sports other than basketball and football coaches are allowed to coach local club teams in their respective sports, but there are restrictions. Players need to be within a 50 mile radius of the institution, unless the club program is the closest program for the player.

NIL Task Force expected to release warnings to boosters

- Additional guidelines are being created to clarify that boosters and booster-led collectives are prohibited from involvement in recruiting
- The additional guidelines will minimize "Pay-for-Play" deals (disguised as NIL deals) created by
 donors to entice prospects, recruit players from other programs, and keep current players happy
- These additional guidelines will require schools to monitor their booster's/donor's spending to ensure no NCAA rules have been violated or schools can face sanctions
- It is believed more than 100 donor collectives exist and that thousands of deals have been made
 within these collectives, with millions of dollars involved
