GAMEDAY INFORMATION

The University of Cincinnati baseball team opens postseason play at 1 p.m. Wednesday when it plays St. John's University in the opening round of the 2011 BIG EAST Championship at Bright House Field in Clearwater, Fla. The Bearcats qualified for the BIG EAST Championship for the fourth season in a row after defeating University of Connecticut 7-4 Saturday at Marge Schott Stadium. Cincinnati earned the No. 7 seed after finishing the regular season with a 14-13 conference record. St. John's finished 18-8 in league play to earn the No. 2 seed. All UC games in the tournament can be heard live at GoBEARCATS.com. Live streaming video will also be available for every tournament game (except for the championship game) at BIGEAST.org.

BEARCATS IN THE BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

- Cincinnati owns a 3-7 all-time record in the BIG EAST Championship.
- The Bearcats' three wins came in 2008 when UC advanced to the championship game.
- UC has made the BIG EAST Championship for the fourth consecutive season.

TRIO OF BEARCATS EARN ALL-BIG EAST HONORS

- Three UC players were named to the All-BIG EAST teams Tuesday, May 24, during pre-tournament ceremonies at the BIG EAST Championship.
- Senior outfielder Justin Riddell was named an All-BIG EAST First Team selection. During conference play, he ended the season ranked second in the league in RBI (29), No. 7 in batting average (.361) and 10th in slugging percentage (.546).
- Freshman designated hitter Justin Glass earned Second Team All-BIG EAST honors after hitting .332 with 4 HR and 45 RBI on the season.
- Junior outfielder Braden Kline

CLEARY SURPASSES SAMPLE ON ALL-TIME WINS LIST

- UC's 7-3 win over Seton Hall on Sunday, May 15, marked career win No. 392 for head coach Brian Cleary, moving him atop the all-time ledger for the Bearcats as the winningest coach in the program's storied 124-year history.
- Glenn Sample, who was the head coach from 1961-1981, previously held the all-time record with a 391-349 (.528) ledger.

BIDDING FAREWELL TO 7 SENIORS

- Cincinnati said goodbye to its seven seniors before Saturday's 1 p.m. regular-season finale against UConn.
- RHP Dan Glozer, RHP Dan Jensen, RHP Nick Johnson, SS Chris Peters, OF Justin Riddell, C Nick Rohlf and RHP Brian Sand were honored during pregame ceremonies before they played their final game at Marge Schott Stadium.

SCOUTING ST. JOHN'S

- St. John's clinched the No. 2 seed in the BIG EAST Championship after an 18-8 conference record.
- The Red Storm rank third in the BIG EAST in conference games in runs scored (150), fifth in batting (.273), third in on-base percentage (.368).
- Sophomore right-hander Kyle Hansen ranks sixth in the league in ERA (2.35) and third in strikeouts (93). His 15-strikeout performance against Notre Dame on April 21 is single-game season high in the conference.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK

- Sr. SS Chris Peters has played in 223 career games, which currently ranks fourth in the all-time UC career record book. Peters also ranks in the top 10 in at-bats (819 - 4th), runs (155 - 8th), hits (225 - 7th), doubles (46 - 9th), walks (117 - 4th), sacrifice hits (18 - 5th), and stolen bases (49 - 6th).
- Sr. OF Justin Riddell sits in the UC career top 10 in games played (198 - 8th), at-bats (692 - 9th), hits (216 - 9th), RBI (137 - 7th) and total bases (339 - 9th).
- Riddell's 67 RBI in 2011 ranks 6th on the all-time UC single-season record book.
- Sophomore CF Jake Proctor's 20 stolen bases this season is four shy of cracking the top 10.

GETTING OFFENSIVE

- The UC offense has been on a tear in the last 22 games, dating back to April 17 at Rutgers.
- The Bearcats are hitting .302 as a team with 19 home runs and own a .382 on-base percentage in that span.
- Cincinnati is 13-9 overall and 10-6 in the BIG EAST during last 22 games.

RIDDELL HEATING UP

- Sr. outfielder Justin Riddell is batting .427 with 7 HR and 37 RBI during the Bearcats' last 22 games.
- Riddell's getting on base at a .470 clip with a .753 slugging percentage during that span.
- The Lexington, Ky. native was named to the All-BIG EAST First Team on Tuesday.

BEARCATS AMONG BIG EAST LEADERS

- The Bearcat pitching staff is third in the BIG EAST in league games with 174 strikeouts. Sr. RHP Dan Jensen is third individually with 56 strikeouts.
- UC's .278 team batting average during league play ranks 4th in the league.
- Sr. OF Justin Riddell's .361 batting average during BIG EAST play ranks eighth in the league, as does his nine doubles. Jr. OF Braden Kline sits at No. 9 with a .356 average.
- So. CF Jake Proctor's 8 stolen bases is tied for fifth.
- Riddell's 29 RBI is second in the conference during BIG EAST play. Kline is tied for sixth in home runs with 5 during league games.
- Sr. shortstop Chris Peters' 114 assists during league play ranks first.

PILING UP BIG EAST AWARDS

- Monday, May 16, marked the third time this season Riddell was named to the BIG EAST honor roll, after previously receiving the honor April 25 and March 7. He is the only Bearcat to be named to the conference honor roll three times this season.
- So. RHP Zach Isler joined Riddell on the honor roll Monday after pitching his first-career complete game in UC's 3-1 win against Seton Hall on Saturday.
- Senior RHP Nick Johnson (Delphos, Ohio/St. John's), has earned the distinction twice on April 11 and March 14.
- Junior first baseman Nic Spence (Victoria, Australia/St. Joseph's) was the third UC player to earn honor roll status this season when he received the tribute along with Johnson on April 11.
- Senior right-handed pitcher Dan Jensen (Centerville, Ohio/Centerville) is the lone Bearcat to receive player of the week honors when he was named BIG EAST Pitcher of the Week on April 4.

KLINE GOING STREAKING

- Braden Kline 15-game hit streak ended after going 0-for-4 in Game 1 of a doubleheader against Seton Hall on Saturday. During the streak, Kline was batting .365 with 4 home runs, 18 RBI and 15 runs scored.
- Earlier this season, Kline had a 16-game hit streak that began with the 2010 season finale and lasted until April 2 at Georgetown. His 16-game streak currently ranks as the fourth longest in the BIG EAST this season.

UC DEFENDS JOE NUXHALL CLASSIC TITLE

- For the second year in a row, UC won the Joe Nuxhall Classic after defeating Xavier and Wright State in consecutive days April 12-13 at Marge Schott Stadium.
- Cincinnati beat XU 6-5 in the first round of the four-team tournament and then defeated WSU 7-4 in the championship game.
- Justin Glass earned Most Valuable Player honors after batting 3-for-6 (.500) with 4 RBI, including the go-ahead RBI in both games.

FIRST PITCH INVITATIONAL

- Cincinnati played in the 2nd Annual First Pitch Invitational, Feb. 25-27, and finished with a 1-2 record for the weekend. The three day round-robin featured Clemson, Michigan State, Furman and Charleston Southern.
- On the opening day of the First Pitch Invitational, Clemson University scored in each of the first seven innings to defeat the University of Cincinnati baseball team 15-4 Friday at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.
- On Saturday at Fluor Field, the Bearcats fell to Charleston Southern 9-5. In his first start of the season, junior Braden Kline (Warsaw, Ind./Warsaw Community) went 3-for-4 with 2 RBI.
- In the final game of the First Pitch Invitational, the University of Cincinnati baseball team recorded its second win of the season after defeating Furman University 9-8 Sunday at Fluor Field.

GLASS NAMED ALL-TOURNAMENT

- Freshman OF/DH Justin Glass was named to the BIG EAST/Big Ten Challenge All-Tournament Team.
- The Fort Wayne, Ind. native hit .545 with three RBI, three runs and two walks in three games.
- In his collegiate debut against Ohio State, Glass went 4-for-5 and scored two runs in UC's 11-5 win.

BIG EAST/BIG TEN BASEBALL CHALLENGE

- Cincinnati made its third trip to the Big EAST/Big Ten Baseball Challenge Feb. 18-20 in the Tampa, Fla. area.
- In game one of the Challenge vs. Ohio State, the Bearcats fell behind 5-0 through the first three innings before scoring 11 unanswered runs to win 11-5. Freshman Justin Glass went 4-for-5 and scored two runs to lead the UC offense, while LHP Cory Hough pitched four scoreless innings of relief to pick up the win.
- In the Bearcats second game against Illinois, UC lost 7-3 after recording just four hits. After taking an early 1-0 lead, Cincinnati surrendered seven straight runs and could not make up the difference.
- On the final day of the Challenge, Cincinnati fell to Michigan State 8-4. UC fell behind 4-0 early and came back to make the score 5-4, but allowed three runs late.

two years of action. After breaking UC's single-season home run record and tying the program's single-season RBI record with 21 home runs and 79 RBI in 2008, Spina drove in 69 runs and broke his own single-season home runs record with 23 in 2009. Additionally, Spina ranks in the Top 10 in UC's career record books in slugging percentage (.703, 1st), home runs (44, 3rd), on-base percentage (.443, 4th), and RBI (148, 6th).

Alongside his experience on the collegiate level, Cleary has also served two stints coaching on the international level. Cleary coached the British National Team in the Baseball World Cup (2009) and the European Championships (2007). During his time with the teams, Cleary served as an assistant coach and worked primarily with the pitchers, helping the squad capture a second place finish at the European Championships in 2007 and a second-round appearance at the Baseball World Cup in 2009.

The fortunes of the Bearcats were never better in 2008 as Cleary's charges set a school record for wins in a season (39) and conference wins in a season (19). UC battled for the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship all year, finishing second in the standings and advancing to the Championship game of the postseason tournament. At the conclusion of the year, another mark was matched as four of Cleary's players were selected in the MLB Draft (Josh Harrison, Dan Osterbrock, Tony Campana and Mike Spina). None of those players were drafted out of high school.

The progression began to show dividends during the 2006 season as Cleary guided the Bearcats to their sixth 30-win season ever and first post-season appearance since 2001. Following the season, Logan Parker became the 11th draft pick in the Cleary era when the Cincinnati Reds selected him in the 12th round of the MLB Draft.

The 2005 season brought an improvement of 10 victories from the year before, as the Bearcats finished the campaign with a 25-30 mark. The season concluded with Josh Kay and Mark Haske both being selected in the MLB Draft. Later in 2005, UC's recruiting class received honorable mention nationally from Collegiate Baseball magazine.

Cleary made an immediate impact upon joining the Bearcat family. After inheriting a team that won only five games in 1996, Cleary pushed his teams to increased win totals each

his first four years. After winning 12 games in his first year, he increased that total to 15 in 1998, 30 in 1999 and 35 in 2000.

The 1999 squad posted a breakthrough 30-29 season, shattering 17 individual and eight team records and finishing as the eighth most improved team in the nation (12-game improvement). The 30 wins marked just the third 30-win season in UC's 115 years of baseball and the first winning campaign since 1995.

In 2000, the Bearcats won a school record 35 games and advanced to the finals of the C-USA Tournament. The squad also set four individual and eight school records.

In 2001, UC garnered 34 wins, the second-most in school history, and went 16-11 in Conference USA to finish tied for third. That finish is the best ever by a Bearcat team in Conference USA. Kevin Youkilis was a third-team all-American and one of three Bearcats taken in the 2001 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. Tony Maynard was named a freshman All-American, and Chris Hamblen was a finalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the top catcher in the nation. That season, Baseball America named Cleary one of the Top-10 coaches on the rise in Division I.

Cleary came to UC after three seasons at Tulane, where he helped the Green Wave to a 116-70 mark and two NCAA Tournament appearances. Cleary's efforts as an associate head coach, assistant coach and recruiting coordinator helped Tulane to the 1996 C-USA championship and a top-25 national ranking. In addition to his duties as recruiting coordinator, Cleary coached the hitters, infielders and baserunners and served as the team's third-base coach.

A 1990 graduate of Fairfield University, Cleary, a native of Boca Raton, Fla., earned four letters and was a two-time Metro Atlantic Conference All-Academic team pick.

In 14 seasons at the University of Cincinnati, Brian Cleary has established himself as one of the top coaches in UC baseball history. After taking over a struggling program in 1997, Cleary has led the Bearcats to 364 wins in his career, ranking second on the school's all-time win list behind the legendary Glenn Sample.

The 42-year-old Cleary has established a strong core of athletes. Due to his energy and passion to deliver a winning product for the University, he has upgraded the talent level within the program thanks to an emphasis on aggressive recruiting. With the influx of talent, Cleary has set his sights on taking the program to the NCAA Tournament after a 30-plus year absence.

For the past six seasons, Cleary has rebuilt a team that's poised to contend for BIG EAST championships. With the completion of the state-of-the-art Marge Schott Stadium and the signing of six straight top recruiting classes, the foundation has been built to allow Cincinnati to compete for BIG EAST Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances for years to come.

Regarded as one of the top coaches in country to develop hitters, Cleary has coached 42 position players that have either been drafted or signed as a free agents. Of those 42 players, only seven were drafted out of high school.

One of those 42 players was Mike Spina, who cemented himself as one of the top hitters in Bearcats history in just
