



Dear Bearcats Family.

The 2023-24 athletic and academic year will be remembered as a historymaking year of transition as we entered the Big 12 Conference and laid the foundation for future success as members in the largest female-only NIL activation of the Power 4.

We joined our new league on July 1, 2023, one year ahead of schedule but ready to chase championships. With us, we brought five new head coaches, a new apparel deal with industry leaders Nike and Jordan Brand and several new construction projects.

The year featured countless highlights on the field and the court. We on schedule and on budget, too. The saw seven student-athletes collect eight All-America honors, and the men's and women's basketball teams improved their records en route to postseason berths. Our baseball team was picked to finish last in the Bia 12 but instead finished fifth. narrowly missing the NCAA Tournament under new head coach Jordan Bischel. Women's track and field freshman Juliette spaces. Larcuente-Huebner grabbed All-America honors indoors and outdoors and proved to be the nation's top underclasswoman in the multi-events. Ty Gingerich became UC's first-ever Big 12 Champion this spring when he collected medalist honors at the conference tournament at Whispering Pines in Trinity, Texas.

Our campus received remarkable exposure and hosted unprecedented sold-out events this year. Nippert Stadium welcomed FOX's Big Noon Kickoff before Bearcats fans stretched our home sellout streak to 18 games, while Fifth Third Arena hosted Jason and Travis Kelce's New Heights Live! in April.

We've solidified our holistic NIL program, Impact, as an industry leader. In addition to partnerships with New Heights and Kroger—which participated in the country--Cincy Reigns partnered with Rhinegeist Brewery to launch Cincy Light, the No. 1 light lager in the country. A percentage of every sale goes back to our student-athletes. Thanks to these creative and successful efforts. **UC** collected the Best Institutional Program Award at the NIL Summit in Atlanta this past June.

\$134 million Indoor Practice Facility and Performance Center project will feature a 120-vard football field, brand-new weight room, fueling station and sports medicine offices. The facilities will be the home of the football program and will also allow our student-athletes all-weather, yearround access to workout and recovery

We continue to expand our studentathlete services, as well, Since 2022. we have pushed to give all 450 of our student-athletes comprehensive personal brand and life skill education through The Academy, created a performance nutrition department—which has grown to feature five full-time employees—and launched our sports psychology and mental wellness team.

Our future is bright. In this new era, // we have proven that we will compete for championships and push boundaries. We will be creative in how we face our industry's challenges head-on. With our

city and fans' support, we're determined to uphold the standards our predecessors established at UC. Thanks to the Big 12, we have a seat at the table to help shape the future of college athletics.

This fall, we will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the dedication of James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium. Team captain Jimmy Nippert died on Christmas Day 1923 from blood poisoning, a few weeks after an unintentional spike during a football game against rival Miami. His grandfather, James N. Gamble, donated the money to finish the stadium in his The crown jewel of our campus is grandson's honor, and on Nov. 8, 1924, our home was christened.

> It's a remarkable story, and I'm proud we've been able to carry on the Jimmy Nippert legacy in the place he played a century ago. Across 100 years, the players, the coaches, and the fans have changed. but the reason for college athletics-impacting the lives of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world-remains the same. We must continue to do right by those who have chosen to be Bearcats by striding bold and innovatively into the future.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Spring of 2024 marked the **32nd consecutive** grading period for athletics at **3.0 or above** and **13th-straight past the 3.3 threshold.**

Ten Cincinnati Athletics teams achieved **perfect Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores** in the latest NCAA report. APR provides a real-time measurement of a team's academic success by tracking eligibility and progress toward graduation of each student-athlete on scholarship

It marks **six-straight years** of double-digit UC programs surpassing that mark. Five other teams accomplished the feat on the multi-year metric, and in that same multi-year category, **Cincinnati led all Big 12 teams** with seven teams leading in their respective sports (Texas second with five).

In addition to those aforementioned teams, women's basketball (996) and football (994) led all Big 12 schools on a multi-year basis, while men's basketball (995), men's swimming and diving (989) and men's track and field (987) were second.

The athletics department through SASS and the Academy has created programming to support student-athletes and their journey as Bearcats to Go Pro. For the 87 spring 2024 graduates, 36 will continue their eligibility in 2024-25, 30 have secured/applying to jobs, 18 have confirmed graduate school/finalizing enrollment, and three are pursuing professional sports.

In the last 10 years, UC athletes who have exhausted their eligibility in their sport, 99% have left with at least an undergraduate degree.

Since 2000, UC athletes who have exhausted their eligibility in their sport, 95% have left with at least an undergraduate degree.

STUDENT-ATHLETE SUCCESS

Cincinnati Athletics garnered **eight All-America honors** in the 2023-24 athletic season. Track and field, swimming and diving, football and lacrosse all had at least one athlete make the list.

Ty Gingerich became Cincinnati's **first Big 12 individual or team champion** with his 9-under 279 at the 2024 Big 12 Men's Golf Championship, held at Whispering Pines in Trinity, Texas. Gingerich, who earned UC's first individual conference title since Dan Gage in the 1993 Great Midwest, marked Cincinnati's **third-straight year of NCAA Regional representation**.

The 2023-24 academic year also saw **six** student-athletes compete at the NCAA Championships: **Tyler Wirth** (cross country), **Joleigh Crye** (swimming & diving), **Hunter Gubeno** (swimming & diving), **Juliette Laracuente-Huebner** (indoor and outdoor track & field), **Abby Knouff** (outdoor track & field) and **Dominique Hall** (outdoor track & field).



Cincinnati Athletics garnered 63 All-Big 12 Honors in the 2023-24 athletic season.

PRO BEARCATS



JORDAN THOMPSON (2015-19)

Thompson has been tabbed for her second consecutive Olympic roster with her selection to be on the 2024 U.S. Olympic Women's Volleyball Team. She was part of the 2020 U.S. team that won gold in Tokyo, becoming the sixth Bearcat to earn a gold medal. She will play for Houston in the U.S.'s new professional league



TRAVIS KELCE (2009-12)

Cemented himself as one of the greatest tight ends in NFL history, catching nine passes for 93 yards, in the Chiefs' 25-22 overtime victory over the 49ers in Super Bowl LVIII. Kelce's three Super Bowl victories are the most ever by a Bearcat. Kelce is a five-time All-Pro honoree, including this fall. He played at UC from 2009 to 2012. He launched the Eighty-Seven & Running Foundation in 2022. The endowment helps fund Cincinnati's Sports Psychology and Counseling Department, directly impacting and aiding all 450 student-athletes.



JOWON BRIGGS (2020-2024)

The selection of Briggs extended the Bearcats draft streak to nine consecutive years since 2016. He is the 17th UC defensive lineman drafted all-time and the 12th since 2000.



VANESSA GILLES (2014-18)

Gilles has been tabbed for her second consecutive Olympic roster with her selection to be on the 2024 Canadian Women's Soccer eam. She was part of the 2020 Canadian team that won gold in kyo. She currently plays for Angel City FC in Los Angeles



SAUCE GARDNER (2019-21)

Gardner was drafted in 2023 and named NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year in 2023. He was First Team All-Pro and made the Pro Bowl in 2024. Gardner was a two-time First Team All-American while playing at Cincinnati from 2019 to 2021, famously never giving up a touchdown over more than 1,000 collegiate snaps. He led UC to a pair of American Athletic Conference Championships and to the 2021 College Football Playoff Semifinals at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic



JASON KELCE (2006-10)

A former walk-on linebacker for the Bearcats, Kelce played for Cincinnati from 2006 to 2010, earning All-BIG EAST honors as an offensive lineman twice. He played for head coaches Mark Dantonio, Brian Kelly and Butch Jones, helping lead UC to the 2008 Orange Bowl and 2009 Sugar Bowl. He was the Scout Team Defensive MVP in 2006 before moving to offensive line and starting three seasons from 2008 to 2010. Kelce announced his



IAN HAPP (2013-15)

Happ is a two-time Golden Glove winner and currently plays for the Chicago Cubs in the MLB. Baseball currently has seven alums playing in the minor leagues, and two paying in other leagues.



ELISSA ALCANTARA (2022-23)

Alcantara was named 2024 Rookie of the Year for the Women's Senior Volleyball League of the Puerto Rican Volleyball Federation. She also won the 2024 NORCECA Women's Final Four Championship with Puerto Rico.



JOSH KROSS (2023-24)

Cincinnati's Josh Kross was selected by the St. Louis Cardinals in the sixth round of the 2024 MLB Draft. Kross is the 51st player in program history to be selected in the MLB Draft and the first since Evan Shawver in 2021. The 171st overall pick in the draft, Kross is the third-highest UC draftee in the last 40 years behind Joey Wiemer and 2015 first-round selection lan Happ.



ASHLEY BARRON (2019-23)

Barron Signed with KIF Örebro DFF in the Swedish Damallsvenskan League. She became the first Bearcat and American Athletic Conference player to earn Defensive Player of the Year honors in three straight seasons, and earned four straight AAC All-Conference First Team honors.

INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY & PERFORMANCE CENTER

Spearheaded by Larry and Rhonda Sheakley's transformational giving and leadership, the new **state-of-the art facilities** will elevate the Cincinnati student-athlete experience, giving Bearcats an **unrivaled advantage** on the playing field and on the recruiting trail.

The **84,000 square-foot Indoor Practice Facility** features a **120-yard football field** equipped for multiple sports. The field will provide an all-weather home for Cincinnati football practices and year-round workouts and have direct access to the Performance Center's weight room, training room and performance nutrition fueling stations.

The **96,000 square-foot Performance Center** features three levels that will provide nearly everything a student-athlete needs to get competition and practice ready in one place.



BASKETBALL UPGRADES

A **transformative investment** from Dave and Wendy Herche to the Day One Ready Campaign prepared the Bearcats to compete for championships in the Big 12.

The remarkable contribution spearheaded the efforts to revamp the men's and women's basketball locker rooms, the makeover of the practice gym and several other hoops and major athletic department initiatives.

The practice gym is now called the "The Herche" in honor of Dave and Wendy. Additionally, the wording "Herche Courtside" prominently adorns the apron at center court of the Ed Jucker Court at Fifth Third Arena. The "Herche Courtside" is a premium seating area that surrounds the playing surface. Fans in this area have access to the Courtside Club located inside Fifth Third Arena.

Ed and Nina Paul have also been involved in the development of the women's basketball program. They established a scholarship program for the women's team, and most recently made a transformational investment in the locker room renovation project. Investments like the Herches' and the Pauls' provide student-athletes much more than a new space to gather or practice. It's a vote of confidence in their hard work, talent and dedication to thriving as a Bearcat on and off the court — investments that prepare them to succeed in life. Through philanthropy, these student-athletes are empowered to continue dreaming and achieving.











The Bearcats' new **state-of-the-art indoor golf facility** opened in Norwood in August 2023. It is among the best in the Big 12.

There are several features included in the finished product, which couples with UC's pre-existing short-game site near the Lindner Athletic Center weight rooms. The new arrangement features four TrackMan hitting bays, a team meeting room, lounge, nutrition station and a putt-view room. Overall, it has more than 5,000 square feet for putting and chipping.



















FACILITY UPGRADES

UC Baseball Stadium received many upgrades this past year. The videoboard was replaced in spring of 2023, and new turf was installed along with a new center field fence. The outfield wall and fence were padded and reinforced, and new graphics for retired numbers, NCAA Regionals appearances, and conference championships for season and tournament added.

The Armory underwent a \$3 million+ renovation that included the resurfacing of the indoor track and flooring and the creation of a hype tunnel, while maintaining the historic fieldhouse-look of where Bearcats legend Oscar Robertson played basketball more than 60 years ago.

New state-of-the-art and industry-leading soccer turf was installed into **Gettler Stadium**, giving the women's soccer team among the nation's best playing surfaces as well as a locker room makeover for the upcoming season.











Proud Cincinnati alumni and future Pro Football Hall of Famers Jason and Travis Kelce, in partnership with Cincy Reigns, held arguably one of the most memorable nights in campus history in front of more than 12,000 fans that raised thousands for UC student-athletes, as well as leaving quests with four hours of unforgettable entertainment.

From a series of challenges named the Lombaby Games that saw two student body teams facing off (campus athletes vs collegiate academics), a live show of the New Heights Podcast featuring special guests Desmond Ridder, Orlando Brown Jr. and Joe Burrow, and a surprise commencement ceremony, hosted by Dr. Neville Pinto, the night was unparalleled in UC history.

NIL IMPACT

The University of Cincinnati was named **best institutional Name Image and Likeness program** at the third-annual NIL Summit. UC beat out finalists Florida, Grand Canyon University, Nebraska, Ohio State, Ole Miss, St. Josephs and UCLA for the prestigious honor.

The Impact NIL department successfully provided NIL opportunities to 100% of student-athletes with 761 deals this year. Collaborating with Cincy Reigns, UC organized the country's largest female NIL event, raising \$15,000 for female athletes, with 100 female athletes receiving NIL deals. Additionally, in collaboration with *The Academy*, over 200 athletes attended workshops to enhance their branding, leadership and content creation skills.





CINCY REIGNS COLLECTIVE

Cincy Reigns, the official NIL partner of Cincinnati Athletics, launched in 2022 and has since helped the Bearcats fanbase, alumni network, businesses and donors offer financial support to UC's student-athletes, while partnering with local charities.

Cincy Reigns strives to create NIL opportunities for over 450 student-athletes and collaborate with organizations like Rhinegeist to advance its mission. In the fall of 2023, Cincy Reigns partnered with Rhinegeist to create **Cincy Light**, which has quickly become the **No. 1 fastest growing craft light lager in the country.** A significant percentage of each Cincy Light sold goes to support NIL.

THE ACADEMY

The UC Student-Athlete Development Academy provides **INNOVATIVE**, **INTENTIONAL** and **IMPACTFUL** programming to enhance student-athletes' success at UC and advance our mission to see all of our #BearcatsGoPro.

The Academy had an outstanding 2023-24 academic year, offering 31 workshops focused on **leadership**, **career exploration**, **personal development**, **and community impact**. They partnered with over 60 local and national employers, brands, and organizations to provide **valuable resources and opportunities to our student-athletes both during and after college**. Their commitment to community impact was evident through 50 unique events, contributing nearly **4,700 hours of service**.

The Academy's achievements were recognized with awards such as the INFLCR NIL Summit's Best Institutional Program, the Black Student-Athlete Summit's Student-Group of the Year for UC's BSAA, and a #1 Division I school ranking by GamePlan. Additionally, the Bearcats were nominated for the NACDA Community Service Award. UC student-athletes completed over 1,600 e-learning modules and achieved an 86% completion rate for Academy commitments, ensuring they are well-prepared for life beyond their sport.

Devon Cherry and **Brian Simms** were chosen to be a part of the **Big 12 Beyond Borders** two-year Program, developing them into the global leaders of tomorrow. This trip featured a **visit to Capitol Hill** allowing the student-athletes to **advocate for education reform in front of Ohio Senator, Sherrod Brown**.

UCATS - UC FOUNDATION

Since 1979, UCATS (an acronym representing **University of Cincinnati Athletic Teams Scholarships**) has been the principal fundraising arm for UC Athletics. Purpose-driven and relationship-centered, UCATS provides a way for **individuals, fans, alumni and corporate entities to help Bearcat student-athletes receive a quality education**, while ensuring UC's tradition of academic and athletic excellence.

More than **6,000 active UCATS members** provide philanthropic support for **450+ student-athletes across 16 sports**, with a vast majority receiving financial aid from the athletics department to attend the University of Cincinnati. On average, UC Athletics spends more \$73,348 per year to fund one in-state student-athlete scholarship. For out-of-state student-athletes, that cost increases to \$88,682.

Donations to UCATS include **philanthropic gifts** as well as contributions tied to season ticket purchases. Through the outstanding financial investment of each member, UCATS was able to **generate more than \$31M** in total contributions. All contributions, both large and small, make it possible for UC Athletics to support Bearcat student-athletes with vital resources such as **academic support**, **athletic training**, **sports medicine**, **and mental health services**. UCATS members have also been instrumental helping Cincy Reigns become one of the best (Name, Image and Likeness) collectives in the country, while **supporting the ongoing construction and renovation of the Indoor Practice Facility and the Armory Fieldhouse**, respectively.
