CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

- BYU is one of four remaining unbeaten teams in FBS, making the Big 12 one of two Power Four conferences with an undefeated team through Week 11.
- The Big 12 Conference will enter Week 12 with the second-highest Sagarin ranking in FBS behind only the SEC.
- Five Big 12 teams rank in the top 30 of ESPN's FPI Strength of Record, led by BYU in second place (Arizona State, BYU, Colorado, Iowa State and Kansas State).
- The Conference has seven teams that are bowl-eligible with three others that are one win away.
- The Big 12 leads all FBS leagues with 24 lead changes in the fourth quarter in Conference play.
- The Big 12 Conference will host FOX Big Noon Kickoff for a Conference-record fifth time this season when the pregame show heads to Boulder on Saturday.
- Entering Week 12, Arizona State and BYU are two of only four FBS teams this season with a perfect 4-0 record in games decided by seven or fewer points.
- Shedeur Sanders, the reigning Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week, continues to rank among the national leaders as one of three FBS quarterbacks in the top 10 nationally in completion percentage (72.9%), passing yards (2,882) and passing touchdowns (24).
- The Big 12 is home to three of the top four active career Power Four rushing yards leaders in Texas Tech's Tahj Brooks (first; 4,236 yards), KU's Devin Neal (second; 3,951 yards) and UCF's RJ Harvey (fourth; 3,543 yards).

- 12 of the 16 Big 12 programs are still in contention for the Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championship entering Week 12.
- The top six teams in the Big 12 standings are separated by just two conference losses.
- Half of the Big 12's 50 conference games have been decided by one score, which is the most among all FBS leagues.

CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

- Iowa State is one of five FBS schools with 30 interceptions in the last two seasons, entering Week 12.
- Colorado's average margin of victory of 17.2 points in Big 12 play is the most of any team in the top half of the Big 12 standings.
- Earlier this season, Colorado's Travis Hunter became the first player in Conference history to win an offensive and defensive weekly award. He has played nearly every snap on offense and defense and is the only FBS player with even more than 50 snaps on both sides of the ball. Hunter has now tallied over 400 snaps on each side of the ball this season.
- The Conference has four teams in the top ten of Power Four in rushing yards per game; UCF (first), Kansas (third), Kansas State (fifth) and Arizona State (ninth).
- Big 12 players have rushed for 175 yards or more in a game 9 times this season, which leads the nation. No other Power Four conference has more than five 175+ rushing yard performances.
- The Big 12 Conference and Raycom Sports announced the launch of Big 12 Studios in September, a new programming and content venture designed to expand and enhance the league's storytelling efforts. Big 12 Studios will create and deliver original programming and content to fans as a FAST (Free Ad-Supported Television) channel across multiple major platforms, including planned launches on leading platforms early this Fall that will be announced soon, as well as major VOD platforms such as YouTube.
- The 2024 season will be the Big 12 Conference's first as a 16-team league. The Big 12 footprint now spans 10 states, four time zones and 90 million people as it begins its 29th football season.
- The Conference partnered with TuneIn, the world's leader in live audio, to launch Big 12 Radio prior to week one. The new 24/7 Conference-branded audio station, is now streaming to fans across the United States. The station includes Big 12 weekday sports talk, extensive Saturday game-day coverage, Big 12 school content and music programming. Additionally, listeners can access a 'Game of The Week' featuring gameday coverage from their Big 12 school's local play-by-play broadcast team.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the 12 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through 12 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on Dec. 31, 2024, and January 1, 2025, while the semifinals will be January 9-10, 2025. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 20, 2025, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.
