

THE AMERICAN TODAY

A busy slate awaits American Athletic Conference teams in Week 1 of the 2021 college football season as five squads kick things off Thursday night and six play on Saturday.

The Thursday ledger is highlighted by one of the better nonconference matchups nationally as UCF and new head coach Gus Malzahn welcome Boise State to the Bounce House for a 7 p.m. ET game on ESPN.

East Carolina faces Appalachian State on ESPNU in the first game of the Duke's Mayo Classic in Charlotte, North Carolina, while South Florida heads to Raleigh to visit NC State. Temple gets the night started with a short road trip to Rutgers, while Tulsa is at home against UC Davis.

The Saturday ledger features a long-anticipated home date for Tulane against No. 2 Oklahoma at Yulman Stadium on ABC. Houston gets the ESPN prime time window for its Texas Kickoff matchup against Texas Tech, while Navy welcomes Marshall to Annapolis.

No. 8 Cincinnati looks to extend a pair of streaks in its season-opener against Miami (Ohio) in the 125th Battle for the Victory Bell. The Bearcats have won 20 straight games at Nippert Stadium and have a 14-game series winning streak against the RedHawks.

Memphis brings a 15-game winning streak at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium into its opener against Nicholls, while SMU hosts Abilene Christian.

Rank And File

Cincinnati finished the 2020 season ranked No. 8 nationally, marking the fourth time in the American Athletic Conference's eight seasons that the league finished with a top-10 team.

Feels Like The First Time

Tulsa went 6-0 in conference play for the first time as a member of The American. Tulsa has won its last seven regular-season conference games, dating to 2019.

On A Roll

Cincinnati has gone 31-6 since the start of the 2018 season. UCF is 41-8 since the beginning of the 2017 season. Memphis is 20-5 and SMU is 17-6 since the start of the 2019 campaign.

Bullies

Cincinnati has won 27 consecutive games against unranked teams.

Consistency

Cincinnati has been ranked in 28 consecutive national polls, dating to the rankings of Oct. 6, 2019. The Bearcats would have to be ranked in the first five polls of the 2021 season to tie UCF's American Athletic Conference record of 33 straight national rankings.

Variety Show

Nine of the 11 American Athletic Conference schools have been ranked in the top 25 since the start of the 2018 season.

Welcome Aboard

The American's top two rushing leaders in 2020 were freshmen. SMU UB Ulysses Bentley led the league with 91.3 rushing yards per game, while East Carolina RB Rahji Harris was second at 78.0 ypg.

Veterans Day

Tulsa lost only eight letterwinners from last year's team. The Golden Hurricane has 14 'super seniors' who elected to return for 2021 with an extra year of eligibility.

Top Of The Charts

QB Dillon Gabriel finished the 2020 season as the national leader in passing (357.0 ypg) and ranked second nationally in total offense (373.9 ypg)

Active Claims

UCF QB Dillon Gabriel will enter 2021 as the NCAA active career leader in passing yards per game. Gabriel has averaged 314.0 yards in his first two seasons.

Familiar Faces

The American Athletic Conference returns 10 of its 11 head coaches from last season. The only new head coach in The American in 2021 will be UCF's Gus Malzahn.

Behind Center

Cincinnati QB Desmond Ridder and East Carolina QB Holton Ahlers both enter the 2021 season as likely four-year starters. Houston QB Clayton Tune and UCF QB Dillon Gabriel will be third-year starters in 2021. Five American Athletic Conference teams (Memphis, SMU, Temple, Tulsa, South Florida) will look to replace their respective starting quarterbacks from 2020.

Great Eigh

Cincinnati is the first American Athletic Conference team with a preseason top-10 ranking since Louisville was ranked No. 9 to start the 2013 season. The Bearcats' No. 8 preseason rank is the highest for an American Athletic Conference team in the league's history.

Draft Class

The American Athletic Conference saw 19 players selected in the 2021 NFL Draft, the most in conference history. Former Tulsa LB Zaven Collins (16th to Arizona) and former Houston DE Payton Turner (28th to New Orleans) were both first-round selections.

2021 COLLEGE FOOTBALL RULES CHANGES

Overtime

Teams will be required to run a 2-point conversion play after a touchdown when a game reaches a second overtime period. Previously, a 2-point attempt was required after the third overtime period.

Also, if the game reaches a third overtime, teams will run alternating 2-point plays, instead of starting another drive at the opponent's 25-yard line. This is a change from the previous rule, which started to use 2-point plays in the fifth overtime period.

This rules change is being made to limit the number of plays from scrimmage and bring the game to a quicker conclusion. Teams can still choose whether to kick the point after touchdown or run a 2-point conversion play during the first overtime period.

Team Area

The Playing Rules Oversight Panel approved the team area being permanently extended to the 20-yard lines, starting in the 2021 season. Previously, the team area extended to the 25-yard lines, but this area was expanded to the 15-yard lines last season to create more spacing due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Unsportsmanlike Tactics

In an editorial change to the rules book, video board and lighting system operators have been included in those personnel who may not create any distraction that obstructs play.

Feigning Injuries

The panel supported the Football Rules Committee proposal to provide a framework to allow a school or conference to request a postgame video review about questionable actions through the NCAA secretary-rules editor/national coordinator of officials

Points Of Emphasis

- For the 2021 season, it will be a point of emphasis for officials to penalize any taunting action directed toward an opponent. Committee members think these actions reflect poorly on the game and can lead to unnecessary confrontations.
- Officials are directed to be alert to players who are significantly in violation of uniform rules and to send violators out of the game to correct the issue. This will include specifically the pants, jerseys and T-shirts that extend below the torso.
- Coaches should not enter the field of play or leave the team area to debate officiating decisions. Those who do so will have committed an automatic unsportsmanlike conduct foul.

- Gabriel finished the 2020 season as the national leader in passing (357.0 ypg) and ranked second nationally in total offense (373.9 ypg).
- UCF has scored a rushing touchdown and a passing touchdown in 49 consecutive games, the longest streak in the nation.
- Head coach Gus Malzahn makes his UCF debut in the opener against Boise State. Malzahn is the only new head coach in The American in 2021.
- The Knights are 41-8 since the start of the 2017 season.
- UCF's three losses last season were by a total of 12 points. The six wins were by an average of 21.3 points.

- Navy begins the 2021 season with a streak of three consecutive games in which the Midshipmen held their opponent to fewer than 300 yards of offense.
- Head coach Ken Niumatolo is the winningest coach in program history. Niumatalolo is 101-67 entering the 2021 season.

- K Dalton Witherspoon has not missed a PAT in his collegeiate career (132-of-132). Witherspoon ranks third on The American's career chart for consecutive made PATs and needs 22 to tie former UCF kicker Matthew Wright for second place.
- Houston's season-opener against Texas Tech will be played at NRG Stadium in Houston. The Cougars' last game at NRG Stadium was a 33-23 win against No. 3 Oklahoma to start the 2016 season.

- QB Cade Fortin will make his first start as South Florida's signal-caller in the opener against NC State. Fortin's last career start came as the quarterback for North Carolina Nov. 24, 2018, also against NC State.

Temple struggled through a 1-6 season in 2020 as the Owls were beset with an untimely confluence of injuries and opt-outs due to the pandemic ... The Owls were 8-5 in 2019, Rod Carey's first season in Philadelphia ... Temple had 22 players make their first career starts during the 2020 season ... The Owls expect to field a more experienced squad in 2021, thanks in large part to the addition of several key transfers ... QB D'Wan Mathis was the Opening Day starter for Georgia last season and is expected to get the start against the Scarlet Knights ... WR Jadan Blue had 41 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in the Owls' six games last season and became Temple's first 1,000-yard receiver in 2019 (1,067 yards) ... WR Randle Jones had 31 catches for 270 yards and two TDs last year.

Rutgers went 3-6 last year in the first season of Greg Schiano's second head coaching tenure in Piscataway, and the Scarlet Knights return 21 starters for 2021 ... Rutgers is looking for its first winning season since the Scarlet Knights went 805 in 2014 ... Schiano had taken Rutgers to bowl games in six of his last seven years in his first go-around with the Scarlet Knights, including the 2006 season, when Rutgers finished the year ranked No. 12 ... QB Noah Verdal threw for 1,253 yards and nine touchdowns against eight interceptions in 2020 ... RB Isaih Pacheco had a team-high 515 rushing yards with three touchdowns, while WR Bo Melton had team highs with 47 receptions, 638 receiving yards and six touchdown catches ... COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Every Game Counts

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is a postseason event to determine college football's national champion on the field, while emphasizing the significance of college football's unique regular season where every game counts.

Rankings

The selection committee ranks the teams based on the members' evaluation of the teams' performance on the field, using conference championships won, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, and comparison of results against common opponents to decide among teams that are comparable.

Tradition

The New Year's holiday period belongs to college football, with two semifinal games rotating annually among the Cotton Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game and Sugar Bowl.

Championship Monday

The two teams that win the Playoff Semifinals compete for the College Football Playoff National Championship. The national championship game is in a different city each year, always on a Monday night.

Universal Access

Every FBS team has equal access to the College Football Playoff based on its performance. No team automatically qualifies.

Governance

University presidents and chancellors from all 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame serve on the CFP Board of Managers and govern the administrative operations, with commissioners (the Management Committee) managing the event. A small staff in the playoff office in Irving, Texas, carries out the detailed responsibilities.

Selection Committee

A talented group of 13 high-integrity individuals with experience as coaches, student-athletes, college administrators and journalists, along with sitting athletics directors, comprise the selection committee. Members of the committee are Mitch Barnhart, Gary Barta (chair), Paola Boivin, Tom Burman, Charlie Cobb, Boo Corrigan, Chris Del Conte, Rick George, Will Shields, Joe Taylor, John Urschel, Rod West and Tyrone Willingham.

Selection Committee Responsibilities

- Rank the top 25 teams and assign the top four to semifinal sites.
- Assign teams to New Year's bowls
- · Create competitive matchups
- Attempt to avoid rematches of regular-season games and repeat appearances
- Consider geography

Participants In New Year's Bowls

Both participants in the Orange, Rose and Sugar Bowls are contracted outside the playoff arrangement (Big Ten and Pac-12 to Rose Bowl; SEC and Big 12 to Sugar Bowl; ACC to Orange Bowl against the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten and Notre Dame). If a conference champion qualifies for the playoff, then the bowl will choose a replacement from that conference. When those bowls host the semifinals and their contracted conference champions do not qualify, then the displaced champion(s) will play in one of the other New Year's bowls.

When not hosting semifinals, the Cotton, Fiesta and Peach Bowls will welcome displaced conference champions and the top-ranked champion from a non-contract conference. The highest-ranked available teams will fill any other berths. The selection committee will make the pairings.

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

The American Bowl Lineup

American Athletic Conference teams are guaranteed at least seven bowl appearances annually as part of the conference's new postseason lineup, which began in the 2020 season and is in place through 2025...

The American, as it has done four times in the first six years of the current bowl cycle, will continue to send its champion to a New Year's Six bowl if that team finishes higher than the champions of four other conferences in the final College Football Playoff rankings. American Athletic Conference teams are also eligible for the College Football Playoff if they are among the top four teams in the final CFP rankings.

As part of the new bowl cycle, The American will annually send teams to the Military Bowl presented by Peraton against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent, the Fenway Bowl in Boston, also against an ACC team, and a third annual spot which will alternate between the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl and the EasyPost Hawaii Bowl.

Additionally, The American will annually have four appearances in a group of eight bowls. The American extended its existing partnerships with the TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl, the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl, the RoofClaim Boca Raton Bowl, the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl and the Cure Bowl.

New to The American's lineup are the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl, the New Mexico Bowl and the Myrtle Beach Bowl.

THE AMERICAN ON TELEVISION

The American and ESPN reached agreement on a 12-year media rights extension that began with the 2020-21 academic year.

With the current agreement, The American has a stronger and more extensive presence on ESPN's primary TV networks - ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU - than at any point in its history. The Conference will also be a valuable part of ESPN+, ESPN's industry-leading direct-to-consumer sports streaming service.

In football, a minimum of 40 regular-season telecasts per season will be televised on ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU, including at least 20 across ABC, ESPN and ESPN2, which represents increased annual exposure across those ESPN networks. The American Championship game will be televised each year on ABC or ESPN.

Beyond select Navy football games, all conference controlled football games from The American will air on an ESPN network or ESPN+.
