**SCOUTING ST. JOHN'S**

- ▶ The defending BIG EAST Tournament champions, St. John's (9-8) takes a four-game winning streak into Friday's matchup with the Bearcats.
- ▶ As of the March 21 BIG EAST rankings, St. John's ranks fifth in batting average (.282), fifth in slugging percentage (.389), fourth in runs scored (119), fourth in RBI (107) and first in fielding percentage (.979).
- ▶ St. John's is 8-3 on the year when scoring at least six runs, including a 5-1 mark when scoring at least 10 runs. St. John's is also 8-3 when the opponent scores five runs or less.

**PETERS STREAKING**

- ▶ Senior shortstop Chris Peters is hitting at a .350 clip (14-for-40) in the last 12 games.
- ▶ He's also added seven RBI and seven stolen bases and one home run during that stretch.
- ▶ Peters hit his first home of the season in the seventh innings against Toledo on Wednesday.
- ▶ It was his first homer since May 15, 2009 vs. Seton Hall.

**VANDENHEUVEL SHINES VS. WMU**

- ▶ Junior second baseman Sam Vandenheuvel Vandenheuvel batted .429 (6-for-14) with four runs scored and two RBI in four games against Western Michigan University.
- ▶ Additionally, the Chandler, Ariz. native pitched two scoreless innings of relief with two strikeouts on Sunday to pick up his first career save.

**BEARCATS ROLLING**

- ▶ Cincinnati has won nine of its past 13 games after starting the season 2-4.
- ▶ During that stretch, Cincinnati has scored an average of 6.00 runs per game, while allowing just 2.76 runs per game.
- ▶ The Bearcats have scored double digits three times and shut out the opponent three times during that span.

**JOHNSON NAMED HONORABLE MENTION**

- ▶ Senior RHP Nick Johnson was named to the BIG EAST Honorable Mention list on March 14 for his performance against Cleveland State.
- ▶ On March 13, the Delphos, Ohio native struck out nine batters in seven scoreless innings to pick up his second win of the season.

**RIDDELL GETS BIG EAST WEEKLY HONOR**

- ▶ Senior outfielder Justin Riddell was named a BIG EAST Honorable Mention recipient on March 7.
- ▶ Riddell batted .500 with four RBI, three runs scored and two doubles in a three-game series against Youngstown State University March 5-6 at Marge Schott Stadium.

- ▶ The 6-foot senior also compiled a .700 slugging percentage and a .545 on-base percentage.

**PROCTOR GOES YARD**

- ▶ Sophomore OF Jake Proctor leads the team in batting average (.361), home runs (3), and stolen bases (8).
- ▶ Trailing 6-5 in the bottom of the eighth inning On March 19 against Western Michigan, Proctor blasted his third home run of the season, a two-run shot to give the Bearcats a 7-6 lead. Cincinnati went onto win 8-6.
- ▶ Proctor hit his second home run of the season on March 5 against Youngstown State, a 2-run blast that gave UC a 10-0 lead.
- ▶ Proctor hit the Bearcats first home run of the 2011 season on Sunday vs. Furman. With the Bearcats trailing 6-4 in the seventh inning, Proctor (Cincinnati, Ohio/Oak Hills) belted a three-run home run to left centerfield to put the Bearcats ahead of Furman 7-6 and help give UC a 9-8 victory. Proctor finished the game 3-for-4 with a home run, two RBI and three runs scored.

**FIRST PITCH INVITATIONAL**

- ▶ Cincinnati played in the 2nd Annual First Pitch Invitational, Feb. 25-27, and finished with a 1-2 record for the weekend. The three day round-robin featured Clemson, Michigan State, Furman and Charleston Southern.
- ▶ On the opening day of the First Pitch Invitational, Clemson University scored in each of the first seven innings to defeat the University of Cincinnati baseball team 15-4 Friday at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.
- ▶ On Saturday at Fluor Field, the Bearcats fell to Charleston Southern 9-5. In his first start of the season, junior Braden Kline (Warsaw, Ind./Warsaw Community) went 3-for-4 with 2 RBI.
- ▶ In the final game of the First Pitch Invitational, the University of Cincinnati baseball team recorded its second win of the season after defeating Furman University 9-8 Sunday at Fluor Field.

**GLASS NAMED ALL-TOURNAMENT**

- ▶ Freshman OF/DH Justin Glass was named to the BIG EAST/Big Ten Challenge All-Tournament Team.
- ▶ The Fort Wayne, Ind. native hit .545 with three RBI, three runs and two walks in three games.
- ▶ In his collegiate debut against Ohio State, Glass went 4-for-5 and scored two runs in UC's 11-5 win.

**BIG EAST/BIG TEN BASEBALL CHALLENGE**

- ▶ Cincinnati made its third trip to the Big EAST/Big Ten Baseball Challenge Feb. 18-20 in the Tampa, Fla. area.
- ▶ In game one of the Challenge vs. Ohio State, the Bearcats fell behind 5-0 through the first three innings before scoring 11 unanswered runs to win 11-5. Freshman Justin Glass went 4-for-5 and scored two runs to lead the UC offense, while LHP Cory Hough pitched four scoreless innings of relief to pick up the win.
- ▶ In the Bearcats second game against Illinois, UC lost

7-3 after recording just four hits. After taking an early 1-0 lead, Cincinnati surrendered seven straight runs and could not make up the difference.

- ▶ On the final day of the Challenge, Cincinnati fell to Michigan State 8-4. UC fell behind 4-0 early and came back to make the score 5-4, but allowed three runs late.

**JONES TO OUTFIELD**

- ▶ Junior T.J. Jones will begin the 2011 season playing in left field after playing the previous two seasons primarily at second base.
- ▶ Jones is looking to return to form after a sophomore slump. He batted .258 with five home runs and 31 RBI last year.
- ▶ As a freshman in 2009, Jones hit .327 with four home runs and 32 RBI, and led the team with four triples as a freshman.

**LOOK WHO'S BACK**

- ▶ The Bearcats have 16 letterwinners returning from the 2010 season including seven seniors.
- ▶ The seniors include Dan Glozer, Dan Jensen, Nick Johnson, Chris Peters, Justin Riddell, Nick Rohfls and Brian Sand.
- ▶ UC has six players back that started at least 20 games last year.
- ▶ UC's top returning hitter from 2010 is senior outfielder Justin Riddell, who hit .313 as a junior with eight home runs and 29 RBI.
- ▶ Senior Chris Peters started all 58 games at shortstop the last two seasons.
- ▶ On the mound, nine of the 14 players who pitched last year are back in 2010.
- ▶ The top returning pitchers for the Bearcats are Dan Jensen and Andrew Strenge.
- ▶ Strenge was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American last year after setting after this season making 15 appearances, including four starts, and finishing with a 1.93 ERA in 46.2 innings of work. Strenge posted an overall record of 7-1 and struck out 40 batters while yielding just 11 extra-base hits of the 46 hits allowed.
- ▶ In conference-only action, Strenge set the BIG EAST Conference single-season ERA record with a 0.62 ERA, breaking Seton Hall's Chris Noonan's record of 0.81 set during the 2003 season. He finished as the league leader in conference-only play not only in ERA, but in opponents batting average (.208), hits allowed (22), runs allowed (5), earned runs allowed (2), and walks allowed (1).

**UC PICKED SEVENTH IN BIG EAST PRESEASON POLL**

- ▶ In the 2011 BIG EAST Preseason Coaches Poll, the Bearcats were picked to finish in seventh.
- ▶ UCONN has been chosen as the favorite to take the 2011 title in the BIG EAST preseason baseball coaches' poll.
- ▶ The coaches also selected UCONN outfielder George Springer as the BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year and tabbed UCONN righthanded pitcher Matt Barnes

the BIG EAST Preseason Pitcher of the Year.

- ▶ UCONN earned nine of a possible 12 first-place votes to edge second-place St. John's as the 2011 favorite. The Huskies had 117 points in the poll, while the Red Storm were second with 107 points and two first-place votes.
- ▶ Cincinnati and Notre Dame were tied for seventh in the preseason poll.
- ▶ The 2011 BIG EAST Baseball Championship will be held in Clearwater, Fla., May 25-29.

**2010 SEASON RECAP**

- ▶ For the second straight year, Cincinnati finished the season with a 29-29 record.
- ▶ Out of 292 NCAA Division I baseball schools, Cincinnati finished the 2010 season with the 26th best team ERA (4.25).
- ▶ The Bearcats made the BIG EAST Tournament for the third season in a row for the first time since joining the BIG EAST Conference in 2005-06.
- ▶ Brian Garman (17th Rd., Milwaukee Brewers) and Kevin Johnson (42nd Rd., Texas Rangers) were both selected in the MLB Draft.
- ▶ Andrew Strenge was named a Freshman All-American by Louisville Slugger and Ping! Baseball.

# HEAD COACH BRIAN CLEARY

In 14 seasons at the University of Cincinnati, Brian Cleary has established himself as one of the top coaches in UC baseball history. After taking over a struggling program in 1997, Cleary has led the Bearcats to 364 wins in his career, ranking second on the school's all-time win list behind the legendary Glenn Sample.

The 42-year-old Cleary has established a strong core of athletes. Due to his energy and passion to deliver a winning product for the University, he has upgraded the talent level within the program thanks to an emphasis on aggressive recruiting. With the influx of talent, Cleary has set his sights on taking the program to the NCAA Tournament after a 30-plus year absence.

For the past six seasons, Cleary has rebuilt a team that's poised to contend for BIG EAST championships. With the completion of the state-of-the-art Marge Schott Stadium and the signing of six straight top recruiting classes, the foundation has been built to allow Cincinnati to compete for BIG EAST Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances for years to come.

Regarded as one of the top coaches in country to develop hitters, Cleary has coached 42 position players that have either been drafted or signed as a free agents. Of those 42 players, only seven were drafted out of high school.

One of those 42 players was Mike Spina, who cemented himself as one of the top hitters in Bearcats history in just

two years of action. After breaking UC's single-season home run record and tying the program's single-season RBI record with 21 home runs and 79 RBI in 2008, Spina drove in 69 runs and broke his own single-season home runs record with 23 in 2009. Additionally, Spina ranks in the Top 10 in UC's career record books in slugging percentage (.703, 1st), home runs (44, 3rd), on-base percentage (.443, 4th), and RBI (148, 6th).

Alongside his experience on the collegiate level, Cleary has also served two stints coaching on the international level. Cleary coached the British National Team in the Baseball World Cup (2009) and the European Championships (2007). During his time with the teams, Cleary served as an assistant coach and worked primarily with the pitchers, helping the squad capture a second place finish at the European Championships in 2007 and a second-round appearance at the Baseball World Cup in 2009.

The fortunes of the Bearcats were never better in 2008 as Cleary's charges set a school record for wins in a season (39) and conference wins in a season (19). UC battled for the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship all year, finishing second in the standings and advancing to the Championship game of the postseason tournament. At the conclusion of the year, another mark was matched as four of Cleary's players were selected in the MLB Draft (Josh Harrison, Dan Osterbrock, Tony Campana and Mike Spina). None of those players were drafted out of high school.

The progression began to show dividends during the 2006 season as Cleary guided the Bearcats to their sixth 30-win season ever and first post-season appearance since 2001. Following the season, Logan Parker became the 11th draft pick in the Cleary era when the Cincinnati Reds selected him in the 12th round of the MLB Draft.

The 2005 season brought an improvement of 10 victories from the year before, as the Bearcats finished the campaign with a 25-30 mark. The season concluded with Josh Kay and Mark Haske both being selected in the MLB Draft. Later in 2005, UC's recruiting class received honorable mention nationally from Collegiate Baseball magazine.

Cleary made an immediate impact upon joining the Bearcat family. After inheriting a team that won only five games in 1996, Cleary pushed his teams to increased win totals each

of his first four years. After winning 12 games in his first year, he increased that total to 15 in 1998, 30 in 1999 and 35 in 2000.

The 1999 squad posted a breakthrough 30-29 season, shattering 17 individual and eight team records and finishing as the eighth most improved team in the nation (12-game improvement). The 30 wins marked just the third 30-win season in UC's 115 years of baseball and the first winning campaign since 1995.

In 2000, the Bearcats won a school record 35 games and advanced to the finals of the C-USA Tournament. The squad also set four individual and eight school records.

In 2001, UC garnered 34 wins, the second-most in school history, and went 16-11 in Conference USA to finish tied for third. That finish is the best ever by a Bearcat team in Conference USA. Kevin Youkilis was a third-team All-American and one of three Bearcats taken in the 2001 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. Tony Maynard was named a freshman All-American, and Chris Hamblen was a finalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the top catcher in the nation. That season, Baseball America named Cleary one of the Top-10 coaches on the rise in Division I.

Cleary came to UC after three seasons at Tulane, where he helped the Green Wave to a 116-70 mark and two NCAA Tournament appearances. Cleary's efforts as an associate head coach, assistant coach and recruiting coordinator helped Tulane to the 1996 C-USA championship and a top-25 national ranking. In addition to his duties as recruiting coordinator, Cleary coached the hitters, infielders and baserunners and served as the team's third-base coach.

A 1990 graduate of Fairfield University, Cleary, a native of Boca Raton, Fla., earned four letters and was a two-time Metro Atlantic Conference All-Academic team pick.
