- Eight teams in the Big I2 standings are separated by two conference losses.
- 22 of the Big I2's 44 conference games have been decided by one score, which is the most among all FBS leagues.

- Big I2 teams have a total of I2 go-ahead scores in the final minute of games in 2024, which is the most in the country.
- The Big I2 leads the FBS with 2I lead changes in the fourth quarter in conference games this season.
- Six Big I2 programs are bowl eligible through Week I0 with another three
 just one win away.
- The Big I2 Conference has the second-highest Sagarin rating of all FBS conferences.
- BYU is one of five undefeated FBS teams through Week IO.
- BYU, Iowa State and K-State all rank in the top 20 in ESPN's FPI Strength of Record.
- Big I2 players have rushed for I75 yards or more in a game 9 times this season, which leads the nation. No other Power Four conference has more than four I75+ rushing yard performances.
- The Conference has five teams in the top ten of Power Four in rushing yards per game; UCF (first), Kansas (fifth), Arizona State (sixth), K-State (seventh), West Virginia (ninth).
- Conference players have eclipsed 100 yards receiving in a game 60 times this season, which leads the country.
- Arizona State running back Cam Skattebo earned his fourth weekly award
 of the season after accounting for 274 all-purpose yards in ASU's win at
 Oklahoma State, which were the most by an FBS running back in Week IO.
 The senior ran for I53 yards on 23 carries and a score while catching four
 passes for I2I yards and two touchdowns. Skattebo is just the sixth player
 in Big I2 history to rush for I50 yards and tally I00 yards receiving in the
 same game.

- Shedeur Sanders is one of two quarterbacks in FBS to rank in the top 10 nationally in completion percentage, passing yards and touchdowns.
- Earlier this season. Colorado's Travis Hunter became the first player in Conference history to win an offensive and defensive weekly award. He has played nearly every snap on offense and defense and is the only FBS player with even more than 50 snaps on both sides of the ball. Hunter has now tallied over 350 snaps on each side of the ball this season.
- lowa State is tied with UNLV for the FBS lead for most interceptions since the start of the 2023 season with 30.
- The Big I2 is home to three of the top four active career Power Four rushing yards leaders in Texas Tech's Tahi Brooks (first: 4,099 yards), KU's Devin Neal (second; 3,835 yards) and UCF's RJ Harvey (fourth; 3,416 yards).
- K-State signal caller Avery Johnson is the only Big I2 quarterback, and one of five nationally, with at least 1,800 yards passing and 350 vards rushing this season.
- The Big I2 Conference and Raycom Sports announced the launch of Big I2 Studios in September, a new programming and content venture designed to expand and enhance the league's storytelling efforts. Big I2 Studios will create and deliver original programming and content to fans as a FAST (Free Ad-Supported Television) channel across multiple major platforms, including planned launches on leading platforms early this Fall that will be announced soon, as well as major VOD platforms such as YouTube.
- The 2024 season will be the Big I2 Conference's first as a 16-team league. The Big I2 footprint now spans IO states, four time zones and 90 million people as it begins its 29th football season.
- The Conference partnered with TuneIn, the world's leader in live audio, to launch Big I2 Radio prior to week one. The new 24/7 Conference-branded audio station, is now streaming to fans across the United States. The station includes Big 12 weekday sports talk, extensive Saturday game-day coverage, Big 12 school content and music programming. Additionally, listeners can access a 'Game of The Week' featuring gameday coverage from their Big I2 school's local play-by-play broadcast team.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on Dec. 3I, 2024, and January I, 2025, while the semifinals will be January 9-I0, 2025. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 20, 2025, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.
