Bearcats Looking for Breakthrough

The Cincinnati women's soccer team missed the BIG EAST Tournament by one point in the 2006 conference standings. With a maturing group of underclassmen who have gained experience at the BIG EAST level, the Bearcats are primed for a breakout season in 2007.

"We were very close last year," 25th-year head coach Meridy Glenn said. "This year we have a capable, experienced group that is developing a winning mentality."

Goals have been hard to come by in recent years. Sophomore Erin MacDonald will have the opportunity to remedy that, as she showed flashes of brilliance as a freshman, scoring three goals in 2006. The play of juniors Jenn Johannigman and Kristin May will be key to UC's attack. Johannigman scored six goals as a freshman in 2005, but injuries limited her time in 2006. May has shown skill during her first two seasons and the coaching staff is expecting

big things from the speedy striker in 2007.

Another junior, Nicole Sanda, is a physical presence at forward, while high school teammate Teresa Smolilo saw extended time in the spring and will push for more minutes.

A talented crop of freshmen enter the mix to fight for playing time as well. Vanessa Hardin scored 56 goals in high school and Emily Hebbeler was an NSCAA/adidas all-region selection as a senior after scoring 52 career goals as a prep. Shauna Smith, a soccer and track standout at Cincinnati's Winton Woods High, gives the Bearcats another speedy option up top.

The loss of four-year letterwinners Becky Imhoff and Kate Norton in the midfield will be tough to overcome, but a strong class returns, led by two-year starter Lindsey Noteboom, who has accounted for two goals and four assists in her career. Sophomore Melissa Bigg and junior Chelsea Kindschuh figure



to see plenty of action, while sophomore Lisa Clark opened eyes with a tremendous spring. Fellow sophomore Stephanie Brindle gained experience in the midfield and at defender during the spring and will push for time. Junior Tricia Gardner is a physical defensive midfielder who has been with the program for two years after joining as a walk-on.

A pair of quality freshmen round out the midfield group. Kendall Loggins led her Naperville (III.) North High squad to three regional championships and was a top midfield recruit in the Chicago area and a U.S. National Team pool player. Logan Ballinger, a Seton High product, was an all-Cincinnati selection and brings an attacking mentality to the midfield.

UC, which cut its goals against from 32 in 2005 to 19 last year, will rely on a solid defensive backline led by captains Gigi Ernst and Kim Sykes. One of just two seniors on the squad, Ernst has started 52 matches in her career and teamed with Sykes to solidify the central defense over the last two seasons. Sykes may see more time in the midfield this season, where her athleticism can help lead to successful UC attacks.

The team's other senior, Erica Maine, will have an opportunity to lock down a wide defensive spot in the preseason after turning the corner in her development during the spring. Sophomore Heather Neiser started all 18 matches last season and should have a spot locked up heading into 2007.

A trio of freshmen provide flexibility along the backline, including Camille Royer, who led her club, Challenge FC, to the Region 3 Finals this summer. The Texan was a state Olympic Development Program participant for three years and won seven state championships with her club team. Ellen Parker, a two-time all-state choice while at Ballard (Ky.) High, accounted for 48 goals and 42 assists as a prep. She has also been a member of the Kentucky state ODP program for five years and a Region II

ODP pool player. Kalli Goldberg, a physical presence at defender, led Bloomfield (Colo.) High to a state championship as a junior.

Andrea Kaminski had one of the best freshman goalkeeping seasons in school history in 2006, posting a 1.04 goals against average and six shutouts, which ranked seventh in the BIG EAST. She opened her career with consecutive shutouts against Kentucky and No. 21 Purdue and earned BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week honors for her effort. Behind Kaminski are a pair of redshirt sophomores. Brittany Hansen saw action in one contest in 2006 and figures to be the primary backup in 2007 after a good showing during the spring season. Andrea Bouldin, who transferred from Eastern Michigan prior to last season, is fighting injury and will push Hansen for the backup spot.

The Bearcats again face a formidable schedule as eight 2006 NCAA tournament teams dot the landscape. Rivalry matches against Xavier, Miami (Ohio), Dayton and Louisville will all be played in the confines of Gettler Stadium in 2007, while UC will take on four NCAA teams on the road, including national runner-up Notre Dame. Matches against Rutgers and Marquette highlight the conference home slate, while UC faces NCAA squads West Virginia and Villanova on the road in BIG EAST play.

"Our non-conference will test us," Glenn said.
"We'll see teams with different styles and we will
be able to use that as a barometer for the BIG EAST
season. The conference schedule has some great
home matches. We've got eight NCAA teams on the
docket, but you never know who is going to be the
next NCAA team. Hopefully, it will be us."

With a maturing team filled with underclassmen, the Bearcats will seek consistency in their attack in 2007 while maintaining their defensive mentality. The goal of reaching the BIG EAST tournament and advancing are well within reach as Glenn and her staff have built a solid base upon which to build the Bearcats into a consistent BIG EAST force.
