# **2002 Bearcats: The Tradition Continues**

Coming off the best season in school history and a sweet 16 appearance, expectations were high for the 2002 Cincinnati women's soccer team. Behind the most successful senior class ever at UC, the 2002 squad used trademark stifling defense to claim back-to-back Conference USA Tournament championships and another trip to the NCAA College Cup.

#### **Defense One of Nation's Best**

On the strength of 13 shutouts, including eight in a row, the Bearcat defense owned Division I's 10th best goals against average, surrendering 0.60 goals per game. UC also boasted the nation's 14th best shutout percentage at 0.54. Individually, goalkeeper Tracy Hale ranked 10th in D-I with a 0.62 goals against average.

#### **Season Of Streaks**

UC put together several lengthy streaks in 2002, all of which came to an end during Oct. 27th's 2-0 loss to Saint Louis at Meyers Field. The Bearcats put together a 10-match unbeaten streak. Included in that string was a period of 943:42 where they held opponents scoreless, setting a new school record by recording eightstraight shutouts. UC also ran up a 23-match unbeaten streak in C-USA regular season matches.

#### **Season Records Fall**

The Bearcats broke three school records during the 2002 campaign.

- Goalkeeper Tracy Hale passed Christy Hoffman for most home shutouts in a season with five and half. Hoffman set the record in 2001 with 4.5.
- With its 0-0 tie with No. 12 Charlotte, UC tied the single-season mark for ties with three. The record has been reached four times previously, in 1983, 1990, 1996 & 1997.
- UC's streak of eight consecutive shutouts surpassed the old mark of seven. The previous record had been accomplished twice, in 2001 and 1982.

#### **Changing The Record Books**

With her 10 assists last season, Tasha Wagner moved into fourth place on the career assists list with 19.

Senior Amy Simonson moved into a tie for eighth place on the career points list at UC with her goal against Kentucky in the NCAA tournament. Simonson, who graduated with 62 career points, is also tied for seventh place on the all-time assists list with 16 and is tied for eighth place in career goals with 23.

In her first season as the Bearcats' starting goalkeeper, Tracy Hale moved into sixth-place on the career shutouts list at UC with 12.5. Hale had 12 shutouts last year and shared a shutout in 2001.

# C-USA Tourney Champs Again

The Bearcats used victories over South Florida, East Carolina and Marquette en route to the C-USA title in Charlotte, N.C, their second in as many years and fourth in league history.

Amy Simonson netted the go-ahead goal 1:51 into the second half, leading UC to a 3-1 victory over South Florida in the quarterfinals. Amy Mink scored the game-winner off a corner kick from Tasha

Wagner in the 88th minute, giving Cincinnati a 2-1 win over East Carolina in the semifinals.

Simonson assisted on two goals, including the game-winner by Wagner with 6:38 left, as the Bearcats defeated Marquette, 2-1, in the championship.

# Second Straight NCAA Bid Ends in Heartbreak

Cincinnati made its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Collegiate Cup in 2002, hoping to repeat 2001's trip to the sweet 16.

Amy Simonson netted a goal just over three minutes into the second half as the Bearcats defeated Kentucky, 1-0, in their opening round match in Knoxville, Tenn.

UC withstood a flurry of shots from the Wildcats and goalkeeper Tracy Hale came 30 yards off her line to thwart a break away opportunity and keep the shut out intact.

In the second round, Tennessee scored the game-winning goal with 4:59 remaining in the second half to take a hard-fought, 2-1 match over UC, ending the Bearcats's season at 17-4-3.
