NO. 8/9 FOOTBALL HEADS TO TAMPA FOR BIG EAST MATCHUP WITH USF THURSDAY NIGHT

- The No. 8/9 University of Cincinnati football team jumps back into BIG EAST Conference action with a Thursday night showdown at No. 21 USF at Raymond James Stadium. Both teams are coming off an idle week and are 5-0 and 1-0 in BIG EAST play. UC has won the past three meetings in the series. Cincinnati enters with the No. 4 ranked scoring offense (42.0 ppg) in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision while USF features the No. 5 ranked scoring defense (9.4 ppg). The Bearcats lead the nation in tackles for a loss and sacks, averaging 10.0 stops per game behind the line of scrimmage and 4.2 quarterback sacks per game.

THE SERIES

- The two schools have met six times on the field with UC leading the all-time series 4-2. USF leads 2-1 in Tampa.

THE COACHES

- **BRIAN KELLY**, the two-time reigning BIG EAST Coach of the Year, is in his third full season at the helm of the Cincinnati football program with a 26-6 record and a 19-year career mark of 163-57-2. Kelly led the Bearcats to a school-record 11 wins, a BIG EAST Championship, and a Bowl Championship Series game berth in 2008. He won two NCAA Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State and led Central Michigan to the 2006 Mid-American Conference Championship. He is the leader in victories among active BIG EAST coaches and is the only current BIG EAST coach with 150 or more career wins.
- **JIM LEAVITT** has a career record of 91-52 (.636) and is in his 13th season at USF. He is the only coach in program history and is 2-4 against UC.

A LOOK AHEAD

- UC will look to retain the Keg Of Nails for the second-straight year as it welcomes Louisville into a sold-out Nippert Stadium for homecoming on Oct. 24 in the battle for the Keg Of Nails. UC leads the all-time series 26-21-1, with a 14-12 UC lead on the home turf. The Bearcats knocked off the Cardinals in a 28-20 thriller a year ago at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS

- UC achieved its best-ever ranking entering the week, checking in at No. 8 in the *Associated Press* poll and No. 9 in the *USA Today* Coaches poll. This marks the third-straight season UC has been ranked. UC is 13-7-1 all-time when ranked.
- UC leads the nation in tackles for a loss (10.0 per game) and sacks (4.2 per game) while also ranking in the top-10 in turnover margin (4th/1.6) and scoring defense (13.8/10).
- The Bearcats have scored 210 points in five games (42.0 ppg) and are 5-0 for the second time in three years (2007).
- Cincinnati ranks third nationally in scoring offense, averaging 42.0 points per game, sixth in passing offense (329.8), and 11th in total offense (468.2), leading the BIG EAST in all three.
- QB Tony Pike has thrown a touchdown pass in 15-straight starts and leads the BIG EAST in total offense (306.8 ypg).
- WR Mardy Gilyard has caught a touchdown pass in each of UC's five games in 2009, extending his TD reception streak to seven games. He has 38 catches for 517 yards and 7 TDs in 2009.
- Gilyard leads the league in all-purpose yards (166.4)
- Under third-year coach Brian Kelly, Cincinnati had its second straight 10-win season in 2008. Before Kelly arrived, Cincinnati had exactly one 10-win season (1951).
- Cincinnati was picked third in the BIG EAST preseason media poll, despite the Bearcats' receiving as many first-place votes (eight) as favorite Pittsburgh.

BEARCATS GRAB HIGHEST EVER RANKING IN POLLS ...

- The Bearcats (5-0, 1-0 BIG EAST) check in at No. 8 in the *Associated Press* poll and No. 9 in the *USA Today* Coaches poll, its best ever ranking in the weekly polls.
- Entering 2009, UC's best ranking in all polls was No. 12.
- The Bearcats ranked No. 12 in the AP, USA Today, and Bowl Championship Series Standings entering the 2009 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- UC also held the No. 12 spot in the AP poll on Nov. 8, 1954.
- The USF contest marks UC's 22nd game as a ranked team. The Bearcats own a 13-7-1 when ranked.

QUICK STRIKE OFFENSE ...

- The Bearcats 2009 offense has shown an uncanny ability for the quick strike score.
- UC is averaging 6.8 plays per scoring drive at an average of 2:25 per score.
- Its longest scoring drive of the season is 5:14 (at Oregon State) while its shortest was also against the Beavers (0:28).
- Ten of those 29 scores have come on plays of 20 yards or longer.

CLOSING OUT GAMES ...

- Since the arrival of head coach Brian Kelly at UC, and the installation of strength and conditioning coach Paul Longo's lifting and conditioning program, UC has become one of the top closing teams in the country.
- Dating back to the 2007 International Bowl, the Bearcats are 26-0 when entering the fourth quarter with a lead.
- When leading after halftime, UC is 24-2.

SAVING ON POSSESSION TIME ...

- Although UC is being outdone in time of possession by a 36:08-23:52 margin, the Bearcats are outscoring their opponents by a 210-69 ledger.
- Against Fresno State, the Bulldogs had possession for 43:42 of the game compared to UC's possession of 16:18.
- Cincinnati had possession for 51 seconds in the third quarter.
- The Bulldogs doubled UC's number of plays, finishing with 84 plays to Cincinnati's 42.

SCORE EARLY, SCORE OFTEN ...

- In each of UC's games this season the Bearcats have scored 21 points or more in the first half.
- The Bearcats are outscoring opponents 145-42 in the first half and 210-69 overall.
- UC has scored 90 points in the second quarter alone, surpassing its opponents output of 69 total points.

LEAGUE VISITORS EXITING ON TOP ...

- The visiting team has won four of the first five BIG EAST

games in 2009, including UC's 47-15 season-opening win at Rutgers on Sept. 7.

- Pittsburgh became the first home team to win a BIG EAST game when the Panthers defeated Connecticut last Saturday.

TAKING OVER THE WORLD WIDE LEADER ...

- Head coach Brian Kelly spent Friday, Oct. 9 at ESPN doing a whirlwind day of interviews in Bristol, Conn.

NOTING THE BIG EAST ...

- The BIG EAST has a 25-7 nonconference record through five weeks of the 2009 season.
- The aggregate record of the seven teams to defeat BIG EAST opponents this season is 27-13.
- The BIG EAST's .767 winning percentage in 2009 is good for second among FBS conferences.
- Under its current alignment, which is in its fifth season, the BIG EAST is a combined 145-58 in nonleague games. (.714). That would stand as the best five-year nonleague record in the history of the conference.

USF TIES ...

- USF defensive coordinator Joe Tresey held the same role at UC from 2008-2009.

BEARCATS RETAIN THE VICTORY BELL ...

- With UC's 37-13 over Miami (OH), the Bearcats retain the Victory Bell for the fourth-straight season.
- The win moved the Bearcats to 48-59-7 vs. Miami in the all-time series
- It's UC's first four-game winning streak against the RedHawks since 1986-89.

A NEW DIMENSION FOR THE OFFENSE ...

- Jacob Ramsey finished with 12 carries for 103 yards and three TDs at Miami (OH).
- He averaged 8.6 yards per carry on the way to becoming in the first UC running back to tally 100 or more yards in a game since Butler Benton (101) against Southeast Missouri State on Aug. 30, 2007.
- Ramsey became the 15th running back in UC history to score three rushing scores in a game (last Richard Hall vs. Miami (OH) in 2004), running in from 4, 8, and 2 yards.
- It was his first career multiple touchdown game of his career and he has eight career rushing TDs.

SACKS & TURNOVERS ...

- Against Miami (OH), UC recorded multiple sacks for the third time in five games in 2009 and a season-high 10 sacks.
- UC tallied double digits sacks for the first time since recording 11 at Syracuse on Nov. 24, 2007.
- The Bearcats defense also intercepted two passes in the game, the fifth-straight game the Bearcats have recorded and interception and a turnover in a game.
- UC leads the nation in sacks (4.2).

WALKING WOUNDED ...

- Robby Armstrong (knee), Quincy Quetant (leg), Chris Williams (knee), DJ Woods (Illness), and Curtis Young (knee) all missed the Miami (OH) game due to injury.
- All are expected back for the USF game except for Armstrong and Quetant who are out for the season.

DUO GETTING SACKS ...

- ▶ Derek Wolfe and Alex Daniels recorded back-to-back sacks on consecutive plays in the fourth quarter against Miami (OH).
- ▶ Daniels had his first-career multiple-sack game, finishing with four. He now has 6.5 sacks in his career.
- ▶ Wolfe also had a multi-sack game with a pair of takedowns. He has 2.5 for his career.

BONES ON DOUBLE DUTY IN 2009 ...

- ▶ Marcus Barnett started at wide receiver in place of DJ Woods at Miami (OH).
- ▶ It was Barnett's first start at wide receiver in 2009 and his second of the 2009 season.
- ▶ He started at defensive back against Fresno State (9/26/09). He is the lone UC player to start on both sides of the ball in 2009.
- ▶ Barnett had a 21-yard reception in the fourth quarter, his longest of the season. He finished with team-high tying six receptions for 57 yards.

HE CAN PUNT TOO? ...

- ▶ Tony Pike quick kicked on UC's first drive against Miami (OH), his first career punt. The punt went for 21 yards.

ROGERS SNAPS A STREAK, STARTS ANOTHER ...

- ▶ Jake Rogers missed his first extra point attempt of the game, snapping a streak of 58-consecutive extra points made dating back to the 2008 season.
- ▶ That mark ranks fourth in school history. He made four-straight extra point attempts following the miss.
- ▶ Rogers hit a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter, his second made kick of the season and first since the season opener at Rutgers on Sept. 7.

NICE TO SEE YOU AGAIN ...

- ▶ John Goebel made his first appearance of the season on

special teams. He had missed the previous four games with a hamstring injury.

A GAME CHANGER ...

- ▶ JK Schaffer intercepted a Zac Dysert pass in the end zone in the third quarter of the Miami (OH) game, returning it 13 yards. It was his team-leading third interception of the season and his career.

GILYARD NEARING THE WIZARD ...

- ▶ Mardy Gilyard's had a 23-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter from Tony Pike, his seventh receiving TD of the year and 21st of his career.
- ▶ He is tied for second place all-time with Jim O'Brien (1967-69) and needs one more to tie Dominick Goodman (2005-08) for the all-time lead at 22.
- ▶ Gilyard has a touchdown reception in each game this season and has a seven-game touchdown streak, dating back to the Hawai'i game in 2008.

REVELS LEADING THE DEFENSE ...

- ▶ Andre Revels recorded a career-best 13 tackles at Miami (OH) and now has a team-best 41 on the season.
- ▶ He also is the leading active career tackler on the squad, checking in with 171 stops.

FORCING TURNOVERS ...

- ▶ The Bearcats have 10 interceptions in five games, recorded by seven different players.
- ▶ JK Schaffer leads the Bearcats and is tied for the BIG EAST lead and tied for 10th in the nation with his three picks.
- ▶ UC has forced five fumbles, recovering one.
- ▶ UC is second in the BIG EAST and ranks No. 3 nationally, forcing 1.6 turnovers per game with a +15 margin in the Brian Kelly era.

RECORD: 3-3

- ▶ The UC Bearcat has been named one of the 12 members of the 2009 Capital One All-America Mascot Team and is competing for the coveted title of "Capital One National Mascot of the Year."
- ▶ Bearcat found the road to the top spot very navigable as he has been a leading vote getter among all 12 mascots.
- ▶ He is 3-3 in head-to-head competition, knocking off Jack Rabbit, Hairy Dawg, and Sebastian the Ibis, while falling to Butch the Cougar Mike the Tiger and Super Frog.
- ▶ The overall win-loss record determines the mascot rankings, with tiebreakers being determined by total votes. After the 11th week of regular season matchups, the top eight mascots will advance to the playoffs.
- ▶ Fans can vote multiple times a day during the contest, and Capital One does not collect names, addresses, or email addresses from anyone who casts a vote.
- ▶ Bearcat faces off with Bucky Badger from Wisconsin this week.



MITCH'S MISSION

- ▶ The Bearcats have adopted Mitch Stone, a 12-year old brain cancer patient, through the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation.
- ▶ Mitch, a Cincinnati native who recently completed fifth grade at Maddux Elementary School, was diagnosed with a primitive neuroectodermal brain tumor (PNET) in Feb. 2009.
- ▶ He underwent surgery to attempt to remove the tumor, four bouts of chemotherapy, and 31 radiation treatments.

- ▶ UC is the first NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision team to adopt a child through FOJ.

SPREADING THE WEALTH ...

- ▶ Fourteen student-athletes have caught passes for the Bearcats this season, led by Mardy Gilyard's 38 catches for 517 yards and seven touchdowns.
- ▶ DJ Woods is averaging 65.2 yards per game, and Armon Binns averages 55.8 yards per contest.
- ▶ Running back Isaiah Pead (8 catches, 131 yards, 1 TD) has the highest per catch average, netting 16.4 yards per grab.

GILYARD NAMED BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK ...

- ▶ University of Cincinnati wide receiver Mardy Gilyard was named the BIG EAST Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the week ending Sept. 26.
- ▶ Gilyard hauled in nine catches for a career-best 177 yards and two touchdowns in UC's 28-20 win over Fresno State at Nippert Stadium on Saturday.
- ▶ He finished with 226 all-purpose yards and had TD grabs of 11 and 23 yards from quarterback Tony Pike to lead a Bearcats offense that was on the field for just 16:18.
- ▶ Gilyard was awarded a helmet sticker by Lou Holtz on ESPN's College Gameday Final Saturday night, and is also one of four finalists for the AT&T All-America National Player of the Week, his second nomination this season.

AN OFFENSE ON DEFENSE ...

- ▶ Six former offense players have started for the UC defense this season, LB Robby Armstrong (RB), DB Marcus Barnett (WR), DE Alex Daniels (RB), LB Craig Carey (QB), LB Demetrius Jones (QB), and LB Marcus Waugh (FB/TE).

ENTERING THE STAT SHEET ...

- ▶ Tight end Ben Guidugli scored the first touchdown of UC's 28-20 win over Fresno State, a 33-yard reception from Tony Pike.
- ▶ It was Guidugli's first touchdown of the season and the third of his career.
- ▶ The 33-yard reception matched his career long.

PIKE A CONSTANT THREAT ...

- ▶ Tony Pike finished UC's 28-20 win over Fresno State 18-of-26 with 300 passing yards, his fifth career 300-yard passing game. His only 2009 game not reaching 300 yards came against SEMO where he played only the first half.
- ▶ He threw three touchdowns and completed a season-long 56-yard pass to Gilyard.
- ▶ Pike has thrown a touchdown pass in 15 straight starts.

LEGGING IT OUT ...

- ▶ Jacob Rogers booted a career-long 54-yard punt in the first quarter against Fresno State, surpassing his previous 44-yard long.
- ▶ Rogers and freshman Patrick O'Donnell have split the punting duties this season.
- ▶ Rogers has kicked eight times for a 35.9 yard average, while O'Donnell has seven punts for a 37.9 average.

(S) PEAD KILLS ...

- ▶ Isaiah Pead scored his third career rushing touchdown in the second quarter of the Fresno State game, a 1-yard touchdown rush, giving the Bearcats a 21-10 advantage.
- ▶ Pead has a rushing touchdown in two of the last three games and has four total touchdowns this season (3 rushing, 1 receiving).

- ▶ On the season, Pead has toted the ball 39 times for 225 yards and three scores, averaging 5.8 yards per carry and 45.0 yards per game.
- ▶ He has caught eight balls for 131 yards and a TD.

PLAY OF THE DAY PART 1 ...

- ▶ Craig Carey stopped Fresno State's drive on a fourth down play at the 6-yard line with his first career interception on the first play of the fourth quarter.
- ▶ The turnover was capped off six plays later with a 23-yard touchdown reception by Mardy Gilyard, his second TD reception of the game, giving UC a 28-17 lead in the fourth quarter.

PLAY OF THE DAY PART 2 ...

- ▶ In the fourth quarter of UC's 28-20 win over Fresno State, DJ Woods made a spectacular one-handed airborne grab to help set up the Bearcats final score of the day.
- ▶ Woods play was ranked as the No. 8 play of the day on ESPN's Saturday night edition of SportsCenter.

FREY A DEFENSIVE STANDOUT ...

- ▶ Drew Frey finished with 11 total tackles against Fresno State and 12 at Oregon State, giving him 23 tackles in a two game span.
- ▶ He is fourth on the team with 29 tackles.
- ▶ He recorded 10 tackles in four games during the 2008 season. He had earned his first career start at Akron before suffering a season-ending arm injury.

RECORDING CAREER BESTS ...

- ▶ JK Schaffer and Dan Giordano each recorded a career-high nine tackles in the 28-20 win over Fresno State.
- ▶ Demetrius Jones matched a career high with nine tackles.
- ▶ Derek Wolfe notched a career-high eight tackles.

ENDING THE BEAVERS' STREAK ...

- ▶ The Bearcats knocked off then No. 24 Oregon State on Sept. 19 at Reser Stadium in Corvallis, Ore., snapping the Beavers 26-game non-conference home winning streak.
- ▶ Before the Bearcats, the last non-conference foe to win at Oregon State was Montana in 1996.

STEWART THE NEXT MAN IN

- ▶ Redshirt freshman Walter Stewart made his first career start at outside linebacker at Oregon State, his third career game, filling in for an injured Curtis Young.
- ▶ He earned his first career solo sack, a nine-yard loss, in the second quarter.
- ▶ Stewart recorded a second sack and caused a Sean Canfield fumble late in the second quarter and was credited with a half sack at the end of the first half. He finished with 4 tackles, 2.5 for loss, and 2.5 sacks.
- ▶ He finished with five tackles and a tackle for a loss in the Fresno State contest, and added four stops and a sack at Miami (OH).

WOODS STRONG IN THE NORTHWEST ...

- ▶ DJ Woods' 45-yard TD reception from Pike with 18 seconds left in the first half at Oregon State was his first career touchdown grab and also a career-long reception.
- ▶ Woods finished the game with a career-high seven catches for a career-best 117 yards and the touchdown.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD ...

- ▶ UC's 70 points against Southeast Missouri State is the third most in school history, passing the 69 points scored in 1923 against Case-Western Reserve.
- ▶ Cincinnati had five touchdown passes in the game, which ties for the most in school history.
- ▶ UC's 578 total yards ranks seventh in school history.
- ▶ UC scored 49 points in the first half against Southeast Missouri State, the most points in a half in the Brian Kelly era. The previous high was 38 against USF in 2007.
- ▶ Cincinnati scored five touchdown receptions, three rushing touchdowns, a punt return, and a kick return for touchdown against SEMO.
- ▶ The 70 points against SEMO and the 47 points against Rutgers mark two of the top-5 highest scoring games in the Brian Kelly era.

STREAMLINED DANIELS MAKING AN IMPACT ...

- ▶ Senior Alex Daniels moved into the starting lineup against Southeast Missouri State and has earned his stripes.
- ▶ Daniels is fifth on the squad with 28 tackles, including 6.5 tackles for a loss, and 5.5 sacks.
- ▶ He finished the 2008 season with 15 tackles and a sack.
- ▶ Daniels shaved his head prior to Bearcat Bowl III last April, losing the dreadlocks he had worn for several years.

ENDING A LONG DROUGHT ...

- ▶ Mardy Gilyard returned a punt 53 yards for UC's first touchdown 2:09 into the game against Southeast Missouri State on Sept. 12, 2009.
- ▶ The punt return for a touchdown snapped a 12-year drought since the last UC punt was returned for a score.
- ▶ It was UC's first in 133 games, or since Nov. 8, 1997 (Tinker Keck vs. Louisville, 44 and 78 yards), marking the second-longest streak nationally (Navy, 152 games)
- ▶ The 53-yard return was Gilyard's career long and only his eighth punt return.

GILYARD IN ALL PHASES ...

- ▶ Gilyard recorded his first career rushing touchdown, UC's third touchdown in five tries in the "wildcat" formation. In his career, Gilyard has scored on a punt return, kick return and has a touchdown reception and rushing touchdown.
- ▶ Against SEMO, Gilyard scored a 1-yard rushing touchdown, 8-yard and 37-yard touchdown receptions, and scored on a 53-yard punt return. He tied the mark for the third-most touchdowns in a UC game.
- ▶ The last player to score four touchdowns in a game was DeMarco McCleskey, who did it twice in 1998 (Arkansas State and Houston).
- ▶ According to STATS, LLC, the last player in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision competition before Gilyard to score via punt return, reception, and rush in the same game was Maurice Drew (now Jones-Drew) of UCLA on Oct. 8, 2005 vs. California. Jones scored three rushing touchdowns and once each via punt return and reception.

THE D HOLDS SEMO ...

- ▶ After allowing SEMO to gain 94 yards in first quarter, the Bearcats held their opponent to 82 total yards in the final three quarters, 69 in the second, 11 in the third, two in the fourth.

BACKUP SUCCESS ...

- ▶ Quarterback Zach Collaros recorded his first career touchdown pass, a career-long 37-yard toss to Mardy Gilyard. It was Gilyard's fourth touchdown of the game and his second touchdown reception.
- ▶ Collaros connected with Charley Howard for his second touchdown throw.

YOUNG SUFFERS KNEE INJURY ...

- ▶ Senior linebacker Curtis Young is expected to miss three to six weeks after undergoing successful right knee surgery on Sept. 18 at University Hospital.
- ▶ Dr. Angelo Colosimo, the Bearcats' team orthopedic surgeon, performed the operation.
- ▶ He was injured in practice leading up to UC's game at Oregon State but has begun rehabilitation.
- ▶ Young started the Bearcats first two games of the season, tallying 13 tackles, including 3.5 for a loss, two quarterback hurries, and a sack.

ANOTHER SPECIAL TEAMS SUCCESS ...

- ▶ Darrin Williams started the scoring on the first play of the second half against Southeast Missouri State with a 100-yard kick return, his first career TD.
- ▶ Williams became the third player in school history to return a kick 100-yards, the last was Mardy Gilyard at West Virginia on Nov. 8, 2008.

ANOTHER DEBUT ...

- ▶ Brendon Kay made his first career appearance at quarterback for UC against Southeast Missouri State.
- ▶ He is the fifth quarterback the Bearcats have played this season (Pike, Collaros, Anderson, T. Kelce), matching last year's number of quarterbacks played.

PIKE EARNS BIG EAST WEEKLY HONOR ...

- ▶ Following his season opening performance at Rutgers, signal caller Tony Pike was named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 8.
- ▶ Pike threw for a career-high 362 yards and three touchdowns as Cincinnati gained an early lead in the BIG EAST race with a 47-15 win at Rutgers.
- ▶ He completed 27-of-34 passes (.794), including two second-quarter TD passes that helped the Bearcats to a 31-7 halftime lead.

CIRCLING CINCINNATI ...

- ▶ Head coach Brian Kelly and his staff have made it no secret that they will use Cincinnati as a recruiting base for future UC student-athletes.
- ▶ Currently, UC has 51 players on its roster from the State of Ohio, far more than any other state represented.
- ▶ Of those 51, 26 are from the greater Cincinnati area.

KELLY FAMILY FOUNDATION MAKES DONATION ...

- ▶ At halftime of the Southeast Missouri State game, the Brian Kelly Family Foundation made a \$10,000 donation to the UC Barrett Cancer Institute at University Hospital.
- ▶ The monies were raised by UC's Fourth Annual Women's Football 101 and its related event.

- ▶ Camerron Cheatham (DB), Alex Daniels (DL), Demetrius Jones (LB), and JK Schaffer (linebacker) made their first career starts against Southeast Missouri State.

NEW-LOOK D MAKES ROAD DEBUT ...

- ▶ UC's 47-15 win over Rutgers on Sept. 7 was the debut of UC's new-look defense.
- ▶ The Bearcats tallied 11 tackles for a loss, five sacks, and three interceptions.
- ▶ Linebacker Curtis Young (11 tackles, 3.0 TFLs, 1 sack) and safety Aaron Webster (10 tackles, 1 interception) led the way for Cincinnati.
- ▶ Ricardo Mathews finished with 1.5 sacks and a quarterback hurry.
- ▶ Brandon Mills led the team with five tackles against SEMO.

ADDING TO THE ARSENAL ...

- ▶ Head coach Brian Kelly added a wrinkle to his offense in the season opener against Rutgers, debuting UC's version of the Wildcat Offense, which is called the Bearcat Formation.
- ▶ The offense was made popular by several teams last year, including the University of Florida and Miami Dolphins.
- ▶ Redshirt freshman Travis Kelce acts as the quarterback in this version of the offense and gained 18 yards on three carries, scoring a pair of touchdowns from four and two yards, respectively.
- ▶ The idea for the package came from a visit UC's offensive coaches took to the University of Florida this winter.
- ▶ The Gators are coached by UC alumnus and former football student-athlete Urban Meyer.

UC IN FACILITY FUNDING PUSH ...

- ▶ UC is in the midst of a funding push to build the Jefferson Avenue Sports Complex, which includes new practice fields for the Bearcats football team.
- ▶ The project has an estimated construction cost of \$13.5 million, of which, more than \$7.5 million has been committed from various sources for the complex.
- ▶ Plans for the complex include two fields, one 100 yards in length and the other being 50 yards.
- ▶ The 100-yard field will also become an indoor practice facility during winter months via an air-supported bubble that will be inflated over the field.
- ▶ The bubble will maintain an interior ambient temperature between 50-60 degrees in the cold Cincinnati winter and be in place from late November to late February..
- ▶ UC athletics benefactor Larry Sheakley, CEO of The Sheakley Group, had issued a \$1 million challenge, which was matched in two weeks.
- ▶ Sheakley has issued a new personal commitment to match up to another \$1.5 million in donations.
- ▶ UC is one of only two football-playing schools (out of 120) in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) that use game day facilities for practice.

HOMECOMING A SELLOUT ...

- ▶ Tickets for the UC's homecoming matchup on Oct. 24 for the Keg Of Nails against Louisville is a sellout.
- ▶ The game is set for an 3:30 p.m. kickoff and will be televised nationally on ESPN2.

WVU GAME IS SOLD OUT ...

- ▶ Tickets for the UC's Nippert Stadium matchup with West Virginia University are sold out.
- ▶ The game is set for an 8 p.m. kickoff on Friday, November 13th and will be televised nationally on ESPN2.

- ▶ UC and Dave & Buster's are teaming up once again in 2009 to provide away-game watch parties for Bearcats fans at the Tri-County area restaurant in Cincinnati.

VOTE KELLY AS LIBERTY MUTUAL COACH OF THE YEAR

- ▶ UC fans have the opportunity to support Bearcats head coach Brian Kelly in his fight to become the 2009 Liberty Mutual College Football Coach of the Year by voting online at coachoftheyear.com.
- ▶ At the conclusion of the 2009 college football season Liberty Mutual, will honor one coach from each of the four NCAA divisions who demonstrates excellence both on and off the field. The four honorees will each receive \$50,000 for charitable activities of their choice and \$20,000 for their school's alumni association.
- ▶ Voting is open from Sept. 14 to Dec. 6 and UC fans can vote once per day for Kelly to help place him among the top 15 vote getters to be considered for the award.
- ▶ The top 15 coaches selected through the fan voting process will be evaluated on coaching excellence, sportsmanship and integrity, academic excellence and community commitment criteria.
- ▶ In addition to fan voting, respected members of the College Football Hall of Fame and national media members will vote for the coaches they feel most embody the criteria.

QUETANT OUT FOR THE SEASON ...

- ▶ Redshirt freshman defensive back Quincy Quetant is expected to miss the season after undergoing successful surgery to repair a ruptured Achilles Tendon at University of Cincinnati Hospital on Aug. 23.
- ▶ Dr. Angelo Colosimo, the Bearcats' team orthopedic, performed the operation.
- ▶ Quetant was injured during non-contact drills in fall camp.

COACH KELLY A HALL OF FAMER AGAIN ...

- ▶ Head coach Brian Kelly will be inducted in the Grand Valley State University Athletics Hall of Fame in on October 16.
- ▶ Kelly spent 13 years (1991-2003) GVSU, leading the Lakers to a 118-35-2 mark, including back-to-back NCAA Division II National Championships in 2002-03.
- ▶ Kelly, a graduate of Assumption College, was inducted into that school's hall of fame in 2006.

UC TEAMS WITH PNC FOR FIRST DOWN PROMOTION ...

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati football team and PNC Bank, a member of the PNC Financial Services Group, Inc., kick off the PNC Grow Up Great "First Down" program Saturday as UC welcomes Fresno State into Nippert Stadium for a noon matchup.
- ▶ For every Bearcats first down during the 2009 season, the PNC Grow Up Great school readiness program will donate \$50 to United Way of Greater Cincinnati Success By 6, a program that helps children under six build a strong foundation for future success in school and in life.
- ▶ PNC Grow Up Great is an unprecedented 10-year, \$100 million investment in school readiness to help prepare children from birth to age five for success in school and life. PNC provides leadership, advocacy, resources and volunteers to assist parents, caregivers and communities in their efforts to increase the potential for young children to succeed.

ON THE LINE ...

- ▶ UC returns three starters on the offensive line, including stalwart left tackle Jeff Linkenbach, left guard Jason Kelce, and center Chris Jurek.
- ▶ The trio has combined for 55 starts.
- ▶ Sophomore Alex Hoffman (right guard) and Samuel Griffin (right tackle) have each started the first five games.

WAITING IN THE WINGS ...

- ▶ Wide receiver Vidal Hazelton, a USC transfer, will sit out the 2009 season to satisfy NCAA transfer requirements.
- ▶ He will be a senior and have one season to play in 2010.
- ▶ Hazelton played in 23 games for the Trojans, catching 57 balls for 586 yards and four touchdowns.
- ▶ He had appealed to the NCAA for immediate eligibility, but his request was denied.

STAFF NOTES ...

- ▶ Defensive coordinator Bob Diaco joined Cincinnati this winter after three years at the University of Virginia.
- ▶ He brings an energetic style to Clifton and installed UC's multiple-front defense during spring workouts.
- ▶ Diaco (pronounced DEE-ah-ko) joined the Virginia staff in Dec. 2005 as the linebackers and special teams coach. Following the close of the 2008 season, he was named the Cavaliers' defensive coordinator. He spent the 2005 season on Brian Kelly's staff at Central Michigan as the co-DC.
- ▶ Defensive backs coach Kerry Coombs was promoted to associate head coach while Mike Elston was named assistant head coach. Elston will switch over to coaching the defensive line in 2009 while continuing in his role as special teams coordinator.
- ▶ Running backs coach Tim Hinton assumed the recruiting coordinator position.

2011 SCHEDULE SHAPING UP ...

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati and University of Tennessee have agreed to a one-game football matchup to take place in Neyland Stadium on Sept. 10, 2011.
- ▶ UT and Cincinnati have met five times, all in Knoxville, with the most recent outcome a 40-0 Vols win in 1992.
- ▶ The other four meetings occurred between 1904 and 1942, and Tennessee leads the overall series 4-1.
- ▶ The Bearcats lone win in the series was the inaugural matchup in 1904, a 35-0 UC decision.
- ▶ UC will open the 2011 season at Nippert Stadium with Albany before heading to Knoxville to play the Vols. Other 2011 non-conference matchups bring Akron and NC State to Nippert with a road trip to Oxford, Ohio for the 116th Battle for the Victory Bell against Miami (OH).

FREY RECEIVES SIXTH YEAR FROM NCAA ...

- ▶ Safety Drew Frey was granted an extension of eligibility request by the NCAA for the 2012-13 academic year.
- ▶ The 20-year old redshirt freshman missed the entire 2007 season and most of the 2008 season due to injury.
- ▶ He had earned his first career start at Akron on Sept. 27, 2008 before being injured in that game.

TRACKING THE POINTS

Through a pair of games in 2009, UC has tallied 117 points, an average of 58.5 per contest. That mark ranks UC second in the country in scoring offense, behind only defending National Champion Florida (59.0 ppg).

- ▶ UC scored 70 points against Southeast Missouri State in the 2009 home opener at Nippert Stadium on Sept. 12.
- ▶ The 70-points was the third-best UC scoring out put of all time, the highest point total of the Brian Kelly era, and the first time UC has eclipsed 70 points since 1921.
- ▶ Kelly has led his squads to 60-or more points in a game 12 times through his 19-year coaching career.
- ▶ Kelly owns two of the top-10 individual game scoring totals in UC history, and the only two to occur since 1953.
- ▶ The 70 points against SEMO also marked the top UC scoring total at Nippert Stadium in the modern era.

NIPPERT STADIUM

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE ...

- ▶ The Bearcats have won eight-straight games on the Nippert Stadium turf.
- ▶ UC won all of its home games in 2008, the first time since 2000 that the Bearcats went undefeated in Nippert.
- ▶ Eight of the Top-12 crowds in Nippert history, including a stadium record of 35,098 against Pittsburgh in 2008, have occurred during the Brian Kelly era.
- ▶ With an average of 31,964 fans in six home games in 2008, UC established a single-season attendance record, topping the 2007 average of 30,246.
- ▶ During Brian Kelly's tenure as head coach, UC holds a 12-2 mark at Nippert Stadium.

STREAKING AT HOME IN NON-LEAGUE PLAY ...

- ▶ UC has won 15 straight home non-conference games at Nippert Stadium, dating back to a 30-24 win over Temple in three overtimes on Sept. 20, 2003.
- ▶ UC is 7-0 on the home turf in non-conference play since Brian Kelly took over as head coach in 2007.

SELLOUTS AT NIPPERT ...

- ▶ Highlighted by a sellout against Pittsburgh on Nov. 22, Cincinnati established a single-season attendance record of 191,788, an average of 31,965 fans, for six home games at Nippert Stadium.
- ▶ Including the 2008 campaign, Nippert Stadium has enjoyed a total of 17 sellouts in its lengthy history.
- ▶ The Louisville (Oct. 24) and West Virginia (Nov. 7) games have already been announced as sellouts.
- ▶ Nippert Stadium's 12 largest crowds are listed below.

NIPPERT STADIUM ...

- ▶ UC's home field, Nippert Stadium was built in 1902 and is the fourth-oldest playing site in the nation for college football.
- ▶ Among NCAA FBS and FCS schools, Nippert (1923) is the nation's fifth-oldest stadium still in use, preceeded by Harvard Stadium (1903), Georgia Tech's Boddy Dodd Stadium (1914), the Yale Bowl (1914), and Cornell's Schoellkopf Stadium (1915).
- ▶ Head coach Brian Kelly calls Nippert the 'Wrigley Field' of college football.

QUARTERBACK CONTINUITY ...

- ▶ Head coach Brian Kelly experienced something heading into the 2009 season that had not happened in his tenure at UC, he returned his starting quarterback.
- ▶ Tony Pike returned for his second season at the reins of the UC offense, after passing for 2,407 yards and 19 touchdowns in 12 games a year ago.
- ▶ He missed two games, and parts of two others due to injury, but the 6-6 signal caller is healthy and has added 15 pounds to his frame, giving him a coat of armor to withstand the rigors of the long season.
- ▶ Pike is already UC's career leader in completion percentage (.610), and should move into the top-10 on most of UC's career passing lists before the season is too old.

A SEASON TO REMEMBER ...

- ▶ UC, the 2008 BIG EAST Conference Champions, achieved a school-record 11 victories, while posting back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in school history.
- ▶ The Bearcats also won the school's first outright conference championship since 1964, and earned the school's first berth in a Bowl Championship Series game, playing against Virginia Tech in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl.
- ▶ Cincinnati held down a postseason ranking of No. 17 in both polls after the bowl season, tying the top postseason ranking in school history and marking the first time UC has ranked in both end-of-season polls in school history.
- ▶ UC finished the regular season on a six-game winning streak and captured all three of its rivalry trophies for the first time in the same season – the Victory Bell (Miami [OH]), Keg Of Nails (Louisville), and River City Rivalry (Pittsburgh).
- ▶ Following the close of the regular season, head coach Brian Kelly was named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the second-straight season. He also earned American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Region 1 Coach of the Year honors, and was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year by *Sporting News*.

A LOOK AHEAD ...

- ▶ Eight offensive starters return in 2009, including all-America kick returner and wide receiver Mardy Gilyard, and all-BIG EAST quarterback Tony Pike.
- ▶ Pike, one of the best success stories in all of college football a year ago, was named second-team all-BIG EAST after completing 61 percent of his passes for 2,407 yards and 19 touchdowns in 10 starts.
- ▶ Safety Aaron Webster is the lone returning starter on the defensive side of the ball. Webster had 60 tackles and an interception a year ago.

GILYARD BACK FOR MORE ...

- ▶ All-America kick returner and wide receiver Mardy Gilyard, the 2008 BIG EAST Special Teams Player of the Year, made 81 catches for a school-record 1,276 yards and a team-high 11 touchdowns. He also set a school record with 994 kickoff return yards along with a pair of touchdowns.
- ▶ In the 2009 FedEx Orange Bowl, Gilyard had seven catches for a school-bowl record 158 yards and a touchdown.

A WORD ON THE DEFENSE ...

- ▶ The UC defense lost 10 starters from a year ago, seven of whom competed for roster spots in NFL camps.
- ▶ While Aaron Webster is the only true returning starter on defense, the cupboard is not bare.
- ▶ The Bearcats started seven seniors on the defensive side of the ball on Sept. 7 in Piscataway, more defensive seniors than three league teams, Connecticut, Pittsburgh, and West Virginia, fielded.
- ▶ Entering 2008, six of UC's starting defenders were full-time players the previous season.

DEPTH AT THE SKILL SLOTS ...

- ▶ One of the offensive strengths of the 2009 team is the squad's depth at the offensive skill slots.
- ▶ The Bearcats return their top-four runners from a year ago
- ▶ in Jacob Ramsey (47.4 ypg), John Goebel (43.4 ypg), Isaiah Peard (27.7 ypg), and Scott Johnson (7.9 ypg).
- ▶ Of the 16 players who caught passes for UC a year ago, 14 return, including nine of the Top-10 receivers from 2008.

UC EARNS AFCA RECOGNITION ...

- ▶ UC received 2008 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement honorable mention accolades for its recent graduation success rate of over 90 percent for the entering class of 2001.
- ▶ UC was one of seven programs nationally, including Colorado, Duke, Navy, Notre Dame, Rutgers, and Vanderbilt to achieve over the 90 percent plateau.

RECORD-SETTING NFL DRAFT FOR UC ...

- ▶ UC had its best-ever showing in the recent NFL Draft when six former players, Connor Barwin (second-Texans), Kevin Huber (fifth-Bengals), DeAngelo Smith (fifth-Cowboys), Brandon Underwood (sixth-Packers), Mike Mickens (seventh-Cowboys), and Trevor Canfield (seventh-Cardinals) were selected.
- ▶ UC's six overall draft choices was the most in school history, bettering the previous mark of five, which had occurred three times, in 1998, 1960, and 1947.
- ▶ The six selections were the most of any BIG EAST school, and the Bearcats were one of nine institutions in the nation with six or more players drafted.

HEAD COACH BRIAN KELLY

19th season overall | third at Cincinnati

Named the University of Cincinnati's head football coach on Dec. 4, 2006, Brian Kelly has set the bar high at UC and achieved a great deal of success in a short period of time.

Entering his third year at the helm of the UC program, Kelly boasts a 23-6 record and led the Bearcats to their first BIG EAST Conference Championship in 2008.

Cincinnati achieved a school-record 11 victories in 2008, had back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in school history, won the school's first outright conference championship since 1964, and earned the school's first berth in a Bowl Championship Series game, playing against Virginia Tech in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl.

UC earned its best-ever ranking to close the regular season as it was ranked at No. 12 in the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches polls, and the BCS standings entering the Orange Bowl. The Bearcats held down a postseason ranking of No. 17 in both polls, tying the top postseason ranking in school history.

UC finished the regular season on a six-game winning streak and captured all three of its rivalry trophies, the Victory Bell (Miami [OH]), Keg Of Nails (Louisville), and River City Rivalry (Pittsburgh) in the same season for the first time.

Kelly was named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the second-straight season, and also was named the *American Football Monthly* Schutt Sports Football Bowl Subdivision Coach of the Year. He also earned American Football Coaches

Association (AFCA) Region 1 Coach of the Year honors, and was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year by *Sporting News*.

UC placed 10 student-athletes on all-BIG EAST teams, including first-team selection defensive end Connor Barwin, who was a tight end entering spring practice in 2008.

Kick returner Mardy Gilyard was named the BIG EAST Special Teams Player of the Year, the second-straight season a UC player has earned that award, and punter Kevin Huber earned the first AFCA All-America nod in program history. Huber was also the first two-time Associated Press First-Team All-America selection in UC football history.

Through an 18-year head coaching career, Kelly has established a reputation for building winning teams. He has won at every stop along the way, earning a pair of Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State (2002, 2003), winning a Mid-American Conference Championship at Central Michigan in 2006, before leading UC to its first BIG EAST title in 2008. Entering 2009, Kelly boasts a career record of 160-57-2. He is the winningest active BIG EAST coach and the only league coach with more than 150 wins.

Kelly has become one of the most recognizable faces in the Cincinnati area as he has undertaken a grass roots effort to reach the UC fan base and create strong ties to the local community. A sought after public speaker, Kelly has addressed a number of local organizations, unions, civic groups, and has served as the keynote speaker at many high-profile events, including the 2009 Big 33 Football Classic Awards Dinner.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (AP) - Tony Pike threw for a career-high 362 yards and three touchdowns, and Cincinnati used its high-speed, no-huddle offense to hurry past Rutgers 47-15 on Monday.

The defending Big East champion Bearcats got a jump on the conference race by improving to 4-0 against Rutgers since joining the league.

Looking to christen its newly expanded stadium and extend a seven-game winning streak, the Scarlet Knights couldn't keep up with Pike, Mardy Gilyard and the Bearcats. Instead, it looked like the bad ol' days at Rutgers.

Coach Brian Kelly began his third season with the Bearcats as a rising star in the business.

With the luxury of a returning starter at quarterback for the first time at UC, Kelly unleashed his fast-paced, Oklahoma-style offense.

Pike completed 27 of 34 passes, Gilyard caught eight passes for 89 yards and a score and Isaiah Pead scored two touchdowns.

With Pike directing traffic at the line of scrimmage, the Bearcats burned down the field on the opening drive of the game, covering 81 yards in 2:29 without an incomplete pass. Pead capped the drive with a 2-yard TD run.

Rutgers' response to UC's speed was a methodical, 20-play, 78-yard touchdown drive, that took more than 10 minutes and was capped by a 5-yard run by Joe Martinek.

Pike went 20 of 25 in the first half for 286 yards with touchdown passes of 5 yards to Gilyard and 41 yards to Pead as the Bearcats raced to a 31-7 halftime lead.

Cincinnati even gave Rutgers a dose of the Bearcat Formation-- with redshirt freshman tight end Travis Kelce, a former quarterback, taking two snaps and bulling 16 yards to finish off the first of three consecutive second-quarter touchdown drives. They were the first two touches of Kelce's career. He added a 2-yard TD run in the third quarter.

CINCINNATI (AP) - Mardy Gilyard scored four touchdowns as part of the third-best scoring performance in Cincinnati's history, reaching the end zone on an electrifying punt return, a run and two catches during the 23rd-ranked Bearcats' 70-3 victory over Southeast Missouri State.

A quick-strike offense scored every which way during a 49-point first half, the biggest in coach Brian Kelly's three seasons at Cincinnati (2-0). Gilyard was the catalyst, putting together one of the top individual performances in school history.

Gilyard, the Big East's top returner last season, took back the game's first punt 53 yards for a score. It was the Bearcats' first punt return for a touchdown in 12 years. He also had his first career rushing touchdown against the Redhawks (1-1), out of the Bearcat formation, and caught two touchdown passes from different quarterbacks.

The senior became the first Bowl Subdivision player to score on a punt return, run and catch in the same game since UCLA's Maurice Jones-Drew did it on Oct. 8, 2005 against California, according to STATS, LLC.

The 70 points were the third-most in Cincinnati history and the most since a 115-0 win over Kentucky Wesleyan 1921.

Tony Pike threw three touchdown passes and ran 1 yard for another during the first half. He headed to the bench for the final drive of the half, which ended when Gilyard took a short pass from Zach Collaros and dashed 37 yards down the middle of the field for a touchdown.

Redshirt freshman Darrin Williams returned the second-half kickoff 100 yards. Cincinnati used five quarterbacks in all.

Pike was 17 of 23 for 229 yards in less than a full half.

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP) - Tony Pike threw for 332 yards and hit Mardy Gilyard with an 18-yard scoring pass in the fourth quarter as No. 17 Cincinnati stopped a second-half Oregon State comeback bid for a 28-18 victory on Saturday.

The Bearcats (3-0) snapped Oregon State's streak of 26 straight nonconference victories at Reser Stadium, dating back to a 67-28 win over Northern Illinois on Nov. 16, 1996.

Pike completed 31 of 49 passes and two touchdowns and Gilyard had nine catches for 65 yards. D.J. Woods had a career-high seven catches for 117 yards and his first career score.

Sean Canfield completed 29 of 45 passes for 240 yards and an interception for the Beavers (2-1). Jacquizz Rodgers' 9-yard scoring run to open the second half was Oregon State's lone touchdown.

Cincinnati built up a 21-8 halftime lead but didn't score again until Gilyard's TD catch.

Oregon State's Rodgers appeared bothered by a sore ankle that lingered from last weekend's 23-21 victory over UNLV last weekend. Quizz and big brother James Rodgers, a flanker, had scored six of Oregon State's seven touchdowns through two games this season, and accounted for 597 yards in total offense.

While propelled by its offense, Cincinnati's defense passed its first major test.

The Bearcats went ahead 7-6 on Pike's 7-yard run, but Oregon State responded with a safety and regained the lead.

Cincinnati went ahead 21-8 before the half on Isaiah Pead's 1-yard scoring run and Pike's 45-yard touchdown pass to DJ Woods.

Rodgers' scoring run opened the second half and Kahut's 23-yard field goal to open the fourth quarter narrowed it further for Oregon State.

CINCINNATI (AP) - Tony Pike was on the field just long enough to save No. 14 Cincinnati.

Pike threw three touchdown passes in a quick-strike offense that was hardly on the field Saturday, and the Bearcats held on for a 28-20 victory over a Fresno State team that ran all over them for most of the game. One big gamble made the Bulldogs (1-3) come up empty.

Facing fourth-and-2 at the Cincinnati 6-yard line to open the fourth quarter, Fresno State chose to throw. Ryan Colburn's pass was picked off by Craig Carey, and Pike put the Bearcats (4-0) in control with a 23-yard touchdown pass to Mardy Gilyard six plays later.

Gilyard also caught an 11-yard touchdown pass in another career day. The senior receiver and returner had nine catches for a career-best 177 yards, giving him eight TDs in four games.

The Bulldogs' strategy was to keep one of the nation's top offenses off the field. It nearly succeeded. Cincinnati came in averaging 48 points per game, fourth-best nationally, but was on the field for only 16:18. With Ryan Mathews grinding out the yards, the Bulldogs held the ball for 43:42. That fourth-down play made it not quite good enough.

Mathews carried a career-high 38 times for 145 yards, topping the 100-yard mark for the fourth straight game.

Cincinnati's offense had the ball for only one minute in the third quarter - a three-and-out drive that put the whole burden on the defense. Linebacker Craig Carey's first career interception on Fresno State's pivotal fourth-down pass helped the Bearcats improve to 25-0 under coach Brian Kelly when they open the fourth quarter with a lead.

The Bearcats' no-huddle offense needed only 2:12, 1:43, 2:53 and 1:45 to zip down the field for its touchdowns, giving the defense little rest.

Colburn's fourth-down pass from the Cincinnati 37 was broken up by safety Aaron Webster with 39 seconds left, clinching it.

OXFORD, Ohio (AP) - With its state-of-the-art passing attack stymied, No. 10 Cincinnati showed it can win the old-fashioned way, too.

Jacob Ramsey ran for 103 yards and three touchdowns in Cincinnati's pass-oriented offense Saturday, and the Bearcats broke open a close game in the fourth quarter for a 37-13 victory over Miami (Ohio) that showed a little grit to go with the glitz.

The oldest rivalry west of the Allegheny Mountains has been a mismatch since Kelly showed up at Cincinnati and turned the Bearcats (5-0) into Big East champs. They won their fourth straight over Miami (0-5), retaining the Victory Bell in blustery conditions in front of Yager Stadium's biggest crowd in six years.

They did it in an uncharacteristic way.

Tony Pike had a so-so game, going 23 of 42 for 270 yards with two touchdowns and an interception in the wind. The senior came in with 70.5 percent completion percentage, but repeatedly forced throws into a defense that double-teamed his top receivers and fell back to take away the long pass.

The Bearcats put the game in Ramsey's hands. He became the first Bearcat to run for 100 yards since the opening game of the 2007 season, and the 15th in school history to score three touchdowns in a game. His 2-yard run with 11:35 remaining gave the Bearcats a 30-13 lead.

The first top 10 team to play at Yager Stadium made the game-turning play. Dysert lost his footing as he threw into the crowded end zone, allowing JK Schaffer to intercept the errant throw.
