QUICK HITS

- This is just the second time Alabama A&M and Cincinnati have met on the football field. The first game in this brief series occurred on Sept. 5, 2015 with Cincinnati topping Alabama A&M 52-10 in the season opener.
- During the past six years, Alabama A&M has made a habit of scheduling at least one FBS program each season. Alabama A&M has played games against Auburn, Vanderbilt, Georgia Tech, Cincinnati, UAB, Coastal Carolina and South Alabama during that stretch. The Bulldogs still are searching for the program's first win against an FBS opponent.
- Alabama A&M is entering a four-week stretch where the Bulldogs will be playing away from Louis Crews Stadium, with games at Cincinnati, Jackson State and Texas Southern. The Sept. 22 contest against Southern technically is a home game, but the Bulldogs are hosting the Jaguars at Ladd Peebles Stadium in Mobile, Ala.
- Through the first two games, Alabama A&M's defensive front seven have consistently been able to pressure opposing quarterbacks. The Bulldogs are averaging three sacks and 4.5 quarterback hurries per game.
- The game at Cincinnati will be a bit of a homecoming for Alabama A&M corner-back Mike Mills. The senior is from Dayton, Ohio, which is about 55 miles north of Cincinnati. Mills is the only Alabama A&M player from Ohio, and this is the second time during his Alabama A&M career that he's played in his home state. Mills was a team captain in the Bulldogs' opener against Miles College.

THE COACHES

Alabama A&M Coach Connell Maynor

Connell Maynor is in his first season at the helm of the Alabama A&M football program, and the veteran coach has brought lots of football knowledge and excitement to the job.

Alabama A&M is the third head coaching position in Maynor's career. In eight seasons, Maynor has amassed a 66-32 overall record and coached in a national title game.

Maynor comes to Alabama A&M after spending the previous four seasons at Hampton, where he posted a 20-25 overall record and a 17-15 mark in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Last season, Maynor led Hampton to a 6-5 record, finishing 5-3 in the MEAC.

Before making the move to Hampton, Maynor built a Division II football power at Winston-Salem State.

In four seasons at Winston-Salem State, Maynor amassed an impressive 45-6 overall record, and his Rams were nearly perfect in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association with a 26-2 mark.

During his tenure at Winston-Salem State, Maynor consistently led the Rams deep into the Division II postseason, including an appearance in the 2012 national championship game.

Cincinnati Coach Luke Fickell

Luke Fickell took over as Cincinnati's 42nd football coach before the start of the 2017 season.

Prior to becoming Cincinnati's football coach, Fickell, an Ohio native, spent 18 years working as an assistant football coach at FBS programs. During that tenure, Fickell was part of two national titles at Ohio State and helped 12 players get selected in the NFL Draft.

Before taking his current position at Cincinnati, Fickell spent 15 seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State. From 2012-16, Fickell served as Ohio State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, working under coach Urban Meyer. During that stint, the Buckeyes advanced to the College Football Playoff twice and won the 2014 national championship.

While working as an assistant at Ohio State, Fickell coached in four national championship games. Along with the 2014 team, Fickell was part of the Buckeyes' 2002 BCS National Championship. He also coached on the Ohio State teams that played in the 2006 and 2007 BCS national title games.

Fickell got his coaching start as a graduate assistant at Ohio State in 1999. He also spent two seasons (2000-01) as the defensive line coach at Akron.

ALABAMA A&M PLAYERS

Bentley on Deacon Jones Watch List

Junior running back Jordan Bentley was named to the Deacon Jones Trophy watchlist during the preseason. The Deacon Jones Trophy is awarded by the Black College Hall of Fame to its player of the year. As a freshman in 2016, Bentley was the SWAC Freshman of the Year recipient. The Guntersville, Ala. native missed several games as a sophomore last season, but still managed to lead Alabama A&M with 480 rushing yards.

Moland a Preseason All-American

Senior defensive tackle Vernon Moland was a first-team selection to the HBCU Game Day Preseason All-America team. As a junior last season, the 6-foot and 235-pound defensive end was one of the SWAC's top pass rushers, recording 10 sacks, 11.5 tackles for loss and forcing one fumble. Moland, an Adamsville, Ala. native, finished last season as a first-team All-SWAC selection.

Three Bulldogs named to Preseason All-SWAC Team

Moland was a first-team selection on the SWAC's Preseason all-conference defense, while senior safety Dyland Hamilton, a Powder Springs, Ga. native, was a second-team selection. Bentley was a second-team selection to the preseason all-conference offense.

Bethune gaining attention

Senior outside linebacker Yurik Bethune as opened the 2018 season strong. The Mobile, Ala. native was selected as The SWAC Defensive Player of the Week following the Bulldogs' season-opener against Miles, recording six tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. He also had three quarterback pressures. Bethune followed with a four-tackle performance against North Alabama.

Depth in the backfield

Running back is a position where Alabama A&M is not short on depth. The Bulldogs return last season's two leading rushers in Jordan Bentley and Trevon Walters, and freshman Gary Quarles also has played his way into the rotation. While sharing carries, the trio are averaging more than 120 yards per game.

Glass growing into quarterback role

In his second season as Alabama A&M's quarterback, sophomore Aqeel Glass is emerging as an on-the-field leader in that role. Through two games, Glass is averaging 200.5 passing yards per game while throwing four touchdowns. He also is spreading the ball around, completing passes to 11 different receivers while throwing just two interceptions.





GAME NOTES

Bulldogs show solid pass defense

Through the first two games, Alabama A&M's defense has not given up many big plays, especially in the passing games. Opponents are averaging just 93.8 passing yards per game against Alabama A&M, with the Bulldogs also intercepting one pass. Opposing teams have averaged 122.2 rushing yards per game.

Maynor era has balanced, effective offense

The area where Alabama A&M has shown drastic improvement since the arrival of coach Connell Maynor is on offense. Through two games, Alabama A&M has consistently moved the ball while showing a balanced offensive attack. AAMU is averaging 378 yards per game with 159 per game on the ground.

Eleventh time AAMU has played an FBS foe

During the past six years, Alabama A&M has followed the trend of FCS programs across the country by scheduling at least one FBS opponent each season. Alabama A&M has an 0-10 record against FBS opponents.

AAMU becoming road warriors

This week's game marks the beginning of a four-week stretch where Alabama A&M will be playing away from its home field at Louis Crews Stadium. During the next four weeks, Alabama A&M has games at Cincinnati, Jackson State and Texas Southern. While the Sept. 22 contest against Southern technically is a home game, the Bulldogs are hosting the Jaguars at Ladd Peebles Stadium in Mobile, Ala, which is about a seven-hour drive from Huntsville.

Two Bearcats with Alabama ties

Cincinnati has a pair of players with Alabama connections. Senior quarterback Hayden Moore graduated from Clay-Chalkville High School in suburban Birmingham, and freshman offensive lineman Jakari Robinson played at Munford High School, which is located in Talladega.

Former teammates now foes

Cincinnati quarterback Hayden Moore will be familiar with two of the players on the opposing defense. Before signing with Cincinnati in Feb. 2014, Moore starred at Clay-Chalkville High School in suburban Birmingham. Two of Moore's teammates at Clay-Chalkville were twins Armoni and Amari Holloway, who now members of the Alabama A&M defense. Armoni Hollloway starts at linebacker, and Amari plays cornerback. When Moore was a high school senior in 2013, and the Holloway twins were sophomores, the trio helped Clay-Chalkville reach the second round of the Alabama High School Athletic Association's Class 6A playoffs. As high school juniors in 2014, the Holloway twins were part of Clay-Chalkville's Class 6A state championship team.

One Bulldog with Ohio ties

The game at Cincinnati's Nippert Stadium will be a bit of a homecoming for Alabama A&M cornerback Michael Mills. The senior is from Dayton, Ohio, which is about 55 miles north of Cincinnati. Mills, who is a graduate of Thurgood Marshall High School, joined Alabama A&M's football program in 2015 as a walk-on, but earned a scholarship by his junior season. Mills was a team captain for Alabama A&M's season-opener against Miles College, and the starting cornerback also is a member of the football program's leadership council.

Defense has posted five shutout quarters

Heading into the season, Alabama A&M's coaching staff believed the team's defense should be a strength. So far, the unit has lived up to the billing, posting shutouts in five of eight quarters. Alabama A&M held Miles College to 115 total yards in a 37-0 shutout in the season-opener, and the Bulldogs held a potent North Alabama offense scoreless in the third quarter of a 25-20 loss.





GAME NOTES

Bulldogs getting pressure on quarterbacks

Alabama A&M's pass defense has been strong this season, holding opponents to just 93.8 passing yards per game. A significant reason for this can be attributed to the Bulldogs' defensive front seven, which has consistently applied pressure to opposing quarterbacks. Alabama A&M has recorded six sacks and nine quarterback hurries. Linebacker Armoni Holloway leads the Bulldogs with two sacks, while defensive end Yurik Bethune has recorded 1.5 sacks.

Cincinnati defense has been strong

Throughout his career, Cincinnati coach Luke Fickell has been viewed as one of the sport's bright defensive minds. His current Cincinnati team reflects that reputation. After opening the season with wins against UCLA and rival Miami-Ohio, Cincinnati ranks 13th in the Division I FBS in total defense, holding opponents to 252 yards per game.

Bearcats bring shutout streak into game

Following a 21-0 shutout last week against Miami-Ohio, Cincinnati now have a shutout streak of five consecutive quarters. The last time Cincinnati allowed an opponent to score was in the third quarter of the season-opener against UCLA. This season, Cincinnati has posted a shutout in six quarters (two against UCLA and four against Miami-Ohio).

Bulldogs have gotten off to fast starts

A positive trend for Alabama A&M this season has been fast starts to games. In both games, against Miles College and North Alabama, the Bulldogs scored touchdowns in both the first and second quarters. Alabama A&M led Miles 24-0 at halftime, and trailed North Alabama 18-17.

Keeping the chains moving

The new offensive scheme brought to Alabama A&M by first-year coach Connell Maynor and offensive coordinator Duane Taylor has been an early success. The Bulldogs have consistently moved the chains offensively, recording 40 first downs through the first two games. Alabama A&M also has been extremely effective in third-down situations, converting 46.7 attempts (14 of 30). Alabama A&M only has punted eight times.

Winning time-of-possession

Alabama A&M has won time-of-possession in both games it has played, averaging 30:33 on the season. Alabama A&M's opponents are averaging 29:27 per game.

Effective in the red zone

Not only has Alabama A&M's offense consistently moved the football, but the Bulldogs also have effective when driving into the red zone. In eight red zone trips this season, Alabama A&M has came away with points eight times. Five of those eight red zone trips have resulted in touchdowns.

Running backs sharing the load

Depth at running back has been a strength for Alabama A&M's offense. The Bulldogs are averaging 159 yards on the ground, but it is not just one player accounting for the bulk of the yards. Trevon Walters and Jordan Bentley have gotten the bulk of the work, and the two juniors have split carries almost evenly. Bentley leads Alabama A&M with 107 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries, while Walters has rushed for 84 yards on 16 carries. Freshman Gary Quarles also has been a significant part of the running back rotation, rushing for 56 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries.

AAMU ranked ninth in total defense

Heading into the third week of the season, Alabama A&M is ranked ninth in the FCS in total defense. The Bulldogs have held opponents to 215 total yards per game. Alabama A&M also ranked third in the FCS in passing yards allowed at 93 yards per game, and the Bulldogs are ranked 32nd in rushing defense at 125.5 yards per game.

Newcomers shining in debut

A prominent storyline for Connell Maynor's first Alabama A&M team is the fast emergence of several young players. Numerous freshmen have played significant roles. Freshman receiver Brian Jenkins Jr. is second on the team in with 72 receiving yards, while freshman running back Gary Quarles is third on the team with 56 rushing yards and a touchdown. Jenkins also has emerged as the Bulldogs' return specialist.
