## OPENING KICKOFF

- The Ohio football team (1-1) looks to get back in the win column this Saturday (Sept. 22) when it visits in-state foe Cincinnati (3-0). Kickoff is scheduled for noon EST at Nippert Stadium.
- Saturday's contest will be broadcast live on ESPN, with Mike Corey and Rene Ingoglia on the call. The game can also be heard on the Ohio IMG Sports Network. Russ Eisenstein returns for his 11th season as the "Voice of the Bobcats." Ohio alum Rob Cornelius, who has been a part of the broadcasts for close to two decades, is back in the booth. The 12-station network has an over-the-air coverage area that hits three states. In addition, the broadcasts are available online through OhioBobcats.com and TuneIn.com/OhioBobcats.com. They are also free on the TuneIn app.
- Ohio is coming off of a 45-31 loss to Virginia last Saturday (Sept. 15) at Vanderbilt Stadium in Nashville, Tenn. The Bobcats battled back from a 35-7 second-quarter deficit to make it a 10-point game with just over nine minutes to play in the third quarter but could not quite complete the comeback. Virginia piled up 552 yards of total offense.
- The Bobcats opened the 2018 season with a 38-32 victory over Howard on Sept. 1 at Peden Stadium.
- Ohio is coming off of a 2017 campaign in which it went 9-4 overall and finished second in the Mid-American Conference East Division with a 5-3 mark in league play.
- The 2017 season saw Ohio earn bowl eligibility for the ninth-straight season and make its eighth bowl appearance during that span. The Bobcats ended the year on a high note, rolling to a 41-6 triumph over UAB in the Bahamas Bowl.
- **Frank Solich** is back on the Ohio sidelines as head coach for a 14th season. The Bobcats have gone 98-71 (.580) during Solich's tenure -- including 64-40 (.615) in MAC play. Two more victories will put Solich in the company of Don Peden (1924-46; 121 wins) and Bill Hess (1958-77; 108) as the only coaches in the history of the program to lead the Bobcats to at least 100 victories. Solich has guided Ohio to four MAC East Division titles (2006, '09, '11, '16) and three bowl victories in nine appearances.
- Ohio was tabbed MAC favorite in the league's preseason media poll, which was announced in late July. The Bobcats were picked first in the East Division with a league-best 140 total points. Ohio was also selected to win the 2018 Marathon MAC Football

### HURRICANE FLORENCE FORCES GAME RELOCATION

Last Saturday's game between the Bobcats and Cavaliers was originally scheduled to be played at Virginia's Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va. The venue change was made due to the threat of severe weather in the Charlottesville area associated with Hurricane Florence and to provide emergency personnel with the ability to focus on the needs of the region's citizens throughout the weekend.

### PAPI PRODUCES

Redshirt senior wide receiver **Papi White** (Seminole, Okla.) posted his third-straight game with at least 100 yards receiving, hauling in six catches for a team-high 131 yards and a touchdown in the loss to Virginia. The last Bobcat receiver to post three-straight games with over 100 receiving yards was Donte' Foster in 2013.

White enjoyed a career day in the win over Howard, racking up a career-high 154 receiving yards on a career-high eight receptions and hauling in a touchdown. He became the first Bobcat wide receiver to register 150-plus receiving yards since Sebastian Smith achieved the feat on Sept. 17, 2016 against then-No. 15-ranked Tennessee.

Through three weeks of the 2018 season, White ranks third in the NCAA with 142.5 receiving yards per game and ranks 17th in receptions per game with 7.0

### LIFTING THE LID

With its victory over Howard, Ohio is now 9-5 (.643) in season openers in the Solich era. The Bobcats picked up their second-straight victory in a season opener and fourth in the last five seasons. Ohio is now 11-3 (.786) all-time in season openers under Solich -- including seven victories in their last eight tries.

### AIR CANADA (WITH GROUND SUPPORT)

Quarterback **Nathan Rourke** (Oakville, Ontario, Canada) burst onto the scene for Ohio in 2017, earning All-MAC Second Team honors for his efforts. He etched his name in the program's top-10 for passing yards (2,203; ninth), completions (161; tied-10th), touchdown passes (17; seventh) and passing efficiency (132.9; ninth) in a single season. He threw for the most yards by an Ohio sophomore signal caller since Tyler Tettleton passed for 3,302 yards in 2011.

Rourke proved problematic for opposing defenses not only because of his arm but because of his legs as well. He set the program record for rushing touchdowns in a single season with 21, which tied him for third-most in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision in 2017 with Washington running back Myles Gaskin and ranked as the most by a quarterback in the country last season. His 6.66 yards per carry a year ago rank as the fourth-highest in a single season in program history and ranked as the 11th-highest average in the country, finishing just behind former Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson (6.90) of Louisville. Rourke tallied five 100-yard games last season, tying him for the 10th-most in a single season in program history.

In all, Rourke accounted for 3,115 total yards of offense (sixth-most in a single season in program history), averaging 7.26 yards per play (second-most in a single season in program history) and 239.6 yards per game (fourth-most in a single season in program history). He set Ohio's single-season scoring record with 132 points (tied for sixth-most in the nation in 2017), 22 touchdowns scored (fifth-most in the nation in 2017) and 39 touchdowns responsible for. His 234 points responsible for tied him for ninth-most in the country last year.

Rourke entered his junior season with his name appearing on the Manning, Maxwell and O'Brien award watch lists.

### BOUNCING BACK

After a tough outing against Howard, junior quarterback **Nathan Rourke** (Oakville, Ontario, Canada) bounced back with a strong performance against Virginia. He finished 16-of-31 for 246 yards and two touchdown passes and added a team-high 72 rushing yards in the loss to the Cavaliers.

### IRON(S) MAN

Redshirt senior running back **Maleek Irons** (Chilliwack, British Columbia, Canada) scored a pair of one-yard touchdown runs in Ohio's loss to Virginia. Irons scored his first touchdown since Nov. 3, 2016 against Buffalo with his one-yard touchdown run in the first quarter. With his two rushing touchdowns, he recorded his second career multi-touchdown game and first since Oct. 8, 2016 against Bowling Green.

Through two games in 2018, Irons leads Ohio with 95 rushing yards.

Perhaps some of the credit for the takeaways can be attributed to the Ohio defense's new sideline prop: The Turnover Belt, which is a WWE-replica championship belt that is awarded to individuals who force the opposition to turn the ball over.

Redshirt defensive lineman **Chukwudi Chukwu** (Willingboro, N.J.) produced a strip sack of Virginia junior quarterback Bryce Perkins in the second quarter of Ohio's loss to the Cavaliers. The fumble was recovered by junior linebacker Eric Popp (Loveland, Ohio) at the Virginia 29 yard line.

The Bobcats forced four turnovers in the season-opening victory over Howard. On the first play from scrimmage of the new season, redshirt senior safety **Kylan Nelson** (Lexington, Ky.) came up with the first big play of the year for the Ohio defense, forcing a fumble that redshirt senior cornerback **Jalen Fox** (Cincinnati, Ohio) recovered. In the second quarter, redshirt sophomore safety **Jarren Hampton** (Fostoria, Ohio) forced a fumble that sophomore cornerback **Marlin Brooks** (Miami, Fla.) recovered. Senior linebacker **Evan Crouch** (Youngstown, Ohio) recorded his first career interception on Howard's first drive of the second half. Finally, with 18 seconds remaining in the contest, redshirt sophomore cornerback **Ilyas Motley** (Centerville, Ohio) came up with his first career interception to seal the victory for Ohio.

### FANTASTIC FARKAS

Redshirt junior kicker/punter **Michael Farkas** (Mishawaka, Ind.) enjoyed another strong game in last Saturday's loss to Virginia. He recorded six punts for 282 yards. His longest punt of the day went for 59 yards in the first quarter, and he also produced a 52-yard punt in the first quarter and a 57-yard punt in the fourth quarter, helping him average 47 yards per punt. Three of his six punts ended up inside Virginia's 20 yard line. Farkas also kicked off four times, with all four going for touchbacks for a 65-yard average. He successfully executed an onside kick in the second quarter that was recovered by junior linebacker **Eric Popp** (Loveland, Ohio).

In the season-opening victory over Howard, Farkas set career highs with eight punts and 368 punting yards in the win. He currently ranks sixth in the NCAA with 46.4 yards per punt this season.

Farkas currently ranks seventh in program history in career punting yards with 5,911.

### AVOIDING PENALTIES

Through three weeks of the 2018 season, Ohio is one of the most disciplined teams in the country in terms of penalties. The Bobcats rank eighth in the country in fewest penalties (10) and seventh in fewest penalty yards (85).

### MAXWELL TAKES ADVANTAGE OF OPPORTUNITY

Redshirt junior quarterback **Quinton Maxwell** (Rayville, Mo.), who came on in relief of junior starting quarterback **Nathan Rourke** (Oakville, Ontario, Canada) in the second quarter, threw for two scores and ran for two more to spark Ohio's win over Howard. He finished 17-of-25 with 233 yards passing. Maxwell matched his career highs for completions (17) and passing touchdowns (2) and set a new career high by running for two scores. His four total touchdowns marked a career high.

### KNOCKING ON HEAVEN'S DOOR

Redshirt junior wide receiver/kick returner **DL Knock** (Springboro, Ohio) helped swing the momentum of the contest against Howard in favor of the Bobcats when took the second-half kickoff back 100 yards for a touchdown to tie a school record. Ohio was trailing Howard, 22-17, at halftime, but Knock's return sparked a stretch in which it scored two touchdowns in 1:37 to flip the script.

Knock became the first Ohio player to bring a kick back 100 yards since Daz' Patterson went 100 yards to the house against Buffalo on Oct. 6, 2012. It marked the first time Ohio returned a kickoff for a touchdown since Nov. 25, 2014 at Miami when **Kylan Nelson** (Lexington, Ky.) brought one back 84 yards. Knock finished the game with three kickoff returns for 125 yards.

Knock was named the MAC East Division Week One Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 3. He became the first Bobcat to be named MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week since kicker Louie Zervos (Tarpon Springs, Fla.) earned honors in Week 11 of the 2017 season.

### A COACHING LEGEND

Entering his 20th season as the man in charge on the sidelines overall and 14th at Ohio, Solich has already cemented his legacy as legendary head coach. Among his achievements:

• Ranks third in MAC history in wins behind Herb Deromedi (110, Central Michigan, 1978-93) and Bill Hess (108, Ohio, 1958-77).

- Is tied for second in MAC history in conference-only wins with Hess, with both trailing Deromedi (90 wins).
- Is tied with Oklahoma State's Mike Gundy as the third-longest tenured head coach in NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision behind Iowa's Kirk Ferentz (20th season) and TCU's Gary Patterson (19th).
- Has coached four All-America honorees at Ohio.
- The program has tallied 94 All-MAC selections during his tenure.
- Nine players have been selected in the NFL Draft under his watch.

### CONSISTENCY IS KEY

Ohio is the only program in NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision to have the same head coach, offensive coordinator and defensive coordinator for the last 14 years as **Tim Albin** (Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator/Running Backs) and **Jimmy Burrow** (Associate Head Coach/Defensive Coordinator/Safeties) both return to Solich's staff in 2018.

Longevity is a theme on the Solich staff. **Dwayne Dixon** (12th year; Wide Receivers) and **Brian Haines** (11th year; Special Teams/Tight Ends/Recruiting Coordinator) have both coached under Solich for over a decade. Three other assistants have been with Solich for at least five years -- **Ron Collins** (Eighth year; Co-Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers), **Scott Isphording** (Sixth year; Quarterbacks) and **Chris Rodgers** (Sixth year; Assistant AD for Football Operations). **Pete Germano** (Defensive Line), **De'Angelo Smith** (Defensive Backs) and **Ryan Bainbridge** (Director of Player Personnel and High School Relations) are all beginning their second seasons, though this is Germano's second stint at Ohio; he spent 11 seasons on the Bobcats' staff before serving as the defensive line coach at Fresno State for five seasons.

New to the Solich coaching staff in 2018 are **Bart Miller** (Offensive Line) and **Tremayne Scott** (Defensive Tackles). Miller comes to Athens after serving as tight ends coach at Air Force last season. He has coached the offensive lines at Minnesota, Florida Atlantic, New Mexico State and Wisconsin. Scott is a familiar face to followers of the Bobcats. At 2012 graduate of Ohio, he played in 35 games on the defensive line for the Bobcats, registering 71.5 tackles, 7.5 sacks, six forced fumbles and one interception. He earned All-MAC Second Team recognition after his junior season. He was also named Defensive Player of the Game following Ohio's 45-14 victory over Louisiana-Monroe in the 2012 Advocare V100 Independence Bowl. Scott spent the last two years coaching at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wis.

### PUTTING UP THE POINTS

Ohio set new single-season standards for points scored (508) and highest scoring average (39.1), average yards per carry (5.7) and rushing touchdowns (44). Ohio ranked 34th in the country in total offense (433.1 yards per game) -- including 16th in rushing offense (244.5 yards per game) -- and ninth in scoring.

### SEEING RED

Not surprisingly, the Bobcats boasted one of the most opportunistic red zone offenses in the nation a year ago, scoring on 91.9 percent (57-of-62) of their trips inside the opponents' 20-yard line to rank 12th in the country. Ohio scored a staggering 35 red zone rushing touchdowns, which was good for third in the country.

Ohio scored on all five of its trips to the red zone in the season-opening win over Howard.

### POUND THE ROCK

Ohio's ground game was crucial to its offensive success in 2017. The Bobcats ranked 16th in the country in rushing offense (244.5 yards per game). In total, Ohio compiled 3,179 rushing yards to rank 15th in the country -- the fifth-most rushing yards in a single season in program history. The Bobcats' 5.74 average yards per carry ranked as the most in program history and ninth-most in the country while their 44 rushing touchdowns set a new program standard and ranked fourth in the nation.

The Bobcats ran for at least 200 yards seven times a year ago -- including three performances of over 300 yards. The high mark came in a 38-10 thumping of eventual MAC champion Toledo on Nov. 8 at Peden Stadium when Ohio racked up a season-high 393 yards on the ground.

### RUNNING DOWN A DREAM

Redshirt senior running back **A.J. Ouellette** (Covington, Ohio) has blossomed from walk-on buried on the depth chart heading into his 2014 freshman campaign to climbing the charts on Ohio's rushing records.

Ouellette currently ranks eighth in school history with 2,579 career rushing yards. He needs just 36 more to pass Kevin Babcock (1976-79) for seventh. His 537 career carries rank as the 10th-most in program history, and his nine career games with at least 100 yards rushing are good for ninth-most in program history.

In 2017, Ouellette became the first Ohio back to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a single season, finishing with 1,006 to become the first since Beau Blankenship piled up 1,604 in 2012.

### DEPTH IN THE BACKFIELD

The Bobcats have the luxury of possessing a stable of quality running backs behind Ouellette on the depth chart.

Redshirt senior **Maleek Irons** (Chilliwack, British Columbia, Canada) is back in 2018 after sitting out last season. In 2016, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 439 yards and five touchdowns on 95 carries. Irons started five of the nine games he played in that season.

Sophomore **Julian Ross** (Kansas City, Mo.) will be looking to build upon a solid rookie season in which he ran for 250 yards and three touchdowns on 60 carries. Redshirt senior **David Burroughs** (Circleville, Ohio) also returns for the Bobcats after seeing action in 10 games a season ago.

Ohio did lose its third-leading rusher from a season ago with the graduation of Dorian Brown. Brown piled up 757 rushing yards and ranked second on the squad with 11 rushing touchdowns. He finished his career with the Bobcats with a bang, racking up 152 yards and four touchdowns to earn Bahamas Bowl Offensive Player of the Game honors.

### STRONG UP FRONT

Of course, much of Ohio's offensive success in 2017 can be attributed to the strong play of its offensive line. Returning on the left side of the line for Ohio in 2018 will be redshirt senior **Joe Lowery** (Tallmadge, Ohio) at tackle and redshirt senior **Joe Anderson** (Torrance, Calif.) at guard. Lowery was named to the Outland Trophy Watch List in July. Redshirt senior right guard **Durrell Wood** (Columbus, Ohio) is expected to step back into the starting lineup after missing nearly all of the 2017 campaign due to injury. Sophomore **Hagen Meservy** (Tulsa, Okla.), who stepped in as the starting right guard last year, is set to back up Wood this season. Junior **Austin Pleasants** (Ironton, Ohio) takes over as the full-time starting right tackle after seeing action in 11 contests a year ago. New to the starting lineup this year is sophomore center **Brett Kitrell** (Ashland, Neb.), who looks to filled the void left by the graduated Jake Pruehs -- an All-MAC Second Team pick a year ago.

### CATCH THIS

Ohio's offense brings back several key components from its passing game a year ago. Redshirt senior wide receiver **Papi White** (Seminole, Okla.) led the Bobcats with 36 receptions and 631 receiving yards last year. He was also an All-MAC Third Team selection as a punt returner. Redshirt senior **Andrew Meyer** (Canal Winchester, Ohio) hauled in 35 passes for 483 receiving yards and two touchdowns. Redshirt sophomore **Cameron Odom** (Bedford, Ohio) totaled 20 receptions for 308 yards and three touchdowns. Redshirt junior DL Knock (Springboro, Ohio) also caught a touchdown a season ago.

The Bobcats lost Brendan Cope to graduate after he finished second on the squad with 35 catches and 494 receiving yards and led the team with four touchdown grabs. Ohio's receiving corps also suffered an unfortunate loss on the first day of fall camp when redshirt junior Elijah Ball (Cincinnati, Ohio) was lost for the second season in a row with a leg injury.

Ohio also lost its top two tight ends from last season to graduation -- Troy Mangen (11 receptions, 139 yards, two touchdowns) and Mason Morgan (seven receptions, 80 yards, two touchdowns). Redshirt senior **Connor Brown** (Miamisburg, Ohio) and redshirt sophomore **Ryan Luehrman** (Athens, Ohio) are penciled in as the top two tight ends on the depth chart heading into 2018.

### NEW-LOOK FRONT SEVEN ON DEFENSE

The Bobcats' defensive front seven will look very different than it did a season ago. Only one starter returns -- senior weakside linebacker **Evan Crouch** (Youngstown, Ohio), who finished fourth on the squad with 70 total tackles (39 solo, 31 assisted). He tied for second on the team with 2.5 sacks and tied for third with six tackles for loss. Gone are All-MAC First Team linebacker Quentin Poling and All-MAC Second Team linebacker Chad Moore. Poling, who was selected by the Miami Dolphins with the 227th overall pick in the seventh round of the 2017 NFL Draft, led the Bobcats with 107 total tackles (49 solo, 58 assisted) -- including a team-high 5.5 sacks and a team-high 12.5 tackles for loss -- and three forced fumbles. He departed Athens as the program's career leader in solo tackles (219). Moore finished third on the team with 78 total tackles (40 solo, 38 assisted) and led the team with three interceptions.

Redshirt senior defensive tackle **Kent Berger** (Mentor, Ohio), redshirt senior defensive tackle **Andrew Payne** (Danville, Ohio), redshirt sophomore left defensive end **Will Evans** (Augusta, Ga.), redshirt sophomore strongside linebacker **Dylan Conner** (Fort Wayne, Ind.) and redshirt sophomore middle linebacker **Jared Dorsa** (Kings Mills, Ohio) are all expected to start in 2018 after serving primarily in reserve or special teams roles last year. **Amos Ogun Semore** (Dacula, Ga.) is anticipated to start at right defensive end after redshirting last year.

### STRENGTH IN THE SECONDARY

Ohio returns three-fourths of its defensive backfield in 2018.

Redshirt junior free safety **Javon Hagan** (Jacksonville, Fla.) was an All-MAC Second Team pick a year ago after ranking second on the team with 85 total tackles (45 solo, 40 assisted). He picked off one pass and forced one fumble. The 2016 MAC Freshman of the Year is on the watch list for the Thorpe Award entering this season.

The Bobcats return redshirt senior **Kylan Nelson** (Lexington, Ky.) at strong safety. Nelson was sixth on the team with 53 total tackles (28 solo, 25 assisted) and third with eight pass breakups.

Redshirt senior **Jalen Fox** (Cincinnati, Ohio) is back as the starting right cornerback after tying for second on the team with two interceptions and ranking second with 11 pass breakups a year ago.

Ohio's secondary lost All-MAC Third Team left cornerback Bradd Ellis, who led the Bobcats with 19 pass breakups and tied for second on the squad with two interceptions. Two sophomores who are natives of Miami, Fla., **Jamal Hudson** and **Marlin Brooks**, are vying to take the starting spot this year.

### KICKING GAME SPECIAL

The Bobcats have the luxury of returning one of the top special teams tandems in the country in redshirt junior kicker **Louie Zervos** (Tarpon Springs, Fla.) and redshirt junior punter **Michael Farkas** (Mishawaka, Ind.).

Zervos enters the season having been named to the Groza Award Preseason Watch list for the second year in a row. He was an All-MAC Third Team pick in 2017 after making 15 of his 18 field goal attempts and drilling 61 extra points.

In the win over Howard, Zervos made all five of his extra points and the second of two field goal attempts. Saturday's loss to Virginia saw Zervos make a 45-yard field goal in the fourth quarter and connect on all four of his extra point attempts. Zervos

now ranks fourth in program history in career points scored (244), second in career field goals made (46) and third in career extra points made (105). He is just the third kicker in Ohio history to make over 100 career extra points. His 82.1 percent career field goal percentage is good for second-best in program history.

### A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

Ohio will close out a stretch of back-to-back home games when it visits Cincinnati (Sept. 22). The all-time series against in-state rival Cincinnati is deadlocked at 23-23-4, but the Bobcats have not faced the Bearcats since 1981. Ohio wraps up non-conference play with a battle with UMass (Sept. 29) at Peden Stadium. The Bobcats escaped Amherst with a wild 58-50 victory over the Minutemen last September.

MAC play opens with back-to-back road games at Kent state (Oct. 6) and Northern Illinois (Oct. 13). Ohio closes October out with a Homecoming matchup against Bowling Green (Oct. 20) and a home game against Ball State (Oct. 25). The Bobcats are back on the road again to start November, visiting Western Michigan (Nov. 1) and archrival Miami (Nov. 7). The regular season concludes with home showdowns against Buffalo (Nov. 14) and Akron (Nov. 23).

### FOLLOW THE LEADERS

Ohio enters 2018 with seven team captains -- Ouellette, Lowery, Hagan, Rourke, Nelson, Berger and Crouch. Ouellette is a three-year team captain while Lowery and Hagan are both two-year team captains

### CELEBRATING '68

The Bobcats are set to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the 1968 team capturing the program's last MAC championship. Ohio went 10-0 in the regular season that year -- including 6-0 in league play -- under the legendary Hess. The Bobcats earned an invitation to the Tangerine Bowl, where Ohio fell to Richmond, 49-42. Ohio placed 10 players on the All-MAC team that season -- quarterback Cleve Bryant (First Team), offensive tackle Ken Carmon (First Team), fullback Bob Houmar (First Team), halfback Dave LeVeck (First Team), linebacker Steve Robinson (First Team), center Jeff Robison (First Team), end Todd Snyder (First Team), offensive tackle Frank Peters (Second Team), defensive back Craig Rader (Second Team) and tight end Phil Swindell (Second Team). Bryant, Carmon and Snyder were all also named All-Americans Snyder is still the one of the most decorated Bobcat receivers ever, still ranking sixth in career receptions (140), second in career receiving yards (2,241) and fourth in touchdown catches (15). Snyder's 214 receiving yards in the Tangerine Bowl remain an Ohio single-game record. Bryant still ranks eighth in career passing yards (3,414) and third in career touchdown passes (29) in program history.

### SCOUTING CINCINNATI

Ohio and Cincinnati are set to square off for the 51st time but first since 1981. The all-time series is deadlocked at 23-23-4. The Bearcats walked out of Athens with a 19-9 win over the Bobcats in the last meeting between the two teams on Oct. 10, 1981. Ohio and Cincinnati met 13 times between 1968-81, with the Bobcats earning five wins. The Bobcats' last trip to Cincinnati saw Ohio come away with a 27-7 victory on Nov. 3, 1979.

Cincinnati kept its perfect start to the 2018 season intact by rolling to a 63-7 victory over Alabama A&M last Saturday. The Bearcats opened the year with a 26-17 win over UCLA, then beat the RedHawks of Miami, 21-0, at Paul Brown Stadium on Sept. 8.

Luke Fickell is in his second year as the head coach of the Bearcats. Cincinnati was picked to finish fourth in the American Athletic Conference East Division in the league's preseason media poll. The Bearcats went 4-8 in their first year under the direction of Fickell in 2017.

Cincinnati boasts a stout defense, ranking third in the country in total defense (228.7 yards per game), second in scoring defense (8.0 points per game allowed), 11th in passing yards allowed (145.0 per game) and 12th in rushing defense (83.7 yards per game). Sophomore safety James Wiggins leads the Bearcats with 14 total tackles (10 solo, four assisted) and has accounted for one of Cincinnati's two interceptions. Senior defensive lineman Cortez Broughton leads the Bearcats with 6.5 tackles for loss -- including a team-high 2.5 sacks.

Sophomore running back Michael Warren II leads Cincinnati's offense with 315 rushing yards and six rushing touchdowns (second-most in the country) on 70 carries. Redshirt freshman quarterback Desmond Ridder is 28-of-45 for 344 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions through three games. Senior wide receiver Kahlil Lewis leads Cincinnati with 112 receiving yards while junior tight end Josiah Deguara leads the team with two receiving touchdowns.

### QUEEN CITY CONNECTIONS

## FRANK SOLICH

### HEAD COACH, 14th Season

Head Coach Frank Solich has tuned the Ohio football program from one of the least successful in the NCAA to the benchmark of consistency among the Mid-American Conference. Now in his 13th season (19th overall), the Bobcats have been bowl-eligible in nine of the last 10 years, having won 76 games since 2006 - the most among any team in the Mid-American Conference East Division - and have had student-athletes selected in the NFL Draft in seven of the past 10 seasons.

Solich, along with offensive coordinator, Tim Albin, and defensive coordinator, Jimmy Burrow, make up the only head coach and coordinator trio that has been together for 13 years at the same school in the entire FBS.

The Bobcats capped a successful 2017 campaign by beating UAB 41-6 in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl. The Bobcats set five rushing and scoring records during the season and rewrote several individual records with the emergence of quarterback Nathan Rourke.

In 2016, the Bobcats returned to the Marathon Mid-American Conference Championship game where they gave No. 17 Western Michigan a scare in a hard fought 29-23 loss at Ford Field before traveling to the 2016 Dollar General Bowl in Mobile, Ala., Ohio's eighth bowl appearance in 10 years. Ohio leads the MAC with eight straight years of bowl eligibility, appearing in seven bowl games during that time.

Ohio's MAC East title was the third under Solich and 10 Bobcats earned All-MAC honors following the season including senior defensive end Tarell Basham being named MAC Defensive Player of the Year and redshirt freshman safety Javon Hagan earning Freshman of the Year. Basham was selected with the 80th pick in the 2017 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts while senior linebacker Blair Brown was chosen with the 148th by the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Ohio's defense ranked fifth nationally and led the MAC in rushing defense while also setting the team sack record with 44. Basham set single-season and career records in individual sacks finishing his career at Ohio with 29.5 career sacks and 11.5 sacks in 2017.

In 2015, Solich led the Bobcats to their seventh-straight season of bowl eligibility, finishing 8-5 overall and 5-3 in the MAC. The Bobcats beat Marshall in the Battle for the Bell for the fourth time in five years. Ohio also defeated Miami for the ninth time in ten years in the annual Battle of the Bricks.

At the end of the season, five Bobcats earned spots on the All-MAC team, including defensive back Ian Wells, offensive linemen Lucas Powell and Mike McQueen, wide receiver Sebastian Smith, and inside linebacker Quentin Poling.

The 2015 season also saw Dorian Brown, Nate Carpenter, Cody Grilliot, Kurt Laseak, Quentin Poling, Blake Scipio, Mike Terpin, and Josiah Yazdani earn spots on the the Academic All-MAC team.

In 2014, Solich led the Bobcats to their sixth-straight season of bowl eligibility, finishing 6-6 overall and 4-4 in the MAC. The Bobcats also earned their second-straight battle of the Bricks victory, scoring 24 unanswered points to down the RedHawks as time expired.

The 2014 season saw A.J. Ouellette, a walk-on freshman, step up and earn a starting spot at the runningback position. Ouellette rushed for 785 yards and scored seven touchdowns on the ground. He also recorded 133 receiving yards and scored three touchdowns from the air.

At the end of the season, four Bobcats earned spots on the All-MAC team, including Punt return specialist Daz Patterson, offensive lineman Lucas Powell, outside linebacker Jovon Johnson and down lineman Tarell Basham.

The 2014 season also saw Mitch Bonnsetter, Aaron Bradley, Dorian Brown, Chase Cochran, Cody Grilliot, Davon Henry, Josh Kristoff, Kurt Laseak, Troy Mangan, Quentin Poling, Kendrick Smith, Mike Terpin and Josiah Yazdani earn spots on the the Academic All-MAC team.

In 2013, Solich guided the Bobcats to their fifth-consecutive bowl appearance. In addition, Ohio picked up its third straight win in its Battle of the Bell rivalry over Marshall, which would go on to play in the 2013 Conference USA Championship game.

Under Solich's leadership in 2013, the Bobcats scored 336 points, which currently ranks eighth on Ohio's all-time Top 10 list. Defensively, Ohio held five of its opponents to fewer than 300 yards of total offense. The Bobcat defensive unit also tallied 34 sacks, which is currently tied for second all-time in a single season.

Following the year, Ohio earned six slots on the 2013 MAC All-Conference with Devin Bass (kick returner) and Travis Carrie (punt returner) both earning spots on the All-MAC First Team.

In 2012, Solich directed Ohio to its best start to a season since the 1968 campaign as the Bobcats opened the year 7-0. The Bobcats' 7-0 start included a thrilling 24-14 victory over Penn State in front of a nationally-televised audience.

After opening the year 7-0, Ohio earned a spot in all three major college football polls for the first time in school history - Associated Press, USA Today and the Bowl Championship Series standings.

Following the 2012 campaign, Ohio placed six individuals on the 2012 MAC All-Conference teams and earned a bid to the 2012 Advocate V100 Independence Bowl to punch its ticket to a fourth-consecutive bowl trip.

In the Independence Bowl, Ohio did not disappoint as it defeated Louisiana-Monroe 45-14 to pick up its second-straight bowl victory. The Bobcats also set or tied 11 bowl records in the win, including the mark for total yards as they finished with 556.

The 2012 season also saw the emergence of running back Beau Blankenship. In his first season as a starter, Blankenship set the single season rushing record of 1,604 yards under Solich's watch. He also rushed for 15 touchdowns as he averaged just over five yards per carry.

In his seven previous seasons as Ohio's head coach, Solich guided the Bobcats to an impressive 50-40 record. In 2011, Solich led the Bobcats to their first-ever bowl win as Ohio defeated Utah State 24-23 in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl to finish the year 10-4.

Ohio's win over the Aggies gave the Bobcats their first 10-win season since 1968. The Bobcats' 10 wins were also the most among division I-A teams from the state of Ohio. The Bobcats four losses came by a combined total of just 19 points (4.75 points per game).

Solich's 2011 Bobcat squad set 47 school records, won six of the team's last seven games and had a league-best 11 players on the MAC All-Conference teams. In addition, Solich picked up his 100th career victory following a convincing 30-3 victory over Gardner-Webb on Sept. 10.

Among the 11 players selected All-MAC, place kicker Matt Weller was named Special Teams Player of the Year, offensive lineman Joe Flading was named First Team and quarterback Tyler Tettleton became the first Ohio signal-caller to be named all-league since 1985. Under Solich's watchful eye, Tettleton re-wrote Ohio's single season record book as he set 12 records and became the first quarterback in school history to pass for 3,000 yards in one year, while in the process throwing a program-best 28 touchdowns.

The 2011 campaign also saw Ohio defeat arch-rival Miami for the sixth-consecutive season - the program's longest winning streak since it won six straight from 1937-1942. Since Solich took over in 2005, Ohio has only suffered two losses to Miami.

In 2010, the Bobcats went to the New Orleans Bowl, making the program's fifth bowl appearance and third in the past five seasons.

Following the season, seven student-athletes were named All-MAC and quarterback Boo Jackson finished his career as Ohio's career leader in completion percentage (.604), pass efficiency (136.3), total offense per play (6.18), passing yards per attempt (7.7) and touchdown passes (38). He also finished the season with 26 total touchdowns, 48 in his career, which is fourth all-time. He also accumulated 18 passing touchdowns in 2010 (fourth all-time on the single-season list).

The 2009 season was equally successful as the senior class compiled 28 victories during its four years on campus. In addition, Ohio boasted a school-record 12 All-MAC selections with four capturing All-America honors en route to a second MAC East title in the squad's last four years. Solich was named the conference coach of the year by Phil Steele.

Following back-to-back seasons of bowl eligibility, the Bobcats followed it up with an offensive outburst that rewrote many of Ohio's all-time team and individual records in Frank Solich's fourth year at the helm. In 2008, the Bobcats' aerial attack set three school single-season passing records, including passing yards, passing yards per game and touchdown passes all of which stood until the conclusion of the 2011 season.

Overall, Ohio also totaled 4,337 yards of total offense, which at the time was the third-highest total in school history. Following the year, six players garnered All-MAC recognition, while in the classroom, five picked up Academic All-MAC awards.

Perhaps the best individual honor under Solich came with safety Mike Mitchell being drafted by the Oakland Raiders in the second round of the NFL Draft (47th overall), becoming the highest drafted Bobcat since 1948 and the highest under Solich.

With Solich as coach in 2007, Kalvin McRae became the first Ohio player in history to rush for 1,000 yards in three consecutive seasons. Other players achieved success for the offense as well, with tight end Andrew Mooney setting the single-season Bobcat touchdown reception record and quarterback Brad Bower tying the career record for most yards per pass.

In 2006, Solich guided Ohio to its first MAC East Division championship, the program's first MAC title of any kind since 1968, earning the Bobcats a spot in the GMAC Bowl, which marked the Bobcats' first bowl game since that same 1968 season.

Following the year, Solich was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors, marking the third time in eight seasons in which he had won his league's coach of the year award. Ohio's five-win improvement from 2005 (4-7) to 2006 (9-5) tied for the sixth-best turnaround in the nation.

In his first three seasons, Solich guided the Bobcats to 19 victories in his first three campaigns after the squad had won 11 games in the previous four seasons. Since his arrival, Solich has coached 63 All-MAC players.

His players have also gained national recognition. At the conclusion of the 2011 season, Joe Flading earned SI.com All-America honors. In 2009, LaVon Brazill and Noah Keller were named to various All-America teams, while Matt Weller and Gerald Moore were tabbed as Freshman All-Americans. In 2005, Dion Byrum became Ohio's first non-special teams All-American since 1968, and three rookies have been honored on The Sporting News Freshman All-America squads.

Ohio has also seen an increase of national television exposure since Solich's arrival in 2005 and has also seen an increased level of exposure in the media as it was featured in Sports Illustrated, USA Today, The New York Times and Boston Globe.

Since Solich arrived in Athens, Bobcat players have been named to watch lists for such prestigious honors as the Maxwell Award, the Butkus Award, the Lombardi Trophy, the Lott Trophy, the Davey O'Brien Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award, the Biletnikoff Award and the Nagurski Trophy. Byrum was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, presented to the nation's top defensive back, in 2005.

Off the field, Solich is equally proud of his player's accomplishments in the classroom. In the past four seasons, the Bobcats have had 31 Academic All-MAC selections. He has also had two seasons where an Ohio player has been named a semifinalist for the Draddy Trophy, one of the most prestigious academic honors in college football. Academic success is nothing new for Solich's teams. While head coach at Nebraska, almost 90 percent of his student-athletes earned their degree. Seven times Huskers earned first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and on four other occasions, second-team honors were bestowed.

Solich was named the Bobcats' head coach on Dec. 17, 2004. In short order he assembled a talented and tested coaching staff, coordinated recruiting efforts to assure a steady stream of outstanding student-athletes to the program, supervised a highly productive off-season weight program producing dozens of personal bests and concluded all-business spring drills introducing his players to tried and true offensive and defensive schemes.

Solich's arrival brought a renewed enthusiasm to the Bobcat football program. Ohio used that spark to begin a massive renovation of Peden Tower to better serve its student-athletes.

The momentum carried over into Solich's first season on the sidelines at Peden Stadium. Solich's first win at Ohio came against defending Big East champion Pittsburgh in his home debut. Dion Byrum's two interception returns for touchdown on national television in an overtime victory put the Bobcats on the national stage. The win was one of only two victories for MAC teams against BCS-conference opponents during that season.

Solich arrived in Athens after six seasons as the head coach at the University of Nebraska. Solich spent nearly 30 years as part of the Nebraska program as a player, assistant coach and head coach. A Big 12 Coach of the Year in 1999 and 2001, Solich produced nine-win seasons in five of his six years as head coach of the Huskers. In 1999, 2000 and 2001, he generated 12, 10 and 11 win seasons, respectively. He also generated six-consecutive bowl appearances including a 2001 run at the national championship against Miami in the Rose Bowl.

Under Solich's leadership, Nebraska spent 54 consecutive weeks in the Associated Press Top 10. In his first five seasons as Husker head coach, Solich won 49 games, more than both his storied predecessors, Bob Devaney and Dr. Tom Osborne, in their first five years at Nebraska.

Moving on from Nebraska following a 2003 season in which his Huskers went 10-3, Solich was nevertheless determined to stay as close as possible to the college game until just the right opportunity came along. In a unique professional development opportunity all too often ignored by colleagues, Solich chose to travel the college and professional ranks to update his knowledge of the game, broaden his perspectives on its nuances and challenges and ready himself for the next great challenge.

Stepping back from the sideline included wide-ranging visits to some of Division I-A's top programs as well and the schedule included much more than a courtesy call. His ambitious fact-finding odyssey included stops at Oklahoma, Texas, Wisconsin, Miami and Southern California.

Coming from his native Cleveland to Lincoln back in 1962, he was recruited to play fullback for the Cornhuskers as a part of Bob Devaney's first class of freshmen. During his time in the Husker program, Nebraska went 9-2, 10-1, 9-2 and 10-1. He earned All-Big Eight honors in 1965 and was the first Husker to rush for 200 yards in a game. His place in the Nebraska tradition was formalized with his induction into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame in 1992.

While his accomplishments as a player were impressive, his work as a gifted teacher and assistant coach perhaps had as much to do with his arrival in the shrine as anything. Nine of the 15 seasons he served as running backs coach, Nebraska led the nation in rushing. He recruited and coached 1983 Heisman winner Mike Rozier and produced at least one all-conference running back in thirteen of the fifteen years he mentored that position. As a head coach, Solich mentored Eric Crouch to the 2001 Heisman Trophy.

**ATHENS, Ohio** -- Redshirt senior wide receiver Papi White (Seminole, Okla.) racked up a career-high 154 receiving yards on a career-high eight receptions and hauled in a touchdown, and redshirt junior quarterback Quinton Maxwell (Rayville, Mo.) threw for two scores and ran for two more as the Ohio football team (1-0) held off Howard (0-1), 38-32, to open the 2018 season with a victory.

- Trailing the Bison 22-17 at halftime, the Bobcats scored two touchdowns in the opening 1:37 of the second half to turn the tide of the game, including a 100-yard kickoff return from DL Knock.

- Maxwell finished 17-of-25 with 233 yards passing and matched his career high with two passing touchdowns. A.J. Ouellette led the Bobcats on the ground with 65 yards while Irons tallied 55 more. White, who caught a career-high with eight total tackles and also broke up three passes. His forced fumble on the first play from scrimmage marked the first of his career. Jalen Fox piled up 7.5 tackles -- including one for a loss -- and both forced and recovered his first career fumble. Crouch matched Fox for second on the team with 7.5 total tackles -- including 1.5 for loss.

- Caylin Newton finished as Howard's leading passer and rusher, going 26-of-52 for 439 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. He also ran for 110 yards and scored a touchdown. Jequez Ezzard hauled in eight catches for 223 yards and a score while Kyle Anthony caught nine balls for 97 yards and a touchdown. Junior linebacker Marcellus Allison racked up a game-high 10.5 total tackles to lead the Bison defense.

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** -- The Ohio football team (1-1) fell to Virginia (2-1), 45-31, today at Vanderbilt Stadium, suffering its first loss of the 2018 season.

- The Bobcats battled back from a 35-7 second-quarter deficit to make it a 10-point game with just over nine minutes to play but could not quite complete the comeback.

- Redshirt senior wide receiver Papi White (Seminole, Okla.) posted his third-straight game with at least 100 yards receiving, hauling in six catches for a team-high 131 yards and a touchdown. Redshirt senior running back Maleek Irons (Chilliwack, British Columbia, Canada) scored a pair of one-yard touchdown runs. Junior quarterback Nathan Rourke (Oakville, Ontario, Canada) finished 16-of-31 for 246 yards and two touchdown passes and added a team-high 72 rushing yards.

- Ohio's defense came up with a turnover that set up a touchdown late in the half to make it a 35-14 contest. Redshirt junior defensive lineman Chukwudi Chukwu (Willingboro, N.J.) produced a strip sack of Perkins that was recovered by junior linebacker Eric Popp (Loveland, Ohio) at the Virginia 29. Rourke found White for a scoring strike on the next play.

- Popp then recovered an onside kick by redshirt junior Michael Farkas (Mishawaka, Ind.) for the Bobcats to set up shop for Ohio at its own 46. A pass from Rourke to White moved the ball 18 yards. After a timeout by the Bobcats, Rourke hit redshirt freshman Isaiah Cox (Jasper, Ala.) for a 36-yard touchdown. The scoring reception marked the first of Cox's career and second touchdown in a span of 46 seconds for Ohio.

- Perkins finished the game 25-of-30 passing for a game-high 379 yards and three touchdowns. Nine of his passes went to Zaccheaus, who totaled a game-high 247 receiving yards and two touchdowns. Ellis tallied a game-high 171 yards on 19 carries and scored three rushing touchdowns.
