2005-06 BIG EAST Opponents

For their inaugural season in the BIG EAST, the Bearcats will host rival Louisville, as well as Notre Dame, Rutgers, Pittsburgh, West Virginia, St. John's and USF. Rutgers reached the Elite 8 last year and finished ranked as high as seventh in the nation, while Notre Dame finished the year at No. 11.

UC's road contests will include national power Connecticut, DePaul, Marquette, Providence, Seton Hall, Syracuse, and Villanova.

With Georgetown as the repeat opponent for the Bearcats, UC will face Louisville just once in the regular season for the first time since the 1995-96 campaign.

2005-06 Cincinnati Outlook

The positives — the University of Cincinnati returns three starters and nine letterwinners and is entering the conference that has produced five of the last six women's basketball national champions.

The negatives — the Bearcats are coming off a nine-win season and are entering the conference that has produced five of the last six women's basketball national champions.

The 2005-06 Bearcats, however, are only looking at the positives. "Our kids are excited," said 20th-year head coach Laurie Pirtle of UC's entry into the BIG EAST. "They know, to be the best you have to play the best."

Pirtle believes those returning took a lot out of last season, including winning four of their last nine games and suffering seven losses by less than 10 points. Losses to Arkansas by 12 points and eventual national runner-up Michigan State by 16 points, both games UC led at halftime, also showed the Bearcats something.

"They look at how we played Michigan State and Arkansas," said Pirtle, "and it opened their eyes to how good we can be. We have the talent, getting the mentality is the key."

That mentality consists of buying into the UC system, which had produced seven-straight postseason appearances before last year, and being able to do so for 40 minutes. Strength and conditioning have been a major part of the off-season routine and Pirtle believes that will eventually pay off.

Another positive of joining the BIG EAST is the new recruiting avenues created. The prospect of playing the likes of Connecticut, Notre Dame and Rutgers every year helped the Bearcats land what one expert ranked as the 10th-best recruiting class in the nation.

On the court, "I really think that we were mediocre in everything last year," said Pirtle. "We didn't flow well in the fast break, we didn't rebound well and we turned the ball over too much. Those are things that have to be better this year. We've been a fastbreaking team for so long and we did none of that last year."

The Bearcats have the athletes to commit to the transition game, with a number of players versatile enough to play up to three positions. They have also seen firsthand the benefits of rebounding, as all of their league wins were the result of double-digit rebounding margins.

The Backcourt

Leading the Bearcats for the third-straight year will be senior point guard Micah Harvey. She finished second in Conference USA in assist-to-turnover ratio in each of the last two years and ranked in the top six in assists both times. She hit double-digits in assists twice last year with just seven games with more than three turnovers. A more consistent outside shot will provide even more scoring opportunities for her.

Harvey was sixth in C-USA in assists and second in assist-to-turnover ratio last year. She is the definite leader and will have improved quickness after fully recovering from injuries that cost her playing time early in the season.

The explosive Humphries returned in December last year after September knee surgery and started the final two games, while Roudebush is a versatile freshman who finished fourth in the Indiana Miss Basketball voting.

May is one of the quickest players on the team and had four double-digit scoring games off the bench. She also was second on the team in steals.

Humphries played in this position, as well, and newcomer Morgan and sophomore Brogan will also fight for time.

In UC's two-post offense, the power forward and center are often interchangeable. Brown is a versatile player who has worked on her consistency. She is a tough rebounder with good range on her jump shot.

Twehues has the size to move to this spot, while Ogide is the most athletic Bearcat. Stephens is the highest-ranked member of the freshman class.

Ogide started the last half of the season, but Stephens carried the team offensively. She earned C-USA Sixth Player of the Year honors after averaging 14.2 points and 6.3 rebounds over the final 10 games.

Jones and Jill Stephens will get some playing time somewhere. The former is a Cincinnati-native who helped her high school team to a state championship and runner-up finish. Jill Stephens is the younger sister of Anne and one of the top 50 players in her class.



Junior Treasure Humphries is an explosive player that can play either point or shooting guard. Last season, she underwent knee surgery in September, but missed only 10 games and returned at the end of December. She finished the year in the starting lineup and averaged 8.3 points and 2.3 steals over the last four games. As a freshman, she played in every game, leading UC in steals and averaging 7.2 points and 1.5 assists per game.

Junior Karen Twehues is UC's top outside threat, with unlimited range. She was third on the team last year, averaging 9.5 points per game. She ranked fifth in C-USA in three-pointers per game (2.11) and three-point percentage (.345).

Senior Bellva May is an exciting player who can play at the shooting guard or wing spots. She had four double-digit scoring games off the bench for the Bearcats last year and was second on the team in steals in just 15.6 minutes of playing time per game.

Sophomore Kristi Brogan is an outside-shooting specialist who has been working hard to diversify her game to earn more playing time.

Three newcomers will also be pushing for playing time. Kahla Roudebush is a 5-8 guard who finished fourth in the voting for Indiana's Miss Basketball. She averaged

17.3 points and 5.1 assists last year and could be UC's point guard of the future.

Angel Morgan averaged 20.7 points and 9.4 rebounds last year en route to county Miss Basketball honors. The athletic 5-8 guard can play either shooting guard or wing. Also, fighting for time on the wing will be 5-10 Shelly Bellman. She is a first-team all-state honoree who averaged 13.6 points, 6.0 rebounds, 4.7 steals and 4.1 assists last year.

The Frontcourt

The two-post offense run by the Bearcats does not differentiate a great deal between who is the center and who is the power forward, thus a number of combinations are available for these two spots.

Senior Anne Stephens leads the group. The C-USA Sixth Player of the Year last season, Stephens led the Bearcats in scoring and rebounding. The 6-4 captain is the tallest letterwinner in school history and adds a nice outside touch to her inside strength.

Sophomore Emy Ogide started at center the final 16 games and was second on the team in blocks. The best athlete on the team, she won all but one jump ball for UC and is a tireless rebounder.

Fellow sophomore Ashley Brown started 16 games and was one of just four players to play in every game. A fundamentally sound player, she contributes in every area of the game. She was third on the team in rebounding, while adding 21 assists, 16 steals and 10 blocks.

Another sophomore player, Bianca Roldan-Jarus, has improved greatly in the offseason. She played in only six games last year, but as a 6-1 player with range out to the arc, she can be a valuable asset.

Twehues, due to her 6-0 frame, is also a possibility to see time in the frontcourt.

A pair of newcomers figure to have a large impact on UC's inside game this year. Jill Stephens, the younger sister of Anne, is one of the highest-rated recruits to become a Bearcat. The three-time first team all-state member is one of the top 50 players in her class and finished second in West Virginia's Miss Basketball voting. She is an athletic 6-3, as evidenced by her all-state accolades in volleyball and softball.

The only local product on the team is 6-1 Michelle Jones. She helped Mt. Notre Dame High School to a state championship as a junior and a runner-up finish last year. She was named APOhio Division I Tri-Player of the Year after averaging 16.3 points and 10.4 rebounds.

2005-06 Bearcat Bites

- The Bearcats entered last season with just 71 games of starting experience, with 49 of those coming from Anne Stephens and Micah Harvey. This year UC boasts 154 returning starts spread among seven players.

- Entering its 35th season of play, UC is just four wins shy of reaching the 500-win plateau. The 496 all-time wins for the Bearcats rank seventh in the BIG EAST.

- Since Fifth Third Arena became the home of UC basketball in 1989, the Bearcats have gone 150-82 (.647) on their home court. Over the past seven years they have a home record of 103-28 (.786). UC went 15-1 at home in 2001-02, the best-ever single season. The Bearcats put together a school-record 21-game home win streak from Jan. 1, 2002 until a loss to Tulane on Feb. 2, 2003.

- Cincinnati moves to the BIG EAST Conference this year. The Bearcats have a 60-71 record (.458) vs. current members of the BIG EAST.

- The Bearcats are hoping to avoid the letdown that has occurred the other three times they began play in a new conference. In 1983-84, UC went 16-12, but won just three of 10 Metro Conference games. 1991-92 saw the Bearcats repeat that 3-7 mark in their initial year in the Great Midwest Conference while going 11-17 overall. In Conference USA's inaugural season, 1995-96, UC went 4-10 in the new league and 8-19 overall.



Head Coach Laurie Pirtle

UC's Winningest Coach Enters Her 20th Year as a Bearcat

Committed to Bearcat Basketball

Committed. Determined. Loyal. Three words that easily describe Laurie Pirtle, head coach of the University of Cincinnati.

Pirtle, who is entering her 20th year as the Bearcats' mentor, is without question the most successful women's basketball coach in UC history and this season will lead the Bearcats into the powerful BIG EAST Conference.

During her tenure, the Bearcats have won 278 games and have advanced to postseason play more times than they have under any other coach. In the last nine years, Pirtle has guided UC to seven winning seasons, five 20-plus win campaigns and seven consecutive postseason appearances from 1997-2004. Cincinnati also had its first player play in the WNBA when K.B. Sharp made the roster of the New York Liberty for the 2003 season.

Much like the 2003-04 squad, which struggled before winning five of its last eight to make the WNIT, the 2004-05 team suffered through a nine-game losing streak but won four of its last eight before being eliminated in the C-USA Tourney. Pirtle considers last year one of her most intensive teaching jobs as head coach, as nine of her 13 players were in their first or second year at UC and nearly the entire roster missed some time due to injury.

The 2002-03 Bearcats began the season ranked as high as 18th, the first time a Cincinnati team was ever ranked to begin a season. Under Pirtle's direction, UC set a school record for consecutive home wins (21) and a C-USA mark for most consecutive league games won (15). The Bearcats finished second in C-USA in the regular season and the tournament, reaching the title game for the third-straight year. UC performed the unprecedented feat of having three players, Sharp, Valerie King and Debbie Merrill, named first team All-C-USA.

During the 2001-02 season, UC posted its best start to a season ever with 11-straight wins before losing to Louisville on Jan. 4. On Dec. 31, Cincinnati received its first-ever ranking in the polls, coming in at No. 23 in the *USA Today*/ESPN poll and No. 25 in the Associated Press poll. After suffering four losses in six games, the Bearcats responded with a school record 14-game winning streak, which included a C-USA Tournament title and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament win, a 76-63 overtime thriller against St. Peter's. King earned honorable mention All-American honors, UC's first in 16 years.

The foundation for success was put in place back in 1986 when Pirtle first stepped foot on campus. Since then she has been determined to turn the Bearcat program around. It took her just two seasons to transpose a 6-22 program into an 18-11 winning team. Her outstanding efforts were rewarded in 1988, when she picked up Coach of the Year honors in the Metro Conference following UC's second-place finish in the league. Pirtle also earned her 100th career win that same year.

A season later, the Bearcats earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament. In that star-studded season (1988-89), Cincinnati tied a school record with 12 consecutive wins, knocking off powerhouses Ohio State, UCLA and Kentucky. Under Pirtle, UC won the mythical state championship of Ohio Division I schools with a 7-1 slate against intrastate rivals.

Determined To Put UC In The Limelight

After a period of rebuilding, Pirtle's hard work paid off as the Bearcats registered a 17-11 record during the 1996-97 season, advancing to the second round of the Conference USA Tournament and capturing their second mythical state championship of Ohio Division I schools with a 5-0 slate.

A year later, Pirtle carried the Cincinnati program into the national spotlight when she guided the Bearcats to their third-ever postseason appearance and first showing in the WNIT. UC posted its first 20-win season in nine years and received votes in the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches' poll.

With her sights on an NCAA Tournament appearance, Pirtle brought her team to the next level in 1998-99. Highlighted by the team's second straight 20-win season, Cincinnati earned a share of the C-USA regular season title, a runner-up finish in the league tournament and received votes in both national polls, including a No. 27 ranking by the





Associated Press.

Most significantly, though, was that Pirtle reached her goal—a bid to the Big Dance. That accomplishment distinguished her as the only coach in UC history to guide UC to more than one NCAA appearance. After producing a 20-7 regular season record, Pirtle was honored as the C-USA Coach of the Year, the eighth similar honor in her career.

A season later, Cincinnati earned its second bid to the WNIT. Powered by Madinah Slaise's 32 points, UC defeated Pittsburgh, 76-60, in the first round to record the program's second postseason win in history. The Bearcats closed out the season as one of five Conference USA schools ranked in the top 60 in the final RPI Report.

In 2000-01, the Bearcats extended the school's postseason streak, making a late run to earn their second straight bid to the WNIT. Winners of eight of its last 10 games, Cincinnati faced Ohio State in the first round, losing on a basket at the buzzer, 61-60. The team finished at 22-10, its third 20-plus win campaign in four years. Other season highlights included freshman Valerie King's selection as the C-USA Tournament's Most Valuable Player. She also became the fifth UC player in six years to be selected to the league's all-freshman team.

Prior to Cincinnati, Pirtle served a four-year stint as the head coach at Capital University, posting an 83-16 (.838) mark. Under her direction, the Crusaders made their first-ever trip to the NCAA Division III Final

Four after a 27-4 showing during the 1985-86 season. They also won a pair of Ohio Athletic Conference titles.

Pirtle was named the OAC and Converse Division III District Coach of the Year in 1985 and 1986, and was the Ohio Intercollegiate Basketball Coaches Association Coach of the Year in 1985.

Pirtle earned her first coaching position, following her graduation from Ohio State in 1980, serving one season (1980-81) as an assistant coach at William Fisher Catholic High School in Lancaster, Ohio.

At OSU, Pirtle was a three-year starter for the Buckeyes after entering the program as a walk-on. A gifted ball-handler, Pirtle still ranks in the top 10 for career assists (317 in 104 games). She earned her B.S. and M.S. from OSU in 1980 and 1986, respectively.

Following graduation, Pirtle signed and practiced with the New Mexico Energy of the Ladies Professional Basketball Association. She also competed in the Venezuelan Basketball League for the Venezuela Oilers in 1980.

Loyal To Cincinnati And Its Community

A dynamic motivator, Pirtle is recognized throughout the Cincinnati community and speaks at various camps and clinics in the area. Pirtle entertained young campers at the 2001 Oscar Robertson Basketball Camp with her ball-handling routine.

Pirtle represents the university at championship events and other professional organizations such as the Women's Basketball Coaches Association. She also serves as a committee member for the Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky Women's Sports Association, who recognizes the area's leading female athletes. A longtime member of UC Athletics, Pirtle remains true and loyal to Bearcat basketball for one reason—it's home. During her tenure, she has worked in three offices, under four different athletic directors and in four different athletic conferences. She knows Bearcat women's basketball more than anyone else. She lives it.

Veteran assistant coach Bret McCormick was added to the women's basketball staff at UC on June 16, 2004. McCormick heads the Bearcat recruiting efforts while assisting in coaching the UC post players.

McCormick came to UC with a reputation as a top recruiter and well-respected coach. His recruiting contacts across the country are second to none and helped the Bearcats sign the 10th-ranked recruiting class in the country last fall.

McCormick joined the Bearcats after having served as a women's college basketball scout for *All-Star Girls Reports* since 1998. While there he was instrumental in starting the nationally known Adidas Top Ten Girls All-American Camp.

Prior to that, he spent the 1997-98 season as an assistant at the University of Central Florida, where he led the recruiting efforts and helped the Golden Knights to their best season in 15 years.

McCormick spent a bulk of his career as the recruiting coordinator at Marshall University from 1993-97, where he recruited and coached two Southern Conference

Freshman of the Year performers. He helped the Herd to its first NCAA Tournament appearance and Southern Conference Tournament title in 1997.

A native of Point Pleasant, W. Va., he graduated from the University of Rio Grande in 1982 and coached AAU basketball in his hometown until 1989. After serving as head coach at Point Pleasant Junior High from 1990-92, McCormick served as an assistant for the men's team at the University of Charleston in 1992-93, before heading to Marshall.

Dawn Hoosier is entering her 11th year as an assistant coach for the Bearcats, and 17th as part of the program. True to her alma mater, Hoosier was a four-year letterwinner for Cincinnati before entering the coaching ranks.

Having played many roles during her association with the game, Hoosier can relate to just about every member of the team — coaches,

players and even the support staff.

Hoosier devotes countless hours to the program on and off the court. In addition to spearheading UC's scouting efforts, she is responsible for game scheduling and equipment. She has also been an integral part of the recruiting team that has produced four top 25 recruiting classes.

Hoosier is aware of the sense of urgency to win placed on every basketball program and the unforgiving hours put into a season. She understands the importance of getting things done and correctly, and she loves it.

In her 11th season on the bench, Hoosier has developed into one of the best X and O coaches around. Her application of strategies, understanding of fundamentals and attention to detail make her an asset.

Such dedication to the mental side of the sport often gives Hoosier a hard-nosed, all business persona that is not found in the young coach. Instead, her student-athletes look to her when they need help. Confidence and respect run high between Hoosier and her players. The Bearcats count on her to give them the edge over their opponents.

Getting the edge on opponents is where Hoosier excels. As Cincinnati's primary scout, her competitive nature swells when the schedule is finished and she can start

collecting every film, statistic, innuendo or play on the opponent. Her scouting reports echo anything and everything you could want to know about a particular player. Hoosier spends countless hours with her stacked VCR's scrutinizing and itemizing every play.

Some say Hoosier is a mirror image of head coach Laurie Pirtle. Granted, she has learned most of her basketball knowledge from her college coach, but Hoosier has some ideas of her own. She watches, listens, learns and soaks in everything and files it all away for the future.

Hoosier's quest to make the UC program successful takes on many other forms. In addition to working with the guards, Hoosier is also the director of the Laurie Pirtle Summer Basketball Camp. She has improved the camp three-fold since taking it over nine years ago. Hoosier has seen the team camp grow from three squads to 70 during her tenure.

The Cincinnati native earned four letters with the Bearcats from 1989-93. She earned her degree in health education at UC in 1995. Hoosier is a member of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Priscilla Rickenbacker is entering her first year on Laurie Pirtle's staff at UC. Rickenbacker's responsibilities will include working with the Bearcat guards, while serving as the staff's academic liaison. She will be involved in recruiting as well.

Rickenbacker spent the last five years as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Loyola-Chicago. While at LU, she helped lead the Ramblers to three-straight appearances in the Horizon League Tournament semifinals for the first time in 12 years. Rickenbacker tutored two 1,000-point scorers at LU, including the school record holder in career three-pointers. Five Ramblers were named All-Horizon League under Rickenbacker and she was the academic liaison for teams that graduated 99 percent of student-athletes who finished their careers.

Prior to joining LU, Rickenbacker was an assistant at Wisconsin-Green Bay for one year, producing regular season and tournament championships as well as an NCAA appearance. Her first collegiate position came as an assistant at Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte during the 1998-99 season.

Rickenbacker's coaching career began at Kings Mountain High School (N.C.), where she served as assistant varsity coach and head JV coach from 1993 to 1997. From there

she became the head coach at North Gaston (N.C.) High School, producing a conference regular season and tournament championship in her first season and earning conference Coach of the Year honors in her second.

She has also honed her coaching skills at a number of prestigious camps, including the University of Minnesota Camp of Champions and the Lady Volunteers Basketball Camp.

Bob Goin

Director of Athletics

Bob Goin's tenure as director of athletics has brought unprecedented success to the University of Cincinnati

sports program. His vision has positioned the university to achieve continued success for decades to come.

His crowning accomplishment was ushering UC into membership in the Big East Conference, a move that aligns the Bearcat sports program with one of the nation's premiere athletic conferences.

Goin's other major achievement is the Richard E. Lindner Varsity Village, a comprehensive \$80.3 million enhancement of all of UC's athletic facilities. Goin has played the lead role in the planning, put together a funding plan, and set an aggressive construction schedule. Goin's efforts began to take form last year with the opening of the new UC Baseball Stadium and Gettler Stadium, a state-of-the-art track/soccer complex opened. The crown jewel of the project, the Richard E. Lindner Center, is a state-of-the-art athletic center which will be completed in early 2006. Other components include the renovation of Armory Fieldhouse and a new natatorium, tennis center and boathouse.

Other significant accomplishments during Goin's tenure include:

- enhancement of Nippert Stadium with the conversion of approximately 9,000 bench seats into individual seating and the installation of a new grass-like artificial playing surface.
- increased academic support for current student-athletes and launched a program to help recent student-athletes complete their degrees.
- implemented a gender equity plan which upped all

women's sports to full scholarship levels and added rowing for women.

- stabilized the athletic department's budget through more stringent fiscal management and the development of new revenue sources.

UC's sports teams have parlayed these accomplishments to success on the field. Bearcat teams posted a combined winning percentage of nearly .600 over the past eight years. UC has claimed 29 conference titles, made 49 postseason appearances and produced 39 All-Americans.

Goin, who was named to the Cincinnati AD position on Oct. 1, 1997, is nationally recognized for his administrative acumen. He has served on the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet and the NCAA Football Bowl Certification Subcommittee.

Goin has shared his professional expertise, serving as a consultant to two NCAA Division I athletic programs.

Goin carved his professional niche during his five years as athletics director at Florida State (1990-94). FSU's across-the-board success made the school a regular top 20 contender for the Sears Cup. His most significant accomplishment was guiding Florida State into membership in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 1991.

Goin played a major role in shaping the future of the Florida State program during his previous nine years as associate AD.

A 1959 graduate of Bethany College, Goin launched his career in athletics at the school a year later, holding a number of coaching and teaching positions. He served as AD and chair of the physical education department from 1970-1976, and was a tenured professor.

From 1976 to 1979, Goin served as assistant athletics director at West Virginia, and spent two years as athletics director at California University of Pennsylvania (1979-81). Prior to coming to UC, he was special assistant to the president at the University of North Florida.

POSTSEASON TRADITION: Last year broke a string of seven-straight postseason appearances for the Bearcats. This era accounted for all but two of the postseason appearances in school history. Four of the seven were to the WNIT, including 2004. The seven-season streak was the longest active streak in Conference USA.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE: UC played the 44th-toughest schedule last year as ranked by the WBCA/Summerville RPI. The Bearcats' schedule featured 12 teams that reached the postseason in 2005. UC's 2004-05 opponents had a combined 451-326 record for a .580 winning percentage. Seventeen of UC's 26 opponents boasted winning records and 11 reached the 20-win mark.

TOP 10 CATS: Seniors Anne Stephens and Micah Harvey and junior Karen Twehues are seeing the results of their careers in the UC record books. Stephens now has 46 career blocks to rank ninth in school history. Harvey has handed out 324 assists in her career, which is seventh all-time by a Bearcat. Harvey's 135 assists as a sophomore was the eighth-best single-season total in UC history. Twehues has made 87 three-pointers in just 47 career games to move into fifth in UC annals.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: The Bearcats opened last season with a combined total of 71 games of starting experience. Anne Stephens (25) and Micah Harvey (24) accounted for 49 of those. For comparison, the 2003-04 team brought 229 games of starting experience into the campaign.

HITTING THE BOARDS: UC won the rebounding battle in six of the last 10 games after being outrebounded in 10 of the first 18. In those 10 games the Bearcats recorded four double-digit rebounding margins and posted all four of their league wins.

CONFERENCE USA SUCCESS

The Bearcats closed their Conference USA tenure as one of seven teams to have a conference record over .500 throughout the history of the league. UC was 81-67 (.547) in the 10-year history of C-USA, posting winning league marks in the five years before last year. The Bearcats were 12-4 in the 1998-99 season to claim the regular season championship.

HOT CAT

C-USA Sixth Player of the Year Anne Stephens carried UC at the end of the season. Stephens averaged 14.2 points and 6.6 rebounds in the last 10 games and shot .563 (58-103) from the field. She scored a career-high 24 points in the win over Memphis, making 10-of-14 shots from the field, and recorded her fifth career double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds at Charlotte.



EMERGING EMY: Freshman Emy Ogide played in just three of the first six games, recording one point and one rebound. Pressed into extended action against Xavier because of injuries, she responded with two points, three rebounds and two blocks.

She played in all 21 games after that and started the last 16, winning 14 of 16 jump balls. She had a career day against Arkansas, setting new bests with eight points, nine rebounds, four blocks and two assists.

RAPID RETURN

Sophomore Treasure Humphries underwent surgery for a torn ACL in late August and exceeded all expectations by making it back to the court in a little under four months. UC's steals leader and fourth-leading scorer last year, she made her debut at Middle Tennessee State on Dec. 29 and scored eight points in 11 minutes with two steals. Humphries averaged 7.8 points in her first four games with a high of 11 points at USF. She exploded for a career-high 18 points in UC's win over Southern Miss.



HELP OFF THE BENCH: In the last 16 games UC averaged 56.5 points per game and nearly half, 25.7, came from the bench. Anne Stephens averaged a team-best 12.4 points per game in this span and Bellva May had three double-digit scoring games, both as reserves.

AT THE LINE AND BEHIND THE ARC: In its nine wins, UC averaged 20.6 free throw attempts and allowed just 2.3 made three-pointers. In the 19 losses those numbers are 11.9 and 3.9. The Bearcats were 3-18 when shooting fewer foul shots than their opponents and attempted 92 fewer than opponents made in the 19 defeats. UC held teams to .212 shooting behind the arc in the nine wins and allowed .361 in the other 19. The Bearcats allowed just two three-pointers in the last four games.



SENIOR LEADERSHIP

During UC's midseason struggles, Laurie Pirtle turned to senior Edwina Williams, who was a favorite among her teammates but had played in only 10 games in her two and a half seasons of eligibility. Williams responded in the next six games, averaging 4.5 rebounds and 3.0 points in 19.2 minutes per game. She tallied 10 points and six rebounds in the win over Marquette and earned the first starts of her career against East Carolina and Charlotte.



Anne Stephens and Emy Ogide had 11 blocks in the two games. The Bearcats' 87 blocks last season was three short of the top five single-season block totals in school history. The school record of 96 is held by that 1983-84 squad.

SHUFFLING IT UP: In the last 17 games UC

used eight different starting lineups due to injuries and performance. Only one of those lineups was used more than twice. Eleven of the 13 players on the Bearcat roster started at least one game last year.

TALE OF TWO HALVES: The Bearcats were outscored by opponents in the first half of games by just 16 points in 28 games, 790-774. In the second half, however, UC was outscored by 110 points, a 3.9 point per game average. UC was only 7-5 in games it led at halftime.

ART OF THE STEAL: Junior reserve Bellva May was second on UC in steals with 38, but averaged 3.5 per 40 minutes played. She had five games with at least three steals. Micah Harvey led the team with 39, surpassing her career best of 22.

DEFENSIVE LOCKDOWN: The 31 points scored by Detroit in UC's 60-31 win on Nov. 21 was the 11th-fewest ever allowed by the Bearcats. It was the lowest total by a UC opponent since Robert Morris scored 29 on Nov. 20, 2001. It was also the fewest points ever scored by Detroit. The seven blocked shots by the Bearcats equalled the second-best UC single-game total at the time.

BALANCED ATTACK:

UC received contributions from a number of different sources offensively. Seven different players led UC in scoring and nine different players recorded a total of 68 double-digit scoring games. The Marquette game on Feb. 5 was the fifth of the season in which four Bearcats reached double-figures.

BLOCK PARTY: UC recorded 15 total blocked shots in back-to-back games against Arkansas and UAB. The eight against the Lady Blazers was the second-highest single-game total in school history, trailing only the 12 rejections against Miami (Ohio) in Dec. 1983.

A DAY FOR THANKS

The day before Thanksgiving left much to be thankful for in Bearcat basketball at Fifth Third Arena. In the afternoon, the UC women came back from a 14-point deficit with fewer than nine minutes left to top Ball State, 62-58. Leslie Knoch's career-high 20 points led the comeback effort. Later that night, the men trailed Northern Iowa by 18 with 10 minutes left, but UC evened the score and eventually won, 76-70, in double overtime. The greatest comeback in Fifth Third Arena history was led by Jihad Muhammad's 23 points, nine coming in the final 2:50 of regulation.
