NOW IT'S TIME FOR THE BREAKDOWN

The No. 8/8 University of Cincinnati football team overcame a slow start to Murray State Saturday, outscoring the Racers 35-D over the second half. It had just 90 seconds of possession in the first quarter but had three interceptions (including Ja'Von Hicks' in the endzone on the opening drive) in the first half. UC scored TDs on four of its first five second-half possessions to break away. UC also moved to 25-1 in the Luke Fickell era when tied or ahead after the first period.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS

Cincinnati ranks fourth nationally in defensive pass efficiency and sixth on the offensive end. Six Bearcats account for the team's seven touchdown catches, led by Tyler Scott's two. He and Jadon Thompson also have a team-high five catches among 13 with a reception this season. Noah Davis' fourth-down TD grab (UC's first score of the game) was his first reception since having three for Michigan State in 2017. UC also has three scoring drives this season of one or two plays (the latter an 81-yard TD pass on the second snap of the Miami game). Defensively, the four takeaways came on the heels of having its nation-leading 20-game streak snapped in the opener.

THE COACHES

LUKE FICKELL, a two-time AAC Coach of the Year, is in his fifth season at UC. He has led the Bearcats to back-to-back 11-win seasons, the 2019 AAC East Division title and consecutive bowl wins in the 2018 Military Bowl and 2019 TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl. A veteran of 20 years in the FBS ranks, Fickell has been a part of two national championship squads, nine conference title-winning teams (seven as a coach, two as a player at Ohio State) with 16 postseason games and 13 NFL Draft selections.

TOM ALLEN is also in his fifth season there and was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year in 2020. His 24 wins were the most in program history over the first four years as head coach. His head coaching debut was in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl and previously had stops at South Florida (2015), Ole Miss (2012-14), Arkansas State (2011).

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS ...

- UC plays its 134th football season in 2021. The Bearcats program dates to 1885 and is one of the 10 oldest in the NCAA
 FBS. UC has won a league title six times in the last 14 years and has played 12 bowl games in the past 15 years.
- UC has won five of the last six American Athletic Conference FB Team Academic Excellence Awards and posted a schoolrecord GPA of 3.212 in spring 2021.
- UC entered with 31 wins over the last three seasons, including back-to-back 11-win campaigns in 2018 and 2019.
- · UC has won 22-straight at Nippert Stadium, going undefeated at home in three-straight seasons for the first time in history.
- UC ranked in the Top-10 of all three final national polls for the first time since the end of the 2009 regular season and started a season 9-0 for the fourth time in program history, along with 1951, 1954, 2009 and 2020.
- · UC had forced a turnover in 20-straight games, the longest active streak in FBS, before it was snapped in the Miami game.
- Picked to repeat as American Athletic Conference Champions, Cincinnati is coming off a 9-1 campaign in 2020, winning the
 AAC title and playing in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, a New Year's Six game. AP ranked UC as No. 8 in its preseason poll, the
 schools best-ever mark. USA TODAY had the Bearcats No. 10 in the preseason coaches poll.
- UC has won 11-straight season openers and 18 of 19 since 2005. The Bearcats are 89-36-10 (.694) all-time in lid lifters.
- The Bearcats return 16 starters from last season's squad, including Desmond Ridder, the 2020 AAC Player of the Year and Ahmad Gardner. a seven-time All-America selection. All-AAC selections Darrian Beavers, Marcus Brown, Bryant, Myjai Sanders, Tre Tucker, Whyle and Young also return.
- The 2021 roster has nearly 40 local players who grew up and played high-school football in the tri-state area.
- UC entered the season with a school-record season-ticket number of over 22,000, eclipsing the previous best of 18,836 set entering 2010. UC added nearly 5,000 new season tickets and sold 6,000 student season tickets.

On gameday, media should park in Clifton Court Garage and enter Nippert Stadium through Gate J. Masks will be required insde the Nippert Stadium West Pavilion and any interior spaces on campus due to current UC policies.

START ME UP

SEPTEMBER SLINGIN'

- · Cincinnati is seeking its third 3-0 start in Fickell's five vears at the helm.
- In addition to its perfect 2020 regular season, it also started 6-0 in 2018 and reeled off nine wins in a row after a Week 2 loss in 2019.
- · Not only that, UC's 20-3 record (.870) win percentage in league play over the past three years is the highest mark in the AAC.

SCHOOL TIES

- · Indiana tight end Matt Bjorson's father, Kris, was a tight end at Cincinnati from 1989-92.
- Hoosier run game coordinator/offensive line coach Darren Hiller was the Bearcats' offensive line coach from 2013-15, including when UC broke 18 offensive school records in 2015.

RECENT BIG TEN GAMES

· Cincinnati's last win over a Big Ten foe was Sept. 10, 2016, a 38-20 win at Purdue. More recently, it fell at Michigan in 2017 and Ohio State in 2019.

COACH FICKELL

- · The University of Cincinnati football team opened a new era in December 2016 with the hiring of Ohio native Luke Fickell, the Bearcats' 42nd football head coach.
- · The 21-year veteran of the FBS coaching ranks took the reins of the UC program after spending 16 years at his alma mater, Ohio State. His impressive resume includes being on the staff of two national championship winning teams, seeing 18 players selected in the NFL Draft, coordinating outstanding defenses over 12 seasons as a co-coordinator or defensive coordinator, winning AAC Coach of the Year honors in 2018 and 2020 and leading the Bearcats to an AAC Championship in 2020.

31 wins over the 2018-20 seasons, including back-toback 11-win campaigns in 2018 and 2019, the 2020 AAC title, an AAC East Division Championship in 2019 and three-straight bowl games, including the 2021 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, the program's first New Year's Six game since 2009.

SAUCE

- · CB Ahmad 'Sauce' Gardner earned recognition on five All-America teams following the 2020 campaign. including first-team honors from the Football Writers Association of America and USA Today along with second-team accolades from the American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the Athletic.
- The First-Team All-AAC selection tied for second in the AAC's with nine passes defended and tied for fourth with three interceptions in the regular season. In nine starts, he added 28 tackles and shared a sack. According to ProFootballFocus.com, Gardner allowed the third-lowest passer rating in the FBS in coverage in 2020, making more plays on the ball than first downs allowed.

SUPER SENIORS

- · Six players, LB Darrian Beavers, DT Curtis Brooks, DT Marcus Brown, CB Coby Bryant, and LB Joel Dublanko elected to use their additional year of eligibility from COVID-19 to return to school for another season.
- OB Desmond Ridder & DE Mviai Sanders are NFL prospects who chose to return to UC.

BUILT FORD TOUGH

- · Senior running back Jerome Ford has continued his ascent in the UC backfield. Over his first three collegiate seasons (two at Alabama), he increased his carries (7-24-73), yards (37-114-483) and TDs (0-3-8).
- · This year, he has 30 carries for 234 yards and 4 TDs, averaging 7.8 ypc. Ford also had a 79-yard TD run against Georgia in the 2021 Peach Bowl.

NEWCOMERS TO WATCH

· Incoming transfers DL Jowon Briggs (Virginia), LB Devin Hightower (Michigan State) and OL James Tunstall (Stony Brook) joined the squad in the offseason.

OB 1

- · OB Desmond Ridder, the 2020 American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year, 2021 AAC Championship Game Most Outstanding Player and 2018 AAC Rookie of the Year, helped lead the Bearcats to an AAC Championship and the team's first New Year's Six appearance since 2009.
- A finalist for the Manning Award, Ridder has 23 career rushing TDs, most ever for a UC QB and tied for No. 8 in the Bearcats annals.
- · He is the active career leader in winning percentage among NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision signal callers, winning over 88% of his career starts.
- · Ridder is the No. 2 passer in school history, throwing for 7.443 yards and 63 touchdowns. He was a 2020 finalist for the Manning Award and semifinalist for the Maxwell and O'Brien Awards
- · He became a father during the spring to a baby girl with his partner, Claire.

· UC tied for the national lead with three honorees on

- Bruce Feldman's annual Freaks list.
- Myjai Sanders a 6-5, 259-pound DE, ran a 4.56 40 this offseason and 4.10 in the shuttle. He also has a 10-2 broad jump and 35-inch vertical.
- Alec Pierce, the big play, 6-3, 213-pound WR, broke the program skill-position record with a 675-pound deadlift. He also boasts an 11-foot broad jump, 40-inch vertical and 4.45 40.
- Desmond Ridder has clocked a 4.55 40 to go with a 10-8 broad jump, 4.00 shuttle and 36-inch vertical.

HOMEGROWN

- · Since Head Coach Luke Fickell's arrival in Cincinnati in late 2016, the recruiting focus has shifted to the State of Cincinnati, a 50-mile radius around campus along with a 300-mile radius which covers Ohio and more.
- · During Fickell's first spring in 2017, 11 scholarship players hailed from Ohio and entering 20, the number has jumped to 45 Ohio scholarship players.
- The 2021 roster projects to have nearly 40 local players who grew up and played high-school football in the tristate area

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS

- · For the first time, UC enters a season under Fickell with a target on their back as the projected league favorite with a Top-10 preseason ranking.
- UC won the 2020 AAC Championship, its 15th league championship, first title since 2014 and first outright crown since 2009.
- · UC was playing in its second-straight AAC title game.
- · The AAC Championship game, played on Saturday, Dec. 19 at Nippert Stadium marked the latest date a game was played in Nippert since a matchup vs. Xavier on Dec. 7, 1918.
- It was UC's first December home game since defeating Houston for a share of the AAC titled on Dec. 6, 2014.

DOUBLE DUTY

UC radio voice Dan Hoard also serves as the PXP man for the Cincinnati Bengals, making him part of a select group. Hoard joins Bill Hillgrove (Pittsburgh Panthers & Steelers) and Gene Deckerhoff (Florida State/Tampa Bay Buccaneers) as the only broadcasters in the country to handle radio PXP duties for an NCAA FBS and NFL team. ESPN CFB commentators Wes Durham (Atlanta), Dave Pasch (Arizona) and Bob Wischusen (NY Jets) are NFL radio voices.

ALL OF THE LIGHTS

- UC has been playing night games at Nippert Stadium since 1928 with a .763 win percentage in night games at Nippert Stadium over the last 12 seasons.
- UC is 11-1 in its last 12 night games and has won threestraight Friday-night games at Nippert.

LET IT FLY

 UC's 2021 preseason was featured in a six-part miniseries titled LET IT FLY, which aired weekly on YouTube leading into the season. The internallyproduced series took Bearcats fans from offseason workouts, behind the scenes of Camp Higher Ground and into game week. Produced by Kelsey Sharkey, Eichel Davis and the internal creative unit, the series granted fans an all-access look at preparations for 2021.

- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Higher Ground has two 100-yard turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

BACK IN BLACK

- UC has won 19 straight games in black jerseys, dating back to a 22-21 win over UConn on Nov. 25, 2017.
- · UC has also won three consecutive Friday-night games.

DEMON IN PROFILE

- TE Josh Whyle was UC's leading receiver last year with 25 receptions for 318 yards and five TDs.
- He made his first career start against Memphis and had four receptions for 36 yards on five targets.
- Pro Football Focus named him a Third-Team All-America selection and he also snaged PFF All-AAC honors along with Second-Team All-AAC accolades from the coaches.
- His 23-yard TD reception in the 2021 opener was both his seventh score and 20-plus-yard reception.

UNDER PRESSURE

- K Cole Smith connected on a 34-yard field goal in the final seconds vs. Tulsa to clinch the AAC Championship.
- UC last won a game on a final second field goal was on Nov. 16, 2019 when Sam Crosa kicked a 37-yard field goal to give Cincinnati a 20-17 lead over USF.
- Smith sent the 2018 SMU game into overtime with a 41yard kick at the gun which he made three times after the Mustangs used timeouts to freeze the kicker twice.
- For his career, Smith is 14-for-26 on field goals and made his only 40-plus-yard try last year. He nailed a career-long 50-varder against Tulsa in 2019.

FAIRLY LOCAL

 Head Coach Luke Fickell picked up win No. 37 at Cincinnati with the victory vs. Murray State. He is third on UC's all-time coaching chart and just outside of the top five in games coached (51) and winning percentage (.725).

SPEED OF SOUND

 KR Tre Tucker had a 97-yard KOR TD in the third quarter vs. USF, a career-long return for Tucker, his first career KOR score, the seventh-longest play in school history and UC's first kick return TD since Ralph David Abernathy IV vs. Vanderbilt in the 2011 Liberty Bowl.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

 UC entered the year as one of four FBS teams to go undefeated at home the last two seasons (Ohio State, Clemson, Notre Dame). Ohio State's loss to Oregon on Sept. 11 moved UC to No. 3 nationally for longest-active home win streaks (22).

A SALUTE TO THE LETTER ZERO

- RB Charles McClelland became the first player in school history to wear the No. 0 in a game.
- McClelland switched numbers after tearing his left ACL in preseason camp leading up to the 2019 season.
- He tore his right ACL at SMU and missed the rest of 2020.
- · LB Darrian Beavers joins him in O this season.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK

- UC trailed 14-3 early in the second quarter at UCF before scoring 16 points to lead 19-6 at the half and were down 25-22 at the end of the third quarter before winngin 36-33.
- UC had 2019 comeback wins over USF (10), ECU (12), then No. 18 UCF (6) and Miami (0H) (10).
- UC put together six come-from-behind wins in 2018, earning victories after facing deficits at UCLA (10), vs.
 Ohio (21), vs. Tulane (4), at SMU (2), USF (6) and vs.
 Virginia Tech in the Military Bowl (3).

LIGHT UP THE SKY

- UC is a crafty veteran in stadium lighting, first starting in 1909 out of sheer necessity, as the large number of coop students on the team could only practice after dark.
- As technology improved, UC's electrical engineering co-ops designed a lighting system which allowed UC to host one of the first night football games in the U.S. and the first in the Midwest on Sept. 29, 1923, opening the season at night with a 17-0 win over Kentucky Wesleyan.

CHEER CINCINNATI

- UC serves as an economic powerhouse for the Queen City, with more than 15,000 employees, 46,000 students, 300,000 living alumni and countless Bearcats fans.
- Among the state's five counties in southwestern Ohio, UC generates a whopping \$3.3 billion annual impact.
- UC is the 18th-oldest public institution in the United States and traces its origins to the founding of the Medical College of Ohio and Cincinnati College in 1819.

FOOTBALL HISTORY



HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

The University of Cincinnati football program dates to 1885 and ranks as one of the 10 oldest in major college football and holds an all-time mark of 637-593-50 entering its 133rd season. UC has won a conference championship six times in the last decade while playing in the postseason in 12 of the last 15 years. UC played in the American Athletic Conference title game for the first time in 2019 and won the championshp game in a 2020 return trip. The Bearcats have tallied 121 wins since 2007, ranking among the Top-15 teams in the NCAA FBS. In 2010, UC reached as high as No. 3 in all three major polls (Associated Press, USA Today, Bowl Championship Series).

A TOWER OF STRENGTH

UC's football program is one of the nation's oldest — only Rutgers (1869), Michigan (1879), Navy (1880), and Minnesota (1883), among NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision institutions, predate Cincinnati, which began the sport in 1885.

THE ROCK OF TRUTH

UC has been involved in several historic college football milestones starting with Dec. 8, 1888. That day, the Bearcats and Miami (Ohio) University engaged in the first college football game played in the state of Ohio, launching a rivalry that is tied for the oldest in the game among major universities — North Carolina vs. Wake Forest began playing that same year. The Battle for the Victory Bell is the fifth-most played rivalry series in college football.

ALWAYS ON THE SIDE OF INNOVATION

A few years later in 1897, UC received an invitation to visit New Orleans to play a football game as a reward for a successful season, a precursor to the current postseason football bowl games.

Cincinnati has been to 16 bowl games over the last 20 seasons and 20 in the program's 133 seasons. UC played in the first Bowl Championship Series, now New Year's Six, game in school history taking on Virginia Tech in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl on Jan 1 2009. The Bearcats returned to the New Year's Six in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl on Jan. 1, 2021 in Atlanta.

In the 1930s, a UC football player wore a device with his helmet to protect his broken nose. The device was a forerunner of the now standard face mask. The first soccer-style place kick was also attempted by a Bearcat, Hank Hartong, in the early 1960s.

THE CHART TOPPERS

In 1968, the Bearcats were the nation's top passing team with quarterback Greg Cook leading the NCAA in total offense, while receiver/kicker Jim O'Brien captured the national scoring title. A year later, Cook earned Rookie of the Year honors as a Cincinnati Bengal, and two years later, O'Brien kicked the game-winning field goal for the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl V.

ALL-AMERICA TRADITION

Forty-five Bearcats have earned All-America recognition. Mike Woods garnered first-team honors in 1977, earning him an appearance on Bob Hope's television special. Punter Kevin Huber became the first two-time First-Team Associated Press all-American in UC history when he earned the honor in 2007 and 2008.

"THE TOE"

Jonathan Ruffin received the Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker in 2000 after booting a record 26 field goals. He was presented the award by ESPN's Chris Fowler. Ruffin was also a consensus all-American that year.

OUR CRADLE OF COACHES

Coaching luminaries have patrolled the sidelines at Cincinnati. College Football Hall of Fame coach Frank Cavanaugh began his 24-season career at UC. Sid Gillman, a member of the College and NFL Halls of Fame, was the architect of one of the top eras of Cincinnati football history. He directed the Bearcats to three conference titles and a pair of bowl game appearances during his six seasons (1949-54) before leaving for the professional ranks. Cincinnati, with Gillman developing the passing offenses which would make him successful in the pro ranks, became known for its aerial attack in the early 1950s. That notoriety continued long after his departure. Current Head Coach Luke Fickell enters his fourth year with the program.

THE NEXT LEVEL

With more than 100 players advancing into the professional ranks and 12 earning Super Bowl wins, 45 earning all-America honors, and 11 garnering academic all-America recognition, Cincinnati football has clearly made an important impact on college football with its long history of accomplishments

TROPHY GAMES

The Bearcats are involved in three trophy games. UC's annual clash with the Miami RedHawks is tied for the third-most-played series in college football history and the second-longest active rivalry in the FBS. The winner of the yearly fall battle claims the Victory Bell. The winner of the UC-Louisville contest takes home the Keg of Nails, while the winner of the UC-Pittsburgh game stakes claim to the River City Rivalry Trophy. UC currently holds two of the three trophies.

UPSET CATS

Cincinnati has been dangerous to top teams over the years, knocking off the likes of No. 8 Wisconsin, 17-12, at home in 1999, upending defending national champion Penn State in 1983 14-3 on the road, and dominating Virginia Tech. 16-0, in 1995 while allowing just 41 yards of offense. However, possibly the biggest upset in UC history came in 2006 as the Bearcats beat its highest-ranked opponent in Nippert Stadium history, blowing away then-No. 7 Rutgers, 30-11.

CHAMPIONSHIP FOOTBALL

With 121 wins since the 2007 season, the Bearcats have become relevant on the national stage once again. Between 2008-12, UC became the only FBS AQ school to earn four conference championships in five seasons. The 2008 BIG EAST Conference Championship was the school's first since 1956. UC finished with a school-record 12 wins in 2009 and finished No. 3 in the Bowl Championship Series standings. The 2008 and 2009 squads made the first two BCS appearances in school history, playing in the Orange and Sugar Bowls, respectively. The Bearcats added BIG EAST titles in 2011 and 2012 along with their first American Athletic Conference title in 2014. UC made a school-record five-straight bowl appearances between 2011-15, playing in the Liberty, Belk - twice, Military and Hawai'i bowls. The 2020 season saw UC return to the Top-10 in all three national polls, AP, USA Today and College Football Playoff, for the first time since 2009, including UC's highest CFP ranking, No. 7 on Nov. 22 and 28, 2020.



NIPPERT STADIUM



CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM HAS BEEN THE VENERABLE HOME OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI FOOTBALL TEAM SINCE 1901 AND PROVIDES A PHENOMENAL HOME-FIELD ENVIRONMENT.

A MODERN CLASSIC

- · The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon, privately funded renovation and expansion project.
- · The post-renovation season in 2015 coincided with the 100th anniversary of the original 1915 construction.
- UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901. making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- Among NCAA FBS schools. Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913). Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State -1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).
- · Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its earlycentury brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal. while remaining a classic showplace for college football.

FOR THE FANS

- · Both concourses were renovated and widened and now feature nearly 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations are available on game days.
- Concession stands feature the usual stadium staples along with offerings from premium local vendors, including Frisch's, Montgomery Inn and Skyline Chili.
- Enhancements were added in 2019, including: new tailgating spots, social gathering spaces, fans-first pricing and a season-long DJ for in-game entertainment.

THE WEST PAVILION

- · The most striking changes sit five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long, the West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.
- · The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels; the Margaret & Michael Valentine press and suite level, suite level, scholarship club level. and patio suites mezzanine level.
- UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1.100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

- · The 2015 project was the latest in a series of enhancements that began in 1916 when the stadium was completed, section-by-section, as funds were raised.
- The Cincinnati Bengals played at Nippert from 1968-69 and MLS' FC Cincinnati currently calls Nippert home.
- Nippert has served as a venue for numerous concerts and events, including speeches by US Presidents, Franklin D. Roosevelt (1936) and Barack Obama (2008).
- · USA Today named it the best home-field venue in the former BIG EAST Conference and ESPN's Scott Van Pelt cited Nippert as a "one of the gems of college football".

WHAT'S IN A NAME?



During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.

His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924.

The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

HEAD COACH LUKE FICKELL

The University of Cincinnati football team opened a new era in December 2016 with the hiring of Ohio native Luke Fickell, the Bearcats 42nd football head coach.

The 21-year veteran of the FBS coaching ranks took the reins of the UC program after spending 16 years at his alma mater, Ohio State. His impressive resume includes being on the staff of two national championship winning teams, seeing 14 players selected in the NFL Draft, coordinating outstanding defenses over 12 seasons as a co-coordinator or defensive coordinator. winning AAC Coach of the Year honors in 2018 and 2020 and leading the Bearcats to an AAC Championship in 2020.

Fickell, starting his fifth season at UC in 2020, has led UC to 31 wins over the last three season, including back-to-back 11-win campaigns in 2018 and 2019, the 2020 AAC title, an AAC East Division Championship in 2019, three-straight bowl games, including the 2021 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, the program's first New Year's Six game since 2009.

Fickell led one of the more remarkable turnarounds in school history in 2018, rebounding from a 4-8 inaugural campaign with the third 11-win season in school history and a win in the Military Bowl. The 2018 American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, Fickell was a semifinalist for the George Munger Award and was tabbed for the watch lists for the Dodd Trophy and Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach the Year awards.

Establishing his T.E.A.M. culture on the Clifton Hts. campus, standing for Together Everyone Achieves More, UC has emerged as one of the teams to watch in the American, especially on defense where the UC has led the AAC in scoring defense in 2018, 2019 and 2020.

Fickell was hired on Dec. 10, 2016 and has been a tireless advocate for the UC program, speaking at numerous events and schools to continue to build the Bearcats brand inside the State of Cincinnati, the 50-mile radius surrounding campus.

An excellent recruiter with strong Ohio, Midwest and Florida relationships, a national presence and a discerning eye for talent, Fickell has put together four-straight impactful recruiting classes at Cincinnati. He was named the American. Football Coaches Association assistant coach of the year in 2010 and he was named a "top recruiter" in 2012 by both Rivals and ESPN.

The former standout football player, college graduate, NFL player, husband and father is most-noticed as a developer of talent.

His NFL Draft selections include first-round picks A.J. Hawk, Bobby Carpenter, Ryan Shazier and Darron Lee, NFL standout James Laurinaitis, along with Joshua Perry, Anthony Schlegel, Larry Grant, Marcus Freeman, Austin Spitler, Ross Homan and Brian Rolle and most recently UC players Cortez Broughton, Korey Cunningham and Josiah Deguara.

No stranger to championship-level football, Fickell was a part of nine Big Ten Conference titles (seven as a coach, two as a player), two national championship squads and 15 postseason games, including two College Football Playoff

From 2005-2016, Fickell-coached defenses at Ohio State ranked among the NCAA FBS Top-40 in yards-per-play allowed, averaging a ranking of No. 17 and earning its highest rank of No. 3 in 2016.

Fickell's coaching career began at Ohio State. After spending a year on the IR list with the New Orleans Saints, he was hired in 1999 as a GA at OSU by his college coach, John Cooper.

Fickell's first full-time coaching position came in 2000 under Lee Owens at Akron, spending two years as defensive line coach. Jim Tressel brought him to Ohio State as special teams coordinator in 2002 and he also worked with the defensive front on the BCA National Championship squad. He was named linebackers coach in 2004, and added co-defensive coordinator duties to his resume in 2005.

In May of 2011 he was asked to take over an Ohio State program staggered by the loss of its head coach, the unexpected departure of a star quarterback and on the cusp of NCAA penalties, and against stacked odds, he led the Buckeyes to a bowl game. Prior to his appointment to serve as head coach, he had been promoted to assistant head coach in March 2011.

He returned to his role as defensive coordinator and LB coach in 2012. Over five seasons, coaching under UC alumnus Urban Meyer, Fickell's defensive units were a big reason OSU went 61-5 and won the 2014 CFP National Championship.

Fickell was one of the founders of the 2nd & 7 Foundation in 1999 with teammates Ryan Miller and Mike Vrabel. The foundation promotes reading by providing free books and positive role models to kids in need while encouraging young | BOWLS COACHED IN athletes of the community to pay it forward.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Fickell is a graduate of DeSales High School, where he was a three-time, undefeated state wrestling champion. He played for the Buckeyes from 1992-96, redshirting the first year and then starting the next four seasons at nose guard. He started a then school-record 50 consecutive games between 1993 and 1996.

He graduated from Ohio State in 1997 with a degree in exercise science. Fickell and his wife Amy have six children: Landon, a freshman offensive lineman at LIC Luca, twin sons Aydon and Ashton, and twin sons Laykon and Lucian.


