BEARCATS LOOK TO EVEN ALL-TIME SERIES WITH UCF AFTER BYE WEEK

- · Cincinnati will travel to Orlando, Fla., to face the UCF Knights on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. ET (ESPN2).
- The Bearcats will look to even the all-time series to 5-5 and stop a two-game losing streak to the Knights.
- Cincinnati has used the bye week to bounce back and return health after falling to Texas Tech, 44-41, in a classic Big 12 shootout
 in Lubbock, Texas, in which the Bearcats were down to their fourth- and fifth-string running backs due to injury.
- The Bearcats' two losses are by a combined four points two opponents who are 10-1 -- Pitt (5-0) and Texas Tech (5-1).
- QB Brendan Sorsby had a history-making night and Jones AT&T Stadium in UC's last game on Sept. 28, throwing for 426 yards
 and four touchdowns and adding a team-best 52 rushing yards. His 478 total yards are the most by a Big 12 player this season
 and the fifth-most in UC history. He was named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week for a second time following his performance.
- · Cincinnati is 11-5 (69%) coming off a bye since 2015. UC also has an open week on Nov. 2 this fall.

THE CINCINNATI-UCF SERIES HAS BEEN MUST-SEE TV

- Cincinnati and UCF spent recent years at the top of the "Group of Five" prior to joining the Big 12 Conference in 2023, developing a rivalry along the way. The Knights won 25 straight games and two AAC titles in 2017 and 2018. Cincinnati actually handed UCF its first AAC loss in three years in a historic 27-24 Friday night win 2019 which propelled the Bearcats to back-to-back league titles and AP Top 10 finishes in 2020 and 2021. The 2019 win gave birth to a true freshman cornerback named Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner who had a pick-six in the game that sparked the victory.
- The Knights have won the last two matchups, including last year's 28-26 game at Nippert Stadium. Cincinnati had a chance to
 tie the game in the final minutes, but a two-point conversion failed. Corey Kiner and Ryan Montgomery both rushed for 100 yards
 as UC held a 515-393 edge in total yards in the 2023 contest, but turned the ball over twice.

BEARCATS BUILDING A RESUME

- The Bearcats are 3-2 with the losses coming by four total points to teams with a combined 10-1 record.
- Cincinnati has the nation's 11th-most efficient offense according to ESPN's Football Power Index.
- UC ranks second in the Big 12 and 16th nationally in total offense (485.0) and No. 11 nationally in first downs (118).
- Led by S Jiquan Sanks (five starts), 10 true freshmen have played a total of 409 snaps on offense or defense, which is already more than the 2021, 2022 and 2023 seasons combined (260). Sanks has 17 tackles and classmate LB Simeon Coleman has 16.
- TE Joe Royer (Ohio State transfer) leads all Big 12 tight ends in receptions (20), and is second in yards (262).
- P Mason Fletcher, a 2022 Ray Guy Finalist, is averaging 46.6 per punt. The single-season UC record is 46.9 by Kevin Huber (2007).
- DT Dontay Corleone, a 2022 All-American, returned to the starting lineup Week 2 after blood clots were discovered this summer.
 He was named to the PFF National Team of the Week after living in the backfield at Texas Tech, finishing with an 89.9 grade.
- · Corleone (2022), Fletcher (2022) and RG Luke Kandra (2023) are all AP Third Team All-Americans.
- RB Corey Kiner has two 100-yard games in 2024 and nine career 100-yard games. UC is 3-1 when he has 20+ carries.
- Kandra is the Big 12's top-rated right guard (77.8) according to PFF. Gavin Gerhardt is PFF's No. 2 C in the league (73.4). Led by Kandra and Gerhardt, UC is allowing pressures on dropbacks just 10% of the time - which is the third-fewest in the nation per PFF.
- Derrick Canteen (84.8) ranks as PFF's No. 1 Big 12 safeties and the third-best in the Power 4.

SORSBY LEADS UNDER CENTER

- Sorsby has proven to be one of the nation's top quarterbacks through five games in 2024, passing for 1,481 yards and 12 touchdowns with just one interception. He is completing 66.3% of his pass attempts and his 165.6 efficiency rating leads the Big 12. His QBR of 80.6 ranks No. 2 in the conference and 14th in the nation. His PFF grade (87.4) ranks second in the Big 12.
- Twice he has been named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week following Week 1 and Week 5.
- Prior to his prolific Texas Tech performance, Sorsby was dominant in a 34-0 win over Houston on Sept. 21. After missing on his first
 attempt of the game, Sorsby completed 12 straight passes. He finished 12-of-15 for 188 yards with three total TDs.
- Overall, he is 43-of-60 (72%) for 614 yards and seven total touchdowns over the last two games combined.

AN ELITE PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- Cincinnati, which started playing football in 1885, is in its 137th season and owns an all-time record of 665-610-50 (.521).
 Saturday's game against UCF will mark the 1,326th football game for Cincinnati.
- 2024 marks the 100th anniversary of the dedication of James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium. (See page 11 for more).
- The Bearcats hold an all-time record of 359-198-13 (.641) at Nippert Stadium, dating back to its dedication on Nov. 8, 1924.
- UC is 59-22 (.728) since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks among the Top 15 best FBS records during the stretch.
- Recent NFL stars with Cincinnati degrees include: Jason and Travis Kelce, Sauce Gardner, Jerome Ford and Alec Pierce.

DOUBLE DUTY

UC radio voice Dan Hoard also serves as the PXP man for the Cincinnati Bengals, making him the only broadcaster in the country to handle radio PXP duties for an NCAA FBS and NFL team. Hoard, entering his 25th season covering Cincinnati Football, will call games alongside Jim Kelly Jr., who is entering his 37th season calling UC Football. ESPN CFB commentators Wes Durham (Atlanta), Dave Pasch (Arizona) and Bob Wischusen (NY Jets) are NFL radio voices.

FOURTH DOWN WARRIORS

- Cincinnati is a perfect 5-for-5 on fourth down conversion attempts this season, one of three teams with a perfect conversion rate on multiple attempts, the other two being Minnesota (7-for-7), Old Dominion (4-for-4).
- · In addition, the Bearcats rank 12th in the country in fourth down defense. Opponents are just 3-of-11 (27.3%) when going for it on fourth down against UC.

- · Since the start of the 2015 season, UC is 11-5 when coming off a bye week. Its .688 winning percentage during that time is tied for 12th in the nation.
- The Bearcats have won five straight road games coming off a bye, including two ranked wins.

BRENDAN SORSBY COMMANDING THE OFFENSE THROUGH FIVE GAMES

- · Redshirt sophomore QB Brendan Sorsby is off to a terrific start as Cincinnati's starting quarterback. Through five games he has totaled 1,481 passing yards with 12 touchdowns and one interception while completing 66.3% of his passes (108-163).
- Sorsby ranks among the national leaders in several categories including passing yards (1,481, 15th), total offense (309.4, 16th), passing efficiency (165.6, 17th), points responsible for (90, 18th), and passing touchdowns (12, 18th).

- Sorsby received Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors for the second time this season following the Texas Tech game. He completed 31-of-45 passes against TTU for 426 yards and four touchdowns while adding 52 yards on the ground as well.
- · His 426-yard passing performance marked the highest total by a UC quarterback since 2015, as well, and the ninth-most in Cincinnati history. It's also the most by a Big 12 quarterback against an FBS opponent this fall.
- · Sorsby has been incredible in the first half of games this year, completing 70.7% of his passes (70-99) for 983

- yards and nine touchdowns with zero interceptions.
- He completed 12 straight passes at one point during the Houston game, the first UC quarterback to do that since Ben Bryant in 2022.
- Sorsby has been able to make a difference in the run game as well, as his three rushing touchdowns are tied for most on the team.

MORE ON SORSBY

- · Sorsby threw his first interception of the season at Texas Tech, snapping a streak of 160 consecutive pass attempts without an interception dating back to last season. He opened the year with 148 straight passes without a pick, the longest streak among FBS QBs.
- He threw for 681 yards over his first two games, the most for a Bearcat in his first two starts since Gunner Kiel's 689 vards in 2014.
- · Sorsby debuted as Cincinnati's starting quarterback vs. Towson and did it all in the Bearcats' win, throwing for 383 yards and accounting for four total touchdowns (2 passing, 2 rushing). For his efforts, Sorsby earned Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors.
- · In the Towson game, the Indiana transfer put up the most passing yards by a Cincinnati QB since Gunner Kiel threw for 386 yards on Nov. 14, 2015 vs. Tulsa.
- Sorsby was announced as Cincinnati's starting QB on Aug. 22, beating out redshirt junior Brady Lichtenberg and freshman Samaj Jones to earn the job.
- Sorsby played two seasons with the Hoosiers and threw for 1,587 yards and 15 touchdowns in 2023. The Denton, Texas native made seven starts at Indiana and added production on the ground as well as through the air. He rushed for 286 yards and four TDs last season, including 151 yards over the final three games of the year.

COREY KINER LEADING UC BACKFIELD ONCE AGAIN

- · Corey Kiner leads Cincinnati in rushing, tallying 413 yards on 67 carries with two touchdowns thus far.
- · He put up back-to-back 100-yard rushing performances against Pitt and Miami earlier this season and now has nine 100-yard rushing games in his career.
- Kiner was evasive in the Miami game, forcing 25 missed tackles. That figure ranked first among Power Four players that week, according to PFF.
- UC is 3-1 all-time when Kiner records at least 20 carries.
- Kiner also led UC in rushing vs. Pitt, carrying the ball 20 times for 149 yards, just four yards away from tying his career-high total.
- Kiner rushed for 1,047 yards a year ago, securing the 20th 1,000-yard season in UC history. His yardage total marked the 13th-best mark in school history.
- · The Cincinnati native (Roger Bacon HS) finished with six 100-yard games in 2023 — tied for the fourth-most in a single season in school history.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH **KINER IN 2024**

- · Kiner can become the first Bearcat to rush for 1.000 vards in back-to-back seasons since Mike Warren in 2018 and 2019 and the fifth to ever accomplish the feat. joining Warren, Isaiah Pead (2010-11), Reggie Taylor (1980-82), and James Bettis (1980-81).
- The Cincinnati native reached an impressive milestone against the RedHawks, pushing past 2,000 career rushing yards. His career total now stands at 2,142, while his career total at Cincinnati sits at 1,822.
- · After eclipsing 100 yards against Pitt and Miami, Kiner now has nine 100-yard rushing performances, which ranks tied for eighth in program history.

JOE ROYER EXPERIENCING BREAKOUT **SEASON**

- · Through five games, redshirt junior Joe Royer has been one of the most-targeted tight ends in the nation, and for good reason.
- · Royer has 20 receptions for 262 yards and two touchdowns this season. He leads all Big 12 tight ends in receptions and ranks second among conference TE's in receiving yards.
- · In his last game against Texas Tech, Royer caught a career-best seven balls for 66 yards.
- Royer entered the season with four career receptions for 24 yards in three seasons at Ohio State
- Royer joined the program this past offseason as a transfer from OSU, and the Cincinnati native (Elder HS) turned heads in his first fall camp as a Bearcat.
- Royer battled through injuries during his three seasons at Ohio State and was a member of the 2022 team that made it to the College Football Playoff.

THE X(ZAVIER) FACTOR

- · Xzavier Henderson has picked up where he left off last season and has been UC's top WR through three games.
- · Henderson leads Cincinnati in receptions (32) and receiving yards (453) and has led the team in receptions and yards in four of the first five games.
- · Henderson ranks eighth in the Big 12 in catches and sixth in receiving yards.
- · He caught two touchdown passes against Houston, the first multi-TD performance of his career.
- Henderson set season highs against Migmi, hauling in 10 catches for 108 yards. The performance was his sixth career 100-yard receiving game, five of which have come at UC, and his second career game with doubledigit receptions.
- · His performance vs. Miami earned him a PFF grade of 87.4, which ranked fifth among Power Four wide receivers last week.
- · Henderson's first season with the Bearcats in 2023 was a smashing success as the Miami. Fla. native was the team's leading receiver and earned All-Big 12 honors. He tallied 994 all-purpose yards and caught 58 passes for 782 yards as a receiver.
- · Henderson was a track star in high school as well, winning the Florida 4A state 400m title in a blazing fast 46.77 time. He was a U.S. Army All-American too.

FEW CAN BOOT 'EM LIKE MASON **FLETCHER**

- · Senior punter Mason Fletcher has already positioned himself as one of the top punters in the country through his first three collegiate seasons, and he's off to another great start this year.
- Fletcher has punted 14 times for an average of 46.6 yards per punt, which ranks third in the Big 12. He has booted six punts of at least 50 yards, which ranks tied for

fourth in the conference.

- Against Miami, the Melbourne, Australia native punted five times and placed three inside the 20-yard line.
- Fletcher's career punt average stands at 44.5, which ranks seventh among all active FBS punters and first among Big 12 punters.
- Fletcher, a 2022 All-American and the 2022 AAC Special Teams Player of the Year, ranked fourth in the Big 12 last season in punting (43.0) while battling injuries. He was one of two Big 12 punters to not record a touchback and also pinned 23 punts inside the 20-yard line.

CAPTAIN CANTEEN

- · Despite never taking a snap as a Bearcat, Canteen was voted by his teammates as a team captain prior to the 2024 season.
- Canteen is the Big 12's top-ranked safety according to PFF (84.2). Virginia Tech transfer Canteen has started all five games this season and has 18 tackles, 1.5 TFL, one interception, and three pass breakups.
- Canteen draws inspiration from his father, who spent many years in the military: "Being raised in that environment helped instill discipline and affected my character and the way I treat people. I remember watching my dad get ready in the morning and seeing how detail-oriented he was and the work ethic he showed. I also learned that treating people with respect aoes a lona way."
- The Georgia Southern and Virginia Tech transfer has impressed coaches and players alike with the way he carries himself on and off the field.
- Canteen, who has played in 42 games in his collegiate career, is entering his sixth season of college football.
- The Evans, Ga. native was tabbed by head coach Scott Satterfield to represent UC at Big 12 Media Days in July, and his teammates voted him as one of four season-long captains at the end of fall camp in August.

THE RETURN OF "THE GODFATHER"

- · Dontay Corleone was named to PFF's National Team of the week following the Texas Tech game. He totaled four tackles, one TFL, and one QB hurry while taking on constant double teams from the Red Raiders' O-line.
- After missing much of fall camp, Corleone returned to action vs. Pitt, starting the game at defensive tackle and reaistering six tackles and one tackle for loss.
- He totaled 52 snaps in his 2024 debut and an 81.0 rush grade according to PFF, the second-best mark among Big 12 interior defensive linemen that week.
- Corleone, a 2022 All-American and preseason All-Big 12 selection this fall, was cleared to play in games by the Cincinnati Athletics sports medicine staff just five days before the Pitt game on Tuesday, Sept. 3, when he participated in his first full practice since June.
- Corleone was sidelined on June 28 with a non-football medical issue. He was treated for blood clots found in his lungs, discovered after he reported chest discomfort and shortness of breath to the Cincinnati athletic trainers.
- Led by Senior Associate Athletic Director of Sports Medicine Aaron Himmler and team physician Dr. Jon Divine. Cincinnati sports medicine staff. Corleone and his family met with several physicians and specialists to develop a personal medical plan for the Cincinnati native to return to football activities safely.
- · Corleone had been a limited participant in every practice during training camp.

JARED BARTLETT QUARTERBACKING THE DEFENSE

· Redshirt senior linebacker Jared Bartlett is in his first season with the Bearcats and has made his presence

- immediately felt.
- · He leads Cincinnati in tackles (24) and has added four tackles for loss, two sacks, two QB hurries, and two pass breakups as well.
- Bartlett transferred to UC from West Virginia, playing 50 games for the Mountaineers from 2019-23 He earned two Iron Mountaineer Awards in 2022 and 2023, presented to the most outstanding performers in WVU's offseason strength and conditioning program.
- · He is the brother of former Pittsburgh Steelers defensive lineman and All-American at Notre Dame Stephon Tuitt.

LONGEST TENURED BEARCAT MAKING IMPACT ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- Redshirt senior defensive end Eric Phillips is in his sixth year with the program, making him the longest tenured player on the team.
- · Phillips has started all five games this season and leads UC with 4.5 TFL and four sacks and is second with three QB hurries.
- · He posted two sacks in the win at Miami (Ohio) to help reclaim the Victory Bell.
- · His four sacks are tied for second in the Big 12.
- · Phillips has appeared in 45 games in his career at UC and has made 27 straight starts dating back to 2022.
- · The Cincinnati native (Colerain HS) has a 19-month old daughter, Ezyla Phillips.

JIQUAN SANKS MAKING IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- · Freshman Jiauan Sanks has started in the secondary for Cincinnati in every game this season and has 17 tackles.
- · When he took the field for the first defensive snap against Towson, Sanks became the first true freshman position player to start the season opener for the Bearcats since DE Marquise Copeland accomplished the feat against Alabama A&M nine years ago (2015).
- Copeland, a Super Bowl Champion with the Los Angeles Rams in 2022, was the first since DT Terrill Byrd and CB Mike Mickens made their first career starts in the 2005 season opener against Eastern Michigan.

EVAN PRYOR: HOME RUN HITTER

- · Ohio State transfer running back Evan Pryor started his Cincinnati career with a bang against Towson, taking his first carry all the way to the house for a 64-yard touchdown.
- · In the Miami game, Pryor outdid himself with a 65-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, the longest run of his career and tied for the longest by a Big 12 player this season. He is the only Big 12 player with multiple 60-yard runs.
- · Pryor rushed for 105 yards vs. Towson on just four carries, ending the game as UC's top rusher while collecting his first career 100-yard performance.

GERHARDT: CENTER OF GAVIN ATTENTION

- Redshirt senior offensive lineman Gavin Gerhardt has been UC's starting center for each of the past two seasons, anchoring the offensive line since 2022.
- Gerhardt is the Big 12's second-ranked center according to PFF and his 28 knockdowns lead all UC offensive
- · The Xenia, Ohio native has started 31 games in his career and each of his last 16 games played. He was placed on the Rimington Trophy preseason watch list.
- · Gerhardt's 29 starts as a Bearcat are most on the team.
- Gerhardt helped pave the way for UC's outstanding run game last season that ranked fifth in the nation (217.1). He was the third-highest rated center in the Big 12

according to PFF (73.4) and his 79.7 run block grade was the highest of any center in the conference and sixthbest in the country.

NATHAN HAWKS MAKES GRAND FIRST IMPRESSION AT MIAMI

- Senior Nathan Hawks took over as UC's placekicker at Miami and started his FBS career with a bang.
- · Hawks' first field goal attempt of his FBS career was a 55-yarder near the end of the first quarter at Miami, which he comfortably booted through the uprights. It was the longest field goal by a UC kicker since 2007 and tied for the second-longest in program history. He also connected on a 50-varder in the fourth auarter.
- Hawks, who transferred to UC prior to the 2023 season after two years at Wittenburg, had only four collegiate field goal attempts in his career prior to this season.
- The performance put Hawks in incredibly rarified air. He is just the fourth FBS kicker since 1996 to have his first two career field goal attempts come from 50-plus yards and make both, joining South Carolina's Mitch Jeter (2022), North Carolina's Dan Orner (2002), and Texas A&M's Terence Kitchens (1999).
- · Additionally, Hawks and Michigan's Quinn Nordin (2017) are the only two FBS kickers since 1996 to make multiple 50-plus yard field goals in their first career FBS contest.

SHUTOUT TIDBITS

- · When Cincinnati shut out Houston on Sept. 21, it became the first team to shut out a "Power 4" opponent in 2024.
- · It was UC's first shutout since Nov. 3, 2018 vs. Navy and first shutout of a major-conference opponent was in 1995 at Virginia Tech.

O-LINE PICKS UP WHERE THEY LEFT **OFF**

- · Cincinnati returns its entire starting offensive line from a season ago as John Williams (LT), Dartanyan Tinsley (LG), Gavin Gerhardt (C), Luke Kandra (RG), and Deondre Buford (RT) are back for the 2024 season.
- · In the season opener against Towson, the O-Line started their 12th-straight game together dating back to last year and did not allow a sack in the 38-20 victory.
- · Overall, these five offensive linemen started 14 straight games together dating back to the 2023 season, a streak that ended vs. Houston after Tinsley missed the game due to injury.
- Behind the strength of its O-Line, UC ranked fifth in the nation in rushing in 2023 (217.1 ypg) and Corey Kiner turned in a 1,000-yard season at running back.
- · Cincinnati and Oklahoma State are the only two Big 12 programs to return their entire starting offensive lines and a 1.000-vard rusher.
- · Kandra was an All-American in 2023, earning that distinction from Walter Camp and the Associated Press. He earned preseason All-America distinctions from Walter Camp and ESPN prior to this season.

FOOTBALL LEGENDS MIKE WOODS, MARDY GILYARD ENSHRINED IN UC ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

- Former Cincinnati Football greats wide receiver Mardy Gilyard (2005-09) and linebacker Mike Woods (1975-77) were among those inducted into the James P. Kelly UC Athletics Hall of Fame on Friday, Sept. 20.
- Gilyard led the Bearcats to back-to-back Big East Championships and BCS bowl appearances in 2008 and 2009. When he wrapped up his career, the Bunnell, Fla., native ranked first in UC history in catches (204), receiving TDs (25), receiving yards (3,003), all-purpose yards (5,904), kickoff returns (93) and KO return TDs (4).
- Woods, who was Cincinnati football's first consensus All-American in 1977, died in 2009. His daughter Pasia Woods accepted in his honor. Nicknamed "War Daddy," he was a two-time team captain and was selected by the Baltimore Colts in the second round of the 1978 Draft, playing in 48 games in his NFL career.

THE NEW GUYS

- · Thirty-four players made their Cincinnati debut in the opener vs. Towson including true freshmen Jiguan Sanks, Gavin Grover, Simeon Coleman, Margavious Saboor, Dontay Weedon, and Devyn Zahursky.
- · On defense, seven Bearcats (Jared Bartlett, Kamari Burns, Derrick Canteen, Jake Golday, Rob Jackson, Josh Minkins Jr., Jiquan Sanks) made their first starts in a UC uniform.

CINCINNATI SHUTS OUT HOUSTON

- · Quarterback Brendan Sorsby connected with wide receiver Xzavier Henderson for two first-half touchdowns and the Bearcats' defense forced three turnovers as the Cincinnati football team raced past Houston, 34-0, to open Big 12 Conference play inside a sold-out Historic Nippert Stadium on Sept. 21.
- · After missing on his first attempt of the game, Sorsby completed 12 straight passes as Cincinnati scored the game's first 31 points. He finished 12-of-15 for 188 yards and two touchdowns, adding a third-quarter rushing score. He was 10-for-11 for 136 yards and those two scores to Henderson at halftime.
- · Junior linebacker Jake Golday and redshirt sophomore safety Antwan Peek Jr. tied for the team lead with seven tackles, a career-high total for the latter. Sixth-year safety Derrick Canteen tallied four stops, including 1.5 TFLs and a forced fumble.

BEARCATS RING THE BELL IN OXFORD

- · Cincinnati avenged last season's loss vs. Miami (Ohio) with a 27-16 win against the RedHawks in the Battle for the Victory Bell in Oxford on Sept. 14.
- · UC now holds a 61-60-7 all-time advantage in the rivalry, which dates back to 1888.
- The 128 meetings are the fourth-most among FBS rivalries behind Wisconsin-Minnesota (133), Georgia-Auburn (128), and North Carolina-Virginia (128).
- Senior running back Corey Kiner finished with 126 yards on 21 carries for his ninth-career 100-yard game. He also added a 1-yard touchdown run, making it three straight vears he has scored in the Battle for the Victory Bell.
- · Led by sixth-year senior defensive end Eric Phillips (career-best two sacks), the Bearcats held the RedHawks to only 24 rushing yards.

UC TAMES TIGERS IN OPENER

- · Cincinnati won its 23rd-straight home opener on Aug. 31 against Towson by a final score of 38-20.
- · The Bearcats' offense was humming all game, posting

- 658 total yards of offense against the Tigers. That total was the fifth-highest of any FBS team in Week 1.
- With the victory, Cincinnati has now won 23 straight home openers dating back to 2002. The streak began with a 36-29 triumph vs. TCU on Sept. 6, 2002.
- · The Bearcats are now 72-32-2 all-time against FCS
- Cincinnati improved to 43-16 at Nippert Stadium since the start of the 2015 season and 88-28 since 2000.
- UC is now 8-1 all-time in August games and has won its last seven.

YEAR TWO IN THE BIG 12

- · Cincinnati enters year two of Big 12 play after joining the conference in the summer of 2023.
- UC posted a 3-9 overall record last season in its inagural year in the league and won its first-ever Big 12 game on Nov. 11, 2023 at Houston
- · It was a challenging first season for the league's four new teams in 2023, as their combined record at the end of the season was 18-31 and only UCF reached bowl eligibility.
- More changes are coming to the Big 12 in 2024 as Texas and Oklahoma have left for the SEC and Arizona. Arizona State, Colorado, and Utah have joined the conference.

THE SCOTT SATTERFIELD FILE

- · Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield enters year two at Cincinnati after he was hired as UC's 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022.
- Satterfield's career record stands at 82-59 (.582) in 12 years as a head coach at Cincinnati, Louisville, and Appalachian State, holding a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games.
- He led the Mountaineers from the FCS to the FBS and to three straight conference titles.
- · He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.

- · A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinals to a six-win improvement in his first year.
- · Satterfield has deep ties to App State, serving as an assistant coach (1998-08) and guarterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way.

NEW DC TYSON VEIDT BRINGS **DEFENSIVE PROWESS TO CINCINNATI**

- · Tyson Veidt was brought in as the Bearcats' new defensive coordinator in the offseason after spending the last eight seasons at lowa State, where he built one of the top defensive units in the Big 12.
- · Under his tutelage, the Cyclones led the Big 12 from 2016-23 in several categories:
 - · Scoring Defense (23.2)
 - Total Defense (354.7)
 - · Yards Per Play Allowed (5.3)
 - · Rushing Yards Allowed (133.4)
 - · Yards Per Carry Allowed (3.8)
- · Veidt mentored four NFL Draft picks in the last three years at lowa State, including 2023 first-round selection and defensive end Will McDonald IV.

FLETCHER BROTHERS REUNITE IN CLIFTON

- Mason Fletcher welcomed his brother, Max, to the program this past spring as a transfer from Arkansas.
- · A fellow punter, Max ranked seventh nationally with a 46.9 punting average at Arkansas this past season.
- · He collected All-SEC Second Team honors from the coaches last fall, adding 23 punts of 50+ and 19 punts inside the 20-yard line for the Razorbacks. He tallied 59 punts and his 2,770 total punting yards led the SEC.
- · Max is expected to serve as the backup to his older brother while redshirting in 2024 before serving as the Bearcats' starting punter the following two seasons, while he pursues a master's degree.

2024 SCHEDULE PRIMER

- The Big 12 welcomed four new members for the 2024-25 season and UC will face two of them, hosting Arizona State on Oct. 19 before visiting Colorado on Oct. 26. The game vs. the Sun Devils is also Cincinnati's Homecomina Game.
- Cincinnati will also meet Texas Tech, Kansas State, and TCU for the first time as Big 12 Conference foes.

- · At the Nov. 9 game vs. West Virginia, UC will celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the dedication of Nippert Stadium.
- Below are brief capsules on Cincinnati's seven remaining games this season:
- at UCF (Oct. 12): Cincinnati and UCF have seen four of their last five matchups be decided by 4 or fewer points. The two teams were the premier Group of 5 programs headed into the last wave of realignment with Cincinnati capturing AAC Championships and New Year's Six bowl bids in 2020 and 2021 and UCF doing the same in 2017 and 2018.
- Arizona State (Oct. 19): The Bearcats will host the Sun Devils for the first time ever in ASU's first season in the Big 12. UC picked up a 34-7 victory in Tempe, Ariz., in 1954, and a 14-0 win at Arizona State in 1976. The victory in 1954 (Nov. 6) marked legendary coach Sid Gillman's final victory as the Bearcats' head coach. He took over as the Los Angeles Rams coach in the NFL the next season.
- at Colorado (Oct. 26): Cincinnati's more-than-1,200-mile trip to Folsom Field in Boulder, Colo. will be its longest away trip of the season as the Bearcats will welcome the Buffaloes back to the Big 12, which they were in from 1996-2010.
- West Virginia (Nov. 9): It will be the Mountaineers first trip back to Nippert Stadium since Isaiah Pead rushed for 175 yards and an injured Tony Pike split time at quarterback with Zach Collaros to lead Cincinnati to a 24-21 victory in 2009. The win kept UC a perfect 10-0
- at lowa State (Nov. 16): Cincinnati will make its first trip to Ames, Iowa to face the Cyclones in Jack Trice Stadium. The Bearcats' new defensive coordinator Tyson Veidt served as Iowa State's associate head coach/linebackers for the last eight seasons.
- · at Kansas State (Nov. 23): Cincinnati travels to Manhattan, Kansas to face the Wildcats for the first time since 1996. UC picked up home-away sweeps over Kansas State in 1951-52 and 1965-66 before falling twice in 1995-96.
- TCU (Nov. 30): TCU (2022) and Cincinnati (2021) the last two current Big 12 teams to advance to the College Football Playoff - will meet for the first time since three straight Conference USA matchups from 2002 to 2004. The Bearcats' 36-29 overtime victory over TCU at Nippert Stadium in 2002 kicked off a home-opener win streak that continues to this day (22 straight).

BY RUSH AND BY PASS

In 10 seasons as an FBS head coach, Satterfield's rush offense has always averaged at least 200 yards per game and his teams have ranked in the Top 30 nationally in rushing every year. Last season, he coached UC to the fifth-best rushing offense in the nation, the highestranked rushing offense of his head coaching career.

CORLEONE, DINGLE MAKE "FREAKS"

- · Redshirt junior defensive tackle Dontay Corleone and redshirt junior linebacker Jack Dingle were both mentioned in Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list.
- · It marked the second straight season that Corleone made the list and the fourth straight year that UC had multiple players mentioned.
- Excerpt about Corleone: "The Godfather is a rare talent. He's 6-1 and 330 pounds. He wears size 18 shoes and has size 11 hands. He benched 485 pounds but moves really well, clocking a 1.71-second 10-yard split and a 2.81 20. He has topped out at 18.7 mph."
- Excerpt about Dingle: Jack Dingle is 6-3 1/2, 240-pounds and built like an Adonis, coaches say. He benched 395 pounds this offseason and did 26 reps at 225. He clocked a 1.54-second 10-yard split, hit 21.99 mph on the GPS and had a 4.21 pro agility shuttle to go with a 33-inch vertical and a 9-11 broad jump."

ALL-AMERICA TRIO TO LEAD THE WAY **IN 2024**

- · UC returned three All-Americans in 2024 with Luke Kandra (2023), Dontay Corleone (2022), and Mason Fletcher (2022).
- · A preseason All-American (Walter Camp and ESPN) Kandra returns as the country's top-graded P4 right
- · Corleone, nicknamed "The Godfather", was an AP All-American in 2022 after ranking as PFF's highest-graded defensive player that year.
- · Fletcher was the 2022 AAC Special Teams Player of the Year and a Ray Guy Award finalist after booting 14 punts of 50+ yards and ranking fourth in the nation with a 46.2 punting average. His 53.5 average in Week 1 was the best in the Big 12.

GET TO KNOW THE BEARCATS

- The University of Cincinnati Department of Athletics competes at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics with the vision to reach Next Level Success for all 18 varsity teams and more than 450 student-athletes. The Bearcats have a proud athletics history, winning eight national championships and 118 conference titles. The Cincinnati men's basketball team is among the 15 winningest programs all-time, while the football team became the first non-Power Five program to compete in the College Football Playoff in 2021. Olympic gold medalist volleyball player Jordan Thompson, NBA Hall of Famer Oscar Robertson and Major League Baseball legend Sandy Koufax are among several luminaries who have competed as Bearcats.
- The Bearcats entered a new era as a Power Five School on July 1, 2023 when they officially joined the Big 12

- Conference, positioning Cincinnati among the nation's premier athletics programs.
- Off the field, UC student-athletes continue to find success, collectively posting a 3.4 GPA in spring 2023 with 78% earning spots on the Honor Roll.
- · Under the leadership of Director of Athletics John Cunningham, and supported by more than 150 full-time staff members, UC Athletics' mission is to connect our community, enhance our university and impact the lives of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world on and off the field.

AN ELITE PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- UC has positioned itself as one of the most successful programs in the country over the last several years.
- Cincinnati is 59-21 since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks ninth among FBS programs and is the best record among current Big 12 programs during that span.
- Cincinnati boasts an 92-51 record since the start of the 2013 season and has won three conference championships while advancing to eight bowl games. Two of its eight bowl trips have been to New Year's Six bowls: 2021 Peach Bowl and the 2021 Cotton Bowl Classic (CFP Semifinal).
- The Bearcats became the first-ever "Group of Five" team to advance to the College Football Playoff in 2021, defeating No. 9 Notre Dame on the road and finishing undefeated in the regular season along the way.
- Since 2009 (last 15 years) the Bearcats rank 19th in FBS with a 128-66 (.660) record and rank fourth among current Big 12 teams behind Oklahoma State, TCU, and Utah. They have won seven conference titles during that time, a number only matched by Alabama (9) Clemson (8) and Oklahoma (8).
- Cincinnati (2021) was one of just 15 teams to make the College Football Playoff in the four-team era (2014-23) and one of just two current Big 12 teams (TCU, 2022) to make it. UC was the only non-Power Five program to ever earn a CFP berth in the four-team format.

CFP+MF4 APPEARANCE

- Cincinnati is one of 11 schools and the only Big 12 institution - to have a Men's Final Four and College Football Playoff appearance in it's athletic history.
- · Cincinnati became the first non-Power 5 team to make the College Football Playoff after finishing as the nation's only undefeated team in 2021 and has advanced to six Men's Final Fours.

BEARCATS FIND NFL SCCESS

· Cincinnati has seen 16 Bearcats drafted since the start of 2021 — second-most in the Big 12 in that time span. The list includes Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, who was selected fourth overall by the New York Jets in 2022 and went on

- to earn All-Pro and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors
- While Gardner took the NFL by storm as a rookie, Travis and Jason Kelce turned in dominant seasons once again. The brothers, who both starred for the Bearcats more than a decade ago, each earned All-Pro and faced off in Super Bowl LVIII. The Kansas City Chiefs won the league crown and Travis Kelce was joined by fellow Bearcat Bryan Cook, a rookie safety.

BROTHERS NEW KELCE BRING HEIGHTS TO FIFTH THIRD ARENA

- · NFL superstars and former Bearcats Travis and Jason Kelce returned to campus on April 11 for a live episode of their podcast, New Heights.
- In front of more than 12,000 fans at Fifth Third Arena, the Kelces entertained for nearly four hours and gave attendees a night they'll never forget.
- The event began with the first-ever edition of the "Lombaby Games", which pitted UC student-athletes against traditional students in a series of mental and physical challenges.
- Following the games, Travis and Jason welcomed special guests Desmond Ridder, Orlando Brown Jr., and Joe Burrow to share stories and plenty of laughs that kept the crowd engaged all night.
- · The climax of the event came near the end, when director of athletics John Cunningham held a surprise commencement ceremony for Travis and Jason, who were not able to walk at their own araduation.
- The event had a seismic impact on social media, generating over 14 million impressions and over one million engagements. The final post of the night from the surprise commencement ceremony was the topperforming social media post in UC athletics history, and the top-performing post by any Big 12 main athletics Instagram account since 2021.

INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY COMING **IN 2025**

- · On Aug. 16, the final steel beam was installed at Cincinnati's Indoor Practice Facility, which is set to be completed in Spring 2025.
- · Spearheaded by Larry and Rhonda Sheakley's transformational giving and leadership, the new state-ofthe art facilities will elevate the Cincinnati student-athlete experience, giving Bearcats an unrivaled advantage on the playing field and on the recruiting trail.
- The 84,000 square-foot Indoor Practice Facility features a 120-yard football field equipped for multiple sports. The field will provide an all-weather home for Cincinnati football practices and year-round workouts and have direct access to the Performance Center's weight room. training room and performance nutrition fueling stations.

- The 96,000 square-foot Performance Center features three levels that will provide nearly everything a studentathlete needs to get competition and practice ready in one place, including offices for the football program.

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- · For the past 26 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- · The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Higher Ground has two 100-yard turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

- · UC won the 2021 and 2020 AAC Championships, its 15th and 16th league titles, for its first two since 2014 and first outright crowns since 2009.
- · UC played in its third-straight AAC title game in 2021.
- · Each of the last two were played at Nippert Stadium. UC toppled No. 16 Houston in 2021 after defeating No. 23 Tulsa on Cole Smith's game-ending 34-yard field goal. That first game, played on Saturday, Dec. 19 at Nippert Stadium, marked the latest date a game was played in Nippert since a matchup vs. Xavier on Dec. 7, 1918.



NIPPERT STADIUM DEDICATION 100TH ANNIVERSARY

Cincinnati Athletics will commemorate the 100-year anniversary of the dedication of Nippert Stadium during the entire 2024 football season, celebrating the life of stadium namesake Jimmy Nippert as the Bearcats' season-long theme. The celebration will take center stage Nov. 9, 2024 when the Bearcats face former BIG EAST rival West Virginia on Carson Field.

UC debuted a memorial shield this summer, which will be featured throughout the 2024 season. More information about the logo can be found on the graphic to the left.

Nippert was a center and captain on the 1923 football team when he sustained an injury on Thanksgiving Day against rival Miami (OH). He fell ill with blood poisoning and died on Christmas Day. Nippert's grandfather—James N. Gamble, son of the Procter & Gamble co-founder——donated \$250,000 for the completion of the stadium.

Nippert Stadium was officially dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924 before kickoff of a game against Oberlin. Members of the Nippert family joined UC staff, players from both teams, and representatives from universities in the region in a ceremony at the memorial in the south end of the stadium.

Nippert Stadium stands as the centerpiece of the University of Cincinnati's campus. Through several renovations, the stadium has modernized to feature suite levels and a press box in addition to premium seating. It now seats just under 40,000 fans, but remains in the middle of campus, adjacent to the Tangeman University Center. Nippert Stadium's turf is open to all students for recreation when not in use by the football or lacrosse teams for practices or games.

Various football season graphic elements and marketing materials, including season tickets, will incorporate throwback designs that pay homage to Jimmy Nippert and celebrate the stadium's rich history.

The 84,000 square-foot Indoor Practice Facility features a 120-yard football field equipped for multiple sports. The field will feature WiFi access and a remote-operated camera system for football as well as a scoreboard, state-of-the-art sound system and a built-in Catapult technology system.

The 96,000 square-foot Performance Center features three levels that will provide nearly everything a student-athlete needs to get competition and practice ready in one place:

- Offices for football program
- Performance nutrition station for all sports
- Fueling station for football
- Sports performance weight room
- Athletic training room

CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM

Carson Field at Nippert Stadium has been the venerable home of the University of Cincinnati football team since 1901 and provides a phenomenal home-field environment.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · In 2021, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season tickets sold, which has been broken in consecutive seasons.
- · The Bearcats sold out 18 straight home games from 2021-23.

A MODERN CLASSIC

- · In 1915, construction was completed on the first sections of a brick and concrete structure to replace the wooden stands and continued for several seasons as funds were raised.
- · In 1924, the completed structure was dedicated as James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium with a capacity of 12,000.
- UC has used the Nippert site as a playing surface since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- · UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

TQL PARTNERSHIP BOLSTERS NIPPERT **STADIUM**

· Total Quality Logistics (TQL), the secondlargest freight brokerage firm in North America and Cincinnati's largest private company, and UC announced in January 2023 a long-term strategic partnership that will include field level and stadium signage and logo assets for TQL as well as specific investment to the Bearcats' indoor practice and performance facility project.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.
- His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8,
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him
 - -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.
- · TQL's logo will appear on Carson Field in two
- While field surface branding typically results in renaming the venue, as a Cincinnati company, TQL has chosen to not name the field. It will continue to be named Carson Field in honor of Dr. Arch Carson, who organized the first football team at the university in 1885 and is known as the Father of UC Football.

HEAD COACH SCOTT SATTERFIELD | SECOND SEASON

2018 SUN BELT AND 2019 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield heads into his second season at the helm of the Bearcats, primed to elevate the program following the inaugural season in the Big 12 in 2023.

Hired by Cincinnati Director of Athletics John Cunningham on Dec. 5, 2022 as the 43rd head football coach at Cincinnati, Satterfield has compiled a 82-59 record (.582) in 12 years as a head coach with the Bearcats, Louisville Cardinals and Appalachian State Mountaineers.

He has earned a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games. He led the Mountaineers to three straight conference titles and four bowl appearances from 2013 to 2018 before taking over the Cardinals in 2019.

Satterfield steered the Bearcats' transition from the American Athletic Conference to the Big 12 in his first season at UC in 2023. Cincinnati's offense had 11 brand new starters for the 2023 season opener, returned only one scholarship wide receiver and featured 23 college transfers. Despite all of the turnover, the Bearcats still finished fifth in the country in rushing (217.1 ypg) and 33rd in total offense (426.1), and running back Corey Kiner authored just the 20th 1,000-yard rushing season in school history.

Right guard Luke Kandra collected All-America honors from the Associated Press and Walter Camp, while six other Bearcats grabbed all-conference honors.

In Satterfield's 11 seasons as an FBS head coach at Appalachian State, Louisville and Cincinnati, his teams have rushed for an average of 200 yards per game and finished among the nation's Top 30 rushing teams every season.

Additionally, Satterfield's offenses have been among the nation's most balanced, averaging both 200 yards passing and rushing every

Prior to coming to UC, Satterfield led Louisville to three bowls in four seasons. He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.

While at Louisville, he compiled a 25-24 record and saw 32 players collect All-ACC honors. Six Cardinals were selected in the NFL Draft during Satterfield's tenure as well.

In 2022, Satterfield led Louisville to a 7-5 mark and saw 13 players collect all-conference accolades. The Cardinals appeared in the College Football Playoff Rankings and beat two Top-25 teams. Louisville led the nation in total sacks (50), finished third in takeaways (30) and ranked 11th nationally and tops in the ACC in scoring defense (19.2).

The 2021 Louisville squad was led by a potent offense that averaged 31.6 points per game and ranked 21st nationally with 446.2 yards of total offense per game. Cunningham proved to be one of the country's top dual-threat quarterbacks, rushing for 1,031 yards and an ACC-leading 20 touchdowns while passing for 2.940 yards and another 19 scores.

Louisville was also explosive in 2020, leading the nation with nine plays of 60+ yards and six plays of more than 70 yards while ranking fifth in the ACC in total offense (444.2).

In 2019, Satterfield guided Louisville to the biggest turnaround in college football, increasing the Cardinals' win total by six and vaulting UofL to the Top 25 in total offense and rushing in his first year, Individually, Javian Hawkins broke the school record for rushing yards (1,525) by a running back, while wide receiver Tutu Atwell set the Louisville record for receiving yards (1,276) and tied the school mark with 12 TD catches.

Satterfield guided his alma mater to three consecutive Sun Belt Conference Championships and an impressive 51-24 record from 2013 to 2018. The Mountaineers held a 38-10 conference mark over six seasons. including a 34-6 record over five seasons in the Sun Belt.

Along the way, he became the first coach to lead a school from the FCS level to FBS and immediately earn three consecutive bowl wins. Satterfield directed Appalachian State to three straight conference titles and led the program to four straight bowl appearances.

In 2018, Satterfield led Appalachian State to a 10-2 record and an in-season ranking of No. 25 in the AP poll, capping the season with



a 30-19 victory over Louisiana to give the Mountaineers a win in the first-ever Sun Belt Conference Championship Game, securing a thirdstraight league title.

In 2017, during a 9-4 season that included a 7-1 run through the Sun Belt, the Mountaineers ranked among the Top 20 teams nationally in several categories, including No. 2 in fewest sacks allowed (eight).

The Mountaineers dominated both sides of the ball in 2016, finishing with a 7-1 league mark while allowing just 94 total points in eight Sun Belt aames. App State led the league in scoring defense (17.0 ppg), total defense (326.0 ypg), rushing offense (245.6 ypg), turnover margin (+8) and time of possession (33:25).

The 2015 season saw the Mountaineers finish 11-2--the 11 wins marking the highest total ever by an FBS program in its first season of bowl eligibility. App State completed the transition from the FCS to FBS by ranking among the Sun Belt's top two in 19 statistical categories and defeating Ohio, 31-29, in its first-ever bowl game, the Camellia Bowl in Montgomery, Ala. The 2015 campaign came on the heels of a breakout season in 2014, when Satterfield led the Mountaineers to an impressive 7-5 record in their first full season in the FBS ranks.

Satterfield helped Appalachian State win three consecutive FCS national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2007 as the quarterbacks coach and primary play-caller.

Amona his many highlights as an assistant in Boone, N.C., he mentored two-time Walter Payton Player of the Year and FCS All-American Armanti Edwards. He helped lead the Mountaineers to the historic 34-32 upset at No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Overall, he won six conference championships as an assistant and two as a player.

Satterfield started 27 games at quarterback for Spp State. He collected first-team all-conference honors in 1995 after passing for 1,461 vards and rushing for 649 more to help lead the Mountaineers to the only undefeated, untied regular season (11-0) in school history and a 12-1 final record. He graduated with a degree in physical education in 1996.

He was an assistant coach at App State, beginning as the wide receivers coach in 1998. He moved to running backs from 1999 to 2002. From 2003 to 2008 he coached guarterbacks, including calling plays from 2004 to 2008 and serving as an integral part of the Mountaineers' transition from Power-I to spread offense in 2004.

After a one-year stint as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Toledo in 2009 and a two-year tenure at FIU as the offensive coordinator and auarterbacks coach. Satterfield returned to coordinate the offense and coach QBs in 2012.

Satterfield and his wife, Beth, a former track and field athlete athlete at Appalachian State, have a daughter, Alli, and two sons, Bryce and


