UC Looks to Sustain Success

n2006, the UC men's soccer team did what no team at UC had done - win a BIG EAST Conference Championship. The Bearcats qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third time in school history and boasted a first-team all-American and MLS draftee in Omar Cummings.

The next step for the program is sustaining that level of success. That step begins in 2007.

"This year's team will face the challenge of handling the expectations that come with the level of success generated by recent teams," seventhyear head coach Hylton Dayes said. "We will have a young team with a solid core of returning players. Our success will depend partly on integrating the newcomers into our system and building the framework upon which our seniors can assume leadership roles."

The 2007 season cannot be looked upon as a rebuilding year. Despite the loss of six seniors, seven starters return and a talented recruiting class enters to help defend the Red Division title. With added depth and experience at each position, the UC program looks to cement itself among the elite soccer programs in the nation.

With Cummings out of the picture, senior Kenny Anaba becomes a marked man. The two-time all-BIG EAST selection has scored 16 goals over the last two seasons and figures to get a lot of attention from opposing defenses. He provides a physical presence at the forward position and is a good target player with his back to goal.

Freshmen Branden Stelmak and Richard Wilson should also see action up top. Stelmak earned NSCAA/adidas High School all-America honors as a senior and Wilson has played with the Jamaican U-20 national team.

A pair of starters return in the midfield in Patrick Baxter and Noah Davidson. Baxter's technical ability



combined with his high work rate makes him a threat in the attack. A Junior College all-American, Baxter made an immediate impact in his first season, scoring once and adding a pair of assists.

Davidson had a breakout year in 2006, scoring three goals and and adding two assists from the central midfield slot. He posted game winners against No. 12 Notre Dame and rival Louisville and finished third on the team with eight points.

Sophomores Marcus Hairston and Kieron Gradwell return to solidify the midfield ranks. Hairston has the speed and ability to contribute on the flank, while Gradwell is a hard-nosed defensive-minded midfielder who will seek increased time this season. Each scored a pair of goals in BIG EAST action in 2006. Also returning is sophomore Paul Hoste, who had a strong spring season and can contribute as an attacking midfielder or on the flanks.

Junior College all-American Scott Stockum looks to follow in the footsteps of former Cincinnati State products Cummings and Baxter and contribute with the Bearcats. Stockum scored 27 goals and added 32 assists during two seasons at Cincinnati State.

Defense should be a strength for the 2007 Bearcats as all four starting defenders return, including all-BIG EAST and all-region selection Amir Ikner. The Bearcats posted seven shutouts last season and with four starters returning, UC aims to accomplish that feat once again.

Ikner is joined by junior Brad Simpson in the center, forming a formidable twosome that creates havoc for opposing forwards. Ikner, an offensive weapon on free kicks and corner kicks, scored the game-tying goal against Pittsburgh. Simpson, also a target on set pieces, has yet to score collegiately, but racked up three assists last season.

Sophomore Judson McKinney, the team's Newcomer of the Year in 2006, and junior Lionel Jackson man the flanks. McKinney started all 19 matches as a freshman

in 2006 and showed great improvement as the season progressed. Jackson returned from a knee injury that kept him out of the 2005 season to put together a solid 2006 campaign, posting three assists.

Freshman Michael Hnat is a big, strong defender who will push for playing time in the back or in the midfield. Hnat has the athleticism and size to compete right away at the BIG EAST level.


Three-year starting goalkeeper Mike Vessells graduated and fifth-year senior John-Michael Boggs is the leading candidate to replace the all-conference keeper. Boggs played in three matches as Vessells' backup over the last three seasons with successful results, allowing just one goal, making four saves and posting a shutout.

Redshirt freshman Matt Williams returns after learning behind Vessells and Boggs in 2006. Freshman Miguel Rosales, a two-time Colorado High School Player of the Year, will also push for time between the pipes. He held a 44-10-6 mark as a starter and led his prep squad to a pair of state titles. Fellow freshman Isiah Castro will provide depth in net.

The schedule is not kind to a young team, as the Bearcats open with four of their first five on the road against quality opponents. Loyola (III.), an NCAA tournament team in 2006 is first up, followed by a trip to the New Mexico Invitational to take on the host and Central Florida. The BIG EAST schedule features home matchups with Seton Hall and St. John's, while road matches against Notre Dame, Louisville and USF loom.

"Our focus is on the BIG EAST and we schedule strong non-conference opponents not only to prepare for the league schedule, but to position ourselves in the NCAA at-large pool," Dayes said. "We hope to improve as the season progresses and use the early road trips as learning experiences for our young team."

"We have had some success in the past and we have earned some respect around the conference. Our next challenge as a program is to have sustained success on the national level."
