KICKOFF

Looking to improve its position entering the upcoming 2012 BIG EAST Conference Championship, the Louisville women's soccer team will close the regular season against rival Cincinnati on Friday at 7 p.m., ET at Cardinal Park. Prior to kickoff in the finale, the Cardinals will honor its senior class of Emily Cardell, Courtney Holtz and Chloe Kiefer. Live scoring for the match will be available through the women's soccer schedule page at UofLsports.com.

SERIES INFORMATION

Friday's match will be the 28th all-time between Louisville and Cincinnati with the Bearcats holding a 17-9-1 advantage in the series. In the last meeting between the two programs in 2011, the Cardinals earned a 1-0 win in Cincinnati to clinch their first ever BIG EAST National Division title. Louisville has the last meetings and eight of the last nine overall.

ABOUT THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

Cincinnati enters Friday's match at 4-12-1 overall and 1-9-0 in BIG EAST play after suffering a 3-1 defeat at Seton Hall and a 5-0 loss at Rutgers last weekend. Friday's game will be the season finale for the Bearcats, who have already been eliminated from contention for the 2012 BIG EAST Championship.

LAST TIME OUT FOR LOUISVILLE

Junior Charlyn Corral scored a pair of goals as Louisville earned its seventh shutout of the season with a 3-0 road victory over Seton Hall last Sunday afternoon at Owen T. Carroll Field. With the win, the Cardinals clinched a spot in the upcoming BIG EAST Championship.

Defensively, senior goalkeeper Chloe Kiefer turned away four Seton Hall shots to earn her 17th career shutout, which places her in sole possession of second place on the Cardinals' all-time list. Louisville had an 11-7 advantage in shots.

CARDINALS CLINCH BERTH IN 2012 BIG EAST CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP

With last Sunday's victory at Seton Hall, the Cardinals clinched a berth in the 2012 BIG EAST Championship and moved into third place in the National Division standings with 1.50 points per game. With a win on Friday against Cincinnati, Louisville would clinch the No. 3 seed from the National Division and open the BIG EAST Championship at American Division No. 2 seed USF on Sunday, Oct. 28 in a quarterfinal matchup. With a loss to Cincinnati, the Cardinals could still finish as the No. 3, No. 4 or No. 5 seed from the National. Georgetown (No. 1 seed) and Notre Dame (No. 2) have already clinched the top two spots from the National, while Marquette (No. 1), USF (No. 2) and Syracuse (No. 3) have clinched the top three positions in the American.

LOUISVILLE IN THE NCAA STATISTICS

Following week nine of the regular season, U of L remains among the top 50 nationally in multiple categories in the NCAA statistical rankings. As a team, the Cards are ranked 46th nationally in scoring offense at 2.00 goals per game. Individually, junior Angelika Uremovich is ranked 49th in the nation in total goals with nine, while senior Chloe Kiefer is ranked 27th nationally in goalie minutes played with 1506:22.

CARDINALS AT NO. 42 IN FOURTH NCAA RPI RELEASE

The fourth set of 2012 NCAA women's soccer RPI rankings were released on Monday evening and the Cardinals were positioned at No. 42 overall. Louisville is one of five BIG EAST Conference teams in the top 42 spots and among eight league squads in the top 96 positions. Leading the way is Georgetown at No. 20 followed by Notre Dame (No. 26), Marquette (No. 37), Rutgers (No. 38), Louisville (No. 42), USF (No. 54), Connecticut (No. 89) and Syracuse (No. 96).

CARDINALS FALL FROM NATIONAL RANKINGS FOLLOWING FIRST LOSS

After suffering their first loss of the season on Sept. 7 to visiting Kentucky, Louisville dropped out of the national rankings for the first time in 2012. Prior to splitting two games that weekend, the Cardinals were ranked 12th in the Soccer America Top 25 and 25th in the NSCAA/Continental Tire Top 25. U of L opened the season ranked 22nd in the Soccer America preseason poll and had risen each week prior to the loss.

YENNEY NAMED BIG EAST OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK ON SEPT. 3

Sophomore Erin Yenney was named BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 3 following her performances the previous weekend. Yenney totaled five points, including two game-winning goals in a 2-0-0 week for the Cardinals. She scored the first goal in a 4-0 victory over Southeast Missouri State on Aug. 31 before connecting for a goal and an assist in a 3-0 win over UNC-Greensboro on Sept. 2. Yenney was named to the All-Tournament team at the UK Tropical Smoothie Invitational after helping lead the Cardinals to the tournament title.

KIEFER INCREASES CAREER SHUTOUT TOTAL TO 17

Senior goalkeeper Chloe Kiefer has seven shutouts this season to take her career total to 17. She ranks second on Louisville's career shutout list behind Joanna Haig's 20 set from 2006-07 while surpassing Meredith Miller's 16 from 2001-04 earlier this season. Last season, Kiefer had nine shutouts, the second highest single season total in school history. She also set a school record last season by playing more than 2,272 minutes as the only Cardinal to see action in goal.

TRIO OF TELEVISED MATCHES ANNOUNCED FOR CARDS

Louisville will play three televised matches this season, including two national telecasts and one statewide telecast. The Cardinals' first televised match of 2012 will be Friday's home showdown with Kentucky, which can be viewed on WHAS-TV 11.2. Available throughout the state of Kentucky, the game can also be seen on Insight channel 432 and Comcast channel 207. Louisville's first national telecast is set for Sept. 14 at 4 p.m., ET when ESPN2 will televise the Cardinals' BIG EAST Conference opener at Notre Dame. U of L will also host a nationally televised game as CBS Sports broadcasts the Cardinals' BIG EAST matchup against Georgetown on Sunday, Oct. 7 at 1 p.m., from Cardinal Park.

KIEFER NAMED TO BIG EAST HONOR ROLL ON SEPT. 3

Senior goalkeeper Chloe Kiefer was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll on Sept. 3. Kiefer posted a pair of shutouts on Aug. 31-Sept. 2 to increase her season total to three and her career total to 13. She needed just four saves in the two games to clinch the shutout wins and earn All-Tournament honors at the UK Invitational.

EXETER, MELHADO RETURN TO LOUISVILLE FOLLOWING FIFA U-20 WORLD CUP

Louisville coaches and players welcomed back standouts Christine Exeter and Rachel Melhado to campus on Aug. 29 following their matches with Canada at the 2012 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup in Japan. Exeter scored a goal and added an assist while starting all three matches for Canada, while Melhado started on the backline throughout the event for the national team. Canada was eliminated from the event in group play with its Aug. 27 loss to North Korea.

Exeter is the reigning BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year and a 2011 NSCAA All-America selection, while Melhado started all 24 games on the Cards' backline in 2011 and was a key contributor in the team's nine shutout wins last season.

UREMOVICH NAMED TO BIG EAST HONOR ROLL ON AUG. 26

Junior midfielder Angelika Uremovich was named to the weekly BIG EAST honor roll on Aug. 26 after scoring a pair of goals in the Cardinals' 4-3 double overtime win against Purdue on Aug. 24.

EXETER NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

Junior forward Christine Exeter was named to the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy watch list for 2012 on Aug. 13. The MAC Hermann Trophy is the highest individual award in intercollegiate soccer presented annually in January during a banquet at the Missouri Athletic Club in St. Louis.

Exeter, the 2011 BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year and a unanimous preseason All-BIG EAST selection in 2012, led the Cardinals with 14 goals and three assists while starting 23 of 24 games as a sophomore. A 2011 NSCAA All-America honoree, Exeter connected for five game-winning goals, including the only goal of the match in the Cardinals' win at Cincinnati to clinch the program's first ever BIG EAST National Division title.

The watch list will be narrowed down by NSCAA members from Division I programs to 15 semifinalists by November 29. Member coaches and fans will then vote for their top three choices and the finalists will be announced December 6. The winner will be announced at the awards' banquet at the Missouri Athletic Club on Friday, Jan. 11.



CARDINALS PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN BIG EAST NATIONAL DIVISION; EXETER TABBED AS PRESEASON OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The Louisville women's soccer team was picked to finish second in the National Division of the BIG EAST Conference by the league's head coaches, while Cardinals' junior forward Christine Exeter was tabbed as the Preseason BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year.

The reigning BIG EAST National Division champion, Louisville received 98 points and two first-place votes in the poll results, while Notre Dame was chosen as the favorite to win the division with 109 points and 12 first-place votes. Georgetown was picked third with 83 points and was followed by Rutgers (78 points), Villanova (52), Seton Hall (50), DePaul (33) and Cincinnati (29).

In the American Division, Marquette was selected first with 97 points, while Connecticut was second with 84. USF (57) was third, while Providence and Syracuse followed with 52 points each. St. John's was sixth with 50 points and Pittsburgh was seventh with 21. The votes were cast by the league's 15 head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own teams.

The Cardinals enter 2012 following their best season in school history advancing to the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 and closing 2011 ranked 24th in the final NSCAA coaches' poll. With its 14-7-3 record overall, Louisville set a school record for wins while also earning its first ever BIG EAST Conference National Division title. Making its third NCAA Championship appearance ever, U of L earned a first round win over Dayton and eliminated No. 4 seeded and previously unbeaten Memphis in the second round before falling to No. 1 seed Florida State in the Sweet 16.

LOUISVILLE ANNOUNCES ADDITION OF CHARLYN CORRAL FOR 2012

University of Louisville women's soccer head coach Karen Ferguson-Dayes announced on July 19 the addition of talented newcomer Charlyn Corral to the Cardinals' roster for 2012.

A native of Mexico City, Mexico, Corral is an athletic forward with extensive international experience playing for the Mexican National team. Most recently, she was a member of Mexican National team at the 2011 FIFA Women's World Cup in Germany seeing action in one match. Prior to that, she was a three-time member of Mexico's U20 World Cup squad (2006, 2008, 2010) scoring four goals in 10 matches.

Along with her four World Cup appearances, Corral has been competing for Mexico's national team since she was age 11. At age 14, she became the youngest player to ever score a goal in a World Cup match when she connected for two goals against Switzerland in the opening match of the 2006 U20 World Cup in Russia. She will have two years of remaining eligibility starting with the 2012 season after transferring from Tecnológico de Monterrey in Mexico.

All five teams have earned a bye to the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Championship. There is one bye left in the National Division, with three teams in contention for it: Louisville, Rutgers and Villanova. Of the three, Louisville has earned a spot in the tournament.

Connecticut, DePaul, Providence and St. John's also are in contention for a berth in the Championship.

Offensive Player of the Week

Jonelle Filigno, Rutgers, R-Jr., F

Filigno earned BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week honors after totaling nine points in a 2-0-0 week. The redshirt-junior had five points (two goals and an assist) in a 3-0 win against Louisville on Oct. 12 and four points (two goals) in a 5-0 win against Cincinnati on Oct. 14. Filigno also was recognized at halftime of the Rutgers-Syracuse football game on Oct. 13 for her Olympic efforts in helping Team Canada win a bronze medal in the London Olympics.



Defensive Player of the Week

Alexa St. Martin, Georgetown, Jr., D

St. Martin was tabbed BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week after helping the Hoyas secure a pair of shutouts. The junior played 195 minutes in two wins last week, a 2-0 victory over No. 24/23 Notre Dame on Oct. 12 and a 1-0 overtime win over DePaul on Oct. 14. St. Martin helped lead a defensive effort that held the Irish to three shots on goals and the Blue Demons to just one. Georgetown has totaled a team-record 12 shutouts this year.



Goalkeeper of the Week

Nicole D'Agostino, Pittsburgh, So., GK

D'Agostino earned BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week honors after totaling 12 saves in a 2-0-0 week. The sophomore had nine saves in a 2-1 win over Connecticut on Oct. 12 and three saves in a 2-0 shutout victory against Providence on Oct. 14. D'Agostino ranks second in the league with 87 saves this year.



Rookie of the Week

Christiane Endler, USF, Fr., GK

Endler was cited as the BIG EAST Rookie of the Week after she led USF in a pair of shutouts totaling eight saves in a 2-0 week. She played 171 minutes and secured one shutout. In a 1-0 win against Syracuse on Oct. 12, Endler made five saves. In a 2-0 win against St. John's on Oct. 14, the freshman made three saves in 81 minutes.

KAREN FERGUSON-DAYES

Head Coach
13th Season
Connecticut, 1993

During her 12 seasons with the Cardinals, Karen Ferguson-Dayes has taken a soccer program at the University of Louisville and molded it into a team that has finished near the top of the BIG EAST and advanced to the NCAA Tournament three times in the last six seasons. The winningest coach in Cardinal history, she has improved the team's record nearly every season she has been at the helm and rewritten the record books.

During her tenure, Ferguson-Dayes has guided the Cardinals to not only their first NCAA Tournament berth, but consecutive trips to the dance. Last season, Ferguson-Dayes led Louisville to its best season in school history with a school record 14 wins, a first ever BIG EAST National Division title and its first ever NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.

The 2011 BIG EAST Coach of the Year, she has coached three All-Americans including current Cardinal Christine Exeter in 2011, Joanna Haig in 2007 and Jamie Craft in 2006 and a pair of Academic All-Americans in Haig (2007) and Amy Seng (2006).

The superlatives are nearly too numerous to list completely. Needless to say Ferguson-Dayes has been the most successful coach in U of L women's soccer history and is one of the top coaches in the nation.

Chris Petrucelli, head coach of the University of Texas women's soccer team, is in the top 10 in NCAA history in career wins and winning percentage and recognizes Ferguson-Dayes' place in the coaching world.

"Karen is a rising star in the coaching world. Her passion for the game is unmatched and she has shown that she can win on a high level. She has proven to be a quality coach in both the international arena and the college game. I expect that we will be hearing great things about her accomplishments in the future."

During the record-setting 2011 season, the Cardinals also advanced to their first ever BIG EAST Tournament title game and ended the season ranked 24th overall in the final NSCAA coaches' poll. Along with Exeter's league honors, Jennifer Jones was a Third Team All-BIG EAST selection in 2011 while Erin Yenney was named to the conference's All-Rookie Team.

Louisville earned an at-large berth into the 2011 NCAA Championship and was selected as a host for the first time in the post-season tournament. The Cardinals delivered on the opportunity to play in front of the home fans earning a dominating 2-0 victory over Dayton for the program's first ever NCAA Championship win. They followed that with an impressive 2-0 road triumph over No. 5 Memphis in the second round before falling to ninth-ranked Florida State in the Sweet 16.

In 2010, the Cardinals were led by freshman Christine Exeter, who was selected as the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year, and redshirt freshman Angelika Uremovich, who was named to the league's All-Rookie Team. U of L opened the season with a school record seven straight wins, which included victories over No. 13 South Carolina and rival Kentucky, and then closed the season by advancing to the BIG EAST Championship for the fifth time in six seasons.

Prior to a disappointing 2009 season where injuries limited the Cardinals' success on the field, the 2008 season served as a learning experience for a team that featured only three seniors. Even with the loss of All-American goalkeeper Joanna Haig and three other key starters, UofL advanced to the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Tournament for the third straight season and won nine games overall against one of the toughest schedules in the nation.

Seniors Jessica Mello and Shannon Smyth earned Third Team All-BIG EAST honors and were joined by senior Mallory Lampson as NSCAA Academic All-Region selections.

In 2007 a trip to the BIG EAST semifinals was a new plateau of success for the program, as were the five players honored on All-BIG EAST teams. In tying the school record with 13 wins and advancing to the NCAA's for the second consecutive season, the team collectively posted a 3.416 GPA in the classroom. Haig established five school records, and finished the season third in the nation in save% (0.893) and fifth in GAA playing in Ferguson-Dayes' defensive brand of soccer.

The 2006 squad became the first in school history to earn a national ranking, peaking at 15th in the nation. It was also the first team to advance to the coveted plateau that is the NCAA Tournament. Success was not limited to the field, as the team set marks in the classroom with the second-highest team GPA, a record number of Red and Black Scholars and members of the AD Honor Roll, as well as the first Academic All-American in school history (Amy Seng). Six players earned All-Region honors, three found their name on the All-BIG EAST squads and two players were named All-American (Jamie Craft and Joanna Haig), just the second and third such honored in Cardinal history. Craft moved on to a career in professional soccer, enjoying a solid season with the W-League Boston Renegades.

The fall of 2005 meant the first foray into the BIG EAST, a conference that Ferguson-Dayes had spent seven years in as a player and assistant coach. With the jump into one of the elite conferences, it was expected that the Cardinals might stumble in making the jump, but under the guidance of Ferguson-Dayes, the team notched double figure wins for the second consecutive season. Three team members were honored by the BIG EAST, lead by junior Jamie Craft, a first-team selection who was also named to two difference All-Region teams.

Ferguson-Dayes' appointment and success here at Louisville has not gone unnoticed.

University of Louisville Director of Athletics Tom Jurich knew who he wanted to lead the then-struggling women's soccer team when Ferguson-Dayes was hired to be the eighth head coach of the U of L women's soccer team in 2000.

"Her name kept rising to the top during our national search and she came to us with incredible recommendations," noted Jurich.

Nobody believed the process of turning the Louisville women's soccer program into a winner is one that would occur overnight, as evidenced by the tough first season for Ferguson-Dayes and staff, but growth and success wasn't measured by wins and losses. Not initially.

Now the ante has been upped. Under the guidance of Jurich, the Cardinals opened a new era as members of the BIG EAST, and will now take the pitch for the seventh season as a member of the league.

"The University has provided us with the resources we feel are necessary to become an elite program, and that is our goal," said Ferguson-Dayes.

Her tenure is the longest in the program's history. She has already watched assistant coaches Jen Mead and Carmelina Moscato move on to pursue a career in professional soccer, former assistant Carole Dutchka is now the athletic director at Louisville's Presentation Academy, and former assistant Tim Nowak departed for a head coaching opportunity at Eastern Illinois.

Achieving at a high level is not something new for Ferguson-Dayes. She is currently the ODP Girls 1993 age group head coach. She previously worked as the Region II liaison for the US Soccer National Teams, in charge of tracking and following the progress of members of the US Soccer Youth National Team system.

She served as an assistant coach of the USA U-21 team for their 2004 season.

The team had three different training sessions at the US Soccer's National Training Center in Carson, California, where they had the opportunity to scrimmage the US National Team. Training preceded trips to China in March, Brazil in May and Iceland in July to complete the Nordic Cup. It was there that the team won its sixth consecutive Nordic Cup title with a 3-0 win over Sweden.

During the summer of 2003 she served as an assistant coach for the U-19 Adidas Youth Team.

Three years ago she served as the head coach of the Region II 87 girl's team which competed in the Adidas ESP event and the November Interregional event in Boca Raton, Florida.

In 2003 she worked with the Region II girls U-15 team, and accompanied the team to numerous interregional events.

Prior to accepting her position at U of L, she was the assistant coach at the University of Connecticut for three seasons. The Huskies were 60-12-2 during the three years she spent as an assistant, advanced to the final eight twice (1998 and '99), and were national runner-up in 1997.

A 1993 graduate of UConn, Ferguson-Dayes coached under and played for legendary soccer coach Len Tsantiris who has not missed the NCAA Division I soccer tournament during his tenure.

Before coaching at UConn, Ferguson-Dayes served as an assistant at Boston University during its first two seasons of soccer where the team was an astonishing 24-7-2 overall.

In her playing career at UConn as a midfielder, she was named first team All-America in '91, '92 and '93. The Huskies were 63-24-3 during her four-year career and she tallied 53 points (18 goals and 17 assists.)

In 1990 as a freshman, the Huskies competed in the national semifinal where she was named to the NCAA All-Tournament team. Soccer America Magazine selected her as a Team MVP in 1992, an award given to 11 players nationally.

Ferguson-Dayes' playing career was not limited to the collegiate level. She played for the U.S. National Team in 1992 and 1993.

While at UConn, she was involved in the Connecticut Olympic Development Program and served as staff coach in Region One. Ferguson-Dayes holds an NSCAA Advanced National Soccer license, as well as a USSF B license.

A native of Holbrook, N.Y., and a graduate of Sachem High School, Ferguson-Dayes is married to Hylton Dayes and the couple has one son, Brandon, who was born in December, 2008.

CARDINAL PARK - HOME OF LOUISVILLE SOCCER



Cardinal Park opened in the spring of 2000 to rave reviews as an area that is not only home to athletic competition, but also as a place the community and surrounding areas can utilize for a workout or as a gathering place.

Louisville soccer hosts games at the 2,500-seat soccer stadium which acts as the centerpiece of the facility. In 2012, a school record crowd of 3,520 packed the stadium to watch the annual Battle of the Bluegrass between the Cardinals and rival Kentucky.

The stadium features locker room facilities, a training room, weight room, team meeting room and an air-conditioned press box. Prior to the 2010 season, a new video wall/scoreboard was installed maintaining Cardinal Park as one of the premier NCAA soccer complexes in the nation having hosted the likes of the Washington Freedom, Canadian National Team and Irish National Team.

The U of L track and field teams hosted the 2009 NCAA Mideast Regional at Cardinal Park as well as a number of other national and regional meets.
