## AT THE KICKOFF

## **PUTTING A BOW ON THE FALL**

Austin Peay's football team wraps up its abbreviated fall schedule with an 11 a.m., Saturday road contest against nationally-ranked Cincinnati. The early kickoff will be broadcast on ESPN+.

## **ANOTHER OPENER**

In this most unusual of football seasons, Austin Peay will be facing an opponent opening its 2020 campaign. And when the yet-to-be-announced spring schedule begins, it is likely the Governors will help four teams open their season. It's a vast difference from the original 2020 schedule when APSU was slated to be the homecoming opponent for five opponents.

### **TAKING STOCK**

Austin Peay returns 14 starters (7 offense/7 defense) from the starting lineup at 2019 season's end. Offensively, the Govs will have to replace leading rusher Kentel Williams (1,414 all-purpose yards) but return 2019 season-opening starter Jeremiah Oatsvall at quarterback. Defensively, the Govs lost a starter on each of its position group, the biggest loss being free safety Juantarius Bryant (107 tackles). Meanwhile, the Govs will field a new group of kickers after losing all three starters from 2019, including placekicker Logan Birchfield (103 points).

### **BACK IN THE SADDLE**

Redshirt junior quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall returned to the QB1 spot for the 2020 season. The Brentwood native was injured just eight plays into Game 2 of the 2019 season, the first injury-shortened season of his career. One of only seven APSU quarterbacks with more than 3,000 career passing yards, he also ranks third in career rushing yards by a quarterback (970).

## **PRESEASON POSITIVES**

Seven Austin Peay athletes were recognized on the Preseason All-OVC teams released in July. Nickelback Kordell Jackson, the league's 2019 Defensive Player of the Year, also was its preseason defensive pick. Wide receiver DeAngelo Wilson, who amassed a APSU record 1,564 receiving yards, was its Preseason Offensive Player of the Year.

## **UP NEXT**

Following Saturday's contest, Austin Peay will turn its gaze toward the Ohio Valley Conference's announcement of a spring 2020 schedule, on a date to be determined. The Govs will seek to defend their 2019 OVC Championship in what promises to be an exciting league slate.

## **BY THE NUMBERS**

26%	Austin Peay lost three of its top four rushers from the 2019 squad and returns only 706 of its 2,694 yards on the ground. Senior Ahmaad Tanner is the Govs leading returning runner with 408 yards and 5 TDs.
<b>76%</b>	The situation among the Govs receivers is less dire with its No. 1 (Wilson) and No. 2 (Baniko Harley) receivers returning. They lead a group that amassed 2,748 of the team's 3,594 receiving yards.
10	Kordell Jackson, a 2019 Consensus All-American, had seven interceptions (2 pick-sixes) last season. But he also had a hand in 10 of the Govs 25 turnovers gained, with two fumbles recovered and two forced.
11	To the victor go the spoils, as Austin Peay found out when a program-record 11 Governors earned postseason recognition from the OVC in 2019. The Govs had seven first-teamers, two-second-teamers and two players among the league's top newcomers.

## FACING THE BEARCATS NUMBER TWO, AGAIN

Cincinnati was picked to finish second in the American Athletic Conference preseason poll, just three points behind preseason favorite UCF. It is the second-straight season Cincinnati has been picked behind the Knights.

### **DEFENSIVE DOMINOES**

Another tough defense awaits the Governors. Cincinnati returns 13 of its top 15 tacklers from a 2019 team that led the AAC in scoring defense (20.6 ppg). Safeties Darrick Forrest and James Wiggins were named to the Nagurski Trophy Watch List as candidates for the National Defensive Player of the Year. They were joined by cornerback Ahmad Gardner on the Thorpe Award Watch List for top defensive back.

### **OFFENSIVE OPTIONS**

While the defense grabs the limelight, the Bearcats offense churned out nearly 400 yards per game last season. Running back Gerrid Doaks returns as does offensive lineman James Hudson – both earning recognition on Athlon Sports' Preseason All-AAC list.

## **PUNTING?**

It's not often a punter grabs a headline, but Cincinnati's James Smith deserves the nod. Boasting a career 43.5 punting average, he was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List this season for top punter.

### **HOME FIELD**

 Cincinnati brings a 13-game home win streak into its season opener against Austin Peay. The Bearcats last loss at Nippert Stadium was Nov. 10, 2017 to Temple.

## LAST MEETING, NOTABLY

**AUG. 31, 2017** ■ UC 26, APSU 14

- Quarterback JaVaughn Craig finished with 155 total offensive yards and threw for a touchdown as Austin Peay opened the 2017 season with an impressive statement in a 26-14 loss to Cincinnati at Nippert Stadium.
- Craig's touchdown throw leveled the game at 7-7 with 6:45 left in the second quarter with a touchdown throw to Kentel Williams, wrapping up a 10-play, 81-yard drive.
- Quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall shared time with Craig and led the Govs to their second touchdown drive, Josh Alexander dashing in from 11 yards out to cap a 13-play, 66-yard scoring drive.
- Defensively, Malik Boynton and Gunnar Scholato each had nine tackles. Kordel Jackson finished with seven tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup.

# ON THIS DATE SEPTEMBER 19

- This will be the Governors 11th game on Sept. 19 and its seventh road game on the date.
- Austin Peay is 4-7 in games played on Sept. 19.
- The Govs have lost their last two games on the 19th (at Vanderbilt, 2015 & at Illinois State, 2009)
- APSU's last win on Sept. 19 was a 21-17 victory against Dayton (1998).

# THE STATE OF THINGS OHIO

- This will be Austin Peay's 23rd game played in Ohio. The Govs are 2-21 all-time in the Buckeye State
- Austin Peay's made back-to-back trips to Ohio in 2017 – the last time they visited the state – facing Cincinnati and Miami.
- The Govs six games against Cincinnati are their most against any Ohio team. They also have played Youngstown State five times and Akron and Dayton four times each.

# PLAYING UP A LEVEL VERSUS FBS

- Austin Peay is facing an FBS/I-A member for the 27th time since 1980.
- The Governors own one victory against the upper echelon – a 26-22 victory against Kansas State on Sept. 5, 1987 in Manhattan, Kansas.
- The Govs scored the game's first 16 points, Tom McMillian hitting field goals of 37, 40 and 50 yards as part of the opening run.
- After K-State forged a comeback to take a 22-19 lead, Austin Peay won with 10 seconds remaining when Rico Ransom caught a 35-yard pass from Dale Edwards.
- Don Goode sealed the win with an interception of a Gary Swim pass on the game's final play.

## **HOUSE OPENING**

Freshman running back C.J. Evans made an immediate impression in front of a national audience. On his first touch – the Govs first touch from scrimmage – he broke off a 75-yard touchdown run. Evans finished two yards shy of his first 100-yard outing.

### **FLEXBONE DEBUT**

Austin Peay added a noticeable wrinkle to its offense during the offseason and debuted a flexbone set on its first offensive play. While the Govs don't utilize the notorious triple-option out of the set, it was a definite help as the Govs receivers were more than happy to supply highlight-reel blocks throughout the opener.

### **LEADING THE PACK**

Wide receiver DeAngelo Wilson was named the Ohio Valley Conference's 2020 Preaseason Offensive Player of the Year in July. He

was a Second Team All-OVC pick in 2019 after he caught 89 passes (the ninth-most in OVC history) for 1,564 yards (first nationally and the second-most in OVC history) and 15 touchdowns (fifth-most in OVC history). Wilson was named to the HERO Sports Preseason All-America team.

### WATCH OUT FOR WR2

The Govs might have the FCS' most potent 1-2 punch among receiver corps. Baniko Harley, who also was a Preseason First Team All-OVC selection, he set career highs in receptions (53) and yards (839) last season.

## **REENTERING OATSVALL'S ORBIT**

Quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall returns behind center after suffering an injury on the eighth play of last season's second game, The OVC Media's 2018 Preseason Player of the Year will look to return to his 2018 form that saw him pass for 1,631 yards and 20 touchdowns (24th in FCS) while posting an 142.8 pass efficiency rating (19th in FCS). His 15.68 yards per completion also ranked 4th among FCS passers in 2019.

## **CONTINUING THE O-LINE**

The Govs offensive line also was a strength throughout 2020 with the group only allowing 15 sacks last season – eighth-fewest among FCS teams at 1,0 per game. Center Blake Mitchell returns to anchor that group and was recognized as a Preseason All-OVC selection. The Govs will have to find a replacement for 2019 First Team All-OVC pick Kyle Anderton at left tackle, but return eight of the 10 individuals listed on the final two-deep of 2019.

## **REVAMPED RUNNING BACK CORPS**

Austin Peay saw three of its top four runners in 2019 depart the team due to graduation. Senior Ahmaad Tanner is the Govs top returning rusher after ranking third on the team with 408 yards and five touchdowns last season. Redshirt freshman Lelan Wilhoite also returns after a 20-carry campaign in 2019.

## **WILSON SETS SIGHTS ON RECORD**

Thanks to his record-breaking 1,564 yards this season, Wilson (2,053 career receiving yards) is one of four APSU receivers with at least 2,000 career receiving yards. Entering his senior season, his needs 947 yards to break the APSU



record held by APSU Hall of Fame member Harold "Red" Roberts (1967-70), who had 2,999 receiving yards.

## **CALLING ON WILSON**

When the Govs needed a big play in 2019 it was Wilson that delivered. Of his team-leading 89 receptions this season, 29 have gone for 25 yards or more and 11 of those have seen him romp for 40 yards. In addition, 63 of those catches have seen him secure either a first down or a touchdown – 28 of those coming on third down this season.

### **HARLEY'S HOUSE OF HIGHLIGHTS**

Baniko Harley proved to be a jack of all trades in 2019, with touchdowns as a passer (1), runner (4) and receiver (7). In a season filled with highlight-reel moments, he added another at Sacramento State, running for two touchdowns and catching another, including a 45-yard dash for a touchdown on a direct snap with the Govs facing 4th-and-1, which capped a drive that started with his own on-side kick recovery.

## **OFFENSIVE LIGHTS**

Twice last season, Austin Peay's offense churned out more than 500 yards in a game. The Govs opened the season with a 563-yard effort against North Carolina Central, August 29. Two months later, Tennessee Tech bore the full brunt of the Govs offensive capabilities, watching the Govs post 614 offensive yards – the fifth time since 1996 APSU has recorded 600-plus yards per game.

## **PASS DENIALS**

After recording four or more pass breakups five times in 2019, Austin Peay opened 2020 with an impressive five pass breakups and two interceptions in the opener against Central Arkansas. Junior cornerback Nathan Page and junior linebacker Jack McDonald each recorded an interception while junior safety Isiah Norman was credited with two breakups.

### **THIRD-AND-GONE**

The Govs held Central Arkansas to 4-of-16 on third-down conversions in the season opener. After a 6-of-11 day on third down by Pittsburgh, opponents are 10-of-27 on third down this season (37.0 percent).

The Govs are even stingier on 3rd-andlong, the Bears and Panthers going just 3-of-13 (23.1 percent). Austin Peay limited opponents to 22.0 percent on 3rd-and-long (7-plus yards) opportunities in 2019.



## **FOURTH-AND-NOPE**

Adding to the defense's impressive late-down performance was its fourth-down stopping power. UCA posted only a 1-for-3 conversion rate against APSU. The Bears saw two drives die on fourth down in the first quarter, on the Govs' 33 and 30-yard lines, respectively. They converted a 4th down later in the quarter, but the drive was snuffed out thanks to Jack McDonald's pick to start the second quarter.

 Pittsburgh failed in its lone 4th down attempt in Week 2, the Govs improving to 1-for-4 versus 4th down opportunities this season.

## **DEFENDING THE PACK**

After a Unanimous All-America campaign in 2019, nickelback Kordell Jackson returns to torment offenses again in 2020. The OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year had a hand in 10 of the Govs 25 turnovers gained and returned three of those for touchdowns (2 pick-sixes and a scoop-and-score). He was named to both the Athlon Sports and HERO Sports Preseason All-America Teams.

### **DEPTH IN DEFENSE**

Austin Peay's defense made quite the impression in 2019 and that will carry over into 2020 with four Govs defenders recognized on the Preseason All-OVC Team. Defensive linemen Josephus Smith and John Wesley Whiteside were both named to the squad and were joined by linebacker Jack McDonald and Kordell Jackson.

### **SHUTDOWN CENTRAL**

The Govs held an opponent to fewer than 100 rushing yards in eight of its 15 games last season, including in its FCS Playoff Round 2 victory at Sacramento State (99 yards/19 carries). Austin Peay flexed its defensive credentials against UT Martin, limiting the Skyhawks to minus-25 rushing yards. It was the lowest rushing total by an APSU opponent since the Govs held Morehead State to an OVC-record minus-88 yards in 1983.

## **BACK FIELD MARAUDERS**

Ten times last season the Govs have collected five or more tackles for loss in a game (FCS average was 3.1 TFL/game), including four double-digit TFL outings. Austin Peay was ranked 35th among FCS teams with 7.0 TFL per game. The Govs opened 2020 with four TFLs against the Bears, nickelback Kordell Jackson leading the way with 1.5 TFLs.

## **NO LANDING ENDZONE**

Austin Peay punters have not punted into the end zone in 19 consecutive games. The Govs last touchback on a punt came off the foot of Jeremiah Oatsvall on Nov. 3, 2018 against Eastern Kentucky. Since that touchdown, APSU punters have 104 punts without a touchback, averaging 35.8 yards per punt – 43 of those boots have stayed inside the 20-yard line.

## **OATSVALL'S FOOT**

While Jeremiah Oatsvall's arm usually gets noticed, it's his foot that surprised commentators against Central Arkansas. Yet for APSU fans it was no surprise, Oatsvall has 20 punts to his credit and is averaging a tidy 33.8 yards per punt

## **LONG SNAPPER SHORTAGE**

Unfortunately, none of the Govs three long snappers by trade made the trip to Central Arkansas. Instead, linebacker Cameron Miller and defensive back Johnathon Edwards were called upon to handle the long snapping duties.

## **GOVERNORS GUIDE**



### **PLENTY OF NEW FACES**

In its season-opening outing against Central Arkansas, Austin Peay utilized 11 first-time starters. Six of those new faces came on offense and included freshman running back C.J. Evans, who took his first touch to the house – a 75-yard touchdown run on the first play from scrimmage.

## **LOVINGS ERA**

Austin Peay Director of Athletics Gerald Harrison named Marquase Lovings as the Governors' interim head football coach for the upcoming 2020 season, July 7. It is Lovings first turn as head coach after 13 seasons on various coaching staffs, including as Associate Head Coach at Austin Peay in 2019. The move followed the resignation of Mark Hudspeth, Friday, for personal reasons.

### **DIPLOMA IN ONE HAND**

Last May, two members of the Governors - Se-

nior defensive end Matthew Gayle (BBA, Management) and senior safety Rodney Saulsberry Jr. (BBA, Marketing) – received their bachelor's degree and have returned to play in 2020. In addition, three transfers joined the Govs after earning degrees at their previous stops: Linebacker Troy Henderson Jr., quarterback Vito Priore and tight end William Wilcox.

### **NFL CONNECTION**

Two of the Governors incoming freshmen have familial ties to the NFL

- Freshman safety Kory Chapman: Father Kory (Indianapolis, 2005)
- Freshman wide receiver Manny Scott: Father Freddie (Atlanta and Indianapolis, 1996-98) and grandfather Freddie Sr. (Baltimore and Detroit, 1974-93)

## **LOOKING BACK AT 2019...**

## **ALL-OVC DOMINANCE**

A program-record 11 Austin Peay football players – 7 first-teamers, 2 second and 2 all-newcomer – earned postseason honors from the Ohio Valley Conference, befitting their status as league champions for 2019. The seven first-team selections tied the program record set in 1965. The nine first and second team honorees combined set the program record as did the 11 picks across all squads.

## **DROUGHT EXTINGUISHED**

The Govs 2019 OVC title they ended the FCS' second-longest drought between conference titles. Austin Peay's 1977-2019 drought is only eclipsed by Columbia's lvy League active title drought which began in 1961.

### **HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE**

Austin Peay finished 2019 with a 6-1 record at Fortera Stadium, including its FCS Playoffs' Round 1 victory against Furman. It is the third consecutive year the Govs have lost just one regular-season home game. Austin Peay is 14-3 at Fortera Stadium over those three seasons.

### **GOVS VS. RANKED FOES**

- For the third time since 2009, multiple ranked foes visited Fortera Stadium.
   in 2019, Furman was the fourth ranked opponent to visit Fortera this season.
- The Govs have defeated at least one ranked foe in each of those seasons with multiple ranked visitors: No. 11 Jacksonville State, No. 20 Southeast Missouri and No. 16 Furman this season, No. 18 UT Martin in 2017 and No. 20 Eastern Kentucky in 2009.
- For the first time since 2009, an OVC member played ranked opponents in three consecutive home games.

### **JOINING AN ELITE GROUP OF GOVS**

The Govs football team became the latest Austin Peay team to win an NCAA tournament contest, joining the men's basketball and baseball programs. APSU's men's basketball team famously downed Illinois in the 1986 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The Govs baseball team picked up wins in both the 2012 and 2013 NCAA Baseball Championships.

# LAST ONE IN

Austin Peay was the last active OVC member to make an FCS Playoff appearance. With their appearance every current member of the OVC has appeared in the postseason at least once. The Govs are first-time playoff participants along with Sacramento State, their appearances reducing the number of active FCS teams that have not made a playoff appearance to 27.

### **SUCCESSFUL DEBUT**

With its opening round win against Furman, the Govs became the first OVC member to win their debut in the FCS Playoffs since 2000 (Western Kentucky) and only the fourth to do so in league history.

### **TWO IN HAND**

With its win over Sacramento State in the second round of the FCS Playoffs, Austin Peay became just the 10th team in OVC history to win multiple games in the same season.

## **TWO-FER DEBUTS**

The Govs followed up their winning debut by picking up a second win in their first FCS Playoff appearance. They became the 20th team in FCS Playoff history to win two or more games in their first playoff appearance – and only the second since the bracket expanded to 24 teams in 2013, joining the 2017 Kennesaw State team that saw its campaign end in the quarterfinal round.

# MARQUASE LOVINGS

Interim Head Coach • First Season Career Record: 0-2 • Howard, 2006

Austin Peay Director of Athletics Gerald Harrison named Marquase Lovings as the Governors' interim head football coach, July 7.

Lovings served as associate head coach for the Governors in 2019, overseeing the defensive line. Under his leadership, that unit helped Austin Peay's 2019 squad post one of the best defensive seasons in program history. They ranked among the FCS' top 20 in rushing defense (8th), total defense (12th), scoring defense (15th), and third-down defense (16th). Josephus Smith and Shaun Whittinghill each earned All-Ohio Valley Conference honors and John Wesley Whiteside was named to the league's All-Newcomer team.

In 2018, Lovings was selected to participate in the American Football Coaches Association's Coaches' 35 Under

35 Coaches Leadership Institute, which is designed to identify and train rising leaders in the game of football and the coaching professions. He also was a presenter at the 2019 AFCA Convention.

Prior to joining the Governors, Lovings was defensive line coach at Nicholls after seven seasons as an assistant at Louisiana-Lafayette.

After spending his first six seasons as the running backs coach at ULL, Lovings moved to defensive ends coach in 2017. The Ragin' Cajuns finished with 61.5 tackles for loss and 20.0 sacks, led by defensive end Joe Dillon's 4.5 sacks.

Under Lovings' tutelage, former Ragin' Cajuns running backs Elijah McGuire and Alonzo Harris combined to rush for over 3,800 yards and 48 touchdowns during a two-year span (2013-14) that saw each earn All-Sun Belt Conference honors. In 2014, the tandem combined to rush for 2,071 yards and 26 touchdowns with McGuire earning Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year honors by the Sun Belt Conference. As a result of their success, Lovings was a nominee for the 2014 Broyles Award, given annually to the top assistant coach in the country.

During the 2013 season, the duo each combined for over 1,800 yards and 22 rushing touchdowns on the season and each earned first-team All-Sun Belt Conference honors in 2013. Harris finished third in the league with 942 yards and 14 touchdowns while McGuire recorded 863 yards, averaging 8.3 yards per carry, while scoring eight TDs and earning Freshman All-America honors.

In 2011, Lovings helped Harris, then a freshman, emerge early in the season, finishing the year with 700 yards and eight touchdowns to earn Sun Belt Freshman of the Year honors.

In 2012, the Cajuns improved their rushing from 125.2 to 193.5 rushing yards per game, ranking them 34th nationally and second in the Sun Belt.

Prior to his time in Lafayette, Lovings spent four seasons at Mississippi State (2007-10), his first two as a defensive quality control coach and his final two seasons as a defensive graduate assistant that saw him work with defensive line standouts Fletcher Cox and Titus Brown.

Lovings walked on as a tight end at Howard University and earned his bachelor of arts in broadcast journalism in 2006. He earned a master's of sport administration from Mississippi State in 2008 and pursued a doctorate as well.

MONTGOMERY, Ala. – In a game that simmered along for 56 minutes, Austin Peay State University's football team and Central Arkansas brought the game to a rolling boil by trading touchdowns in the final four minutes, with the Governors falling by a 24-17 margin in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff, Saturday, at the Cramton Bowl.

The game's first two touchdowns came in the opening moments of each half. Austin Peay got the game's first score when freshman running back C.J. Evans dashed for a 75-yard score on the game's opening play from scrimmage. After the teams traded field goals the rest of the half, Central Arkansas took the lead in the first minute of the second half on Kierr Crossley's 34-yard run.

But Austin Peay got the ball with four minutes left and quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall mustered the offense to a seven-play, 60-yard scoring drive for a 17-16 lead. On the ensuing drive, Central Arkansas Breylin Smith responded by leading the Bears to a 6-play, 78-yard drive that needed just 1:06 to regain the lead and a two-point conversion set the final score.

Oatsvall completed 14-of-31 passes for 181 yards and a touchdown. Evans, in his first game as a Governor, had 10 carries for 98 yards and a touchdown. Junior linebacker Jack McDonald had eight tackles and an interception to pace the APSU defense.

## **FORTERA STADIUM**





## For nearly eight decades, Fortera Stadium has served as the home of Austin Peay State University football along with the University's track and field teams.

Austin Peay has played football in its current location since 1946. However, following the 2015 season, the university embarked on the biggest construction project dedicated to football in its history.

What resulted is a \$19-million facility that has four levels on its west side. On the lower level is the player locker room, featuring new dark wood lockers with nameplates to recognize some of the donors that made them possible. Also on that level is a players lounge; athletic training room and equipment room.

Fans on levels 3 and 4 find the amenities of club seating and skyboxes – new features to the stadium. The skyboxes, which feature a sports-bar like atmosphere, feature tiered stadium-type seating with up to 22 seats per viewing room. In addition, each skybox has a bar with locations for bar stools, tables and chairs to seat four to six people.

The Governors Stadium skyboxes have sliding glass at the front of the viewing rooms, a push button to control a public address speaker and two television monitors.

The main concourses feature enhanced concession stands along with sport murals created to honor memorable Govs players and teams, with the hopes more will be created for future stars. The conference champions from 1948 and 1977 have wall spaces as well as the program's only back-to-back eight-win seasons in 1964 and 1965.

Meanwhile, the field itself has been replaced with its fourth artificial turf, FieldTurf XT, manufactured by FieldTurf, a Tarkett Sports Company. The turf, includes the new Governors logo at midfield.

Outside the southwest corner of the stadium, the Hendricks Fox Walk in the Blake Jenkins Plaza lists the names of all lettermen to wear the red and white.

The new stadium also created a revamped tailgating experience in a more central location outside the stadium.

In April 2016, following the Spring Game, a ceremony was held outside the stadium to celebrate its rechristening into Fortera Stadium. Country singer Maggie Rose performed before fans enjoyed a fireworks show.

In March 2017, construction completed on a new weight room project inside Fortera Stadium. The state-of-the-art facility will service not only Austin Peay football but a host of the department's programs. The new space will free up the weight room in the Dunn Center and houses racks, free weights and treadmills in the facility.

In 2018, additions to the athletic training facility were completed to better care for the student-athetes.

The original Municipal Stadium was constructed in time for the 1946 season as a joint project between the City of Clarksville, Montgomery County and then what was Austin Peay State College. The stadium became the home field for local schools and APSC for football games and track events.

The city maintained its ownership and operation of the Municipal Stadium until 1970. In that year, as a result of a cooperative agreement saw the city convey title to one-third of the stadium to the State of Tennessee for the university. The

other one-third went to Montgomery County.

Austin Peay, Montgomery County, and the city of Clarksville were authorized to appropriate funds to the newly created Stadium Authority for constructing, remodeling and operating the stadium, including adding east side seating. The members of the Stadium Authority were appointed by the county and by the university.

In addition, the natural grass surface—because it was being used by the local schools and Governors alike—was replaced by Astroturf and the east side two-level press box was constructed in 1979.

The stadium was in desperate need of a new turf in the early 1990s. However, the Clarksville-Montgomery County school system, which was amidst growth and expansion, indicated it could not afford to be a part of the turf replacement. As a result, Austin Peay agreed to purchase Municipal Stadium from the Stadium Authority in 1993.

Stadia Turf replaced the AstroTurf, which was placed by the Stadium Authority, before 1993 season's start. The playing surface was changed again in 2004, when Polytan surfaces were installed on the football field (Mega Grass) and track (Polytan WSS 15).

Other than a new scoreboard being erected for the 2007 season, those were the last major upgrades until plans were announced Aug. 20, 2012 to all but replace Governors Stadium when \$16 million was approved by the state for new construction.

A ceremonial demolition of Governors Stadium began following the 2015 season-ending Nov. 19 contest against Southeast Missouri. Despite the coldest winter in recent memory, including icy conditions that shut down the University for three days, the construction crew lost just one day of work.
