Cincinnati 13-10, 4-7 BIG EAST vs. Pittsburgh 19-5, 7-4 BIG EAST

SETTING THE SCENE: The University of Cincinnati has had a week to prepare for Pittsburgh in a BIG EAST clash on Tuesday, Feb. 13 at 7 p.m. at the Petersen Events Center. The game will be nationally televised on CSTV. The Bearcats have momentum going into the contest with a 74-61 win over Providence on Tuesday, Feb. 6, breaking a three-game losing slide. The Panthers are on a four-game winning streak, but will have played three contests in 10 days, including two on the road—an 84-40 win at Providence, a 66-53 win over Villanova at home, and a road trip to Tampa in a 69-65 win over USF on Feb. 10. In all the Panthers traveled 3,180 miles.

STORY LINES:

- With five games to play, the Bearcats are currently in 11th place in the BIG EAST standings. Only the top 12 teams in the conference advance to the BIG EAST Championship. The Bearcats are 1-4 on the road in conference play, while Pitt is 4-1 at the Petersen Center in BIG EAST play.
- Both Pitt and UC feature freshmen that lead the squad in assists. The Bearcats' Carla Jacobs averages 4.6 dimes per game, fourth in the BIG EAST. She leads UC in assist/turnover ratio at 2.04, third in the BIG EAST. The Panthers' rookie Jania Sims leads the team with 3.9 assists, seventh in the conference, and is also seventh in the BIG EAST in assist/turnover ratio (1.70).
- Jacobs and Pitt's Danielle Taylor both played their high school basketball in Cleveland. Jacobs helped Regina High to two state championships, while Taylor played for Villa Angela St. Joseph High, just seven miles from Regina.
- Michelle Jones leads UC in starts this season with 22. She is the only Bearcat to start every BIG EAST game this season. Shavonte Zellous, Mercedes Walker and Xenia Stewart have started every conference game for Pitt, and Zellous is the lone Panther to start every game this season.
- The game will feature two of the best offensive rebounders in the conference. Pitt's Mercedes Walker is fourth in the BIG EAST with 3.50 offensive boards a game, while UC's Michelle Jones is sixth with 3.22 per game.
- Sophomore Shelly Bellman has played some of her best basketball for UC vs. Pitt. In two games she has averaged 21 points. She became the fifth Bearcat to make six 3-pointers in a game, her career high, in UC's BIG EAST Tourney loss to Pittsburgh (3/4/06). Jill Stephens also has a career high vs. the Panthers with her three assists (2/4/06).

NOTES FROM THE PROVIDENCE GAME:

- The game was delayed 90 minutes due to the weather conditions, which prevented officials from getting to the game by the original 7 p.m. tip-off.
- The Bearcats evened the all-time series vs. the Friars, 1-1.
- Carla Jacobs played a career-high 39 minutes. That bumped her average to 29.1 minutes per game which leads the Bearcats.
- Jill Stephens was 2-for-3 from beyond the arc, a career high for the sophomore post player for 3-point field goals made. Karen Twehues was 4-of-4 from the free throw line, marking a season-high for free throws made.
- The Bearcats held Providence's Catherine Bove, a Cincinnati native, to just four points.

BIG EAST Opening Round

Mercedes Walker and Mallorie Winn scored 21 points each to lead Pittsburgh to a 77-62 win against UC in the first round of the 2006 BIG EAST Tournament. Shelly Bellman led UC with 22 points and a career-best six three-pointers. The Panthers shot 61 percent from the floor for the game and led by as many as 15 in the first half before taking a 37-27 lead into halftime. Bellman came out firing in the second half, hitting three successive three-pointers during an 11-2 run that cut the lead to just four with 16:29 to play. Pitt answered with a 7-0 spurt. The Bearcats twice trimmed the lead to five, but a 7-0 Panther run got the lead back to double-digits.

◆ UC outrebounded the Friars, 41-32, marking the 19th time in 23 games the Bearcats have bested their opponent in that category.

◆ The Friars put up 30 treys, the most hoisted against the Bearcats this season. Providence only shot 23 percent from behind the arc (7-of-30).

◆ Treasure Humphries had a double figure rebounding game for the first time in her four-year career. She pulled in a career-high 10 boards.

◆ The Bearcats had five players score in double figures for the fifth game this season.

BEARCATS DATA
CINCINNATI PLAYERS HONORED:

◆ Carla Jacobs earned UC's first BIG EAST Weekly honor this season, when she was named Freshman of the Week on Jan. 29. Jacobs, a native of Cleveland, Ohio, had a career week as she averaged 16.0 points, 6.0 assists and 3.5 rebounds, while shooting 6-of-6 from the foul line. The guard tied her career high with 15 points and dished out a career-high 10 assists in the team's 80-62 win over Georgetown (1/23/07), nabbing her first career double-double. She bettered her offensive production with a new career-high 17 points in UC's loss to No. 18/17 Marquette (1/27/07). Jacobs shot 6-of-15 from the field, including a 3-of-6 effort from 3-point range.

◆ Jill Stephens (Mineral Wells, W.Va./Parkersburg South) was named the athletics department's top female scholar-athlete of the fall quarter after earning a perfect 4.0 grade point average, plus was named to the Topcat Honor Roll. To qualify for the Topcat Honor Roll, a student-athlete must have earned a grade point average between a 3.5 and a 4.0 GPA.

TOP CATS:

◆ Treasure Humphries is UC's leading scorer (12.3), Shelly Bellman is the Bearcats' leading rebounder (6.4) and Carla Jacobs is the assists leader (4.36). Both Bellman and Humphries have been named to the BIG EAST

Pitt leads the series 3-2, but the Bearcats own a 2-0 edge when playing in Pittsburgh. The game marks the first time Cincinnati will play in the Petersen Events Center.

Honor Roll this season and Jacobs was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Week.

SCORING DROUGHT ENDED

♦ After scoring in the first 48 games of her college career, Shelly Bellman was held scoreless vs. No. 17/18 Marquette (1/27/07) and No. 5/6 UConn (1/30/07). Bellman broke the slump with five points vs. No. 25/23 Rutgers (2/3/07) and got back into double figure scoring with 11 vs. Providence (2/6/07).

MOST IMPROVED:

♦ Junior Emy Ogide is averaging 6.0 points a game this season, more than doubling her career average coming into the season of 2.2 points. Ogide led UC in scoring in back-to-back games. She put up 14 points vs. No. 25/23 Rutgers (2/3/07) and the game before, scored a team-high 12 points, on 5-of-6 six shooting from the field vs. No. 5/6 UConn (1/30/07). She had a career game in UC's 65-60 win over Dayton (11/16/06). The 6-2 junior forward came off the bench to score a game- and career-high 18 points, doubling her previous best of nine points set last year against Georgetown on Feb. 21, 2006.

BEARCATS ATTACK THE BOARDS:

♦ The Bearcats have won the battle of the boards in 19 of their 23 games this season. Only Georgetown and Top 25-ranked teams Rutgers (2/3/07), Louisville (12/14/06) and Arkansas (12/28/06) have beaten UC in that category. Cincinnati owns an +8.4 rebounding margin this season, third in the BIG EAST. The UC single-season record is a +6.7 margin.

BOARD BUDDIES:

♦ The sophomore trio of Shelly Bellman, Michelle Jones and Angel Morgan are wrecking balls on the boards for UC. Jones is an expert on offensive rebounding, while Bellman and Morgan make their marks on the defensive end. Bellman leads the team with 6.4, Jones adds 6.0 and Morgan is third with 5.4. Jones has 290 career rebounds and more than half have been offensive (151). Of her 137 rebounds this season, 74 have been offensive. She averages 3.22 per game, sixth in the BIG EAST. Bellman has 320 career rebounds and 240 have been defensive. She has 101 defensive rebounds of her 140 total this season. Morgan has 124 rebounds this season and 96 have been defensive. She has 175 in her career, with 125 of those being defensive.

"A" FOR ACCURACY:

♦ Sophomore Michelle Jones is shooting a team-high 53 percent from the field, ninth in the BIG EAST. She has converted 107 of 203 attempts. After her 11-point performance vs. No. 5/6 UConn (1/30/07) she moved to second on the team in scoring (11.7). She had career highs of 10 field goals made (10-of-13) and 24 points against Tennessee Tech (12/21/06). She was also a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line.

SPREADING THE WEALTH:

♦ Cincinnati is sixth in the BIG EAST in scoring, but the Bearcats don't have a player who averages more than 15.0 points. Three players average double figures: Treasure Humphries (12.3), Michelle Jones (11.7) and Shelly Bellman (11.3).

HOLD EM':

♦ UC has held 12 of its 23 opponents to 65 points or less and held No. 24 DePaul (1/14/07) to 44 points, a season low.

3-POINT THREAT:

♦ Senior Karen Twehues is third all-time at UC in career 3-point field goals made with 178. She leads the Bearcats in 3-point field goal percentage at 37 percent, seventh in the BIG EAST.

STEALS AND DEALS:

♦ Senior Treasure Humphries and freshman Carla Jacobs are the masters of creating shots for their teammates, helping UC to 16.4 assists a game, fourth in the BIG EAST. The duo are also creating havoc on the defensive end, going one-two in steals.

♦ Humphries, who led the team in steals both her freshman and junior seasons, is pacing the team in thefts with 52 and is fourth in the BIG EAST with 2.26 a game. She has had multiple steals in 19 of 23 games this season. She tied a career-high with seven take aways vs. No. 23 Arkansas (12/28/06). Jacobs is second on the team in steals with 38. She has had at least one steal in 18 of 22 games this season.

♦ Jacobs is UC's assist leader with 96 in 22 games, a 4.36 average that ranks fourth in the BIG EAST. She had a career-high 10 assists against Georgetown (1/23/07). She knows how to take care of the ball too. She is third in the conference in assist/turnover ratio (2.04) and the top freshman in that category. Treasure Humphries is second on the team in assists (91). She has had three or more assists in 18 of the Bearcats' 23 games. She is eighth in the BIG EAST with 3.96 per game.

DOUBLING DOWN:

♦ Carla Jacobs got UC's 12th double-double of the 2006-07 season with a career performance against Georgetown (1/23/07). She had 15 points and set a new career high with 10 assists.

♦ Karen Twehues and Michelle Jones both registered double-doubles vs. Xavier (1/17/07). Jones, accomplishing the feat for the second time in as many games, had 18 points and 10 rebounds. Twehues, notching the third of this season and in her career, had 12 points and 10 rebounds. The last time two Bearcat players had a twin double in the same game was Dec.

21, 2004 vs. Loyola Marymount when Anne Stephens scored 11 points and grabbed 11 boards, and Toni Slaughter had 16 points and 12 rebounds.

- ♦ Karen Twehues scored her first career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds against Alabama A&M (12/18/06). She blocked two shots, a career high. She added her second career double-double with 10 points and a career-high 12 rebounds against USF (1/6/07).
- ♦ Michelle Jones recorded a double-double in the season-opener against Youngstown State (11/10/06). She scored 11 points and nabbed 10 rebounds for her second career double-double. Jones tacked on her second double-double of the season with a game-high 19 points and a career-high 13 rebounds vs. No. 24 DePaul (1/14/07).
- ♦ Shelly Bellman has six career double-doubles, including five this season, most recently vs. Seton Hall (1/20/07) when she had 12 points and 11 rebounds. Against Notre Dame (1/10/07) she had 13 points, 10 rebounds and added seven assists. She had 14 points and 11 rebounds against St. Francis (11/22/06); 13 points and 13 rebounds against Murray State (11/28/06); and 17 points and 11 rebounds against Tennessee Tech (12/21/06). She also had seven assists, on the verge of getting UC's first triple-double since Jane Anne Preston in 1992.

DOUBLE OR NOTHING:

- ♦ Bellman has scored in double figures in all but seven games she has played this season and in 30 of 51 career contests. Michelle Jones has scored in double figures in a team-high 17 games this season and 34 in her career.
- ♦ The Bearcats have had at least three players score in double figures in every game except for three this season (only two vs. USF on 1/6/07 and vs. Marquette on 1/27/07 and only one vs. Rutgers 2/3/07). The Bearcats have had five players score in double figures in five games this season; Cincinnati's 83-51 win over St. Francis (Pa.) (11/22/06), UC's 86-70 win over Tennessee Tech (12/21/06), a 94-82 loss to No. 23 Arkansas, UC's BIG EAST home opening win over Georgetown, 77-55 (1/3/07), and the Bearcats' 74-61 win over Providence (2/6/07).

GETTING FLOOR TIME:

- ♦ Freshman Carla Jacobs leads UC in minutes played at 29.1 per game. Jacobs played a career-high 39 minutes vs. Providence (2/6/07). Angel Morgan is second on the team in average minutes played with 28.9. Morgan played the entire 40 minutes and scored a career-high 18 points, vaulting UC to a 74-57 win over Murray State (11/28/06). The win gave head coach Laurie Pirtle her 300th at Cincinnati.

RECORD SHATTERED:

- ♦ UC broke a team record for 3-point field goals in a game in an 89-65 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Nov. 14. UC finished with 13 treys, including 10 in the first half. The Bearcats bested the old mark of 12 set vs. Houston on March 5, 2004.

STREAKING:

- ♦ The Bearcats extended their home-opener winning streak to 11 with an 89-65 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff (11/14/06).

NORTHWESTERN TOURNEY HONORS:

- ♦ Shelly Bellman averaged 19.5 points and 5.5 rebounds and was named to the all-tournament team of the Mildred and Roger L. White Invitational (12/1-2/06), hosted by Northwestern.

DAGOSTINO DEPARTS UC STAFF:

- ♦ First-year assistant coach Dave Dagostino has left the UC coaching staff, citing personal reasons. The resignation was effective on January 26. Prior to joining the UC staff last spring, Dagostino had been the head coach at Jacksonville State University, where he also resigned from his post following a six-year tenure at the Alabama school, including three as the Gamecock's head coach.

STARTING FRESH:

- ♦ The Bearcats had their earliest season opener in school history, playing at Youngstown State on Nov. 10. With the start against YSU, Carla Jacobs became one of nine true freshmen Division I point guards in the nation who started in their teams' women's basketball season openers.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Bearcats will play their second consecutive BIG EAST road game when UC takes on St. John's on Saturday, Feb. 17 in Queens, N.Y.



A REASON TO CELEBRATE

CINCINNATI - Cincinnati and Xavier played in front of a sold out crowd Jan. 17 in the Women's Crosstown Shootout. The game, centered on the theme "Celebrate Women in Sports", was a huge success for both teams and the community, but Xavier used a monster second half to steal UC's show, 89-76. With the win the Musketeers nabbed the ornate Kendle Cup.

The Women's Crosstown Shootout included many celebrations. In a pre-game ceremony Hamilton County Commissioner Todd Portune declared Nov. 28, 2006 Laurie Pirtle Day in honor of her 300th win at Cincinnati against Murray State on that date. WCPO anchor Lisa Cornwell declared for the City of Cincinnati that Jan. 17, 2007 is Skyline Chili Women's Crosstown Shootout Day. A half-time ceremony "Celebrating Women in Sports" was held to honor former UC and XU athletes. Nearly 100 current and former UC and XU players were recognized. Bill Keating Jr. was recognized for his efforts to "Sell Out the Shootout." UC basketball great Cheryl Cook was on hand and recognized at half court and also signed autographs.

- The official attendance of 13,176 is the largest crowd to ever see a regular season women's basketball game in the city of Cincinnati. It was the first sold out women's basketball game in Fifth Third Arena history.

FORMER UC COACH HONORED:

Former University of Cincinnati women's basketball coach Sandy Smith was honored with the Oppenheimer Funds BIG EAST Coach's Achievement Award on Jan. 31 during the Bearcats' men's basketball game vs. Louisville. She is the second recipient of the honor. Coach Smith spent seven years on the UC women's basketball coaching staff during the 1980's, three of which were as head coach. During her tenure, UC achieved a 132-83 record and had wins over powerhouses, Kentucky and Tennessee. She also led UC to its best ever conference finish in the program's history at that time. She recruited and coached two-time All-American Cheryl Cook and All-American Bev Obringer. She also coached at the 1983 Pan American team trials. Oppenheimer Funds recognized coach Smith's commitment to excellence and outstanding leadership, both on and off the court.

- Treasure Humphries is currently ninth in UC's career record book for 3-point field goals made with 62. She needs three to overtake Angie Zimmerman (1992-95) who had 65 in her career. Humphries needs four assists (257) to break into UC's top 10. Madinah Slaise (97-00) is currently No. 10 with 261. Humphries needs to average 8.4 points in UC's next five games to reach 1,000 in her career. She currently has 958.
- Jill Stephens is one point shy of reaching 300 in her career (299).
- Angel Morgan needs one point to reach 200 in her career (199).
- Michelle Jones is 10 rebounds short of 300 in her career (290).
- Emy Ogide is 15 rebounds short of reaching 200 in her career (185).
- Shelly Bellman is 14 assists shy of the 150-career mark (136).
- Karen Twehues needs 19 points to reach 800 in her career (781).

ABOUT THE BEARCATS:

- ♦ Senior Treasure Humphries has led the Bearcats in steals her junior and freshman years.
- ♦ Senior Karen Twehues provides a strong outside threat for the Bearcats. She has 175 career 3-pointers, third in UC history, and coming into this season her .378 career 3-point percentage is second in the record books. She is currently at .376, behind Valerie King's mark of .399 (2001-04).
- ♦ Junior Emy Ogide was named the most improved player during the preseason. She did not start playing basketball until her sophomore year of high school. The athletic post player can govern the paint and open up the perimeter.
- ♦ The four sophomores, Shelly Bellman, Michelle Jones, Angel Morgan and Jill Stephens are a top 10 recruiting class. They learned plenty about Division I basketball last season with 62 starts between them.
- ♦ The freshman class of Carla Jacobs, Natasha Graboski and Stephanie Stevens is also a highly touted group. Jacobs (D-III) and Stevens (D-I) were both honored as Ohio High School Basketball Players of the Year. Graboski earned second team all-state honors.

36th SEASON OF UC WOMEN'S HOOPS: The 2006-07 season marks Cincinnati's 36th year of varsity competition. The 2005-06 squad gave UC its 500th victory on Dec. 3, 2005 during the fifth game of the season, an 82-48 win over Eastern Illinois. UC's all-time record is 526-460, seventh most wins among BIG EAST schools. Under head coach Laurie Pirtle the Bearcats are 308-297 and have made postseason appearances in eight of the last nine years.

UC IN THE BIG EAST: Cincinnati enters its second season as a member of the expanded BIG EAST Conference. In the preseason polls of the league's coaches the Bearcats were picked to finish 12th among the 16 teams. The Bearcats have compiled a 71-88 record against the current BIG EAST membership. Last year UC finished 11th in the regular season race with a 7-9 ledger and earned a berth to the BIG EAST Championship.

FIFTH THIRD ARENA ADVANTAGE: Cincinnati entered its 17th season in Fifth Third Arena with a 168-86 record and a .659 winning percentage since its opening in 1989-90, and a 120-32 mark in the past nine years. The Bearcats are 10-4 at home this season.

HUMPHRIES HONORS: In 2006, Treasure Humphries became the first Bearcat women's basketball player to earn All-BIG EAST honors when she was named to the all-conference second team. A total of 22 Bearcats have earned all-conference recognition during the Laurie Pirtle era.

◆ Carla Jacobs earned UC's first BIG EAST Women's Basketball Weekly honor this season after being named Freshman of the Week on Jan. 29. Jacobs had a career week as she averaged 16.0 points, 6.0 assists and 3.5 rebounds, while shooting 6-of-6 from the foul line. The guard tied her career-high with 15 points and dished out a career-high 10 assists in the team's 80-62 win over Georgetown. She bettered her offensive production with a new career-high 17 points in UC's loss to No. 18/17 Marquette.

◆ Sophomore Shelly Bellman was named to the BIG EAST Conference Women's Basketball Weekly Honor Roll for her performance in the Bearcats' 67-62 loss to No. 16 Louisville on Dec. 14. Bellman notched 16 points and nine rebounds against the undefeated Cardinals at Freedom Hall. She also generated three steals and two assists. Her three 3-point field goals were a season high.

◆ Senior guard Treasure Humphries was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll for her performance against No. 23 Arkansas. The Canton, Ohio native tied career highs with her 25 points and seven steals. She also dished out four assists and had a team-high seven rebounds in the 94-82 setback to the Lady Razorbacks on Dec. 28.

Tenisha Benson

(Akron, Ohio/Archbishop Hoban)

Benson, a 5-foot-9 point guard/shooting guard, is the top-rated perimeter player in the state by *Ohio Girls Basketball Report*. An adidas All-American and all-state selection, Benson is on pace to be the all-time leading scorer and rebounder at Hoban High School. She averaged 16 points, 7.5 rebounds and 5.5 assists a game as a junior. She is a candidate for Ms. Ohio Basketball.

Asia Jenkins

(Piscataway, N.J./Piscataway)

A 5-foot-11 guard, Jenkins was rated the No. 1 overall player in the latest edition of the *National Recruiting Report*. She averaged 15.7 points and 2.4 assists at Piscataway High School as a junior, earning all-state honors. She was the 2005-06 Middlesex County Player of the Year and is a candidate for this year's Ms. New Jersey Basketball.

Caitlin Pauley

(Chicago Heights, Ill./Marian Catholic)

Pauley, a 6-foot-3 left-handed post, is captain of her Marian Catholic High School team that is ranked No. 1 in preseason polls. Pauley, averaging 15 points and eight rebounds a game her junior year, was invited to the adidas All-American Camp. She is rated one of the top 20 front court players in the nation by Dan Olson Collegiate Girls Basketball Report.

"Tenisha, Asia and Caitlin are total-package kids," said University of Cincinnati head coach Laurie Pirtle. "All three young ladies come from wonderful families and will undoubtedly impact our academic, athletic and campus communities from day one.

"We needed a group that has the maturity to impact UC and the BIG EAST right away," she added.

Pirtle, who is entering her 21st year as the Bearcats' mentor, is without question the most successful women's basketball coach in UC history and put together one of her most impressive coaching jobs in the first season in the powerful BIG EAST Conference. Pirtle has directed UC to nine winning seasons in the last 10 years and nine postseason appearances. She is the winningest coach in UC history.
