FOR STARTERS:

The University of Cincinnati women's soccer team will hit the road for two non-conference contests this weekend. On Friday, Sept. 9, UC will battle Kentucky at 7 p.m. ET in Lexington. The Bearcats will then head north for a meeting with Central Michigan University on Sunday, Sept. 11. Kickoff from Mt. Pleasant, Mich. is set for 1 p.m. ET.

NIKE-FLYER INVITATIONAL WRAPUP:

Cincinnati earned a 2-2 tie with No. 10 Ohio State in the opener of the Dayton Nike-Flyer Invitational on Sept. 2, in Dayton. UC came out firing as freshman Jenn Johannigman scored her second goal of the season just 1:45 into the match. Cincinnati extended its lead in the 28th minute when freshman Chelsea Kindschuh tallied her first career goal. Kindschuh fired a shot just inside the far post from 20 yards out, beating OSU keeper Shannon Neely to stretch the UC lead to 2-0. Ohio State (2-0-1) got itself back into the match with a Jennifer Greenwood goal at the 40:28 mark. The equalizer came in the 75th minute after Lisa Collison took a pass from Emily Francis and beat Bearcat goalkeeper Sherry Slye for her third goal of the season.

On Sept. 4, Dayton scored a late goal to propel the host Flyers to a 2-1 victory against Cincinnati in the tournament finale. UC scored early on Dayton's home field, as sophomore Andrea Haney collected a rebound off the post after a Kindschuh shot and put it home to stake the Bearcats to a 1-0 lead just 5:17 into the contest. Dayton grabbed the momentum just before the half, when Natalia Walters headed in a Courtney Sirmans pass in the 43rd minute to tie the match at one. Sirmans scored in the 89th minute to give Dayton the lead and send the Flyers to just their fourth win all-time against Cincinnati. The Bearcats still hold an 11-4-1 record in the rivalry series.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS:

The Kentucky Wildcats enter Friday's match with a 3-0-1 record after defeating Bellarmine, 7-1, on Sept. 6. Kate Hughes notched just the third hat trick in UK women's history in the victory and leads the Wildcats with four goals and eight points. UK has played one common opponent of the Bearcats, Michigan State. The Wildcats and Spartans fought to a 1-1 tie on Aug. 26 in Lexington. UC defeated Michigan State, 1-0, at home.

match of the trip, then dropped a 2-0 decision to Air Force. Erica Rohren leads CMU with four goals, including the game-winner against Valparaiso, and eight points.

Central Michigan head coach Tony DiTucci, in his second year as the Chippewa mentor, owns a 11-10-4 career record. DiTucci has never faced the Bearcats as a head coach.

UC-CMU SERIES HISTORY:

UC has met Central Michigan four times in its history, including UC's eighth-ever match in 1980. The Bearcats are 3-1-0 against the Chippewas, including a 15-0 victory in 1982. In 2003, CMU earned a 2-1 overtime win in Cincinnati.

UC PICKED EIGHTH:

The Bearcats were chosen to finish eighth in the BIG EAST's Division B in a poll of the BIG EAST head coaches. Defending national champ Notre Dame was unanimously selected to capture the Division B crown, while Connecticut was tabbed as the Division A favorite. Fellow NCAA qualifiers West Virginia and Villanova were selected to finish second in Divisions A and B, respectively.

"FRESH" STARTS:

Five freshmen have started each of the first four matches for the Bearcats. Forwards Jenn Johannigman and Kristin May, along with midfielders

Chelsea Kindschuh and Lindsey Noteboom earned starting nods. Defender Kim Sykes also started each match along the backline for the Bearcats. Johannigman leads UC with two goals and four points. Kindschuh is second on the team with one goal and one assist for three points. Sykes scored the game winner in UC's 1-0 victory against Michigan State on Aug. 28. May and Noteboom have each picked up one assist on the season.

TOUGH SLEDDING:

The Bearcats face one of the most difficult schedules in the country in 2005, the team's first year in the BIG EAST Conference. UC will play six NCAA College Cup qualifiers, including defending national champion Notre Dame. The majority of those contests come on the road, making things even more difficult for UC. 23rd season
240-156-29 overall

Meridy Glenn, the second-winningest female coach in NCAA women's soccer history, enters her 23rd season at the helm of the UC program. She has compiled a 240-156-29 record in her previous 22 seasons and has guided the Bearcats to six NCAA tournament appearances.

Her 240 victories rank 10th in NCAA women's soccer history and in 2001, she became the first female women's soccer coach to reach the 200 win plateau. She has led the Bearcats to seven NSCAA top-20 finishes and helped produce 25 all-region selections and five all-americans.

Her student-athletes have also excelled in the classroom. Eight Bearcats have earned NSCAA Scholar-Athlete All-America honors, while nine have

A Barrington, R.I. native, Glenn came to UC after a successful playing career at Brown University. She graduated in 1980 with a degree in biology and received her MBA in operations management from UC in 1997.
