# LELLIE SWORDS

## Head Coach » 4th season at Cincinnati

**L**ellie Swords begins her fourth season as the head coach of the University of Cincinnati's women's lacrosse program after building a resume that includes a playing and coaching career at the premier level. Dedicated to the complete development of her student-athletes, Swords

provides her athletes the opportunity to succeed athletically, academically, and as contributing members of the community.

The Bearcats continued its improvement in 2010, scoring more goals on less shots than the 2009 squad. UC recorded a .447 shot percentage in 2010, nearly doubled its assists for the season (78 in 2010) and improved statistically in ground balls (351).

In 2009 the Bearcats began the season with a three-game win streak and ended the season on a two-game win streak. Cincinnati scored 58 more goals, controlled 48 more draws, picked up 15 more ground balls, and tallied 76 more points than the inaugural team, showing improvement in every statistical category.

Academically, the lacrosse team has been honored with the BIG EAST Conference Team Academic Excellence Award during both seasons it has been a member of the prestigious league (2008-09, 2009-10). The award recognizes the highest collective grade-point average in each conference sport.

The squad also posted a perfect Academic Progress Report score in 2008 and Lindsey Marshall graduated magna cum laude in the summer of 2009. Ten UC players earned IWLCA Academic Squad honors over the last two seasons. For the 2008-09 academic year, Jess Kazaks, Lauren Kelly, Patty Kelly, Shannon Lynes, and Lindsey Marshall were honored and for the 2009-10 academic year Jen Mott, Kazaks, Patty Kelly, Lynes and Skelton were recognized by the IWLCA for excellence in the classroom.

Additionally, Cincinnati was recognized by the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) as earning Academic Squad honors for the 2010 season. UC was one of 48 Division I schools to receive the recognition in 2010.

Swords has also encouraged her athletes to become active members of the community, varying from volunteering time around the holidays at the Drop Inn Center to visiting the Cincinnati Children's Hospital. Other community service projects have included Adopt a Family, Adopt a Troop, Toys for Tots, Sports Buddies, Cincinnati Kid Fest, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Ronald McDonald House, Winners Walk Tall, Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, Bras for Bridges, and Breast Cancer Awareness. The Bearcats have also given back to the lacrosse community as well. During the summer and fall, the team hosted several clinics for area youth.

Swords became UC's first intercollegiate women's lacrosse coach on Feb. 16, 2007, and led the Bearcats to the first win in school history on March 7, 2008, against Saint Mary's. She was selected as one of three BIG EAST coaches to serve on the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) Board of Directors.

Prior to her coaching stop at UC, Swords helped Johns Hopkins build one of the premier women's lacrosse programs in the nation. The Blue Jays posted a 56-28 record during her time on the Baltimore campus. In 2003 and again in 2005, she directed a defense that was ranked in the Top 10 nationally.

Swords mentored 2005 all-American Lacey-Leigh Hentz, who was a four-time first team all-American Lacrosse Conference (ALC) defender. In 2007, sophomore Sarah Gallion earned second team all-ALC honors.

Swords served as the defensive coordinator at Johns Hopkins and was promoted to associate head coach in the fall of 2006. She was a volunteer assistant for one season before being promoted to full-time status in August 2002.

After beginning her coaching career at George Mason, Swords moved on to Cornell where she worked primarily with the Big Red defense. During her three-year stay in Ithaca, N.Y., Cornell was ranked as high as No. 15 in the national polls and won the ECAC Championship in 2000.

In 2001, Swords was an assistant coach at the St. Paul's School for Girls in Baltimore while concurrently serving as a volunteer assistant at Hopkins.

A four-year letterwinner at James Madison, Swords started all 35 games over her final two seasons. She led the team in interceptions in each of her final two seasons and was awarded the squad's Unsung Hero award in 1996. She also garnered Virginia I/South II honors as a senior.

The Cherry Hill, N.J., native graduated from JMU in 1996 with a bachelors degree in kinesiology and minor in business. She continued her playing career on Team Toyota until retirement in 2005.

Swords' husband, Kyle, played professional soccer in the A-League with the Hershey Wildcats and Charleston Battery, and in the indoor league with the Harrisburg Heat and Baltimore Blast. The Swords have three children, Rianne, Killian, and Jameson.





# LAUREN SCHWARZMANN

Assistant Coach » 3rd season

**L**auren Schwarzmann, a former standout at Johns Hopkins, begins her third season at the University of Cincinnati.

Schwarzmann was selected to represent the U.S. as a member of the senior women's national lacrosse team in August, 2010. The 36-player squad was

chosen after a three-day tryout at the University of Maryland. Schwarzmann earned a spot as a midfielder on the team and will train for the 2013 Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL) World Cup.

A four-year starter and four-time all-conference selection for the Blue Jays, Schwarzmann was on the Tewaaraton Trophy (the top individual award in women's lacrosse) watch list in 2008. An all-region selection in 2007 as a midfielder, she was selected to play in the North/South College Senior All-Star game. Schwarzmann finished her Johns Hopkins career with 79 goals, 39 assists, and 118 points, ranking in the Top 10 in school history in all three categories. Schwarzmann is also a member of the US Women's National Team and has been a part of the program since her '07-'08 senior season.

Schwarzmann has played for and coached with UC head coach Lellie Swords when the two were at Hopkins. Swords was an associate head coach with the Blue Jays and the Director of the Jays Lacrosse club team, a middle school girls squad. Schwarzmann was recruited by Swords to JHU and was an assistant coach for the Jays club team.

Schwarzmann graduated in the spring of 2008 with a degree in public health studies. Schwarzmann plays an integral part in the growth of lacrosse in the Greater Cincinnati area, running camps and leagues through the 513 Lacrosse organization and the Natilax Elite club team. She will handle the offensive coordinator duties at UC, and recruiting. She aids in fundraising, team academics and video exchange.

Assistant Coach » 1st season

**U**niversity of Cincinnati lacrosse head coach Lellie Swords added Syracuse defender Breanna Stiff to her coaching staff in October, 2010. Stiff was a four-year letterwinner while at Syracuse.

While at Syracuse, Stiff experienced enormous success as the Orange advanced to the NCAA

Tournament quarterfinals every season. As a freshman, Syracuse earned its first NCAA Tournament win before advancing to the quarterfinals. During her sophomore campaign the Orange won a school-record 18 games and advanced to the Final Four for the first time in school history. The 2010 squad finished the season with a 15-9 record and advanced to the Final Four for the second time in three seasons.

As a senior she saw action in every game and made her first start of the season against Colgate, tying her career-high in ground balls (2). She finished her junior year with five groundballs, nine draw controls, and four caused turnovers and was named to the Athletic Director's Honor Roll in the spring semester. Stiff graduated in the spring of 2010 with a degree in public health. A native of Hampstead, Md., Stiff assists with the 513 Lacrosse organization and the Natilax Elite club team. She handles individual player development, video exchange, fundraising, and assists with recruiting.

**E**ric Wolery joined the lacrosse staff as a volunteer assistant in the fall of 2010.

Wolery, a Cincinnati native, graduated from Lakota East High School before extending his lacrosse career on the collegiate level. He played goalie at Clarkson University (Potsdam, N.Y.) for two seasons before transferring to Mount St. Joseph in Cincinnati.

While at Clarkson, Wolery won five games in goal and recorded 190 saves. At the Mount, Wolery played 14 games played in goal, including nine starts, as a junior. He recorded 180 saves and garnered the team's Most Valuable Player honors. His senior season, Wolery started all 15 games in goal, earning six wins and recording 232 saves.

Wolery played four seasons of varsity lacrosse in high school. As a high school junior, Wolery collected First Team all-City and Second Team all-Ohio honors while as a senior he was named First Team all-City and First Team all-Ohio, as well as winning the Warrior Position Player of the Year in Division 1B.
