

seasonOUTLOOK

A new era begins for Cincinnati women's soccer in 2008 as Michelle Salmon opens her first season as head coach after winning back-to-back Mid-American Conference titles with Ball State. Salmon takes over a program that returns nine starters, including all-BIG EAST forward Erin MacDonald. The Bearcats are looking for their first trip to the BIG EAST Tournament in the fourth year of affiliation with the powerful conference.

FORWARDS

MacDonald, UC's first all-BIG EAST selection, returns after scoring seven goals and adding seven assists for 21 points in 2007, earning second-team all-conference honors. The junior has posted 10 goals in her first two seasons as a Bearcat. Sophomore Kendall Loggins, who scored four goals and added four assists to finish second on the team in scoring, returns with a year of starting experience under her belt. Freshman Julie Morrissey, a two-time all-Massachusetts selection, will challenge for a starting spot up top immediately. Junior Lisa Clark, speedy sophomore Vanessa Hardin and classmate Emily Hebbeler, who scored a goal in limited action in 2007, provide capable scoring punch off the bench. Senior Teresa Smolilo adds depth to the Bearcat attack.

MIDFIELDERS

Senior Jenn Johannigman, who has totaled six goals and four assists through her first three seasons, returns to lead a veteran midfield group. Melissa Bigg, who spent the summer of 2008 as a member of the USL W-League's West Virginia Illusion,

will start alongside Johannigman. Bigg was the Bearcats' second-leading scorer last season with four goals and four assists. Senior Kristin May had a breakout campaign in 2007, scoring three goals and adding five assists. A three-year starter, May has played in 54 matches and provides experience and a scoring punch from the wing. Redshirt junior Chelsea Kindschuh returns after missing 2007 with a knee injury. A two-year starter prior to injury, she has accounted for a goal and two assists in 35 career matches. Sophomores Logan Ballinger, who scored the last-minute, game-tying goal against rival Xavier in 2007, and Ellen Parker return to fight for time in the midfield. Rookie Lauren Lucas won a state title as a prep and won state cup championships with her club team, bringing the kind of winning mentality that Salmon is building at Cincinnati.

DEFENDERS

Senior and four-year starter Kim Sykes will anchor the Bearcat defense in 2008. Sykes has started all 54 matches of her career and has twice earned all-Ohio honors. Junior Heather Neiser, who has started since her freshman campaign, is back on the left side. Senior captain Lindsey Noteboom moves from her wide midfield position to right back, where she will factor in the Bearcat attack. Sophomore transfer Sydney Barker, who started nine matches as a freshman at Alabama in 2007, looks to get the starting nod alongside Sykes. Highly-touted freshmen Kay Young and Aimee Bux will also work themselves into the mix for playing time. Fellow freshmen Kelli Pawelko, Erin Kaufman and Deja Amato provide a youthful base of defenders to build around.


