Autonomy Legislation Update

The below illustrates the initial look at what the conferences that make up the "Power 5" (i.e. Atlantic Coast, Big 12, Big Ten, Pac-12 and Southeastern Conference) would be looking for in the upcoming legislative cycle regarding autonomous legislation. Remember that these conferences are being granted some additional flexibility to change rules for themselves in specific areas within Division I. This is the first step. They must identify areas in which they are seeking additional levels of autonomy with a more specific and formal report due by January.

Removing Duplicates

In order to ensure you do not have any duplicates in your recruiting databases (it can adversely affect contacts, evaluations, visits and phone calls) do the following:

- Login got JumpForward
- Go to your Prospect Database
- Click the DUPLICATES box (which will list all duplicate recruit names)
- Click the checkbox next to the names that are duplicate and select MERGE

News Headlines

An internal investigation at Georgia Tech revealed impermissible telephone calls and text messages that occurred from 2011-2012. The violations were committed by the football and men's and women's basketball coaching staffs. This extends Georgia Tech's probation, which began in 2012 for similar violations.

The investigation exposed more than 460 impermissible phone calls and more than 250 impressible texts. One assistant football coach was responsible for nearly 80% of the violations. He resigned shortly after the calls and texts were discovered. Members of the two basketball coaching staffs were suspended for a number of games. The athletic department has self-imposed probation and other restriction until June 2017.

→ The JumpForward app is one of the ways the University of Cincinnati monitors phone calls and text messages to prevent violations similar to Georgia Tech.
