-Temple looks to make it four straight wins against Cincinnati and remain perfect in conference play.

THIS WEEK

The Temple Owls are continuing to roll through conference play with a 21-17 win against Navy. Temple will have their toughest opponent yet as the 6-0 #20 Cincinnati Bearcats come to Philadelphia to challenge the Owls 3-0 American Athletic Conference record. This is the first ranked opponent the Owls will face this season. Temple is potentially looking at playing four ranked opponents in the final five games of the season. Kickoff is set for Saturday, October 20, 2018, at 12:00 ET and will air on ESPNU and WTEL 610 ESPN.

Temple and Cincinnati first squared off in October, 1973. The game took place at Temple Stadium and resulted in a 16-15 win for the Owls. Temple has the slight advantage in the series 12-7-1 and has won three in a row against the Bearcats. The Owls have outscored the Bearcats 103-63 in the last three head-to-head matchups.

This past weekend, QB Anthony Russo continued growing in the starting role, throwing 23-31 for 300 yards and a touchdown. He connected with nine different receivers this week compared to 11 last week. His longest pass came on the first play of the first series in the fourth quarter. With the game tied, Russo connected with WR Ventell Bryant for a 62-yard touchdown. Bryant finished with a season-high eight catches for 147 yards. He is quickly approaching the Owls all-time receiving yards record held by Willie Marshall with 2,272 career yards. Redshirt sophomore RB Tyliek Raynor scored his first career touchdown on a 15-yard rush. FB Rob Ritrovato scored the other touchdown for Temple on a one-yard stuff for his second score of the season.

Defensively, the Owls were able to contain the potent Navy rushing offense. Temple only allowed 284 total yards and didn't let Navy score over the final 28 minutes of the game. The defense managed the time of possession differential well and forced two fumbles. The Owls defense forced three punts and two turnover on downs in crucial late-game situations. The Midshipmen only converted 5-13 third downs and 1-3 fourth downs that set up the Owls with great field position starting on average at the Temple 39-yard line.

NKL Sam Franklin led Temple with 10 tackles and two TFLs. LB Shaun Bradley and DT Michael Dogbe had eight tackles each. SAF Delvon Randall had seven tackles and a forced fumble.

The Owls snatched the game from Navy with nine minutes left to play and the defense held strong to grab the win. Navy had only lost three games at home in the past four seasons and two of those loses were against Temple.

LAST TIME vs. CINCINNATI

The last time Temple and Cincinnati played was on November 10, 2017, at Nippert Stadium under the Friday night lights. Temple came out on top at the end of a high-scoring affair with the final of 35-24. Both teams had over 400 yards of total offense and over 20 first downs. QB Frank Nutile went 18-30 for 224 yards and had two touchdowns, one on the ground and one in the air. RB David Hood had 23 carries for 108 yards and a score as well.

LAST TIME @ LINCOLN FINANCIAL

The last time last time Temple and Cincinnati played at Lincoln Financial Field was on October 29, 2016. The Owls won in dominating fashion 34-13. This was the eighth consecutive game that the Owls had scored 26 points-or-more and it was also the second season in a row the Owls reached the 10 win mark. QB Phillip Walker led the offense with 199 yards and two touchdowns in the air. RB Ryquell Armstead had 18 carries for 61 yards and two touchdowns. WR Ventell Bryant had three catches for 66 yards and a touchdown. The defense forced Cincinnati to punt seven times and had two fumble recoveries.

UP NEXT

After Cincinnati, the Owls head into a bye week before heading down to Orlando to take on #10 UCF on November 1 in a Thursday night primetime matchup.

This Week

TELL SOMETHING GOOD

WR Ventell Bryant has caught at least one pass in every game he has played in his career for a span of 42 straight games. He is tied for the longest active streak in FBS with Fresno State WR KeeSean Johnson.

WE'VE SEEN THIS BEFORE

The last time Temple started 3-0 in conference play was in the 2015 season. The Owls finished 10-4 and 7-1 in the AAC before playing in the conference championship game and the 2015 Marmot Boca Raton Bowl.

OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS

Temple has been among the most opportunistic teams in the country. The Owls rank first in the FBS with five defensive touchdowns, fourth with three blocked kicks, and 20th with seven interceptions. Their eleven takeaways ranked 22nd in the country.

DEFENSIVE DUEL

Both defenses have shown why they should be respected so far this season. Temple ranks 27th in total defense and Cincinnati ranks fourth. The Owls rank fifth in the nation in passing defense and Cincinnati ranks eighth. The Owls rank 12th in redzone defense and the Bearcats ranks 38th.

JUST A NUMBER

Temple has five wins against Top 25 opponents including in the last four seasons. 34-10 win against #19 Navy on 12/3/16

31-12 win against #21 Memphis on 11/21/15

20-10 win against #21 ECU on 11/1/14

#GETTHEBALL

Much has been made recently about college football teams using methods to reward players for turnovers. Geoff Collins may have started that tradition using a GetTheBall Board since his days as a defensive coordinator at Western Carolina from 2002-05. A grease board sits on the sidelines and players write their names on it when they create a takeaway. Today's players tend to write their twitter handles to grow their following. In addition, in 2017 Collins added allowing those players to hand the ball to any coach who must immediately drop down and do 10 push-ups.



A GOOD OFFENSE IS A GREAT DEFENSE

Temple has scored a non-offensive touchdown in six of seven games so far this season.

<u>Villanova</u>- Q.Roche blocked a field goal and it was returned 74-yards by K.Brown. <u>Buffalo</u>- B.Mack blocked punt that was recovered by T.Mason in the endzone. Maryland- S.Bradley inteception returned 78-yards.

T.Centeio completed a fake punt pass 36-yards to F.Johnson.

Tulsa- T.Mason 36-yard interception return

Q.Roche forced fumble that was recovered and returned 50-yards by K.Dioubate

BC- R.Ritrovato forced fumble on a kickoff that was recovered and returned 19-yards

CAUGHT BETWEEN A ROCK AND THE BALL

CB Rock Ya-Sin has been a force in the secondary during his first season with the Owls. Not only did Ya-Sin make SportsCenter Top 10 #1 with his interception against Tulsa, but he also ranks seventh in the nation with nine pass breakups.

DARE TO KICK

Isaiah Wright has 182 punt return 421 kick return yards which ranks him third in the nation in combined kick return yards with 603 total. Wright also returned a punt 59-yards for a touchdown against ECU.

FRESH FACES

Temple's Adam Klein has started games 4-7 at right tackle as a true freshman. He is one of just 17 FBS true freshmen starting on the offensive line and only one of three starting at the right tackle spot. The others are: Kylar Cooks (Texas State), and Donovan Laie (Arizona).

Team

TEMPLE TUFF

The phrase "Temple Tuff" is synonymous with the fight and grit of Temple's football team. However, it was coined by legendary Temple basketball coach John Chaney whose teams also were noted for their hard-nosed, lunch-pail passion by which they played.

BEST OF CLASS

Temple's senior class entered its fourth season with 27 victories. That ranked tied for ninth all-time in school history over a four-year span. Now with 31, they need two wins to tie the 2017 group as the all-time winningest in school history.

WINNING IS CONTAGIOUS

It's safe to say that Temple football has gone through a resurgence since moving to the American Athletic Conference, and Geoff Collins has helped to continue that narrative. Collins is currently tied with Matt Rhule for the most wins on average per season (7.0) and helped the Owls finish .500 or better for the fourth consecutive season, the first time that's happened since the early 1970s under Wayne Hardin.

GOING BOWLING

Temple football has been to seven bowl games in the program's history. Three of them have come in the past three years. The Owls have been bowl-eligible four consecutive seasons for the first time in program history and in the last nine years, Temple has been bowl-eligible seven times.

SIX NATIONS

Temple has more countries, eight, represented on this year's roster than any team in the country: Sweden (Oskar Andersson, Isaac Moore), Cameroon (Arnold Ebiketie, William Kwenkeu), Cuba (A.J. Perez, Jose Barbon), Dominican Republic (J.D. Gomez), Jamaica (Nickolos Madourie), Nigeria (David Nwaogwugwu), and the United States.

Geoff Collins

A BRONX TALE

Among Geoff Collins' first coaching stops was tutoring the linebackers at Fordham University in the Bronx in 1996 under head coach Nick Quartaro. Three of Collins' top hires since coming to Temple were part of that same staff. Chief of staff Vinny Sinagra was the defensive coordinator, offensive coordinator Dave Patenaude was the special teams and quarterbacks coach, and senior offensive advisor Tom Pajic handled receivers.

WHAT'S IN A NAME

Geoff Collins has been creative with titles for new staff members and has received some attention for it. He named former college head coach Vinny Sinagra his "Chief of Staff" and promoted two graduate assistants into full-time positions - Dave Gerson was named "S.W.A.G. Coordinator" (Specialist With Advanced Graphics) and Pat Boyle to "Strategic Specialist."

MAYHEM IS COMING

Geoff Collins came to Philadelphia with the title "Minister of Mayhem" and the Temple community quickly learned why. His Mississippi State and Florida defenses were designed to confuse offenses, cause havoc and create turnovers. However, his workouts and practices, for those not in the planning, look chaotic complete with fire engines, Easter bunnies, national flags, water guns, and more.

SEC-OND TO NONE

Long thought of as the best conference in college football, the SEC was home to Geoff Collins for seven of his 10 seasons prior to Temple. Collins served on Nick Saban's original Alabama staff in 2007 and then spent four seasons at Mississippi State and two at Florida before taking the head coaching position at Temple.

POSITION FLEXIBILITY

One of Geoff Collins' coaching philosophies is to incorporate position flexibility throughout his roster. He has always taught his defense globally so that players know what the man next to him is doing and so they can play each other's positions. Now that he controls the whole roster, that has led to many players being given the chance to play on both sides of the ball. In 2017-18, some of those were: Shaun Bradley (LB/RB), Freddie Booth-Lloyd (DL/FB), Dan Archibong (DL/OL), Ryquell Armstead (RB/DE), and Sam Franklin (LB/DE). Collins continues to move players around throughout the season.

Offense

BOMBS OVER BROAD STREET

Temple had much success throwing the football last season. The Owls threw for 3,273 yards overall, the second most in school history. Their 251.8 passing YPG last season was the highest for Temple since the 1994 season, when the Owls set a school record with exactly 251 YPG.

SHOW AND 'TELL

With 2,097 receiving yards, WR Ventell Bryant sits third overall on the Temple all-time career receiving yards list and second on the receptions list with 148. He is 175 yards away from breaking Willie Marshall's record of 2,272 yards. Bryant has the chance to put himself in good company in the top-10 AAC all-time receiving yards list.

YOUNG GUN

QB Anthony Russo has started the last four games for the Owls. His first career start came in a win at Maryland. Against Navy, Russo went 23-31 for 300 yards and a touchdown. On the season Russo is 88-150 with a 58.7% completion rate. He has thrown for 1173 yards, six touchdowns with a 4-1 (3-0 AAC) record.

THREE'S COMPANY

Regardless of injury, the Owls like to implement multiple packages using all three of the quarterbacks. All three quarterbacks: Frank Nutile, Anthony Russo, and Todd Centeio, have different styles and provide a brand new look for the Owls when they get out on the field.

LEAN WIT' IT RYQ WIT' IT

RB Ryquell Armstead is poised to climb his way up the Temple all-time rushing yard list. After rushing for 604 yards and five touchdowns last season he already has 122 carries, 626 yards, and six touchdowns so far this season. Armstead comes into Week 7 with 2,340 yards in his career, eighth in Temple history, and became the ninth Owl to rush for over 2,000 yards in a career. He is also fourth all-time in career rushing touchdowns as an Owl with 27. He is also eighth all-time in rushing yards in the AAC. Armstead also had rushed for 100+ yards in four straight games, the last Owl to do that was Tanardo Sharps in 2002. He rushed for 91 yards against ECU.

CUT FROM THE SAME CLOTH

Redshirt senior FB Rob "Nitro" Ritrovato recently was awarded #4 heading into the 2018 season. Ritrovato walked on to the team during his freshman year and made his collegiate debut in week three of his freshman year against Delaware State. He was also awarded a scholarship during the week nine bye last season. Ritrovato follows in the footsteps of fellow walk-on FB Nick Sharga. Sharga was also awarded the honor of wearing #4 during his redshirt sophomore season. He's rushed for 87 yards and two touchdowns this year.

OWL SCHOLARS

In an effort to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of Temple University's student-athletes, Temple Athletics introduced the OW Scholars Program in the Fall of 2016. Through team apparel, student-athletes on all of Temple's 19 sports regularly have the opportunity to wear items that represent their athletic lives while on campus or in the classroom; the Owl Scholars Program aims to accomplish the reverse - provide an easily identifiable symbol of academic success for student-athletes to wear on their respective field or court of competition.

The Owl Scholars Patch has been designed to pay homage to the rich history of the Temple Owls, while invoking images of the infamous speech of Temple University's founder Russell Conwell, Acres of Diamonds. The three stars above the regal owl symbolize the three different ways a student-athlete can earn the honor of having the patch included on their uniform/game warm-up:

YOU DO THE MATH

Offensive line coach Chris Wiesehan has taken Geoff Collins' position flexibility concept to a new level. Interior linemen, Matt Hennessy, Jovahn Fair and Vincent Picozzi spent the spring working at all five line positions. Tackles James McHale, and Jaelin Robinson can play each position. That group of six players could go 72 plays without using the same combination more than once. The Owls have added even more linemen into the mix with true freshmen Isaac Moore and Adam Klein consistently getting playing time.

POWER-I-WRIGHT

Although listed as a wide receiver, Isaiah Wright has been known to lineup in the backfield, especially in Wildcat formation. He did so in multiple series against Tulsa, and it proved to be productive again. Wright is first on the team with 877 all purpose yards which ranks 17th in the country. Wright also scored in five different ways last season (receiving TD, rushing TD, punt return TD, kick return TD, and passing 2 pt. conversion).

RETURN OF THE MACK

Coming off a great summer camp and cracking the first team, Branden Mack started his first collegiate game week one Villanova. The 6-5 redshirt sophomore was Nutile's favorite target the first two weeks of the season. Mack caught his first-career touchdown against Buffalo and caught another to pair it. He also blocked a punt against Buffalo that was recovered in the endzone for a touchdown. Mack has 25 catches for 275 yards and three touchdowns this season.

Defense

BIG THACK ATTACK

While early in his career as a defensive coordinator, 33-year old Andrew Thacker's defense had a signature game at Maryland followed by a monster week against Tulsa and another dominating week against ECU. The Owls D held ECU without a touchdown for the first time in AAC play and the first time in six years.

CAN YOU SMELL WHAT THE ROCK IS COOKING?

CB Rock Ya-Sin was known just as much for wrestling in high school as he was for football. The senior transfer from Presbyterian College was a dominant force in wrestling in Georgia, finishing his high school career as a three-time regional champion, county champion, and a two-time state champion. He has two interceptions so far this season and one against Tulsa that was #1 on SportsCenter Top 10.

NO FLY ZONE

Temple's young defensive backfield has been improving each week. Nothing speaks to that as much as this stat — they have allowed just six completions of over 20-yards this season. Four came in game two, and the last connection for 20+ yards was in the first half at Maryland in game three. While senior transfer Rock Ya-Sin has deservedly gotten the accolades with a team-leading two interceptions and nine passes defensed, junior Linwood Crump, redshirt sophomore Kimere Brown, and redshirt freshmen Christian Braswell and Ty Mason have matched the effort while sharing the load on the other corner (combined two INTs and five PBUs). The unit has not traded in run support for defending the pass as three safeties — Jyquis Thiomas, Bennie Walls and Rodney Williams recorded TFLs vs. ECU.

THE ULTIMATE WEAPON

Philadelphia football fans are familiar with a guy named Randall being "the ultimate weapon." Randall Cunningham was dubbed that in 1990 on the cover of Sports Illustrated. He backed that up with another four INTs and 80 tackles a year ago en route to first team All-American Athletic Conference honors. So far this season, Randall has 41 tackles, two pass breakups, and two forced fumbles.

EASY PICKIN'

The defense has been clicking on all cylinders since joining the AAC. Temple recorded 10 interceptions in 2017, their fourth straight season recording 10-or-more interceptions. The Owls are one of two teams in the AAC (Memphis) to record 10-or-more interceptions the last four years straight. The "Darkside" has seven interceptions so far in the 2018 season and one returned for a touchdown against Maryland and Tulsa.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

Last season's leading tackler was MLB Shaun Bradley with 85 stops. His on-field production allowed for him to become the defense's vocal leader as well. That led to Bradley earning one of the coveted single-digit jerseys this offseason. He currently leads the Owls with 50 tackles.

WILD BOYZ

Temple's defensive line has been dubbed with the nickname "Wild Boyz" over the past decade and the unit has lived up to the special billing. Two NFL first round draft choices - Muhammad Wilkerson (2011, NY Jets) and Haason Reddick (2016, Cardinals) - and a handful of other pro players have learned their trade at Temple. In 2017, Julian Taylor (49ers 6th round), Jacob Martin (Seahawks 7th), and Sharif Finch (Titans' FA) joined that fraternity. DTs Michael Dogbe and Freddie Booth-Lloyd lead a solid young group who are following in their footsteps.

THAT'S MY DOG

Michael Dogbe is expected to continue his own development and emerge as a leader for the defensive line. Not an easy job for a unit that lost three players to the professional levels in each of the past two seasons. Dogbe is a workout warrior with a 500 bench press, 37 reps of 225-bench, 685 squat, and a 4.85 40-yard dash, Dogbe is use to hard work. He has 4.5 sacks, 6.5 TFLs, two forced fumbles and 40 tackles on the season.

FBI

Freddie Booth-Lloyd's initials can also be used to represent a nickname – Freakin' Big Load. The 6-1, 330-lb. defensive lineman, referred to as "Freddie Love" by head coach Geoff Collins, has been used in short yardage situations for the Owls this season. He has been given the ball on the 1-yard line at Maryland and vs. ECU and plowed into the end zone each time for a touchdown.

A-E-I-O-U

Former Temple basketball player Bill Mlkvy lives in school folklore as "The Owl Without a Vowel." Now Temple University can also claim "The Owl with Every Vowel." Junior DT Karamo Dioubate's surname is complete with all five vowels. Dioubate hopes one day to not just live alongside Mlkvy in uniqueness, but in Temple's Hall of Fame. He recorded his first career sack against Maryland. He also recovered a fumble for a touchdown against Tulsa.

Special Teams

ISN'T THAT SPECIAL?

Ed Foley joined Temple's football program in 2008 and is now working under his fourth head coach. He has held many roles, including interim head coach for the 2016 Military Bowl, and continues as the special teams coordinator for the fifth straight season. During that time, the kicking game has flourished with both Austin Jones and Aaron Boumerhi among the most accurate kickers in the nation.

BLOCK PARTY

Since the start of Ed Foley's tenure as the team's special teams coordinator, the Owls are in second in the NCAA in blocked kicks (punts, field goals and PATs). The Owls have also blocked one of every kind of kick this season

The Owls have proved that this season by scoring on special teams in their first three games. Against Maryland, a fake punt pass thrown by QB Todd Centeio caught by WR Freddie Johnson for a touchdown was the first score of the game and got the Owls out in front early. The Owls' scored on offense, defense, and special teams at Maryland, and it had been nearly four years since they scored on all three phases of the game. The last time was Sept. 20, 2014 vs. Delaware State.

AIN'T THAT FRESH

Temple special teams has been a highlight of the team so far this season despite the in experience at some of the most vital positions on the field. The Owls have a redshirt freshman punter (Connor Bowler), kicker (Will Mobley), and long snapper (Cole Lerch).

Miscellaneous

EL DIABLO

On opening day, the team learned that a member of the Temple Football family was seriously ill and in a coma. Kane Ivers-Othus, an assistant equipment manager, and one of Geoff Collins' first hires at Temple (the two worked together at Florida), was diagnosed with leukemia and is currently in the hospital receiving treatment. A GoFundMe page (www.gofundme.com/help-kane-iversosthus) has been created by a family member and raised nearly \$50,000.

BEASTS OF THE NORTHEAST

If you want to go to the NFL, go to Temple. In the past three years, the Owls have had more players drafted or signed by NFL teams of any program in the northeast. This year alone, Temple had 10 players sign with NFL teams, among the most in the country.

WE'RE MOVIN' ON UP

The Owls saw seven players go to the pros after a very successful 2015 season topped by 10 players each in 2016 and 2017. Eight players were drafted, including DE/LB Haason Reddick who was selected by Arizona with the #13 overall pick in 2016. OL Dion Dawkins and CB Nate Hairston joined Reddick in 2016 while CB Tavon Young, DL Matt loannidis, and LB Tyler Matakevich were the 2015 draft choices. There are currently 17 former Owls playing in the NFL.

IT'S ALL ACADEMIC

While excelling on the field, Temple football student-athletes have also performed well in the classroom. Enrolled in 41 different majors, the team posted a combined cumulative GPA of 3.02 GPA this spring, the highest team GPA in program history, and the first time the team has finished above a 3.0 collectively. The team also posted a combined 3.15 summer GPA. It marked 11 consecutive semesters of 2.7+. The Owls also had the second-highest APR (Academic Progress Rate) among all NCAA Division I FBS programs. Temple remains one of two (Purdue) football programs in the nation whose multi-year APR has never decreased and its recent Graduate Success Rate (86) ranked 14th in the nation amongst all FBS institutions. In the past three bowl seasons, Temple ranked in the top three in number of graduates on the roster competing in a bowl game - thus marking three consecutive year of 20+.

COME HERE AND STAY A WHILE

Temple football is tied for sixth in country with 12 graduate students on the roster, including two graduate transfers. WR Ventell Bryant, DE Michael Dogbe, DE Jimmy Hogan, LB Todd Jones, OL James McHale, DE Zach Mesday, TE Chris Myarick, QB Frank Nutile, OL Aaron Ruff, SAF Jyquis Thomas, DB Rodney Williams, and WR Brodrick Yancy all received their undergraduate diplomas and are pursuing masters degrees in a variety of disciplines.

POWERFUL SCHEDULING

With 19 games scheduled against Power 5 schools between 2018-2028, Temple has more future opponents against those schools than any other school outside of those conferences. The Owls have at least one game in each of those 11 seasons. Among the list of future opponents are: Boston College, Duke, Georgia Tech, Maryland, Miami (ACC); Penn State, Rutgers (Big Ten); Oklahoma (Big 12).

HOMECOMING SUCCESS

The Temple Owls have a had a lot of success on homecoming weekend. The Owls have posted a 12-6 record since 2000 during homecoming. The Owls have outscored opponents 464- 365 on homecoming since the turn of the century. That is an points per game average of 25.8-20.3.

TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.53 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington, D.C. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a day's drive from Philadelphia.

Temple is the 26th largest public University in the country with over 41,000 students founded in 1884 and has 404 academic programs including five professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and podiatry.

Temple is a Research I institution, a Carnegie Classification in 2015 as the highest level and ranked by US News and World Report at 115 (6th) with an overall graduation rate of 70%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 89%. Temple is one of 11 institutions in the country with multiyear APR scores of 970 or greater for all teams including a 2015 multi-years APR score of 971. Temple has over 300,000 alumni around the world including over 170,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student-athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible seven out of the last nine years. The Owls finished 10-4, won the AAC Eastern Division and were ranked in the Top 25 twice in the past three seasons. They won the AAC Championship in 2016 and the Gasparilla Bowl in 2017.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Gameday, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame in 2015 had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area which is impactful given the market is the 4th largest in the country.

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by the Super Bowl Champion Philadelphia Eagles and there are ongoing discussions to build an on campus football stadium as well. The basketball arena is a state-of-the-art facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last four years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multipurpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state of the art library.

OUARTERBACKS

Second-year offensive coordinator David Patenaude will head the unit again, coming off a season where Temple quarterbacks threw for 3,273 yards, the second most in school history.

Leading the group in the 2018 season is graduate Frank Nutile, who took over the starting job last year in week eight. Last season was capped off when the team won the 2017 Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl, 28-3, over FIU where he was named MVP after going 18-28 for 254 yards with one throwing and one rushing TD. "Frankie Juice," as head coach Geoff Collins calls him, has thrown for 401-yards and four touchdowns through the first five games of the season.

Anthony Russo started his first career game against Maryland. He has 1173 yards and a six touchdowns in five starts. Centeio threw his first career touchdown pass and played a couple series at Maryland, Russo went 23-31 for 300 yards and a touchdown against Navy.

Redshirt freshman **Todd Centeio** has played in every games so far this season, coming in during special packages.

The 2018 recruiting class welcomed the addition of Trad Beatty (Columbia, S.C. / Ben Lippen) who enrolled into school early and benefited from working with the Owls during the spring. Seth Agwunobi (Alexandria, Va. / Episcopal Academy) was added as a freshman walk-on this summer. Bryce McLain (Waxhow, N.C. / Marvin Ridge) was added as a walk on this fall.

WIDE RECEIVERS

This unit is once again led by Stan Hixon who brings 37 years of coaching experience to the Temple sidelines. In his second year with the Owls, Hixon mentors a deep and talented unit.

Junior Isaiah Wright has made a huge impact within the Owls' offense in his first two years on the team. Wright was also first on the team in all-purpose yards (1,301) and scored in five different ways last year (receiving, rushing, passing, kick return, punt return) making him just the sixth player in FBS history to do so in the past decade. Wright has 21 catches for 218 yards and two touchdowns this year. He has 877 all purpose yards and returned a punt for a touchdown against ECU.

Through his first three seasons, redshirt senior Ventell Bryant has racked up enough yards and catches to make a play for the Temple all-time records. He currently sits in second in career receptions (148) and second in receiving yards (2,097). Against Navy, he led the Owls with 8 catches for 147 yards and a touchdown. He caught a 62-yard pass from Russo in the fourth quarter to put the Owls ahead. He's also thrown for a 2-point conversion this season.

Redshirt sophomore Branden Mack has proved to be a viable option in the air for the Owls. Mack caught two touchdowns against Buffalo and blocked a punt that was recovered in the endzone for a Temple touchdown. He is second on the team with 25 catches and 275 yards. Mack leads the team with three touchdowns.

Redshirt senior **Brodrick Yancy** made early contributions to a deep unit in 2017, finishing with nine receptions, 108 yards. and a touchdown. He has since made a comeback and appeared in six games grabbing five catches for 123 yards.

Redshirt sophomore Freddie Johnson made a huge impact in special teams, solidifying himself as one of Temple's top gunners. He caught a touchdown pass on fake punt from Centeio against Maryland. He has five catches for 115 yards and a touchdown this season.

Junior Randle Jones and redshirt junior Travon Williams found ways to make an impact on the field in a variety of ways last season. Williams was often used on end around as part of the Owls rushing attack as well as being one of the kick returners for the team. Jones caught a 44-yard touchdown from Nutile during the Buffalo game and caught a 49yard ball from Russo that led to a rushing touchdown against Tulsa. He also caught a 31-yard touchdown against ECU. He has eleven catches for 183 yards on the season.

Jadan Blue was a highly-touted member of the 2017 recruiting class who redshirted while opening eyes on the scout team. He continues to see increased playing time this sea-

Travis Hines and Thomas Mattioni joined the unit in a similar capacity in the 2017 fall and also did not see any game action before redshirting.

The 2018 recruiting class welcomed the additions of Jose Barbon (Lancaster, Pa. / Conestoga Valley), Kadas Reams [New Brunswick (N.J.) High] and Sean Ryan (Brooklyn N.Y. / Erasmus Hall) who are mid-year enrollees and began being eligible in the Spring 2018. Jordan Smith (Davie, Fla. / Western), and Ronnie Stevenson [Montour (Pa.) High] were other members of the 2018 recruiting class. Zachary Ludwig (Bradenton, Fla. / Great Valley) was added as walk-ons this fall.

RUNNING BACKS

Second-year coach Tony Lucas will head the unit again. He will have a lot of experience coming back as most of the backfield has returned.

Senior Ryquell Armstead battled through injury last season but look to continue to lead the unit once again. After running for 626 yards through the first six games, he currently has 2,340 career yards (ranked 8th) and 27 TDs (4th).

Redshirt senior Rob Ritrovato is the primary fullback returning to the Owls' offense. He ended up making an impact on the limited rushing opportunities he had last year finishing with 178 yards, which was fourth on the team. He caught his first career pass against Villanova. He had 14 carries for 38 yards and a touchdown against Maryland. He also forced a fumble that was recovered for a touchdown against BC. He ran for his second touchdown of the season against Navy.

Redshirt junior Jager Gardner made contributions to the offense early last season but suffered a season-ending injury in week four at USF and missed the remainder of the year. Gardner has since made a comeback and is being used as a change of pace back for the Owls. He had 11 carries for 52 yards and also caught two balls for 58 yards against Navy.

Redshirt freshman Jeremy Jennings was part of the Owls 2017 recruiting class and made his first career rushing attempt against Buffalo.

Johnny Forrest and Tyliek Raynor both return as redshirted sophomores and hope to make more of an impact for the Owls during the 2018 campaign. Forrest saw the first game action of his career last year at Army. Raynor was injured his first two seasons and has since come back this season. He rushed for his first career touchdown against Navy.

The 2018 recruiting class welcomes the addition of Kyle Dobbins (Richland, N.J. / Timber Creek), Anton Brown (Washington D.C. / McKinley Technology) was added as walk-ons this fall.

- Posted back-to-back road game shutouts for the first time since 1925.
- Had three shutouts in a season for the first time since 1945.
- Won 20 games in a two-year span for the first time ever.
- Posted 10 wins for only the second and third times in program history (1979, 2015,
- Won its first Conference Championship since 1967 and its first Conference Championship Game ever.
- · Had a player (Isaiah Wright) return a kickoff and punt for a TD in the same season (has not happened for Temple dating back to 2000. He also rushed, caught and threw for a score becoming just the sixth player in 10 years to score those five separate ways.

has been with the Owls for 10 seasons. He is the longest tenured coach with Temple Football. Foley is fortunate to return all three tight ends who saw action a year ago.

Redshirt senior Chris Myarick as started each game this season. The former walk-on was awarded a scholarship last spring. Myarick has four catches for 71 yards on the season. Redshirt sophomore Jake Robinson caught both his first pass and TD on the same play last year versus Navy. He also started the game against Maryland and ECU. Kenny Yeboah had three catches for 16 yards against Buffalo including a 2-point conversion thrown by WR Ventell Bryant. He caught his first touchdown pass, a 47-varder, against Maryland.

Sam Kramer joined the team as a walk-on in 2016 and has switched from LB to TE. Redshirt freshman L.J. Holder moved to TE after spending time at WR and LB.

The 2018 recruiting class welcomes the addition of Aaron Jarman (LaGrange, N.C. / North Lenoir) and David Martin-Robinson (Landsville, Pa. / Hempfield). Nick Picozzi (Collegeville, Pa. / Landsdale Catholic) was added as walk-ons this summer. Martin-Robinson played in his first game against

OFFENSIVE LINE

This unit is headed by Chris Wiesehan who will coach the o-line for the fourth time in the last five seasons. He has been given the additional title of run game coordinator this year. Wiesehan has 23 years of coaching experience, including 20 years in college.

Leading the unit this season will be redshirt sophomore Matt Hennessy who has been nominated as a Rimington Award finalist as the best center in the country. He started all but one game for the Owls last season (illness at Army) and ended up earning ECAC second-team accolades.

Redshirt junior Jovahn Fair and redshirt sophomore Vincent Picozzi are the two other returning starters for the Owls. Fair started every game in 2016 at guard, but suffered a shoulder injury in 2017 that caused him to miss games 4-10. When Fair went down, it was Picozzi who stepped into the starting left guard role and held onto the spot for most of the season

Redshirt senior Jaelin Robinson rotated in every game last season as the sixth offensive lineman and has played in 34 career games over his career which is most of anyone on the unit. James McHale is another redshirt senior who showed a lot of promise last year as he started three games for the Owls at left tackle. Robinson and McHale play both left and right tackle for the Owls.

Redshirt senior Aaron Ruff is another returning player with experience but has played in 15 games during his career with very limited snaps.

Redshirt senior Vaughn Fulton and redshirt sophomores Darian Bryant and Leon Pinto add depth to the unit. Bryant was a part of the 2016 recruiting class while Fulton and Pinto both joined the team as walk-ons.

Griffin Sestili and Andrew Eisenson are all redshirt freshman who joined the program last season. Sestili has seen action in all five games this season.

The 2018 recruiting class welcomes the additions of sophomore transfer J.D. Gomez (Miami Fla. / ASA College) and freshman Isaac Moore (Orebro, Sweden / Thoren Business School) who are mid-year enrollees. Oskar Anderson (Katiskoga, Sweden / Celsiusskolan), Adam Klein (Springfield, Pa. / Episcopal Academy), and David Nwaogwugwu (Bronx, N.Y. / DeWitt Clinton) were also part of the 2018 recruiting class. Sean Eilertsen (Stamford, Conn. / Cheshire Academy) and

Riley Keating (Morganville, N.J. / Marlboro) were added as freshman walk-ons this summer.

Moore and Klein are among just a handful of FBS true freshmen to see action at O-line this season. Both have seen action in every game and Klein started at RT in games 4-6.

DEFENSIVE LINE

The "Wild Boyz," nickname of Temple's defensive line, will again be headed by second-year coach Jim Panagos, a Broyles Award semifinalist last season. The unit lost some impact players such as Sharif Finch, who finished 12th in program history with 14.5 sacks and Jacob Martin, a team captain who wore a single-digit the past two years, an honor given to Temples toughest players.

Redshirt senior Michael Dogbe looks to be the unit's leader as he has provided the Owls with quality playing time throughout his four-year. He has freakish strength - 500 lb. bench press, 37 reps at 225, 685 lb. squat to go with a 4.85 40-yard dash for a 6-3, 280 frame. Dogbe has 32 total tackles, 6.5 tackles-for-loss, 4.5 sacks, and two forced fumbles this season. He had a career-high 2.5 sacks and 3.5 TFLs at Maryland. He had three tackles and one sack against ECU.

Redshirt senior Freddie Booth-Lloyd, junior Karamo Dioubate and redshirt sophomore Dan Archibong add experience on the inside. Booth-Lloyd had his first career carry on offense for a 1-yard touchdown against Maryland and scored again on a similar play against ECU. He also forced a fumble against Tulsa. He has 10 tackles and two TFL this year. Archibong has nine tackles, 1.5 TFLs and three PBUs. Dioubate was part of the 2016 recruiting class as he was a four-star prospect for the Owls. He had his first career sack against Maryland. He also returned a fumble for a 50-yard. touchdown against Tulsa. He has 12 tackles, two sacks, and a PBU on the year

The Owls added graduate transfer Jimmy Hogan from Rutgers this summer. He was originally recruited to RU by Panagos. He recorded his first career sack as an Owl against Maryland and had another against Tulsa. He's started in five of six games this year and has nine tackles and 1.5 sacks.

Redshirt sophomore Quincy Roche is a rising star for the Owls. This season he has blocked two kicks, recorded 34 tackles, four TFLs, three sacks and forced two fumbles, one of which was returned for a touchdown.

Graduate Zach Mesday has played a lot of defensive end this season and recorded his first career sack against Maryland. He has 13 tackles and one sack on the year.

Redshirt juniors Dana Levine and DeAndre Kelly earned increased playing time as the season progressed last year. Levine was hurt during the Villanova game but has since returned. Kelly has two tackles and one TFL this season.

Arnold Ebiketie and Ifeanyi Maijeh and were part of the 2017 recruiting class and ended up redshirting. Ebiketie has seen action in three games this season and Maijeh has played in

Sophomore Nickolos Madourie is transferring from Dakota College where he played defensive tackle. He is joined in 2018 by incoming freshmen Khris Banks (Wayne, N.J. / De-Paul Catholic), Evan Boozer (Hunt Valley, Md. / Loyola Blakefield), Dante Burke (Virginia Beach, Va. / Bishop Sullivan), Antonio Colclough (Bronx, N.Y. / Cardinal Hayes), and Tyreke Young [Hilton Head (S.C.) High].

tle experience but is among the Owls' most promising units now. Heading the group for the second straight season will be **Andrew Thacker**, who was recently promoted to defensive coordinator and selected to AFCA 35 Under 35 Awards. He will be aided by **Larry Knight**, who was promoted to outside linebacker coach this winter.

Leading the group on the field is junior **Shaun Bradley** who has 50 tackles, 3 TFLs, one sack, and one interception returned for a touchdown through six games this season.

Redshirt junior **Chapelle Russell** is back from injury that left him out for the last 4 games of the season. He has 39 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, one sack, and two fumble recovery through seven games this year.

William Kwenkeu is another junior who has seen action in all seven games. He has 19 tackles, one TFL, and one sack on the season.

Redshirt sophomore Isaiah Graham-Mobley and senior Todd Jones add more depth to the position. Graham-Mobley is second on the team with 41 tackles this season. He also has a fumble recovery and a PBU. Jones makes an impact on special teams and has six tackles this year. Kevin DeCaesar is a former walk-on who is in his redshirt junior year and sees action on special teams.

THE NICKE

Junior **Sam Franklin** has been so versatile this season. He has played both NKL and DE. He recorded his first career interception against Villanova and has tallied 39 tackles, three sacks, one forced fumble, and seven TFLs this season.

Rodney Williams was added as a graduate transfer from Syracuse this spring. The Cherry Hill, N.J., native played 33 games for the Orange with 21 starts, collecting 125 tackles and 4 INTs. Williams started his first game for the Owls against Buffalo. He has 22 total tackles, two TFLs and three PBUs in seven games.

DaeSean Winston (Severn, Md. / Archbishop Spalding) was added in the 2018 recruiting class.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

This unit is headed by first-year coach **Nathan Burton** who came to Temple from NC State. He replaced Taver Johnson who coached the safeties, and Corey Robinson who tutored the cornerbacks.

Senior **Rock Ya-Sin** transferred from Presbyterian College after they dropped their football program last season. He started 24 games throughout his career and collected 95 tackles with five interceptions. He recorded his first interception as an Owl against Buffalo and grabbed another against Tulsa. He has 35 tackles, one TFL, nine PBUs this season.

Junior **Linwood Crump** returns as the most experienced cornerback. He grabbed his first career interception against Maryland. He has three tackles and one PBU this season.

Redshirt sophomore **Kimere Brown** adds some experience to a young unit. Brown saw action in seven games last sea-

son on special teams. Brown returned a blocked kick for a touchdown against Villanova. He has nine tackles and two PBUs this season.

Christian Braswell and Ty Mason were part of the 2017 recruiting class who ended up redshirting last season. Mason recovered blocked punt in the endzone for a touchdown against Buffalo. He has nine tackles this year. Braswell saw action against Maryland, Boston College, ECU, and Navy. Josh Allen was a freshman walk-on last season who ended up redshirting.

The 2018 recruiting class also welcomes the additions of **Elijah Clark** [Sayreville (N.J.) High] and **Chauncey Moore** (Washington, D.C. / Friendship Collegiate Academy).

Delvon Randall, who was the Owls only first-team all-conference selection in 2017. He started every game last year, finishing second on the team in tackles with 80, and led the team in interceptions with four. The two-year starter has eight interceptions for his career, which has him in a tie for 11th on the all-time list. Randall is second on the team with 41 tackles, two pass breakups, and two forced fumble this season.

Redshirt senior **Jyquis Thomas** was sidelined after week nine due to injury last season but has since come back. Thomas has 20 tackles, one TFL, and one pass breakup this year. Junior **Benny Walls** has 28 tackles and one sack, three PBUs this season and grabbed an interception against Tulsa.

Keyvone Bruton and **Amir Tyler** are both redshirt sophomores who make contributions on special teams and select defensive packages this year. Bruton has six tackles this season

The unit is led by Ed Foley for the fourth consecutive season. At kicker, the Owls' experienced a "passing of the torch" when junior **Aaron Boumerhi** took over duties on kickoffs, field goals and extra points midway through last season. Senior Austin Jones continued to recover from ACL surgery and has since transferred to Alabama. Impressing in every aspect, Boumerhi led the team in total scoring with 73 points, falling one point short of his freshman year total. In the Owls' week three match-up against UMass, Boumerhi knocked through his career-long 52-yard field goal to help the Owls to a 29-21 win over the Minutemen.

Redshirt freshman **Will Mobley** has seen action since the Buffalo game when Boumerhi aggravated an injury.

After redshirting this past season, punters **Connor Bowler** and **Max Cavallucci** competed for the starting punter role this offseason, a spot formerly held by Alex Starzyk since 2014. Bowler emerged from camp as the starter. Redshirt freshman **Cole Lerch** steps into the shoes of his older brother, Corey Lerch, for the long snapping duties.

Head Coach | Western Carolina '94

Geoff Collins accepted the head coaching position at Temple University on December 14, 2016, becoming the 27th head football coach in Owls' history. Armed with 23 years of coaching experience, Collins has proven to be a driven leader who is not bashful about the word love. He has demonstrated a love for his players and they have reciprocated that passion in their actions and words.

"I could not speak more highly of Coach Collins," said Houston Texans' LB Benardrick McKinney who played for Collins at Mississippi State. "He has done so much for shaping the player I am today. He coached aggressively with a tremendous amount of energy and fun. He loved his players. Coach Collins would do anything for us, on and off the field. Not only did he train us to be the best defensive players we could be on the field, but also the best men we would be off the field."

Collins' creative spirit has paid dividends on and off the field. Whether devising original game-plans, creating new methods to teach, or splashy ways to pursue recruits, Collins' ideas are mimicked throughout college football.

While Collins has gained notoriety for being innovative and energetic, his accomplishments in his first year as head coach can not be overlooked. Despite a roster that needed to start 42 different players due to injuries and youth, he led the Owls to bowl eligibility for the fourth consecutive season and seventh time in nine years.

Collins navigated through a mid-season quarterback change that was brought on by injury but was kept based on performance. The old football adage is that you do not lose your job to injury, but when Logan Marchi went down with a foot injury and was replaced by "Frankie Juice" Nutile, the latter provided a spark to the offense. Collins saw fit to keep Nutile under center and the redshirt junior led the Owls to four wins in their last five games and the third bowl win in school history.

The defense took on Collins' identity and ranked among the conference leaders in yards per game (391.8 - 2nd), passing yards per game (210.0 - 1st), third down percentage (39.3 - 2nd), sacks (32 - 2nd), and tackles for loss (92 - 2nd).

For his performance, Collins was named ECAC Coach of the Year.

Prior to coming to Temple he had been widely recognized as the top defensive coordinator in college football and is the only coach to be a Broyles Award nominee, given to the nation's best assistant coach, at three schools [FIU (2010), MSU (2014) and Florida (2015)]

"The excitement over Temple football has been growing for years, and Geoff is going to ensure that Temple's reputation for quality on the field and in the classroom is going to continue," said President Richard M. Englert. "Our student-athletes are great representatives of this university and make me proud every time I see them play.'

"Geoff Collins is an extraordinary leader, and it's clear he is the right person to take an already successful program and advance it to the next level," added the University's Board of Trustees Chairman Patrick J. O'Connor. "We are thrilled to have him join the Temple University community."

Collins is an alumnus of Western Carolina University, where he played defensive back and linebacker. Collins has coached all over, beginning at his alma mater, and most recently working in the SEC at both Florida, where he helped the Gators to back-to-back SEC East Division Titles, and Mississippi State in the role of defensive coordinator. Over the course of his career, Collins has helped guide 31 of his student-athletes to careers in the National Football League.

"As soon as I met with Geoff I knew right away that this was the right coach at the right time for Temple University," said Director of Athletics Dr. Patrick M. Kraft, "Well beyond Geoff's acumen as a coach of hard, physical football, he shares our values of embracing the student-athlete and demanding excellence in all that we do."

Collins first began at Florida in 2015, hired by Jim McElwain to be on his initial staff. Collins' opportunity to serve as defensive coordinator at Florida was his second defensive coordinator job in the SEC, as he held the same title at Mississippi State for two

The Florida defense was relentless under the guidance of Collins, finishing the season ranked eighth nationally in 2015. His Gators' defense was also ranked third in the SEC during that time, only allowing 310.2 yards per game. Collins' defense also set a number of other records during his time in Gainesville, including being one of only seven FBS teams in the last 20 years to not allow a touchdown against three FBS Power 5 schools on the road, in a single season.

In the 2015 season alone, Collins helped prepare three players who eventually earned first-team All-SEC honors, including CB Jalen "Teez" Tabor, DL Jon Bullard, and CB Vernon Hargreaves. Hargreaves was also a consensus first team All-American in 2015. In total, five of Collins' defensive players were selected in the 2016 NFL Draft; two first round selections (CB Vernon Hargreaves and S Keanu Neal) along with DT Jonathan Bullard (3rd), LB Antonio Morrison (4th), and DE Alex McCalister (7th), along with Brian Poole who started for the Falcons in the Super Bowl after joining Atlanta as a rookie free agent.

The Florida team capitalized on the success of its defense in 2016, finishing 8-4 on the year and earning its second straight SEC East Division Title. The unit finished among the nation's best in multiple categories - first in pass efficiency (92.87), second in pass defense (148.5), third in defensive scores (5), fourth in red zone defense (71.8), fifth in total defense (293.0), sixth in scoring defense (16.8 ppg), and seventh in first downs allowed (206). Collins also helped three of his players earn All-SEC selections in the 2016 season. Florida's defensive unit developed seven more draft picks in 2017, including four in the first two rounds.

Prior to his time at Florida, Collins was a member of the coaching staff at Mississippi State. Originally hired to serve as the linebackers coach and co-defensive coordinator for the 2011 season, Collins was promoted to the position of defensive coordinator in

Mississippi State had tremendous success while he was on the coaching staff, most notably the 2014 season, when the Bulldogs when they were ranked #1 in the country for most of the season and finished with a 10-3 record. This 10-win season was the best finish at the school in 15 years, and concluded with a berth in the Orange Bowl. Collins' defense was dominant that season, producing the most sacks in the SEC (37), as well as the #1 ranked red zone defense and ninth ranked scoring defense in the country. The season prior, Mississippi State went 7-6 and defeated Rice in the Liberty Bowl, 44-7. Collins' unit was one of the best in the SEC. In his first season as full-time defensive coordinator, his defense ranked among the SEC's top five in a number of categories, including fourth in total defense (349.3 yards per game), fourth in rushing defense (144.2 yards per game) and fifth in passing defense (205.2 yards per game). He also held his last three opponents during the 2013 season to just 11.3 points per game.

In 2012, the Bulldogs finished the year 8-5 and made an appearance in the Gator Bowl. That year, Collins tutored DB Darius Slay, a second team All-SEC selection. Along with Slay, who was picked in the second round of the NFL Draft, Collins helped prepare a number of other Mississippi State players for careers in the NFL, including Jim Thorpe Award winner CB Jonathan Banks (2nd round), CB Will Redmond (3rd round), and DT Josh Boyd (5th round).

During his first season on the staff, Mississippi State finished the season 7-6 as the Bulldogs went to the Music City Bowl, defeating Wake Forest, 25-17. In Collins' first season as a co-defensive coordinator for the Bulldogs, he helped mentor DT Fletcher Cox, a first team All-American and first team All-SEC selection in 2011. Cox was selected 12th overall in the first round of the NFL draft by the Philadelphia Eagles, and earned All-Pro honors in 2014 and 2015.

Collins' ability to mold a defense was evident well prior to his time in Mississippi State and Florida. Before coaching in the SEC, he sharpened his teeth as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Florida International University in 2010. During that season, his defense was ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense, pass defense efficiency, and turnover margin. This, off of the prior year when the team was ranked 119th in total defense nationally. This dramatic turnaround led Collins to be named a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2010, an award for the top assistant in college football.

Before joining the staff at FIU, Collins was a linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator under head coach George O'Leary at UCF for two seasons. In 2009, he was part of a staff the led the Knights to an 8-5 record and a berth in the St. Petersburg Bowl. Even though UCF did not make a bowl game in 2008, he had the defense ranked second in Conference USA in total and scoring defense.

Collins also spent some time working at both the University of Alabama and Georgia Tech. In 2007, he worked at Alabama as the director of player personnel under head coach Nick Saban and had the #1 recruiting class in the country. That class included Mark Ingram Jr., the 2008 Heisman Trophy winner and the first-ever by an Alabama player. He spent the 2006 season at Georgia Tech as director of player personnel. Georgia Tech secured their best recruiting class in team history that year as well.

Between the years of 2002 and 2005, Collins was the defensive coordinator at his alma mater Western Carolina. Collins' defense was continually ranked near the top nationally at the FCS level while under his guidance. In 2005, the team was ranked first nationally in pass defense and 18th in total defense. The team also led the So-Con conference in rushing defense for the first time in program history in that season.

From 1999-2000, Collins served as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech under O'Leary. During that time, the Yellow Jackets had a 25-12 record, including reaching three consecutive bowl games. In Collins' last season at Georgia Tech he was promoted to tight ends coach under current Houston Texans' head coach Bill O'Brien and the Yellow Jackets defeated the Stanford Cardinal in the 2001 Seattle Bowl, 25-12.

Collins got his chance at being a defensive coordinator at Albright College from 1997-1998, Before that, he was a linebackers coach for the Fordham Rams for the 1996 season. In 1995, he was an assistant coach for Franklin High School in North Carolina. He began his coaching career at his alma mater, Western Carolina University, contributing as a student assistant during the 1993 and 1994 seasons.

Collins played college football at WCU as an outside linebacker and defensive back from 1989-1992. He totaled 194 career tackles during his four year career with the Catamounts. As a junior, he was the team's fifth-leading tackler (68), while registering 6.0 tackles-for-loss. As a senior, he helped Western Carolina to a 7-4 record, totaling 62 total tackles and 5.0 tackles-for-loss.

The Conyers, Ga., native was born April 10, 1971. He and his wife, Jennifer (formerly Haynes), have one daughter, Astrid (two).



>Jackson was intercepted again by Rock Ya-Sin to give Temple 1:45 seconds to get down the field and score to end the half.



TEMPLE DOMINATES IN WIN OVER MARYLAND

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Temple Football bounced back in a big way Saturday with an impressive 35-14 win over previously unbeaten Maryland, 35-14. The Owls dominated the game on both sides of the ball on their way to huge road win against the Big 10 school. Temple finished with 80-plays for 429 yards compared to Maryland's 52-plays for 195 vards.

KEYS TO THE GAME

> QB Anthony Russo started the game for Temple as QB Frank Nutile was held out due to injury. QB Todd Centeio also rotated in throughout the game.

>The Owls struck first on a 4th-and-8 from Mary-

land's 34-yard line. Centeio took the direct snap on a fake punt and rolled right looking to throw. WR Freddie Johnson caught the pass down the Temple sideline and scampered into the endzone untouched. It was Centeio's first career touchdown throw and Johnson's first career touchdown catch. The quarter would end 7-0 Temple.

>Also in the first quarter, Michael Dogbe recorded 1.5 sacks, Zack Mesday had one sack, and Jimmy Hogan had a half sack.

>On a 3rd-and-16 from the Temple 43 yard-line, Russo completed a 40-yard pass to WR Brodrick Yancy to keep the drive alive. This led to a one-yard touchdown on a dive play by DT Freddie Booth-Lloyd. Booth-Lloyd doesn't play offense often, but he has seen action in goal line situations throughout practice. With 6:38 to go in the half, Temple led 14-0.

>With 3:23 left in the half, Maryland's Darnell Savage picked off Russo and returned it for a touchdown to make the score 14-7.

>Temple answered quickly with a long drive and a touchdown. The 11-play 65-yard drive was capped off by a 2-yard touchdown by FB Rob Ritrovato. The Owls scored with seven seconds left in the half and took a 21-7 lead into halftime.

>To start the second half, Temple marched down the field and scored on a 47-yard catch and run by TE Kenny Yeboah from Russo. It was his first career touchdown catch and Russo's first career touchdown throw. Just three minutes into the second half, the Owls led 28-7.

>The Owls continued to shut down the Terrapins on both sides of the ball. Headed into the fourth quarter Temple had run 67 plays for 387 yards compared to Maryland's 34 plays for 109 yards. Dogbe forced anoth-



er fumble and eventually the Terrapins would turn the ball over on downs with 11:54 left in the 4th quarter.

> Maryland blocked a Connor Bowler punt and returned it 27-yards for a touchdown to cut the Owls lead to 28-14 with 8:21 to play.

> Maryland got the ball back and was eyeing another shot at the endzone on Temple's 22-yard line. LB Shaun Bradley ended the Terps threat with a 78-yard pick-six to seal the victory.

>Owls CB Linwood Crump came up with another TU interception to close out the contest.

GAME NOTES

>Temple dominated time of possession by more than 10 minutes. Temple amassed 36:33 compared to 23:27 for Maryland.

>Temple's stingy defense only allowed the Terrapins to convert 1-of-12 third down conversions, forcing Maryland to punt eight times.

>RB Ryquell Armstead rushed for 118 yards on 26 carries. His longest was a 25 yard run. This was his second straight 100+ yard game this season.

> Dogbe had seven tackles, 2.5 sacks, 3.5 tackles-forloss, and two forced fumbles.

> The Owls had more tackles-for-loss (nine for 38 yards) in this game than they did previously all season.

DARKSIDE DOMINATES IN CONFERENCE WIN

PHILADELPHIA - The Temple Owls opened up Conference play at home in front of 24,217 fans with a commanding win over Tulsa, 31-17. Temple forced a season-high five turnovers, three interceptions, four forced fumbles, and two fumble recoveries in the win. **RB Ryquell Armstead** rushed for 108 vards and recorded his first career sack while playing DE. LB Shaun Bradley led the Owls with 11 tackles and had a fake punt run for 28 yards.

KEYS TO THE GAME

- > The Owls took the opening drive down to 15-vard line before a batted ball at the line was picked off by Tulsa.
- > The Owls then got a pick of their own. Ty Mason jumped a pass and returned the interception 36-yards for the touchdown. Temple took a 7-0 lead.
- > Tulsa countered with a touchdown on a 3-yard touchdown run by Cory Taylor. The drive went 16-plays and 75-yards. Temple would get the ball back with 0:36 left in the first quarter.
- > The Owls started out the second quarter with a long pass from Anthony Russo to WR Randle Jones for 41 yards to the four-yard line. Three plays later Russo ran the ball in from the one to make it 14-7.
- > Temple forced another turnover on the following Tulsa drive. Rock Ya-Sin grabbed an interception on a one-onone deep pass, his second pick of the season.
- > After a defensive stop the Owls would march down the field 66 yards on seven plays in just 2:38. Armstead scored for the first time this season on a 22-yard carry to push the lead to 21-7.
- > In the opening drive of the second half. Quincy Roche forced two fumbles. The second fumble was recovered by DT Karamo Dioubate and returned 50-yards for a touchdown to make the score 28-10 Temple.
- > In the opening drive of the fourth quarter, Russo's pass was bobbled and picked off by Tulsa which led to a 14play 53-yard drive and a score to make it 28-17 with 9:58
- > Tulsa got the ball back, but Temple created another turnover, a strip sack by LB Sam Franklin which was recovered by LB Chapelle Russell. Fellow LB Shaun Bradley was then able to extend the ensuing offensive drive for Temple on a fourth down fake punt direct snap



that he ran for 28 yards to the Tulsa 16 yard line.

- > The recovered fumble led to a 33-yard field goal by kicker Will Mobley to make it 31-17 Temple.
- > On the following drive, the Owls forced another turnover, their fifth of the game. CB Benny Walls intercepted the ball to seal the game for Temple.

GAME NOTES

- > Ryquell Armstead became the ninth Owl to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards. His TD was the 22nd rushing touchdowns of his career tying him for fourth in school history. This was his third consecutive game with 100 rushing yards, the last Owl to do so was Bernard Pierce in 2011
- > Armstead is the third player ever to have 100-yards rushing and a sack in a game. The other two are Anthony Samuel (9/1/2011 for Bowling

Green) and Vic Hall (11/29/08 for Virginia).

- > Karamo Dioubate's fumble return for a touchdown was Temple's first in exactly a year. DE Jacob Martin returned a fumble 44-yards for a touchdown against USF on
- > The last time Temple forced five turnovers was at Cincinnati on September 12, 2016.
- > This was the second consecutive game the Owls scored as many defensive touchdowns as they allowed their opponent.

TEMPLE DROPS BACK-AND-FORTH BATTLE TO BOSTON COLLEGE

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. – Despite a career day from RB Ryquell Armstead, 24-carries, 171-yards and four-touchdowns, the Owls lost to ACC foe Boston College 45-35 in front of 40,111 fans at Alumni Stadium. Temple is now 2-3 (1-0 AAC) on the season.



KEYS TO THE GAME

- > Boston College struck first on a 7-yard catch and throw to make it 7-0 BC.
- > On the ensuing drive RB Ryquell Armstead ran 75-yards for a touchdown to tie the game.
- > The following kickoff, Temple was called offsides, but instead of taking the penalty, BC opted for a re-kick. This worked out in the Owls favor as FB Rob Ritrovato forced a fum-

ble on the re-kick and LB Isaiah Graham-Mobley scooped it and scored to put Temple up 14-7.

- > BC would score again on a 16-yard touchdown catch, the Eagles kicker would miss the extra point to keep Temple ahead 14-13.
- > Temple countered the score after some back-andforth with Armstead's second rushing touchdown of the day. It was all set up by a third-and-one deep pass by Anthony Russo to Ventell Bryant that he grabbed with one hand while being interfered with by a defender. Bryant came up with the pass and landed on the one-yard line, setting up Armstead for the walk-in score to put Temple up 21-13.
- > Armstead and BC's A.J. Dillon continued to duel on the ground as Dillon rushed for a 52-yard touchdown and converted a twopoint conversion to tie the game at 21.
- > BC picked off Russo and brought the ball all the way to the Owls' 9-yard line to set up a Dillon touchdown to give the Eagles a 28-21 lead with three minutes to play in the half. The Owls later would surrender a field goal to end the half down 31-21.
- > With 9:22 left in the third quarter, BC scored another touchdown on a reverse pass to extend its lead to 38-21.
- > Armstead got on the board for the third time on a one-yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to 38-28 with 6:31 left in the third.
- > Armstead continued to feast on the Eagles' defense



going for his fourth score of the game on a one-yard carry to close the gap to 38-35 with 9:02 left in the game.

> The Owls attempted to rally back and take the lead, but fell short on a handful of drives. BC would score a one-yard touchdown with 3:11 left in the contest to push the lead to 45-35.

GAME NOTES

- > Ryquell Armstead now holds sole position of fourth for career rushing touchdowns as a Temple Owl with 26.
- > With 100-yards rushing, Armstead now has four-straight 100-yard rushing games. The last time a single Owl rushed for 100-yards in four straight games was Tanardo Sharpes from Sept. 21-Oct. 19, 2002.
- > This was the first time in Armstead's career he has rushed

for four touchdowns in a game.

- > Isaiah Wright had his first 100-yard receiving game this season. He made seven catches for 114 yards.
- > It was the fifth straight game the Owls have had a non-offensive touchdown.



OFFENSE EXPLODES WHILE DEFENSE THROTTLES ECU IN TEMPLE'S LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY VS. FBS OPPONENT

PHILADELPHIA - In the second conference game of the season. the Temple Owls easily defeated the ECU Pirates 49-6 in front of 26,681 fans at Lincoln Financial Field. QB Anthony Russo threw for four touchdown passes and the Owls didn't let up a touchdown in the game. it is the Owls' largest margin of victory ever against an FBS opponent. The Owls are now 3-3 (2-0 AAC).

This game proved Temple's sheer force when firing on all cylinders. In all three wins, the Owls never trailed and, in this one, it was a runaway from the get-go. Despite not creating a turnover. a rare occurrence for the ball-hawking Owls, Temple forced ECU to punt 11 times after only converting on 4-of-18 on third downs. The Owls had their best field position of the season so far, and capitalized by hanging points all afternoon. The Owls also had their best



The Owls proved they are a top-tier American Athletic Conference team with the statement win coupled with a dominating victory against Tulsa. Russo remains undefeated in home starts and continues to gain confidence as he lets the ball fly more in each game. He has spread the ball around the last two games, connecting with eight different receivers against BC and 11 today against ECU.

HIGHLIGHTS

- > Temple has scored a non-offensive touchdown in every single game this season. This week WR Isaiah Wright returned a punt 59 yards for a touchdown. It was his first of the season.
- > True freshman Sean Ryan led the team with four catches for 57 yards and his first career touchdown.
- > Russo threw a touchdown to four different receivers, he is the first QB to do so since Frank Nutile against Navy last season.
- > Temple was the first team to hold ECU without a touchdown in AAC action in the league's history.
- > This was Temple's largest margin of victory against any opponent since beating Delaware State, 59-0, on Sept. 20, 2014.



HOW IT HAPPENED

- > Following an interception on its first drive the Owls battled back and forced the Pirates to punt. Temple drove down the field 80 vards on seven plays to score first. The score came on a blown coverage 24-yard touchdown catch from Russo to Ryan..
- > On the next drive the Owls forced a turnover on downs to start with the ball in ECU territory. The drive would result in a seven-vard touchdown by WR Branden Mack from Russo.
- > The Owls would force a three-and-out and get the ball back to start the second quarter Russo started the drive by connecting with Ryan on a 12-yard pass and Armstead would follow that up with a 10-vard run to get the ball to the ECU two yard line. It would take two more rushes for Armstead to cross the goal line, but he eventually would to make the score
- 21-0 Temple with 14:00 left to play in the half.
- > Temple would force a three-and-out as ECU got set to punt to Wright, who fielded it at the Temple 41 and returned it 59 yards for the score.
- > The second half began slow for both teams until Russo hit WR Randle Jones on a deep 31-yard pass for a touchdown to extend the lead to 42-3.

TEMPLE HALTS NAVY 24-17, REMAINS PERFECT IN AAC PLAY

TODAY'S GAME PRESENTED BY

ANNAPOLIS, Md.-The Temple Owls continue rolling through conference play as they took down the Navy Midshipmen, 24-17, in front of 30,106 fans at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The Owls are now 4-3 on the season and 3-0 in American Athletic Conference play.

Temple's passing offense clashed with Navy's triple-option run game, and the air attack came out on top. Despite time of possession being lopsided in favor of Navy, 33:07-26:53, Temple took advantage of the time they had on the field and worked efficiently and methodically to put up 24 points in the win. The Owls did outgain the Midshipmen 409-284 and

also had 21 first downs to Navy's 18 in the victory.



>Temple and Navy traded fumbles in Navy territory before a 10-minute Navy drive resulted in the first score of the game, a field goal that put Navy up at the beginning of the second quarter.

>Temple answered in the ensuing drive with a nine-play 77-yard drive that was capped off by Raynor's first career touchdown, a 15-yard run into the endzone to make the score 7-3 Temple.


>Navy answered with their first touchdown of the game, a one-yard run to make it 10-7 Navy.

>Neither team would make any more noise for the remainder of the first half.

>In the first series of the second half, Navy broke a long 45-yard run to get all the way to the Temple 30-yard line. Navy would run it three more times, the final being a 12-yard touchdown to make it 17-7 Navy.

>A long return by WR Isaiah Wright set up the Owls on the Navy 43-yard line to begin their first offensive possession of the second half. A pitch pass from Russo to RB Jager Gardner went another 20-yards to get further into Midshipmen territory. The Owls however had to settle for a field goal. Will Mobley's 31-yard attempt was good to make the score 17-10 Navy.

>Temple then forced Navy to punt and started their drive on their own 45-yard line. Russo connected with Bryant for a nine-yard catch. After a Gardner rush for five yards, Russo hit Bryant again with a one-on-one deep ball for 40 yards bringing the Owls into redzone territory. The Owls would not come up empty-handed



>Both teams exchanged punts the rest of the third quarter and into the fourth quarter Temple forced a turnover on downs as the Midshipmen creeped into field goal range. The Owls didn't waste any time on the next drive. Russo continued to feed Bryant and on the first play of the drive they connected for a 62-yard touchdown. Bryant beat the entire right side of the secondary and Russo hit him perfectly in stride for the go-ahead touchdown. The Owls took the lead, 24-17, with 9:14 left to play in the game.

>Temple forced three-andout and got the ball back on their own 20-yard line with 8:13 left to play. Temple marched down the field

again but a Russo pass was intercepted by Navy on a one-on-one ball in the endzone. Navy would attempt a game tying drive with 2:06 left to play in the game. The stingy Owl defense would force the Midshipmen to turn the ball over on downs and Temple would take over on the Navy 20 yard line with 1:40 left to play.

GAME NOTES

>WR Ventell Bryant has caught a pass in 42 straight games. He is tied for the longest active streak in the FBS.

>Redshirt sophomore RB Tyliek Raynor scored his first career touchdown.

>Temple has allowed less than 20 points in five of seven games this season.

>Temple has a takeaway in every game except a 49-6 win against ECU.
