THE STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa is in its 121st season of football.
- Tulsa has the smallest FBS enrollment with 3,269 undergraduate students ... Cincinnati has an enrollment of 46,388.
- Tulsa's 6-0 AAC record marks the best league start in its 7 years as an AAC member ... it is also the best conference start for a Tulsa team since starting 7-0 in Conference USA in 2012.
- Tulsa has won 6 straight games after a season-opening loss ... it is the longest winning streak for Tulsa since 7 straight wins in the 2012 season.
- Tulsa is 8-1 in its last 9 games dating back to 2 wins in its final 3 games of the 2019 season.
- The last time Tulsa played a team ranked as high as No. 6, it also came in Ohio when the Hurricane faced No. 4 Ohio State on Sept. 10, 2016.



IN CHAMPIONSHIP GAMES . . .

- This is the 5th conference championship game for Tulsa, but the first in the American Athletic Conference.
- Tulsa had a 2-2 record in Conference USA Championship games, winning the first C-USA title game in 2005 with a 44-27 win at UCF.
- Tulsa dropped the 2007 game at UCF (44-25) and the 2008 title game at home against East Carolina (27-24).
- The Hurricane won the 2012 C-USA Championship game at home against UCF (33-27 in OT) which was the last appearance in a league championship contest.

FROM PRESEASON NO. 9 TO THE AAC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME . . .

- Tulsa was picked to finish in 9th place in the 2020 American Athletic Conference preseason coaches poll.
- In its first AAC game, Tulsa faced the preseason first-place team UCF on Oct. 3 and came away with an 18-point comeback win (34-26) over the #11-ranked Knights.
- Tulsa went on to defeat the preseason-picked No. 4 (SMU), No. 5 (Navy) and No. 6 (Tulane) teams.
- Now, Tulsa faces the preseason No. 2 Cincinnati in the AAC Championship game.

TULSA RANKED IN AP POLL FOR 5th STRAIGHT WEEK . . .

- For the 5th straight week Tulsa is ranked in the *Associated Press* poll, the most weeks ranked and the most consecutively for Tulsa since 1945 when Tulsa was ranked for 8 weeks, and 5 consecutively ... Tulsa is ranked 20th this week in both polls.
- Tulsa has been ranked this year as high as No. 18 in the *Associated Press* poll and 19th in the *USA Today* Amway Coaches poll the week of Dec. 6
- Tulsa moved into the AP's top-25 on Nov. 15 with at No. 25 following a 28-24 win over No. 19 SMU ... Tulsa jumped to No. 24 a week later after a win over Tulane.
- Tulsa debuted in the *USA Today* Amway Coaches poll at No. 25 on Nov. 22.
- The AP ranking this year is the first time Tulsa has been ranked in the AP poll since ending the 2010 season ranked 24th nationally ... before that, Tulsa was ranked in the AP poll for three weeks during 2008.
- The last time Tulsa was in the *USA Today* Coaches poll was at the conclusion of the 2012 season when the Hurricane was ranked No. 25.
- Tulsa has received votes in both AP and Coaches polls since the Oct. 4 rankings.
- In the College Football Playoff (CFP) rankings, Tulsa began at No. 25, then moved to 24th.

THE SERIES . . .

- This is the 35th meeting in the series as Tulsa leads 17-15-2.
- The first meeting came in 1946 as Tulsa claimed a 20-0 victory.
- Cincinnati has won 6 of the last 7 games, including a 24-13 victory at home last year as the nation's 21st-ranked team.
- This is only the fourth meeting for the two teams as members of the American Athletic Conference ... Cincinnati has a 2-1 record.
- The last win for Tulsa was a 40-37 overtime victory in the 2016 season in Tulsa.

BEST SINCE 2016 . . .

- In the COVID-shortened season, Tulsa turned in a 6-1 regular season record ... it's the best regular season record since a 9-3 mark in 2016.
- The last time Tulsa had better than a 6-1 record was starting 7-1 in 2012.
- The last time Tulsa only lost one game in the regular season was in 1981 when Tulsa played 11 games and finished 10-1.
- The Hurricane posted a 4-1 mark in 2016 after its first five games with the only loss coming against #4-ranked Ohio State on the road.
- Tulsa's lone loss this year came on the road at #11-ranked Oklahoma State.

COLLINS NAMED FINALIST FOR THE BRONKO NAGURSKI TROPHY; SEMIFINALIST FOR BUTKUS AND BEDNARIK . . .

- A three-time winner of the National Defensive Player of the Week Award, Tulsa linebacker Zaven Collins was named one of 5 finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, one of three national defensive player of the year awards.
- Collins was also named one of 18 semifinalists for the Chuck Bednarik Defensive Player of the Year Award and one of 16 semifinalists for The Butkus Award, given to the nation's top linebacker.
- Collins is the lone non-Power 5 selection chosen to the Butkus list.
- Collins has won each of the 3 Defensive Player of the Week Awards in different weeks this year – the Bednarik, the Bronko Nagurski and the Walter Camp Foundation.
- In 7 games this year, Collins has totaled 51 tackles, 11.5 TFLs, 4 sacks, 4 INTs, 2 TDs off INTs while being named the American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week 4 times.
- Two of his INTs were game-clinchers ... his INT against #19 SMU stopped any possible final scoring drive for the Mustangs ... his pick-6 against Tulane in overtime went 96 yards for the game-winning score.

GREEN IV NAMED SEMIFINALIST THORPE AWARD AS THE NATION'S TOP DEFENSIVE BACK . . .

- Tulsa cornerback Allie Green IV was named a semifinalist for the 2020 Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, given to the nation's top defensive back.
- Green IV is one of three players representing the American Athletic Conference on the Thorpe Award list tying the SEC for the most semifinalists of any conference.
- The 6'3" senior has totaled 21 tackles, including 17 solos, in helping lead the Hurricane to a No. 18 national ranking and an overall 6-1 record and league-leading 6-0 mark.
- Green IV has one interception, one pass breakup and one fumble recovery.
- The three finalists for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award will be announced on Tuesday, Dec. 22.

COLLINS NAMED NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK THREE TIMES . . .

- Tulsa played only 7 games, but 6'4" junior linebacker Zaven Collins has been named the National Defensive Player of the Week three different times this year, once each by the 3 main awards handed out for that category.
- Collins is one of only 2 players to earn each National Defensive Player of the Week honor this year, but the only one to earn the award in different weeks ... Texas Joseph Ossai won all 3 on the same week, Oct. 31.
- Collins was named the Bednarik National Defensive Player of the Week against No. 11-ranked UCF on Oct. 3, with 10 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 2 PBUs, one INT and a safety.
- He was selected as the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week by the FWAA for his performance after his 6 tackles, 2 TFLs and game-ending INT vs. #19 SMU
- Collins was the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week award winner after his 15-tackle, game-winning 96-yard pick 6 against Tulane.

ZAVEN UP FOR NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR, ALL-AMERICA HONORS, WHAT ABOUT THE HEISMAN?

- After 7 games, junior LB Zaven Collins is smack in the middle of the conversation for All-America honors as well as consideration for some of the nation's top defensive player awards – Walter Camp, Bronko Nagurski and Chuck Bednarik Defensive Player of the Year awards.
- With as many game-changing plays that he's made, Collins can certainly be in the discussion for the Heisman Trophy, a rare award for a defender.
- He has already been named a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and has been named to the semifinalist lists for the Chuck Bednarik Award and The Butkus Award.
- Announcing Tulsa's win over USF, ESPN analyst Andre Ware said about Collins "you gotta be crazy if this guy isn't on your All-America team."
- This year Collins was named the Bednarik National Defensive Player of the Week (UCF), the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week (SMU) and the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week (Tulane).
- He is one of only 2 players to earn each National Defensive Player of the Week honor this year, but the only one to earn the award in different weeks ... Texas Joseph Ossai won all 3 on the same week, Oct. 31).
- Collins was also named the PFF National Defensive Player of the Week against USF.
- He has been named the American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week 4 times (#11 UCF, USF, #19 SMU and Tulane).
- In 7 games, including 3 against top-20 opponents, #11 Oklahoma State, #11 UCF and #19 SMU, Collins has registered 51 tackles, including 34 solos, 11.5 TFLs for -49 yards, 4 sacks for -25 yards, 4 interceptions for 152 return yards and 2 TDs, 2 pass breakups, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one safety.
- In the 2nd OT vs. Tulane, Collins took an interception 96 yards for a 30-24 victory, while totaling 15 tackles during the game, thus earning the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week award and his 4th AAC weekly award.
- Collins' interception with just over one minute remaining in the SMU game ended the Mustang's last chance to pull out a win ... he also had 6 tackles, 2 TFLs for -10 yards, one sack for -9 yards and one QB hurry, thus earning Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week and AAC Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- Against ECU, Collins missed most of the first half after suffering an injury, but returned in the second half and ended the game with 6 tackles.
- In the USF game, Collins had 6 tackles, including 5 solos, one forced fumble when USF was at the Tulsa 6-yard line and an INT return for a TD and a 35-13 Tulsa lead.
- At #11 UCF, Collins had 10 stops, 3.5 TFLs for -11 yards, 2 PBUs, one INT and one safety.
- For his performance at UCF, Collins was named the AAC's Defensive Player of the Week.
- Against OSU, Collins totaled 6 tackles, all solos, with 4 of those for a loss of 24 yards, including 3 TFLs for -16 yards, and that came in just a little over 2 quarters of the game since he left in the 3rd period with an injury.
- For his OSU performance, Collins was named the Chuck Bednarik National Defensive Player of the Week, while also being named to the AAC's weekly honor roll.
- Collins earned preseason fourth-team All-America honors by Phil Steele's magazine.
- He was also named to the preseason watch list for the Bednarik Award which is presented to the nation's top defensive player.
- Collins was left off of the Dick Butkus preseason watch list this year for the nation's top LB.
- Last year, Collins had the second-most team tackles with 97 stops, has 8 TFLs for -27 yards, 2 sacks for -14 yards, 3 pass breakups, one fumble recovery and one blocked kick.
- As a redshirt freshman in 2018, Collins was named to the *USA Today* and *Football Writers Association of America* (FWAA) Freshman All-America Teams, becoming the 9th Tulsa player to earn Freshman All-America honors
- In 2018, Collins moved into the starting WILL linebacker spot in the 3rd game vs. Arkansas State due to a Robert Revels III injury moving over from his backup role at the MIKE position.

COMEBACK WINS . . .

• Since Philip Montgomery took over as head coach in 2015, Tulsa has had 16 games in which the Hurricane has trailed and come back to win . . . in the 2015 season, 11 points against SMU was the biggest deficit that Tulsa came back to win . . . Tulsa also trailed by 10 points vs. FAU in the season opener, and twice against Tulane to come back to win . . . in 2016, Tulsa had its biggest come-from-behind win in school history and second-biggest in NCAA Division I history (now 3rd), trailing 31-0 at Fresno State in the second quarter and winning 48-41 in overtime . . . the next largest comeback win was 21 points this year against SMU.

PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN SIXTH YEAR LEADING TULSA FOOTBALL PROGRAM . . .

- Philip Montgomery is in his 6th season as the Golden Hurricane head coach and has an overall 31-38 head coaching record.
- Montgomery grabbed his first coaching win against a ranked opponent in his 14th game vs. a top-25 team with a 34-26 win over #11 UCF earlier this season . . . he became the first TU coach to defeat two top-25 ranked teams in the same season when Tulsa defeated #19 SMU.
- Montgomery was named The Dodd Trophy Coach of the Week, as named by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation after Tulsa's 21-point comeback over SMU.
- He ranks 8th on the school's all-time head coaching wins list with 31 victories.
- Montgomery completed his second season in 2016 leading the Tulsa football program to a 10-3 record and a win in the Miami Beach Bowl.
- He became the 29th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2014.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU.
- In his first year, he led Tulsa to 6 wins and to the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the final three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.

COLLINS NAMED THE AMERICAN'S DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOUR TIMES IN JUST SEVEN WEEKS . . .

- Zaven Collins garnered the AAC's Defensive Player of the Week award 4 times this season, coming after his performances against #11 UCF, USF, #19 SMU and Tulane.
- Against 11th-ranked UCF, Collins had 10 tackles, 3.5 TFLs for -11 yards, 2 PBUs, one interception and one safety in Tulsa's 34-26 comeback win on Oct. 3.
- In the USF game, Collins totaled 6 tackles, including 5 solos, forced one fumble and returned an interception 38 yards for a TD in Tulsa's 42-13 win on Oct. 23.
- Collins had 6 tackles, 2 TFLs for -10 yards, one sack for -10 yards and the interception that sealed Tulsa's win over #19 SMU.
- His 4th weekly AAC honor came after the Tulane game when he had 15 tackles and the game-winning 96-yard INT return to end the game in overtime.

TAKING DOWN TWO TOP-20 TEAMS FOR FIRST TIME . . .

- Tulsa's 34-26 win over #11 UCF was the first for the Hurricane against a ranked opponent since handing #24 Hawaii a 62-35 loss in the 2010 Hawaii Bowl.
- It was the first win over a top-15 opponent since Tulsa defeated No. 15 Texas A&M 35-34 in Sept. 1991.
- Before that, it was 1971 that Tulsa defeated a higher ranked team with a 21-20 win over #7 Arkansas.
- The win also snapped a 21-game home winning streak for UCF . . . the last team to defeat UCF on its home field was the 2016 Tulsa team on Nov. 19, 2016, 35-20.
- When Tulsa defeated No. 19 SMU on Nov. 14, it marked the first time in school history that Tulsa defeated two ranked teams in the same season.

FWAA NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK . . .

- For its 34-26 win at #11-ranked UCF, Tulsa was named the FWAA/Reveal Suits National Team of the Week.
- Trailing 16-0 and 23-5, Tulsa came back from that 18-point deficit and outscored the UCF Knights 29-3 over the final 30:53 of the game.
- Tulsa scored on a 48-yard pass play at the 0:53 of the 2nd quarter, going 88 yards in 4 plays and taking 0:41 off the clock.
- The Hurricane added a 34-yard TD toss in the first 0:11 of the 3rd quarter on a one-play 34-yard drive in just 0:06.
- Tulsa took its first lead, 31-26, at the 12:56 mark of the 4th period, capping a 5-play, 61-yard drive . . . Zack Long's 34-yard FG with 1:30 remaining in the game gave Tulsa its 8-point lead.

PLAYER, LONG THE LATEST TO EARN AAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS . . .

- In what amounted to be Tulsa's final regular season game against Navy, the Hurricane came away with 2 AAC Player of the Week selections.
- Junior Jaxon Player was named the Defensive Player of the Week, while senior Zack Long won the award for special teams.
- From his defensive tackle position, Player tallied a career-best 12 tackles, including 10 solos, and had a team season-best of 4.5 TFLs for -12 yards and added 2 sacks for -3 yards.
- Long scored 13 of Tulsa's 19 points, while connecting on 4-of-4 field goals and added one PAT ... Long's first FG was a career-long 48-yarder.
- In addition, punter Lachlan Wilson was named to the AAC weekly honor roll after punting 4 times for a 41.8 average and converting a first down on a 22-yard run on a 4th-and-10 fake punt from Tulsa's own 26-yard line.

IN THE RED ZONE . . .

- Defensively, Tulsa's opponents have crossed the red zone 25 times and have scored 76 percent of the time, but only 40 percent of the time having scored a touchdown.
- Tulsa has held the opposition to 10 TDs, 9-of-12 FGs, forced a fumble and held on one 4th down attempt.
- On offense, Tulsa has scored 80 percent of the time in the red zone with 20 scores in 25 attempts, including 12 TDs and 8-of-11 FGs.

KARDIAC KIDS . . .

- Borrowing the moniker from the 1980 Cleveland Browns, Tulsa has been the college version of the Kardiak Kids this year.
- In 4 of its 7 wins this season, Tulsa had to come back from double-digit deficits, trailing by 18, 14 and 21 points all in the first half, and then 14 points at the end of 3 quarters.
- In the Philip Montgomery era, Tulsa has come-from-behind 16 times since 2015 ... in 14 of those 16 comebacks Tulsa trailed by double digits.
- The first comeback was on the road Oct. 3 against the 11th-ranked UCF Knights when the Hurricane trailed by 18 points (23-5) with less than 2 minutes remaining in the first half.
- The second comeback was at home on Oct. 30 against ECU ... Tulsa scored 31 points in the second half after trailing 17-3 at halftime.
- Tulsa trailed No. 19-ranked SMU 21-0 early in the second period and 24-7 at halftime, but outscored the Mustangs 21-0 in the second half for a 28-24 win.
- A week later, Tulsa trailed Tulane 14-0 after 3 quarters and then 21-14 with 1:38 left in the game ... Tulsa, with its third QB of the game, Davis Brin, scored 21 4th quarter points and 9 in overtime for a 30-24 win.
- Tulsa's 21-point comeback vs. SMU is the second largest come-from-behind victory in the Montgomery era, behind overcoming a 31-0 deficit against Fresno State in 2016 for a 48-41 win ... the 18-point win is the third largest deficit Tulsa has come back from in that time.

AN UNUSUAL SEASON . . .

- When Tulsa hosted ECU on Friday, Oct. 30, it was the latest home opener ever in Skelly Field at H.A. Chapman Stadium's 90-year history.
- A total of 341 days had passed since Tulsa had played a home game ... Tulsa's last game at Chapman Stadium before that was on Nov. 23, 2019.
- Three home games were planned before Oct. 30, but were cancelled or postponed.
- The latest home opener in school history was played 102 years ago when on Nov. 23, 1918 Tulsa, then known as Henry Kendall College, played Oklahoma A&M at Lee Stadium.
- Tulsa had games on back-to-back weekends twice this season ... those came on Oct. 23 at USF and Oct. 30 at home against ECU and Nov. 14 and 19 vs. SMU and Tulane.
- The Hurricane had 2 weeks between facing #11 OSU (Sept. 19) and #11 UCF (Oct. 3) ... 3 weeks between UCF (Oct. 3) and USF (Oct. 23) ... 2 weeks between ECU (Oct. 30) and #19 SMU (Nov. 14), 2 weeks between Tulane (Nov. 19) and Navy (Dec. 5) and now 2 weeks between Navy (Dec. 5) and the AAC Championship Game at Cincinnati (Dec. 19).

THE 'JUJU' HAT DEBUTS . . .

Upon his retirement in July 2016 as the Tulane University athletics director, Rick Dickson took to the hobby of saltwater fly fishing. He had been enjoying his retirement fishing in such locations as Costa Rica, Panama, Belize, the Baha Peninsula, among other locations. He began wearing what has become his trademark in retirement, the Panama hat.

In September, Dickson agreed to return to his alma mater, Tulsa, as interim athletics director.

When he returned to Tulsa where he was a football student-athlete and later where he began his athletics administration career, Dickson met with the Golden Hurricane football team following practice his first day on the job wearing his trademark 'Panama' hat.



As Dickson watched football team practices, he often times was teased by student-athletes as being the "OG AD" (old guy AD) and "we need hats like that". That's when Dickson went to work taking one of his Panama hats and turned to Shameka Wilkerson and her sister Shaee, who owns Perfect PartiZ, to decorate the hat 'blue and gold' with a red feather added, and so began Tulsa's "Panama 'Cane JuJu Hat", which is simply called by TU players as the 'Juju' hat.

The "Juju" hat debuted in Tulsa's 42-13 win over USF. The hat is used as a reward for scoring a touchdown and any other game-turning play.

COVID-19 IMPACTS TULSA SCHEDULE . . .

- A total of 8 Tulsa games were affected by the COVID-19 pandemic this season ... 2 games were canceled before the season and 6 were initially postponed ... 2 of the postponements were rescheduled (OSU and Navy) ... 4 others (Arkansas State, Houston and Cincinnati twice) were not played.
- The Toledo (Sept. 5) and Northwestern State (Sept. 19) games were canceled before the year due to their Conferences initially canceling the 2020 football season.
- The Tulsa-OSU Game scheduled for Sept. 12 was moved back to Sept. 19, an open week for both schools. It was not because of positive COVID cases that week, but because of limited practice for TULSA due to COVID in the preseason. (In attempting to deal with COVID-19 protocols effectively, the Tulsa football team has been limited in practice sessions since the beginning of preseason camp on August 7. Tulsa had a nine-day pause due to multiple positive tests and was limited to seven practices in the 17 days of preseason camp).
- The Arkansas State game (Sept. 26) was postponed due to Arkansas State's stated inability to assemble a two-deep depth chart at one position group that would allow the game to be played safely. (make-up date not likely).
- The Cincinnati home game (Oct. 17) was postponed due to positive Cincinnati COVID cases and ensuing quarantine of student-athletes (rescheduled for Dec. 19) ... the rescheduled game for Dec. 4, then moved to Dec. 5 was canceled again due to positive Cincinnati COVID cases.
- The Navy game (Nov. 7) in Annapolis, Md., was postponed due to positive Navy COVID cases and ensuing contact tracing of student-athletes, but was rescheduled and was played on Dec. 5.
- The Houston game (Nov. 28) in Houston, Texas, was postponed due to positive UH COVID cases and ensuing quarantine of student-athletes, and later canceled.
- Only 5 games on Tulsa's schedule were played on the same weekend that the game was originally scheduled for, including at UCF (Oct. 3), at USF (Oct. 23), East Carolina (Oct. 30), SMU (Nov. 14) and Tulane (Nov. 19, but moved from Nov. 21).

PLAYER STEPS UP IN DOMINANT DEFENSIVE EFFORT . . .

- Junior defensive tackle Jaxon Player has been a steady force all season long for the Hurricane, but in Tulsa's last outing he was in another zone.
- A 6'0" junior from Waco, Texas, Player led a Tulsa defense that was dominant in a 19-6 road win at Navy on Saturday.
- The Hurricane defense held the Midshipmen to 6 points, zero touchdowns and only 153 yards of total offense ... for most of the 2nd half Tulsa was without All-America linebacker Zaven Collins due to injury.
- Player was the catalyst behind the defensive effort, as he tallied a career-best 12 tackles, including 10 solos, and had a team season-best of 4.5 TFLs for -12 yards and added 2 sacks for -3 yards.

BRIN BRINGS BACK HURRICANE . . .

- After starting QB Zach Smith went out in the first quarter and backup Seth Boomer left the game late in the third quarter against Tulane, both with injuries ... trailing 14-0, redshirt sophomore Davis Brin took the reins of the offense with under 3 minutes remaining in the 3rd quarter.
- On Tulsa's first possession of the 4th quarter, Brin guided Tulsa to an 84-yard, 10-play drive and ran the final 18 yards for the first Tulsa score at the 9:17 mark.
- After the Tulsa defense held Tulane to 8 yards in 5 plays, Brin again took the Hurricane down the field and on a 4th-and-15 completed a 19-yard pass to Josh Johnson in the back of the end zone to tie the game at 14-14 with the PAT with 3:16 left in the contest.
- Trailing 21-14, Tulsa took possession with 1:38 on the game clock from their own 25-yard line ... Brin marched the Hurricane down the field by completing 5-of-8 passes to reach the Tulane 37-yard line with just 0:06 remaining on the clock.
- Brin took the snap on 3rd-and-7, avoided a tackler and launched a 'Hail Mary' pass to the right corner of the end zone to a waiting JuanCarlos Santana for a 37-yard completion and after the PAT a 21-21 tie with no time remaining.
- For the game, Brin completed 18-of-28 passes for 266 yards and 2 touchdowns, while rushing for 11 yards and one touchdown on 4 carries and was named the AAC's co-Offensive Player of the Game.

RBs MAKING UP FOR LOSS OF BROOKS . . .

- The school's 5th-leading all-time rusher Shamari Brooks' senior season ended before it started with an ACL injury the week of the season opener against OSU.
- In his absence, Tulsa has used a trio of backs — Deneric Prince, Corey Taylor II and TK Wilkerson.
- These 3 backs have combined to average 143.1 yards per game on the ground , while each player has missed one game ... they have combined to total 1,002 yards on 214 carries for a 4.7 average per attempt this year.
- Prince has a team-leading 356 yards, followed by Corey Taylor II with 329 yards and T.K. Wilkerson with 317 yards, each playing just 6 games.
- Prince and Taylor have each had a 100+ rushing game this year, while Wilkerson was just 6 yards shy of 100 with 94 yards against #19 SMU.
- Taylor had a season-high 132 yards against Tulane for his first 100+ rushing game since gaining 117 yards on Nov. 10, 2018 against Memphis.
- Prince had a season-high 109 yards and 2 TDs at USF, while Taylor added 67 yards and 2 TDs in that contest.
- Prince led Tulsa with 82 yards on 15 carries vs. #11 OSU, while Wilkerson was Tulsa's leading ballcarrier vs. #11 UCF with 86 yards and one TD on 22 carries.
- In back-to-back games against ECU and SMU, Wilkerson totaled 183 yards and 3 TDs in those two games, totaling 89 yards and 2 TDs on 18 carries against ECU and 94 yards and one TD on 21 attempts vs. SMU.

JC FOR THE TD . . .

- Junior receiver JuanCarlos Santana entered the Tulane game with 215 receiving yards on the year ... he ended the game having half of that total with a career-best 132 yards on 8 receptions.
- Santana made some big catches in the game including a 37-yarder on Tulsa's first scoring drive on a 3rd-and-5.
- But none were any bigger than the 37-yarder in the corner of the end zone as time expired when he pulled in the "Hail Mary" pass from Davis Brin to tie the game after the PAT.
- The TD was Santana's 3rd of the year and 4th of his career.
- Santana was named to the AAC's weekly honor roll for his performance.

DC GILLESPIE NAMED TO BROYLES LIST . . .

- Tulsa defensive coordinator and linebackers coach Joseph Gillespie has been named a nominee for the Broyles Award which honors college football's top assistant coaches.
- The 56 nominees in this year's Broyles Award class were selected from approximately 1,270 assistant coaches representing 127 FBS programs across the country.

SLOW STARTS . . .

- This year, Tulsa's offense has gotten off to a slow start in its 7 games.
- Tulsa has scored just a total of 12 first-quarter points with one touchdown (USF), one field goal (ECU) and a defensive safety (UCF) for an average of 1.7 points.
- Tulsa has been held scoreless in the first quarter in 4 games this season.
- Eight of Tulsa's 14 turnovers have come in the first quarter this year.
- In its third game, Tulsa scored on its first possession, going 65 yards in 4 plays against USF for its only touchdown in the first quarter this season.
- In the first quarter this year, Tulsa averages only 72.0 yards (496 yards on 131 plays) and 2.0 points (12), and 7 of Tulsa's 13 turnovers have come in the first quarter this year.
- Tulsa has heated up in the second quarter scoring 44 points, while scoring 65 points in the third stanza.

THE FINAL THREE QUARTERS . . .

- In Tulsa's 7 games, Tulsa's offense gotten off to a slow first quarter, totaling only 496 yards for a 3.78 average per play (131) and scoring only 10 points (2 additional points came from a defensive safety).
- In the final three quarters and OT, the Hurricane has totaled 2,382 yards for 340.2 yards per game and has scored 182 points (26.0 ppg).
- Against OSU in the first quarter, offensively Tulsa had 51 yards on 15 plays and zero points ... over the last 3 quarters Tulsa gained 227 yards and scored 7 points.
- In the first quarter at UCF, Tulsa gained only 52 yards on 23 plays and had a 2-point defensive safety ... over the final 3 quarters, Tulsa had 386 yards on 50 plays and 32 points.
- In the 3rd game against USF, Tulsa opened with a touchdown on its first possession and ended the first quarter with 159 total yards on 19 plays for an 8.4 average per play.
- Against ECU, Tulsa scored only 3 points and gained 53 yards in the first quarter, while scoring 31 points and gaining 375 yards over the final three stanzas.
- Tulsa has scored zero first quarter points in the last 3 games.
- In the SMU game, Tulsa scored zero first quarter points and gained just 59 yards, while totaling 396 yards and 28 points over the final three quarters.
- In the Tulane game, Tulsa scored zero first quarter points and totaled 58 yards, while gaining 464 yards in the final 3 quarters and overtime ... Tulsa scored all 30 points in the 4th quarter and the OT period.
- Tulsa and Navy were tied 0-0 after the first quarter in Tulsa's last outing.

KEYLON STOKES SURPASSES 2,000 CAREER RECEIVING YARDS . . .

- Senior Keylon Stokes now has 2,266 yards and 10 TDs on 144 receptions in 40 career games.
- Stokes went over the 2,000-yard plateau for his career on his third reception that went for 25 yards in the 3rd quarter in the 5th game this year against ECU.
- This year, Stokes has caught 35 passes for 508 yards and 2 TDs in 7 games ... he has also rushed for 49 yards on 9 carries and has 40 punt return yards on 11 returns.
- Stokes was a 1,000-yard receiver last season, the first since the 2016 season when his brother, Keevan Lucas, led Tulsa with 1,180 yards and Josh Atkinson had 1,058 yards.
- Stokes also has 1,201 career kick return yards on 58 returns, 92 punt return yards, 195 rushing yards for 3,754 career all-purpose yards.
- Stokes had 1,046 receiving yards and 6 TDs last year ... he surpassed 1,000 yards in the season finale at ECU when he had 76 yards on 4 receptions.
- Stokes has 6 career 100-yard receiving games, including a season-high 122 yards on 8 receptions against #19 SMU this season.
- He had a career-high 144 yards on 9 receptions against Houston in 2019.

JJ LEADING IN TD RECEPTIONS . . .

- Junior receiver Josh Johnson is tied with Keylon Stokes for receptions this season with 35 and has 484 yards.
- His 6 receiving TDs leads all Hurricane players for touchdowns.
- Johnson has had scoring receptions of 16 yards (OSU), 48 (UCF), 20 (SM), 35 (SMU), 19 (Tulane) and 66 (Navy).

THE LAST MEETING . . .

- Tulsa and Cincinnati met a year ago in Cincinnati on October 19 as the #21 Bearcats held off the Hurricane 24-13.
- Five turnovers handicapped Tulsa's chances for a victory as the Bearcats converted two of those takeaways into 10 points.
- The Tulsa defense came up with a big stop with under 5 minutes to play when the Hurricane stopped the Bearcats on 4th-and-3 at the Tulsa 12-yard line to keep the 4-point differential.
- Trailing 17-13, Tulsa took possession with 4:11 left needing to go 90 yards for the lead, but a Cincinnati interception ended Tulsa's hope for the come-from behind victory ... on the first play, the Bearcats' Gerrid Doaks scored his third TD of the game with a 27-yard run for the final score.
- For the game, Tulsa held a 377 to 317-yard edge, including passing for 243 yards and rushing for another 134 yards.

THE LAST TIME OUT . . .

- Tulsa used a third quarter touchdown and four Zack Long field goals to claim a 19-6 victory over the Navy Midshipmen on Dec. 5 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- The win clinched Tulsa a spot in the American Athletic Conference Championship game on Dec. 19 against the Cincinnati Bearcats.
- The Hurricane defense held the Midshipmen to 6 points, the lowest for a Tulsa opponent since Sept. 10, 2011 when Tulane scored just 3 points. It was also the last time a Tulsa opponent did not score a touchdown.
- For the game, Tulsa outgained the Mids, 296 to 153, as the Hurricane had 128 rushing yards and 168 through the air. Corey Taylor II had 69 rushing yards, while Zach Smith completed 10 passes for 168 yards and Tulsa's only TD of the game.
- Tulsa's defense, missing All-America candidate Zaven Collins most of the second half with an injury, totaled 12 TFLs for -49 yards and 5 sacks, as tackle Jaxon Player was a best with a career-high 12 tackles, 4.5 TFLs for -12 yards and 2 sacks.
- Tulsa's first touchdown of the game came at the 1:33 mark of the 3rd quarter when Zach Smith connected with Josh Johnson on a 66-yard pass play to take a 13-6 lead into the 4th quarter.
- After putting its first points on the board with a field goal at the end of the first half, Navy came out in the second half and marched 14 plays, 60 yards and taking 7:08 off the clock to tie the score at 6-6 with a 32-yard field goal at the 7:08 mark of the period.

Zack Long's third field goal of the day gave Tulsa a 10-point lead at 16-6 on a 37-yarder, capping a 52-yard, 11-play drive.

CORNERS BRING EXPERIENCE . . .

- Despite losing starting corner Reggie Robinson to the Dallas Cowboys as a 4th round draft choice, the Tulsa cornerback position brought solid experience into the season.
- "I feel like we have two all-conference players at the corners," said Coach Montgomery.
- Cornerbacks Allie Green IV and Akayleb Evans have combined for 44 career starts ... Green has started 6 games and Evans all 7 games this year.
- In 7 games, opposing offenses have passed for just 183.4 yards against Tulsa's defense.
- The duo leads a pass defense that is ranked 15 nationally for passing yards and 17th for pass defense efficiency.
- This year, the CB duo has combined for 38 tackles, 2.5 TFLs for -7 yards, 2 PBUs, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one interception.
- Evans has totaled 17 tackles, 2 PBUs and one forced fumble, while Green has 21 tackles, 2 TFLs for -5 yards, one pass breakup, one INT and one fumble recovery.
- The tandem has combined for 169 tackles, 21 pass break-ups, 2 forced fumbles and one interception in their careers.
- Green IV has made the semifinalist list for the Thorpe Award, given to the nation's top defensive back.

SMITH LEADS TULSA OFFENSE . . .

- Senior Zach Smith is in his second season as Tulsa's starting quarterback after transferring from Baylor
- In 7 games this year, Smith has completed 58-percent of his passes for 1,434 yards and 11 TDs for a 135.16 passing efficiency.
- Smith returned to the lineup at Navy after suffering an injury in Tulsa's previous game against Tulane ... he played just the first quarter against Tulane.
- Smith completed only 10-of-25 passes for 168 yards at Navy, but connected on a 66-yard TD to Josh Johnson.
- He has led Tulsa in 3 second-half comebacks leading Tulsa to 22 second-half points at #11 UCF, 31 second-half points against ECU and 21 second-half points against #19 SMU.
- In the second half of those 3 games, Smith completed 62.5-percent of his passes (35-of-56) for 550 yards and 6 TDs with just one INT.
- Whereas, in the first half he completed 48-percent of his passes (27-of-48) for 301 yards and one TD with 4 INTs in those 3 games.
- Smith finished with a season-best 325 yards and 3 TDs on 26-of-38 against #19 SMU ... a game before, Smith had 253 yards and 2 TDs on 19 completions against ECU.
- Against USF, Smith completed 67-percent of his passes for 223 yards and one TD.
- * In an 18-point comeback win over #11 UCF, Smith completed 17-of-29 passes for 273 yards and 3 TDs ... after going 2-of-8 for 9 yards with one INT and one fumble in the 1st quarter, Smith went 15-of-21 for 264 yards, 3 TDs and 0 INTs over the final three quarters.
- In the opener at Oklahoma State, Smith completed 64-percent of his passes (18-of-28) for 166 yards and one TD.
- At Tulsa, Smith now has 4,713 yards and 30 TDs in 19 games over the last two years to rank 10th on the school's career passing chart.
- Last year, Smith threw for 3,279 yards, 19 TDs and 273.2 yards per game in 12 games.
- He had five 300+ passing games, including consecutive 300+ passing games with 354 yards and 2 TDs vs. Wyoming and 346 yards and 4 TD passes vs. SMU.
- Smith played in 18 games at Baylor in 2016 and 2017, while starting 10 of those contests ... he put up career numbers at Baylor of 2,997 yards, 21 TDs and a 55.6 completion percentage.
- He now has 7,711 passing yards and 51 TDs in 37 games between Tulsa and Baylor.
- Smith has 17 career passes for 50+ yards, including 7 at Tulsa.
- Smith had a career-high 463 yards and 4 TDs on 33-of-50 passes for Baylor against No. 3 Oklahoma in 2017.

CHRIS PAUL MORE THAN A FOOTBALL PLAYER . . .

- A two-year starter, Chris Paul started at right guard as a redshirt freshman in 2018 and at left guard in 2019
- This year Paul is starting in his third position on the offensive line as he is the starter at right tackle.
- In the UCF and Tulane games, Paul graded out at a season-best 91-percent over 78 snaps at UCF and 92 snaps against Tulane.
- Against USF, Paul played at right tackle in the first half and moved to left tackle, due to an injury, for the second half.
- He returned to the start at right tackle against ECU.
- Paul has started 27 career games, including 12 at left guard, 8 at right guard and all 7 games this year at right tackle.
- Aside from his play on the field, Paul is active in the community and on campus.
- This year, Paul was named as the American Athletic Conference's representative to the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee for 2020-21.
- He will serve as chair of the conference's SAAC executive board for the 2020-21 and 2021-22 academic years.
- Paul was named to Tulsa's Ultimate Team in 2019-20, an award that recognizes the school's top student-athletes based on academic success, athletic achievement, campus involvement, character and community outreach.
- A top-10 freshman in 2018-19, Paul has volunteered at the Children's Hospital at Saint Francis, Read Across America, Lift Up America and at the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma.

WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

DEFENSE AMONG TOP UNITS IN NATION . . .

- Tulsa's defense has had strong performances so far this season – holding the opposition to 19.9 points, 146.7 rushing yards, 183.4 passing yards and 330.1 total yards per game.
- Tulsa ranks among the top-35 for many of the main NCAA defensive categories ... Tulsa is 8th for TFLs, 15th for passing yards, 16th for 3rd down conversions defense, 17th for pass efficiency defense, 18th nationally for fumble recoveries, 20th for defensive TDs, 20th for total defense, 21st for scoring defense and 27th for red zone defense,
- The Hurricane has forced 14 turnovers, totaled 59 TFLs for -194 yards, 17 sacks for -86 yards and 26 pass break-ups.
- Tulsa has held the opponent scoreless in 12 of 28 quarters this year (not including OT), including holding #11 UCF, USF, #19 SMU and Navy scoreless in the 4th quarter.
- In the season opener, Tulsa faced one of the nation's top returning offenses with the nation's leading returning rusher Chuba Hubbard ... Oklahoma State averaged 453.9 yards last year and returned all of its skill position players in 2020.
- Tulsa limited the OSU offense to 289 yards, 151 on the ground and 138 passing yards.
- The Hurricane had 14 TFLs for -56 yards and 6 sacks for -24 yards, while also forcing one fumble and intercepting one pass against OSU.
- In the next game, Tulsa faced UCF's nation-leading offense that came into the game averaging 50.0 points, 646.0 total yards and 233.5 rushing yards.
- Tulsa held UCF to 24 points, 191 total yards and 108.5 rushing yards less than their season average.
- Tulsa held USF to 13 points, the lowest for a Tulsa opponent since the 2016 Bowl Game (10 points by Central Michigan) and just 305 total yards, while getting 3 turnovers, including an INT return for a touchdown.
- In the USF game, Tulsa was without defensive starters NKL Cristian Williams, SAF TieNeal Martin and DE Cullen Wick ... LB Treyvon Reeves missed the 2nd half of the USF game after a first-half targeting call.
- East Carolina had the most yardage against the Hurricane this year, totaling 456 yards, and Tulsa forced 3 turnovers ... Tulsa was still without starters SAF TieNeal Martin and DE Cullen Wick, and LB Zaven Collins missed most of the first half with an injury, but returned after halftime.
- Against #19-ranked SMU, Tulsa's defense held SMU to 351 yards, 175 yards below the Mustangs' season average of 526 yards per game, and 24 points, which was 16.5 points below SMU's scoring average.
- Tulsa held Navy to the lowest total offensive output this year for a Hurricane opponent, limiting the Midshipmen to 153 total yards.

TYLER SMITH ON FWAA FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA LIST . . .

- Tulsa red-shirt freshman left tackle Tyler Smith is on the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Freshman All-America Watch List.
- Smith is one of 10 redshirt or true freshmen offensive lineman named to the FWAA's list.
- A 6'5", 322-pounder from Fort Worth, Texas, red-shirted in 2019, but did play in four games, including starting assignments in Tulsa's wins against UCF and East Carolina.
- He has started all 7 games this year and played every offensive snap in 5 games this year, including against No. 11-ranked teams Oklahoma State and UCF.
- Smith left the USF game late in the first half with an injury, but returned the next week and played the entire game against East Carolina ... he missed one play in the SMU game.

MORE EXPERIENCE ON O-LINE . . .

- On the O-Line, Tulsa came into 2020 with 53 starts among 6 different players.
- Whereas a year earlier, Tulsa came into the season with just 27 starts among 4 different players — Chris Ivy Jr. (12), Chris Paul (8), Tiller Bucktrot (4) and Dylan Couch (3).
- The starting offensive line now totals 83 starts — LT Tyler Smith (9), LG Dante Bivens (14), C Gerard Wheeler (18), RG Dylan Couch (15) and RT Chris Paul (27)
- Backup guard Tiller Bucktrot has 5 career starts to give Tulsa a total of 88 starts among its 6 players with career starting assignments.

By The Numbers . . .

1 Tulsa will be playing in its first AAC Championship game, but its 5th overall conference championship game ... Tulsa was 2-2 in Conference USA Championship games.

2 Zaven Collins has returned 2 of his 4 interceptions for touchdowns this year ... he had a 38-yard return in the 3rd quarter at USF to increase Tulsa's score to 35-13 ... against Tulane, he had a pick 6 on a 96-yard return in the 2nd overtime to give Tulsa a 30-24 comeback win.

4.5 Jaxon Player had a team-season-high of 4.5 TFLs for -12 yards at Navy, including 2 sacks for -3 yards.

5 Zaven Collins ranks 5th in the NCAA for total interceptions and interceptions per game with 4 pickoffs on the year. ... he has 152 return yards and 2 TDs on his 4 pickoffs.

6 Tulsa has won 6 straight games this year, the most since winning 7 consecutive games in the 2012 season.

8 Tulsa has won 8 of its last 9 games dating back to last year when Tulsa won 2 of its final 3 games.

14 Tulsa's defense has had 14 takeaways in 7 games this year, including 8 fumble recoveries and 6 interceptions ... whereas, Tulsa had a season total of only 18 turnovers last year in 12 games.

16 Zaven Collins is just the 16th FBS player since 2006 to record at least 4 sacks and return 2 INTs for TDs in a single season ... others include Ndamukong Suh, Khalil Mack and Tulsa's own Jesse Brubaker ... Collins has accomplished the feat in 6 games, the next closest is 10 games by Ohio's Quentin Poling in 2015.

75 Tulsa redshirt freshman Lachlan Wilson had a 75-yard punt in the SMU game ... it's the longest punt since 2009 when Michael Such had an 83-yarder against Memphis ... it also ties for the 9th longest in school history.

121 Tulsa is in its 121st season of football ... the first year Tulsa began playing football was 1895 ... there were five years between 1903 and 1911 that Tulsa did not field a football team.

153 Tulsa held Navy to 153 total yards in its last outing, which was the least for a Tulsa opponent since Sept. 8, 2012 when Tulane was held to 177 yards.

TULSA'S RUNNING BACK GROUP CAME INTO SEASON SECOND IN NATION ONLY TO CLEMSON . . .

- Tulsa's returning RB corps came into 2020 with the second-highest combined career rushing yards and rushing TD totals in the nation, which was second only to Clemson.
- Tulsa's running back room returned 4,541 career yards and 51 TDs, while Clemson returned highs of 5,887 career yards and 74 rushing TDs.
- For the Hurricane, Shamari Brooks led the way with 2,700 career yards and 23 TDs followed by Corey Taylor II with 1,490 yards and 22 TDs.
- TK Wilkerson gained 315 yards and 6 TDs on the ground, while Christian Lovick had 36 rushing yards.

FROM AUSTRALIAN RULES FOOTBALL TO TULSA . . .

- Redshirt freshman Lachlan Wilson came to Tulsa in 2019 after playing Australian Rules Football for the Heidelberg Football Club.
- Wilson made his college debut in the season opener when he punted 7 times for a 37.7 average against Oklahoma State.
- In just his second career game, Wilson averaged 45.1 yards on 7 punts, including four inside the 10-yard line and a long of 67 yards against UCF ... his punts that landed inside the 10-yard line were downed at the 9, 4, 4 and one-yard lines.
- For his performance at UCF, Wilson was named the Co-Special Teams Player of the Week
- In the SMU game, Wilson tied for the 9th longest punt in school history with a 75-yarder ... the last time Tulsa had a longer punt was Michael Such's third-longest of 83 yards in 2009.
- In his 7 career games, Wilson has punted 34 times for a 42.7-yard average with 13 fair caught and 13 inside the 20-yard line.

UNDER MONTY . . .

- In 69 games under Philip Montgomery, Tulsa has scored over 40 points 24 times and has posted a 19-5 record when doing so.
- Tulsa has gone over 500 yards of total offense in 23 games under Montgomery.
- The Golden Hurricane has gone over 600 yards 9 times under Montgomery, including a high game of 667 yards in 2017 against Louisiana-Lafayette.
- Tulsa has 13 300+ yard rushing games in the Montgomery era, with a school record eight in 2016, three in 2017 and two in 2019.
- Tulsa is 10-1 when two players have gone over 100 rushing yards in the same game since 2015 under Montgomery.
- Tulsa has three 400+ rushing games under Montgomery, two coming in back-to-back games in 2017 (424 vs. Louisiana, 423 at Toledo) and one in 2016 (470 vs. UConn).

90 YEARS FOR H.A. CHAPMAN STADIUM . . .

- H.A. Chapman Stadium celebrates its 90th anniversary this year.
- Tulsa has now posted a 340-165-14 record at Skelly Field @ H.A. Chapman Stadium.
- Oil man and longtime friend of The University of Tulsa, William Skelly, gave \$125,000 to the Stadium Fund Drive in the spring of 1930 ... the remaining \$175,000 was raised by Tulsa businessmen who organized the Stadium Corporation of Tulsa.
- Ground-breaking ceremonies for Skelly Field were held on May 11, 1930.
- The inaugural game came on October 4, 1930, as Tulsa hosted Arkansas on that date and posted a 26-6 victory.
- On the opening kickoff, Arkansas fumbled and Johnny Potts recovered for Tulsa.
- Billy Boehm scored on the very next play for the first touchdown in the north end of the stadium ... Chet Benefield scored the first TD in the south end zone.
- The Golden Hurricane won its first six games at the new stadium that year.
- Skelly Field became known as Skelly Stadium in 1964 when enlarged to 40,235 seats.
- It was announced in 2007, that Skelly Stadium would have a new name – H.A. Chapman Stadium and in 2008 the stadium went through a complete renovation.
- The renovated stadium opened on Sept. 20, 2008 with a 56-14 victory over New Mexico.

Robinson, Gipson Stick to NFL Rosters . . .

Reggie Robinson II, the 4th round draft pick of the Dallas Cowboys, and Trevis Gipson, a 5th round draft pick of the Chicago Bears, have made the 53-man roster for their respective teams ... Robinson was Tulsa's leader last year for pass breakups and interceptions, while Gipson led Tulsa in TFLs and QB sacks ... the defensive duo is the first Tulsa players taken in the NFL draft under Coach Montgomery and the first overall since 2011.

Texas Flavor on Tulsa Coaching Staff . . .

- Tulsa Head Coach Philip Montgomery is from Eastland, Texas, but he is not the only Tulsa coach with ties to the state of Texas.
- Seven of Tulsa's 10 full-time assistant coaches were born in the state of Texas. Carlton Buckels (La.), Zach Hanson (Calif.) Luke Olson (Okla.) were born outside the state of Texas.
- Texas hometowns of Tulsa assistant coaches are Houston, Bay City, Fort Worth, Austin, Spring, Stephenville, Denton and Fort Hood.

PRACTICE PAUSE . . .

- Tulsa began camp on Aug. 7 ... practiced 4 days before a scheduled day off on Aug. 11.
- Practice paused for 9 days due to COVID testing and multiple positive tests on Aug. 12.
- Practice resumed on August 21 ... Tulsa practiced 3 more times before classes began on August 24 ... Tulsa practiced just 7 times in the 17 days of preseason camp.
- Leading up to the season opener on Sept. 19 at Oklahoma State, Tulsa had practiced a total of 25 times in 43 days since beginning preseason camp.

DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT SINCE MOVING TO 3-3-5 . . .

- Since the 2018 season when Tulsa's defense transitioned to the 3-3-5 scheme, the Hurricane has shown immense improvement since the 2017 campaign.
- In that first season of the 3-3-5, Tulsa held opponents to 121.2 yards less in total offense, 89.3 yards less in passing, 31.9-yards less in rushing and 10.4 less points.
- The Hurricane finished that 2018 season ranked 8th in NCAA for fewest passing yards allowed, 10th for 4th down conversions, 22nd for fumbles recovered, 41st for pass efficiency defense and 44th for red zone defense.
- Counting the 2020 season, Tulsa has allowed only one of its last 31 opponents over 500 yards of total offense as compared to 7 games in 2017 (506 yards by OSU in 2019).
- In 2019, Tulsa held the opposition to 394.8 yards of total offense, which was the first sub-400+ yearly offensive total since the 2012 season (347.8 ypg).
- This season, Tulsa's defense ranks among the nation's best — 15th for pass defense, 20th for total defense and 21st for scoring defense

BROOKS' SEASON ENDED BEFORE IT STARTED; RANKS 5th ON TULSA'S ALL-TIME RUSHING CHART . . .

- Senior running back Shamari Brooks missed the 2020 season after suffering a knee injury in practice the week prior to the season opener at Oklahoma State.
- Brooks was entering the 2020 season ranked 5th on the school's career rushing list and 11th for career rushing TDs.
- He has played in 32 career games and has 2,700 total rushing yards and 23 TDs.
- Brooks enters this season needing 1,217 yards to tie D'Angelo Brewer (2014-17, 3917 yards) for the school's all-time rushing record.
- He became just the 16th Tulsa player to gain over 2,000 career rushing yards.
- Brooks had 4 100+ rushing games in 2019 and now has 12 career 100+ rushing games.
- He had a career-high 202 yards in the 2019 season finale at ECU.

LINEBACKER BURNETT OUT TOO . . .

- Senior Yohance Burnett was the starting MIKE linebacker heading into the 2020 season until a preseason ACL knee injury sidelined him for the season.
- Burnett moved into the spot opened by the graduation of Cooper Edmiston.
- Burnett had 34 tackles and 2.5 TFLs for -5 yards a year ago.
- Since he transferred to Tulsa from Navarro Junior College in January of 2018, Burnett will now have missed 2 of his 3 seasons due to injury ... he missed the 2018 season after suffering an ACL injury as well.

SO CLOSE AGAINST TOP-25 TEAMS IN 2019 . . .

- Tulsa took three AAC 10+ win teams down to the wire in the 2019 season.
- Tulsa faced 3 conference opponents that were ranked among the nation's top-25 at the time of the meeting — #24 (AP) SMU, #21 (AP) Cincinnati and #25 (Coaches) Memphis — last year.
- These three teams had records of 11-3 (Cincinnati), 12-2 (Memphis) and 10-3 (SMU) to finish the season.
- All 3 games came down to the final minutes ... Tulsa lost those 3 games by an average of 6 points.

WHAT RETURNED ON OFFENSE . . .

- Tulsa returned 100-percent of its rushing, passing and total offense yards, 85-percent of its receiving yards and 89-percent of its touchdowns.
- Nine starters returned for the Golden Hurricane offense.
- This is the first time since 2016 that Tulsa has had the same starting QB returning.
- QB Zach Smith threw for 3,279 yards and 19 TDs with just 9 INTs as a first-year starter.
- Tulsa had a 1,000-yard rusher (Brooks) and 1,000-yard receiver (Stokes).
- The RB duo of Brooks and fellow senior Corey Taylor II came into 2020 with 4,190 yards and 45 touchdowns in their careers.

WHAT CAME BACK ON DEFENSE . . .

- Tulsa returned just 4 starters in 2020, but an additional 7 players who started at least one game during their careers also returned.
- One starter returned on the line (Jaxon Player), one at linebacker (Zaven Collins), and two in the secondary, including nickel safety (Cristian Williams) and cornerback (Allie Green).
- Collins was Tulsa's leading returning tackler with 97 stops and for TFLs and sacks
- Corner Akayleb Evans, who started 14 games, returned to the starting lineup this year after sitting out most of 2019 with an injury.
- Nose guard Tyarise Stevenson entered the year with the second-most starts on defense behind Zaven Collins with 18 career starting assignments.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium before the 2013 spring game.
- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay Buccaneers).
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).

THE PANDA . . .

Tulsa Head Coach Philip Montgomery has a 'Panda' logo placed on his headset this season. The 'Panda' is a part of The Children's Hospital of Saint Francis logo. Unlike other years, Tulsa student-athletes are not allowed to visit the youth at The Children's Hospital due to COVID-19. The purpose of placing the 'Panda' logo on Coach Monty's headset is to honor the children currently in the hospital during these times. Saint Francis Health System is the official Health System of TU athletics.



Former Tulsa Football Player & Director of Athletics Rick Dickson Returns to Tulsa as Interim Athletics Director . . .

Rick Dickson, a Tulsa native who led The University of Tulsa's athletics program in the early 1990s, was named interim director of athletics at Tulsa on Sept. 18, 2020. Dickson's prolific career includes five years as athletic director at The University of Tulsa from 1990 to 1994 before leading athletic programs at Washington State University (1994-2000) and Tulane University (2000-2015). Programs under Dickson's leadership saw dozens of conference championships and scores well above the national average in the NCAA's Academic Performance Rates. Dickson attended Tulsa's Bishop Kelley High School and played football for the Golden Hurricane before graduating from TU in 1977. His wife, Brenda, graduated from TU in 1979.

JOHNNY UNITAS GOLDEN ARM AWARD ... **Zach Smith** was added to the prestigious Golden Arm Award Watch List, which is presented annually to the top upperclassman quarterback ... Unitas was an 18-year veteran of the NFL, who played his collegiate career at the University of Louisville before joining the Baltimore Colts in 1958.

RIMINGTON AWARD ... the Rimington Award announced its watch list on Oct. 14 as Tulsa center **Gerard Wheeler** was named to the list ... the Rimington Trophy is presented annually to the most outstanding center in FBS football ... Wheeler is in his second year as Tulsa's starting center ... he has started the last 18 games dating back to the second game of the 2019 season.

• **DAVEY O'BRIEN AWARD** ... senior quarterback **Zach Smith** was a mid-season selection to the Davey O'Brien Award Watch List ... he was named to the Davey O'Brien's Great 8 after leading Tulsa back from an 18-point deficit for a 34-26 win over #11 UCF ... has completed 58-percent of his passes for 1,434 yards and 11 TDs this year in 7 games.

• **RAY GUY AWARD** ... another mid-season selection to a watch list, redshirt freshman punter **Lachlan Wilson** was named to the Ray Guy Watch List ... on the year, Wilson has punted 34 times for a 42.7 average..

• **DOAK WALKER AWARD** ... the senior running back duo of **Shamari Brooks** and **Corey Taylor II** were each named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List for the nation's top running back ... Brooks makes the list for the third straight year, while Taylor is on the preseason list for the second consecutive season ... the duo combined for 4,190 yards and 45 TDs ... Brooks rushed for 1,046 yards and 6 TDs last year, while Taylor II gained 461 yards and 6 touchdowns in 2019.

• **MAXWELL AWARD** ... **Shamari Brooks** was selected to the preseason watch list for the 84th Maxwell Award presented annually to the most outstanding player in college football ... the 5'9" Brooks enters the 2020 season ranked 5th on the school's career rushing list and 9th for career rushing TDs ... he has played in 32 career games and has 2,700 total rushing yards and 23 TDs.

• **BEDNARIK AWARD** ... **Zaven Collins** was named to the watch list for the 26th annual Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's outstanding defensive player ... Collins was a second-team American Athletic Conference selection last year after recording 97 tackles, eight TFLs for -27 yards, two sacks and two pass breakups ... he came into the 2020 season with 182 tackles and 17.5 TFLs, six pass breakups and two fumble recoveries ... a 2018 Freshman All-American as named by *USA Today* and the FWAA, Collins has six double-figure tackle games and two blocked kicks in his career.

• **WUERFFEL TROPHY** ... Cornerback **Akayleb Evans** and offensive lineman **Chris Paul**, both juniors, have been named to the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List ... the Wuerffel Trophy is known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service" ... Evans began the Akayleb Evans Foundation in his hometown of McKinney, Texas, in 2017 ... the Foundation started the #TouchdownwithToys event every Christmas and this past May provided gift cards to staff members at the McKinney Urgent Care in showing appreciation for their fight against COVID ... Paul was named as the American Athletic Conference's representative to the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee for 2020-21 ... Paul will serve as chair of the conference's SAAC executive board for the 2020-21 and 2021-22 academic years.

• **PATRICK MANNELLY AWARD** ... **Adam Higuera** was named one of 20 preseason candidates to the Patrick Mannelly Award Watch List, which is presented to the best FBS senior long snapper ... the award is in its second season ... To be elected to the Hall of Fame, Pearson must receive 80% voting support by the entire 48-member Selection Committee on "Selection Saturday".

Pearson, who was a finalist in the 2020 class but was snubbed by the selection committee, was named a finalist for next year during a virtual meeting of the Hall of Fame's Senior Committee who consider players whose careers ended at least 25 years before.

If Pearson gets the final nod, he will be the fourth Golden Hurricane player to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Those already in the Hall include — Bob St. Clair (1990), Steve Largent (1995) and Jim Finks (1995).

GAME 1

#11 Oklahoma State 16, Tulsa 7

Sept. 19, 2020 • Boone Pickens Stadium • Stillwater, Okla.

The 11th-ranked Oklahoma State Cowboys scored 13 4th quarter points to pull out a 16-7 victory over Tulsa Saturday afternoon at Boone Pickens Stadium in front of a COVID altered crowd of 14,668 fans.

Tulsa held a 4-point lead, 7-3, heading into the final quarter, a lead the Hurricane took with just under 2 minutes remaining before halftime.

On the game's first possession, OSU marched 77 yards in 18 plays, but the Hurricane defense stiffened inside the 20-yard line and stopped the Cowboys at the 10 for a 27-yard field goal.

After that opening 74-yard drive, the Hurricane defense held OSU to just 17 total yards the remainder of the first half.

Tulsa took its 7-3 lead on a 3-play, 56-yard drive that took just 0:56 off the clock in the second quarter as the Smith found Josh Johnson in the front corner of the end zone for 16 yards. The drive was set up by Smith's 41-yard toss to Keylon Stokes advancing to the OSU 15-yard line with just 1:38 left in the first half.

For most of the game it was the defenses that starred as the two units combined to allow only 566 total yards, 277 for Tulsa and 289 for OSU. The Golden Hurricane defense totaled a whopping 14 tackles for 56 lost yards, had six quarterback sacks, caused two turnovers.

Trailing 7-3 at the start of the 4th quarter, the Cowboys used a 3-yard Hubbard run on the first play of the period to take a 10-7 advantage, capping a 6-play, 81-yard drive that took only 2:06 off the clock. The drive was engineered by OSU true freshman quarterback Shane Illingworth on his first collegiate series.

Tulsa put together a 67-yard, 11-play drive of its own marching to the OSU 3-yard line before a false start penalty on 3rd and goal moved the Hurricane back to the 8-yard line. Tulsa had to rely on a 26-yard field goal attempt that went wide left.

The Cowboys added two field goals on its next two possessions in the final 4:27 for the win.

Tulsa 34, #11 UCF 26

Oct. 3, 2020 • Spectrum Stadium • Orlando, Fla.

Tulsa scored the final 15 points to overcome an 18-point deficit and down the nation's 11th-ranked UCF Knights 34-26 Saturday night at Spectrum Stadium.

The win snapped a 21-game home winning streak for the Knights. The last team to defeated UCF on its home field was the 2016 Tulsa team on Nov. 19, 2016 by a score of 35-20. The victory is also Tulsa's first against a ranked opponent since handing #24 Hawaii a 62-35 loss in the 2010 Hawaii Bowl, and it's the highest-ranked opponent Tulsa has defeated since a 35-34 home win over No. 15 Texas A&M in September 1996. Before that, it was 1971 that Tulsa defeated a higher ranked team with a 21-20 win over #7 Arkansas.

Tulsa's special teams forced and recovered 2 fumbles, while the defense intercepted one pass, had 10 tackles for -23 yards and 9 pass break-ups. Zaven Collins led the Hurricane defense with 10 tackles, 3.5 TFLs for -11 yards, two pass break-ups and one interception for a 13-yard return. Bryson Powers caused and recovered one fumble, while the other forced fumble came from Daiquain Jackson and was recovered by Josh Stewart.

Tulsa took its first lead of the game at 31-26 with 12:56 remaining in the 4th quarter as Smith hit Stokes in the back of the end zone, capping a 5-play, 61-yard drive in taking just 2:22 off the clock. The two-point pass attempt fell short of receiver Johnson to keep Tulsa 5 points ahead.

Tulsa milked the clock as much as possible in the final 5:35 minutes as the Hurricane took an 8-point lead on a Zack Long 34-yard field goal.

Trailing by 11 points at halftime, the Hurricane special teams got Tulsa off to a solid start in the second half, as Powers made a tremendous play on the kickoff. Powers caused and recovered the fumble in one motion, taking the ball away from returner Jaylon Richardson.

Smith wasted little time in finding Crawford for a 34-yard scoring strike on the first play from scrimmage, cutting the Knights lead to 4 points, 23-19.

Tulsa moved to 2-0 in the American Athletic Conference with a 42-13 victory over the USF Bulls at Raymond James Stadium.

It's the first 2-0 start for Tulsa in AAC play in its 7-year membership and the first time since 2012 that the Hurricane has put together two straight conference road wins.

Tulsa 34, East Carolina 30

TK Wilkerson scored his second touchdown of the game on a one-yard run to give Tulsa a 34-30 lead and the eventual victory over the East Carolina Pirates Friday night at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

Tulsa moved to 3-1 on the season and 3-0 in American Athletic Conference play, while ECU fell to 1-4 and 1-3 in the league.

After trailing by 14 points, 17-3, at halftime, the Hurricane scored on 5 of its 6 second-half possessions, including 4 touchdowns that each capped drives of over 70 yards. It was the second double-digit comeback victory this season for Tulsa.

ECU took a 3-point lead 30-27 with 4:24 left in the game, then Tulsa took possession at their own 25-yard line for the game-winning drive. A 4th down pass from the Tulsa 43-yard line resulted in an interference call, and a second 4th-and-5 saw Josh Johnson come up with a sliding catch. On the next play, Wilkerson rumbled 18 yards to the ECU 1-yard line and scored on the next play to put the Hurricane ahead 34-30 after the PAT.

The Pirates returned the kick to the Tulsa 44-yard line and got down to the 29 when a 'Hail Mary' pass into the end zone was touched by an ECU receiver but fell incomplete.

Tulsa came back from a 21-point deficit to capture a 28-24 victory over the 19th-ranked SMU Mustangs Saturday night at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

The win gives Tulsa its second victory over a top-25 opponent this season, which is the first time in school history that the Golden Hurricane defeated two ranked opponents in the same season. It's also the third come-from-behind victory for the Hurricane this season, coming back from 18 down at UCF, 14 against East Carolina and tonight's 21-point comeback.

Trailing 24-21, Tulsa took possession of the ball at their own 35-yard line with 4:02 left on the game clock. Passes of 12 and 29 yards from Zach Smith to Keylon Stokes put Tulsa at the SMU 24-yard line. Three straight TK Wilkerson runs of 14, 3 and 3 yards put the Hurricane on the 4-yard line setting up a 3rd-and-goal pass from Smith to tight end James Palmer for the touchdown.

Tulsa's Zaven Collins' interception of a Shane Buechele pass at the 50-yard line with just over one-minute remaining sealed the victory for the Hurricane.

SMU took a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on two takeaways, the first score coming on an interception return for a touchdown and then a 19-yard drive following a Tulsa fumble. SMU then scored on the first play of the second quarter for a 21-0 lead.

After those early SMU scores, Tulsa outscored the Mustangs 28-3 over the final 44 minutes

The 25th-ranked Tulsa Golden Hurricane scored 30 points in the final period and 2 overtimes to claim a 30-24 win over the Tulane Green Wave on a Thursday night game at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

After being shutout through three quarters and trailing, 14-0, Tulsa scored 21 points in the 4th quarter and 9 more in overtime for its 4th double-digit come-from-behind victory this season.

In overtime, each team scored on field goals in the first period and then on Tulane's second possession, Tulsa All-American Zaven Collins intercepted a 3rd-and-goal pass and went 96 yards for the game-winning score.

In sending the game to overtime, it took a spectacular 4th quarter offensive performance led by third-string quarterback Davis Brin.

Tulsa lost starting quarterback Zach Smith in the first half and backup Seth Boomer in the third quarter with injuries, thus putting Brin in the driver's seat of the Golden Hurricane offense. The sophomore rushed for one touchdown and threw for 2 more in the fourth quarter comeback that put the game into overtime tied at 21.

Brin guided the Hurricane to an 84-yard, 10-play drive and ran the final 18 yards for the first Tulsa score at the 9:17 mark of the 4th quarter. After the Tulsa defense held Tulane to 8 yards in 5 plays, Brin again took the Hurricane down the field and on a 4th-and-15 completed a 19-yard pass to Josh Johnson in the back of the end zone to tie the game at 14-14 with the PAT with 3:16 left in the contest.

Tulane's Amare Jones returned the kickoff 71 yards to the Tulsa 28-yard line and the Green Wave took a 21-14 lead with less than 2 minutes on the clock.

Starting from their own 25-yard line, Tulsa took possession with 1:38 left on the game clock. Brin marched the Hurricane down the field by completing 5-of-8 passes to reach the Tulane 37-yard line with just 0:06 remaining on the clock. Brin took the snap on 3rd-and-7, avoided a tackler and launched a 'Hail Mary' pass to the right corner of the end zone to a waiting JuanCarlos Santana, who went up and brought in the 37-yarder for the TD, sending the game to OT.

For the game, Brin completed 18-of-28 passes for 266 yards and 2 TDs.

Tulsa used a third quarter touchdown and four Zack Long field goals to claim a 19-6 victory over the Navy Midshipmen Saturday afternoon at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

The win clinched Tulsa a spot in the American Athletic Conference Championship game on Dec. 19 against the Cincinnati Bearcats.

The Hurricane defense held the Midshipmen to 6 points, the lowest for a Tulsa opponent since Sept. 10, 2011 when Tulane scored just 3 points. It was also the last time a Tulsa opponent did not score a touchdown.

For the game, Tulsa outgained the Mids, 296 to 153, as the Hurricane had 128 rushing yards and 168 through the air. Corey Taylor II had 69 rushing yards, while Zach Smith completed 10 passes for 168 yards and Tulsa's only TD of the game.

Tulsa's defense totaled 12 TFLs for -49 yards and 5 sacks, as tackle Jaxon Player was a best with a career-high 12 tackles, 4.5 TFLs for -12 yards and 2 sacks.

Tulsa's first touchdown of the game came at the 1:33 mark of the 3rd quarter when Zach Smith connected with Josh Johnson on a 66-yard pass play to take a 13-6 lead into the 4th quarter.

After putting its first points on the board with a field goal at the end of the first half, Navy came out in the second half and marched 14 plays, 60 yards and taking 7:08 off the clock to tie the score at 6-6 with a 32-yard field goal at the 7:08 mark of the period.

Zack Long's third field goal of the day gave Tulsa a 10-point lead at 16-6 on a 37-yarder, capping a 52-yard, 11-play drive. He knocked through his fourth field goal covering 36 yards with 2:54 left in the game.
