THE RUNDOWN

Cincinnati never trailed after the opening minutes to eventually rout CAA champion Hofstra, 79-65, in what was the Pride's second home loss. Landers Nolley II scored in double-figures for the 25th-straight game, scoring 20 for the 12th time this year as well. The Bearcats, who attempted a season-low 14 three-pointers, shot 52.6 percent overall to mark the ninth time above 50 on the season, something they did only once last year.

David DeJulius (15 pts, 9 assists) had his fifth game of nine or more dimes to move within one of third in single-season school history, trailing only Keith LeGree (1996) and Oscar Robertson (twice). He has 16 assists to one turnover in the NIT, and 25 to 3 when counting the two AAC Tourney games, to currently rank third nationally at 3.19. Ody Oguama's 14 points and 11 boards marked his second double-double, with UC moving to 13-1 when one of its players does so. His partner in the post, Viktor Lakhin, scored 16 points against Hofstra for his most (as well as minutes: 28) since UCF on Feb. 4, his last game at full health. Mika Adams-Woods is 10-for-17 from deep over his four AACT/NIT games (58.8 percent), coming at the right time as he has improved his FG% by 9.1 and 3FG% by 10.1 from last year. As a team, UC has a 19.8-11.5 free-throw advantage over the last four games.

With 41 wins at Cincinnati, Wes Miller has the most of any UC coach in his first two years since Ed Jucker (56), which included his 1961 and 1962 national titles. Cincinnati improved to 20-2 when winning the boards and 21-4 when up at the half, while the Hofstra win improved UC to 18-2 when holding its opponent to 69 or below.

CINCINNATI TRADITION

Cincinnati, ranked the No. 9 basketball program all-time by CBS' Matt Norlander in 2019, boasts 1,866 all-time wins, good for No. 12 nationally (both entering the season), with this season marking the 40th of 20-plus wins. The Bearcats have produced 32 All-Americans (last: Jarron Cumberland's Honorable Mention in 2019), 86 All-Conference selections, 57 NBA Draft picks (last: Jacob Evans III in 2018) and 56 members of the 1,000-Point Club. The program has spent 434 weeks ranked in the AP Top 25, 212 in the Top 10 and 45 at No. 1. Jack Twyman and Oscar Robertson are both members of the Basketball Hall of Fame, with Robertson earning a spot on the NBA's 75th-Anniversary Team last fall.

BIG 12-BOUND

Cincinnati in September was announced as one of four new members of the Big 12 Conference. It will join AAC mates Houston and UCF, as well as BYU, for the 2023-24 season.

MILLER'S EXTENSION

Cincinnati announced on Dec. 14 that Wes Miller would receive a two-year contract extension, as well as an increased salary, now through the 2028-29 season.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN 2022-23

Cincinnati has boasted 16 double-doubles, by five different players, so far this season, making UC 13-1 when that happens (Tulane on Feb. 7 as only exception). Skillings' on Dec. 4 marking the first by a true freshman since current Houston Rockets rookie Tari Eason in 2020-21. Cincinnati also has two games (Bryant, ECU) with two double-doubles.

MILLER IN MARCH

This is Miller's sixth 20-win season out of 12 as a head coach. He led UNC Greensboro to the 2018 and 2021 SoCon titles and NCAA bids, in addition to NITs in 2017 and 2019.

TURNOVERS, TOO...

Cincinnati committed only four turnovers in its wins over Detroit Mercy (Dec. 21) and South Florida (Jan. 18), one off the school record. Two of the team's only 14 games with four or fewer turnovers have come this season, and UC has Even in the USF game, the last one came on a mercy decision with seconds left in the 85-69 victory, and the Bearcats did not commit one for the first 27 minutes.

LEARNING HOW TO WIN CLOSE

Cincinnati's first 12 wins were decided by 21.2 ppg, and 17 of the team's 23 have been by double-digits. The Feb. 19 UCF win was the team's fourth win decided by 1-3 points in the Miller tenure, with the others at Miami (Ohio) and East Carolina in 2021-22.

"There are a lot of ways to look at it," Miller said after the ECU game, with the following echoing sentiments he coincidentally made during his midweek press conference. "My favorite wins as a coach are when you can't throw it into the ocean, and you turn it over 17 times, but you guard and you rebound well enough to find a way to win. That shows the character of the team. Believe me, I don't want to turn it over 17 times. I want to shoot it better. But to be in that offensive standpoint, those are the ones you're most proud of."

NOLLEY, DEJULIUS NAMED ALL-AAC

Landers Nolley II (First) and David DeJulius (Third) earned All-AAC honors for the second times of their respective careers. Nolley was a First-Team selection at Memphis in 2021, while DeJulius made the Third-Team in 2022 as well.

Nolley is UC's eighth First-Team honoree in its 10 years in the AAC, as well as the first since Jarron Cumberland and Tre Scott in 2020.

ALL-TIME NIT APPEARANCES

Cincinnati is making its 11th NIT appearance and first since 2010. The Bearcats hold a 7-3 home record (10-10 overall), with their last appearance coming in 2010. UC opened by defeating Damian Lillard and Weber State, 76-62, before falling at home to eventual champion Dayton.

Cincinnati's previous 2010 appearance kicked off what would eventually become a nine-year NCAA run (2011-19). Its 1991 bid also preceded a 1992 NCAA Final Four trip.

Landers Nolley II was the NIT's Most Valuable Player while leading Memphis to the 2021 title.

WELCOME TO THE 1,000 POINT CLUB

David Delulius' three-point dagger with 50 seconds left against UCF (Feb. 4) made him Cincinnati's 55th member of the 1,000-point club, as well as the 35th to reach it in three years or less.

Jeremiah Davenport hit his milestone in the first half of the ECU road game (Feb. 15), going 5-for-5 while making all four of his three-point attempts for a 16-point outburst. Kalu Ezikpe also accomplished the feat at ECU, with 938 coming at Old Dominion.

DOZEN OF DIMES FOR DAVID

David Delulius is on a monster tear in the assists department, including leading the AAC with 6.8 per league game (most by a Bearcat in league play since at least 1992-93). He also had 12 in the first ECU matchup, the first points-assist double-double since Troy Caupain in 2016. His 16-straight games with five or more led the nation, while his 5.3 per game overall serve as the most by a Bearcat since consensus First-Team All-American Steve Logan in 2002.

YOU CAN CALL HIM “CHEZ”

Those listening to Wes Miller interviews will often hear him refer to Landers Nolley as “Chez.” That is a nickname that has followed Nolley since high school and relates to his middle name being Sanchez.

JUICE AND CHEZ: DOUBLE-TROUBLE

Delulius' 30 points in his home-finale win over SMU followed Nolley's 33 against Arizona to open the Maui Invitational, becoming the first UC teammates since Deonta Vaughn (Wofford) and Marvin Gentry (West Virginia) to record 30-plus in the same season.

The duo have also combined for 19, 20-point games this season, including simultaneously in wins over Louisville, Miami (Ohio), South Florida, Temple and SMU.

NOLLEY’S OT OUTBURST VS. TEMPLE

Cincinnati improved to 1-1 in overtime under Wes Miller with an 88-83 win against Temple on Feb. 22, which was also its first OT win since Feb. 2020. Landers Nolley II scored nine of the team's first 11 points in overtime, going 4-for-4 from the field, to end with his ninth 20-point game. UC snapped a three-game losing streak to the Owls, and the last nine meetings (prior to the 84-54 AAC Tourney win) have all been by single-digits for an average of 4.2 ppg.

LAKHIN LOCKS DOWN ON DEFENSE

Viktor Lakhin has taken monumental strides this season after averaging 10.9 minutes as a freshman last year with no starts.

Lakhin's eight blocks at SMU tied for sixth in school history, including the most in the AAC since 2017 and by a Bearcat since Eric Hicks in 2006. His 36 steals are two behind the team lead despite missing three games and only playing seven minutes against Tulane.

His seven blocks against Temple in the AAC Quarterfinals tied the conference's tourney record.

INJURIES LOOM LARGE IN NOLA

Cincinnati's overtime loss to Tulane had more effects than the heartbreaking result. Starting center Viktor Lakhin played just seven minutes before suffering an ankle injury that also kept him out for the South Florida game that Saturday. Point guard and defensive ace Rob Phinisee later tore his patella on the same spot of the floor, which ended his fifth and final season.

A CHANGE WOULD DO YOU GOOD

Landers Nolley II's contagious smile has taken over Clifton, and it's for good reason. He has seen significant improvements this season in minutes (+5.4), field-goal percentage (+7.1), three-point shooting (+8.0), scoring (+6.9 ppg) and rebounds (+1.9), **boasting career-highs in all.** He credits Naismith Hall of Famer Larry Brown with convincing him to play for Wes Miller, despite Brown being one of his coaches at AAC rival Memphis.

“I talk to Coach Larry every day,” Nolley told the Cincinnati Enquirer. “He’s like another father figure in my life. He tells me all types of stuff. He always tells me to take it one day at a time and always have fun while I’m doing it.”

DEJULIUS: ALL-AAC IN 2021-22

DeJulius, named to the league's 2021-22 Third Team and picked to this year's Second-Team, led the Bearcats in scoring (14.5 ppg) and free-throw percentage (82.4 percent, sixth in the AAC), energizing the team on both ends of the floor. The Detroit native produced 10, 20-point games, including seven against AAC foes.

The most-notable element of DeJulius' season were his improvements from 2020-21, namely his jumps in field-goal percentage (4.9 percent), three-pointers (9.4 percent), free-throws (4.9 percent) and scoring (5.4 ppg).

DEJULIUS’ RULES TO LIVE BY

Those familiar with the UC program are aware of David DeJulius' noble mindsets, stemming from his strong

propensity to read and learn. When asked by ESPN's Mark Wise ahead of the Jan. 5 Wichita State game about what advice he would give to his freshman self, given what he knows now, he said:

"Be patient and enjoy the process. I may have rushed a few things mentally and wished that some happened overnight when it was a step-by-step process. There were some things I had to go through to get into the position I'm in now. I wish I had the enjoyment I have now earlier in those stages of my career."

GUARDS ARE MILLER'S FORTE

Wes Miller is one of three active head coaches in Division I to have been at the helm for 10-plus seasons while coaching an All-Conference guard in every season.

BEARCATS DIG THE LONG BALL

Four of Cincinnati's eight games with its most three-pointers in school history have come in the Wes Miller era, highlighted by 17 (tied for third) against Arizona in Maui and in overtime at Tulane, with the 48 tries in the latter tying the school record. Other games include 16 against Tulsa and Memphis last season.

Last year, the program set records for makes (269) and attempts (853), and this year's team has topped that in both.

Cincinnati has made 10-plus three-pointers in 13 games this season, going 9-4 in those. UC's 17 against No. 12 Arizona and Tulane are tied for third in school history.

Landers Nolley II against Virginia Tech became the eighth Bearcat to hit 90 or more in a season. The full UC record book features eight players with 90 or more.

WHO IS "SHOEY?"

Mika Adams-Woods has had the nickname "Shoey" since his AAU days, when he was described as keeping the ball on a string and taking opponents' shoelaces.

He and Jeremiah Davenport are the only four-year members of the program, and he has started a team-high 103 of 120 games played (only non-start in last two years was 2022 Senior Day). Adams-Woods had a 2.81 assist-turnover ratio last season, which ranked 15th nationally and second in the AAC. It was the highest clip since Troy Caupain (3.36 and fifth) in

2016-17. Shoey also had three turnovers over his final seven games, 190 minutes in all.

FRESHMEN PRESSED INTO DUTY

Cincinnati suffered serious blows early in the season on the injury front, and both in the backcourt. John Newman III went down with a meniscus injury in the season opener and has not practiced since.

Fellow fifth-year guard Rob Phinisee injured his foot in practice the day after the NJIT game (Nov. 30) and has also not been able to participate yet. UC not only lost a pair of elite defenders with eight prior years of experience, it has now turned to true freshmen Dan Skillings Jr. and Josh Reed, who have often been on the floor at the same time but have raised eyebrows with their current abilities and future potential.

Reed did not play the first three games and was possibly on the redshirt route.

BRINGING IN WINNERS

Out of the three transfers, all fifth-years, that Cincinnati signed this offseason, all of them have proven track records of success and NCAA Tourney appearances.

Rob Phinisee, an Indiana captain, helped Indiana go 72-57 and make the NCAA Tournament last season, Mike Woodson's first at the school.

Landers Nolley II helped Memphis to a 42-19 ledger over two years, grabbing NIT Most Outstanding Player honors in 2021 as the Tigers claimed the title, then helping Memphis to nearly knocking off No. 1 Gonzaga in last year's NCAA Second Round.

Kalu Ezikpe was also a captain at Old Dominion, helping the Monarchs to a 67-55 record and the 2019 Conference USA title. He improved his scoring, rebounding and minutes in each year of his career.

EYE-OPENING DEBUTS

Three new faces made quite the impression in the team's season-opening win over Chaminade, leading off with Dan Skillings Jr.'s jump-shot block and ensuing fastbreak dunk for his first collegiate points. Nolley made his first three shots and assisted on a triple, accounting for 11 of the team's first 16 points. His 19 were the most by a Bearcat in their debut since Sean Kilpatrick's 21 against Mt. St. Mary's in 2010. To take it back even further, Nolley's career-high was 30 points for Virginia Tech at Clemson (and John Newman III) to open the 2019-20 season.

Rob Phinisee's eight assists (off the bench) were the most for UC since Mike Saunders Jr. against ECU on Jan. 12, 2022. It also tied his career-high, set twice before against Marquette and UC Davis in the first six games of his career at Indiana in 2018.

YOU CAN CALL HIM "CHEZ"

Those listening to Wes Miller interviews will often hear him refer to Landers Nolley as "Chez." That is a nickname that has followed Nolley since high school and relates to his middle name being Sanchez.

LAKHIN EARNS FIRST-CAREER START

Viktor Lakhin, a former AAC Freshman of the Week last December, earned his first start after 29 reserve appearances (10.9 mpg) last season. He finished 3-for-3 from the field with a team-high six rebounds.

Lakhin's torn left meniscus sidelined him the whole 2020-21 season, his first in the States. He has said the academics weren't overly difficult, but it was a matter

of translating to English. Lakhin credits (current Boston College guard) Mason Madsen and Mika Adams-Woods with getting him out of his shell and even said Landers Nolley is his favorite part of the UC program, based on his "always pushing me to do better when I am being sloppy and fighting over the training room table."

DE-FENSE...DE-FENSE...IN DALLAS

Cincinnati turned back the clock to its defensive roots in the 54-52 win at SMU on Jan. 14. First of all, it was the Bearcats' fewest points in a win since 52-49, also at SMU, on Feb. 27, 2019.

The Bearcats totaled 52 rebounds as well, with Landers Nolley (12), Ody Oguama (10) and Viktor Lakhin (10) giving UC its first trio of double-figure boards since 2016. Jeremiah Davenport even added a season-high nine.

Viktor Lakhin stole the defensive show with eight blocks, which tied for sixth in school history (most since Eric Hicks' school-record 10 against Marquette in 2006). His last one was on SMU's game-tying layup attempt, and he was able to corral the rebound with 1.2 seconds left.

Wes Miller, unknowingly, spoke it into existence following the 83-55 win over East Carolina three days prior, saying his favorite wins as a coach are when the team shoots in the 20s or 30s percentage-wise and finds a way to win with defense and rebounding.

GAME 16: FIRST LINEUP CHANGE

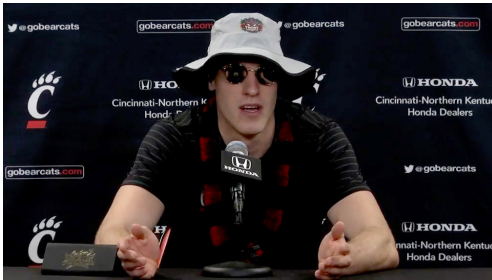
Ody Oguama earned his first start of the season at Wichita State on Thursday, Jan. 5. He had 42 starts at Wake Forest his first two years, then earned his lone one against Memphis last season in place of an injured Abdul Ado, who is now one of the team GAs. Before that substitution, Cincinnati was one of 17 teams nationally (and only in the AAC) to have the same starting five every game till then.

DAVENPORT EXPLODES OFF BENCH

Jeremiah Davenport's team-best 52-game start streak came to an end at Wichita State (Jan. 5), but he responded with season-highs of 22 points and 6-of-9 shooting from deep (previous best was 3). It was the highest-scoring game by a Bearcat reserve since Jarron Cumberland on Jan. 29, 2017 vs. South Florida. Davenport also scored 20 off the bench on Feb. 1 against Tulsa, going 4-for-8 from deep. His two 20-point games this season have been as a reserve (pg. 22), including an 7.4 percent jump in 3FG% since taking on that new role (29.7% to 37.1%).

LAKHIN'S IMPRESSIVE MAUI WEEK

Lakhin was the model of efficiency in Cincinnati's three Maui Invitational games. He scored in double-figures all three contests (13.7 ppg), shooting 69.2 percent from the field, raising his scoring average to 11.0 ppg after averaging 4.2 last season. By comparison, he had three double-figure scoring games for his career ahead of the event.



NOLLEY'S 33-POINT SIGNIFICANCE

Nolley's career-high 33 points against Arizona were not only UC's most since Jarron Cumberland in the 2019 AAC title game over Houston, but also carried major play beyond the arc. He went 9-for-14, tied for second in school history and the most since Deonta Vaughn in 2007 against Coastal Carolina. He is also the only one in the nation with nine treys against a Division I opponent as of Nov. 29.

Nolley and Arizona's Azuolas Tubelis (30) mark the only dueling 30-point regulation games of the season as of Nov. 29. Davidson and Wright State each had one in a double-overtime Nov. 9 contest.

FAMILY IMPORTANT TO NOLLEY

There are multiple layers to Landers Nolley II's story, from one generation to the next. His father played at LSU, and he also has a three-year-old daughter, Promise, with whom he shares a birthday. She even joined him on his recruiting trip this past spring to Cincinnati, which included a trip with the coaching staff to the city's renowned zoo.

Nolley also credits Memphis assistant and Naismith Hall of Fame coach Larry Brown as one of the leading influences for him choosing Cincinnati. He said Brown saw Miller as a "younger version of him," with similar philosophies and teachings.

DEJULIUS GETS FIRST POTW HONOR

David DeJulius led UC in scoring (21.3 ppg), three-point shooting (78 percent), assists (11) and steals (6) as the Bearcats went 3-0 on Opening Week. It was his first such award after claiming six AAC Honor Roll nods over the previous two years, as well as the first under Wes Miller. Lakhin was also a Freshman of the Week in December 2021.

HENSLEY, NEWMAN FOLLOW MILLER

Jarrett Hensley played his freshman season at UCGC under Wes Miller, while John Newman III was committed as a transfer before ultimately following Miller to the Queen City.

ABDUL ADO JOINS STAFF

One year with Wes Miller was all Abdul Ado needed to make enough of an impression to earn a GA spot the following season. Ado, a former four-year starter at Mississippi State and All-SEC defender, played throughout injury all season and provided invaluable veteran leadership through his experience and positive mindset.

His mother, who runs a restaurant in Nigeria, would wake up in the middle of the night to watch his game broadcasts live.

KALU THE ARTIST

Graduate transfer forward Kalu Ezikpe boasts an incredible knack for drawing and painting. This past season, he designed shoes that his Old Dominion coach, Jeff Jones, wore for their annual Coaches vs. Cancer game. Ezikpe's emphasis is on Japanese anime style, and he hopes to one day produce his own animated show.

EZIKPE'S UNCONVENTIONAL PATH

Kalu Ezikpe had his fair share of offers out of high school, ultimately choosing a strong Old Dominion Monarchs' program.

Ezikpe was cut from his eighth-grade middle school

team and asked his parents for a basketball goal from Walmart. The rest has been history.

Ezikpe is also an accomplished artist, first realizing his skill in kindergarten. His speciality is Japanese anime (drawing and painting), and he even designed shoes for ODU coach Jeff Jones to wear in the team's Suits and Sneakers game last season.

TALL TOLENTINO RETURNS HOME

Freshman Sage Tolentino's 7-foot-1 stature matches him for the tallest player in program history. Others include Hayden Koval last year, Chris Vogt (2019-21) and David Nyarsuk (2012-14). Tolentino, however, is the only one to start his career with the Bearcats and was originally an Auburn commit.

Tolentino, a native of Kane'ohe, Hawaii, is eager for his return to the Maui Invitational as well. Along with Ohio State's Justice Sueing (Cal, 2017), he is the first Hawaiian native on a mainland team in the field since Joshua Ko at Pittsburgh in 2014.

WHAT WRIST?

Jarrett Hensley had the most fascinating season's end of anyone on the team, and yet it wasn't realized till it was all over. He broke a bone in his right (non-shooting) hand during the team's penultimate regular-season game at Houston (March 1), but shook it off and played his most inspired ball over the final three contests.

He drove and posterized a defender with a dunk at SMU (out of a season-high 20 minutes), then collected season-highs of seven points and three assists in a first-round AAC win over ECU.

"Jarrett Hensley might work as hard in all facets of development as any player I've ever coached," Miller told The Athletic. "For a couple years I kept saying he's the hardest-working freshman I've ever seen, then the hardest-working sophomore. This will be Year 3, and I've never had a player who is more committed than Jarrett Hensley day to day."

HENSLEY GOES TO SPAIN

Jarrett Hensley got the trip of a lifetime when he competed with USA East Coast, a collegiate all-star team, August in Spain. The team spent two days training at Columbia University before flying out for a three-game series that emulated the 30th anniversary of the Dream Team's run there.

Hensley's teammates ranged from Cal State Northridge to Duke and Providence, with Utah Jazz assistant Alex Jensen serving as the head coach. Hensley totaled 20 points, nine rebounds, four assists and one steal in 35 minutes over the three games.

"Coach Miller and I had an end-of-the-year meeting like how he does with every player," Hensley said. "He brought it up to me about an opportunity to play in Spain, and I was really interested. I knew immediately it would be a good opportunity to play against grown men and meet new people as well to connect with. I was real excited. Shoutout to him for that."

CAPTAIN CLUTCH

David DeJulius claimed his second UC buzzer-beater with a runner (0.2 seconds left) for a 73-71 win at UCF on Feb. 19. He took it himself from the top of the key on a sideline set after UC called timeout with 11 seconds left.

DeJulius knocked down the team's only buzzer-beating-like shot of the season on Jan. 30 at ECU. Trailing by one, he secured an offensive rebound off his own missed runner, dribbled once and rolled one around the rim and in for a 60-59 lead with 3.7 seconds left. ECU, with no timeouts left, missed a contested three from the wing.

DeJulius also banked in a three and connected on the succeeding free-throw for a four-point play with 11 seconds left against Xavier this year.

MORE DEJULIUS DEJA VU

David DeJulius, an old soul with maturity beyond his years, missed a crucial game-tying shot at Temple in 2021-22. Afterwards, he reflected on it, and it seemed to come to fruition when he made that same shot late in the aforementioned UCF game this year.

"I just missed it. Floater is the shot I shot my whole life. I thought it was good," DeJulius said to The Athletic. "It stings a little bit, because I've been in the gym so much working on creating space and my shot, and I didn't really think about it until I got into the locker room, but I feel like my floater was something I maybe neglected in my workouts. So that kind of sucks when you feel like you didn't prepare."

"I don't think I deserved to make that shot, but I'll get back in the gym and make sure everything is working."

"I just feel like if I put the work in, then I can kind of live with the results. But if something happens and I feel I didn't prepare for it, that's when I feel bad about it," DeJulius said. "So if I didn't feel I had neglected my floater in my workouts and I missed that shot, I wouldn't have thought twice about it. It's just something I wanted to emphasize going forward."

PHINISEE THE PHINISHER

You can't talk "clutch" without also mentioning Indiana transfer Rob Phinisee. His buzzer-beating triple in Gainbridge Fieldhouse defeated Butler as a freshman, and twice in his career he had 20 and 18 points in wins over the No. 4 team in the country.

His career-high 20 against Purdue last season was one of his three double-figure scoring games in his final year as a Hoosier, while his 18 at Iowa in the 2020-21 campaign also served as a season-high.

GRANITE STATE GREETINGS

Four different members of the program are alumni of New Hampton Prep in New Hampshire, starting with Wes Miller and assistant coach Mike Roberts, who were teammates for two seasons. The two share an "old married couple" relationship, and in high school the two promised each other they would hire the other if one became a head coach.

Syracuse native Mika Adams-Woods, previously recruited strongly by Miller and Co. at UNC Greensboro, played a season there as well, in addition to first-year graduate assistant Malik Massey, a four-year letterwinner for Miller at UCGC.

MONSTER FACTORY LEGACY

Mike Rehfeldt, UC's Associate Athletic Director for Sports Performance, has become a beacon within the men's basketball program. He first served the Bearcats from 2012-20 before joining Miller's inaugural staff after a one-year stint at UConn.

Rehfeldt's cutting-edge investments go beyond the

plates and into the technology realm. He also helped hire Dillon Frees, the athletics department's first-ever Director of Sports Nutrition.

Notable performers on this year's roster include:

- Rob Phinisee with the fastest 3/4 court sprint time (3.01)
- Jarrett Hensley with the highest max touch (12 feet, 1.5 inches)
- Viktor Lakhin decreasing his body fat by 3.5 percent from last year
- Dan Skillings Jr. adding 15 lbs to his frame since stepping on campus

HOOPS IN THEIR DNA

Jeremiah Davenport is one of four siblings in his family to play collegiate basketball. His mother played at Morehead State, while his brothers Michael (St. Bonaventure), Joshua (Winthrop) and sister Naomi (West Virginia) all played at the Division I level.

Freshman Josh Reed boasts similar bloodlines as well. His mother, Chenoah Turner, played at South Florida and led the Bulls in blocked shots for the 1989-90 season.

PUBLISHED AUTHOR

Few coaches, or anyone in particular, can say they published a book while in school. Wes Miller authored "The Road to Blue Heaven," a diary of his senior season as a Tar Heel.

ROBERTS, MORGAN RECOGNIZED

Assistant coaches Mike Roberts and Andre Morgan were selected to participate in the TopConnect Basketball Virtual Symposium in June, a prestigious program that provides the nation's top assistant coaches with leadership development and networking opportunities.

FALL TOUR OF THE BUCKEYE STATE

UC went on its annual team retreat the weekend of Oct. 14-16, beginning with team dinner in Cincinnati at the Original Montgomery Inn. The Bearcats then went to Columbus, where they bowled, did a quiz show, practiced and ultimately faced Ohio in a closed scrimmage on Sunday.

DOLLAR PROMOTED

Second-year UC coach Chad Dollar earned a promotion this fall to associate head coach. Dollar has built a national reputation at the highest levels of the game.

"He's been the guy whose counsel and advice has really helped me and part of it was, he's earned it," Miller said. "I want him to have the confidence to know that I want him to speak up more, whether it's with our players, whether it's on the court, whether it's in the locker room, or whether it's in staff meetings, or whether it's opening my door, when I need to hear something that maybe I don't want to hear, I want him to know that I have the confidence and I'm putting him in a role that I expected to do that."

BEST GPA IN PROGRAM HISTORY

The Fall 2021 semester saw UC post a 3.484 GPA, its highest ever. All 15 players earned Honor Roll accolades for earning a 3.0, while nine more made the Dean's List with a 3.4 or higher (Mika Adams-Woods, Abdul Ado, Rob Banks, Jarrett Hensley, Hayden Koval, Mason Madsen, Sam Martin, Ody Oguama, Mike Saunders Jr.).

2022-23 CINCINNATI MEN'S BASKETBALL

RULING THE AAC

UC tied fellow departing member Houston with 125 wins in AAC play, more than any other league member since the conference formed prior to the 2013-14 campaign.

The UC men's basketball program has been a member of nine leagues (not including three stints as an independent) during its 121-year history. The Bearcats have 100 or more conference wins in two other leagues: 128 in the Missouri Valley Conference (1957-58 through 1969-70) and 123 in Conference USA (1995-96 through 2004-05).

Cincinnati has claimed three AAC regular-season crowns (2014, 2018, 2020) and two AAC Tournament titles (2018, 2019).

2023-24 ROSTER LOOK-AHEAD

Cincinnati opened its early signing period with the addition of four-star prospects Rayvon Griffith (Cincinnati) and Jizzle James (Orlando, Fla.).

Griffith was UC's first commit of the class and honored during the Dec. 21 Detroit Mercy game. He originally attended Cincinnati's Taft High School before enrolling at Compass Prep in Chandler, Ariz., in the summer. Griffin's 247Sports composite ranking had him as high as No. 54 nationally, including the nation's 11th-best small forward. Griffith led Taft to the Division III state title in Dayton as a junior, and AZ Compass Prep enters this season atop MaxPrep's Independent School Basketball rankings.

James has been rated by 247Sports as the No. 64 player nationally and No. 10 point guard. His father is Pro Football Hall of Famer Edgerrin James, and his brother, Eden, is a running back at Howard. James also attended the Dec. 17 La Salle game and was recognized during a media timeout.

Cincinnati also added DaVeon "Day Day" Thomas, the No. 4 junior-college prospect out of Kilgore CC in Texas (native of Columbia, S.C.).

DAY ONE READY CAMPAIGN

The Day One Ready Campaign launched in November 2021 as a \$100 million fundraising initiative to prepare for the university's upcoming move to the Big 12. The Day One Ready Campaign will raise money to directly boost the Bearcats' abilities to enhance the student-athlete experience and compete for championships in its new conference. The construction of a new indoor practice and performance facility on campus is a key project of the campaign.

SECOND TRIP TO MAUI

Cincinnati made its second-ever trip to the Maui Jim Maui Invitational, with its last one coming in 2009. The Bearcats defeated No. 24 Vanderbilt and No. 21 Maryland before falling in the title game to Gonzaga in that one.

It was Cincinnati's sixth trip to Hawaii, sporting a 10-8 record overall over three cities. Its 1999 Big Island Invitational (Hilo), in which it swept its three-game set, came while ranked No. 1 in the country. UC also played in the 1975, 1989 and 1994 Rainbow Classics in Honolulu.

NOLLEY SAYS "ALOHA!" AGAIN

Landers Nolley II has achieved the rare status of being a repeat visitor to the Maui Invitational, and he has quite the resume and experiences to boot.

As a redshirt-freshman (2019-20) at Virginia Tech, Nolley averaged 19.7 points and 5.7 rebounds per game to earn All-Maui Invitational honors. His 22 points in the opening win over No. 3 Michigan State included a trey in the final minute that made it a four-point lead. Nolley opened the 2022 tournament with a career-high 33 points against Arizona, notching nine threes along the way for the second-most in school history.

LAST TIME OUT

HEMPSTEAD, N.Y. -- Efficient shooting (52.6 percent) and dominance on the boards (42-27) powered Cincinnati to a 79-65 win at Hofstra on Saturday afternoon, advancing the Bearcats to the NIT quarterfinals.

UC, which will play at either Colorado or Utah Valley next week at a date to be announced, was playing its first road NIT game since Oklahoma in 1991. The Bearcats went to the NCAA Final Four the next season.

Cincinnati held a 22-13 lead through the under-12 timeout, including a 13-4 difference on the boards. UC started 12-for-17 from inside the arc, notching its first three-pointer on David Delulius' corner bucket at 5:00 that opened a 31-25 lead.

Back-to-back Hofstra treys tied it at 31 at the 3:42 media timeout, and Mika Adams-Woods hit Ody Oguama for an alley-oop on the in-bounds to regain the lead.

UC (23-12, 11-7 AAC) made three in a row from deep, after missing its first six, to lead 39-32 late in the half.

Cincinnati led 40-37 at the break and gained its largest margin at 55-45 on Adams-Woods' halfcourt steal and finger-roll layup at 11:51. The senior's second trey of the game at 7:47 extended UC's advantage to 66-53.

UC never trailed after the opening minutes. Hofstra was 6-for-11 from deep in the first half but went 1-for-10 in the second.

Landers Nolley II led UC with 20 points, his 12th game with 20 or more this year. Ody Oguama notched his second double-double of the season with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

Hofstra (25-10, 16-2 CAA) was the Colonial Athletic Association regular-season champ and had lost once at home all year prior. It opened NIT play with an overtime win at No. 1 seed Rutgers.

FROM WES MILLER

"I told our guys before the game that we are playing a team that went 16-2 in a mid-major conference. I spent 10 years in the Southern Conference, which is similar to the Colonial, and if you go 16-2 and win the regular season, you're a heck of a team. That's one heck of a basketball team. Our guys showed a lot of maturity taking them seriously. I thought we got back the last couple of days to what we've been about all year. I was happy as a clam that we had a great day of practice yesterday. I liked how we came out and defended in the second half. I could keep talking about our guys, but they gave great effort. Ody set a tone on the offensive and defensive glass and gave us a punch on our ball-screen defense... like Landers and David have been all year, they made plays on offense."

2010 NIT RECAP

CINCINNATI HEAD COACH WES MILLER

Wes Miller was named the 28th University of Cincinnati men's basketball head coach on April 14, 2021 after a decade as the head coach at UNC Greensboro.

On Dec. 14, 2022, the university's Board of Trustees approved a two-year extension to his current contract that would keep him one of the nation's best young coaches in Clifton through 2028-29.

The 2021-22 season saw Miller become the first UC coach to start his tenure 5-0, and the fifth win was a 71-51 dismantling of No. 14 Illinois in Kansas City. It marked the Bearcats' largest margin-of-victory over a ranked opponent since 2011. David DeJulius earned Third-Team All-AAC honors as well. The team improved in many categories following its 12-11 campaign the year before, including its national rankings in turnovers per game (27 from 267) and field-goal defense (35 from 186) among many others. Not only that, UC set a program record in the fall semester with a 3.484 GPA, seeing nine student-athletes earn Dean's List accolades as well.

"I am incredibly excited to welcome Wes into the Bearcats family," Cunningham said upon Miller's hiring. "He is an extremely dynamic coach and mentor who impressed me with his drive, focus and attention to detail. He's a proven winner as a head coach and was able to rebuild a program and lead a remarkable turnaround at UNCG over the last decade. We cast a very wide net in this search and Wes emerged as the right coach to lead the Bearcats into the future."

Regarded as one of the top young coaches in college basketball, Miller built UNC Greensboro into perennial championship and NCAA Tournament contenders, was named as ESPN.com's No. 1 Coach Under 40 in May 2020 and also was tabbed for The Athletic's 40 Under 40 list a year ago. His 185-career wins coming into the 2021-22 season also put him in the national lead for coaches under 40, ahead of LSU's Will Wade (177) and New Mexico's Richard Pitino (159).

"I'm absolutely thrilled to be the head coach at the University of Cincinnati," Miller said. "I'm thankful for President Pinto and (AD) John Cunningham for bringing me into the Bearcats family. I am honored to lead such a storied program and excited to get to work. I also can't thank UNCG enough because I wouldn't be here without my players and athletic director Kim Record. This last decade coaching the Spartans has been extremely rewarding."

Miller's collegiate head coach and mentor Roy Williams had high praise for his former player.

"Wes Miller is one of the most outstanding young coaches in our game and what he did at UNC Greensboro makes me believe he is THE most outstanding," Williams said. "As a player

at North Carolina he came closer to reaching his full potential than any player I've ever coached. His energy, his determination, his intelligence and his care for young people convinces me that he will continue at that level. I am so happy for him and the University of Cincinnati Basketball program and I look forward to being in the stands!"

AT UNCG

- The Spartans all-time winningest head coach, Miller totaled 185 wins in 10 seasons with four Southern Conference Regular-Season Championships. Over the last five years, UNCG has five-straight 20-win seasons, two NCAA Tournament appearances, two NIT appearances, two Southern Conference Tournament Championships, 125 wins and 70-20 record in conference play.
- UNCG won 21 games during the 2020-21 season along with the SoCon regular season and tournament championship and earned its second NCAA Tournament appearance in four years.
- The Spartans won 20 or more games in each of the last five seasons, including a program record 29 in 2018-19. Miller led UNCG to NCAA Tournament appearances in 2017-18 and 2020-21.

AS AN ASSISTANT COACH

- Miller, who also spent the 2010-11 season as an assistant coach at UNCG, also spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Elon and High Point. Miller also ran his own basketball camps in Charlotte and Greensboro for two summers.

PLAYING DAYS

- In three seasons as a player at North Carolina under Coach Williams, Miller helped the Tar Heels to the national championship in 2005, two Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season championships and one ACC Tournament title.
- He was team captain as a senior in 2006-07, leading UNC to 31 wins and the NCAA Elite 8 as well as the ACC regular-season and tournament titles, and a final No. 3 national ranking.
- A fan favorite at UNC, Miller authored a book entitled The Road to Blue Heaven, which was published as a diary of his experiences as a North Carolina basketball player.
- In addition to his success on the floor, Miller excelled off the court, earning ACC Academic Honor Roll recognition and the UNC Athletic Director's Scholar Athlete-Award. He earned his degree in political science from North Carolina in 2007.
- Upon his graduation from North Carolina, Miller played one season of professional basketball for the London Capitals of the British Basketball League, where he averaged 19.6 points per game to rank eighth in the league.
- Miller was a prep standout at the New Hampton School in New Hampshire. He earned a scholarship to James Madison University, where he played one season before transferring to North Carolina to become a walk-on for Coach Williams' squad.
