#### **CINCINNATI HEADS TO WVU FOLLOWING FIRST BIG 12 WIN**

- Cincinnati will travel to Milan Puskar Stadium in Morgantown, W. Va. to face the West Virginia Mountaineers at 2:30 p.m. ET on Saturday for the 21st time ever and the first matchup since 2011.
- The Bearcats and Mountaineers played in several epic games, meeting every year from 2005 to 2011. These games featured big performances from legends from both teams, including Mardy Gilyard, Jason Kelce, Pat McAfee, Tony Pike, Isaiah Pead, Geno Smith and Pat White among several stars.
- The Bearcats are coming off a 24-14 victory at Houston on Saturday that gave UC its first Big 12 Conference win. Cincinnati is 2-2 on the road this season, beating Pitt 27-21 a week before WVU defeated the Panthers, 17-6, in Morgantown.
- The Bearcats (223.3 rush ypg) and the Mountaineers (213.8) will feature the Big 12's No. 2 and No. 3 rushing offenses.
- WVU is led by CB Beanie Bishop, who leads the nation with 23 passes defended (19 PBUs and four INTs).
- WVU was picked to finish last in the Big 12, but started 4-1 and has a 6-4 overall mark and 4-3 record in the Big 12.
- Mountaineers head coach Neal Brown faced Scott Satterfield three times when he was coaching at Troy and Satterfield was
  leading Appalachian State from 2015 to 2018. Satterfield's App State teams finished 3-0 against Troy during that stretch,
  including a 44-41 triple-overtime win in 2015 and a 21-10 victory to clinch a berth in the 2018 Sun Belt Championship Game.

#### RIVALRY RENEWED

- The Bearcats and Mountaineers will play for the 20th time ever and first time since UC took a 24-21 loss at Paul Brown Stadium on Nov. 12, 2011 when Tony Miliano's FG attempt was blocked as time expired. Geno Smith threw for 372 yards to lead WVU, while Isaiah Pead rushed for 113 yards and two touchdowns for the Bearcats.
- The last time UC and WVU played in Morgantown, the Mountaineers cruised to a 37-10 win on Nov. 13, 2010.
- The last time Cincinnati beat WVU came in a 24-21 win on Nov. 13, 2009 inside Nippert Stadium. An injured Tony Pike threw
  two touchdowns off the bench while splitting time at quarterback with Zach Collaros, while Pead rushed for 175 yards. Both
  Travis (backup TE) and Jason Kelce (starting LG) played in the game for UC. The win kept UC perfect at 10-0.
- The last time UC won in Morgantown came in a 26-23 overtime victory on Nov. 8, 2008 in which Mardy Gilyard returned the
  opening kickoff 100 yards for a TD and Pike tossed two touchdowns in his return from a broken arm. WVU's Pat McAfee drilled
  a 52-yard FG as time expired to send the game to overtime.

#### **COMPLIMENTARY FOOTBALL LEADS UC TO 24-14 WIN OVER HOUSTON**

- The Bearcats' defense held the Big 12's fifth-ranked passing attack to just 102 yards through the air, and RB Corey Kiner
  rushed for 129 yards and two TDs on a career-high 23 carries to lead Cincinnati to a 24-14 victory at Houston last Saturday to
  snap a seven-game losing streak and give the Bearcats their first Big 12 Conference victory.
- DB Deshawn Pace, LB Dorian Jones and DB Ken Willis each had interceptions of Houston QB Donovan Smith.
- Punter Mason Fletcher put all three of his punts inside the 21-yard line, including one that was downed at the 5 to seal the win.

#### KINER EYES 1,000, POWERS NATION'S NO. 5 RUSHING ATTACK

- · Cincinnati ranks second in the Big 12 and fifth nationally with 223.3 rush yards per game, up from 93rd last year at 129.7.
- UC has run for 200 or more yards in eight of 10 contests, including 204 at Houston.
- Junior Corey Kiner has rushed for 885 yards and five TDs on 161 carries, moving him just 115 yards shy of the 20th 1,000-yard season in Cincinnati history. He looks to become the 13th different Bearcat to break the 1,000-yard barrier.
- Kiner has five 100-yard games this season, which is tied with Jerome Ford (2021) for 12th-most in a single-season at UC.
- Four different Bearcats have rushed for 100 yards in a game this season: Kiner (five times), Ryan Montgomery (twice), Myles Montgomery (once) and Emory Jones (once).
- Myles Montgomery's 6.6 yards per carry average is the highest among the Big 12's top 30 rushers and he is the third-highest-rated running back in the Big 12 according to Pro Football Focus (84.7).
- Cincinnati's 223.3 average is the second-most by a Bearcats team over the last 30 years (239.5 2018).
- All five starters on UC's offensive line have at least one year of eligibility left, and redshirt junior Luke Kandra is the nation's highest-graded right guard (79.3), according to Pro Football Focus. His 762 snaps are the most of P5 guard this season.

#### QUICK NOTES

- All 11 offensive starters in the season opener were starting their first game ever for UC. C Gavin Gerhardt is the only returning
  offensive starter for the Bearcats. He did not start Game 1, but he has started the last seven contests.
- The Cincinnati wide receiver room returned just one scholarship receiver in redshirt junior Chris Scott.
- After the 2022 season, Cincinnati had 15 players enter the transfer portal and leave the program and another 17 either graduated or declared for the NFL Draft. The Bearcats brought in 23 college transfers for this fall.
- · Cincinnati is 662-605-50 (.521) all-time and is playing its 136th football season in 2023 (since 1885, one of 10 oldest in FBS).
- Sixth-year senior defensive end Malik Vann rates as the Big 12's No. 3 top edge (77.2) according to PFF.
- Cincinnati's defense is allowing only 133.5 passing yards per game over the last two games.

Following the game, a complete postgame statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics, substitution chart, postgame quotes from both head coaches and players and postgame notes.

Head Coach Scott Satterfield will be available to the media every Tuesday at noon ET during the season with the exception of UC's bye week. The press conference is streamed live on ESPN+ and @GoBearcats. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaching staff.

On gameday, media should park in Clifton Court Garage and enter Nippert Stadium through Gate J.

Inside Paul Brown Stadium, UC was handed its first BIG EAST loss of the season after failing to stop a fourth quarter comeback from the Mountaineers. Senior quarterback Zach Collaros went 7-of-11 for 70 yards before leaving the game due to injury midway through the second quarter, while backup quarterback Munchie Legaux completed 10-of-21 passes for 144 yards and one rushing touchdown. Senior running back Isaiah Pead finished with 19 rushes for 113 yards and two touchdowns, while senior JK Schaffer leads with nine tackles. The UC defense had 18 tackles for loss and held WVU to just 32 rushing yards. Current Seattle Seahawks quarterback Geno Smith threw for 372 yards and one touchdown.

#### **BIG ADJUSTMENTS FOR BIG 12**

- · As Cincinnati claimed its first Big 12 win, some reflection is necessary on the uphill climb to the Power 5 ranks.
- The four new teams (three from AAC, one from independence) are 7-21 overall in the league.
- · Scott Satterfield is the only coach out of the 14 in his first year at the school, coupled with 33 scholarship newcomers.

#### WON ALL THREE PHASES AT HOUSTON

- · Cincinnati's 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to open the Houston game set the tone on a cool Saturday night.
- · UC's defense posted season-lows of 241 yards and 12 first downs, helping the Bearcats to their sixth game of outgaining their opponent by 100 or more yards.
- · The defense had three interceptions, its most turnovers forced since Week 1, and held UH to just 102 yards passing. The Cougars entered the game averaging 263 ypg.
- Led by Corey Kiner (129 yards), UC had its fourth-straight 200-yard rushing performance and eighth overall.
- Mason Fletcher placed two of his three punts inside the 20, including one to the 5 late in the game before the Bearcats' final game-sealing INT. He has put 19 of his 35 attempts inside the 20 with no touchbacks on the year.

#### BY RUSH AND BY PASS

- · In nine full seasons as an FBS head coach, Satterfield's rush offense has always averaged at least 200 yards per game and his teams have ranked in the Top 30 nationally in rushing every year. Louisville's offense was the only FBS program to average both 200 yards passing and 200 yards rushing each of the last four seasons.
- Cincinnati has outgained its opponent in eight of 10 games this year.

#### **KINER CRACKS 100 FOR SIXTH TIME**

- · Cincinnati native and 2020 Ohio Mr. Football honoree Corey Kiner had game-highs of 105 and 153 yards against EKU and Pitt to open the season, the latter being a career-high that he surpassed by halftime. His 68-yard first-quarter run at Pitt was a career-long as well.
- Kiner also helped carry the offense against Baylor (129), UCF (114) and Houston (129) His other 100-plus game was against at Tulsa in 2022.
- · Kiner has six rushes for 20-plus yards.
- · He had a career-best 23 carries and a career-high two TDs at Houston as well as a 62-yard run - his secondlongest ever.
- · He had just 16 carries over his final four games last year.
- Kiner had 79 carries for 324 yards and two TDs for LSU as a freshman in 2021.

#### **KINER'S QUEST FOR 1,000**

- · Corey Kiner has 885 rushing yards this season, and needs just 115 yards for the 20th 1,000-yard season in UC history. He can become the 13th different Bearcat to accomplish the feat, too.
- Cincinnati has boasted three 1,000-yard rushers since 2018. Emerging Cleveland Browns star Jerome Ford was the last to reach it in 2021 with 1,319.

#### **LEARNING LICHTENBERG**

- · Redshirt sophomore QB Brady Lichtenberg has flashed potential the last three weeks, including a few first-half drives in the last two.
- He went 3-for-5 for 50 yards, the last a 35-yard completion to Xzavier Henderson, in the second quarter against UCF.
- Lichtenberg's first Big 12 action came at Oklahoma State, going 5-for-9 for 48 yards in the fourth guarter.
- He found Aaron Turner for a 21-yard TD pass against the sideline, each of their second scores of the season. Lichtenberg also posted a career-long 16-yard rush.
- The Toledo native also boasts UC's longest play from scrimmage: a 65-yard TD to freshman Barry Jackson, Jr. in the opener vs. EKU.
- He is 12-for-21 for 131 yards over UC's last three games, completing passes for 20 yards or more in each of those.

#### **NEW. RECENT STARTERS ON DEFENSE**

- · Nine defensive players have made their first-career starts this season, including true freshman CB Rayquan Adkins at Houston, Adkins become the first true freshman to start at CB since Sauce Gardner in 2019.
- Seven of those began their careers at UC; the other two are DBs DJ Taylor (Arizona State) and Jordan Young (Florida).
- · Antwan Peek Jr. made his first career start at safety at OSU. The redshirt freshman joined UC as a walk-on from Indian Hill High School in Cincinnati last season.
- RS freshman Jonathan Thompson started three-straight October games at linebacker. He had 22 tackles with 2.0 for loss, including 13 stops and two QB hurries over those latter two
- CB Kalen Carroll got his first-career starting nod against UCF, breaking up two passes.

### **NUMBERS TO KNOW**

Deshawn Pace, despite missing the Oklahoma game, has shot up to the team lead in tackles (64) and TFLs (10.0), which includes 8.5 in Big 12 play to rank third. He also has 4 PBUs over that stretch.

Cincinnati is fifth nationally with 223.3 rush yards per game (second in Big 12). It was 93rd last year at 129.7. Four Bearcats have combined for nine 100-yard rushing games, including QB Emory Jones.

Fifth-year senior Ryan Montgomery is averaging 6.1 yards per rush and has two 100-yard games, while playing only five full games in 2023. He is 10 yards away from 1.000 for his career

Mason Fletcher has sent 19 of his 35 punts this season (54.3 percent) inside the 20-yard line, which ranks first in the Power 5. He only has four touchbacks out of 144 boots in his career.

Corey Kiner needs 115 yards (or 57.5 ypg) to become the 13th Bearcat to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. UC has had 19 different 1,000 yard rushing seasons all-time with Jerome Ford (1,319) accomplishing the feat last in 2021.

#### **HOMETOWN HEROS**

- A dozen players from Cincinnati appeared on the seasonopening two-deep on offense and defense.
- 26 players from Ohio are also on the initial two-deep.
- This speaks to the program's philosophy to heavily recruit "the State of Cincinnati" and the 50-mile radius around campus.
- UC also features Cincinnati native and legendary Colerain High School coach Kerry Coombs on staff as the cornerbacks coach and special teams coordinator.

#### **RUN GAME HEATS UP**

- Cincinnati's 2,233 rush yards are its most through the first 10 games of a season since 2018.
- The Bearcats have run for 200-plus yards in eight of their 10 contests, and this is the first season UC has had three games of two 100-yard rushers. There have been nine instances overall among four different players in 2023.
- Myles Montgomery had scores of 38 and 63 yards in backto-back games versus Baylor and Oklahoma State, both season-longs. The 63 at OSU marked UC's second-longest rush (Corey Kiner, 68, Pitt). His 84.4 PFF rating is third by all running backs in the Big 12.
- Kiner (129) and Montgomery (103) became the second pair of teammates to both rush for 100 yards in a game this season in the 32-29 loss to Baylor.
- UC's next home game, UCF, marked the third instance, but this time with Kiner (19-114) and Ryan Montgomery (8-113).
- Ryan Montgomery's career-high 104 rush yards, paired with Emory Jones' 101 against Miami (OH) marked UC's first 100-yard rushing duo since Gerrid Doaks and QB Desmond Ridder against Houston in 2020.
- Cincinnati is 5th nationally with 223.3 rush yards per game. The Bearcats were 93rd last season at 129.7.

#### **HELLO AGAIN, RYAN MONTGOMERY**

- Fifth-year senior running back Ryan Montgomery had seven carries for 17 yards the first two games, before going for a career-high 104 yards on 20 attempts against Miami (Ohio). His first two carries went for 27 yards.
- His 113 rushing yards (on only eight carries) against UCF came in his first action since Oklahoma on Sept. 23. He broke off a season-long 29-yard gain as well.
- His 688 punt-return yards are third in UC history.

#### THE X(ZAVIER) FACTOR

- Xzavier Henderson is eighth in the Big 12 with 4.8 receptions per game. His 48 overall have already surpassed his team-leading total at Florida in 2022.
- His 53-yard catch-and-run at Oklahoma State was a season-long and trailed only his 78-yarder against national-champ Georgia in 2022.
- 34 of his 48 catches are at home this year, for 465 yards.
   He had a career-high nine catches by halftime against Miami (Ohio) and finished with 12, which tied the fourth most in UC history and most since Kahlil Lewis at SMU in 2018. He also had team-highs of 7 catches for 74 yards at BYU.
- Henderson totaled a career-best 149 yards on a career-best-tying seven catches vs. EKU, including the first TD of the 2023 season for the Bearcats a 49-yard touchdown on a 4th-and-5 pass from Emory Jones. He added 26 yards on kick returns to lead all Big 12 players with 174 yards of all-purpose yards during Week 1 action.
- He was PFF's highest-graded receiver (92.5) in Week 1.
- A transfer from Florida, Henderson was a coveted recruit who held offers from Alabama, Georgia and LSU among others. He won the Florida 4A state 400m title in a blazing fast 46.77 time and was a U.S. Army All-American.

#### **KANDRA: NATION'S TOP RG (PFF)**

- Redshirt junior right guard Luke Kandra has cemented himself as a top guard and one of the top linemen in the Big 12 in his first season back home.
- The Cincinnati native transferred to the Bearcats this season following three years in the Louisville program.
- Kandra is UC's highest-graded offensive lineman overall (92%) and leads the team with 67 knockdowns. He has not recorded a penalty and has yielded only two sacks in 10 games. His 762 snaps are the most of any P5 guard in the nation.
- Kandra's 79.3 PFF grade has him as the No. 2 overall guard and No. 4 offensive lineman in the Big 12, in addition to the top Power 5 right guard.
- He was named to The Athletic's Midseason All-Transfer Team on Oct. 20. All-conference and All-America caliber right guard who has started all 10 games.
- Naturally, he has been UC's highest-graded OL in eight of 10 games, paving the way for the nation's No. 5 rushing offense (223.3 yards per game).

### PACE RETURNING TO FORM RECENTLY

- Deshawn Pace has been a lightning bolt for the Bearcats' defense over his five games since missing Oklahoma.
- The senior is sixth in the Big 12 in league-games only despite that absence with 8.3 tackles per game.
- He is third in the Big 12 in conference-only games with 1.42 TFLs per game.
- Pace's second-quarter interception at Houston was the sixth of his career, leading all current Bearcats.
- Pace was a key catalyst on the 2021 CFP team as a first-

time starter, recording 95 tackles (9.5 for loss) with a teamhigh four interceptions and a blocked field goal.

#### **BIG PLAY-ER CHAMON METAYER**

- TE Chamon Metaver has made the most of his touches this year, including on special teams.
- · His two touchdown grabs, on 27 and 23 yards, against BYU marked the first multi-TD game by a tight end since Josh Whyle in 2021.
- · Metayer added a 20-yard touchdown catch against Iowa State as well, tving him for the team-lead with three scores.
- · Metayer's number was also called for a 27-yard fake-punt keeper deep inside Miami territory on UC's final regulation drive in that game.
- · Metayer has parlayed his big-game efficiency into threestraight games of career-high receptions, most recently with 5 for 50 yards against Baylor.
- · His lone 2022 catch went for 32 yards as well.

#### HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the 2023 football season, selling more than 25,300 to set a new school record in August.
- · It's the second time in history that UC has sold out of season tickets.
- · Last season, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season
- Cincinnati has sold out 17 consecutive home games dating back to the third home game of 2021, as well.

#### **CINCINNATI DEFEATS RIVAL PITT**

- · UC's 27-21 win at Pittsburgh was its third-straight against the Panthers, fifth out of the last six and third-straight in Heinz Field/Acrisure Stadium.
- · Corey Kiner ran for a career-high 153 yards, which included a 68-yard rush that was both his career-long and UC's biggest of the young season. Emory Jones also threw two touchdown passes.
- The ever-stingy Bearcats defense held Pitt to 10-of-32 passing (31.3), their best mark since UCLA and Dorian Thompson-Robinson went 8-for-26 in the 2019 opener, a 24-14 UC win.
- · Senior Justin Harris had four pass breakups in his first start, and Jack Dingle had a career-high seven tackles. Dingle's first-career sack came on Pitt's final fourth-down attempt.
- · Cincinnati improved to 4-2 since 2018 in road games against P5 opponents (wins against Pitt, Notre Dame, Indiana, UCLA).

#### **NEW CONTRIBUTORS STEP UP VS. OU**

- · The Bearcats' defense was up to the challenge in not only its first Big 12 game, but against still-undefeated Oklahoma. Its 10 points in each half, as well as 20 total, marked its fewest since Nov. 12, 2022.
- · DB Ken Willis earned his first-career start against Oklahoma in place of Deshawn Pace at the star position, finishing with a career-high nine tackles.
- · LB Dorian Jones, who started seven games over the last two years for Satterfield and DC Bryan Brown at Louisville. had a career and UC season-high 13 tackles.
- · S Bryon Threats forced a fumble in the first quarter, his third forced turnover (two picks as well) this season.
- · S Taj Ward produced career-highs of nine stops and two for loss.

#### TWO ALL-AMERICANS RETURN...

- Redshirt sophomore defensive tackle Dontay Corleone burst onto the national scene in 2022, earning Third Team All-American honors from the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus. He was famously nicknamed "The Godfather," and rated PFF's top defensive player in the country for 2022 (94.7) and the No. 2 returning interior defensive lineman for 2023. His 94.7 percent run-grade was the best by PFF since Micah Parsons in 2019 and the fifth-highest for a single season by a defensive lineman, edge or linebacker since 2014. The Cincinnati Colerain High School product tallied 45 tackles, 5.5 TELs, three sacks, two fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles in 2022.
- Corleone was also named the No. 7 draft-eligible DT underclassman by The Athletic's Dane Brugler in the
- Junior Mason Fletcher also collected Third Team All-American honors from the AP and was a Ray Guy Award finalist. He will arguably the top returning punter in the country after earning AAC Special Teams Player of the Year honors and ranking fifth in the country with a 46.2average. The Melbourne, Australia native booted 14 50+ punts and his long of 84 yards set against SMU shattered the Cincinnati and AAC record for longest punt.

#### ...AND THEY'RE LIVING UP TO IT

- Dontay Corleone made his presence known in the Oklahoma backfield, notching a career-high two TFLs and recording his fifth-career sack.
- · Corleone also had five tackles and his first-career PBU in the lowa State game.
- · He is second on the team in sacks (3.5) and TFL (5.5), all as an interior lineman.

#### **MASON FLETCHER: NATION'S BEST?**

- Junior punter Mason Fletcher ranked fourth in the nation and second in the AAC with a 46.2 average in 2022 and was named to the Ray Guy Award watch list, in addition to multiple Preseason All-America honors.
- He has 35 punts for a 43.7-yard average in 2023, with 19 inside the 20 (and six inside the 10) with no touchbacks. He has only four TBs out of 147 for his entire career.
- 29 of his 62 punts (47%) in 2022 were downed inside the 20-vard line with 12 downed inside the 10.
- He has bettered that percent to 54% of his punts being down inside the 20 so far in 2023 (19 of 35) - which leads
- He has 24 punts of 50+ and three 60-yarders, including a school and AAC record 84 at SMU in 2022.
- His 65.0 average at SMU also set AAC and UC records and gave Fletcher AAC Special Teams honors.
- · The Melbourne, Australia native faced his brother, Max Fletcher, a freshman punter for Arkansas, in the 2022 season opener at Arkansas. Mason and Max's parents, Dustin and Suzanne, flew from Australia for the game. It marked the first time in nearly two years that Mason had seen his brother and mother. Fletcher's father, Dustin, a 23-year veteran in Australian Rules Football, came to the 2021 Cotton Bowl.

#### **PERMANENT CAPTAINS**

Head coach Scott Satterfield announced four permanent captains for the 2023 season on Sunday, Aug. 27 - the start of the first game week.

- Scott Satterfield's offenses have been among the nation's best during his time at Appalachian State, Louisville, and now, Cincinnati.
- · The Satterfield-led 66-point offense explosion against EKU is tied for the second most points scored in his coaching career and is the sixth time his offense has scored more than 60 points in a game. In his second year at the helm of Appalachian State (2014) he led the Mountaineers to a 66-0 victory over Campbell. His most recent 60-point win was during his tenure at Louisville as the Cardinals defeated Duke 62-22 in 2021.
- It also marks the 12th time a Satterfield-coached team has amassed 600 yards of total offense in a game.

#### MARRIED BRIGGS LEADS DEFENSE

- Fifth-year senior Jowon Briggs leads UC with 27 career starts at Cincinnati. A former Walnut Hills High School star, he originally played at Virginia, where he started 14 games over two seasons and was a Midseason Freshman All-American in 2019.
- He came up huge in the Pitt game with his first sack of the season and a pair of TFLs.
- In 2022, he started all 13 games and finished with 61 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and three sacks en route to All-AAC First Team honors.
- · Briggs has a degree in interdisciplinary studies with a focus on physics and music. He will have his certificate in computer science in December
- · He and his wife, Nyjae, have three children, Jowon, Reine and new-born baby Zane (born Aug. 25, 2023).

#### MALIK VANN: SCHOLAR-ATHLETE

- Sixth-year Bearcat Malik Vann was named a semifinalist for the NFF's Campbell Trophy.
- Vann is also the No. 3 edge defender in the Big 12 this season with an 77.2 rating by PFF.
- Vann entered the year on the watch list for the Reese's Senior Bowl and Comeback Player of the Year. He has held prior captain duties, including at the 2022 Wasabi Fenway Bowl while injured.
- The Fairfield HS alumnus has played in 59 games with 12 starts, totaling 23.5 TFLs and 10.5 sacks. He played only two games last season before suffering a season-ending injury.

#### SATTERFIELD ERA STARTS FAST

- Cincinnati scored the ninth-most points (66), totaled the seventh-most yards (667) and tossed for the sixth-most passing yards (438) in school history in the season-opening 66-13 win over EKU.
- · The first TD of the Satterfield era couldn't be more fitting. On fourth-and-5 from midfield, Satterfield dialed up a 49-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Emory Jones to wide receiver Xzavier Henderson for the first score of the season.

#### THAT'S A LOT OF YARDS

- · Freshman Barry Jackson Jr. scored on a 65-yard catchand-run from redshirt-sophomore Brady Lichtenberg on his first-career reception, capping a historic offensive performance.
- The 667 yards were seventh in school history, while the 66 points were ninth and the most since 2013. The program record for the latter is 124 against Transylvania in 1912.
- Satterfield now has 12 games of 600-plus yards as a head coach. While at Louisville, he had 687 against Duke in 2021 and 600-plus against BC and Syracuse in 2019.

#### **JONES NAMED BIG 12 POTW**

- · Jones was named the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week and Newcomer of the Week on Monday following his seven-touchdown performance in his Bearcats' debut on Saturday in the 66-13 victory over EKU.
- Jones had more touchdown passes (five) than incompletions (four) and finished 19-of-23 for 345 yards and five touchdowns with no interceptions through the air. He added two rushing scores and 26 yards on the ground.
- While at UF, he was the SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week following a standout performance in a win over Tennessee in 2021. He led the Gators to a 38-14 victory over the Volunteers by totaling 209 yards and two touchdowns passing and 144 yards rushing.
- Saturday marked the second seven-touchdown game of Jones' career, as well. He totaled seven touchdowns (six passing, one rushing) during a 550-total-yard performance against Samford in 2021.

#### BRADEN SMITH TAKES TO THE AIR

- · Louisville transfer wide receiver Braden Smith is not only a 4.4 40-yard dash extraordinaire; the 23-year-old is a certified pilot. He took up the journey shortly after his three-catch, 45-yard Fenway Bowl performance against Cincinnati in December.
- · Smith's long-term goals include flying cargo for UPS or FedEx, but says he remains open to airlines.
- "I just enjoy the thrill of being hands-on and being in control and going through procedures and things of that nature," Smith said to the Cincinnati Enquirer. "The first time I went up I was kind of shakin' at the knees. I didn't know what to expect. Luckily, I had a really good instructor and was able to keep flying. I got more confident with it, and once I was able to get my license, I really built up that confidence in myself."
- Smith, who had a 48-yard touchdown catch in his debut against EKU, had 59 receptions for 653 yards for Louisville from 2020-22 after transferring from Northwest Mississippi CC.

### **GET TO KNOW THE BEARCATS**

- The University of Cincinnati Department of Athletics competes at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics with the vision to reach Next Level Success for all 18 varsity teams and more than 450 student-athletes. The Bearcats have a proud athletics history, winning eight national championships and 118 conference titles. The Cincinnati men's basketball team is among the 15 winningest programs all-time, while the football team became the first non-Power Five program to compete in the College Football Playoff in 2021. Olympic gold medalist volleyball player Jordan Thompson, NBA Hall of Famer Oscar Robertson and Major League Baseball legend Sandy Koufax are among the several luminaries who have competed as Bearcats.
- The Bearcats entered a new era as a Power Five School on July 1 when they officially joined the Big 12 Conference, positioning Cincinnati among the nation's premier athletics programs.
- Off the field, UC student-athletes continue to find success, collectively posting a 3.4 GPA in spring 2023 with 78% earning spots on the Honor Roll.
- Under the leadership of Director of Athletics John Cunningham, and supported by more than 150 full-time staff members, UC Athletics' mission is to connect our community, enhance our university and impact the lives

of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world on and off the field.

#### **100 YEARS OF NIPPERT AT NIGHT**

- · This season marks the 100th anniversary of Cincinnati playing what is believed to be the first major college football night game in the country.
- Cincinnati started playing football in 1885 but moved the program to campus in Clifton in 1901. In 1906, UC invented co-operative education, which meant studentathletes on the football team were working downtown during the day. They needed a way to keep practicing when players were on a co-op rotation, so they erected a crude system of lights at Carson Field (where the team still plays today) in 1909. This allowed student-athletes to return to campus from co-op jobs and practice at night. In 1910, a more permanent setup was installed. The team painted the football white in order to see it better in the dark. In 1921 the university upgraded to a more modern incandescent lighting system which was, fittingly, designed by electrical engineering student Jack Silverman as his co-op thesis.
- In 1923, UC took it a step further, staging a regularseason game under the lights—the September 29 season opener against Kentucky Wesleyan. As the Bearcats won the game 17-0, the college football world took notice that the experiment had worked. It was the first college football game played under lights in the Midwest and believed to be the first major college football night game in the country.
- Cincinnati celebrates the 100th anniversary of night football this season, on the same field where the idea was pioneered in 1923.

#### AN ELITE PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- Any way you look at it over the last five, 10, 15 and 20 years - Cincinnati has proven to be one of the nation's top programs.
- Cincinnati is the 19th winningest program since 2013 (the last 10 years) with a record of 88-47 (65%), winning three conference championships and advancing to eight bowls, including two New Year's Six bowls in that time frame.
- The Bearcats became the first-ever "Group of Five" team to advance to the College Football Playoff in 2021, defeating No. 9 Notre Dame on the road and finishing undefeated in the regular season along the way.
- Since 2008, Cincinnati has the 15th-most wins in college football (last 15 years) with a 135-64 (68%) mark. The Bearcats have won an astounding seven conference championships over the last 15 years with only Oklahoma (nine), Ohio State (eight), Alabama (eight) and Clemson (seven) matching that feat. UC also has four NY6 bowl appearances and three AP Top 10 finishes in that time.
- Cincinnati (2021) is one of only 15 teams ever to play in the College Football Playoff and join Oklahoma (2016, 2019, 2020) and TCU (2022) as the only current Big 12 teams to ever qualify for College Football's Final Four.

#### **HALL OF FAME BLOODLINES**

- Redshirt-sophomore safety Antwan Peek Jr. is following in his father's Cincinnati Athletics Hall of Fame footsteps.
- · The elder Peek is UC's all-time leader in sacks (27.0), tackles for loss (56.0), forced fumbles (17) and blocked kicks (7). He was a third round pick (No. 67 overall) by the Houston Texans in the 2003 in the NFL Draft and played

- five seasons in the NFL, including four with the Texans and one with the Browns, finishing with 28 starts.
- Peek Jr., a walk-on who was put on scholarship, was cited by Satterfield prior to the season-opener as someone to
- "The guy that's kind of stuck out this August camp was Antwan Peek Jr. He's a guy who was down the depth chart and now after the spring, he's number two safety. He a guy that will get to play, I mean he's going to get some good playing time."

#### **FREAKS LIST**

- · UC boasted three members of Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list for the third-straight season.
- Tyler Scott, Tre Tucker and Josh Whyle earned the honors in 2022, while Desmond Ridder, Alec Pierce and Myjai Sanders garnered 2021 nods. All six are now on NFL rosters.
- Defensive lineman Jowon Briggs, an eclectic music persona with the piano, guitar, bass, drums, sax, flute, cello, violin, viola, harmonica and his tenor voice, squatted 700 in high school. He deadlifted 655 this offseason and did 31 bench-press reps at 225. He also hit 18.6 MPH and 4.89 in the pro shuttle.
- Fellow defensive lineman Dontay Corleone benches 485, squats 605 and deadlifts 700. He can also hit 18 MPH on the GPS with a 4.68 pro shuttle, something only one other 300-pound defensive lineman could do faster at the NFL Combine.
- Deshawn Pace, the 6-2, 212-pound senior star (hybrid nickel/linebacker) hit 21.21 MPH with a speedy 1.51 10yard split. He also benches 340 pounds and can do 25

#### CFP+MF4 APPEARANCE

- · Cincinnati is one of 11 schools one of two in the Big 12 with Oklahoma - to have a Men's Final Four and College Football Playoff appearance in it's athletic history.
- · Cincinnati became the first non-Power 5 team to make the College Football Playoff after finishing as the nation's only undefeated team in 2021 and has advanced to six Men's Final Fours.

#### **LOOKING AT THE 2023 SCHEDULE**

- · The Bearcats joined the Big 12 on July 1, setting up what will be the most exciting football schedule in school history.
- · Cincinnati hosts seven games at Nippert Stadium.
- · Cincinnati's first conference game as a member of the Big 12 will be a marquee matchup against Oklahoma on Sept. 23 inside Nippert Stadium.
- · Other highlights include renewing old BIG EAST rivalries with road contests at Pitt and West Virginia.

#### **NOTING THE REST OF THE 2023 SCHEDULE**

- West Virginia (Nov. 18): Former Big East rivals meet for 21st time and first since 2011.
- · Kansas (Nov. 25): Cincinnati won 34-7 in Nippert Stadium in 1997, one of two matchups all-time.

#### SATTERFIELD SYNOPSIS

- · Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield begins his first year at the helm of the Bearcats. He was hired as UC's 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022.
- · Satterfield brought an outstanding 76-48 record (.616) in 10 years as a head coach at Louisville and Appalachian

- State, holding a winning mark in seven seasons in addition to a 4-1 record in bowl games.
- · He led the Mountaineers from the FCS to the FBS and to three straight conference titles.
- He lifted the Cardinals up from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.
- · A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinals to a six-win improvement in his first year.
- Satterfield has deep ties to App State, serving as an assistant coach (1998-08) and quarterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way.

- · After the 2022 season, Cincinnati had 15 players enter the transfer portal and leave the program and another 17 either graduated or declared for the NFL Draft.

#### 12 NEW STARTERS IN FIRST GAME

· Of Cincinnati's 22 starters in the season opener, eight were making their UC debuts, including five on offense. Four others (OL Dartanyan Tinsley, RB Corey Kiner, TE Payten Singletary, LB Jack Dingle) made their first-career starts.

#### LT AN AEROSPACE ENGINEER

- · The offensive line is a cerebral position, and redshirtjunior offensive lineman John Williams has proven it as he pursues a starting job at left tackle.
- Williams, an aerospace engineering major, played in 12 of 13 games last year and 12 more in 2021, including starting the first three for the eventual CFP Bearcats. He cites NASA and Boeing as two places he would like to work for once his career is over.
- "I do take a good amount of pride in it," he told Sports Illustrated about his heavy academic load. "It's hard to juggle, and I don't sleep much, but I like to work hard."

#### **BUFORD HAS SEEN THE BEST**

- Redshirt junior and Kentucky transfer Deondre Buford claimed the starting right tackle spot.
- The Detroit native, who went to the same Martin Luther King HS as Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, appeared in all 13 games for UK in 2022 at both guard and tackle, while earning a pair of starts. One of those was against defending and eventual national champion Georgia.

#### THE LONE RETURNING STARTER ON OFFENSE

- · The coaching change and transfer portal has made for a completely different offensive depth chart this season.
- Redshirt-junior center Gavin Gerhardt is the only returning offensive starter, having taken on all 13 games last year and proving to be one of the Bearcats' best on the line. He snapped for two quarterbacks with vastly different styles and paved the way for three different running backs to tally 100-yard rushing games.
- · Not only that, he was emerging as a starting guard in 2022 fall camp before a season-ending injury to incumbent center Jake Renfro.

#### **CARTER BROWN, THE KICKER**

- · Arizona State transfer Carter Brown was 9-for-9 on PATs in his debut (second-most in UC history as well) and remains perfect on all 56 tries of his career.
- · He also made his first six field goal tries (including two of 46 and 47 yards), putting him 9-for-11 from 40-plus
- · His 54-yard boot against Oklahoma was the longest for UC since 2008 and tied for third all-time.

#### **NEW FACES AT WIDE RECEIVER**

- · The Cincinnati wide receiver room returned just one scholarship receiver in redshirt junior Chris Scott. Here are the newcomers:
- **O Braden Smith (Louisville)** Appeared in 29 games as a wide receiver and kick specialist for Louisville, where he hauled in 59 receptions for 653 yards and two touchdowns from 2020-22 after transferring from Northwest Miss. CC.
- 2 Dee Wiggins (Louisville) Veteran who brings 22 games of starting experience during stints at Louisville and Miami. Spent four seasons at Miami from 2018 to 2021 where he appeared in 40 games at wide receiver. Totaled 791 receiving yards on 62 receptions for seven touchdowns as a Hurricane. Played three games at Louisville in 2022 before a season-ending injury.
- 3 Evan Prater (QB at UC) Started two games behind center for the Bearcats in 2022 and was previously a backup for Desmond Ridder, Moved to wide receiver this summer. Had 166 yards on the ground as a guarterback and is a natural athlete.
- 8 Xzavier Henderson (Florida) Led Florida with 38 receptions in 2022, while also totaling 410 receiving yards and two touchdowns. He appeared in 35 games, recording 73 catches for 835 yards and five touchdowns with the Gators from 2020-22. Former teammate of UC. starting quarterback Emory Jones.
- 9 Aaron Turner (UConn) Appeared in all 25 games for UConn from 2021-22, totaling 90 receptions for 759 yards and three touchdowns, in addition to 75 more yards on the ground. Led the Huskies in receptions, his second straight season with a team-high in catches, yards and touchdowns in 2022, finishing with 57 catches for 527 yards and three scores after hauling in in 33 catches for 232 yards in 2021.

- · 11 Donovan Ollie (Washington St.) Experienced receiver who brings 24 career starts, 70 receptions, 807 yards, four touchdowns and two years of eligibility to the Bearcats following four seasons as a member of the Washington State program. Made 11 starts and appeared in 12 games in 2022, tallying 43 receptions for 491 yards and three scores. Overlapped one season with the late Mike Leach, whose Texas connections brought him to Pullman.
- 14 Barry Jackson (High School) Four-star recruit according to Rivals and one of the top 50 prospects in the state of Georgia according to 247Sports.
- 84 Sterling Berkhalter (NC A&T) Cincinnati native who played in 16 games with 13 starts over two seasons (2021-22) at North Carolina A&T. Totaled 35 receptions for 476 yards and two scores. Made 10 starts in 2022, tallying 28 receptions for 414 yards and both career touchdowns. Attended Georgia Prep Academy prior to college.

#### WHO IS NEW AT QUARTERBACK

- · Cincinnati signed transfer quarterback Emory Jones in the early signing period in December. He has started 20 games at Arizona State and Florida, and thrown for 4,880 yards and 33 touchdowns over 45 career games. He started 12 games at Florida in 2021 and finished with 2,734 yards and 19 touchdowns to go along with 758 yards and four touchdowns on the ground.
- Brady Drogosh, a 6-4 true freshman, joins the Bearcats as a four-star recruit and Michigan's No. 1 prospect. He was named Michigan's Mr. Football in 2022 after throwing for 2,264 yards and 35 touchdowns to go along with 1,340 rushing yards for De La Salle Collegiate.
- RS sophomore Brady Lichtenberg went 4-for-4 for 93 yards as the second-stringer against EKU, his first-career passing attempts. He hit freshman Barry Jackson Jr. for a 65-yard score late in the game.

#### **DUAL-THREAT DROGOSH**

- · True freshman quarterback Brady Drogosh turned heads in his first collegiate spring and fall camp, despite coming in as arguably UC's top high-school signee.
- The Warren, Mich., native was a consensus four-star recruit and rated the No. 1 player in the state, a top-five quarterback and top-50 national prospect by On3. While the 6-foot-4, 215-pound gunslinger has displayed a fluid throwing motion, he also unleashed a 99-yard touchdown run in a fall-camp scrimmage at Nippert Stadium.

#### **BEARCATS IN SEASON OPENERS**

· Cincinnati has won 22-straight home openers, beginning with an overtime win over TCU in 2002. This season was a 66-13 win over Eastern Kentucky.

#### **BEARCATS FIND NFL SUCCESS**

- · Cincinnati has seen 16 Bearcats drafted since the start of 2021 — second-most in the Big 12 in that time span. The list includes Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner, who was selected fourth overall by the New York Jets in 2022 and went on to earn All-Pro and NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors.
- While Gardner took the NFL by storm as a rookie. Travis and Jason Kelce turned in dominant seasons once again. The brothers, who both starred for the Bearcats more than a decade ago, each earned All-Pro and faced off in Super Bowl LVIII. The Kansas City Chiefs won the league crown

and Travis Kelce was joined by fellow Bearcat Bryan Cook, a rookie safety.

#### TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- · For the past 25 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- · The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Higher Ground has two 100-yard turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

#### **CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY**

- · UC won the 2021 and 2020 AAC Championships, its 15th and 16th league titles, for its first two since 2014 and first outright crowns since 2009.
- · UC played in its third-straight AAC title game in 2021.
- Each of the last two were played at Nippert Stadium. UC toppled No. 16 Houston in 2021 after defeating No. 23 Tulsa on Cole Smith's game-ending 34-yard field goal. That first game, played on Saturday, Dec. 19 at Nippert Stadium, marked the latest date a game was played in Nippert since a matchup vs. Xavier on Dec. 7, 1918.



#### CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM

CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM HAS BEEN THE VENERABLE HOME OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI FOOTBALL TEAM SINCE 1901 AND PROVIDES A PHENOMENAL HOME-FIELD ENVIRONMENT.

#### HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the first time ever prior to the 2022 football season, selling more than 23,500 to set a new school. The Bearcats accomplished the feat again in 2023.
- · The Bearcats are currently on single-game sellout streak spanning 17 contests since 2021.

#### A MODERN CLASSIC

- · In 1915, construction was completed on the first sections of a brick and concrete structure to replace the wooden stands and continued for several seasons as funds were raised.
- · In 1924, the completed structure was dedicated as James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium with a capacity of 12,000.
- · UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- · Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).
- Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football.
- The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon, privately funded renovation and expansion project.
- · The post-renovation season in 2015 coincided with the 100th anniversary of the original 1915 construction.

#### **FOR THE FANS**

- · Both concourses were renovated and widened and now feature nearly 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations are available on game days.
- Concession stands feature the usual stadium staples along with offerings from premium local vendors, including Frisch's, Montgomery Inn and Skyline Chili.
- · Enhancements were added in 2019, including: new tailgating spots, social gathering spaces, fans-first pricing and a seasonlong DJ for in-game entertainment.

#### WHAT'S IN A NAME?

- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.
- His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

#### THE WEST PAVILION

- · The most striking changes sit five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long, the West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.
- The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels; the Margaret & Michael Valentine press and suite level, suite level, scholarship club level, and patio mezzanine level.
- UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

#### TQL PARTNERSHIP BOLSTERS NIPPERT STADIUM

- · Total Quality Logistics (TQL), the second-largest freight brokerage firm in North America and Cincinnati's largest private company, and UC announced in January 2023 a longterm strategic partnership that will include field level and stadium signage and logo assets for TQL as well as specific investment to the Bearcats' indoor practice and performance facility project.
- TQL's logo will appear on Carson Field in two places.
- While field surface branding typically results in renaming the venue, as a Cincinnati company, TQL has chosen to not name the field. It will continue to be named Carson Field in honor of Dr. Arch Carson, who organized the first football team at the university in 1885 and is known as the Father of UC Football.

### **HEAD COACH SCOTT SATTERFIELD | FIRST SEASON**

2018 SUN BELT AND 2019 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

Bringing a history of success as the leader of two programs, Scott Satterfield was hired as Cincinnati football's 43rd head coach on Dec. 5, 2022

Satterfield holds a 76-48 record (.612) in 10 years as head coach at Louisville and Appalachian State, earning a winning mark in seven seasons and a 4-1 record in bowl games. He led the Mountaineers' transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision and to three straight conference titles and four bowl appearances from 2013 to 2018 before taking over the Cardinals in 2019.

Employing an explosive offensive attack, Satterfield led Louisville to three bowls in four seasons. He lifted the Cardinals from a 2-10 campaign in 2018 to an 8-5 record in his first season in 2019.

A Durham, N.C., native, Satterfield was the 2018 Sun Belt Coach of the Year at Appalachian State before earning 2019 ACC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinals to a six-win improvement

Satterfield, who is 50, led Appalachian State from the FCS into the FBS as the head coach after serving as an assistant coach (1998-08) and auarterback for the Mountaineers (1991-95), helping lead his alma mater to three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and eight conference championships along the way. Famously, Satterfield was the offensive play-caller and quarterbacks coach for App State's historic 34-32 upset of No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Under Satterfield, Louisville was the only team in the country to average more than 200 yards rushing and 200 yards passing each year from 2019 to 2022.

Additionally, Satterfield's rushing attacks have averaged more than 200 yards and ranked in the nation's top 30 in all eight years he has been an FBS head coach.

While at Louisville, he compiled a 25-24 record and saw 32 players collect All-ACC honors. Six Cardinals were selected in the NFL Draft during Satterfield's tenure as well, including 2023 selections YaYa Diaby (third round), Yasir Abdullah (fifth round) and Kei'Trel Clark (sixth round).

Louisville quarterback Malik Cunningham signed a guaranteed free-agent contract with the New England Patriots in 2023.


In 2022, Satterfield led Louisville to a 7-5 mark and saw 13 players collect all-conference accolades. The Cardinals appeared in the College Football Playoff Rankings and beat two Top-25 teams. Louisville led the nation in total sacks (50), finished third in takeaways (30) and ranked 11th nationally and tops in the ACC in scoring defense (19.2).

The 2021 Louisville squad was led by a potent offense that averaged 31.6 points per game and ranked 21st nationally with 446.2 yards of total offense per game. Cunningham proved to be one of the country's top dual-threat quarterbacks, rushing for 1,031 yards and an ACC-leading 20 touchdowns while passing for 2,940 yards and another 19 scores.

Louisville was also explosive in 2020, leading the nation with nine plays of 60+ yards and six plays of more than 70 yards while ranking fifth in the ACC in total offense (444.2).

In 2019, Satterfield guided Louisville to the biggest turnaround in college football, increasing the Cardinals' win total by six and vaulting UofL to the Top 25 in total offense and rushing in his first year. Individually, a pair of Cardinals posted the best statistical seasons in school history, Javian Hawkins broke the school record for rushing yards (1,525) by a running back, while wide receiver Tutu Atwell set the Louisville record for receiving yards (1,276) and tied the school mark with 12 TD catches.

Satterfield guided his alma mater to three consecutive Sun Belt



Conference Championships and an impressive 51-24 record from 2013 to 2018. The Mountaineers held a 38-10 conference mark over six seasons, including a 34-6 record over five seasons in the Sun Belt

Along the way, he became the first coach to lead a school from the FCS level to FBS and immediately earn three-consecutive bowl wins. Satterfield directed Appalachian State to three-straight conference titles and led the program to four straight bowl appearances.

In 2018, Satterfield led Appalachian State to a 10-2 record and an in-season ranking of No. 25 in the AP poll, capping the season with a 30-19 victory over Louisiana to give the Mountaineers a win in the first-ever Sun Belt Conference Championship Game, securing a thirdstraight league title.

In 2017, during a 9-4 season that included a 7-1 run through the Sun Belt, the Mountaineers ranked among the Top 20 teams nationally in several categories, including No. 2 in fewest sacks allowed (eight).

The 2015 season saw the Mountaineers finish 11-2—the 11 wins marking the highest total ever by an FBS program in its first season of bowl eligibility. App State completed the transition from the FCS to FBS by ranking among the Sun Belt's top two in 19 statistical categories and defeating Ohio, 31-29, in its first-ever bowl game, the Camellia BowL.

The 2015 campaign came on the heels of a breakout season in 2014. when Satterfield led the Mountaineers to an impressive 7-5 record in their first full season in the FBS ranks.

He took over the reins at his alma mater in 2013.

Satterfield helped Appalachian State win three consecutive FCS national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2007 as the quarterbacks coach and primary play-caller.

Among his many highlights as an assistant in Boone, N.C., he mentored two-time Walter Payton Player of the Year and FCS All-American Armanti Edwards. He helped lead the Mountaineers to the historic 34-32 upset at No. 5 Michigan to open the 2007 season.

Overall, he won six conference championships as an assistant and

Satterfield started 27 games at quarterback for Appalachian State. He collected first-team all-conference honors in 1995 after passing for 1,461 yards and rushing for 649 more to help lead the Mountaineers to the only undefeated, untied regular season (11-0) in school history and a 12-1 final record. He graduated with a degree in physical education

Satterfield and his wife. Beth, a former track & field athlete at App State, have a daughter, Alli, and two sons, Bryce and Isaac.


