## Cincinnati 9-2, 0-1 BIG EAST vs. No. 24 Arkansas 13-1, 0-0 SEC

**SETTING THE SCENE:** Cincinnati faces its second ranked opponent in December when it takes on No. 24 Arkansas in Fayetteville on Thursday, Dec. 28. The Bearcats (9-2) bounced back from a 67-62 loss at No. 16 Louisville with two convincing wins over Alabama A&M and Tennessee Tech last week. The Lady Razorbacks (13-1) are in the midst of a six-game winning streak, their only loss coming against No. 2 North Carolina, 94-69. Arkansas is 5-0 at home this season, while the Bearcats are 2-2 when playing on the road.

## STORY LINES:

- For the first time this season the Bearcats have three players averaging double figures—Shelly Bellman (15.5), Treasure Humphries (11.5) and Michelle Jones (10.9).
- UC's starting lineup features three sophomores and two seniors, while the Arkansas starters include two seniors, two juniors and a freshman. UC's freshmen and sophomores are producing 63 percent of the Bearcats' offense.
- The Bearcats are 0-1 against ranked opponents this season.
- This is the third opponent UC has faced that has a player averaging a double-double (at the time they play). Lauren Ervin is averaging 12.0 ppg and 10.1 rpg for Arkansas. Louisville's Angel McCoughtry and Murray State's Joi Scott were the other two.
- The Lady Razorbacks are 5-0 when playing at the Bud Walton Arena this season. They are 305-79 all-time when playing at home.

**UC LAST TIME OUT:** The Bearcats kept their perfect home record in tact, knocking off Tennessee Tech, 86-60, on Thursday, Jan. 21 at Fifth Third Arena, to improve to 7-0 when hosting. Michelle Jones scored a career-high 24 points—leading the cast of the Bearcat starters who scored in double figures—and Shelly Bellman was three assists short of recording UC's first triple-double in more than a decade. Bellman turned in a tremendous first-half performance tallying 10 points, seven rebounds, six assists and a steal, more than halfway to a triple-double. She finished with 17 points, 11 rebounds and seven assists. The last time the feat was accomplished at UC was by Jane Anne Preston against Marquette in a 101-100 victory on Jan. 25, 1992. She posted 13 points, 10 rebounds and 11 assists. Treasure Humphries, Angel Morgan and Karen Twehues each scored 11 to round out the starting five who scored in double figures, the first that has happened this season.

- Michelle Jones had a career-high 24 points, surpassing her previous best of 18 set last season against USF (1/15/06). She shot 10 of 13 from the field and 4 of 5 from the free throw line.
- For the 12th consecutive game, at least three Bearcats scored in double figures—all five UC starters scored in double figures: Jones (24), Bellman (17), while Angel Morgan, Karen Twehues and Treasure Humphries each had 11.

Michelle Jones scored a career-high 24 points to vault UC past Tennessee Tech. The Bearcats stayed undefeated (7-0) in home contests. The Bearcats dominated in the paint, outscoring TTU, 42-28. UC also outrebounded the Golden Eagles, 42-23. Shelly Bellman was on the verge of a triple-double, tallying 17 points, 11 rebounds and 7 assists. All of UC's starting lineup scored in double figures. The team shot a season-high 93 percent from the free throw line.

**UC Series vs. Arkansas**

Arkansas owns a 2-0 lead over Cincinnati in this series. The Lady Razorbacks last defeated UC, 66-54, on Jan. 2, 2005 at Fifth Third Arena. The other meeting was in the NCAA West Regional hosted by the Bearcats, also at Fifth Third Arena. The No. 24 Razorbacks won, 71-57. UofA lost to No. 5 Texas in the next round.

- The Bearcats had 24 assists on 33 field goals made. The 24 assists tie a season-high.
- Tennessee Tech had no offensive rebounds until the 7:10 mark of the second half. UC scored 20 points on second-chance points, while Tennessee Tech only scored three. For the 10th time in 12 games UC has outrebounded its opponents. The Bearcats dominated the boards, 42-23.
- The Bearcats – who had struggled from the free throw line this season (130 of 215 for 61 percent) – shot a season-high 93 percent from the charity stripe (13 of 14).

**BEARCATS DATA**

- Karen Twehues scored her first career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds against Alabama A&M (12/18/06). She blocked two shots, a career-high. The Bearcats blocked three shots, a season-high for the team.
- The Bearcats have won the battle of the boards in 10 of their 11 games this season. Only Louisville has beaten UC, posting a 53-44 margin. Cincinnati owns a +11.9 rebounding margin this season, second in the BIG EAST and 13th in NCAA. The UC single-season record is a +6.7 margin.
- Senior Treasure Humphries has had three or more assists in 10 of the Bearcats' 11 games. She leads UC with 5.0 per game. The Bearcats are averaging 19.1 assists per game, second in the BIG EAST in that category and ranking 12th in the NCAA.
- Humphries has scored in double figures in six games this season and 37 in her career.
- Humphries, who led the team in steals both her freshman and junior seasons, is pacing the team in thefts with 23. She has had multiple steals in nine of 10 games this season.
- Sophomore Shelly Bellman is the team's leading scorer (15.5) and rebounder (7.5). She has grabbed at least five rebounds in every game this season. She averaged 19.5 ppg and 5.5 rpg and was named to the all-tournament team of the Mildred and Roger L. White Invitational (12/1-2/06), hosted by Northwestern.
- Bellman has scored in double figures in all but one game this season and in 25 of 40 career contests. Bellman has four career double-doubles, including two this season: 14 points and 11 rebounds against St. Francis (11/22/06); 13 points and 13 rebounds against Murray State (11/28/06); and 17 points and 11 rebounds against Tennessee Tech (12/21/06). She also had seven assists, on the verge of getting UC's first triple-double since Jane Anne Preston in 1992.
- Sophomore Michelle Jones is shooting a team-high 56 percent from the field. She has converted on 49 of 87 attempts. She had career highs of 10 field goals made (out of 13) and 24 points against Tennessee Tech. She was also a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line.
- Sophomore Angel Morgan is second on the team in average minutes played with 30.0. She played the entire 40 minutes and scored a career-high 18 points, vaulting UC to a 74-57 win over Murray State (11/28/06). The win gave head Coach Laurie Pirtle her 300th at Cincinnati.
- Senior Karen Twehues is third all-time at UC in career 3-point field goals with 157. She leads the Bearcats in 3-point field goal percentage at 42 percent.
- Sophomore Kahla Roudebush will miss the remainder of the season after undergoing shoulder surgery.
- The Bearcats have had at least three players score in double figures in every game this season. A season-high five players scored in double figures in Cincinnati's 83-51 win over St. Francis (Pa.) (11/22/06) and against vs. Tennessee Tech (12/21/06), an 86-70 win for UC.
- Junior Emy Ogide is averaging 7.1 points a game this season, well above her career average coming into the season of 2.2 points. She had a career game in UC's 65-60 win over Dayton (11/16/06). The 6'2" junior forward came off the bench to score a game- and career-high 18 points, doubling her previous best of nine points set last year against Georgetown on Feb. 21, 2006.
- UC broke a team record for 3-point field goals in a game in an 89-65 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Nov. 14. UC finished with 13 treys, including 10 in the first half.
- The Bearcats extended their home-opener winning streak to 11 with the win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff.
- Cincinnati has held six of its 11 opponents to 65 points or less and is averaging 63.0 points allowed this season. The Bearcats held St. Francis (Pa.) to 51 points, a season low.
- The Bearcats had their earliest season opener in school history, playing at Youngstown State on Nov. 10.
- With the start against YSU, Carla Jacobs became one of nine true freshmen Division I point guards in the nation who started in their teams' women's basketball season openers. Jacobs is second on the team in steals (18) and assists (44).

**LOOKING AHEAD:** The Bearcats return to Fifth Third Arena on Wednesday, Jan. 3, resuming BIG EAST play against Georgetown with a 7 p.m. tip-off.

**ABOUT THE BEARCATS:**

- ◆ Senior Treasure Humphries has led the Bearcats in steals her junior and freshman years. She was a second team All-BIG EAST performer last season.
- ◆ Senior Karen Twehues provides a strong outside threat for the Bearcats. She has 157 career 3-pointers, third in UC history, and coming into this season her .378 career 3-point percentage is second in the record books.
- ◆ Junior Emy Ogide was named the most improved player during practice. She did not start playing basketball until her sophomore year of high school. The athletic post player can govern the paint and open up the perimeter.
- ◆ The five sophomores, Shelly Bellman, Michelle Jones, Angel Morgan, Kahla Roudebush and Jill Stephens, tabbed the 'Fab Five' were a top 10 recruiting class. They learned plenty about Division I basketball last season with 68 starts between them.
- ◆ The freshman class of Carla Jacobs, Natasha Graboski and Stephanie Stevens is also a highly touted group. Jacobs (D-III) and Stevens (D-I) were both honored as Ohio High School Basketball Players of the Year. Graboski earned second team all-state honors.

**36<sup>th</sup> SEASON OF UC WOMEN'S HOOPS:** The 2006-07 season marks Cincinnati's 36<sup>th</sup> year of varsity competition. The 2005-06 squad gave UC its 500<sup>th</sup> victory on Dec. 3, 2005 during the fifth game of the season, an 82-48 win over Eastern Illinois. UC's all-time record is 518-450, seventh most wins among BIG EAST schools. Under head coach Laurie Pirtle the Bearcats are 304-289 and have made postseason appearances in eight of the last nine years.

**UC IN THE BIG EAST:** Cincinnati enters its second season as a member of the expanded BIG EAST Conference. In the preseason polls of the league's coaches the Bearcats were picked to finish 12th among the 16 teams. The Bearcats have compiled a record of 71-78 against the current BIG EAST membership. Last year UC finished 11th in the regular season race with a 7-9 ledger and earned a berth to the BIG EAST Championships.

**SURVEY OF SCORING AND STARTS:** The Bearcats return 78 percent of their scoring from last season, including the three scoring leaders - senior Treasure Humphries (12.8 ppg) and sophomores Shelly Bellman (10.9) and Michelle Jones (9.1). Humphries and Bellman started every game last season, while Jones played in all 29 games and started 17. Sophomores Jill Stephens (13), Kahla Roudebush (6) and Angel Morgan (3) combined for 22 starts last year.

Her three 3-point field goals were a season high. Bellman, who was named to the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team last year, leads UC in scoring (15.4), rebounding (7.4) and is second in field goal percentage (.500), hitting 50-of-100 attempts.



The University of Cincinnati and Xavier University athletic departments announced the "Sell out the Shootout" campaign for this season's XU vs. UC Skyline Chili Women's Crosstown Shootout, Presented by Fifth Third, on Wednesday, January 17 at 7 p.m. at Fifth Third Arena.

**UC SIGNS 3 FOR 07-08**

Tenisha Benson (Akron, Ohio/ Archbishop Hoban), Asia Jenkins (Piscataway, N.J./Piscataway) and Caitlin Pauley (Chicago Heights, Ill./ Marian Catholic) signed National Letters of Intent on Nov. 8 during the early signing period, committing to play for the Bearcats women's basketball team beginning in the 2007-08 season.

"Tenisha, Asia and Caitlin are total-package kids," said University of Cincinnati head coach Laurie Pirtle. "All three young ladies come from wonderful families and will undoubtedly impact our academic, athletic and campus communities from day one."

"We needed a group that has the maturity to impact UC and the BIG EAST right away," she added.

Benson, a 5-foot-9 point guard/shooting guard, is the top-rated perimeter player in the state by *Ohio Girls Basketball Report*. An adidas All-American and all-state selection, Benson is on pace to be the all-time leading scorer and rebounder at Hoban High School. She averaged 16 points, 7.5 rebounds and 5.5 assists a game as a junior. She is a candidate for Ms. Ohio Basketball.

A 5-foot-11 guard, Jenkins was rated the No. 1 overall player in the latest edition of the *National Recruiting Report*. She averaged 15.7 points and 2.4 assists at Piscataway High School as a junior, earning all-state honors. She was the 2005-06 Middlesex County Player of the Year and is a candidate for this year's Ms. New Jersey Basketball.

Pauley, a 6-foot-3 left-handed post, is captain of her Marian Catholic High School team that is ranked No. 1 in preseason polls. Pauley, averaging 15 points and eight rebounds a game her junior year, was invited to the adidas All-American Camp. She is rated one of the top 20 front court players in the nation by Dan Olson Collegiate Girls Basketball Report.
