



Postgame Notes
Cincinnati vs. Navy
Nov. 5, 2022 | Nippert Stadium

Team Highlights

- Head coach Luke Fickell is now 55-17 in his sixth season at Cincinnati.
- Cincinnati extends its active home winning streak to 31 games, the second longest streak in the nation (Clemson).
- The captains for today's game were senior tight end Josh Whyle, redshirt senior linebacker Wilson Huber, redshirt senior Dylan O'Quinn and redshirt senior defensive lineman Jabari Taylor.
- Cincinnati is now 7-2 in games after a loss since 2018.
- Cincinnati is now 657-597-50 in the 135th season of college football.
- Cincinnati is now 29-4 (.879) since the start of the 2020 season and 51-9 (.850) since the start of 2018.
- Cincinnati has now three straight games (2018, 2021, 2022) against Navy, improving to 3-1 as AAC opponents.
- Navy won the toss and deferred to the second half.
- It is the second time this season that the Bearcats did not surrender a first-half touchdown. (Kennesaw St, 21-3). Cincinnati is 43-2 when leading at the half under Fickell.
- Attendance for today's game was 38,461, the ninth largest in Nippert Stadium history.

Offensive Notes

- Cincinnati's 98-yard drive in the third quarter was the longest of the season.
- Junior wide receiver Tyler Scott finished with 10 receptions for 139 yards and two touchdowns.
 - The two touchdowns mark his second career multi-touchdown game, extending his season touchdown total to eight, 13 for his career.
 - All 13 of his career receiving touchdowns have been above 20 yards, with a 42.2-yard career average.
 - The 139 yards was his third time this season over the 100-yard mark.
- Redshirt senior Charles McClelland recorded 60 yards rushing on 11 attempts, eclipsing 1,500 career rushing yards.
- Junior wide receiver Jadon Thompson hauled in a season-long 39-yard catch, finishing with three receptions for a career-high 81 yards.
 - Seven out of his 20 receptions this season were for 20-plus yards.
- Senior quarterback Ben Bryant finished 25-of-35 for 299 passing yards and two passing touchdowns. He also surpassed 6,000 yards for his career.
- Cincinnati entered the week ninth nationally in fourth-down conversions and was successful on both attempts against Navy (8-for-12 on the season).

Defensive Notes

- Senior linebacker Ivan Pace Jr. finished with a game-high two tackles for loss. He is now sits 10th all-time in program history for tackles for loss in a single season with 18 through the first nine games.
- Pace Jr. finished the game with 14 tackles, one sack, and two tackles for loss. He has led the Bearcats in tackles in all but one game this season, eight of nine contests.
 - Pace Jr. has totaled double-digit tackles in six games.
 - He surpassed 250 career tackles in the game, extending his career total to 255.
- Redshirt freshman Dontay Corleone made his first collegiate career start.
 - Corleone finished the game with a career-high 11 tackles. He matched his previous career-high of six tackles in the first half (six vs. Kennesaw St.)
- Redshirt junior Eric Phillips set a career-high in tackles with seven.
- It was the second time this season that the Bearcats did not surrender a first-half touchdown. (vs. Kennesaw St, 21-3 in the first half).
- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Jabari Taylor totaled six tackles to bring his career total to 102 tackles.
- Senior defensive lineman Jowon Briggs recorded a new career high with nine tackles. He also blocked a field goal in the second quarter.

Special Teams Notes

- Senior kicker Ryan Coe connected on two first-half field goals from 47 yards and 27 yards out.
 - Coe is now 9-13 from 40–49 yards in his career.
 - Coe is now made 9 of his last 10 field goal attempts over the last three games.
- Senior defensive lineman Jowon Briggs recorded his first career blocked field goal on a 25-yard attempt in the second quarter. It is the second blocked field goal by the Bearcats this season.
- Three of sophomore punter Mason Fletcher's four punts were downed inside the 20-yard line.
 - Fletcher had two punts of 50-plus yards in the game, extending his season total to 13 punts of 50-plus. His first punt of the game was a 52-yarder downed that at the 1-yard line for the second time this season, while his last was for 59 yards.
 - Fletcher now has 22 punts downed inside the 20-yard line and 11 inside the 10.
