## FOCUS OF THE MONTH



### Super Bowl Gambling Reminder



ATLANTA 02.03.19

As a student-athlete, coach, or institutional staff member with University of Cincinnati Athletics, you **CANNOT** engage in any gambling activities related to **the Super Bowl or any other sport that has an NCAA Sponsored Championship.**

**10.3 Sports Wagering Activities.** The following individuals shall not knowingly participate in sports wagering activities or provide information to individuals involved in or associated with any type of sports wagering activities concerning intercollegiate, amateur or professional athletics competition:

- (a) Staff members of an institution's athletics department;
- (b) Nonathletic department staff members who have responsibilities within or over the athletics department (e.g., chancellor or president, faculty athletics representative, individual to whom athletics reports);
- (c) Staff members of a conference office; and
- (d) Student-athletes.

**10.02.2 Wager.** A wager is any agreement in which an individual or entity agrees to give up an item of value (e.g., cash, shirt, dinner) in exchange for the possibility of gaining another item of value.

**10.3.1 Scope of Application.** The prohibition against sports wagering applies to any institutional practice or any competition (intercollegiate, amateur or professional) in a sport in which the Association conducts championship competition, in bowl subdivision football and in emerging sports for women

# CAN YOU SPOT THE VIOLATION ?

A WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL PROSPECT JUST SIGNED A NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT WITH UC IN THE FALL. SHE IS VERY EXCITED TO COME AND PLAY FOR THE BEARCATS AND WANTS TO GET A HEAD START FOR NEXT YEAR. THE PSA ASKS THE COACHES IF SHE CAN COME SIT IN ON FILM SESSIONS ONCE A WEEK SINCE SHE IS FROM CINCINNATI. IS THIS ALLOWED?



No, if the PSA came to the film sessions on a regular basis this would be considered a practice activity. A PSA may not engage in practice activities (film, playbook review, and chalk talks) with coaches prior to their enrollment.

## 13.11.1 Prohibited Activities

### \*TMP REMINDER\*

Keep in mind that all Time Management Plan requirements must have been met by the end of the academic year. This includes the seven consecutive days off at the conclusion of your championship segment, and the extra 14-days off which are required by the policy. If you have any questions or concerns about where your team stands contact your compliance representative.



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Question:** Is it permissible to receive an NLI while on campus for an official or unofficial visit?

**Answer:** : Yes. While under the terms of the NCAA and NLI program a coach or institutional representative may not hand-deliver an NLI off campus, there is nothing that precludes a coach or institutional representative from delivering an NLI while on campus for an official or unofficial visit.

**Question:** Once a prospective student-athlete signs an NLI with another school, is it permissible to recruit that student-athlete?

**Answer:** No. Once a prospective student-athlete has signed an NLI with another school, a coach is obligated to cease contact with the student-athlete and their family members. Any contact in excess of an exchange of a greeting is not permitted regardless of the conversation. The conversation does not have to result in recruiting discussion for a recruiting ban violation to occur.

**Question:** If a prospective student-athlete fails to honor their NLI commitment to another school, is it permissible for another NLI institution to recruit them?

**Answer:** Yes, but only if they have received a complete release or had the NLI recruiting ban lifted by the institution with which they signed. The lifting of the NLI recruiting ban must be indicated on the NLI Release Request Form. If the NLI recruiting ban is lifted, it is not limited to certain institutions, but to all institutions seeking to recruit them. Note: this NLI recruiting ban policy is different from the NCAA permission to contact requirements.
