FOOTBALL RETURNS TO NIPPERT STADIUM SATURDAY AGAINST ALABAMA A&M

• The University of Cincinnati football team opens up the home schedule in week three, facing Alabama A&M at 7 p.m. inside Nippert Stadium after playing the first two weeks of the season on the road. The game will air exclusively on ESPN3 and the ESPN app and via radio on 102.7 WEBN, 700 WLW AM following the ending of the Reds game and TuneIn.com.

· Saturday marks the second all-time meeting between the two schools with both contests taking place in Cincinnati at NIppert Stadium. The Bearcats won the Sept. 5, 2015 matchup 52-10, the first home game following the Nippert Stadium renovation.

- LUKE FICKELL was named the 42nd Football Head Coach at the University of Cincinnati in December 2016. He took the reins of UC's program after spending 15 years at his alma mater, Ohio State. A veteran of nearly 20 years coaching at the FBS level, Fickell was a part of nine Biq Ten Conference titles (seven as a coach, two as a player) and two national championship squads with 15 postseason games and 12 NFL Draft selections under his belt.
- CONNELL MAYNOR is in his first season leading the Alabama A&M program. Maynor has more than two decades of experience, both as a coach and as a player in the intercollegiate and professional ranks. He has been part of 10 championship teams, six as a player and four as a coach with previous head coach stints at Hampton and Winston-Salem State.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS ...

- The University of Cincinnati football team plays its 131st season in 2018. The program dates to 1885 and is one of the 10 oldest in major college football. UC has won a league title five times in the last 11 years and played in nine bowl games in the last 12 seasons.
- Entering 2018, UC is one of 36 NCAA FBS teams with 100 wins since 2005. The Bearcats' .638 winning percentage since 2007 ranks among the Top-30 teams in the NCAA FBS, winning at least nine games seven times in the last 12 years.
- The Bearcats returned to Nippert Stadium in 2015 after a 20 month, \$86-million renovation and drew 222,578 fans in the first year back at Nippert Stadium, a single-season record average of 37, 096.
- UC won back-to-back-to-back American Athletic Conference FB Team Academic Excellence Awards in 2015, 2016 & 2017.
- UC was picked fourth in the American Athletic Conference Preseason poll and is the only team in the conference to return its leading rusher (Gerrid Doaks), passer (Hayden Moore) and receiver (Kahlil Lewis) from the 2017 season.
- Almost sixty-nine percent of UC's roster [77 of 112] is made of up freshmen. RS freshmen and sophomores.
- UC is one of the five youngest teams in college football, featuring 81 underclassmen [29 sophomores, 17 redshirt freshmen, 35 true freshmen) on its 112-person roster.
- The 2018 roster is composed of student-athletes from 16 states and five countries. Sixty-four Bearcats hail from Ohio, with 24 from Cincinnati, followed in order by Florida [10], Georgia [9], Indiana [6], Illinois [4], Kentucky [4], Virginia [4], Alabama [3], Michigan [2] with single players from California, Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Texas and Washington.
- UC started the season with two straight road games for the 12th time, winning both games for only the second time in program history and the first time since 1898. UC hadn't started a season with two-straight road games since 1991 when the Bearcats opened with three-straight away from home against Penn State, North Carolina and Bowling Green.
- UC is the only team in The American that did not play a home game in the first two weeks of the season.
- The Bearcats have held opponents scoreless in five straight quarters, beginning with the fourth period against UCLA in Week 1.
- UC's defense is tied for 7th in the country in fewest points allowed per game.
- UC's shutout over Miami [OH] was the Bearcats' first since a 14-0 win against Temple in the 2014 season and the 13th-straight win in the Battle for the Victory Bell.
- After two games, RB Michael Warren is tied for the national lead with five rushing touchdowns.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the UC Sports Communications Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit the football page at GoBEARCATS.com to request credentials online. Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game. No credentials will be mailed after Tuesday preceding the game. Thereafter, credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located by gate 6.

SCOUTING PASSES

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through UC's Sports Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

SIDELINE PASSES

The University of Cincinnati follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines and behind the restraining line in the end zone.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete stats, scoring summaries, running play-by-play, quickie stats and post-game notes and quotes are provided by the UC Sports Communications Office. Pregame food service is available beginning approximately two hours prior to kickoff, while beverages are available throughout the contest. This service is provided as a courtesy to working media. In addition, concession areas are available within the stadium confines. Wireless internet is available in the press box at Nippert Stadium. Members of the UC Sports Communications staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

UC holds a weekly media luncheon each Tuesday in the second floor Bob Goin Team Room of Richard E. Lindner Center. Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., selected players are available for one-on-one interviews from 11:45-noon, and head coach Luke Fickell takes the podium at noon. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaches.

PRACTICES

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on Tuesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact UC Sports Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regular-season practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and the first 20 minutes (four periods).

INTERNET POLICIES

Live updating of websites, blogs and social network feeds is not allowed during practices.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The UC locker room will remain closed following all football games. Media should request players through UC Sports Communications during the fourth quarter. Media will be allowed to enter the field [for home games] late in the fourth quarter but will not be allowed to conduct interviews with UC football players on the field (home or away). Only the originating television and radio networks will be allowed to conduct interviews on the field.

There will be a 10-15 minute cooling off period between the end of the game and start of the postgame interview sessions. Coach Fickell will address the media in the designated interview area following home games. Players will be brought into the interview area as soon as possible.

Postgame availability on the road will be determined on gameday. Please see football contact Ryan Koslen for details.

AMERICAN ATHLETIC TELECONFERENCE

The American Athletic Conference will coordinate a weekly teleconference of the league's 12 head football coaches. Media members who wish to access the teleconference should contact Chuck Sullivan at the American Athletic Conference for the phone number. THE LAST STOP

- UC and AAMU met on Sept. 5, 2015, the first game in newly renovated Nippert Stadium.
- DT Cortez Broughton and DT Marquise Copeland and S Chris Murphy made their first career starts while LB Malik Clements, Copeland, CB Tyrell Gilbert, WR Kahlil Lewis, QB Hayden Moore and Murphy made their first appearance in the Red & Black.
- Copeland was the first true freshman to start a season opener for UC in 10 years, dating back to 2005 when DT Terrill Byrd and CB Mike Mickens, now a UC assistant coach, started in their first career game.

CONNECTION

- UC has a trio of Alabama natives on its roster in QB Hayden Moore (Clay), OL Jakari Robinson (Talladega) and LB Perry Young (Birmingham).
- AAMU CB Mike Mills is the lone Ohio native on the Bulldogs roster. The native of Dayton, Ohio attending Thurgood Marshall HS
- Moore, AAMU CB Amarai Holloway and AAMU LB Armoni Holloway all attended Clay-Chalkville HS.
- UC defensive quality control coach Colin Hitschler spent three years on the South Alabama staff from 2014-17.

MOVING ON UP

- Through two games, UC's defense has shown some vast improvements in the statistics.
- UC sits No. 13 in the NCAA FBS in total defense and No.
 7 in scoring defense. At the same point a year ago, the Bearcats sat No. 66 and tied for No. 68, respectively.

A HOME TO COME TO

- UC is the only team in The American that did not play a home game in the first two weeks of the season.
- UC hasn't started a season with two-straight road games since 1991 when the Bearcats opened with three-straight away from home against Penn State, North Carolina and Bowling Green.
- The Sept. 15 home opener date is the latest home opener since 1991.

WHO'LL STOP THE RAIN?

- UC's 21-0 win over Miami (OH) was played in dreadful weather conditions, with heavy rain throughout.
- The Bearcats ran 62 plays with 51 coming on the ground as the passing attack was largely ineffective.
- UC's 11 pass attemptes were its fewest in a game since attempting 11, also against Miami [OH] on Sept. 30, 2006.

LONG TIME GONE

• The Bearcats have opened a season with back-to-back road games 12 times previously with the 2-0 start to the 2018 campaign marking just the second time UC has won both. The last time it happened came in 1898 when UC posted a 12-0 win at Ohio before blanking host Miami, 22-0. The last time UC opened a season with back-toback road games was in 1991 when it lost at #5 Penn State and at North Carolina.

BLUE SKY MINE

- P James Smith punted eight times at Miami [OH], totaling 368 yards for an average of 46.0 per kick in heavy rain.
- His long of the night measured 63 yards and was his second kick of 50+ yards on the night after he also hit a 50-yarder in the third quarter. With those two 50+ yard boots, he raised his total to 12 on the year with his 63yard punt standing as his longest this year and third-longest of his career behind a 65-yard kick at ECU and a 64yard punt against Austin Peay.
- Smith also dropped three of his punts inside the 20.

FOR WHOM THE BELL TOLLS

- UC knocked off longtime rival Miami in the 123rd meeting in the Battle for the Victory Bell 21-0.
- UC's win cuts into Miami's all-time series lead as the RedHawks now lead, 59-57-7.
- The Bearcats have now won 13 in a row in the series with the RedHawks with the last loss in the series coming in 2005, a 44-16 win for host Miami in Oxford
- The last time the Bearcats posted a shutout the series came in 2013 when they won, 14-0, in Oxford.
- The 2018 edition marked the second time Paul Brown Stadium has hosted the series with UC winning the previous game in 2014, 31-24, when Nippert Stadium was undergoing renovations.
- Sept. 8 marked the first time UC has been the visiting team at Paul Brown Stadium.

A SALUTE TO THE LETTER ZERO

• The Bearcats held the RedHawks off the scoreboard for the entire game, marking the first shutout victory for UC since 2014 when it defeated Temple, 14-0, in Philadelphia. Couple that with not allowing points to UCLA in both the second and fourth quarters and the UC defense has now posted six scoreless quarters of play. Last year, the Bearcats held a foe scoreless in just five quarters with only one game – hosting Austin Peay – seeing the defense shutout a foe in two quarters.

SIMPLY RED ... ZONE

- Cincinnati was 3-of-3 on red zone chances in the game and are now 7-of-7 on the year after scoring on all four chances last week in the win at UCLA.
- UC's defense held Miami without a red-zone opportunity.

PRESSURE

 After UCLA opened the game with a 10-0 lead, the Bearcats defense responded by allowing just seven points of the next seven quarters, including the shutout of Miami on Sept. 8.
 For the season, UC is now outscoring its foes, 47-17.

START ME UP

- Three players earned their first start against Miami (OH).
- CB Cam Jefferies earned his first career start with UC after starting seven games last year at Bowling Green while QB Desmond Ridder and WR Jerron Rollins both earned their first collegiate starts on the offensive side of the ball.

DOWN ON THE CORNER

- Entering the Miami (OH) game, CB Tyrell Gilbert had four career pass breakups and nearly doubled that total in the first half as he had three on RedHawks wide receivers.
 Gilbert added a pair of solo tackles in the game as well.
- Gilbert has played several positions during his time at UC but has settled in nicely at corner, starting the first two games of 2018.

RUN THRU

- QB Desmond Ridder broke off a 39-yard run on the second drive of the first quarter at Miami (OH), a play that eventually led to RB Michael Warren II rushing two yards for his fourth touchdown of the year.
- Ridder's rush surpassed his career-long of 32 yards (at UCLA, 9/1/18).
- The 39 yard scamper was the third of the year for UC for plays over 30 yards with Ridder recording two of those plays. Last year, the Bearcats recorded 19 plays of 30 yards or more with five coming on the ground.
- With 3:21 remaining in the Miami game, Ridder recorded his first career touchdown pass, hitting a wide open TE Josiah Deguara over the middle for a 9-yard strike. The touchdown grab also was the first of Deguara's career on his 21st career reception.
- Ridder finished the game with 100 yards rushing on 18
 attempts, both of which are career highs. His rushing total also makes him the first Bearcats quarterback since
 Munchie Legaux to hit the century mark on the ground
 after Legaux recorded 117 yards against Pittsburgh on
 September 6, 2012, six years and two days prior to Ridder's feat.
- Ridder's first career start saw him finish 6-of-11 through the air for 45 yards and one touchdown while accounting for 145 yards of total offense when adding his rushing.

GIVING YOU THE BEST I GOT

- RB Michael Warren II scored on a 2-yard direct-snap plunge at the 5:37 mark of the first quarter at Miami (OH), his fourth score of the season.
- Last year, UC did not record its fourth rushing score
 of the season until the 9:04 mark of the third quarter
 against Marshall, the fifth game of the year.
- Warren now has five rushing touchdowns on the year after adding two to his total against Miami. Entering the season, he had scored only one rushing touchdown in his UC career and now has back-to-back games with multiple scores on the ground.
- · Warren finished the game with 91 yards on 29 carries.

JUMP RIGHT IN

- Late in the first quarter at Miami (OH), DT Cortez Broughton recorded his second tackle-for-loss of the game, bringing his season total to 5.5 already. That total already eclipsed his best season total when he recorded 5.0 in 2016.
- Early in the second quarter, Broughton forced a fumble that MU recovered, marking the first force of his career.
- Broughton finished the game with five tackles, including 2.0 TFL, one quarterback hurry, one forced fumble and one pass breakup.

PINBALL WIZARD

- S Darrick Forrest recorded his first interception and returned it 23 yards to the Miami 1 early in the fourth quarter, setting up RB Michael Warren II's second rushing touchdown of the game.
- On the defensive play, CB Coby Bryant got his hand on the ball to deflect it from the receiver with LB Bryan Wright getting his hand on it to keep the ball in the air where Forrest snagged it and nearly found the end zone, being tackled just short.

ARE YOU READY

 RB Tavion Thomas recorded his first career carry in the third quarter at Miami (OH), toting the ball for three yards and a Bearcats first down. It was his lone rush in the contest.

LOVE IT WHEN A PLAN COMES TOGETHER

- LB Bryan Wright was named the AAC Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 3.
- Wright, playing his first game at middle linebacker after switching from defensive end in the offseason, had four tackles, including two sacks and three tackles for loss, and had a pivotal forced fumble in the fourth quarter that resulted in the go-ahead safety as the Bearcats took a 26-17 win at UCLA.
- He shared the weekly accolade with Houston DT Ed Oliver.

TRUCKIN'

 RB Michael Warren II earned a spot on the league's weekly honor roll following the win at UCLA. Warren tallied a career-high 142 yards on 35 carries with a career-best

- three touchdowns.
- It was UC's top rushing performance since Gerrid Doaks ran for 149 yards at Tulane in 2017. UC's last three TD rushing performance came from former Bearcats standout Mike Boone against Tulsa on Nov. 14, 2105.
- Entering 2018, UC had rushed for three or more TDs only once in the last 24 games, against Miami (OH) on Sept. 24, 2016.

GOING TO CALIFORNIA

- With a 26-17 win at UCLA on Sept. 1, UC has been victorious in its past three West-Coast trips, winning 28-18 at Oregon State in 2009 and 52-23 at San Diego State in 2007.
- UC is 3-3 all time in games in the state of California, going 1-0 each against UCLA and San Diego State and 1-3 against Pacific in Stockton, California.

- Tied at 17, UC recorded a safety in the fourth quarter with Bryan Wright forcing a UCLA fumble with the Bruins deep in their own territory.
- QB Desmond Ridder engineered a 9-play, 36-yard drive which featued a pair of 4th-down conversions and ended with a 1-yard TD run by RB Michael Warren II which made the final 26-17.

NEW KID IN TOWN

- · K Cole Smith saw his first action for UC at UCLA.
- The freshman from Middletown knocked in all three of his extra points and a 24-yard field goal at the Rose Bowl.
- UC attempted just 17 field goals a year ago, but none in the final two games of the campaign.

- Redshirt freshman QB Desmond Ridder came off the bench at UCLA to spark the Bearcats in the first quarter and finished with 100 yards on 13-of-24 passing.
- Ridder completed his first four passes and rushed 14 times for 63 yards, including an 18-yard scamper in the second quarter which helped lead to Cole Smith's 24yard field goal which game UC a 17-10 halftime lead.
- Seven true freshmen, Ja'Von Hicks, Jayshon Jackson, Charles McClelland, Alec Pierce, Myjai Sanders, Cole Smith and Malik Vann, all saw action in the opener in the Rose Bowl.

BOOMBOX

- K Ryan Jones has settled in as UC's kickoff specialist, averaging 64.6 yards per boot with four touchbacks on five attempts in the opener at UCLA.
- A year ago, the junior provided some desperately needed stability to the kicking game, kicking extra points and making six field goals over the second half of 2017.
- The former walk-on was placed on scholarship during the week leading up to the UCLA trip.

THE LAND DOWN UNDER

- P James Smith has been a rock of consistency since joining UC a year ago.
- The first-team, all-league selection a year ago had eight punts at UCLA, averaging 43.4 yards per kick with a long boot of 52 yards and five kicks dropped inside the 20yard line.

SMASHMOUTH

- DT Cortez Broughton registered 2.5 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss in the season opener at UCLA.
- With that effort, he eclipsed his 2017 total for both sacks [1.0] and TFLs [3.5].

SACK ATTACK

- UC recorded five sacks and eight tackles for a loss in the season opener at UCLA.
- It was the highest single-game sack total for the Bearcats since earning five sacks against Miami [OH] on Sept. 24, 2016.
- UC had nine TFLs last season against Marshall and a season-best 10 against Austin Peay.
- The Bearcats 58 TFLs and 12 sacks for the entire 2017 season.

FIRST CAREER STARTS

 OL Dino Boyd, TE Josiah Deguara, OL Chris Ferguson, S Darrick Forrest, WR Rashad Medaris, DE Michael Pitts, RB Michael Warren II and S James Wiggins made their first career starts at UCLA.

AN UNLIKELY GROUPING

 The starting five for the Bearcats OL is made up of a sixth-year former walk-on [Garrett Campbell], two grad

- transfers (Dino Boyd & Kyle Trout), a former hockey player (Morgan James) and senior who had never played a game of college football before the opener at UCLA (Chris Ferguson).
- They average 6-5 and 310 lbs.

FROM THE ISLANDS TO THE NATI

- Senior OL Chris Ferguson got the start at RT at UCLA, marking not only his first career start, but his first career appearance for UC.
- Ferguson has played both offensive and defensive line during his career.
- He was born in the Bahamas, moved to Orlando, Florida at the age of 18, was originally a basketball player and played only one year of HS football before coming to Cincinnati.

NOTING THE LID LIFTERS

- Cincinnati is 85-38-10 in season-opening games
- UC has won eight-straight lid lifters, dating back to 2010 (at Fresno State).
- UC opened the season on the road for the first time since traveling to Fresno State in 2010.

SUPERFREAK

- S James Wiggins earned a spot on Bruce Feldman's Biggest Freaks in College Football list, checking in at No. 33.
- Feldman wrote of the Bearcats sophomore: "One of the higher-ranked recruits Cincinnati has signed in recent years, the 5-11, 205-pound one-time Miami commit from South Florida is super strong for his size. He benches 405, squats 675 and has tremendous burst, broad jumping 11-0, vertical leaping 37 inches and timing 4.40 in the 40."
- Wiggins hauled in his first career interception with 9:57 left in the second quarter at UCLA.

YOUTH OF THE NATION

 UC is one of the five youngest teams in college football, featuring 81 underclassmen (29 sophomores, 17 redshirt freshmen, 35 true freshmen) on its 112-person roster.

STUCK IN THE MIDDLE WITH YOU

- Bryan Wright made the move to middle linebacker in the offseason after previously playing at DE.
- He started UC's first six games in 2017, recording 15 tackles and 2.5 TFLs, before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury.
- Wright was a prep QB at Howard HS in Wilmington, Delaware where he also played on a state championship basketball team.

THESE BOOTS WERE MADE FOR PUNTING

 UC led the American Athletic Conference in punting, averaging 42.0 yards per kick and were one of four teams nationally to not record a touchback in 2017.

IN THE AIR TONIGHT

- WR Kahlil Lewis leads the returning group of wideouts.
- The senior from Miami, Florida hauled in 61 balls for 676 yards and 7 TDs a year ago, all career-best marks.
- Lewis was a standout prep in two sports at Miramar HS, also averaging 15 mpg as a shooting guard.

- Smith, a First-Team All-AAC selection as a true freshman, kicked 64 times for a 42.0 per kick average with a long boot of 65 yards in 2017.
- He had 33 punts fair caught, dropped 21 inside the 20yard line and booted nine kicks for 50 or more yards.
- Smith hails from Wangaratta, Australia, which is a mere 9,683 miles from Cincinnati.
- Smith, who grew up playing Australian Rules FB, is a product of Prokick Australia.

CHA- CHA- CHANGES

- The coaching staff underwent several changes during the offseason with some familiar faces returning to UC.
- Special Teams Coordinator Brian Mason served as the Bearcats Director of Recruiting in 2017, cornerbacks coach Mike Mickens was an All-America selection at cornerback who helped lead UC to the 2008 BIG EAST title and Orange Bowl and defensive line coach Steve Stripling was previously on staff from 2010-13 and was UC's interim HC in the 2013 Belk Bowl win over North Carolina.
- On the offensive side of the ball, coordinator Mike Denbrock shifted over to tight ends, Gino Guidugli moved over to quarterbacks and Doug Phillips shifted to running backs.

• Freshmen wide receivers Jack and Jake Peterson are identical twin brothers from Granville, Ohio.

TURN THE PAGE

 UC is coming off a pair of 4-8 seasons, marking the first time the Bearcats have had back-to-back sub-.500 records since 1998 [2-9] and 1999 [3-8].

CLEVELAND ROCKS

- DT Marquise Copeland earned spots on the watch lists for the Outland and Nagurski Trophies entering 2018.
- The Cleveland, Ohio, native earned Honorable Mention All-AAC accolades a year ago. He was a 12-game starter at defensive tackle, setting career highs with 63 tackles, 8.0 tackles for a loss and a team-high 3.5 sacks. He set a career high with 10 tackles and a QB hurry against UConn in the season finale.
- He was named a preseason First-Team All-AAC selection by Athlon Sports in May 2018.

GEORGIA ON MY MIND

- Cortez Broughton, a Second-Team All-AAC honoree in 2016, returns for his senior campaign at UC.
- He has started 24-straight games for UC.
- Broughton ranked among UC's Top-10 tacklers with 23 total stops. He also added 3.5 tackles for a loss, five QB hurries, a fumble recovery and a sack. He posted his best game of the year in the finale against UConn, racking up six tackles, a TFL and a OB hurry.
- He played in the 2009 Little League World Series for the Warner Robins (Georgia) All-Stars.

- OL Morgan James does not have the traditional background of a college football player.
- He did not play in high school and spent time after graduation playing hockey in the Southern Professional Hockey League. The big man was an enforcer on ice.

- In recent years, UC has played games in the top five venues by capacity in college football.
- Michigan Stadium (107,601 2017) tops the list followed by Penn State's Beaver Stadium (106,572 - 2005), Ohio State's Ohio Stadium (104,944, 2014), Texas A6M's Kyle Field (102,733, 1971) and Tennessee's Neyland Stadium (102,455 - 2011).

EIGHT DAYS A WEEK

- UC added three graduate transfers to its roster prior to training camp starting in the form of LB Tinashe Bere [Duke], OL Dino Boyd (Rhode Island) and CB Cameron Jefferies (Bowling Green).
- Bere will miss the season after suffering a leg injury early in training camp.

NIGHT SWIMMING

- UC 3-0 over its last 13 games when possessing the ball for 30 or more minutes in a game.
- UC had the ball for 34:21 at UCLA in the season opener.
- The Bearcats held the ball for 30:20 at Miami (OH) and for 30:01 against Tulane in 2017.

THE RISING

- QB Hayden Moore became the fifth UC signal caller alltime to surpass 6,000 career passing yards.
- Moore (6,191) sits fifth on the all-time chart, trailing current UC QB coach Gino Guidugli (11,453), Gunner Kiel (6,835), Danny McCoin (6,801) and Deontey Kenner (6,278).
- Moore's 75-yard TD pass to Kahlil Lewis at ECU was the longest of his career and UC's longest play from scrimmage in 2017.
- Moore holds both the UC and AAC single-game passing mark with his 557-yard performance at Memphis in 2015. Moore came off the bench in the second quarter in relief of injured UC starter Gunner Kiel.

NO DOUBLING BACK

 UC was one of four NCAA FBS teams (Air Force, Arkansas State, UCF) to not have a touchback on a punt in 2017.
 The Bearcats led the AAC in punting with a 40.7 net punting yards average.

THEY WERE ALL ... YELLOW

- UC was whistled for 94 penalties on the season, an average of 73.0 penalty yards per game.
- The Bearcats season-low total was flour flags at Michigan.
- UC was tagged for six or more penalties 10 times in 2017 and has hit double-digit flags four times.

OFF THE GROUND

- UC rushed for 208 yards at Tulane, its second-highest total of the season (249 vs. SMU) and second consecutive game topping the 200-yard mark.
- UC is 36-2 when rushing for 200 or more yards in a game since 2007.
- UC has not had a 1,000-yard rusher since 2012, when future RB George Winn ran for 1,334 yards..

AHEAD BY A CENTURY

- RB Gerrid Doaks rushed 17 times at Tulane for a careerbest 149 yards, his first career 100-yard game.
- His 57-yard rush in the fourth quarter was a career long and was UC's longest rush in 2017.
- Doaks missed the last two games of 2017 after undergoing shoulder surgery prior to the ECU game.

THE STAFF HAS SEEN THIS BEFORE

- HC Luke Fickell, a 19-year veteran of the coaching ranks, has a veteran, experienced staff with 239 years of onfield experience at all levels of football.
- DL coach Steve Stripling (40), S coach Jon Tenuta (37), OC/ TE coach Mike Denbrock (32) and WR coach Joker Phillips (30) have 30+ years of experience while OL coach Ron Crook (29) and STC/TE coach Doug Phillips (22) have 20+ years in.
- DC/LB Marcus Freeman (9), QB coach Gino Guidugli (8) and CB coach Mike Mickens (7) joined the coaching ranks after professional playing careers.
- ST coach Brian Mason, who moved to the coaching staff in January 2018, spent six years as a coach before serving as UC's director of recruiting a year ago.

T.E.A.M

 Simply put, HC Luke Fickell's mantra Together Everyone Achieves More is one of the guiding forces for the UC program. The phrase adorns the team's workouts shirts, Coach Fickell's gameday attire and a band worn by members of the team.

A LEGEND RETURNS HOME

- RB coach Gino Guidugli, a member of UC's James P. Kelly Sr. Athletics Hall of Fame returned to his alma mater in 2017 after spending six seasons at Central Michigan.
- Guidugli was named CMU's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach following the 2016 campaign after previously serving as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator.
- He spent 2017 at UC's running backs coach and shifted to quarterbacks prior to the spring of 2018.
- Guidugli still holds seven UC school records and is the only signal-caller in school history to throw for 3,500 or more yards in a season and had 14 career 300-yard passing games.

LOCKDOWN DEFENDER BACK IN CLIFTON

- Former UC All-American Mike Mickens returned to UC in January 2018 as cornerbacks coach.
- Mickens, UC's career interceptions leader with 14, joined the coaching staff after four years coaching corners at Bowling Green. He has also spent time on the staffs at Idaho and Indiana State.
- The 2011 UC graduate was a Football Writers Association of American All-America selection in 2007 and a 2008 Playboy All-American.

FORMER BEARCATS ON STAFF

 Guidugli and Mickens are not the only former Bearcats on the coaching staff. Steve Stripling (DL), Joker Phillips (WR) and Ron Crook (OL) had previous stints on the coaching staff while Austin Bujnoch (offensive GA) and Pat Lambert (defensive GA) played for the Red & Black.

HIGH TECH EQUIPMENT

 Cincinnati is one of a handful of teams to wear the Russell Athletic CarbonTek shoulder pad system. The pads are a collaboration between Russell Athletic and Boeing that uses excess carbon fiber from 787s.

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

- UC announced a long-term partnership with Under Armour, naming the global performance brand as the its official outfitter starting July 1, 2015.
- As part of the multi-year agreement, Under Armour will exclusively design and supply the footwear, apparel and equipment for training and gameday uniforms for each of UCis 19 men's and women's varsity athletic teams beginning in the 2015-16 season.

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- For the past 20 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Among many amenities, Higher Ground features a pair of 100-yard artificial turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

THE REMIX

 The Bearcats added several transfers to the roster including: grad transfers LB Tinashe Bere (Duke), OL Dino Boyd (Rhode Island), CB Cameron Jefferies (Bowling Green) and transfers OL Darius Harper (Miami OH) and WR Aulden Knight (Hampton).

DOUBLE DUTY

- UC radio voice Dan Hoard also serves as the play-byplay man for the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals, joining Bill Hillgrove [Pittsburgh Panthers & Steelers] and Gene Deckerhoff [Florida State/Tampa Bay Buccaneers] as the only broadcasters in the country to handle radio play-byplay duties for both an NCAA FBS and NFL team.
- ESPN college FB commentators Dave Pasch (Arizona Cardinals) and Bob Wischusen (NY Jets) are NFL playby-play radio voices.

UC WRAPS TWO-PHASE NIPPERT PROJECT

- A two-phase fan exprience project was recently completed at historid Nippert Stadium
- The venerable facility received a new video board prior to the 2017 season, called Lindner Family Vision, thanks to a donation from longtime UC supporters Carl & Martha Lindner
- Nearly four times larger than the size of the former active video display area, the new end zone display from Daktronics measures 31 feet high by 114 feet wide.
- The display is the same quality and model installed by the Cincinnati Reds in right field of Great American Ball Park prior to the 2015 MLB All-Star Game.
- A new sound system and distrubuted antenna system for improved cell phone coverage was installed during the 2018 offseason.

THE CINCINNATI STRIPE

- A prominent feature on UC's uniforms is a stripe with elements unique to the University and its campus.
- The height of the stripe is equal to that of the Cincinnati script on the home and road uniforms. The angles represented were inspired by the angles on numerous campus buildings and structures, including the new Nippert Stadium press box and the long red stairway inside the Richard E. Lindner Center. The triangles are representative of the windows of the Lindner Center, which are visible from Nippert Stadium on gameday and all throughout campus.

BEARCATS INSIDER ON FOX SPORTS OHIO

- Bearcats Insider, a new show on FOX Sports Ohio covering UC Athletics debuted in August.
- The 30-minute show airs weekly on FSO as hosts Dan Hoard and former Bearcats quarterback Tony Pike discuss the most recent game and upcoming matchup as well as feature interviews with coaches and players.
- New episodes will air Wednesdays; check local listing for times and replays. The show on Wednesday, October 17th, UC's football bye week, will feature a preview of Bearcats basketball.

FICKELL RADIO SHOW RETURNS TO THE AIR

- Head Coach Luke Fickell has a weekly radio show from 8-9 p.m. ET on Tuesday's throughout the season.
- The show originates from the Montgomery Inn [9440 Montgomery Rd.] and is open to all fans.
- The hour-long program with Coach Fickell, Dan Hoard and Jim Kelly Jr. will air weekly from 8-9 p.m. ET on both ESPN 1530 AM and 700 WLW AM this season. The first five shows air on ESPN 1530 with the final seven broadcast on 700 WLW.
- Fans can listen online at iheart.com and through 700
 WLW and ESPN 1530's iHeartRadio app. For those who
 can't catch the program live, a podcast of the weekly
 program will be made available free of charge on
 700WLW.com.

POLLING DATA



NIPPERT STADIUM

Carson Field at Nippert Stadium has been the venerable home of the University of Cincinnati football team since 1901 and provides the Bearcats with one of the best home-field environments in college football.

Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football.

The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon, privately funded renovation and expansion project. The reopening of Nippert Stadium coincided with the 100th anniversary of the 1915 original construction of the facility.

UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).

Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).

The stadium served as home for the Cincinnati Bengals, in 1968 and 1969, while their original permanent home at Riverfront Stadium was being constructed. It is currently the home field for FC Cincinnati, a professional soccer team in the USL who earned an expansion slot in MLS for 2019.

Nippert has served as a venue for concerts by Aerosmith, Blue Oyster Cult, Britney Spears, Michael Jackson, NSYNC, Janet Jackson, KT Tunstall, The North Mississippi All-Stars, The Roots, the Cincinnati Opera Company, Styx and many more.

Two US Presidents have spoken at the stadium. On Oct 16, 1936, President Franklin Roosevelt, running for a second term, appeared at Nippert Stadium and spoke from an open car in the rain to a crowd estimated at 15,000 and on Nov. 2, 2008, President Barack Obama held a campaign rally at Nippert two days before the 2008 Presidential Election to an estimated 27,000 attendees.

USA Today named Nippert as the best home-field venue in the former BIG EAST Conference and ESPN's Scott Van Pelt cited Nippert as a "one of the gems of college football'.

RECENT ENHANCEMENTS

The playing surface was widened and a new perimeter wall was constructed following the 2016 season, creating a safe area around the end zone corners and giving Nippert the ability to play host to international friendly matches on a FIFA regulation field.

A two-phase fan experience project was completed from 2017-18 with the installation of a new LED video display, which was four times larger than the previous videoboard, electronic ribbon boards, an upgraded audio system along with a distributed antenna system to improve cell phone coverage.

THE 2015 RENOVATION

During the most-recent renovation, the Bearcats played their 2014 home schedule at Paul Brown Stadium downtown before returning to a packed house against Alabama A&M on Sept. 5, 2015

Both east and west concourses were completely renovated and widened and fans will find 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations and new restrooms throughout the stadium, including ADA accessible seating and facilities.

East-side patrons with seats in Herschede-Shank Pavilion will notice the skywalks connecting O'Varsity Way to the upper deck, allowing them to bypass the main concourse and have a quick and easy route to and from their seats.

All the seating benches are covered by red and silver Perma-Cap vinyl bleacher covers by Hussey Seating. The covering gives the bleachers a different look and includes a CPAW painted in the south end zone student section.

The most striking changes, however, sits five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long, the five-story West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.

The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels; a press and operations level, suite level, scholarship club level, and patio suites mezzanine level.

UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area

customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

In addition, three new lighting poles were installed along with new lights on existing poles and on the roof facing of the press box. The stadium lighting averages 165 footcandles, a vast improvement over the previous number.

PREVIOUS IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The 2015 project was the latest in a series of enhancements that began in 1916 when construction began on a permanent brick-and-concrete stadium structure, which was completed, section-by-section, as funds were raised.

Over the years, the playing surface has been lowered several times, the Reed Shank Pavilion, now Herschede-Shank Pavilion, on the east side of the stadium was added in 1954 and a permanent grandstand and gameday locker rooms were added in the north endzone in 2005.

Capacity was raised to 28,000 in 1954, 35,000 in 1991 and 40,000 following the 2015 renovation.

Artificial turf was first installed in 1970 and in 2000, the stadium became one of the first in the U.S. to utilize FieldTurf, a grass-like synthetic surface.

Prior to the 2013 season, UBU Sports' Speed Series S5-M synthetic turf system was installed as the playing surface at Nippert. The stadium's field orientation was shifted slightly north and west to even out the sideline areas and add a run-off area around the south end zone.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (Ohio) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning. His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8, 1924.

The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

HEAD COACH LUKE FICKELL

SECOND YEAR • OHIO STATE '97

Veteran defensive coordinator and Ohio native Luke Fickell was named the University of Cincinnati's 42nd football head coach in December 2016.

The 18-year veteran of the FBS coaching ranks took the reins of the UC program after spending 15 years at his alma mater, Ohio State.

Fickell was hired on Dec. 10, 2016 and in the span of less than eight weeks, he hired a staff and put one of the top recruiting classes in the American Athletic Conference together. Since he hire, Fickell has been a tireless advocate for the Cincinnati program, speaking at numerous events and schools to continue to build the Bearcats brand inside the State of Cincinnati, the 50-mile radius surrounding the Clifton Hts. campus.

His impressive resume includes being on the staff of two national championship winning teams, seeing 12 of his players selected in the NFL Draft, and coordinating outstanding defenses over the last 12 seasons as a co-coordinator or defensive coordinator.

He is also an excellent recruiter with strong Midwest and Florida relationships, a national presence when needed and a discerning eye for talent. He was named the American Football Coaches Association assistant coach of the year in 2010 and he was named a "top recruiter" in 2012 by both Rivals and ESPN.

No stranger to championship-level football, Fickell was a part of nine Big Ten Conference titles (seven as a coach, two as a player) and two national championship squads at Ohio State. During his coaching tenure with the Buckeyes, OSU qualified for the College Football Playoff twice and played in 15 postseason games.

The former standout football player, college graduate, NFL player, husband and father is most-noticed as a developer of talent.

His NFL Draft selections include first-round picks A.J. Hawk, Bobby Carpenter, Ryan Shazier and Darron Lee, NFL standout James Laurinaitis and Joshua Perry, Anthony Schlegel, Larry Grant, Marcus Freeman, Austin Spitler, Ross Homan and Brian Rolle.

The 2016 Buckeyes earned a spot in the College Football Playoff semifinal against Clemson after finishing the regular season 11-1 and ranked No. 3 in CFP poll. OSU won five consecutive games to close the season and boast the nation's No. 4 total defense [282.3 yards per game allowed], including the No. 1 pass efficiency defense and the No. 3 scoring defense [14.2].

Since 2005, Fickel-coached defenses at Ohio State have ranked among the NCAA FBS Top-40 in yards-per-play allowed, averaging a ranking of No. 17 and earning its highest rank of No. 3 in 2016. Cincinnati based ProFootballFocus ranks OSU's defense as its No. 3 overall unit in 2016.



Fickell's coaching career began at Ohio State. After spending a year on the injured reserve list with the New Orleans Saints, he was hired in 1999 as a graduate assistant at OSU by his college coach, John Cooper.

Fickell's first full-time coaching position came in 2000 under Lee Owens at Akron, spending two years as defensive line coach. Jim Tressel brought him to Ohio State as special teams coordinator in 2002 and he also worked with the defensive front on the BCA National Championship squad. He was named linebackers coach in 2004, and added co-defensive coordinator duties to his resume in 2005.

In May of 2011 he was asked to take over an Ohio State program staggered by the loss of its head coach, the unexpected departure of a star quarterback and on the cusp of NCAA penalties, and against stacked odds, he led the Buckeyes to a bowl game. Prior to his appointment to serve as head coach, he had been promoted to assistant head coach in March 2011.

He returned to his role as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2012. Over the past five seasons, coaching under UC alumnus Urban Meyer, Fickell's defensive units have been a big reason the Buckeyes went 61-5 and won the 2014 College Football Playoff National Championship.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Fickell is a graduate of DeSales High School, where he was a three-time, undefeated state wrestling champion, and he is a 1997 graduate of Ohio State. He played for the Buckeyes from 1992-96, redshirting the first year and then starting the next four seasons at nose guard. He started a school-record 50 consecutive games between 1993 and 1996.

Fickell graduated from Ohio State in 1997 with a degree in exercise science. Luke and his wife Amy have six children: Landon, Luca, twin sons Aydon and Ashton, and twin sons Laykon and Lucian.
