

2006-07 in Review



2006-07 SEASON IN REVIEW

The University of Cincinnati closed the 2006-07 season with a record of 11-19 overall and 2-14 in BIG EAST play. UC used a 70-67 overtime victory over Seton Hall on Feb. 28, in its home finale, to close out the home schedule with a record of 10-8 in Fifth Third Arena. The Bearcats' final two wins of the season were both in overtime, including a 17-point come-from-behind overtime victory vs. West Virginia on Jan. 20.

STORY LINES:

- **Deonta Vaughn** concluded the year as the second-highest scoring freshman in Cincinnati history. Vaughn finished his rookie campaign with a 14.5 points per game average. Dontonio Wingfield holds the UC freshman season scoring record, averaging 16.0 points in 1993-94. Vaughn was also the second-leading scorer among BIG EAST freshmen, trailing only Eugene Harvey of Seton Hall.
- Bearcats' forward **John Williamson** finished his first season at UC fourth in the BIG EAST in offensive rebounds (3.4) and 11th in total rebounds (7.3).



Deonta Vaughn averaged 14.5 points, 3.5 assists and 1.8 steals per game, earning BIG EAST All-Freshman Team honors.

- Head Coach **Mick Cronin** introduced seven new faces to a roster that returned four Bearcats with playing experience during his first year as bench boss. Those newcomers accounted for 77 percent of the minutes played and 84 percent of the scoring production during the 2006-07 season.

SUCCESS IN OVERTIME

- Cincinnati posted a 2-0 mark in overtime games during the 2006-07 campaign. On Jan. 20, UC and West Virginia were deadlocked at 75-75 before the Bearcats went on a 21-8 run in the extra frame to claim a 96-83 win. Eleven games later, UC out scored Seton Hall, 11-8, after being tied at 59 a piece en route to a 70-67 triumph.

WILLIAMSON PICKS UP OFFENSE

- **John Williamson** picked up the Bearcats' offense in final games. The 6-6 junior averaged 16.9 points over his last seven games, during which he shot .536 (45-of-84) from the field. Following back-to-back games in which he scored 16 points each, Williamson scored 14 points at West Virginia on March 3. He tallied 23 points, shooting 8-of-12 from the field, and grabbed nine rebounds in the Feb. 18 game vs. Notre Dame. He scored 19 points on 7-of-12 shooting in the Feb. 10 game at Rutgers and had 15 points vs. Villanova on Feb. 14.
- Williamson was Cincinnati's most consistent scorer, having reached double figures in 23 of the team's 30 contests.
- Williamson was one of the most effective rebounders in the BIG EAST Conference, particularly under the offensive glass. The 6-6 junior is ranked fourth in the BIG EAST in offensive rebounds, averaging 3.4 per game. He is rated eighth in the league in overall rebounding with his 7.3 average.
- Williamson recorded his fifth double-double of the season with 14 points and 13 rebounds in the March 3 matchup at West Virginia. His rebound total was second to the 16 rebounds he gathered vs. No. 4 Ohio State on Dec. 16.
- Williamson earned BIG EAST Conference Honor Roll accolades for his play the week of Dec. 11-17, during which he averaged 17.5 points and 12.0 rebounds.

VAUGHN AMONG BEST FRESHMEN

- **Deonta Vaughn** paced the Bearcats in scoring with his 14.5-point average. Vaughn ranked among the top freshmen scorers in the BIG EAST Conference throughout the season and finished second to Eugene Harvey (16.5 points) of Seton Hall.
- Vaughn averaged 17.4 points over his last five games. He scored 20 points—his sixth 20-point outburst of the season—in the win over Seton Hall, including five points in overtime.
- More than just a scorer, Vaughn twice recorded a career-high eight rebounds and was the Bearcats' assists leader (3.5). He shared the Bearcats' lead in steals (1.8), having averaged 2.5 thefts over his final six games.
- Vaughn twice earned BIG EAST Conference Rookie of the Week honors, including his performance in Cincinnati's victory over North Carolina State on Dec. 23, in which he scored 25 points and reached career highs with nine assists and six steals.
- Vaughn tallied a UC freshman single-game scoring record of 33 points vs. Wofford on Nov. 21. He connected on nine 3-pointers, the second most by any Bearcat in UC history. His 33-point effort was the third-highest scoring performance by any BIG EAST Conference player last season.
- Vaughn dished out five or more assists in 10 games with a single-game high of nine.

THE SIXTH MAN ... AND THEN SOME

- **Marvin Gentry** was Cincinnati's super sixth man most of last season before moving into the starting lineup for his final six games of the year.
- Gentry tallied 22 points while playing all but three minutes of the Jan. 31 game vs. Louisville.



- Gentry scored 15 points on 6-of-12 shooting from the field vs. Georgetown (1/27/07).
- Gentry played a major role in the 96-83 win over West Virginia on Jan. 20, scoring a career-high 32 points. He was 5-of-7 from 3-point range and sank nine of his dozen free throw attempts. The effort helped him earn weekly BIG EAST Honor Roll laurels.

SIKES SCORES FROM OUTSIDE

Marcus Sikes, normally a perimeter player, was forced to see action around the basket last season. Sikes, who at 6-8 was the tallest Bearcat regular, nonetheless has the second-most 3-point attempts among the Bearcats with 45 and led the team in 3-point field goal percentage (.425).

- Sikes scored 19 points in 25 minutes of the Jan. 27 Georgetown game before fouling out. He was 7-of-9 from the floor and tied a UC single-game record for 3-point field goal percentage with a perfect 5-of-5 day from behind the arc.
- Sikes scored a career-high 24 points vs. Syracuse on Jan. 17, sinking 8-of-12 3-pointers.

WARREN SHINES ON BOTH ENDS

Jamual Warren sparked the Bearcats throughout the season at both ends of the court. He tallied 13 points vs. Seton Hall on Feb. 28, and recorded a career-high seven assists at West Virginia on March 3.

- Defensively, Warren had at least one steal in all but five games last season and had multiple steals in 17 contests. Warren, who had a streak of 15 games with a steal, shared the team lead in steals with his 1.8 average. Warren set a career high with five steals in the Jan. 17 USF contest.
- Perhaps no steal was more timely than the one in which Warren made to extend his streak during the Dec. 27 win over Miami (OH). After sinking a short jumper to give UC a 54-52 lead with 2:14 to play, Warren stole the ball on the ensuing possession and dunked on a break-away to give the Bearcats an insurmountable lead.

BEARCATS DATA:

- Though they were almost always at a size disadvantage, the Bearcats won the battle of the boards in four of their final five games. Cincinnati posted a 46-34 advantage in rebounding in the win over Seton Hall and out rebounded DePaul, 43-35, on Feb. 24.
- Cincinnati's 96-83 overtime win over West Virginia on Jan. 20 featured the second-largest deficit that the Bearcats had overcome in their history in Fifth Third Arena. UC trailed by 17 points in the first half of the West Virginia contest. Cincinnati has twice overcome 18-point margins for wins in Fifth Third Arena. On Feb. 28, 1998, the Bearcats fought back from 18 points down to defeat Saint Louis, 61-58. They overcame

the same size margin on Nov. 28, 2004 for a 76-70 overtime win over Northern Iowa.

- **Marcus Sikes'** 5-of-5 performance from 3-point range vs. Georgetown (1/27/07) tied the UC single-game record for 3-point field goal percentage (minimum five made). Field Williams was 5-of-5 vs. Louisville in 2001-02.
- The Bearcats forced a season-high 32 turnovers, three shy of the school record, in their Dec. 23 win over North Carolina State.
- UC's 17 3-point field goals vs. Wofford (11/21/06) was the third-highest single-game total while its 32 attempts was fifth-most.
- Cincinnati notched its 40th consecutive victory in home openers and upped its record to 86-19 in season home openers.
- The Bearcats upped their record in season openers to 87-19. UC has won 25 of its last 26 season openers.

IT'S ACADEMIC

Two Bearcats, **Marcus Sikes** and **Branden Miller**, qualified for the Dean's list academic honors after Fall quarter for having grade point averages of 3.5 or above. Three others, John Williamson, Connor Barwin and Mike Williams, posted GPAs of 3.0 or above. The team's GPA was 2.875, a shade lower than the 2.965 of the UC general student body.
